WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclama-tion prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatso-ever, in every or any specified portion of Western Aus-(ralian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets, and also against

the use of fishing lines set for the capture of sharks, as from the 1st day of January, 1937, until the 31st day of December, 1937, inclusive.

Scarborough Beach :--- All that area of Western Australian waters at Searborough Beach commencing at a point fronting the western extremity of Reserve street and extending in a southerly direction to a point two chains south of Brighton road, and to a width of one half-mile from high-water mark.

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FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

1. Where the Trustees desire the attendance of any 1. Where the Trustees desite the attendance of any person before them for the purpose of giving evidence or producing any documents they shall issue a summons in the form in the Schedule hereto, or as near thereto as the circumstances may require. Where the Trustees the circumstances may require. Where the Trustees desire the person summoned to produce documents, the documents shall be specified so far as possible to identify them.

2. Every summons to a witness may be served either personally or by leaving the same at his place of busi-ness or place of abode, and the person serving the sum-mons shall make a statutory declaration setting out the date, time, and method of service and indicating the place where service has been effected.

3. Where a witness is required to travel more than one mile for the purpose of giving evidence, he shall be paid reasonable conduct money to enable him to attend.

4. Any person who, having been summoned in accord-ance with these Regulations for the purpose of giving evidence, fails to attend in accordance with the requisitions of the summons or, having attended, fails to answer any question or produce any document in his power to answer or to produce, commits an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

"Approved electric lamp" means an electric lamp

"Approved electric lamp" means an electric lamp approved by the Director of Navigation, Common-wealth of Australia, the British Board of Trade, or the American Bureau of Standards. "Approved safety lamp" means a safety lamp approved by the Director of Navigation, Common-wealth of Australia, the Commonwealth of Aus-tralia, the British Board of Trade, or the American Bureau of Standards Bureau of Standards.

"Certificate of test" means a certificate of test, in the prescribed form, given by a competent analyst in respect of a tank or any other part of a vessel which has been carrying oil or inflammable liquids that he has carried out a test in an adequate and suitable manner for the presence of inflammable vapour and found the space or spaces to be free therefrom.

"Competent analyst," for the purpose of these Regulations, means a member of the Institute of Chemistry of Great Britain and Ireland or of the Australian Chemical Institute, with special knowledge of inflammable liquids and oils, or any other competent person approved by the Commissioners.

"Tank" means any tank, compartment, or space which contains or has contained any oil or inflammable liquid, or any sludge deposit or residue therefrom.

(a) Until a certificate of test has been obtained, no person shall bring near, or take into any tank, any naked light, fire, or lamp (other than an approved electric lamp) or apparatus of any kind for producing a light or spark, nor enter it, except for the purpose of testing the atmosphere or for the necessary preliminary cleaning.

(b) If the eargo last contained in the tank was Inflammable Liquid Group A, a fresh certificate of test shall be obtained daily before work is commenced or continued therein, and if during the course of the work any pipe or joint in the tank is broken, or any other risk arises of inflammable liquid or vapour therefrom entering the tank, work therein shall be suspended until a further certificate of test shall have been obtained.

(c) No naked lights, fires, or lamps other than approved electric lamps, and no apparatus of any kind for producing a light or spark shall be permitted in any part of a vessel where oil or inflammable liquid has been carried, until a certificate of test shall have been obtained in respect of that part.

(d) Every certificate of test, or a copy thereof, shall, immediately upon receipt, be posted in a conspicuous place, where it can be easily read by all persons concerned.

(e) The following provisions shall apply in connection with the preliminary cleaning of tanks:-----

(1) All sludge deposit or residue therein shall first be removed; where it is necessary for any person to be employed in the cleaning of a tank which has contained Inflammable Liquid Group A, he shall be provided with suitable breathing apparatus consisting of a helmet or facepiece with necessary connections by means of which he can breath outside air.

(2) The tank shall be thoroughly steamed by means of steam jets for such periods as will insure the vaporisation of all volatile oil or inflammable liquid.

(3) After the tank has been steamed, all covers of manholes and other openings therein shall be removed, and the tank shall be thoroughly ventilated by mechanical or other efficient means, so as to insure the removal of all inflammable vapour; the interior surfaces including covers shall, if any deposit remains thereon, be washed or scraped down with a wooden or other suitable tool.

(4) The person in charge shall take precautions that no matches or other means of producing fire or sparks are carried by the men who are employed in the cleaning of a tank.

(5) No person employed in the cleaning of a tank shall smoke in or take matches or other means of producing fire or sparks into such tank.
(f) Such further precautions shall be taken as may be required by the Harbour Master.

11. Repairs in Tank of Vessels.—Where repairs are being carried out on or in any tank in which there is a possibility of the presence of inflammable or explosive fumes and in respect of which a certificate of test is required under these regulations—

(a) no lamps other than approved electric lamps or approved safety lamps shall be used; (b) no fire, naked light, or heated rivet shall be taken into any tank or compartment without the written authority of the person giving the certificate of test that, as far as he is able to ascertain, work may be undertaken without danger to the vessel or the men employed.

Part A.—General Provisions.

(3) Red Flag and Red Light.—While within the port there shall be displayed on the vessel, by day, a red flag not less than three feet square, with a white circular centre six inches in diameter, and by night, a red light of approved design at the masthead or other conspicuous place, but not less than twenty feet above the deck, so that the flag or light is clear of all obstructions and clearly visible in all directions, provided that, if such vessel is a barge which cannot normally comply with this provision, the master or owner of such barge shall display by day in a conspicuous position above the deck a red flag of metal, not less than eighteen inches square, with a white circular centre six inches in diameter, and by night an all round red light of approved design.

Part B-Vessels with Inflammable Liquid otherwise than in Bulk.

(3) Ventilation of Holds after Unloading.—All holds from which inflammable liquids in drums, tins, or other packages have been unloaded shall be thoroughly ventilated. The bilges shall be carefully cleaned by removing any liquids by hand pumps, suitable wooden bailers, and by swabbing, and afterwards suitably ventilated. Fire or unauthorised light shall not be permitted at or near such hold until a certificate of test shall have been obtained.

Part C—Special provisions with respect to Tank Ships. By deleting paragraph 3 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

(3) Matches, smoking, etc., prohibited.—Before entering the Inner Harbour all matches shall be collected from members of the crew and other persons on the vessel, and no person shall smoke or bring matches or other means of making a fire or light on the vessel while such vessel is within the Inner Harbour.

By deleting Clause (a) of paragraph 5 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:---

Fires and Lights on Tank Ships.

