Metropolitan Water Supply Improvement.

Mosman Park Road District.—24-inch diameter steel water main in Stirling highway from Johnston street to Victoria street, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 5906.

The Sandalwood Act, 1929.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1478/29.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 2 of "The Sandalwood Act, 1929," the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council, limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown Land and alienated land during the period therein stated: And whereas it is desirable to limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown Land and alienated land during the period from the First day of July, 1937, to the Thirty-first day of December, 1937, to 1,400 tons: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period from the First day of July, 1937, to the Thirty-first day of December, 1937, to 1,400 tons, exclusive of sandalwood required for oil distillation purposes within the State.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made under and pursuant to Section 6 of "The Vermin Act, 1909," and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th day of July, 1924, the Menzies Road District was duly constituted a Vermin District under and for the purposes of the said Act, to be known as Menzies Vermin District, and such district is still subsisting by the said name under and for the purposes of "The Vermin Act, 1918": And whereas, by Order in Council made under and pursuant to Section 7 of "The Vermin Act, 1909," and also published in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th day of July, 1924, the Governor duly constituted a Vermin Board, to consist of six members, to be known as the Menzies Vermin Board for the said Menzies Vermin District, and by an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of July, 1925, the Governor increased the number of members of the said Menzies Vermin Board from six to seven: And whereas it is enacted by Section 14 of "The Vermin Act, 1918," that the Governor may by Order in Council *inter alia* dissolve the Board of a Vermin District, and by Section 45 of "The Vermin Act, 1918," that the Governor may appoint the Board of any Road District to be the Board of any Vermin District, the boundaries whereof are the same as those of the Road District: And whereas the boundaries of the said Menzies Vermin District are the same as those of the Menzies Road District, and it is deemed desirable and expedient to appoint the Menzies Road Board to be the Vermin Board for the said Menzies Vermin District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Vermin Act, 1918, and of all other powers in this behalf, doth hereby dissolve the Menzies Vermin Board as heretofore constituted and appointed as aforesaid and in lieu thereof doth hereby constitute and appoint the Menzies Road Board to be the Vermin Board for the said Menzies Vermin District, under and for the purposes of the said Vermin Act, 1918, to be known as the Menzies Vermin Board.

## BY-LAWS.

The Rottnest Board of Control hereby makes the following By-laws, to follow By-law 16 of the General By-laws of the Board as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th December, 1933, and to be read as one with those By-laws:—

## Aircraft.

16A. (1) No person shall land or cause any aircraft to land on the island unless he first obtains a permit from the Board.

(2) A permit shall be in the Form in the Schedule with such variations as the case may require.

(3) Every person by whom or the owner of any such aircraft on whose behalf the same is landed or caused to alight shall pay the Board the following fees:—

- (a) In the case of a machine with accommodation for not more than two passengers—6d. for each landing or alighting.
- (b) In the case of a machine with accommodation for more than two but not more than four passengers—1s. for each landing or alighting.
- (c) For every passenger landed or discharged for landing—6d.

16B. (1) No person shall land or cause any aircraft to be landed on the island unless:—

- (a) it comes within the category of a "light" aircraft. A light aircraft is one which is designed to carry not more than four passengers, including the pilot; and
- (b) it is landed on the landing ground set aside by the Board for the purpose.

3. Fees for passengers landed—6d. for each person.

4. A return to be supplied to the Board of Control at the end of each month, showing particulars of flights made, passengers carried, and a remittance of the fees to accompany the return.

By-laws for the Management of the Guildford Public Cemetery, Reserve No. 21697.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amending Acts, of the By-laws as set out hereunder for the Control and Management of the Guildford Public Cemetery.

## GUILDFORD PUBLIC CEMETERY—BY-LAWS.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Guildford Cemetery Board as Trustees of the Guildford Public Cemetery, Reserve No. 21697, the said Trustees make the following By-laws and all By-laws previously gazetted are hereby repealed:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees as set forth in the Schedule A shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial as set forth in Schedule D.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for application within such time. No free interment shall be allowed, unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least eight working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be reopened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the gravedigger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be permitted to take place in the Cemetery without an order for burial being obtained from the secretary in the form of Schedule C.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows.—On week days, September to April, inclusive, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August, inclusive, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.; on Sundays, throughout the year from 9 to 10 a.m. and from 12 noon to 5 p.m.; and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the Cemetery or proceed except by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of 14 years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the Cemetery or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the Cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws the superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof: or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form B in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid the Trustees may, when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form B in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed, unless upon production of the "Order for Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assigns, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assigns shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure on any part of the Cemetery, or construct a brick grave or vault, must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing work within the Cemetery, deposit with the secretary to the Trustees the sum of twenty shillings (20s.), which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. Where any person desires to exhumate any corpse from any grave in the Cemetery, pursuant to an order obtained from the Governor under Section 41 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," the following provisions shall apply and be observed, that is to say:—

(a) A written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal of such corpse, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased.

(b) If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second air-tight wooden or leaden coffin prior to removal.

(c) Grave to be filled in and all rubbish removed.

33. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions, as they may find it necessary to give, and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees, commits an offence against these By-laws.

34. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.

(c) The dressing of any graves, and the wheeling and carting of all material, shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.

(d) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch and only during regulation hours.

35. Prior to the conducting of any interment within the Cemetery, or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall apply to the Trustees for an annual permit, and shall at the time of making application give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem it fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and, unless in the possession of such a "Permit," no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

36. Any person committing any breach of these By-laws and Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations or By-laws lawfully made under authority of any Act relating to Cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall forthwith be removed from the Cemetery by the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.

37. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation, and number of grave, and a Register of all Certificates of Right of Burial, shall be kept at the office.

38. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the Cemetery.

(c) Penalties.—Any person who does, suffers, or permits any act, matter, or thing contrary to these By-laws, commits or permits any breach or negligence thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and where not otherwise provided, shall be deemed liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such offence.

By-laws for Harvey No. 1, Waroona, Harvey No. 2, and Collie Irrigation Districts respectively.

## Division I.

## 1.—Interpretation.

(a) The words "Board," "District," "Irrigable," "Irrigation," "Occupier," "Prescribed," "Watercourse," and "Works" shall have the meanings severally attached to them in "The Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914," or any amendment thereof.

(b) "Minister" shall mean the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage acting in the exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on a Board in respect of each of the irrigation districts to which these By-laws apply respectively.

## Division II.

Protection of Water, Grounds, Works, etc., from Trespass and Injury.

## 2.—Unauthorised Entry.

Trespassing within the fenced-off ground adjacent to or reserved for water supply or irrigation works, or the entering without proper authority upon any water or irrigation work not open to the public, is prohibited.

## 3.—Camp Fires.

Camping or lighting of fires on any Government water reserve, or in the immediate vicinity of any reservoir within the boundaries of the irrigation district, except on land set apart for such purposes, is prohibited.

## 4.—Native Flora.

The removal, plucking, or damaging of any wild-flower, shrub, bush, tree, or other plant growing on any land reserved for or vested in the Minister within half-a-mile of any reservoir and within the irrigation district is prohibited.

## 5.—Endangering Works.

No vehicle, conveyance, or animal shall be driven, taken, or ridden in such a manner as to endanger or damage the mains, conduits, or any "works," or shall cross the same, except at places where crossings have been provided.

