FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:—

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 12 of 1937.

(Registered 3/7/37.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 25th day of June, 1937, between the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie (hereinafter termed the employer) of the one part, and the Eastern Goldfields Municipal and Roads Board Labourers' Union of Workers, being a Union of Workers registered under the provisions of "The Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," hereinafter termed the employees of the other part, whereby the said parties are mutually agreed as follows:—

Casual hands employed for less than one week, to receive 1s. per day above the rates specified for such work.

Men working with tar, bitumen, Colas or other road-making compounds to receive 1s. 2d. per day above the ordinary rate paid them as dirt money.

Men tarring paus to be paid 1s. 2d. per day over the rate paid to sanitary workers, such as stagemen.

Rubbishmen driving a motor truck and picking up rubbish, to be paid 1s. 2d. per day over the rate paid to rubbishmen.

Attendance on Horses.—Men having to feed and attend their horses, to be paid 1s. per day extra.

2.—Hours of Labour.

(a) The hours of labour for all employees shall not exceed forty (40) hours per week, eight (8) hours per day, from Monday to Friday inclusive.

(b) Generally:—The starting time for all employees shall be: from Mondays to Fridays inclusive work shall commence at 7.30 a.m. and continue with one hour intermission for dinner until 4.30 p.m.

(c) Sanitary Workers:—On Mondays to Fridays inclusive, the hours of all sanitary employees shall not exceed eight hours per day, commencing at a time arranged by the Sanitary Manager as most suitable to meet, from time to time, the exigencies of the several services; provided that such work shall not start before

5 a.m. and shall continue with one hour or half-an-hour intermission for dinner as may be mutually arranged between the Sanitary Manager and the employees and shall finish not later than 4.30 p.m.

It is specially agreed that from April 1st to October 1st, starting time shall be varied for work not to start before 6 a.m.

3.—Overtime.

All time worked in excess of the hours stated herein, each day's work to stand by itself, shall be considered as overtime, and shall be paid for at the following rates:—The first two (2) hours after the ordinary time for ceasing work, time and a quarter; after the first two (2) hours and up to four (4) hours, time and a half; after the first four (4) hours and until the ordinary time for re-commencing work, double time. Any employee called back to work after leaving the job, at the completion of the hours set out herein, after a lapse of a period of one hour or more, shall be paid at double time rates for all the time worked until the ordinary time for re-commencing work.

All time worked on Sundays shall be paid for at double time rates. Sundays for the purpose of this clause shall be from midnight Saturday to midnight Sunday. Overtime rates shall not apply to watchmen, foremen, assistant gardeners or stablemen.

4.—Holidays, Public.

Every employee, except stablemen, shall be allowed the following holidays on full pay:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Labour Day, and Kalgoorlie Cup Day. Employees compelled to work on such days shall be paid double time rates.

5.—Sick Pay.

Twelve (12) days' sick pay per annum on half rates on account of sickness shall be granted to all employees. A doctor's certificate to be produced on each occasion a man is off sick; sick pay shall not be granted for more than twelve days in the aggregate in any year.

6.—Aprons.

Two aprons per year to be provided for the use of the drivers and stagemen in the Sanitary Department, if required.

7.—Overalls.

Men employed on the sprinkler to be provided with overalls.

8.—Oilers.

Men having to work in the rain to be provided with oilers.

9.—Mixed Functions.

Any employee using tradesmen's tools and doing the work of tradesmen shall, for the time during which he is actually so engaged, be paid the ruling rate in the district for the class of work on which he is employed, and in the case of an employee taking the place of a higher paid employee or doing work classed at a higher rate of wage he shall be paid the higher rate of wage for the time during which he is actually so engaged.

If employed at the higher rate of wage for two (2) or more hours in any one day, he shall be paid the higher rate for the whole of that day.

This clause shall not apply to any workmen who may be employed in whitewashing or effecting rough carpentry repairs or small painting jobs.

10.—Services Not Required.

In the event of an employee turning up to work at the usual starting time, and finding his services are not required, he shall be paid for two (2) hours at the ruling rate.

11.—Order of Employment.

In the event of the full complement of men not being required, men shall be employed in rotation. This clause only to apply when it is not the intention of the employer to permanently shorten hands.

12.—Contracts let by the Council.