(a) From the time when the tanks or holds of tank ships carrying inflammable liquid are first unscaled or opened for the purpose of loading or unloading inflammable liquid until such tanks or holds have been closed and sealed down, no fires or lights other than approved electric lamps or approved safety lamps shall be lit or used either on board the vessel or on shore within one hundred feet of any place at which inflammable liquid is being loaded or unloaded.

10. Repairs or Alterations to Tanks.—Immediately it becomes known that repairs or alterations are necessary to tanks in which oil or inflammable liquid has been conveyed, application shall be made to the Harbour Master for permission to undertake such work. Repairs or alterations involving operations such as welding, cutting, boring, soldering, or hammering, which may produce heat or be liable to cause the ignition of inflammable vapours, shall not be commenced until the said permission, in writing, has been obtained, and then not until the measures prescribed in Regulation 204 (10) and (11) shall have been taken.

TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1935.

Traffic Regulations, 1936-Additions and Amendments. P.W. 339/36

REGULATIONS Nos. 41 and 46 of the Traffic Regulations, 1936, published in the Government Gazette on the 26th day of August, 1936, are hereby deleted and the following inserted in lieu thereof:---

41. Every trailer the weight of which together with the load which it is licensed to carry exceeds twenty-five hundredweight shall have an efficient braking system, the brakes of which act upon-

(a) at least two wheels, in the case of a trailer having not more than four wheels; and
(b) at least four wheels, in the case of a trailer having more than four wheels,

and so constructed that the brakes are capable of being set so as effectually to prevent two at least of the wheels from revolving and so prevent the trailer from moving off under its momentum when the trailer is stationary. Provided that this regu-lation shall not apply in respect of a trailer which is exclusively used outside the South-West Land Division as described under "The Land Act, 1933-1934.

THE WATER BOARDS ACT, 1904, AND AMENDMENTS.

Reedy Water Area By-laws.

Division 1. Interpretations.

1. (a) The words "Authorised," "By-laws," "Dis-trict," "Fittings," "Local Authority," "Minister," "Occupier," "Owner," "Pipe," "Prescribed," "Rate-payer," "Rateable land," "Road," "Reservoir," "Stream," "Water Area," "Waterworks," and "Works" shall have meanings severally attached to them in "The Water Boards Act, 1904," hereinafter referred to as the principal Act, or any amending Act, and the By-laws made thereunder

and the By-laws made thereunder. (b) "Reservoir" shall mean any reservoir, dam, tank, (c) "Minister" shall mean the Minister for Water

(c) "Minister" shall mean the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, acting in pursuance of "The Water Boards Act, 1904," and "The Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912." (d) "Inspector" and "Local Officer" respectively shall mean a person appointed by the Minister for the purposes of these By-laws, or to administer the said By-laws

laws.

(e) "Domestic supply": A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply for cattle or for horses, or for any steam engine, or for washing carriages, or motor vehicles where such horses or car-riages or motor vehicles are kept for hire or are the property of any dealer, or for any hotel, inn, trade, manu-facturer, or business whatever, or for watering gardens, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purposes. (f) ''Private service'': For the purpose of these By-laws ''Private service'' includes all the pipes and fit-tings and all connections and apparatus of whateopere

atings, and all connections and apparatus, of whatsoever nature or kind, and whether used temporarily or otherwise, on any part of the premises of the owner or occu-pier of any premises supplied with water, whether by meter or otherwise, and includes any pipes or fittings, the property of the consumer, which are used for con-veying water from the mains of the Minister, whether situated on the premises of the consumer or otherwise.

Division 2.

Preventing Pollution of the Water and Protecting the Works.

2. No person shall bathe or wash clothes or other articles in any reservoir or other waterworks within the water area, or wash, throw, or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal; or throw or convey, or permit to be conveyed or thrown therein any rubbish, dirt, filth, dead animal, or other noisome thing or otherwise cause any pollution of water within the Water Area.

No Trespassing.

3. No person shall, without proper authority, enter any machinery house, valve house, or other portion of the works not open to the public, or enter any enclosure within the water area containing a tank, reservoir, meter, house, store, office, or other waterworks.

No Advertising.

4. No person shall pest any bills, advertisements, or other notices on any portion of any waterworks or grounds in the vicinity thereof.

Division 3.

Licensing of Plumbers.

Plumbing work shall be done by Licensed Plumbers.

5. No person shall do or cause to be done any work within the water area in connection with the water supply of any premises, or in connection with any fitting or apparatus connected therewith, unless he shall have first been duly admitted by the Minister as a 'Licensed Water Plumber.'

Description and Scope of Licenses.

6. The conditions upon which licenses will be issued by the Minister are:—(a) The Minister will grant Water Supply Plumbers' Licenses, operative only in the area to which these By-laws apply, to water supply plumbers, upon the applicants satisfying the Minister that they are competent water supply plumbers, and that they are fit and proper persons to hold such licenses, and the complicants more here around the complicants area more interval. the applicants may be required to submit to an examination in the theory and practice of plumbing work.

Annual Fee for License.

7. A fee of ten shillings shall be payable for every license, except when a license is granted after the tenth day of July in any year, in which case the fee shall be five shillings.

Renewal of License.

8. Licenses issued by the Minister under the By-laws and Regulations shall be current only from the 1st January to the 31st December of the year of issue, and water supply plumbers shall apply for a renewal, and pay the necessary fee before the expiry of the year for which their existing license is current.

List of Licensed Plumbers shall be Published.

9. A list of licensed water supply plumbers shall, from time to time, be published at the Office of the Minister.

Breaches of By-laws by Plumbers.

10. Any licensed water supply plumber offending against any By-law or Regulation, or who shall refuse to against any By-law of Regulation, of who shall refuse to give any needful or proper information required by an officer of the Minister, either by himself or those em-ployed by him, or who fails to complete any contract with the Minister, or with a private owner, within the time specified, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Twenty pounds, and he shall also show cause why his license shall not be suspended or cancelled. Any person who has been removed from the list shall not be re-admitted as a licensed water supply plumber until he shall have served the suspension order, or paid such fine, not exceeding Twenty pounds, as the Minister may determine.

Delay in Work.

11. Plumbers shall execute any work they undertake with reasonable despatch, and any inconvenience to the public caused by licensed water supply plumbers by unnecessary delay in carrying out work will be rigor-ously dealt with by the Minister.

Accidents to Pipes shall be Reported.

12. Accidents caused by licensed water supply plumbers to water, gas, or other pipes shall be at once re-ported and immediate steps taken to have repairs effected, and the cost of same shall be defrayed by such plumber.

