FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:--

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or form-ing portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

PROCESS ENGRAVERS' AGREEMENT.

No. 7 of 1937. (Registered 10/3/1937.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," this 15th day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, between the Printing Industry Employees' Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, and J. Gibbney & Sons Ltd.; Art Photo Engravers (C. W. McKinlay); Williams and Sargant; Perth Engraving Works (J. A. Hatch), and C. L. McShane.

1.—Scope.

This Agreement shall relate to the Process Engraving Industry.

2.---Terms.

This Agreement, as regards conditions of working and rates of wages, etc., shall come into force from the commencement of the nearest working week to 15th February, 1937, and shall remain in operation without amendment being sought by either side for a term of at least (1) one year from the aforesaid datc, and, subject to thirty days' prior notice in writing by either party, shall terminate on 14th February, 1938. In the event of this Agreement not being terminated as aforesaid, it shall continue subject to thirty days' previous written notice by either party.

3.—Area.

This Agreement shall operate over the area contained within a radius of fifteen (15) miles of the G.P.O. of the city of Perth (excluding the premises in which the work of the ''West Australian'' newspaper is carried out by the proprietors of the ''West Australian'' newspaper).

4.

(a) Hours of Labour:

The maximum number of hours to be worked each week shall be:-Day work, 44 hours; night work, 40 hours.

(b) Spread of Hours:

Day work shall mean work done between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Work done by a day-worker before or after these hours shall be paid for at overtime rates. The maximum daily spread of shift shall be nine hours, inclusive of (1) one hour meal time. In offices where a (5) five day week is worked, the maximum daily spread of shift shall be 10 hours, inclusive of (1) one hour meal time. Work done beyond these hours shall be paid at overtime rates.

Night work shall mean work done between 6 30 p.m. and 8 a.m. Work done by a night worker before or after these hours shall be paid for at overtime rates.

(c) Mixed Shift:

In a factory where a regular shift is worked between the hours set down in this Agreement for day and night work, the wages shall be the rate proportionate to the number of hours day work and night work, and the hours shall be those for night shift. (Where a regular mixed shift is worked between the hours set down for day and night work in this Agreement, 6s. per week shall be added to the worker's ordinary wage.)

(d) The maximum nightly spread of shift shall be (8) eight hours, inclusive of one hour meal time. Work done beyond the shift shall be paid for at overtime rates. Where any regular mixed shift is worked, the work shall be rotated amongst the employees. Where a (5) five-day week is worked the maximum nightly spread shall be (9) nine hours inclusive of meal time.

(e) The hours of duty of all employees on night shift or unusual shift shall be arranged between each particular employer and the Printing Industry Employees' Union of W.A., or (if members of such Union are not employed his employees) and, in case they are unable to agree, by the Board of Reference.

(f) All employees working six full shifts a week day or night (i.e. employees who do not get a day-and-a-half or two days off consecutively, or who have to work after 1 o'clock noon on Saturday) shall be allowed one full shift off every two weeks, to be paid for. In the week in which the day or night off is taken, the weekly hours shall be reduced by one-sixth of the weekly hours agreed to respectively for each section. Roster:

A roster of daily hours shall be displayed in each workroom, one week's notice of variation to be given, and other requirements of Section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act shall be complied with.

5.—Wages.

- (a) The minimum weekly rate of wages shall be:-£ s. d.

(b) Any worker employed on night shift shall be paid 12s. per week extra in addition to the ordinary or day rate of pay, or 2s. per single shift, if less than one week

rate of pay, or 2s. per single shift, if less than one week. (c) Workers shall be paid at the rate for the classification at which they are usually employed and when put to work at a higher grade shall be paid the difference in the wages prescribed.

Provided that, if a worker is employed at the higher grade for more than two hours per day, he shall receive the higher wage for the full day. Provided also, that a permanent employee shall be continuously engaged in the higher grade.

(d) Pay Day:

An employee shall be paid on Thursday or Friday in each week, and not more than two days' pay shall be kept in hand by the employer.

Basic wage:

The basic wage upon which this Agreement is based is £3 13s. 9d. per week, for males.

