FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1934.

By-laws to Control Hawking in the Black Range Road District.

P.W. 5195/21.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 204 (ss. 41) of "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," the Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act, the Black Range Road Board doth, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every power enabling it in this behalf, hereby make the following By-laws:—

Hawking By-laws.

- (1.) No person shall hawk any fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables, or any article of merchandise within any part of the Black Range Road District without having first obtained a license from the Black Range Road Board.
- (2.) Any person who either on foot or with or without a vehicle of any description whatsoever, hawks, peddles, or cries wares in any street, road, lane, right-of-way or public place, or who solicits orders for wares for immediate delivery, shall be deemed to hawk the same.
- (3.) All such hawking is hereby prohibited within the areas contained within a two-mile radius of the Post Offices at Sandstone and at Youanmi.
- (4.) Licenses for hawkers shall be in the Form Y annexed.
- (5.) Every hawker, whilst employed or engaged in hawking, shall produce his license upon demand of any constable or any officer of the Black Range Road Board, and shall at all times have affixed to some conspicuous part of his coat, barrow, or vehicle a board or plate bearing his name, and the words "Licensed Hawker" legibly painted thereon in letters not less than one inch in height.
- (6.) Before any Hawker's License is granted an application in the Form X annexed hereto shall be de-livered to the secretary of the Black Range Road Board, together with the requisite fee.

- (7.) The fees to be paid for a Hawker's License shall be One pound (£1) per annum.
- (8.) Hawkers' Licenses shall be issued with a currency of one year from the date of application.
- (9.) No person to whom a Hawker's License is granted shall lend, transfer, or assign his license, and no person shall borrow or make use of any license granted to any person other than himself.
- (10.) The Black Range Road Board shall have the right to cancel any license in the event of a breach of any of the foregoing provisions.
- (11.) Every person engaged in hawking shall keep on his vehicle at least one pair of tested scales, to use in selling goods by weight.

Every person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than One pound (£1) nor more than Twenty pounds (£20).

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 20 of 1936.

(Registered 26/10/36.)

Between State Executive Australasian Society of Engineers' Industrial Association of Workers and H. V. McKay Massey-Harris Pty., Ltd.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-35," this 31st day of August, 1936, between the State Executive Australasian Society of Engineers' Industrial Association of Workers, on the one part, and H. V. McKay Massey-Harris Pty., Ltd., of corner Murray and King streets, Perth, on the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

This Agreement shall supersede all other Agreements and shall operate over the area of the South-West Land Division of Western Australia, including the Metropolitan Area.

Wages.

Special Rates.

In addition to the rates prescribed above, the following special rates and allowances shall be paid:—

Leading hands in charge of not less than 3 and not more than 10 employees-6/- per week extra.

More than 10 and not more than 20-12/- per week extra.

More than 20-18/- per week extra.

Hours of Employment.

The ordinary hours of employment shall be 46 per week, to be worked between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive and 7.30 a.m. to noon on Saturday. Provided that the spread of hours herein prescribed may be altered by mutual agreement between the employer and his employees and also that the weekly hours may be worked in five days.

Overtime.

For all work done outside ordinary hours the rate of wages shall be time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

In computing overtime each day's work shall stand alone.

An employee recalled after leaving his workshop to work overtime shall be paid for three hours' work at the appropriate rate.

An employee occasionally required to hold himself in readiness to work after ordinary hours shall, until released, be paid standing-by time at the ordinary rate from the time from which he is to hold himself in readiness, but any custom now prevailing under which an employee is required regularly to hold himself in readiness for a call back shall continue.

For all work done during meal hours and thereafter until a meal hour break is allowed, time and a half rate shall be paid. An employee shall not be compelled to

work for more than six hours without a break for a meal.

An employee working overtime shall be allowed a crib time of twenty minutes, without deduction of pay, after each four hours of work, but this provision shall not present any arrangement being made for the taking of a longer meal period without pay.

Before starting overtime after working ordinary hours, a meal break of at least forty-five minutes shall be allowed unless the period of overtime is less than one

be allowed unless the period of overtime is less than one and a half hours. An employer and his employee may mutually agree to any variation of this subclause to meet the circumstances of the work in hand.

An employee required to work overtime for more than two hours without being notified the day before that he will be required so to work, shall either be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid 1s. 6d., or, if the work extends into a second meal hour, 2s. 6d. for the two meals, but such payment need not be made to employees who live in the same locality as their workshops and who live in the same locality as their workshops and who can reasonably return home for meals.

If an employee pursuant to notice has provided a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime, he shall be paid for each meal so provided.

When an employee working overtime finishes work at a time when reasonable means of transport are not available, the employer shall provide him with a conveyance or pay him ordinary wage rates for the time occupied in reaching his home.