Deposit and Declaration.

13. Prior to issue of the license, the person to whom the same is to be issued shall deposit with the Minister a sum of Five pounds, which shall be retained during the currency of the license as a security for the proper performance of all work done by him, and shall sign a declaration that he accepts such license, subject to and in conformity with the conditions thereof and with the Regulations of the Minister, and that he will conform thereto and comply therewith.

Deductions from Deposit.

14. The Minister may deduct from such deposit any fine inflicted, or the expense of making good any bad work of the licensed water supply plumber or his work-men, and, as often as any amount is so deducted, the licensed water supply plumber shall make good the deposit to the sum of Five pounds, and, in default, his license will be cancelled.

Change of Address to be Notified.

15. Every licensed water supply plumber shall, with-in forty-eight hours of any change in his address, give notice in writing thereof to the Minister.

Division 4.

Water Supply Plumbing.

16. In connection with the laying down, maintenance, alteration, or repair of every private service, the fol-lowing Regulations shall be observed by the owner or occupier of the premises whereon such service is :--

- (a) all pipes and fittings shall be of lead or galvanised wrought or malleable iron, of a standard approved of by the Minister for use in country water supplies under his control;
- (b) no service pipe shall communicate directly with (b) no service pipe shall communicate directly with any cistern, tank, or vessel intended or used for the reception of rainwater, or made or used below the surface of the ground;
 (c) no part of any service shall communicate directly with the water in any steam boiler or other apparatus used for the generation of steam, but the food water shall be surphied in such a man
- the feed water shall be supplied in such a manner that none of the water in the boiler or such other apparatus can return into the main or service pipe;
- (d) Every water closet fitting shall be approved of by the Minister, and shall be supplied from the service pertaining to the tenement through a proper cistern or service box fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus; no service pipe shall communicate directly with a basin or trap, or otherwise than with the cistern of a water closet.
- (e) In every bath the outlet shall be distinct from and unconnected with the inlet or inlets, and the inlet or inlets shall be placed at least one inch above the highest water-level of the bath; the
- above the highest water-level of the bath; the outlet of every bath shall be provided with a perfectly water-tight plug.
 (f) Every urinal shall be supplied only through a cistern or service box, fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus; no service pipe shall communicate directly with any urinal.

Maintenance of Private Services.

17. (a) The owner or occupier for the time being of any premises supplied with water shall, at his own risk and expense, and, subject to the provisions of these

risk and expense, and, subject to the provisions of these By-laws, arrange with a licensed plumber to lay down his private service, and keep it in good order and repair, and so that the same shall at all times be in accordance with the By-laws for the time being. (b) The service pipe, being the property of the owner or occupier of the land supplied by such service pipes, the occupier (if any) and, if none, the owner shall upon receiving notice that his service pipe requires repairing, immediately arrange with a licensed plumber to repair immediately arrange with a licensed plumber to repair the same, subject to the provisions of these By-laws, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, and, in default, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after receipt of such notice, and the Minister may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe, or otherwise, as the Minister may see fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

(c) Without prejudice to the right of the Minister to proceed for any penalty for the breach or non-observ-ance of any of the provisions of these By-laws, the Minister may cut off the supply of water to any premises whereon the private service or any part thereof is not at all times laid, fixed, used, or maintained in all respects in accordance with the provisions of the said By-law, and may keep the same cut off until such provisions have been fully observed.

Interference within Three Feet of Meter.

18. Licensed plumbers or other persons shall not, under any circumstances, disconnect the joints from the meter, or, after a meter has once been fixed on a service and water has been turned on, disconnect or interfere with any piping within three feet of such meter. Such work shall be done only by the servants of the Minister. 19. The mains shall be tapped only by the workmen of the Minister.

20. No licensed plumber or operative plumber shall interfere with any pipe or fitting belonging to the water-works without the permission, in writing, of a local officer first obtained.

Inspection of Works.

21. Work shall not be undertaken in connection with water supply, or in the extension or alteration thereof, until such time as the necessary printed permit is ob-tained. Two days' notice shall in all cases be given by the licensed plumber before work is intended to be com-menced, unless the officer of the Minister duly appointed to issue permits expressly accepts shorter notice. In no case shall any water pipe or apparatus in connection with water supply be used until the said work shall have been inspected, and, if necessary, tested by the said officer and certified by him on the prescribed form. No underground or enclosed work shall be covered up or concealed from view until the same shall have been duly inspected and passed by the inspector, and for this purpose the person to whom the permit has been issued shall immediately report any work which is ready for inspection or test, and every facility shall be afforded to such officer for making such inspection or tests.

Division 5.

General Purposes.

Application for Services.

22. Application for services shall be made on the printed form procurable at the Head or Branch Office, and shall be lodged not less than two weeks before the service is required.

23. Applications will not be entertained unless full information, as indicated on the printed form, is sup-plied, and the full amount of rates due on the premises to which a service is required is paid.

Supply to non-rated Premises.

24. Any person or persons requiring a water service to any non-rated property may be supplied, on payment of a minimum charge, which shall be fixed by the Minis-ter in each case. The minimum charge shall then take the place of a water rate, and the general provisions of these By-laws, as applying to ratepaying consumers, shall apply to minimum-charge-paying consumers.

Supply of Water not Compulsory.

25. It shall be at the discretion of the Minister to supply water to any individual consumer or to any land, whether rated or not.

Separate Services Required.

26. Except with the written permission of the Minister, not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Minister may, in special cases, consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the subservices shall be so arranged that the supply to each house shall be independent of the supply to the remain-ing houses and controlled by a stopcock on such subservice.

Sizes of Service Pipes.

27. The size of the service pipe shall in each case be fixed at the discretion of the Minister.

Notice of intention to Build.

28. The owner or occupier of any land supplied with 28. The owner or occupier of any land supplied with water within a water area who shall erect or make, or cause to be erected or made, any building or addition to an existing building on such land shall, before the commencement of same, give notice in writing thereof to the Minister.

Locking of Taps, etc.

29. The occupier of any premises to which the water has been laid on or, in the event of there being no occur pier, the owner, shall cause proper means to be taken, by locks or otherwise, subject to the approval of the Minister, to prevent the use of the water from the main by persons not connected with the said premises.

30. No service pipe shall communicate directly with any eistern, tank, or vessel intended or used for the reception of water other than water obtained from the Minister's mains.

Misuse of Water.

31.Any person entitled to a supply of water for domestic purposes only, or entitled only to a supply of water for any other specified purposes, shall not use such water for any other purposes, except that specified.