In all contracts let by the Council for work to be performed, the rates of pay and conditions of work, as set out in this agreement, shall be embodied in the conditions of contract.

13.—Annual Holidays.

Every employee shall, in addition to Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Labour Day, and Kalgoorlie Cup Day, be allowed a fortnight's holiday, including 10 working days, on full pay, once in each year; such holidays shall not be allowed to accumulate.

Casual hands in the employ of the Council for more than one week shall be entitled to any of the public holidays which may fall within that period.

14.—Notification of leave.

Notification of annual leave shall be given to employees entitled thereto at least seven days before the commencement of such leave.

15.—Annual leave mixed functions.

Any employee who has been engaged on mixed functions during the year when his annual leave falls due, shall be paid for such leave at a rate computed on the average weekly earnings of such employee for the twelve months immediately preceding such leave.

Employees working for less than 12 months shall be allowed one day's holiday on full pay for each month employed; provided that should the employment be terminated before the end of a month, he shall be paid a proportionate amount as holiday pay for such portion of month worked. For the purpose of this clause 20 days to be calculated a month.

16.—Preference to unionists.

All men becoming employees of the Council shall become members of the Eastern Goldfields Municipal and Roads Board Labourers' Union of Workers within three (3) weeks of commencing work; this clause not to apply to men employed on relief or emergency works.

17.—First aid outfit.

The Council shall at depots and stables provide a reasonable first aid outfit for the use of employees, and shall from time to time, keep same renewed and in proper order.

18.—Full payment for day's work.

After beginning a day's work, workers shall not be paid for less than a full day's work, unless they leave of their own accord, or are dismissed for misconduct.

19.—Inspection of time sheets.

A duly accredited official of the Union shall be allowed to inspect the time and pay sheets relating to any worker affected by this agreement and make extracts therefrom.

20.—Working Plods.

Every employee shall fill out a working plod showing the different jobs he has been employed on during the day, and the hours occupied on each job, and the rate of pay appertaining to same.

21.—Reducing Hands.

Should the occasion arise to reduce the number of men employed, the management in selecting those to be retained shall give full weight to the consideration of length of service, and all things being equal shall retain those who have been longest in the employ of the Council; this clause shall not apply to employees of less than 12 months standing.

22.—Seniority.

All things being equal, seniority to be given consideration for all positions for promotion, or positions carrying a higher rate of pay.

23.—Rights and Privileges.

Any employee who may be at the date of signing of this Agreement in receipt of a higher rate of pay for his particular class of work than is herein prescribed, or in receipt of any privilege or allowance, other than herein provided, shall not suffer by reason of this agreement, and any reduction in the amount which the employee was receiving above the rate prescribed in this agreement or loss of any privilege or allowance.

24.—Minimum Wage.

The minimum wage shall, except in the case of junior workers engaged in parks and gardens, be Ninety-nine shillings per week of forty (40) hours.

25.—Day's Work.

On Mondays to Fridays inclusive, eight (8) hours excluding lunch time shall comprise the day's work.

26.—Interpretation Clauses.

For the purpose of this Agreement, unless the context otherwise indicates, the terms used shall be interpreted or defined as follows:—

Spreader:—A spreader is one who is engaged in spreading metal or other material on new works, or works being reconstructed, or engaged levelling or spreading after the scarifier, but shall not include a horse driver or motor driver spreading his own load or doing patching work.

Men cleaning Septic Tanks:—To mean men actually engaged in cleaning out septic tanks and soak wells, not merely engaged pumping effluent from wells and other receptacles.

Rubbishman driving Motor Truck: half a day extra: To mean one who performs the double duty of driving a truck and picking up rubbish, not merely driving the truck.

Rubbishman:—Means one who collects rubbish which has been deposited by householders in boxes or other utensils, also rubbish thrown in the streets, or in any right-of-way, but does not drive the truck.

Stableman:—Means one who works in the stables, grooming horses, cleaning harness, cleaning stables and mixing horses' feed.

Concreter:—Means one who under the instructions of the Supervisor of Works or Foreman, carries out the doing of any concrete work.

Casual Hand:—Means one who is employed by the Council for less than one week.

27.—Term of agreement.

This Agreement shall come into force on the First day of April, 1937, and shall remain in force for the period of three years thence next ensuing and thereafter subject to the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," and shall apply to all works and undertakings carried out by the said employer in the Municipality of Kalgoorlie.