Holidays: (a) Twelve (12) paid holidays per annum shall be granted each worker after twelve (12) months' continuous service: Provided always, that New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day, or the days observed as such, shall be taken as they come as portion of the holidays. The balance of six days shall be granted as annual leave at the convenience of the employer, but shall in any event be taken within six (6) months after becoming

(b) In the event of a worker being employed by the employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and, if such holidays are not equal to the holidays given to the other employees, he shall not be

holidays given to the other employees, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other employees of such employer are on holidays on full pay.

(c) Except when employed subject to the conditions of (Overtime) no worker shall be required to present himself for duty on any of the specially named holidays in Subclause (a) hereof. On any other public holiday an employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty, but if kept open or work he done ordinated. self for duty, but, if kept open or work be done, ordinary rates shall apply.

(d) Where a worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct, he will not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(e) The foregoing provisions shall not apply to casual

workers.

Shop Stewards.

Shop stewards appointed by employees in each workshop shall be allowed the necessary time during working hours to interview the employer or his representative on matters affecting employees whom they represent.

Right of entry of Union Officials.

A duly accredited representative of any of the industrial unions of employees party to these disputes shall have the right to enter employers' workshops during the midday meal hour for the purpose of interviewing employees on legitimate union business, on the following conditions:

(a) That he produces his authority to the gate-keeper or such other person as may be appointed by the employer.

Travelling Time Allowance and Board.

All fares and reasonable travelling expenses-including the cost, if any, incurred for meals—incurred by an employee during travelling shall be paid by the employer. The fares shall be first class on coastal boats, or on interstate boats, where there is no second-class distinct from steerage. Train fares shall be at secondclass rates, and, in cases in which an employee has to travel all night, sleeping accommodation, if available, will be supplied.

Time occupied in travelling during the ordinary working hours of the factory in which the employee works

shall be paid for at ordinary rates.

If an employee has to be away from his home overnight he shall be allowed reasonable cost of board and

lodging.
When it is more convenient for the employee in the city or town in which his employer's factory is situated to go direct to the job from his home he shall do so, and start and cease work at the usual time customary at the shop; provided that any extra expense incurred by him in travelling shall be borne by the employer.

Contract of Service.

The contract of service shall be by the day, and shall be terminable by one day's notice on either side, except in the case of a casual worker.

The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of the next following clause, or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of the Agreement.

This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for

This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such case wages shall be paid up

to the time of dismissal only.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably pre-

Absence through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for nonattendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half-day for each completed month of service. Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act pensation Act.

(b) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from duty, except on account of sickness in accordance with Subclause (a) hereof.

Time, Wages Book.

Each employer shall keep a Time and Wages Book showing the name of each employee and his occupation, the hours worked each day and the wages and allowances paid each week.

The time occupied by an employee in filling in any time books or cards, or in the making of records, shall

time books or cards, or in the making of records, shall be treated as time of duty, but this does not apply to checking in or out of the beginning or end of duty.

The Time and Wages Book shall be open for inspection to a duly accredited official of a Union bound by this Agreement during the usual office hours at the employer's office or other convenient place. Provided that no inspection shall be demanded unless the secretary of the Union or the district secretary or organiser of of the Union or the district secretary or organiser of any division suspects that a breach of the Agreement has been committed. Provided further, that only one

demand for such inspection shall be made in any one fortnight at the same establishment. The officer making such inspection shall be entitled to take a copy of the entry in the Time and Wages Book relating to such suspected breach of the Agreement.

Miscellaneous.

Tools:-The employer shall provide for each em-10018:—The employer shall provide for each employee such tools as were customarily provided at the time of the making of this Agreement, and for sheet metal workers, snips used in the cutting of stainless steel, monel metal and similar hard metals. The employee shall replace or pay for any tools so provided if lost through his negligence.

Posting Award.

A copy of Awards relating to work carried on in the establishment shall be kept posted in a prominent position by the employer.

Mixed Functions.

An employee engaged on any day on different grades of work shall be paid at the rates prescribed for time actually worked in each grade.

Definitions.

Assembler-an adult person employed in putting together parts of any agricultural machinery covered by this Agreement which have been previously fitted. The removal of burrs or ragged edges shall not be deemed to be fitting.

Fitter—a person engaged in the fitting of parts of agricultural implements or machinery.

Casual Workers.

Casual workers shall be paid at the rate of 10 per cent., in addition to the rates prescribed in this Agreement, if employed for less than six consecutive working days.

The currency of this Agreement shall be for three years from date hereof. Provided that, at any time after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof, this Agreement may be altered or amended by either party. This Agreement to come into operation on and from Monday, 31st August, 1936.