## 6.—Rubbish.

No person shall cast away, throw, or deposit on any "works" any rubbish of any kind; or carry on any operations, or do any act which creates or tends to create any nuisance on any "works," and no occupier shall allow any sullage from his land to enter in or upon any "works."

## 7.—Unauthorised Water.

No person shall take or use or cause to be taken or used any water from any "works," including any watercourse within the irrigation district, without the Minister's authority, and no person shall allow any water supplied to him by the Minister to run to waste either on public roads or on private or public lands or otherwise.

## 8.—Interference with Works.

No person, without the Minister's authority, shall interfere in any way with any "works."

## 9.—Animals Straying.

No person owning or having the right of control of any animal shall drive, or allow the same to stray, upon any "works." In the event of any contravention of this By-law the person guilty of such contravention shall in addition to the penalties prescribed in By-law No. 38 hereunder be liable for all damage that may thereby be caused to such works.

## 10.—Bathing.

No person, except with the express permission of the Minister first had and obtained, shall bathe in any channels, conduits, reservoirs, watercourses, or other works within the irrigation district.

## Division III.

Conditions Governing the Supply and Control of Water.

## 11.—Zones.

For the purpose of determining the times or period for supplying water for irrigation, the district may be divided into zones decided upon by the Minister from time to time.

## 12.—Zone Period of Watering.

(1) The Minister may from time to time determine the period of watering applicable to each zone in the district and cause to be prepared a programme of waterings in accordance with his determination.

(2) Full particulars of such programme of waterings for each zone shall be publicly notified at the local office of the irrigation district.

## 13.—Application for Watering.

Applications for a watering for irrigation shall be made in writing by ratepayer, on forms to be provided by the Minister, to the district officer authorised by the Minister to receive same, and shall be lodged at least three days prior to commencement of the zone period applicable to the land referred to in the application.

## 14.—Supply of Water.

On receipt of such application for watering, the Minister may, at the times and in the quantities fixed by him, and subject to payment by the ratepayer of irrigation rates and charges due, and subject also to limitation of waterings as hereinafter provided, supply water, and to such point or points as in his opinion may be necessary.

## 15.—Occupier's Distributary System.

The occupier of each block to be watered shall provide and maintain efficient head ditches to the satisfaction of the Minister, and shall make all arrangements for the distribution and retention of water on his land. Failing such provision, the Minister shall have the power to refuse the supply of water until the defects have been remedied to his satisfaction.

## 16.—Land Adjacent to Rivers.

No water will be supplied to any head ditches or other distribution channels constructed or located within two (2) chains of the nearest edge of any river in an irrigation district except with the approval of the Minister.

## 17.—Regulating Supply.

The officers of the Minister may, at any time, enter upon any holding for the purposes of inspecting and/or regulating the water supply and, in the event of any water being taken or used in an unauthorised manner, or being unnecessarily wasted, shall have the power to stop all further supply of water. This By-law shall not be construed in such manner as to relieve any person from any other penalties prescribed in these By-laws.

## 18.—Delivery Outlets.

All persons receiving water from any works shall take delivery thereof through the respective outlets, at such times and in such order and in such manner as the Minister may direct. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the Minister or his officers.

## 19.—Water Deliveries.

If deliveries of water, for which application has been lodged, are refused when duly offered, such deliveries may be deemed to have been made, and may be charged for accordingly.

20.—Maximum Watering.

No ratepayer may receive more than one watering for each piece of land during a zone period without payment of the surcharge prescribed in By-law No. 28.

21.—Water for Household Purposes.

The supply by the Minister of water for household purposes shall not be deemed to imply that the water is of potable quality.

22.—Waste of Water.

Every ratepayer or occupier shall take all necessary precautions to prevent unnecessary waste during the watering of the land in relation to which the water is supplied.

23.—Special Services for Demonstration, Grading, or Experimental Plots.

On application being made, water may be supplied by the Minister without charge to any land which is controlled or supervised by the Department of Agriculture for demonstration, grading or experimental purposes.

DIVISION IV.  
Rates and Charges.

24.—Irrigation Rate.

All irrigation rates levied in terms of "The Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914" on land within the irrigation district shall be payable in advance within one calendar month from publication in the *Government Gazette*, and in a newspaper usually circulating in the particular district affected, of notice that the said rates have respectively been ordered to be made and levied.

25.—Water in Return for Rate ("Free Watering").

Subject as provided by the said Act and the By-laws, and to the payment of the said annual rate, every ratepayer shall be entitled to receive one watering of not less than four inches in depth over the area of irrigable land watered, in respect of which area the rate is payable.

26.—Other or Subsequent Waterings.

Subject as provided by the said Act and the By-laws, every ratepayer who has paid his rates for the then current year or the accommodation watering charge prescribed in the next following By-law shall, during such year, so far as the water is available, on payment in advance of the further sum of 2s. 6d. per acre for each acre to be watered, be supplied with subsequent waterings, at such times and in such order and in such manner as the Minister may direct.

27.—Accommodation Charge on Non-rated Area.

In cases where the Minister, at his discretion, supplies irrigation water to a non-rated area within the district or for an acreage in excess of the acreage rated, a charge per acre equivalent to the irrigation rate levied for the year current, under By-law 24, shall be payable before any water is supplied.

28.—Charges for Irregular Services during Zone Period.

In the event of a ratepayer receiving water out of his order provided by the zone programme, although within his zone period he shall pay a surcharge of 10s. in addition to the watering charge; and in the event of a ratepayer receiving more than one watering for the same piece of land within the appropriate zone period, he shall pay, in addition to the watering charge, a surcharge of 5s. for each extra watering received.

29.—Minimum Area for Watering Charge.

The minimum area for a watering charge shall be 5 acres and any area watered of less than 5 acres shall be treated as 5 acres and charged for accordingly, subject however to the special minimum charges of £1 provided in By-laws 34 and 35.

30.—Out of Zone Watering.

In the event of a ratepayer desiring water out of the zone period of watering applicable to his property, a surcharge of £1 shall be payable before such service is given.

31.—Reconnection Charge.

Where the supply of water has been stopped in consequence of an infringement of By-laws 17 or 22, the settler may, on compliance with the necessary requirements of the Minister, be permitted to complete his interrupted watering on payment of a reconnection charge of £1, provided water is still available within his zone

and the watering can be completed within the zone period; if such watering is completed after the close of his zone period, the out of zone charge prescribed by By-law 30 shall be paid in addition to the reconnection surcharge.

32.—Water for Stock.

(a) Every ratepayer shall, on payment of the irrigation rate levied, be entitled to a supply of water for stock.

(b) Every ratepayer requiring water for stock shall at his own expense provide a suitable receptacle for the storage of stock water, such receptacle to hold sufficient water to avoid the necessity of replenishing between zone periods; and the dam, tank, or other receptacle provided for the storage of stock water shall be subject to approval by the Minister. Unless such approval has been given, the Minister may refuse to supply water for stock purposes.

(c) Subject to the provisions of Clause (b) being complied with, the holder of any land exempt from payment of irrigation rates because such land cannot be irrigated, or for any other reason, may be given a supply of stock water on such land on the following terms:—

33.—Stock Water for Use Outside an Irrigation District.