Illegal taking or selling of Water.

32. Any person, whether entitled to receive water from the Minister or not, shall not, without the written permission of the Minister, take, carry away, or allow to be taken or carried away, such water from his premises, or sell the same to any other person.

Turning off when Repairing and Tapping.

33. The Minister may, from time to time, when neces-sary for the purpose of tapping and repairing the main or otherwise, cut off the supply of water from any part or parts of a water area.

Waste of Water.

34. Any person supplied with water by the Minister, whether by meter or otherwise, shall not allow the same to run to waste.

Fixing of Meters.

35. Any officer appointed by the Minister for the purpose may fix a meter on any service, and shall determine the size and class of meter in each case. Meters will be supplied by the Minister and may be opened or encased, at the discretion of the Minister.

Repairs and Maintenance of Meters.

36. Any person supplied with water through a meter belonging to the Minister shall pay the cost of making good all damages to such meter whilst on his land and his charge. Any repairs required shall be done by the officers of the Minister, and the expense incurred by the Minister in so doing shall on domand he paid by the Minister in so doing shall on demand be paid by the owner or occupier of the land, and if not paid on demand shall be recoverable in the same manner as water rates.

Notice of Damage or Non-registration of Meter shall be given.

37. Any person supplied by the Minister with water through a meter shall, on finding that meter is damaged or not registering, immediately give notice of the fact to the Local Water Supply Office.

Interference with Meters.

38. No person shall break or in any way interfere with the seal fixed on the meter through which water is supplied by the Minister, or turn or attempt to turn any screw, bolt, or nut on or attached to such meter, or use any tool or appliance on any such meter, or in-troduce or attempt to introduce any body or substance into such meter, or in any way interfere with any portion of such meter or any pipes or fittings attached thereto.

Period for Reading.

39. The quantity registered by a meter at any time between ten days before and ten days after any stated date may be taken as the reading of the meter at such stated date.

Averaging of Consumptions.

40. During the time any meter is undergoing repairs, or should it cease to properly register the consumption of water, the Minister, or any officer appointed by the Minister, may at his option estimate the quantity of water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during such previous period as the Minister may detonuing on the quantity according to the second determine, and the quantity so ascertained shall be paid for by the consumer.

Testing of Meters.

41. If any consumer shall at any time be dissatisfied 41. If any consumer shall at any time be dissatisfied with any particular reading of a meter, and be desirous of having the meter tested, he shall give written notice thereof to the Minister or his officer, within seven days of such reading, and thereupon the said meter shall be tested by passing through it a predetermined quantity of water, and if upon such testing of water it shall appear to the satisfaction of the Minister or his officer that the meter registered more than five per cent. in excess of the quantity that shall actually pass through it at such testing, then the Minister shall bear the ex-pense of and incidental to such testing, and shall also adjust the charge to the said consumer; but if the meter upon such testing shall not register more than five per cent. in excess of the quanty that shall actually pass through it, then the consumer shall pay to the Minister of and incidental to even the testing. all the expenses of and incidental to such testing; providing that the expense of every test shall be fixed by the Minister, subject to a minimum charge of ten shil-lings for each test: provided, also, that the consumer shall not be at liberty to avail himself of the right to test the registration of the meter for any period other than the period of registration next preceding the date of reading in respect of which he shall have given notice as aforesaid.

Authority to enter Premises.

42. Any officer acting under the Minister's authority may at all reasonable times enter any house or premises connected or intended to be connected with the water mains, in order to examine whether the water pipes and hindering such officer in the execution of his duty shall be liable to a penalty as hereinafter prescribed.

Gratuities Prohibited.

43. No officer, workman, or agent of the Minister shall solicit or receive any fee or gratuity whatever.

Division 6.

Rates and Charges.

Rating.

44. Within the Reedy Water Area the water rate shall be at a rate not exceeding Three shillings in the pound per annum upon the net annual value of all rateable land: provided that a minimum rate of not exceeding One pound per annum shall be payable on each separately assessed piece of land.

Rates-How Payable.

45. Water rates shall become due and payable yearly, in advance, on each first day of January: Pro-vided that in all cases where a water rate is made after the first day of January in any year, the notice of the order for the making and levying of such rate, published in the *Government Gazette* and a newspaper, as pro-vided by Section 94 of the said Act, shall specify the minimum sum payable as rate as aforesaid, and the date or dates when the rate shall be due and payable, and such rate shall be and become due and payable in accordance with the terms of such notice.

Allowance for Rate.

46. Every ratepayer will be entitled to consume on each separately assessed property for which he is rated that quantity of water which, if calculated at a price not exceeding six shillings and eightpence per thousand gallons, would amount to the equivalent of the water rate paid on such property: provided that such water be taken during the period for which the rate is struck.

Payment for Excess Water.

47. Every ratepaying consumer taking water in excess of the quantity to which he is entitled in respect of the rate shall pay for the excess in accordance with prices set forth in the Schedule 1 hereto.

Fees—State or Commonwealth Government Departments.

48. For each water service for purposes of any State or Commonwealth Department there shall be payable, as a minimum annual fee in lieu of water rate, the sum of not less than One pound $(\pounds 1)$, when the service is metered, and not less than One pound ten shillings $(\pounds 1)$ 10s.) when the service is non-metered. It shall be at the discretion of the Minister as to whether or not a meter shall be fixed in each case.

Fees for additional Services.

49. In any case where the owner or occupier of any separately rated piece of land requires more than one service to be installed for supplying water to such land, such additional service or services shall, at the discretion of the Minister, be installed, on such occupier or owner paying in advance the cost of installation and a fee of not less than One pound per annum, in addition to meter rent, for each additional service. In return for such fee an equivalent quantity of water will be given in each year, in the same way as water is given in return for water rates.

Meter Rents.

50. Meters will be supplied by the Minister, and may, in the discretion of the Minister, be open or encased, and every person supplied with water by measure to other than rateable premises or private residences shall pay meter rent in advance, according to the following scale :--

Reconnection Fee.

51. In every case in which the supply of water shall have been cut off by reason of non-payment of rates or other charges, or by reason of a defective service, or by request of the occupier or owner, or when in the opinion of the Minister or local officer necessary to prevent of the Minister or local officer necessary to prevent waste of water or for other reasons, a minimum fee of five shillings shall be charged for disconnection and reconnection; provided that, where the cost exceeds the minimum fee, the actual cost of the disconnection and reconnection, as determined by the Minister, shall be charged, and shall be payable by the owner or occupier for the time being, on demand. The service shall not be restored until such fee has been paid.

