WHEREAS by Section 158 of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation temporarily suspend the operations of the said Act, in so far as it applies to the closing times fixed or appointed for any shop or shops: And whereas it is expedient to exercise such power in manner hereinafter appearing: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation suspend the operations of the said Act on Thursday, the 12th day of November, 1936, between the hours of 6 p.m. and 9 p.m., in so far as it applies to the closing time of all shops situated in the Bridgetown Shop District.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act. 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Govern-ment Gazette until the 31st day of December, 1937, inclusive.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Pro-elamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Aus-tralian waters specified in the Schedule hereto for a period of twelve months as from the 15th day of November, 1936.

Schedule.

(1) All that area of Western Australian waters (Cockburn Sound) eastward of the Fremantle Fish Market Jetty and extending to the western extremity of South street and to a width of half a mile from high-water mark.

(2)That area of Western Australian waters (Cockburn Sound) commencing at the western extremity of Sydney street and extending southward to a point a quarter of a mile south of the Jetty fronting Douro road and to a width of half a mile from high-water mark.

(3) That area of Western Australian waters (Cockburn Sound) commencing at a point on the foreshore a quarter of a mile north of Robbs Jetty and extending to a point on the foreshore a quarter of a mile south

of Robbs Jetty, and extending into the waters aforesaid to a distance of a quarter of a mile from high-water mark.

Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 35 of "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935," that the Governor may make Regulations prescribing all matters which by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which it may be necessary or convenient to prescribe for giving effect to this Act: And whereas by Order in Council dated the 7th day of September, 1921, and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of September, 1921, the Governor made Regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of December, 1935, the Governor amended the Regulations aforesaid in the manner set forth in the Schedule to the said last-mentioned Order in Council: And whereas it is now deemed necessary and expedient further to amend the said Regulations as amended as aforesaid in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, doth hereby further amend the said Regulations as published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of September, 1921, and as amended by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of December, 1935, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder :--

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsec-tion 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:—

TOWN PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT, 1928.

(Regulation.)

NEDLANDS ROAD BOARD—TOWN PLANNING SCHEME.

Control of Tenement Houses.

1. This Regulation is made under the provisions of "The Town Planning and Development Act, 1928," and shall have the full force and effect as if it were enacted by the said Act.

2. In the construction of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires:—

- (a) The expression "Tenement house" shall mean a dwelling-house containing two or more flats or tenements.
- (b) The expression ''habitable rooms'' shall include bedrooms, dining rooms, sitting-rooms, and kitchens, but shall not include bathrooms, waterclosets, pantries, and storerooms.
- (c) The expression ''floor area'' applied to a tenement shall mean the aggregate superficial areas of so many horizontal sections thereof as there are floors in the said tenement. The horizontal section of each floor shall be made at the point of its greatest surface dimensions, exclusive of external walls.

3. The number of apartment or tenement houses to be erected to the acre within the Nedlands Road District shall not exceed:—

- (a) Tenement houses capable of being divided into two flats-two to the acre.
- (b) Tenement houses capable of being divided into more than two flats—one to the acre.

more than two flats—one to the are. Provided that the total number of flats to be constructed in any tenement house shall not exceed six.

This By-law shall not apply to allotments fronting Stirling highway or Broadway and shall not apply to a single family dwelling-house, which may be erected anywhere within the district upon a subdivisional allotment of land.

4. Where a building is let or occupied in flats or tenements, each flat or tenement shall be deemed to be a separate house or dwelling.

5. A tenement house consisting of one floor only shall not cover an area exceeding half of the allotment or parcel of land upon which it is built. Where a tenement house has more than one floor, the total space of the allotment to be left unbuilt upon shall be at least equal to the total floor area of the buildings erected thereon.

6. No person shall erect, or have or permit or suffer to be erected any tenement house to contain or containing more than two floors in height.

7. Each tenement shall be self-contained and shall be provided with a separate kitchen, separate bathroom and separate water-closet on the same floor as the other rooms of such tenement, and each tenement shall be provided with a separate entrance, and, when the tenement is not on the ground floor, the stairway shall be of brick, stone, or concrete.

8. The total floor area of each separate tenement shall be at least 700 square feet, and, in addition, there shall be attached thereto open verandah space for the exclusive use of such tenement at least 100 square feet in floor area.

9. The minimum floor area to each habitable room shall be 100 square feet and the average floor area for such rooms of any tenement shall be 120 square feet.

10. No dividing fence shall be constructed in front of any tenement house between the fence alignment and the building so as to divide the frontage thereof into a frontage less than that of the lot or parcel of land upon which the building is erected. 11. Any person who constructs, alters, or redesigns any premises in contravention of this scheme shall within 30 days from notice given by the Nedlands Road Board remove, pull down, or alter any building so as to comply with the Scheme.

These Regulations supersede Regulations for the Control of Tenement Houses gazetted on the 16th day of November, 1934, which said Regulations are hereby cancelled.