If surplus water is available for persons who desire to water their stock, whose land is not in the irrigation district, then the scale of charges in By-law 32 will apply; By-law 30 (surcharge for out of appropriate zone period) also applies, and the provisions of By-law 32 re storage must be complied with.

34.—Water for Land Outside an Irrigation District for Irrigation Purposes.

If surplus water is available for persons desiring same for irrigation purposes for land outside the district, other than piped supply services, or is available for users off main supply channels, the Minister may supply the same but a charge of £1 per acre shall be payable, with a minimum charge of £5 for the first watering; all subsequent waterings shall be at the rate of 2s. 6d. per acre; with a minimum charge of £1 for acreage watered. If such water is taken outside the appropriate zone period applicable, a surcharge of £1 as prescribed by By-law 30, shall also be payable before such service is given.

35.—Piped Supply Services.

Water from a main supply channel for land, whether within or without the irrigation district, unable to receive ordinary irrigation, may be supplied under three headings:—

- (a) For sprinkler irrigation;
- (b) For stock;
- (c) For household and/or dairy purposes.

The scale of charges shall be:—

1. An annual charge of 10s. as a water right for each service provided off a channel by a pipe installed by the Minister, to which the consumer must connect his pipe system.
2. The annual charge for land watered under—(a) "Sprinkler Irrigation" shall be £1 per acre, plus 10s. for each additional half acre so watered, with minimum charge of £1.
3. The annual charge for water supplied under—(b) "Stock Water" shall be £2.
4. The annual charge for water supplied under (c) "Household and/or Dairy Purposes" shall be £2.

Water supplied under Clause 4 may be used for garden purposes without further charge, provided such garden does not exceed an area of one-half acre.

Written application must be made annually for each or any of the aforementioned services.

36.—Unpaid Irrigation Rates.

The Minister may refuse to supply water to any land upon which irrigation rates are unpaid.

## DIVISION V.

## 37.—Delegation of Authority.

The Minister may authorise any Government officer or agent to do any of the acts, matters or things which the Minister acting in the capacity of the Irrigation Board is by or under "The Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914," authorised or required to do.

## DIVISION VI.

## 38.—Breach of By-law—Penalties.

Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws, or who shall refuse or neglect to obey any injunction in any such By-law, or to comply with any requirements therein contained, shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 and, in the case of a continuing breach, a further penalty not exceeding five pounds for each day the offence continues after notice has been given by or on behalf of the Minister to the offender.

## DIVISION VII.

## 39.—Repeal.

All By-laws heretofore made and in force for the Harvey No. 1 Irrigation District, the Waroona Irrigation District, the Harvey No. 2 Irrigation District, and the Collie Irrigation District are hereby repealed.

*West Ward.*

*East Ward.*

## MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906.

## Albany Municipality—By-laws for Control of Reserves.

P.W. 469/37.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the

Municipality of Albany doth hereby make and pass the following By-law:—

Repeal of Previous By-laws.

By-law No. 23, Clauses 1 to 16 inclusive, for the Management of the Ulster Road Reserve, Albany, and By-law No. 25, Clauses 1 to 18 inclusive, for the Management of the Parade Street Recreation Reserve, passed by the Council on 8th October, 1923, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 28th December, 1923, are hereby repealed, and the following By-law No. 23 is substituted:—

By-law No. 23.—For Control of Centennial Oval and of the Parade Street Recreation Reserve.

1. No person shall interfere with any property in and belonging to the reserve, or throw stones or any other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter of any kind.

2. No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences of the reserve, or cut letters, names, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same, or write thereon.

3. Any person found in a state of intoxication in the reserve or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or using any foul or indecent language, or committing any act of indecency therein, may be forthwith removed from such reserve by the caretaker, or by any officer of the Council, or by any member of the police force, and shall be, moreover, liable to prosecution for an offence against this By-law.

4. No person, except those in the employ of or authorised by the Council, or by the payment of the stipulated fee, shall bring into the reserve any horse or other animal, or any vehicle.

5. No person shall light any fire within the reserve without first having obtained the consent of the Council.

6. No person except the mayor or councillors, or the officers of the Council, shall be allowed to enter the reserve on such days as may be set apart for sports, except through the proper entrance for that purpose, and on payment of the fee chargeable for admission at the time.

7. No person shall be allowed to enter the reserve for the purpose of training or for any other purpose, at any time, unless the Council's permission has first been obtained.

8. No person shall smoke any pipe, tobacco, cigar, or cigarettes in any of the dressing-rooms on the reserve.

9. No person, other than a licensed bookmaker at a registered race meeting, shall bet, gamble, or call the odds, or offer to bet or gamble within the reserve; and any person found betting, gambling, or calling the odds or offering to bet or gamble within the reserve may be forthwith removed from the reserve by the caretaker, or by an officer of the Council, or by any member of the police force, and such person shall be liable to be prosecuted for a breach of this By-law.

10. No person shall enter any of the dressing or training rooms on the reserve, or use any of the lockers without first having obtained a permit for that purpose from the Council. Failure to produce such permit shall be sufficient grounds for excluding such person from the dressing and training rooms.

11. No person shall preach or address an audience or public meeting on the reserve without first having obtained permission so to do from the Council.

12. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry over night on the said reserve without first having obtained the written consent of the Council.

13. No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint or otherwise affix, or cause to be posted, stuck, stencilled, painted, stamped, or otherwise affixed, any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, or any document or writing

whatsoever upon any tree, post, fence, gate, wall, flagging, or path on the said reserve, without first having obtained the written consent of the Council.

14. No person shall sell, or expose for sale, any goods, wares, merchandise, or things on any portion of the said reserve, unless the consent, in writing, of the Council shall be previously obtained.

15. Any person found on the reserve on a Sunday shall be liable to be prosecuted for a breach of this By-law, unless the Council's written permission has first been obtained.

16. The Council may nominate any conditions that it sees fit for the use of the reserve or any part thereof by any person or persons.

17. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

In the matter of an Award made on 27th day of August, 1934, in settlement of an industrial dispute wherein The West Australian Meat Exports Company, Limited, and The Anchorage Butchers, Limited, were Applicants, and West Australian Branch Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter referred to as "the Union") was Respondent, and

In the matter of an application to vary the said Award.

UPON reading the application lodged by the above-named Union of Workers, filed on the 16th day of January, 1936, and the answer of The West Australian Meat Export Company, Limited, filed on 31st day of July, 1936, and upon hearing the duly appointed agents, namely, Frederick Rees James for the Union and Lionel Lewin Carter for The West Australian Meat Exports Company, Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Company"), the Anchorage Butchers, Limited, not being affected by the present proceedings, and upon hearing and considering the evidence submitted and in pursuance of the powers contained in Section 90 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," the Court doth order that the said Award be and the same is hereby varied as indicated in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule hereinbefore referred to.

(1) Clause 6 (b) of the said award is amended by inserting at the commencement thereof the words:—"Except as provided by Clause 5 (d) of this award"; adding after the word "work" in the first line the words "or be required to work"; and by deleting the word and figure "five (5)" and inserting in lieu thereof "four (4)."