6.—Overtime.

(a) All overtime rates earned by an employee shall be paid in full and no deduction shall be made from such overtime rates by reason of any time not worked by such employee.

(b) Overtime shall be rotated amongst employees in each section, and shall be charged for at the rate of time and one-half for the first three hours and double time thereafter. Sunday work shall be paid for at double time rates.

(c) No junior worker under seventeen years of age shall be on duty in any event before 8 a.m. or later than 9 p.m. on any working day.

(d) An employer shall not require or permit an employee to work overtime or on night shift in connection with power driven machinery, unless he works in company with at least one other person. Provided that an a) prentice shall not be permitted to work overtime unless at least one journeyman is employed in company with the said apprentice.

7.-Holidays.

Each employee shall receive twelve consecutive working days holidays in each year on full pay, at times convenient to the employer. Provided always, that should the services be brought to a termination after the expiration of three calendar months but before the expiration of twelve calendar months, the said twelve days holiday shall be commuted to a holiday for one day for each calendar month's service.

Permanent part-time employees averaging three or nore shifts per week shall receive proportionate holidays. Other part-time employees shall receive only such proportionate holidays as may be agreed upon between employer and the Union.

One day at Christmas, Good Friday, Easter Saturday and Labour Day shall be paid holidays, and should any employee be required to work on these days, he shall receive double pay for the time worked in addition to the holiday pay. Provided that, if given a day off on full pay within seven days of the paid holiday, he shall receive double pay only for the time worked.

8.-Meal Time.

Each person employed shall receive a meal time not less than one hour. Should an employer require an employee to work through his usual meal time, he shall pay such employee 5s. for each meal time worked, and, in addition, such employee shall be allowed time for a meal. Provided that the employer may vary the usual meal hour by half an hour.

9.-Sick Pay.

Permanent employees absent through sickness shall be paid full wages for the first week of absence, after which the legal liability of the employer shall cease.

10.—Casuals.

(a) A "casual" or a "part-time worker" is a worker paid by the hour or per day whose term of m-ployment in any one office does not exceed four continu-ous full weeks. For the purpose of this clause the con-tinuity of employment shall not be affected by reason of an interruption in any week due to any of the holidays provided in this Award.

(b) Casuals shall be guaranteed a full shift at night and four hours in the day time. A full shift shall mean one-sixth of the usual weekly working hours. All casuals shall be paid at the rate prescribed for their section per hour plus $12\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. for each shift. Casuals working day work, if employed for a full week, shall be paid the prescribed weekly wage, with no extra allow-ance per shift. (b) Casuals shall be guaranteed a full shift at night

(c) Casuals working mixed shifts, i.e., shifts commenc-ing before 6.30 p.m. and ending after 6.30 p.m. shall be paid day rates, providing the work after 6.30 p.m. does not exceed one hour. If it does, then night rates are to be paid throughout and the guarantee to be four hours.

(d) If employed for a full week at night, casuals shall be paid the prescribed weekly wage, plus five shillings, with no extra allowance per shift.

(e) A casual working for eleven (11) consecutive shifts shall be allowed one full shift off on full pay: Provided that, where such time is allowed off and paid for, the extra allowance for casuals shall not apply.

11.-Call Time.

Two hours' time shall be allowed as a call in addi-tion to the time worked, if any employee is sent for, or required to attend the factory to do any other special work not in the ordinary working hours. Time worked on a call shall be charged by the employee on a separate time sheet, and shall stand alone, in no way affecting or complicating any computation of the ordinary work or complicating any computation of the ordinary work-

ing week. Whenever the finishing time of any worker working overtime or any temporary night shift is of such as to cause him to miss his usual means of conveyance home, he shall be conveyed home in a suitable manner, with-out delay, at the expense of the employer.

12.—Classes of Labour.

Two classes of labour only shall be engaged in the industry, i.e., journeymen and apprentices.

13 .- Record Book.

Each employer shall keep at his office, or at each of

- them if more than one, a book containing a record of :-
 - (a) the names of all workers employed by him at such factory and to whom this Agreement applies; and
 - (b) the class of work performed, the hours worked (including overtime) and the wages paid to each such worker.

