FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming a portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

No. 8 of 1937.

Between Metropolitan Soap and Candle Manufacturers' Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicants, and Soap Distributors, Limited, and Western Soaps, Limited, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

AWARD.

1.—Area.

This Award shall apply over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

2.—Term.

This Award shall continue in force for a period of three (3) years.

3.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked, except in the case of shift workers, between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, and between 7.30 a.m. and 12 o'clock noon on Saturday.

(b) The ordinary day's work shall not exceed eight (8) hours, Monday to Friday inclusive, and four (4) hours on Saturday, to be worked in a continuous shift.

(c) Lunch interval shall not exceed one hour.

(d) Where shift work is worked, the forty-four (44) hours shall be worked at times to suit the convenience of the employer.

4.—Overtime.

(a) For all work done beyond the hours of duty on any week day other than Saturday afternoon, or the holidays prescribed, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Work done after 12 o'clock noon on Saturday or on Sunday, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day or Boxing Day shall be paid for at double time rates.

5.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu thereof, shall be holidays, and no deduction shall be made from the wages of workers for such holidays:— Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(b) As to any other public holidays, the employer may make a deduction from the wages of any worker in respect of same, if no work is done on such day.

6.—Annual Leave.

(a) A holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each worker on the completion of each year of service. A worker not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu thereof in proportion to his length of service.

- (b) Where practicable, annual leave shall be granted by the employer at Christmas time.
- (c) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatsoever.
- (d) A worker dismissed for misconduct, or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall lose all rights under this clause.

7.—Meal Money.

If a worker other than a shift worker is required to work after 5 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, or after 12 o'clock noon on Saturday for more than one hour, he or she shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) for a meal.

8.—Payment for Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half-day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

9.—Change and Mess Room.

A suitable change and mess room shall be provided for in all establishments.

10.—First-aid Equipment.

Adequate first-aid equipment shall be provided in all establishments.

11.—Contract of Service.

All workers other than casuals shall be engaged and paid by the week, and one week's notice shall be given by either party: Provided, however, that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct.

12.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Award than that which he usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate while so employed.

Adults:—Threepence (3d.) per hour above the rates specified on an hourly basis.

Juniors:—One penny-halfpenny (1½d.) per hour above the rates specified on an hourly basis.

- (g) No junior under the age of seventeen (17) years shall be required to lift packages of a greater weight than thirty (30) pounds.

- (h) All shift workers other than day shift workers shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per shift extra.

14.—No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum rate prescribed for his class of work.

15.—Time and Wages Book or Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a book or record containing the name of each of his workers to whom this Award applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such worker, and the time during which each such worker has been employed. Such book or record shall be open for inspection by a representative of the Union during all working hours.

16.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

- (a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

- (c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

17.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed, because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

18.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:—

- (i) Name in full.
- (ii) Age and date of birth.

- (a) The certificate shall be signed by the worker.

- (b) No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages in the event of his age being wrongly stated on this certificate.

19.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a Chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are

assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time;
- (iv) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," which for the purpose are embodied in this Award.

Between The Metropolitan Rope and Twine Manufacturers Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A., Applicant, and The West Australian Rope and Twine Company Proprietary, Limited, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

AWARD.

1.—Scope of Award.

This Award shall apply to all workers who are employed in or in connection with the manufacture of rope and twine, or goods manufactured from rope and twine: Provided that this clause shall not apply to workers in the industry who are already covered by an Award or Industrial Agreement made under the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935."

2.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

3.—Term.

This Award shall continue in force for a period of three (3) years from the date hereof, subject to the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935."

4.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked, except in the case of shift workers, between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, and between 7.30 a.m. and 12 o'clock noon on Saturday.

(b) The ordinary day's work shall not exceed eight (8) hours, Monday to Friday inclusive, and four (4) hours on Saturday, to be worked in a continuous shift.

(c) Lunch interval shall not exceed one hour.

(d) Where shift work is worked the forty-four (44) hours shall be worked at times to suit the convenience of the employer, and any worker taken from day work for night shift shall have his position on day work guaranteed to him when the night shift is finished.

5.—Holidays.

(a) The following holidays, or the days observed in lieu, shall be allowed and paid for as they occur, viz., Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Labour Day, New Year's Day, Anzac Day, and four (4) days intervening between Boxing Day and New Year's Day.

(b) Employees working on any of these days shall, except as hereinafter provided, be entitled to ordinary time for the time worked in addition to the weekly wage: Provided that any worker so employed shall receive a minimum of four (4) hours' pay.