Private Fire Service.

52. Private fire services will be allowed, but every such service shall be sealed, except in cases where the Minister may decide that sealing is unnecessary. For each such service there shall be paid the actual cost of installation, and a fee equivalent to five per centum on cost per annum shall be paid in advance as rental, subject to a minimum fee for each service of Ten shillings per annum. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion, except for extinction of fire. In the event of the seal having been broken in case of fire or by accident, or otherwise, the occupier shall give notice, and pay the cost of rescaling.

When Accounts Due and Payable.

53. Where water is supplied by measure to the owner or occupier of land, whether rated under the Act or otherwise, payment for same shall become due and pay-able within 14 days after due service of the account, unless otherwise agreed upon.

Division 8.

Penalties.

Penalty for Breaches.

54. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws, to which no specific penalty is attached, or who shall refuse or neglect to obey any injunction in any such By-laws, or to comply with any requirements therein contained, shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, and, in case of continuing offence, a further penalty not exceeding £5 for each day after notice of such offence shall have been given by the Minister to such offender.

No. 9 of 1936.

Between The West Australian Cleaners, Caretakers, Lift Attendants, Window Cleaners, Attendants and Watchmen's Industrial Union of Workers (Perth), Applicant, and the Hon. the Premier of Western Australia, the Minister for Public Works, the Minis-ter for Labour and Employment, the Minister for Education, The Chief Secretary, the Minister for Mines, the Minister for Lands, the Minister for Agriculture, the Minister for Water Supply, the Minister for Justice, the Minister for State Trading Concerns, the Commissioner for Main Roads, the Chancellor of the University of Western Australia, the Commissioners of the Agricultural Bank, Re-spondents. spondents.

THE Industrial Board, in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon it by Section 107 of "The Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," and in pursuance of a remission to it by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the In-dustrial Dispute between the abovenamed parties:---

AWARD OF INDUSTRIAL BOARD.

1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to the various designations of workers specified in the Award, but shall not apply to workers in an industry already covered by an Award or industrial Agreement existing at the date of this Award.

2.—Area.

This Award shall operate over all that portion of the State of Western Australia south of parallel of latitude 22.

3.-Term.

The term of this Award shall be three (3) years from the date hereof: Provided that, after the expiration of one year from such date, either party may make appli-cation to the Court of Arbitration for leave to apply to the Court, or to this Industrial Board, to alter, amend, add to, or revise the same.

4.—Definitions.

(a) "Caretaker" shall mean a male person required to reside on or in the vicinity of the premises of his employer and who is responsible to his employer for the supervision and/or the general cleaning of such pre-

supervision and/or the general cleaning of such premises, and who is responsible for the safety of such premises after ordinary working hours.
(b) "Premises" shall include all buildings in occupation by State Departments or quasi-Government Departments to which this Award applies.
(c) "Cleaner" shall mean a person mainly employed in cleaning work of one description (including clear and constitution (including clear and constitution).

in cleaning work of any description (including glass partitions and windows) on premises or in bringing into or maintaining premises in a clean condition. (d) "Caretaker's quarters" in existing premises shall mean not less than two (2) rooms, with an aggre-

gate floor space of not less than two hundred and twentyeight (228) square feet, but in the case of premises eight (228) square feet, but in the case of premises which may be erected after the date of this Award, the term shall mean not less than three (3) rooms—two (2) rooms each with not less than one hundred and forty-four (144) feet of floor space, and one room with one hundred (100) feet of floor space, to be erected in con-formity with existing local Building By-laws. Caretakers' quarters in all cases must be reasonably suitable for human habitation, both in themselves and in their immediate surroundings

(e) "Watchman" shall mean a male person required

to watch and/or guard and/or patrol the building and/

to watch and/or guard and/or patrol the building and/ or premises of his employer. (f) 'Lift attendant' shall mean a male person em-ployed in any mechanical contrivance, running in a vertical shaft or well, within or attached to any build-ing worked by any power other than hand, and which comprises a cage or platform and is used for the pur-pose of raising persons or goods. This definition shall not apply to any cage or platform creeted on any mine

pose of raising persons or goods. This definition shall not apply to any cage or platform erected on any mine used solely for mining purposes. (g) 'Window cleaner'' shall mean a male worker employed exclusively or principally in window cleaning. (h) 'Attendants' shall include Judges' ushers, door-keepers, porters and janitors. (i) 'A casual worker'' shall mean a worker who is supergoid intormittently for a period not exceeding six

(6) consecutive days. Such worker shall be paid a minimum amount of two (2) hours' pay for each engagement.

Part I.-Cleaners. 5.-Hours.

(a) The hours of male cleaners shall be forty-four (44) per week, which shall be worked between six o'clock a.m. and seven o'clock p.m., from Monday to Friday in-clusive, and between six o'clock and twelve noon on Saturday.

(b) The hours of female cleaners shall not exceed forty-four (44) hours per week and shall be worked be-tween the hours of six o'clock a.m. and seven o'clock

tween the hours of six o'clock a.m. and seven o'clock p.m., from Monday to Friday inclusive, and between six o'clock a.m. and twelve o'clock noon on Saturday. Part VI.-Watchmen. 17.—Hours.

(a) The ordinary working hours of watchmen shall be eighty-eight (88) a fortnight. Such hours may be worked in not more than thirteen (13) shifts per fort-night and not more than ten (10) hours in any one hight and not more than ten (10) hours in any one shift, and not more than one shift in every twenty-four (24) hours. The employer may fix the number and duration of such shifts, and the worker shall be given forty-eight (48) hours' notice of any change of such shift.

(b) The ordinary working hours of a casual watch-man shall not exceed eight (8) hours on any day or night without payment of overtime. Casual watchmen shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) above the ordinary weekly rate of a watchman, calculated at an hourly rate, and shall be entitled to a minimum of four (4) hours for each engagement, when such engagement does not exceed four (4) hours, and to a minimum of eight (8) hours for any engagement exceeding four (4) hours.

18.-Wages.

Part VII.—General. 19.—Overtime.

(a) Except as hereafter provided, and subject to Subclause (b) of Clause 5, all time worked in excess of or outside the usual hours, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours after the usual time for ceasing work, and double time there-after: Provided that workers called upon to start within

an hour and a half prior to the usual starting time shall be paid at the rate of time and a half until the usual starting time.