Such book may be inspected at any time during ordiary business hours by the secretary for the time being of the Workers' Union and/or the Employers' Associa-tion, and these two secretaries may conjointly visit and inspect the various factories to ascertain whether the provisions of this Agreement are being carried out. The employer and the worker shall be severally re-

sponsible for the keeping of this book.

14 .-- Agreement, etc., to be Posted.

(a) A copy of this Agreement, with any variation thereto, shall be kept posted in a prominent place in each workroom. The Printing Industry Employees' Union of W.A. shall be permitted to post notices as to Union meetings on a board at each establishment in a reasonable manner.

(b) Notices containing advice for the preservation of health and protection of workmen if provided by the Printing Industry Employees' Union of W.A., shall be kept prominently posted and displayed in all workrooms by the employer.

15.-Union Officials Visiting Factory.

An employer shall permit the Secretary of Printing Industry Employees' Union of W.A. Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, to enter the workroom during work-ing hours to interview the Father or Clerk of the Chapel, or individual members, or to collect subscriptions, but shall not interview members severally in such a manner as to delay the working of the office.

16.—Health Conditions.

(a) Dark rooms must be thoroughly ventilated and the cubic capacity must be in accordance with the Factories and Shops Act.

(b) Flues or other satisfactory means of ventilation, to be approved by the Factories Inspector, to be pro-vided over all acid baths, which shall be so fitted that all fumes and heavy gases are drawn off into the open air.

(c) Proper facilities shall be provided by the employer for the employees to change their clothes.

(d) The employer shall provide a suitable place for employees to wash their hands.

(e) Proper facilities shall be provided by the employer so that clothing of employees, taken off during working hours, may be protected from the dust and fumes of the workroom.

(f) If artificial light is in use, effective shades shall be provided by the employer to prevent eye strain. Arti-ficial light shall be so situated as to enable the employees to work without unnecessary strain to the eyes.

17.—Preference to Unionists.

(No agreement was reached on this clause. It was agreed, however, to register this Agreement subject to the preference clause being submitted to an Industrial Board.)

18.—Termination of Employment.

Except as to casual workers, the employment is ter-minable on either side by one week's notice given on any day or by payment of one week's pay, but for the first month of employment the hiring shall be from day to day and during that period a day's notice or a day's near cheal be sufficient pay shall be sufficient.

19.—Definitions.

When used in this Agreement, "Journeyman" shall mean a worker who has served (5) years in the indus-try: Provided that special arrangements shall be made between the Union and the employer in regard to any person employed in the Industry for twelve months prior to the date of this Agreement. Failing a satisfactory arrangement the matter to be referred to the Board of Reference.

"Permanent employees" shall mean any worker who has completed one (1) month's continuous employment.

20.—Work not to be taken off Employer's Premises.

No work shall be taken off the employer's premises to be executed by any employee.

21.-Board of Reference.

(i) For the purposes of this Agreement, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, consisting of a Chairman and (2) two representatives of the employers and (2) two representatives from the Union, nominated by the parties.

(ii) The parties shall submit the name or names of persons from whom the Chairman may be chosen by the Court of Arbitration, but the Court may appoint any other person as Chairman.

(iii) The Board shall hold its deliberations in pri-vate, unless the majority of the representatives of the parties or the Chairman otherwise decides.

(iv) A majority of the members, one of whom must be the Chairman, shall constitute a quorum.
 (v) The Board may sit at such times and places as

the majority may decide and may adjourn from time

to time and from place to place. (vi.) A member may resign at any time by certification in writing signed by him and served upon the Regis-trar of the Court. Any party may at any time vary its representatives and fill any vacancy.

(vii) All meetings of the Board shall be convened by the Chairman by notice served upon the members thereof.

(viii) The decision of the Board shall be the decision of the majority of the members and shall be signed by the Chairman and forwarded to the Clerk of the Court,

the Chairman and forwarded to the Clerk of the Court, who shall forthwith notify the parties. (ix) The decision of the Board may be reviewed and altered by the Court on application of any of the parties: Provided that notice of an application to the Court to review such decision shall be given within seven days from the date thereof to the Chairman and the opposite next, and the opposite part of the Review rate. party and the application lodged with the Registrar asking for such review within fourteen (14) days of such

decision: Provided further, that all parties shall abide by the decision, unless and until the same is altered by the Court.