STATE BATTERY EMPLOYEES—INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 13 of 1937.

(Registered 7/7/1937.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," this 7th day of July, 1937, between the Australian Workers' Union Westralian Goldfields Mining Branch Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter referred to as the "Union") of the one part, and the Hon. Minister for Mines (hereinafter referred to as the "Minister") of the other part, whereby the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree as follows:—

1.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of two (2) years and shall take effect from the commencement of the first pay period from the date hereof.

2.—Area and Application.

This Agreement shall operate over the Yilgarn, Coolgardie, Broad Arrow, Dundas, Phillips River, East Coolgardie, North Coolgardie, North-East Coolgardie, Mount Margaret, East Murchison Goldfields and Northampton Mining District, and the Murchison, Yalgoo, Peak Hill and Gascoyne Goldfields, and the area out-

side those Goldfields in Western Australia comprised within the 14th and 26th parallels of latitude, and shall apply to workers employed at State Batteries.

3.—Rates of Wages.

Basic wage at the rate of £4 7s. 0d. per week. One shilling (1s.) per week extra shall be paid as a Goldfields allowance.

The above wages are payable under a contract of daily service.

4.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four hours, exclusive of crib time, shall constitute a week's work for surface workers. If more than one shift is worked on the surface, the forty-four hours shall then be inclusive of crib time.

(b) Six (6) hours shall constitute a shift's work for men engaged inside the gas or water spaces of any boiler or flue in cleaning or scraping work and for men engaged in cleaning dust bins or dust flues. In case of boiler cleaners working broken shifts, one hour on the above description of work shall count as one hour and twenty (20) minutes. In the case of Lancashire and Cornish boilers all time necessary for a boiler cleaner to come out for a spell shall count as time worked in the boiler.

5.—Overtime.

(a) For work done beyond the hours of duty on any ordinary day, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Work done on holidays shall be paid at double time except work in connection with repairs to machinery which has broken down and caused a stoppage of operations.

(c) All work done on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-third, and any work done in excess of eight (8) hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.

(d) When computing overtime the district allowance shall not be computed as an addition to the day's pay.

(e) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time due to private arrangement between the workers themselves or which is necessary for effecting periodical rotation of shifts, or which is owing to a relieving man not coming on at the appointed time. The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime, due to a relieving man not coming on at the proper time shall not exceed two (2) hours after the expiration of which overtime rates shall apply for the whole shift.

6.—Wet Places.

In all wet places one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) extra per shift shall be paid in addition to the rates set out.

7.—Dry Crushing Plant.

No dry crushing plants shall be operated unless under such conditions as obviate dust as far as is reasonably practicable. It shall be the duty of the Inspector of Mines to make an examination of all dry crushing plants in his district, once in each month, and at such other times as he may be requested so to do by the Secretary of the Union. He shall examine and report to the Minister, and such report shall be *prima facie* evidence of the facts stated therein.

8.—Pieceworkers.

There shall be implied in every contract in which a worker is engaged to perform any kind of work at or for a remuneration other than the rate fixed by this Agreement:—

(a) Where the engagement is for a period of time such period shall not be determined before the expiration thereof without the written consent of the worker.

(b) Where the engagement is to perform a specified quantity of work, the amount of work to be performed shall not be curtailed by a greater amount than five per cent. (5 per cent.).

(c) The rate of remuneration agreed upon shall not be decreased during the engagement.

(d) The actual remuneration paid for the work done shall not be less than the amount which the worker would have received for the period of his work if he had been working for that period at the rate of wages fixed by this Agreement for the work done.

(e) The price of any article supplied by the employer for the use of the worker during the period of his engagement shall not be increased during the period, and shall in no case exceed the cost or price of the article to the employer at the place of supply.

(f) Where the work is to be carried out by a body of workers acting together, the number of workers to be employed shall be specified in the contract. In the event of the specified number of workers not being present during any shift, the employer may provide a substitute in the place of any worker absent, and shall pay such substitute wages at the rate fixed by this Agreement or by the contract, whichever shall be the greater, for the work done by him during the time he is so employed as a substitute, and may charge such payment against any money found due under the contract.