One thousand nine hundred and thirtysix, until the Fourteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, subject to the following alterations and additions, to wit:

Clause 1-Term of Agreement: To be altered to read-

Provided that, at any time after the expiration of the first twelve months from the date of this Agreement and after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve months expiration of any subsequent period of twelve months, the provisions of this Agreement may by mutual agree-ment between the parties hereto be varied or rescinded."

Leading hand (not otherwise specified) in charge of three or more men shall be paid 1s. 3d. per day above the ordinary rate of pay for such work.

Leading hand (being a tradesman) in charge of three or more tradesmen or six or more other workers shall be paid 2s. 6d. per day above the rate prescribed for his trade.

Men engaged inside the gas, tar, or water space of any boiler, or inside the boiler flue, in cleaning or scraping work, shall, whilst so employed, be paid 6d. per hour in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate of pay.

Any employee working in wet ground shall be paid 1s. per day in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate of pay. 'Wet ground'' means ground in which, in the opinion of the engineer, it is impracticable for workers to work without getting wet feet. Provided that, where watertight boots are supplied by the management there shall be no allowance for wet ground.

In addition to the wages as prescribed in this Agreement, 'Industry money'' shall be paid at the rate of three shillings (3s.) per week to all workers covered by this Agreement, with the exclusion of the workers enumerated in Clauses 8 and 14 hereof, and men discharging coal from railway trucks.

When the basic wage as declared by the State Arbitration Court exceeds $\pounds 4$ 5s., Industry money shall be decreased by the amount by which the basic wage exeeds $\pounds 4$ 5s. until at $\pounds 4$ 8s. and over, no Industry money shall be paid.

Clause 2.—Travelling Allowance for Main Gangs and Outside Workers.

Where an employee commencing work at starting time on the job incurs extra tram or railway fares over and above one tram fare each way, or over and above the amount he would incur if starting work at Wellington street works, Perth, Gas Works, Fremantle; or Cottesloe Depot, this extra amount of fares shall be refunded to him each week, providing that this clause does not apply to any worker who has been allotted a special district whilst working in such district.

Clause 3.—Time Allowance Outside the Two-mile Radius.

Employees working temporarily outside the two-mile radius of the Wellington street Works, Perth; Gas Works, Fremantle, or Cottesloe Depot, and not within two miles of their place of residence, shall be allowed one-half hour per day travelling time, without loss of pay, in addition to above travelling allowance, when required to report for work on the job.

Clause 4.--Hours.

The hours of duty shall not, without payment for overtime, exceed 44 hours per week, and the hours of duty for any day shall not, without payment for overtime, exceed eight hours: Provided also, that if it is found necessary, arrangements may be made for employees to commence work earlier or later and finish earlier or later than the ordinary hours. Each shift to consist of eight hours.

Clause 5.—Overtime.

Payment shall be made for overtime at the rate of time and one-half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

When a worker is recalled to work after leaving job he shall be paid for at least two hours at overtime rates.

When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one hour, he shall be provided with any meal required, or shall be paid two shillings (2s.) in lieu thereof. This provision shall not apply in case of emergency breakdown repairs, nor to men unloading coal.

Clause 6.-Shift Work.

The hours of duty without payment for overtime shall not, for shiftmen (except watchmen), exceed an average of 44 hours per week, to be worked in shifts not exceeding eight hours each. Such shifts to be distributed as the employers choose, but so as to make an aggregate shift time on duty not exceeding 176 hours in each period of four weeks.

For all duty performed on his day off in the week, not being a Sunday or a holiday, the minimum ordinary rate prescribed for a shiftman shall be increased by onehalf, but in the case of a Sunday it shall be doubled.

For all time worked on a Sunday and holidays (not being his day off) the minimum ordinary rate for a shiftman shall be increased by one-half.

In the case of a shiftman working on his day off at the request of another employee, the rate to be paid shall be the ordinary rate payable for the day or shift.

A shiftman shall be deemed to be working on a continuous process.

In the case of a man, after his usual day's work, being called on for Retort House work between 5.0 p.m. and 7.30 a.m., he will be paid at the rate of time and one-half, unless notified before 5 p.m. that he will be required for the night shift.

Clause 7.-Holidays.

Any days which are prescribed by the laws of the State to be observed in lieu of the holidays above-mentioned will be treated as the days to which this clause applies.

All employees, other than shiftmen, shall be free from duty on holidays, without loss of pay for the day, but any employee may be required for duty on any Sunday or holiday, and, if so required, shall be entitled to the ordinary rate for the time worked on Sunday, and on holidays the ordinary day's pay plus the holiday pay for the day. The rates for shiftmen shall be time and one-half for Sundays and holidays.

Annual Leave.

A working week of forty-four hours' leave of absence will be granted annually on full pay after twelve months service, in addition to the seven days holiday already specified herein. Leave not to be cumulative and to be taken at the discretion of the Management, so as to interfere with the routine of the works as little as possible.