- (x) The functions of the Board shall be :-
 - (a) to settle, and/or determine any matters left to the decision of the Board by this Agreement;
 - (b) to settle, allow, determine and deal with any matter or thing which the Court may from time to time refer to the Board;
 (e) subject to the jurisdiction of the Court of
 - Arbitration, generally to settle and/or deter-mine any dispute or questions arising out of this Agreement, except a matter involving the interpretation of any of the terms thereof or any variation in the rates of wages or any other term thereof, excepting the matter re-ferred to in Clause 19 of this Agreement.

22.-Apprentices.

(1) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one to every three or fraction of three journeymen employed in any one section by him. Provided that, where an employer has two or more permanent journeymen employees in a department, special arrangements may be made between the Union and the employer as to what may be deemed to be the quota. For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the twelve months immediately pre-ceding such time shall be deemed to be the number of journeymen employed. Where an employer is himself a journeyman working at the trade, he shall be counted as a journeyman for the purpose of computing the number of apprentices allowed.

The maximum number of apprentices shall not exceed four (4) in any one section.

(2) The period of apprenticeship shall be for five (5) vears.

(3) The minimum weekly wage payable to an apprentice shall be :-

(4) An apprentice shall be apprenticed to learn and shall be fully and thoroughly taught and instructed by the employer in one at least of the following branches of the Industry :--

- (i) Operating;

- (ii) Printing;
 (iii) Half-tone etching;
 (iv) Line etching;
 (v) Mounting, routing and fluishing.
- (5):
 - (i) An apprentice to operating shall be taught and instructed in the coating, sensitising, develop-ing, fixing, reducing and intensifying of negatives; the exposure of fine and coarse screen (half-tone offset and line), wet and/or dry plate negatives, and the use and care of camera, screens, stops and filters.
 - (ii) An apprentice to printing shall be taught and n apprentice to printing shall be taught and instructed in the preparation of and use of sensitised and enamel printing solutions for copper and zine; and polishing, graining, coating, whirling, exposing and fixing under line and half-tone and offset, wet and dry plate negatives of zine and copper plates, and stripping, ruling and ghosting of nega-tives and the use and care of are lamps (and guillotine). He must be taught all formulae of solutions used in printing zine conper and of solutions used in printing zinc, copper and offset; he must be taught the correct method of printing from negatives, line half-tone dry plate and offset.
- (iii) An apprentice to half-tone etching shall be taught and instructed in the etching of coarse and fine screen half-tone zinc and copper plates, and the use and care of acid and acid baths.
- (iv) An apprentice to line etching shall be taught the proper care and use of acid baths and machines, ink rollers and slabs. He must be taught and instructed in the dusting and rolling methods of etching line, copper and zinc plates, retouching, and stopping out for tints.

- (v) An apprentice to routing, mounting and finish-ing must be taught the proper care and operation of such machines as:--Router, saw, type-high beveller-planing machine, jigsaw, trimmer, and proof press, also bevelling and trimmer, and proor press, also bevening and planing by hand where there are no machines. He must be taught mounting of zinc, cop-per and steel plates, including the mounting of colour plates in register. Finishing means proofing of black and white. His instruction must include piercing, anchor and vignette, mounting and proofing. In the last year of his apprenticeship he must be given the opportunity of learning colour proofing in premises where this class of work is carried out.
- (vi) Colour work applicable to each section shall be taught the apprentices of that section dur-ing the last twelve months of his apprenticeship.
- (vii) Provided that, where any process above-mentioned is not carried out in the ordinary course of business on the premises, the provision as to training need not apply.