(g) Where any workers are employed to work by or with the contractors at a wages remuneration, the employer shall be entitled to pay the amount due to such wage workers for the period they have been employed at the rate fixed by this Agreement or the rate fixed by the contract, whichever shall be the greater, and to charge the payment so made against the amount found due to the contractors. A printed copy of these conditions shall be kept exhibited in the Change Room.

9.—Holidays.

The following shall be holidays: Christmas Day, Easter Monday and Labour Day. If Christmas Day falls on a Sunday, the following Monday shall be kept. In the event of a worker not being required by the employer to present himself for duty on any of these days, payment may be deducted.

10.—Casual Workers.

Workers employed for less than one week shall be considered casual, and shall receive one shilling (1s.) per shift above the rates specified for the work.

11.—Drinking Water.

Good drinking water shall be supplied where men are working, and kept cool and free from dust.

12.—Free Water.

In all districts where free water is supplied by the employer, single men shall get three (3) gallons, and married men six (6) gallons per day.

13.—No Reduction.

Any worker who has been prior to the date of this Agreement in receipt of a higher rate of pay for his particular class of work than that prescribed by the Agreement heretofore in force, shall not by reason of this Agreement suffer any reduction in the amount by which such higher rate of pay exceeded the amount formerly prescribed, such excess amount shall not be affected by this Agreement.

14.—Mixed Functions.

(a) Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two (2) hours in any shift, shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift, provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two (2) hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole of the shift.

(b) Any worker regularly engaged in relieving work shall be paid the highest rate applicable to the class of work upon which he is employed during any shift.

15.—Change Room.

If more than four (4) persons are employed in one shift, sufficient accommodation shall be provided but not in the engine room or boiler house, for enabling the persons employed to conveniently dry and change their clothes, and in no case shall men dry their clothes upon a boiler.

16.—Reduction of Hands.

Should occasion arise to reduce the number of men employed, the management, in selecting those to be retained, shall give full weight to the consideration of length of service and, all things being equal, shall retain those who have been longest in the employ of the Department.

17.—Accident Pay.

In the event of a worker meeting with an accident during the shift, or being required to attend to one who has met with an accident, he shall be deemed to have rendered duty during the whole of the shift and be paid accordingly.

18.—Full Payment for Shift.

(a) After beginning a shift, workers shall not be paid less than for a full shift, unless they leave of their own accord, or are dismissed for misconduct. This shall not apply in matters beyond the control of the management.

(b) If before a worker leaves the works at the end of his shift, and because he is not so informed, he attends at the next shift willing to work it, and there is no suitable work which he is allowed to perform, he shall be paid the wages he would have been entitled to if he had worked the shift he was ready and willing to work. This shall not apply in matters beyond the control of the management.

19.—Payment of Wages.

Pay day shall be every second Friday. Any worker leaving or being dismissed shall be paid the full amount of wages due to him within one hour of ceasing work, or within one hour of the opening of the Department office, or, if such office was closed at the time of his ceasing work, or if the work done requires to be measured or assessed, within two hours of ceasing work.

20.—Ventilation.

(a) Where the ventilation in any place is inadequate, no work excepting such as is necessary for the purpose of remedying the conditions, shall be undertaken in that place until the ventilation is adequate.

(b) The ventilation in any place shall be determined by the District Inspector of Mines.

(c) From the decision of a District Inspector an appeal shall lie to the Mines Ventilation Board hereinafter constituted. Such appeal shall be instituted by notice in writing to the other parties affected and to the Under Secretary for Mines, which notice must be given within seven (7) days from the date the party

appealing is notified of the District Inspector's decision. The Under Secretary will then convene the Board, which will meet as soon as possible on a date to be notified by the Under Secretary.

(d) For the purpose of this clause the Mines Ventilation Board is hereby constituted, such Board to consist of—

- (i) The State Mining Engineer,
- (ii) The Commissioner of Public Health,
- (iii) A Workmen's Inspector appointed by the Union,
- (iv) A representative appointed by the employers, or, if unable to act, their respective nominees. The State Mining Engineer (or his nominee) shall be the Chairman of the Board. The Commissioner of Public Health shall be a member of the Board in an advisory capacity only, and without a vote. The decision shall be in accordance with the majority of votes. The presence of four (4) members shall be necessary for a quorum. The decision of the Board shall be final.