(2) Clause 7 of the award is amended by inserting "(a)" before the commencement of the first paragraph; deleting the words at the commencement of the paragraph "Men employed on the killing floor and in the cold storage section" and inserting in lieu thereof "Workers under this award"; and by adding at the end thereof a sentence as follows:—

"(b) Workers in Cold Storage Section, if and when employed outside the prescribed starting and finishing times, shall also be allowed a smoke-oh of fifteen (15) minutes immediately on completion of each two (2) hours of such service."

(3) Clause 11 of the award is amended by adding a second proviso as follows:—

"Provided further that the Secretary of the Union shall give to the employer one calendar month's written notice of the date upon which it is intended to celebrate Butchers' Picnic Day; failing such notice the employer shall be entitled to assume that the date fixed for such celebration is the fourth Monday in November, and to make his business arrangements accordingly."

(4) Clause 15 of the award is amended by inserting the word "solo" after the word "killed" in sub-clause (e); and by inserting a sub-clause as follows:—

"(f) A tally of the number of beasts killed per day per team engaged in chain slaughtering."

(5) Clause 19 of the award is amended as follows:—

(i) Delete the symbols and figures "£3 9s. 3d." and "£3 9s. 6d." appearing in sub-clause (a) and substitute "£3 13s. 9d." and "£3 14s. 8d." in lieu thereof, respectively.

(ii) Delete sub-clause (b) and insert in lieu thereof:

"Notwithstanding any alteration in the basic wage, the piecework rates herein prescribed shall remain constant: Provided, however, that should the basic wage rise or fall the total daily earnings of the pieceworker shall, if in excess of the daily proportion of the basic wage, be reduced or increased to the extent of one-sixth of the variation in the basic wage."

(6) Clause 20 of the award is amended by:—

(i) Inserting "(a)" before the words "The minimum" at the commencement of the clause; and by deleting the figures indicating the percentage of male basic wage, namely, "30, 40, 50, 60, 70, 85" and by substituting in lieu thereof the figures "35, 45, 55, 65, 75, 90" respectively; and

(ii) Adding a subclause as follows:—

(b) Junior workers shall be allowed to operate the Head Crushing Machine and the rate of wage for this work shall be seventy-five per cent. (75%) of the male basic wage.

(7) Clause 21 of the Award is amended as follows:—

(i) Under the word "Pieceworker" insert "(a) Solo System";

(ii) Delete the money figures appearing therein, namely, "£2 10s. 0d., £1 15s. 0d., £3 10s. 0d., £3 10s. 0d., and 8d.," and insert in lieu thereof "£2 13s. 3d., £1 17s. 3d., £3 14s. 6d., £3 14s. 6d., and 8½d." respectively;

(iii) Add a subclause as follows:—

The foregoing operations shall be performed as determined from time to time by the management.

When one team only is employed the composite rate of Two pounds one shilling and elevenpence (£2 1s. 11d.) per hundred (100) may be divided equally amongst the team, namely, those men employed in Groups A and B.

When two (2) or more teams are employed, those employed in Group A, namely, catchers, stickers and shacklers, shall divide Three shillings and sevenpence (3s. 7d.) per hundred (100) between them, and the balance, namely, One pound eighteen shillings and fourpence (£1 18s. 4d.) per hundred (100), shall be divided equally between the men employed in Group B."

(8) Clause 23 of the Award is amended as follows:—

(i) After the heading "Pieceworking Conditions" add "Solo System."

(ii) Delete the second paragraph of Subclause (a).

(iii) Delete the word "hooks" at the end of Sub-clause (b) and substitute "hooks."

(iv) Delete Subclauses (c) and (f).

(9) Interpolate a new clause as follows:—

"23A.—General Conditions.

(a) The employer shall provide a suitable dressing-room and dining-room for the workers.

(b) Sufficient power-driven grindstones, and hot and cold showers, where practicable, to be provided; also further provision in present change-room for hanging and drying clothes.

(c) Wages to be paid not later than Friday in each week.

(d) The whole of the work to be carried out to the satisfaction of the employers.

(e) A first-aid chest, with all necessaries for same, shall be provided.

(f) All workers shall be paid weekly, and in the time of the employer: Provided that payment may be made during smoke-ohs."

(10) Clause 28 of the Award is amended by deleting Subclauses (n), (o), (p), and (r).

The Award, as amended, reads:—

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 15 of 1933, as amended by Order No. 19 of 1936.

Between the West Australian Meat Exports Company, Limited, and the Anchorage Butchers, Limited, Applicants, and West Australian Branch Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the Industrial Dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

AWARD.

1.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of thirty (30) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

2.—Term.

This Award shall operate for a period of three (3) years from its date; provided that, at any time after the expiration of twelve (12) months from its date, application may be made to the Court for alteration, revision, or amendment.

3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers employed in the killing, dressing and/or preparing of sheep and/or lambs for export.

4.—Hours.

The week's work shall consist of forty-four (44) hours, to be worked in five and a-half (5½) days.

5.—Starting and Finishing Times.

(a) Except where otherwise provided the ordinary starting and finishing time shall be 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday, and 8 a.m. to noon on Saturday.

(b) No worker shall be penalised for being a few minutes late, provided he submits a satisfactory explanation to the management and is prepared to make up the lost time.

(c) Penners up, Drivers and Stockmen: The starting and finishing times in this branch of the industry shall be fixed by the employer to suit the requirements of the business.

(d) Cold Storage Workers: For persons employed in the hanging ground and grading room, the time of ending shall be as soon as possible after 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday, inclusive, and after 12 noon on Saturdays, that is, immediately after the last carcasses killed have passed over the scales and have been placed on the proper rail. Such time after 5 p.m. or 12 noon shall not be considered as forming part of the day's work; provided that any time occupied in cleaning and washing floors after 5 p.m. or 12 noon respectively shall be considered and paid for as overtime. For all others the starting time shall be 8 a.m. and the finishing time shall be 12 noon on Saturdays and 5 p.m. on other days.

6.—Meal Times.

(a) Any time allowed under this Award for a meal shall not exceed one hour. Suitable times for any meal or crib time shall be mutually arranged between the employer and the Union, and, if no agreement is arrived at, the Board of Reference hereinafter constituted shall decide.

(b) Except as provided by Clause 5 (d) of this Award no worker shall work or be required to work for a longer period than four (4) hours without a suitable interval for a meal.

(c) Meal times for workers engaged in loading trains for boats shall be elastic, as may be mutually arranged, when necessary, in order to facilitate the loading and dispatch of trains.

(d) Subject to Subclause (c), meal time, if worked, shall be paid for at double time on prevailing rates, and this will continue until such time as the worker has been allowed to take his meal.

7.—Smoke-ohs.

(a) Workers under this Award shall be allowed a smoke-oh of fifteen (15) minutes before noon and a further smoke-oh of fifteen (15) minutes in the afternoon.

(b) Workers in the Cold Storage Section, if and when employed outside the prescribed starting and finishing times, shall also be allowed a smoke-oh of fifteen (15) minutes immediately on completion of each two (2) hours of such service.

8.—Other Workers.

Any worker employed by the employer on work other than that covered by this Award may be brought into the works to do work under this Award, and in that event such worker shall be paid the rates prescribed by this Award for the work he is doing and he shall only be so paid for the time that he is employed on such work which is covered by this Award.

9.—Overtime.

(a) All work performed beyond forty-four (44) hours in any week, or before the usual starting time, or after the usual finishing time in any day, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, except where otherwise provided.