Apprentices shall be engaged under the terms and regulations herein set forth :-

(6) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this Agreement. The employer of every apprentice shall keep him constantly at work and teach such apprentice, or cause him to be taught the industry, craft occupation, or calling in relation to which he is bound apprentice, by competent instruction in a gradual and complete nanner, and he shall give such apprentice a reasonable opportunity to learn the same, and receive, during the term of his apprenticeship, such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as may be necessary. And every apprentice shall, during the period of his apprenticeship, faithfully serve his employer for the purpose of being taught the industry, craft, occupa-tion or calling in relation to which he is bound, and shall also conscientiously and regularly accept such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as aforesaid, in addition to the teaching that may be provided by his employer.

(7) A Board of Reference, to be called the "Appren-ticeship Board," is hereby constituted, to consist of a Chairman and six other members, three to be nominated by the Metropolitan Master Process Engravers' Association and three to be nominated by the Printing Indus-try Employees' Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Perth.

- (8) The functions of the Board shall be as follows:-
- (i) To advise the Court as regards apprenticeship matters in the Process Engraving Industry within the area covered by the Agreement and, in particular, on the following heads:-
 - (a) The appointment or re-appointment of examiners.
 - (b) The preparation of a syllabus for the course of instruction from time to time.
 (c) The methods of instruction to be followed.

 - (d) The conduct of examinations of apprentices. (e) Schemes for the institutions of scholarships and prizes.

To receive monthly or other periodical reports from the instructors for the purpose of amending or correcting any laxity in attendance or conduct of apprentices at classes of instruction.

To assist in selecting the best type of apprentice and to advise upon ability of any person, firm, or company to effectively train an apprentice or apprentices, and to encourage and foster the study of subjects bearing upon the trade or occupation in the evening classes or other classes instituted for the purpose. To advise the Court and parties interested as

to what additional plant is required from time to time for the effective training of apprentices.

To assist in the promotion of classes for instruction in branches of the industry not already provided for.

To formulate and submit to the Court a scheme for the instruction of country appren-

tices. To consider and recommend improvements in the training of apprentices from time to time.

- (ii) The Apprenticeship Board shall hold its deliberations in private, unless a majority of the re-presentatives of the parties or the Chairman otherwise directs.
- (iii) A majority of members, one of whom must be the Chairman, shall constitute a quorum: pro-viding that, in the case of differences of opinion between members representing the said Union of workers and members representing the said the said Union of employers, the decision of the Chairman shall be accepted and taken as the decision of the Apprenticeship Board.
- (iv) The Apprenticeship Board may sit at such times and places as the majority may decide and
 - (v) The decision of the Apprenticeship Board may be reviewed and altered by the Court on the application of any of the parties: provided that notice of an application to the Court to review such decision shall be given within seven days from the date thereof to the Chairman and the opposite parties and the application lodged with the Registrar asking for such review, with in fourteen days of such decision; provided further, that all parties abide by the decision; unless and until the same is altered by the Court.
- (vi) With the consent of the Court, either party may at any time vary its nomination of representative members.

(9) Every apprentice shall be employed on probation for a period of three months, to determine his fitness or otherwise for apprenticeship, and shall work only for such hours per day and for such remuneration as may be prescribed by this Agreement. In the event of his becoming an apprentice, such probationary period shall be counted as part of the term of apprenticeship.

Before completing such probationary period, the pro-bationer shall submit himself to an eyesight test and obtain a certificate of his fitness to be apprenticed to the trade, and a copy of such certificate shall be at-tached to the notice of registration of the apprenticeship

(10) An employer taking an apprentice on probation shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such probationer by giving notice thereof to the Registrar in the prescribed Form 1 (a) in Appendix, and if at the date of coming into operation of this Agreement an employer is employing an apprentice or probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall forth-with apply for the due registration of such apprentice or probationer.

(11) The Court may, in any case where it seems expe-dient to do so, order that the probationary period of employment be extended for a further period not exceeding three months.

(12) The Apprenticeship Agreement shall be com-pleted within fourteen days of the termination of the probationary period.

(13). All agreements of apprenticeship shall be drawn up on Form 6 in Appendix, and signed by the employer, the legal guardian of the apprentice, and apprentice. No employer, guardian, or apprentice shall enter into any agreement or undertaking purporting to add to, vary, alter or amend any such Agreement without the approval of the Court.