(e) All reasonable costs and charges of the Board and the members shall be rendered to the Under Secretary for Mines who shall apportion them equally between the Mines Department and the parties to this Agreement, provided that the Board may order any appellant to pay the whole or a certain proportion or amount of the costs of any appeal which the Board may declare to be trivial, and such appellant shall forthwith pay any such sum.

21.—Annual Holidays.

Annual holidays shall be taken at the convenience of the management of the Department; workers to receive one month's notice of the date on which the holiday is to commence; a committee of three (3) to be appointed to assist the management in the arrangement of a suitable roster.

A fortnight's holiday, including twelve (12) working days, on full pay, shall be granted once in each year to every worker provided he has worked two hundred and ninety-eight (298) shifts at ordinary rates of pay, and should he have worked less than two hundred and ninety-eight (298) such shifts when the said holiday is taken, or at the termination of his employment, he shall be paid for a proportionate number of holidays. Payment for the said holiday shall be at the rate of pay the worker is receiving immediately before the holiday is taken or employment terminated.

A pieceworker shall be entitled to be paid, when on holiday, the minimum rate for his grade.

22.—Lime.

Lime used in the reduction of ore shall not be mixed in battery bins.

23.—First Aid.

(a) In any Battery where workers are employed a first aid outfit shall be provided.

(b) Each shift boss or foreman shall have ready and available for use on his person a small emergency supply of bandages and padding or similar requisites.

24.—Resumption of Work after Holidays.

Where a worker is not notified prior to taking his holidays that no further work is available on the Battery he shall be re-engaged on his return.

25.—Accommodation.

Suitable camps will be erected as soon as possible at centres where accommodation is not available at a rental of 3s. per week.

26.—Preference of Employment.

Preference of employment in respect of the classes of workers covered by this Agreement shall be given to financial members of the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Goldfields Mining Branch Industrial Union of Workers, provided that any employee or applicant for employment who is a member of a craft industrial union, and who produces proof of such membership, shall be entitled to equal preference, provided that such employee or applicant shall, within fourteen days of the expiry of his current ticket with the other union, make and complete an application for membership with the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Goldfields Mining Branch Industrial Union of Workers.

27.—Definitions.

“Wet Places”: Should any dispute arise as to whether any place is wet, such dispute shall be referred to a Board of Reference as hereinafter appointed.

“Leading Fireman” shall mean a fireman who attends to feed pumps, feed water, gauge glasses, etc., and/or where only one fireman is employed on more than one boiler, he shall be classed as in charge.

28.—Board of Reference.

(a) As and whenever the occasion arises and either of the parties hereto so requires by notice in writing served upon the other party, there shall be appointed for the purposes of this Agreement a Board of Reference to act generally or Boards of Reference in respect of any one or more Batteries. Each such Board, if and when appointed, shall consist of a Chairman and two other members. The chairman shall be either:—

- (a) a person mutually agreed upon by the parties, or failing such a mutual agreement
- (b) the Warden or Resident or Stipendiary Magistrate, if he be willing to act; or if this Warden or Magistrate be not available—
- (c) a Government Inspector of Mines.

Of the two other members of the Board, one shall be the Manager of the Battery in which the difference or dispute arises, or his nominee, to represent the employer, and the other shall be a representative of the Union appointed for such purpose by the Union to represent the workers. Such representative may be changed by the Union at any time and from time to time provided that notice in writing of any such change shall be given by the Union to the employer concerned.

(b) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of:—

- (i) Deciding matters, specifically referred to in the Agreement as being the subject matter of a decision of the Board.
- (ii) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement, or any of them.
- (iii) Deciding all matters and questions referred to in the Agreement, as being the subject of mutual agreement if not agreed upon.
- (iv) Deciding any other industrial matter that the parties may refer to such Board from time to time.
- (v) An appeal shall lie at the instance of either party to the reference from any decision of such Board to the Court of Arbitration in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations to “The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935,” which for this purpose are embodied in and form part of this Agreement (Regulation 92).

For the purpose of this paragraph the parties to this Agreement agree and consent to the Court of Arbitration having and exercising jurisdiction to hear and determine any appeal aforesaid as if the Board of Reference whose decision is appealed against were a Board of Reference which has been appointed by the said Court under and in accordance with the provisions of Section 87 of the said Act.

- (vi) There shall be no cessation of work pending the reference to and the settlement of any dispute by the Board.
- (c) The term “Manager” includes the person acting as such for the time being.