(b) Workers called upon to work after meal time following the ordinary finishing time shall be provided with a minimum of two (2) hours' work, or shall be entitled to payment for such, unless they have been previously notified so as to enable them to provide themselves with a meal.

(c) Foremen and/or Leading Hand.—All work done in excess of forty-four (44) hours in any week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(d) Penners up, Drivers and Stockmen.—All work done in excess of forty-four (44) hours in any week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(e) Cold Storage Section.—When a worker has performed his usual daily work and continues at work through the night, the night rates shall be payable during working hours from the ending of the day shift until such time as a break in his work of at least twelve (12) hours shall have occurred. From midnight on Sunday, or holidays, ordinary overtime rates shall be payable until the usual starting time on that day.

10.—Sunday and Holiday Work.

(a) All work performed on Sunday or on any of the holidays prescribed in this Award shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(b) Workers called upon to work on Sundays shall be paid for a minimum of at least two (2) hours' work at Sunday rates.

11.—Holidays.

The following days shall be paid holidays:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Butchers' Picnic Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day.

Provided that, before being entitled to be paid for any of the foregoing holidays, a worker shall have been continuously employed by the employer for one month or more, otherwise he shall be paid pro rata for such holiday.

Provided further that the Secretary of the Union shall give to the employer one calendar month's written notice of the date upon which it is intended to celebrate Butchers' Picnic Day; failing such notice the employer shall be entitled to assume that the date fixed for such celebration is the fourth Monday in November, and to make his business arrangements accordingly.

12.—Casual Workers (Cold Storage Section only).

"Casual Worker" shall mean any person (excepting hanging-ground or grading-room hands) who is employed for less than three (3) consecutive days (provided that Saturday, Sunday or any holiday, unless worked, is not included in the reckoning of consecutive days) and shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the ordinary rates.

13.—Contract of Service.

The contract of service of all workers, excepting piece-workers and junior workers, shall be a daily one terminable by one day's notice on either side. In the case of junior workers the contract of service shall be a weekly one.

## 14.—Higher Duties (Cold Storage Section).

Any worker who performs work carrying a higher rate of pay than his usual rate of pay shall be paid at the highest prevailing rate for that day: Provided that he is engaged at such higher work for over half an hour.

## 15.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a time and wages record, containing the following particulars:—

- (a) The name of the worker.
- (b) The class of work performed by him.
- (c) The hours worked each day.
- (d) The wages and overtime paid.
- (e) A tally of the number of beasts killed solo per day.
- (f) A tally of the number of beasts killed per day per team engaged in chain slaughtering.

Such book shall be open to inspection at the office of the employer by the Secretary of the respondent Union, or other officer appointed by the Union in writing, on any day during working hours.

## 16.—Old and Infirm Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate prescribed by this Award may be paid such lesser rate as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the employer and the Secretary of the Union, or, failing such agreement within twenty-four (24) hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the Secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said Secretary; who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the Secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six (6) calendar months from the date thereof and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have again been fixed at the instance of the said Secretary in the manner prescribed. The Secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

## 17.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any such cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

## 18.—Payment for Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one half day for each completed month of service; provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

## 19.—Basic Wage.

(a) This Award is made on a basic wage at the rate of £3 13s. 9d. per week within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth, and a basic wage at the rate of £3 14s. 8d. per week for the rest of the area covered by the Award. The wages as herein fixed have been regulated at the former rate.

(b) Notwithstanding any alteration in the basic wage the piecework rates herein prescribed shall remain constant; provided, however, that should the basic wage rise or fall the total daily earnings of the pieceworker shall, if in excess of the daily proportion of the basic wage, be reduced or increased to the extent of one-sixth of the variation in the basic wage.

## 20.—Junior Workers.

(a) The minimum rate of wage to be paid to junior workers shall be:—

When two (2) or more teams are employed those employed in Group A, namely, catchers, stickers and shacklers, shall divide three shillings and sevenpence (3s. 7d.) per hundred (100) between them, and the balance, namely, one pound eighteen shillings and fourpence (£1 18s. 4d.) per hundred, shall be divided equally between the men employed in Group B.

## 22.—Waiting Time.

If a pieceworker reports for piecework at a specified hour, and if he reports for work at the usual hour, unless previously notified that he will not then be required, he shall (except as hereinafter provided) be paid as from that hour at the rate of two shillings and eightpence (2s. 8d.) per hour, until he can either start work on that day or until he is notified that his services will not be required on that day: Provided that if he is started to work within fifteen (15) minutes after the hour specified, or the usual hour, as the case may be, the waiting time shall not be paid.

## 23.—Pieceworking Conditions—Solo System.

(a) The work to be done by any such workers in slaughtering, skinning, and dressing shall consist of sticking down, taking out neck sweetbreads (if any), taking off skin, taking out offal, wiping up the carcase and hanging all in a workmanlike manner.

When legging, the skin shall be opened up from the trotter downwards in such a manner as to leave the maximum amount of wool on the skin.

(b) In the case of sheep and lambs, there shall be four (4) feet at least between the hooks.

(c) If sheep or lambs have to be carried to a distance greater than fifteen (15) feet, the employers shall provide labourers to carry.

(d) The sticking pens for sheep and lambs shall not exceed one hundred and twenty (120) square feet.

23A.—General Conditions.

- (a) The employer shall provide a suitable dressing-room and dining-room for the workers.
- (b) Sufficient power-driven grindstones, and hot and cold showers, where practicable, to be provided; also, further provision in present change-room for hanging and drying clothes.
- (c) Wages to be paid not later than Friday in each week.
- (d) The whole of the work to be carried out to the satisfaction of the employers.
- (e) A first-aid chest, with all necessaries for same, shall be provided.
- (f) All workers shall be paid weekly, and in the time of the employer: Provided that payment may be made during smoke-ohs.

24.—Attendants on Slaughtermen.

27.—Tallow and Fertiliser Workers.

The rates and conditions of these workers shall be regulated as prescribed in Award, No. 1 of 1928, made between the Coastal Master Butchers' Industrial Union of Employers and the West Australian Branch of the Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Respondent.

28.—Cold Storage.

- (a) The minimum rates of wage payable shall be:—

29.—Preference to Unionists.

(a) Subject to Clause 8, preference of employment as between members of The West Australian Branch Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, and other workers shall be given to aforesaid members: Provided that:—

(i) There are members of the said union equally qualified with other workers offering their services to perform the particular work required to be done and ready and willing to undertake same;

(ii) The rules of the Union shall permit any worker of good character coming within the scope of this award to become a member of the Union, upon payment of a reasonable subscription and/or entrance fee. If any question should arise as to the reasonableness of such entrance fee and/or subscription, it shall be referred to the Registrar for decision; and

(iii) In any case where a new worker not having been a member of the said Union at the time of his engagement applies for membership of the said Union within seven (7) days after his engagement, it shall be deemed that no question of preference has arisen, unless and until his application is rejected for good cause.

(b) The provisions of paragraph (a) of this clause shall not apply if there is any restriction of output by the workers acting in concert, or if any system of clocking work or otherwise regulating the time for the performance of work is in operation.

(c) This clause shall be deemed to be rescinded on the conviction of the said Union or any of its members of an offence under Clause 129, 130 or 131 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925."