(c) Employees engaged on repair work or the cleaning of the plant on any of the above prescribed holidays, or on Sunday, shall be paid for such work on holidays at the rate of half time, in addition to the ordinary weekly wage, and for such work on Sundays at the rate of ordinary time in addition to the weekly wage.

(d) The holidays provided for in Subclause (a) shall be deemed to be in lieu of annual leave. Any worker not completing one year of service shall be entitled to pay in lieu of the above twelve (12) paid holidays in proportion to the length of his or her service.

(e) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatsoever.

(f) A worker dismissed for misconduct, or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall lose all rights under this clause.

6.—Overtime.

Except as relating to shift work, all work performed before the usual starting or after the usual finishing times, or in excess of eight (8) hours in any one day, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

7.—Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a book containing the names of each of his employees to whom this Award applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such employee and the time during which each such employee has been employed. Such book shall be open for inspection by a duly authorised representative of the Union between the hours of 10 o'clock a.m. and 4 o'clock p.m.

8.—Engagement.

(a) All workers, other than casuals, shall be engaged and paid by the week, and one week's notice shall be given by either party: Provided, however, that the employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct: Provided further, that any worker not attending for duty will lose his pay for the actual time lost, unless he produces evidence satisfactory to the employer that his non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such absence, when the following provisions shall apply—a worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one half-day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) The year referred to in the preceding clause begins on the date on which this Award comes into force and the said six (6) days may be apportioned accordingly.

Juniors.—One penny halfpenny (1½d.) per hour above the rates specified on an hourly basis.

11.—Mixed Functions.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his usual rate shall be paid, whilst engaged on such work, at the rate prescribed therefor: Provided that, where no record of such work is kept, the worker shall be paid at the higher rate for the whole of the day on which the work was performed.

12.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 4 of 1937.

In the matter of an Industrial Agreement, dated the 1st day of May, 1926, and Numbered 20 of 1926, between The Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Union"), and Berryman Bros.; Central Gardeners' Fruit & Produce Markets, and others (hereinafter called "the employers"), and which said Industrial Agreement was on the 12th day of August, 1926, declared to be a Common Rule, and in the matter of an Application by the Union for the cancellation of the said industrial Agreement.

UPON hearing the application of Mr. R. F. Bourke, on behalf of the Union, and Mr. L. L. Carter, on behalf of the employers, and by consent, leave of the Court to make this application having been granted on the 1st day of March, 1937, and all requirements of the Act and Regulations having been duly complied with, the Court doth hereby order that Industrial Agreement, dated the 1st day of May, 1926, and Registered No. 20 of 1926, as amended by Order No. 554 of 1931, which Agreement was declared to be a Common Rule on the 12th day of August, 1926, be and the same is hereby cancelled.

In the matter of an Industrial Agreement, dated the 31st day of July, 1928, made between the Western Australia Musicians' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"), and Miss E. Philp, C. Sheridan, and others (hereinafter called "the employers"), and which Agreement was on the 25th day of October, 1928, declared to be a Common Rule, and in the matter of an Application by the abovenamed Union for an amendment of the said Industrial Agreement.

UPON hearing Mr. C. L. Vickery, on behalf of the Union, there being no appearance on behalf of any party desiring to be heard in opposition, leave of the Court to make this application having been granted on the 1st day of March, 1937, and all requirements of the Act and Regulations having been duly complied with, the Court doth declare that Industrial Agreement, dated the 31st day of July, 1928, and Numbered 22 of 1928, declared a Common Rule on the 25th day of October, 1928, be and the same is hereby amended in the terms of the Schedule annexed hereto.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," this 14th day of July, 1937, between the Western Australia Professional Musicians' Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part, and Birts, Limited, Cabaret Proprietors, Australasia Chambers, St. George's terrace, Perth; K. McEntyre, Dance Organiser, Piccadilly Ball Room, Perth; T. Palmer, Dance Organiser, 21 Kent street, Busselton; James T. Cook, Dance Organiser, 1 York street, Maylands; H. A. Cooper, Dance Organiser, 8 Pemant street, North Perth; C. N. Schofield, Dance Organiser, 112 Oroya street, Boulder; R. J. Knox, Dance Organiser, Denmark; B. Richards, Dance Promoter, Unity Theatre, Perth (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—The Industry.

This Agreement shall relate to the Industry of Professional Musicians who may be employed in or in connection with the production, organising, or advertising of balls and dances.

2.—Definitions.

(a) "Weekly employee" means a musician engaged by the same employer for six performances in each or any one week at the same place of employment.

(b) "Casual employee" means a musician employed for less than six performances in any week at the same place of employment by the same employer.

(c) "Orchestra" means an orchestra of two or more players.