In the case of a retort operator, he shall receive two working weeks' annual leave.

Employees not completing twelve months' service shall receive holidays, or pay in lieu thereof, after six months' service, in proportion to the length of service, that is, one day's holiday for every two months' service, calculated at the rate of one-sixth of the 44-hour week's pay for each day's holiday, unless summarily dismissed for misconduct, dereliction of duty, etc., in which case no holiday pay shall be granted.

Clause 8 .--- Casual Workers.

A casual worker shall be paid ten per cent. increase on the prescribed rate for the particular class of work "Casual worker" means a worker (other than men

picked up for unloading coal) employed for less than fourteen consecutive days.

From his fifteenth birthday a junior worker shall be paid "Industry money," starting at the rate of threepence (3d.) per week and increasing by threepence (3d.) per week each half-year, until at 20½ years he will receive three shillings (3s.) per week "Industry money" in addition to the wages prescribed in this Agreement.

Clause 10 .--- Weekly Hiring.

(a) Except as to casual workers, the employment is terminable on either side by one week's notice, given on any day. But for the first fourteen days of employment the hiring shall be from hour to hour, and during this period an hour's notice or an hour's pay shall be sufficient.

(b) If a weekly worker absents himself from duty, a sum proportionate to his time of absence may be deducted from his pay.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed, because of any strike by the applicant or the Unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through any breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work, or by any such strike or breakdown which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

(e) Sick pay.—The employers will, in the case of per-sonal accident or personal sickness necessitating absence from work, pay for a total period of six days in the year for such absence from work.

Providing also, that the employee will lose his pay for the time of such absence from work, unless he produces or forwards within forty-eight hours of the commence-ment of such absence a medical certificate or other evidence satisfactory to the Management that his absence was due to personal accident arising out of and in the course of his employment, or to personal ill-health necessitating such absence.

Provisions.

Clause 11.-Service Layers.

Service layer's work to terminate within six feet of inside of building or street line.

Clause 12 .- Maintenance Work.

Maintenance work shall not constitute gas fitter's work, unless it is found necessary to remove the fittings and replace them to repair a fault.

Clause 13.-Tools.

All tools required by the abovenamed employeees (service and maintenance men) in connection with any work vice and maintenance men) in connection with any work performed by them on behalf of the employers to be provided by the employers, with the following excep-tion—All tools (small), generally known as ''Pocket tools,'' to be found by the employees.

Clause 14.

Plumbers, carpenters, blacksmiths, fitters, and tur-ners and other trades provided for under the various Federal and State Awards are not included in this Agreement.

Clause 15 .- Forty-four Hour Week.

The 44-hour week in this Agreement having been agreed to in consequence of the State Arbitration Court having awarded a 44-hour week to the Amal-gamated Society of Engineers, it is hereby agreed that, should the Court increase or decrease the hours to any other number of hours per week to the Amalgamated Society of Engineers, this Agreement shall be amended to include such provision.

Clause 16.-Settlement of Disputes.

Should any question or dispute arise regarding this Agreement or any matter not provided for herein, it shall be referred to a representative of the employers and of the Union, who shall meet and endeavour to effect a settlement.

This clause shall not be taken to interfere with any rights of either of the parties to proceed for a penalty for a breach of this Agreement.

Clause 17.-Locality of Agreement.

This Agreement shall apply to the whole of those areas in which the City of Perth Municipal Council and the Fremantle Gas and Coke Company, Limited, have the right to supply gas.

Clause 18 .--- Basic Wage.

The basic wage as declared by the State Arbitration Court being adopted as the standard in this Agreement, any variation of the basic wage declared by the Court will become the standard in this Agreement, and all other rates will be altered so as to preserve the margins shown in this Agreement.

Clause 19.-Duration of Agreement.

This Agreement shall operate from the 15th day of October, 1936, to the 14th day of October, 1938, inclu-sive, and thereafter, until superseded or varied, subject to the right of either party to apply to the Court of Arbitration (State) at any time after the expiration of the first twelve months from the 15th day of October, 1926, and after the expiration of 1936, and after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve months to vary or amend this Agreement.

When the Chairman or a member of the Board (other than the Chairman) attends any conference of the Board with any other Dried Fruits Board or Boards, whether such conference is held within or outside the

whether such conference is held within or outside the State, the following special fees and allowances shall be payable to them, that is to say:

(a) when sitting in conference, the Chairman shall be entitled to and shall be paid a fee of £2 5s. per day, and each member (other than the Chairman) shall be entitled to and shall be paid a fee of $\pounds 1 \ 10\varepsilon$. per day; and

(b) while travelling to and from the place where the conference is held, and whilst in attendance at such place on days other than the days when sittings of the conference are held, the Chairman and each member (other than the Chairman) so travelling and in attendance as aforesaid shall be entitled to and shall be paid a travelling allowance of £1 per day; and