(d) The provisions of this clause shall not operate in the case of junior workers under the age of eighteen (18) years.

30.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints, for the purposes of the award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a Chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties, as prescribed by the Regulations. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the award, the functions of:—

(i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the award or any of them;

(ii) Classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the award;

(iii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time;

(iv) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations to "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," which for this purpose are embodied in this award.

## THE INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION ACT, 1912-1935.

Between Fire Brigade Employees' Industrial Union of workers (Coastal District) of Western Australia, Applicant, and W.A. Fire Brigades Board, Respondent.

## INDUSTRIAL BOARD—FIRE BRIGADES.

THE Fire Brigades Industrial Board, in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon it by Section 107 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," and in pursuance of a remission to it by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

## AWARD.

## 1.—Rates of Pay.

The following workers shall be paid at the margins shown against their respective items:—

Where less than the full week is worked, workers shall be paid at per daily rate of wages for seven days a week.

Firemen shall automatically progress from third-class to second-class and from second-class to first-class, after one year's satisfactory service in the third and second classes respectively.

## 2.—Seniority.

Seniority shall rank in the following order:—

- (i) Senior Fireman in charge of a station;
- (ii) Senior Fireman;
- (iii) First-class Fireman;
- (iv) Second-class Fireman;
- (v) Third-class Fireman.

## 3.—Hours of Duty.

(a) The hours of duty shall be worked on a system of two shifts by workers known as the "A" Platoon and the "B" Platoon.

(b) The "A" Platoon shall assume duty on the Station at 8 a.m. and remain on duty until 6 p.m.

The "B" Platoon shall assume duty on the Station at 6 p.m. and remain on duty until 8 a.m. on the following morning.

(c) The platoons shall change shifts on each third day, when the "A" Platoon shall assume duty on the Station at 8 a.m., and remain on duty until 8 a.m. on the following day, at which hour the "B" Platoon shall take up duty on the Station, and remain on duty until 6 p.m., when the "A" Platoon shall again assume duty on the Station, and remain on duty until 8 a.m. on the following morning.

Each platoon shall be off duty for a period of twenty-four hours on every alternate third day, except as provided in Clauses 5 and 6.

(d) Day Shift.—All routine duties and drills, except as hereinafter provided, shall be performed between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m., and the platoon shall stand by on the Station for fire calls from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m.

Night Shift.—The platoon shall stand-by on the Station for fire calls from 6 p.m. to 8 a.m. on the following morning, and shall muster at 7.30 a.m. daily for the purpose of tidying up the Station. The bells shall be rung at 7.15 a.m.

(e) Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing, it is provided that a worker, while on duty at the Station, may be called upon to perform any of the following duties:—

- (i) Watchroom duty;
- (ii) Any work incidental to a fire call or emergency call for special services ordinarily performed by firemen;

- (iii) Station domestic work;
- (iv) The manning and driving of any of the Fire Brigade Board's motor vehicles.
- (v) Work of an urgent nature incidental to a breakdown of fire alarms, fire appliances or equipment. Provided that if work of this nature extends beyond one hour, a penalty rate of two shillings (2s.) an hour in addition to the worker's ordinary rate shall be paid.
- (vi) Drill under night conditions for an aggregate period of not more than six (6) hours per year.

## 4.—Meal Hour.

One hour shall be allowed for all meals, which shall be taken on the station.

## 5.—Overtime.

Any work done outside the platoon hours, including travelling within the Metropolitan Area, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, except as otherwise herein provided. For this purpose overtime shall be calculated on the basis of forty-eight hours per week.

Motor drivers, whilst engaged in driving the Board's cars for journeys extending beyond twenty-four hours, shall receive an additional allowance of 5s. per day, and in such cases no overtime shall be paid.

## 6.—Emergency Calls.

Any worker called upon outside his platoon hours shall be paid at the rate of 5s. per hour or part thereof. Time to commence when the call is received until signing off at the station.

## 7.—Relieving.

(a) Any worker stationed in the Metropolitan Area and required to take up duty outside such area for a period of less than three months shall be regarded as "relieving" and shall be entitled to the allowance provided in Clause 8.

(b) Relieving shall be spread over as many of the staff as possible.

(c) When a fireman is sent to relieve an officer at a station that is manned only by a Station Officer, he shall be paid two shillings (2s.) a shift on that account.

## 8.—Travelling or Relieving Allowances.

Travelling or relieving allowances beyond the Metropolitan Area shall be granted on the following scale:—

## 9.—Meal Allowances.

When relieving and unless he has been notified on the previous day, a worker whilst on duty has to have a meal away from his home station, he shall be paid the sum of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) on that account: Provided that in no case shall the worker be entitled to the allowance as aforesaid for more than the first day of any period of relieving duty.

## 10.—Goldfields Allowance.

Workers employed at Kalgoorlie and Boulder shall receive an allowance of 2s. 4d. per week.

## 11.—Service Allowance.

After five (5) years' service, workers shall be paid a long service allowance of five shillings (5s.) per week; after ten (10) years' service an additional allowance of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week, and after fifteen years' service a further two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) a week.

## 12.—Motor Drivers' Allowance.

Motor Drivers who are rostered to drive the Motor Pumps at Headquarters and at Fremantle shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per week in addition to their ordinary rate of pay.

## 13.—Sick Leave.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for seven-twelfths (7/12ths) of one day's pay for each completed month of service during any year: Provided payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to seven (7) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater amount than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

Personal ill-health does not include ill-health which is the result of an accident sustained away from the place of employment or ill-health the result of the worker's own misconduct, but the onus of proof in such cases shall rest upon the employer.

(b) Holiday pay shall not accrue during the worker's absence from duty, except on account of sickness in accordance with subclause (a) hereof.

(c) The onus of proof of sickness entitling the worker to the leave mentioned in subclause (a) hereof shall be on the worker, and, if necessary, may be required to be supported by a certificate from a qualified medical practitioner.

## 14.—Accident Pay.

Accident pay, in accordance with the Regulations prescribed by "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," shall be paid to all workers covered by this Award.

## 15.—Uniforms.

All uniforms, as required, shall be supplied by the Board.

## 16.—Watchroom Duty.

Watchroom duty shall be performed as required by the Chief Officer.

## 17.—Annual Leave.

After the expiration of one (1) year's service, workers shall be entitled to twenty-one (21) days' annual leave on full pay and thereafter a pro rata allowance: Provided, that no leave shall accrue to any worker until he has served three (3) complete months.

## 18.—Residence.

No restriction shall be placed on men who are off duty as to place of residence, duty, or otherwise, except as provided by Clause 6 hereof.

## 19.—Salvage Duties.

Where possible, opportunity shall be given to workers to change into dry clothing when their uniforms have become wet.

## 20.—Holidays.

On Saturdays after 12 noon, on Sundays, and on all gazetted public holidays, firemen shall not engage on work other than that specified in Clause 3, Subclause (e) (i), (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v).

## 21.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid weekly.

## 22.—Vacancies.

When a vacancy occurs in a rank higher than first class, applications shall be invited by the Chief Officer from qualified men in the class immediately below that in which the vacancy occurs, and all things being equal a selection shall be made from such applicants for the vacancy.

## 23.—Transfers.

When a worker is transferred from one Station to another by direction of the Board, all reasonable expenses shall be paid by the Board; except in such cases where a worker is transferred from one Station to another as a punishment.