(b) All workers (except watchmen) whose ordinary working hours are between six o'clock a.m. and seven o'clock p.m. required to work on Sunday shall be paid

o'clock p.m. required to work on Sunday shall be paid for the time so worked, at double the ordinary rates, with a minimum engagement of four (4) hours. (c) For watchmen, all time in excess of eighty-eight (88) hours a fortnight, or in excess of ten (10) hours in any one shift, or time worked on Sundays, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day or Boxing Day, shall be paid at the rate of time and a guarter. and a quarter. (d) Provided that, in respect of the workers of the

Minister of Education who are granted holidays in ex-cess of those provided herein, any time worked by them holidays allowed to them during school vacations.

20.-Meal Hours.

(a) Except in the case of watching, is employed for at least six (6) hours, he or she shall be allowed one hour for a meal, between the fourth and sixth hours of such employment. If such hour is worked it shall be deemed to be overtime and paid for at the rate of one and a half times the ordinary rate.

(b) All workers required to do overtime work for more than one hour shall be paid one shilling and six-pence (1/6d.) for each meal, between the ordinary ceas-ing time and the completion of overtime work, unless notified thereof on the previous day, and unless the em-ployer provides such meals for them. In cases of emergency where workers are unable to leave their work to procure a meal, the same shall be provided by the employer.

21.-Holidays.

(a) Except for watchmen, the days upon which the following public holidays are observed shall be holidays under this Award, namely, New Year's Day, Anniver-sary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Mon-day, Anzae Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(b) For the purpose of this Award, where the rate of wages is a weekly rate, double time shall mean one day's wages in addition to the prescribed weekly rate;

or pro rata if there is more or less than a day. (c) For the purpose of this Award, where the rate of wages is a weekly rate, time and a half shall mean one half day's wages in addition to the prescribed weekly rate; or pro rata if there is more or less than a day.

22.-Annual Leave.

22.—Annual Leave. (a) After the completion of twelve (12) months' service all workers, other than watchmen and casuals, shall be granted two (2) weeks' holiday on full pay. (b) Watchmen shall be granted three (3) weeks' holiday on full pay for each year worked since previous holidays or date of engagement. (c) A worker (other than a watchman) who leaves his employment, or is dismissed, or retired, shall be en-titled to receive one day's holiday pay for each month worked since previous holidays, or since the date of engagement. engagement.

(d) Watchmen (other than casuals) whose employment is terminated within twelve (12) months of engagement is terminated within twelve (12) months of engage-ment shall be entitled to receive one and a half (1.1/2)days' holiday pay for each month worked since pre-vious holidays, or since the date of engagement. (e) A worker dismissed for gross misconduct shall not be entitled to the benefit of Subclauses (b), (c), or (d)

above.

23.-Time and Wages Book.

(a) The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a Time Book and Wages Sheet, in either of which shall be entered :-

- (i) the name of each worker to whom this Award applies:
- (ii) the nature of the work performed;
- (iii) the hours worked each day;
- (iv) the wages and overtime (if any) paid to each worker;
- (v) in the case of junior workers, the age of each junior worker last birthday.

Workers shall record their starting and finishing times daily in the Time Book; and shall sign the Wages Sheet on receipt of their wages.

(b) The Time Book with all entries therein shall on demand be produced for inspection by the secretary or duly authorised official of the Union at any reasonable time. The Wages Sheet shall be similarly produced on demand during ordinary office hours.

24.-Posting Award.

A copy of this Award shall be posted in a suitable place on the premises of every employer.

25.---Notices.

The secretary or authorised person may post notices relating to Union business at a place where the copy of the Award is posted.

26.-Long Service Leave.

In accordance with the conditions adopted by the Western Australian Government, all full-time employees of that Government, whether male or female, shall be granted long service leave.

27.-Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of a worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the "Workers' Compensation Act."

Evidence satisfactory to the Department shall be pro-duced before payment of any wages is made under this clause.

28.--General Conditions.

(a) No female cleaner shall be permitted to ascend to a greater height from the floor or ground than three (3) feet to do any cleaning. The employer shall provide a suitable appliance for this purpose. (b) All workers called upon to clean closets connected

with septic tanks or sewerage shall receive an allow-ance of sixpence (6d.) per closet per week up to a maxi-mum amount of three shillings (3/-) per week. This

allowance shall not apply to cleaners employed exclusively on lavatories as provided by Clause 6 (a) (iii).

(c) Workers called upon outside their ordinary working hours to wash towels shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1/6) a dozen for ordinary towels; but where towels are rendered exceptionally dirty by grease, they shall be paid two shillings $(2/\cdot)$ per dozen.

Dusters shall be paid for at the rate of one shilling (1/-) per dozen. (d) Any worker who is required to clean windows

(d) Any worker who is required to clean windows when it is necessary to go wholly outside the windows, or climb around an outside column to do such cleaning, shall, if such cleaning and climbing is at a height of more than ten (10) feet from the ground, or verandah, be paid threepence (3d.) extra for each such window, unless the outside window or column ledge is more than twenty (20) inches wide. Provided that nothing in this subclause shall apply to cleaning from a ladder resting on the ground: Provided further, that no payment under this clause shall be due in cases where safety appliances are provided. Where such appliances are provided, the worker must use same.

(e) Where cleaning is done from a ladder and any portion of the window to be cleaned exceeds in height twenty-five (25) feet from the ground, the worker shall be paid threepence (3d.) per window extra for each window so cleaned: Provided that this clause shall not apply where such cleaning work is done from the interior of a building at a height not greater than twentyfive (25) feet from the floor: Provided further, that this clause shall not apply when an efficient safety device is provided.

(f) (i) Subject to Clause 27, any regular worker on a weekly engagement who may not have worked the maximum number of ordinary working hours in any one week shall be paid not less than the minimum weekly rate of wages specified herein for his or her particular class of work: Provided that such worker has been available to work the maximum number of ordinary working hours.

(ii) For the purpose of this subclause, time worked on statutory holidays within the limitations set out shall be deemed hours in which a worker was available to work the ordinary working hours.

(g) In the case of regular workers, other than casuals and caretakers, who are provided with quarters, one week's notice must be given by either side to the other when it is desired to terminate the engagement. In the case of caretakers who are provided with quarters, a fortnight's notice must be given. An employer may pay a week's or a fortnight's wages, as the case may be, in lieu of notice, and, in the case of a worker leaving without notice or before such notice expired, he shall forfeit all wages accruing due to him for the current week's services. Such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week.

(h) (i) For all workers, other than casuals, a week's notice shall be given by either side on the termination of service, or a week's pay forfeited in lieu thereof, except in cases of insubordination, dishonesty or drunkenness, when a worker shall be subject to instant dismissal and entitled to pay due to him up to the hour of dismissal.