(14) The Agreement shall be executed in triplicate; and one part shall be held by the employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one shall be retained by the Registrar.

Every Agreement of Apprenticeship shall be (15)subject to the provisions of the Agreement in force for the time being applicable to apprenticeship in the industry.

(16) Every Agreement of Apprenticeship entered into shall contain :-

- (a) the names and addresses of the parties to the agreement
- (b) the date of birth of the apprentice;
 (c) a description of the industry, craft, occupation or calling or combination thereof to which the apprentice is to be bound;
 (d) the date on which the apprentice in the computation is to compute the computation of the apprentice of the computation of the computation
- (d) the date on which the apprenticeship is to commence and the period of apprenticeship;
- (e) a condition requiring the apprentice to obey all reasonable directions of the employer and re-quiring the employer and the apprentice to comply with the terms of the Industrial Agreement, so far as they concern the apprentice;

- (f) a condition that technical instruction, when available, shall be at the employer's expense and shall be in the employer's time;
- (g) a condition that, in the event of any apprentice in the opinion of the examiners not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical in-struction shall be allowed at the employer's expense, during the fifth year of such appren-ticeship, to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard;
- (h) the general conditions of apprenticeship.

(17) The Court may order the transfer of an apprentice from one employer to another, either temporarily or permanently :-

- (a) if the employer does not provide the necessary facilities for the apprentice to become pro-
- ficient in his trade, or (b) upon the application of the employer or the apprentice for good cause shown.

(18) The transfer of every apprentice shall be on Form 2 in Appendix and shall be made out in quadruplicate, and shall, unless the Court otherwise directs, be signed by the late employer or his assigns, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice and the new employer. The transfer form shall be completed within one month of the date upon which the transfer is ordered to be effected.

(19) The document of transfer shall be held one part by the late employer, one by the new employer, one by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one shall be supplied by the employer to and be retained by the Registrar.

(20) Should an employer at any time before the determination of the period of apprenticeship desire to dis-pense with the service of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice and guardian, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, qualified and willing to continue to teach the apprentice and pay the rate of wages prescribed by the Agreement, or otherwise, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer.

(21) Every agreement shall include a provision that it may be cancelled, by mutual consent, by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice giving one month's notice in writing to the Court and to the parties concerned that such apprenticeship shall be terminated.

(22) On the transfer or termination of any apprenticeship from whatever cause, the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate stating what time he has served, full particulars of the branches of the trade or industry in which he has received instruction, the proficiency attained, and shall also notify the Clerk of the Court of the cause thereof.

(23) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge and the cause thereof to the Clerk of the Court in Form 3 in the Appendix.

- (a) No apprentice employed under a registered agreement shall be discharged by the em-ployer for alleged misconduct until the registration of the agreement of apprenticeship has been cancelled by order of the Court, on
- (b) It shall not be obligatory to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him.

Provided, however, that an apprentice may be suspended by the employer for misconduct, but in any such case, the employer shall forthwith make an application for cancellation of the agreement of apprenticeship, and in the event of the Court refusing same, the wages of the apprentice, or such portion thereof as the Court may order, shall be paid as from the date of such suspension and, in the event of the application being granted, such order may take effect from the date when the apprentice was suspended.

(24) Subject to regulation thirty-nine (39), time lost by the apprentice through sickness or any other cause whatsoever, may, with the consent of the Court, on the application of any party, be added to the original term in the Apprenticeship Agreement.

(25) In the event of an employer being unable to provide the work for the apprentice, or to mutually agree with the legal guardian of the apprentice to cancel

the agreement or arrange a transfer, application may be made to the Court to arrange for such transfer or to have such agreement cancelled.

(26) Where in any case an employer is temporarily unable to provide work to employ an apprentice for his full time, application may be made by the employer to the Court for permission to employ the apprentice on other work in the factory or establishment.

(27) Every apprentice shall attend a Government technical school, vocational classes, or classes of instruc-tion, where provided, for instructions in such subjects as are deemed necessary for his branch of the trade. He shall be allowed necessary time off during his ordinary working hours to attend such classes. Any apprentice failing to attend such classes when given time off for that purpose, shall be deemed to have unlawfully absented himself from his employment and may have his wages reduced accordingly.