## 24.—Cleaning After Fires.

Reasonable time, not exceeding fifteen minutes, shall be allowed for changing and cleaning after completion of duties, on return from a fire and prior to leaving the Station.

## 25.—Charges Against Employees.

When a worker is suspended and is summoned to appear before an officer of the Fire Brigades Board to answer a charge, he shall be informed of the particular charge at least forty-eight hours before the hearing thereof, and shall have access to all reports which are put in as evidence against him. He shall have an advocate from the Union to assist him. He shall be allowed to call evidence on his behalf, and to hear all evidence against him.

## 26.—Appeal Board.

Every worker shall have the right of appeal from a decision of the Fire Brigades Board affecting his employment, to an Appeal Board constituted of one representative of the Fire Brigades Board, one representative of the Union, and a Stipendiary Magistrate (or some other person appointed by the Court) as Chairman.

## 27.—Membership of Union.

Every man employed as a permanent or probationary fireman must when assuming duty apply for membership in the Western Australian Fire Brigades Employees' Industrial Union of Workers (Coastal Districts) and, if elected, remain a member of the Union whilst in the service of the Board.

## 28.—Definition.

In the construction of these presents the term "worker" shall apply to and include the several classes of workers specified in Clause 1 of this Award, to be employed as permanent firemen by the Western Australian Fire Brigades Board south of parallel of latitude 24 degrees in the State of Western Australia.

## 29.—Bedding.

All beds and bedding requirements shall be provided by the Fire Brigades Board, and replacements due to fair wear and tear shall also be provided by the Board.

## 30.—Term of Award.

The term of this Award shall be three years from the date thereof: Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months, application may be made to the Court of Arbitration to alter, amend, or vary the same, in accordance with the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935."

## 31.—Application of Award.

Nothing herein contained shall apply to auxiliary firemen who may be employed under the conditions laid down from time to time in the Rules and Regulations issued under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act.

## INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 14 of 1937.

(Registered 17th July, 1937.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," this 14th day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, between The Operative Painters and Decorators' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called the Union), of the one part, and Alman Brothers, Hannan street, Kalgoorlie; A. A. Crompton, Wilson street, Kalgoorlie; W. J. Adams, 270 Hannan street, Kalgoorlie; J. M. Davey, 83 Lyall street, Kalgoorlie; D. McDonald, 27 Melba street, Kalgoorlie; W. H. Peters, 9 North terrace, Boulder; J. Kidd & Son, 80 Moran street, Boulder, Master Painters, and J. Flett, Wilson street, Kalgoorlie, Master Builder (hereinafter called the Employers), of the other part, witnesseth that for the consideration hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

## 1.—Area.

This Agreement shall operate over an area comprised within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the Post Office, Kalgoorlie.

## 2.—Terms.

The currency of this Agreement shall be three (3) years from the date hereof.

## 3.—Hours.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work. Such hours shall be worked as follows, namely:—On the first five (5) days of the working week between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., with an interval of not more than sixty (60) minutes for lunch, and on Saturday between 8 a.m. and 12 noon.

## 4.—Rates of Pay.

Basic wage, £4 7s. per week.

The minimum rate of wages payable to painters, paperhangers, or glaziers shall be at the rate of Two shillings and ten pence (2s. 10d.) per hour.

## 5.—Overtime.

All work performed after the usual time for ceasing work shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half up to midnight, and from midnight to 8 a.m. double time.

## 6.—Double Time.

Double time shall be paid for work done on the following days:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Sundays.

## 7.—Payment of Wages.

All wages shall be paid not later than 12 o'clock Saturdays, at the shop or on the job. Time lost through waiting after 12 o'clock shall be charged for at overtime rates.

## 8.—Country Work.

When any worker is sent by his employer or is engaged by his employer to go to a job at such a distance that he cannot return to his home each night, the employer shall provide board and lodging. The employer shall pay all fares and travelling time: Provided that such travelling time shall be limited to eight (8) hours in any one day.

## 9.—Piecework.

Piecework of any description shall not be worked.

## 10.—Special Conditions.

(a) No worker shall be permitted to have a meal in any paint shop or place where paint is stowed or used.

(b) In all cases where painters are employed, water and soap shall be provided for washing, and hot water for lunches shall be provided in all business premises and buildings in course of erection, and vacant houses by the employers.

## 11.—Dry Rubbing Down.

No surface painted with a lead paint shall be rubbed down or scraped by a dry process.

## 12.—Width of Brushes.

Oil paint brushes shall not exceed five (5) inches in width. No kalsomine brush shall be more than eight (8) inches in width.

## 13.—Leading Hands.

Workers who have charge of three (3) or more journeymen for at least one (1) day shall be paid One shilling (1s.) per day extra.

## 14.—Spraying.

(a) Lead paint shall not be applied by a spray to the interior of any building. All workers (including apprentices) applying paint by spraying, shall receive Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day extra.

(b) It shall be considered a breach of this agreement for spray painting operations to be carried on contrary to any order or regulations made by the Department of Public Health.

## 15.—Tools of Trade.

The employer shall provide all tools in connection with the trade excepting—Putty knife, strippers, scissors, duster, paperhanging brush, roller, two lining fitches, a two-foot rule, hammer, and hacking knife.

## 16.—Wet and Dusty Places.

In places where the atmosphere is dust-laden, or where water is continuously dripping so that the clothing or feet become wet, One shilling (1s.) per day or fraction of One shilling (1s.) in proportion to the time worked in such places shall be paid in addition to the rates prescribed by Clause (4).

## 18.—Termination of Employment.

One day's notice of intention to terminate the employment shall be given on either side.

## 19.—Access to Jobs or Shops.

The Secretary or any other authorised officer of the Union shall be allowed free access to any job where work covered by this agreement is being carried out, at any time during the working hours or lunch interval, for the purpose of policing the agreement.

## 20.—Definition.

(a) "Painter" shall mean any worker engaged in any manner whatsoever in connection with the painting of dwelling houses or other buildings of any nature, fences, petrol or oil containers (of over fifty (50) gallons capacity), bridges (whether constructed of iron or wood or partly of iron or partly of wood) or in connection with paperhanging, decorating, graining, marbling, gilding, signwriting, putty glazing, kalsomining, distemping, colourwashing, staining, varnishing, plastic relief, stripping off old paper, removing old paint or varnish, and preparing and getting ready of all work connected with any of the above branches of the trade, and the preparation of all materials required for any of the said branches of the trade.

(b) "Glazier": A glazier is one who cuts glass or any of its kindred products, to sizes required, under any condition and fits and fixes it, either with putty or beads, either nailed or screwed, in any place prepared for it by some other kind of tradesman (ironworker, carpenter, etc.), in such as window sashes, frames, doors, etc., of either iron or wood, and shopfronts.

(c) This agreement shall not apply to the painting of ships or to limewashing.

(d) Limewashing consists of slacking down of lime by the addition of water and common binders, and the application of the same by a spray or brush, but when colouring matter is introduced into the mixture it becomes painters' work.