(ii) The engagement of a casual hand may be terminated at any time: Provided that all wages due shall be paid at the termination of such engagement.

(i) Higher duties: A worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular rate of pay shall be paid such higher minimum for the particular shift whilst so employed upon such higher work; Provided that acting time less than twenty (20) minutes in any one shift shall not be counted.

Should any worker be required to perform work in a lower grade for any shift or portion thereof, his wages shall not be reduced whilst employed in such capacity.

(j) No reduction: Nothing contained in this Award shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award is being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his class of work.

(k) All cleaning materials and disinfectants shall be provided free by the employer.

(1) Rubber boots: Where the employer deems it necessary for the work, rubber boots shall be supplied by the employer in the following cases:---

- (i) Where a worker is required to use a hose on any place above the floor surface on which he is working;
- (ii) To wash with a hose any place for thirty (30) minutes or more continuously on any day;

(iii) Where a worker is required by the employer to work in the rain, suitable protective clothing shall be provided free by the employer.

In the event of any dispute as to the necessity of supplying such rubber boots, the matter shall be referred to the Board of Reference provided by Clause (r) hereof.

(m) Travelling time:

(i) Where a worker is sent to work from an employer's recognised place of business, the employer shall pay all travelling time from such place of business to the job, and if the worker is required to return the same day to the employer's place of business, the employer shall pay travelling time to the place of business.

(ii) A worker sent for duty to a place other than his regular place of duty shall be paid his excess travelling expenses.

(n) Change Room: Where practicable, suitable dressing accommodation shall be provided by the employer and time for changing clothes of the workers engaged in the industry shall be included in the time set out for the week's work. Ten (10) minutes per day shall be allowed for changing clothes. Cleaning material shall not be kept in the dressing room.

(o) In cases of urgent necessity, nightwatchmen shall be permitted to leave the premises subject to their notifying the officer-in-charge at the first available opportunity and their returning to duty as soon as possible.

(p) Watchmen shall be provided with facilities for boiling water, where practicable.

(q) Employers shall allow watchmen to eat their meals in some clean place protected from the weather, and every such worker shall leave such place in a thoroughly clean condition.

(r) Board of Reference:

(i) A Board of Reference is hereby appointed for the purposes of this Award. Such Board shall consist of a chairman and four (4) representatives, two (2) to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Award, or any of them;
- (b) classifying and fixing wages rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
- (c) deciding any other matters that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.
- (d) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations to ''The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935,'' which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

(s) Where a worker is required to work before the starting time or after the cessation of transport, namely, trains, trams, and omnibuses, the employer shall, if reasonably necessary, provide the means of transport to enable the worker to travel to or from his or her residence.

29.—Preference.

Every person who is at present employed, or may at any time hereafter become employed on work to which this Award applies, shall not be continued in employment unless he or she is a member of the West Australian Cleaners, Caretakers, Lift Attendants, Window Cleaners, Attendants, and Watchmen's Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, or makes application to join the said Union within fourteen (14) days of engagement.

Provided that any person who is a member of another recognised Industrial Union shall not be required to join the Cleaners and Caretakers' Union until the expiry of his current ticket with the other Union: Provided also, that this clause shall not operate in regard to casual workers or to part-time female workers engaged for less than twelve (12) hours per week and employed outside a radius of twenty-five (25) miles of the General Post Office, Perth.

30.—Uniforms.

Any special uniform or staff dress required by the employer to be worn by workers shall be provided by the employer.

31.-District Allowances.

District allowance will not apply where a worker is absent without pay, unless such absence is due to the Workers leaving the service for any cause and due for

22 .-- Cleaning of Schools-Schedule of Piecework Rates and Conditions.

(a) In schools, workers may be employed to perform Three shillings and fourpence (3/4) per week for every five hundred and fifty (550) square feet of floor space. Such rates shall be subject to review on basic wage declarations.

(b) The calculation of floor space shall be as follows:-

- (i) Classrooms, corridors, passages, cloakrooms, verandahs, and lavatories shall be counted at full rates.
- (ii) Shelter sheds shall be counted at half rates: Provided that, if desks are used in such shelter shed, they shall be counted at full rates
- (iii) Six (6) closets shall be counted at the same rate as five hundred and fifty (550) square feet of floor space and a lesser number shall be counted at proportionate rates.

(c) Where a school is held in a public hall or other

(c) Where a school is held in a public hall or other hired building, special rates for school cleaning, not less than those prescribed by this Award, may be fixed. (d) Holidays: New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day shall be holidays and paid for at ordinary rates. If workers are required to work on such holidays, an extra day's payment shall be made for each holidays. an extra day's payment shall be made for each holiday worked.

(e) Sick leave: All workers engaged under this Award shall be entitled to sick leave, in accordance with All workers engaged under this Clause 27 hereof.

(f) Annual leave: After the completion of twelve (12) months' continuous service, all workers shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' annual leave. Leave due shall be taken during the Christmas school vacation: Provided that, if the service is terminated before the completion of twelve (12) months' service, one day's holiday pay shall be granted for each month's continuous service.

(g) No female shall be permitted to ascend to a greater height from the floor or ground than three (3) feet to do any cleaning.

(h) Chopping of firewood by female cleaners is here-

by prohibited. (i) Cleaning material: All necessary cleaning material shall be supplied by the Department free of cost to the worker.

(j) Long Service Leave, in accordance with the terms of Clause 26 of this Award, shall apply to cleaners em-ployed on piecework in schools classed from one (1) to

four (4). (k) One week's notification of the termination of the contract of cleaning by piecework shall be given on either side. One day's holiday pay shall be paid for ach completed month of service under the contract.

(1) Provided that, where convenient to the Department, no teacher, male or female, or scholar, shall perform cleaning work where there is a person other than a teacher or scholar able and willing to perform the necessary cleaning work: Provided further, that no mas-ter or mistress of a Government School—Class (1) to (4)-shall be allowed to do cleaning work.

(4)—shall be allowed to do cleaning work. (m) The piecework method of cleaning shall only be applied to schools classified from two (2) to four (4) inclusive: Provided that this restriction will only be applied in circumstances that will allow any female cleaners displaced thereby being found other employment.

Except where the contrary is expressly stated in (n)this Schedule, nothing contained in this Award outside this Schedule shall apply to workers engaged by contract on piecework.

General Hospital Industrial Agreement.

No. 21 of 1936.

Operating from 1st June, 1936.