(d) "Conductor or conductor leader" means the conductor of an orchestra who plays in and/or directs an orchestra.

3.—Rates of Wage.

(a) This Industrial Agreement is based on the following basic wages, namely:—

(c) Provided that, in respect to any basic wage variation which may occur from time to time, the total wage prescribed for a female employee shall be increased or decreased by the same amount that the basic wage for male employees is increased or decreased as a result of such variation, in order that the rates for a female employee and a male employee shall remain equal.

(d) A performance shall not exceed three hours' duration, otherwise overtime rates in accordance with Subclause (e) hereof shall be paid.

(e) If a performance exceeds a period of three hours in duration or continues after 11 p.m. in any night, all time worked thereafter shall be deemed to be overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time-and-a-quarter.

(f) A conductor and/or conductor-leader shall receive a minimum of 5s. per performance in addition to the above rates.

4.—Holiday and Sunday Rates. Christmas Day, Good Friday, Labour Day, Boxing Day, Anzac Day, New Year's Day, and any Sunday and all gazetted Public Holidays.

For all work performed on Christmas Day, Good Friday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, or on any Sunday and all gazetted public holidays, each musician shall be entitled to receive payment at the rate of time and a half for all time so worked.

5.—Musicians Not Specially Engaged for Broadcasting.

In cases where a musical performance of employees who are engaged otherwise than specially for broadcasting is broadcast in whole or in part, there shall be paid to each such employee an extra payment of 5s. for each such performance: provided that there shall not be payable in the aggregate more than 15s. in respect of any one week's employment, whatever the number of performances broadcast in such week.

6.—Payment of Wages.

(a) Weekly employees shall receive their wages weekly.

(b) Casual employees shall be paid their wages at the completion of each performance.

7.—Notice to Terminate Employment.

(a) Weekly employees shall be entitled to give and receive twenty-four (24) hours' notice to terminate their employment.

(b) The engagement of a casual employee shall terminate on the completion of the engagement.

8.—General Conditions.

(a) In all engagements of less than six consecutive performances outside the City of Perth the employer shall pay tram fares, first class railway fares, or boat fares as from the Perth Town Hall, to and from the place of performance, in addition to the prescribed rates herein: provided that the distance is three miles or over from the Perth Town Hall, but provided further, that should the return fare from the place of residence of an employee to his place of employment be a lesser amount than that prescribed above, such lesser amount only shall be paid.

(b) At performances and where a performance is three hours in duration, a minimum interval of ten minutes shall be allowed and such interval shall be included in the time worked.

(c) The provisions of this Agreement as to duration of performances, time of performance, and overtime shall apply to all employees.

(d) Full preference shall at all times be given to members of the Western Australia Professional Musicians' Union of Workers, Perth, and every employer shall endeavour to engage only members of such Union.

(e) All employees, casual or otherwise, shall be entitled to receive overtime rates.

(f) Where an employee is required to wear a special uniform other than evening dress, such uniform shall be supplied by the employer, and must be kept clean and in good condition by the employer, and any cost of renovation, etc., must be paid by the employer.

(g) Reasonable cost of transport shall be paid by the employer for the transport of the string bass, sousaphone and drums.

(h) Any musician who is required to attend rehearsals shall be paid 5s. for each rehearsal: provided any such rehearsal shall not exceed a period of two hours' duration and shall take place during a week when such musician is employed as a weekly employee or a casual employee under this Agreement.

9.—Time and Wages Book.

A Time and Wages Book shall be kept by each employer at the place where the musician is employed, and in such Time and Wages Book there shall be entered the name of each employee, the nature of his employment, showing whether casual or weekly, and the amount of overtime worked (if any), also the amount of wages received by the employee each week, or on the completion of each casual engagement, and the employee's signature for same.

The employer and the employee shall be severally responsible for the proper posting of the Time and Wages Book each week, or on the completion of each casual engagement, and the said Time and Wages Book shall be open to the inspection of a duly accredited representative of the Union during business hours, or any other books or documents relating to the employment of the workers covered by this Industrial Agreement.

10.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the area within that portion of the State of Western Australia south of the 24th parallel of latitude.

11.—Term.

This Agreement shall continue in force for a period of three years from its date: provided that, at any time after the expiry of twelve months from its date, or of any subsequent period of twelve months therefrom, any party or persons hereof may make application to the Court of Arbitration for a variation hereof.

12.—Common Rule.

All parties to this Industrial Agreement hereby agree that application shall be made by the Union to the Court of Arbitration, asking the Court to declare that this Agreement shall have the effect of an Award and be a Common Rule over the industry or industries to which it relates.