## 21.—Under-rate Workers.

A worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate, which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the Secretary of the Union. If within seven (7) days after being notified in writing of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed, the said Secretary and the worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the nearest Resident Magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage. The worker shall give such Secretary two (2) days' notice in writing of his intention to apply to the Magistrate, and the said Secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The Magistrate may fix the rate of wage, and his decision shall be final. Any worker whose wage shall be so fixed may work for and be employed for such wage for the period of six (6) months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen (14) days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the said Secretary of the Union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed in the agreement.

## 22.—Apprentices.

(a) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer in any branch shall be in the proportion of one (1) apprentice to every three (3) or fraction of three (3) journeymen employed by him in that branch.

An employer who has only one (1) apprentice to the branch of painting or signwriting, may be allowed to take another apprentice to such a branch after his first apprentice has for three (3) years duly passed the examination prescribed by this agreement. Provided that the fraction of three (3) shall not be less than one (1) and provided further that the provisions of this clause shall not operate to prevent an employer from

continuing in his employment subsequent to the date of this agreement any person capable of being apprenticed to any branch of the industry as hereinafter set forth, and is actually so apprenticed within one month of this agreement.

(b) Apprentices shall be allowed—

(i) In General Painting Shops.—To painting, paper-hanging, graining, putty glazing, and decorating.

(ii) In Signwriting Shops.—To signwriting, apprentices shall be taught to prepare, in any necessary manner, any surface, either wood, stone, or other material on which it is afterward intended to paint lettering.

(iii) In Glazing Shops.—Shall be taught putty glazing, glass cutting, steel frame glazing, patent glazing, fixing of bevel glass, altering and fixing of motor wind screens, plate glass cutting, and the handling of the same, fixing in of glass in shop fronts, show cases, and the packing of glass, and cutting and fixing of vitralite and their substitutes, and all kinds of materials.

(c) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be—

During first six months ..	15%	of the minimum wage
During second six months	20%	” ”
During third six months .	25%	” ”
During fourth six months	30%	” ”
During fifth six months ..	40%	” ”
During sixth six months ..	50%	” ”
During fourth year ..	60%	” ”
During fifth year ..	80%	” ”

23.—Record Book.

The record shall be kept by each employer, in which record shall be entered the name of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of the wages received by him each week. The employer shall be responsible for the proper posting of the record each week. The said record shall be open to the inspection of the Secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Union during working hours.

The word “record” in this clause shall be taken to mean the normal method in use in any shop, whether time and wages book, or time sheet.

(d) Dairymen who hold a Milk Vendor's License and a Treatment License as well as a Dairyman's License—2/3rds of a 1d.

(e) Milk Vendors who do not hold any license from the Board other than a Milk Vendor's License—1/3rd of a 1d.

(f) Milk Vendors who hold a Treatment License as well as a Milk Vendor's License but no other license from the Board—1/3rd of a 1d.

(g) Persons who hold a Treatment License but who do not hold any other license from the Board—2/5ths of a 1d.

ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1934.

Carnamah Road Board.

By-laws for the Management of Reserves under the Control of the Board and the Playing of Games thereon.

P.W. 614/37.

THE Carnamah Road Board, under and by virtue of the power conferred on it by Section 204, Subsection 49, of "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," and of every other power enabling it in this behalf, do hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

1. In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

- (a) The word "Board" shall mean the Carnamah Road Board;
- (b) The word "Reserve" shall mean the ground owned by, vested in, or otherwise under the control of the Board;
- (c) The word "Caretaker" shall mean any person appointed by the Board to take care of any reserve or reserves;
- (d) "Inspector" shall mean and include any person appointed by the Carnamah Road Board as an Inspector in regard to the Reserve and any acting or assisting inspector;
- (e) "Secretary" shall mean the Secretary of the Carnamah Road Board;

2. No person shall damage or interfere with any property or thing placed or used in or belonging to any reserve, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any rubbish, litter, or waste matter of any kind.

3. No person shall stand on or climb or jump over the seats, trees, or fences of any reserve, or cut letters, names or marks thereon, or otherwise damage the structures, trees, seats, gates, posts or fences thereon, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

4. No person, except those in the employ of or authorised by the Board, shall bring into any reserve any horse or other animal or vehicle.

5. No person shall light any fire within any reserve without the permission of the Board.

6. No person, except the officers or servants of the Board acting in the discharge of their duty, shall enter any reserve on such days as may be set apart for games, sports, shows, amusements, or entertainments, except through the proper entrance for that purpose, and on payment of the fee chargeable for admission at the time; but on such days as are not set apart as aforesaid the reserves shall be open to the public free of charge.

7. No person shall enter the reserves for the purpose of playing any games or sports or horse racing therein until he has first obtained a permit so to do from the Board, unless he is a bona fide member of any club or other body authorised in that behalf.

8. No person or authorised club having obtained such permit as aforesaid shall practise, play at, or carry on any game, sport, or amusement, except upon such portion of the reserve as may be specified for that purpose.

9. The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any person, club or other body from playing at or carrying on any game or sport, or otherwise using any portion of any reserve at any time.

10. No person shall bring or take any horse or other animal on to any reserve for the purpose of training or exercising such horse or other animal, without first having obtained a permit from the Board so to do.

11. No person other than a member of a sporting body duly authorised in that behalf shall enter any dressing room on the reserves, or use any locker, without having first obtained a permit for that purpose, and every person holding such permit shall produce and exhibit same when required by due authority.

12. No person shall address an audience or public meeting on any reserve without having first obtained permission so to do from the Board.

13. No unauthorised person shall camp, lodge, tarry overnight, or frequent for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying overnight on the reserves.

14. No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint or otherwise affix or exhibit, or cause to be posted, stamped, stuck, stencilled, painted, or otherwise affixed or exhibited, any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever upon any tree, post, fence, gate or building on any reserve, without having first obtained the written consent of the Board.

15. No person shall sell or expose for sale any food, drink, goods, wares, merchandise, or things on any portion of the reserves, unless the consent of the Board shall have been previously obtained.

16. No fermented or spirituous liquors shall be brought into or consumed on any reserve, except when permitted by the Board in writing.

17. Any person found in a state of intoxication in any reserve, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or using any profane, indecent or obscene language, or committing any act of indecency or misconducting himself, or committing any breach of this By-law therein, may be forthwith removed from such reserve by the caretaker, or by any officer or servant of the Board, or by any member of the Police Force, without affecting such person's liability to prosecution for an offence against this By-law.

18. No person, club, sporting body, or association shall sublet any portion of any reserve the use of which may be granted to any such person, club, sporting body or association, nor permit the same to be used by any person or persons whatsoever without the written consent of the Board.

19. The sums to be charged by the Board to the various persons, clubs, sporting bodies, or associations for the use of any reserve or any portion thereof shall be such as shall be fixed by the Board from time to time.

20. The Board may grant the exclusive use of any reserve, or any portion thereof, to any particular person, club, sporting body, or association for any parti-

ular day or days, and the fees to be charged to the public for admission shall be such as shall be fixed with the consent of the Board, by the person, club, sporting body, or association, to whom such exclusive use shall be granted.

21. Application for the use of any recreation reserve shall be made in writing to the secretary of the Board not less than one week before reserve is required.

22. The Board reserve the right to refuse to rent any reserve or portion thereof to any applicant, without assigning any reason for such refusal.

23. No male person, except children under the age of seven years accompanied by females, shall enter any place set aside for the use of females.

24. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.