(28) The fees for the classes attended by the apprentice shall be paid by the employer.

(29) The period during which apprentices are to attend such technical school or classes shall be four hours per week.

(30) Where instruction is provided for any branch of the trade, the method of training shall be as follows:-

- (a) The name of each apprentice, as soon as he is registered as such, shall be forwarded by the Clerk of the Court to the Apprenticeship Board, which shall keep a waiting list of such enrolments.
- (b) The full course of instruction shall be designed to cover the first, second, third and fourth years of the apprenticeship term: provided that, in the event of failure to satisfactorily complete such course by the end of the fourth (c) Each year's instruction to (g)).
 (c) Each year's instruction shall be divided into two terms, ending June and November re-
- spectively.
- (d) Each session of instruction shall consist of four hours weekly. (e) The syllabus covering the whole four years
- period shall be drawn up by the instructors in collaboration with the Apprenticeship Board.
- (f) The instructors shall complete the course set down by the syllabus for each term in time to hold the terminal and annual examinations.
- to hold the terminal and annual examinations.
 (g) All practical work given out by the instructors shall be entered upon a "Work Docket," and this, with the student's first proof and final proof shall be examined by the instructor, allotted the deserved number of marks, and carefully preserved in a "Dossier," for refer-ence during and at the completion of his student course. These practical tests shall be recorded on a Special Form, which may be inspected from time to time by members of the Apprenticeship Board, who shall have the right to make periodical visits of inthe right to make periodical visits of in-
- spection during class hours. (h) The instructors shall forward to the Apprenticeship Board a monthly report of the attendances and conduct of students, such report to be in the hands of the secretary of the Board by the seventh day of the following month.

(31) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by the examiners hereinafter provided for.

(32) The Clerk of the Court shall notify examiners of the names and addresses of the apprentices required to submit themselves to examination.

(33) The examiners shall be persons skilled in the Industry, one shall be nominated by the employers and one by the workers, for each particular branch of the trade. Failing such nomination or nominations, the Court may appoint such person or persons as it may deem fit. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners, the matter in dispute shall be referred to the Apprenticeship Board, at the request of any one of the examiners, and the decision of such Apprenticeship Board shall be final and conclusive.

(34) It shall be the duty of the examiners to examine the work, inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and, where any apprentice fails to show progress, to inquire as to the opportunities provided by the employer for such apprentice to learn, and to submit a report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination within fourteen days from the date of holding the examination.

(35) Such examination shall include theory and practice as applied to the trade, industry, craft, occupation, or calling to which the apprentice is indentured.

(36) The method of conducting the examination of apprentices in those branches of the trade where technical instruction is provided shall be as follows:---

- (a) Except in the case of the first examination, no apprentice shall be examined unless he has gained a pass in the previous examination.(b) The whole of the practical work of the examin-
- ation shall be performed at the technical school classroom. (In those branches of the trade where no technical instruction is provided, the examination shall be held at the factory where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of the employer to provide such neces-sary material and machinery as may be re-quired and in all ways facilitate the conduct of such examination.)
- (c) The terminal (June) examination shall be for theory only, and shall be conducted by the intheory only, and shall be conducted by the in-structors during the last week but one pre-ceding the end of the term. The questions shall also be set out by the instructors, and the written answers checked, and the deserved marks allotted. These, with each student's practical work for the term under review, shall be headed to the gravitation and a ball marging be handed to the examiners, who shall approve or otherwise of the instructor's decisions. Any difference of opinion that cannot be agreed upon mutually shall be referred to the Appren-ticeship Board, whose decision shall be final.
- (d) The examiners shall, during the month of June, make their annual visit of inspection to each factory where apprentices are employed, and personally interview the employer (or foreman) and also the apprentice and shall satisfy them-selves as to the assiduity of the apprentice in his daily work, and especially as to the facili-tics afforded him to enable him to make the required progress in his particular branch of the two da the trade.
- (e) The examiners shall present a report to the Court as to the progress made by the students during the term, and at the same time forward a copy to the Apprenticeship Board. The terminal report shall also cover their inspection of factories.
- factories.
 (f) The annual examination shall take place in November. The test papers shall be set by the examiners in collaboration with the instructors. The practical tests set during the term shall be checked by the examiners, who shall also set each student a special practical test, which shall be performed under their direct supervision at the technical school classroom during the second week of the examination. With these three results before them, viz., the With these three results before the examination. With these three results before them, viz., the written answers of the theory examinations, the term's progressive tests already marked by the instructors, and the special test judged by themselves, the examiners shall draw up their annual report and submit same to the Court of least there does before the data free Court at least three days before the date fixed for the final day of the term. A copy of such report shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the Apprenticeship Board.
- (g) Marks shall be awarded for these examinations as follows:

A first-class certificate shall be granted to all who secure 90 per cent. and over of marks. A second-class certificate shall be awarded to those who secure 80 to 89 per cent. marks, while 70-79 per cent. shall entitle a student to a pass. Less than 70 per cent. marks shall necessitate a student continuing his studies another term.

(h) At the conclusion of the student's course, he shall sit for his final examination, which shall be conducted entirely by the examiners. be conducted entirely by the examiners. A student securing marks totalling 96 per cent. and over shall be deemed to have attained "Honours" and shall be entitled to receive an additional "Honours" certificate. A first-class certificate shall be granted to all who secure 90 per cent. and over of marks. A second-class certificate shall be awarded to second-class certificate shall be awarded to those who secure 80 to 89 per cent. marks,

while 70 to 79 per cent. of marks shall entitle a student to a pass. Less than 70 per cent. of marks shall necessitate a student continuing his studies another term.

- (i) The Registrar shall, after each examination, issue a certificate to each apprentice indicating (on Form 4 in the Appendix) the result of his examination, and the final certificate in Form 5 in the Appendix.
- (j) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportun-ity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed prima facie guilty of a breach of this Agreement. Upon any proceedings against him in respect of such a breach the report may be received in evidence.
- (k) Any apprentice claiming to have cause for complaint regarding instruction, either in techni-cal school or in workshop, shall have the right to appeal to the Apprenticeship Board.

(37) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

(38) The employer shall pay the apprentice, in respect of time lost through compulsory military or naval spect of time lost through compulsory miningry or navai training, the amount (if any) by which wages prescribed by the Industrial Agreement for the trade, calling, or craft, occupation or industry exceeds the amount re-ceived by the apprentice from the Department of De-fence: provided, however, that this clause shall not apply to military or naval training imposed through follows to attend compulsory mendors: failure to attend compulsory parades.

(39) All time lost by reason of compulsory military or naval training, other than the additional training mentioned in the above proviso, shall count as part of the apprenticeship.

(40) When an apprentice attends a technical school during his ordinary working hours, the time so occupied shall be regarded as part of the term of his apprenticeship, and the employer shall not be entitled to make any deduction from the wages of the apprentice for such time

(41) If the Apprenticeship Board makes represen-tations to the Court that the facilities provided by the technical school or other place of vocational training for the teaching of apprentices are inadequate, the Court may make such investigations and such report to the Minister controlling such technical or other such place, as it deems necessary.

(42) The term of apprenticeship may be extended by (42) The term of apprenticeship may be extended by the Court on the failure of an apprentice to pass any of the examinations, and for such purpose it shall be the duty of the examiners to make any necessary recom-mendation to the Court. Any extension of the term of apprenticeship shall be subject to all the conditions and stipulations in the original Agreement, except as to rates of wages, which shall be of such amount as the Court may determine Court may determine.

(43) Upon the failure of an apprentice to pass two consecutive examinations, it shall be the duty of the examiners to report same to the Court, with a recomdeem advisable. The Court, after notice to all parties concerned, may cancel the Agreement or make such other order in the circumstances as it may deem necessary.

(44) The wages of an apprentice under this Agree-ment are subject to alteration by the Court when the wages of journeymen under this Agreement are reviewed.