Operating from 1st June, 1936. THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," this First day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, between the Minister for Public Health for the State of Western Australia, as the Minister Controlling the Fre-mantle Hospital; the King Edward Memorial Hospital, and the Old Women's Home, Fremantle (the said Minis-ter for Public Health entering into these presents in respect of the said Fremantle Hospital, and the King Edward Memorial Hospital, and the Old Women's Home, Fremantle, only). the Perth Public Hospital (herein-Fremantle, only); the Perth Public Hospital (herein-after called "the employers"), of the one part, and the Hospital Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. (Coastal Branch) (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part; witnesseth that, for the considerations hereafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows: follows ;-

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office, in the City of Perth.

2.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three years from the 1st June, 1936.

3.—Definition.

"Head orderly."-The term "Head orderly" shall mean a person performing the duties of an orderly, and who is responsible for directing the activities of other orderlies.

4.-Hours of Duty.

(a) Laundry workers:-Forty-four hours shall con-stitute a week's work, and, except where other hours are mutually agreed upon between the Union and any institution, shall be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and between 8 a.m. and noon on Saturdays.

(b) In the event of altered hours being required by any institution and the Union not agreeing to such alteration, the matter may be referred to a Reference Board for decision.

(c) All other workers :- Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work, and shall be worked on any six days of the week. Provided that eighty-eight hours days of the week. Provided that eighty-eight hours may be worked in eleven days each fortnight, at the option of the employer.

5.—Overtime.

(a) Laundry staff.—All time worked in excess of eight hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and four hours on Saturday, shall be regarded as overtime and be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and thereafter double time.

(b) All other workers:—All time worked in any day in excess of the time for which the worker is rostered shall be regarded as overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and thereafter double time:

Provided that, if the overtime is occasioned through the failure of another worker to report for duty, equiva-lent time off duty may be granted in lieu of paying for overtime.

(c) Workers required to work on the day on which they are rostered off duty shall, at the option of the worker, be paid at the rate of double time for time worked or be paid at ordinary rates and allowed equivalent time off.

(d) Workers called upon to work, in addition to ordinary duties, in the venereal clinic at night shall, for time so worked during the night, be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and thereafter double time.

6.—Rosters.

Weekly rosters shall be kept posted in a convenient place, setting out the hours of starting and finishing, and the duties of each worker thereon, together with the day each worker is booked off duty. Such roster shall be drawn up in such a manner as to show the hours of each worker, forty-eight hours preceding the date on which the roster commences and may only be altered on account of sickness or the absence of a worker, or on account of any contingency that the employer could not reasonably foresee.

7.-Time Book.

(a) A time book, to be open for inspection by the Union secretary at reasonable time, shall be provided. Each worker must record in such book the exact time he or she starts and finishes duty on each day, and also the time booked off for meals or breaks in shift; pro-vided that, if the ''clocking'' system be introduced it will, for the purpose of this clause, be considered as a time book.

(b) The Wages sheets shall, upon reasonable notice being given, be open for inspection by the secretary at the head office of the Institution.

8.-Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as holidays, namely-New Year's Day, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day. Any worker required to work on any of the foregoing days shall be paid at the rate of double time, or shall have one day added to their annual holiday for each day so worked, at the option of the employer.

(b) A holiday of three weeks on full pay, without any deductions being made for board and lodgings, shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service. A worker not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holiday in proportion to the length of his or her service. Provided always, that if the worker be dismissed for misconduct or any offence, no payment for annual leave or holidays will be granted for any offence, and payment for annual leave or holidays will be granted for any period subsequent to the date of the offence.

9.-Sick Leave.

(a) In the case of illness, provided a satisfactory medical certificate is furnished, full pay shall be allowed as follows:-

Workers with less than six months' service-nil.

Workers with six months' and less than one year's service-14 days.

Workers with one year's and less than two years' service-28 days.

Workers with two years' service and over-42 days. Such sick leave shall be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave on pay shall be as provided.

(b) The total sick leave in any one triennial period shall not exceed 42 days; the triennial period to be the three years preceding the date of illness for which leave is claimed.

(c) No payment for sick leave shall be made when the illness is due to the worker's own misconduct, or to an accident met with off duty.

(d) Sick leave, if granted, will only be recognised, provided a medical certificate be placed in the hands of the Hospital secretary within forty-eight hours of the rostered time for commencement of duty.

11.—Payment of Wages.

Wages, including overtime, if any, shall be paid fort-nightly, and such payment shall be made in cash.

12.—Dressing Room.

Reasonable facilities for rest rooms for those boarding-in and dressing rooms for laundry staff living-out shall be provided.

13.---Uniforms.

(a) All uniforms, i.e., uniformity in dress, shall be supplied free of cost to all workers required to wear them. Aprons shall be provided for all female workers

(b) Suitable clothing shall be available for men on
(c) Boots shall be available for kitchenmen, laundry-

men, and washhousewomen.

14.—Casual Workers.

All persons engaged for a period of less than six days in any one week shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent., in addition to the rates hereinbefore pre-seribed, with a minimum engagement of one day: Pro-vided that this shall not apply in the case of a worker summarily dismissed for misconduct.

15.-No Reduction.

Provided that nothing contained in this Agreement shall operate to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Agreement is being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

16.-General Clauses.

(a) No female worker shall be called upon to clean men's lavatories in or about any institution.

(b) A worker required to take a day off duty not

(b) A worker required to take a day off duty not already shown on the roster for such day must be so informed before booking off on the day previous.
(c) All washing to be provided as at present.
(d) Space shall be provided at the workers' quarters for the purpose of posting Union notices.
(e) A worker who is required to do work which carries a higher rate in this Agreement than that which such worker usually performs shall be entitled to the higher rate while so employed.
(f) When a worker is entitled to annual leave under this Agreement, such worker shall be given at least two weeks' notice of the date when such leave is to commence, and such leave shall be for an unbroken period. period.

(g) Copy of this Agreement shall be posted in a con-spicuous position by the secretary or Chief Resident Medical Officer of every Institution.

(h) Overtime rates shall be calculated and based on

(i) Overtime rates shall be calculated and based on the aggregate wage, i.e., the amount paid in cash plus the deduction for board and/or lodging.
(i) If a worker's day off falls on a day prescribed by this Agreement as a holiday, such worker shall be allowed another day in lieu thereof.
(j) Letter racks shall be provided in the dining rooms

for male and female workers.

(k) All workers covered by this Agreement shall within fourteen days of commencing work become members of the Hospital Employees' Union.
