Reclassification of the Professional Division.

(Dating from 28th January, 1937.)

The reclassification dating from 28th January, 1937, of the officers of the Professional Division, whose salaries do not exceed £699, is attached. This classification is made as the result of an Agreement made pursuant to the provisions of Part IXA of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," of Western Australia, dated 25th May, 1937, between the Civil Service Association and the Public Service Commissioner, relating to the Professional Division. (Copy of the Agreement is appended hereto.)

The salaries shown in the column "Salaries under Award or Agreements" are the salaries payable on the 28th January, 1937. All transfers, promotions and appointments since that date, and any other alterations that affect the officer's total remuneration up to and including the 31st May, 1937, have been shown in the "Remarks" column. Any adjustments after the 1st June will be made on the personal files of officers.

THIS Agreement made pursuant to the provisions of Part IXA. of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," of Western Australia this 25th day of May, 1937, between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) (hereinafter called the Association) of the one part and the Public Service Commissioner of Western Australia (hereinafter called the Commissioner) of the other part witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

The Agreement shall apply to all permanent officers employed within the State of Western Australia under "The Public Service Act, 1904," in the Professional Division, whose salaries are less than £700 per annum.

2.—Interpretations.

In this Agreement the following expressions shall, unless the contrary intention appears, have the meanings hereby respectively applied to them, namely:—

"1936 Classification" means the Classification issued by the Public Service Commissioner to date from 1st January, 1936.

"Grades in 1936 Classification" refers to those grades contained in Public Service Regulation 95.

3.—Scale of Classes and Grades therein.

In making a classification under this Agreement the Commissioner—

- As regards engineers and/or chemists may amalgamate any two or more classes; and
- As regards engineers shall adhere to the number of classes existing under the 1936 classification.

4.—Grades.

The following grades shall apply:—

£270, £282, £294, £306, £318, £330, £342, £354, £366, £378, £390, £402, £414, £438, £462, £486, £510, £534, £558, £582, £606, £630, £666, £699.

5.—Salaries of Draftswomen.

6.—Ex-Cadets.

Any person who has graduated through a cadetship requiring a University degree or other academic qualification approved by the Commissioner may be employed on a probationary period of one year with a salary of £270.

Any person who has graduated through a cadetship requiring the passing of a Public Service examination only may be employed on a probationary period of two years with a salary for the first year of £245 and for the second year £260.

In the event of their appointment being confirmed at the end of the probationary period they shall then be appointed at the commencing salary of the respective class to which they have qualified, but subject to Clause 9, Subclause (f).

This clause shall not operate until after the 30th June, 1937.

7.—Technical Diploma.

A Draftsman who obtains a diploma of the Perth Technical College for Mechanical or Structural Engineering, or an equal or higher qualification approved by the

Commissioner, shall advance one grade ahead while in Class 8, and 12 months after reaching the maximum of £706 will be entitled to draw an allowance of £12 per annum until such time as he obtains promotion to a higher class.

8.—Progression from Minimum to Maximum of Class.

Subject to the receipt by the Commissioner of a report from the Permanent Head regarding the good conduct, diligence and efficiency of the officers as provided for by the Public Service Regulations, officers shall proceed from the minimum to the maximum of the class by annual increments in the manner provided for in Clause 9 of this Agreement, except where the Commissioner has fixed a limit within a class under Public Service Regulation 106.

9.—Special Provisions to Cover Interval Between Old and New Classifications.

To enable a transition from existing classes under the 1936 classification, which overlap, to classes provided under Clause 3 of this Agreement, and which obviate overlapping, it is agreed—

(a) If an officer is placed in a class under Clause 3 of this Agreement the maximum salary of which is less than the maximum salary of his 1936 classification, and such officer is drawing the maximum salary under his 1936 classification, he shall continue to draw such higher salary until the 30th June, 1938, provided that—

(i) If not promoted by that date he shall be reduced to the maximum of his new class.

(ii) Should an officer appeal to the Public Service Appeal Board against the placing of his position in a class the maximum salary of which is lower than the maximum salary prescribed for his position under the 1936 classification, and the Board decides that his position is placed in the correct class, then he shall be paid the lower salary rate from the date of the Board's decision, but, in any case, not later than the 30th June, 1938.

In the event of the Board's upholding the appeal he shall be paid salary increases under the following subclauses, whichever is applicable.

(b) If an officer has in the 1936 classification a position the maximum salary of which is identical to the maximum salary of the class in which he is placed under Clause 3 of this Agreement he shall proceed to the maximum of such new class in accordance with the annual incremental scale provided in the 1936 classification until the minimum of such new class is reached, and then by increments according to the grades in such new class.

(c) If an officer is classified under the 1936 classification with a maximum salary one grade lower than the maximum salary of the class in which he is placed under Clause 3 of this Agreement, his salary increments shall be—

(i) If in receipt of the maximum salary of his 1936 classification on the 28th January, 1937, he shall advance to the maximum salary of his new class on the 1st January, 1938.

(ii) If the salary of an officer, on the 28th January, 1937, is below the maximum of his 1936 classification, he shall proceed to the maximum of his new class in accordance with the provisions of Subclause (d) of this clause.

(d) If an officer is classified under the 1936 classification with a maximum salary two or more grades lower than the maximum salary in the class in which he is placed under Clause 3 of this Agreement, he shall proceed to the maximum of such new class in accordance with the annual incremental scale provided in the 1936 classification until the minimum of such new class is reached, and then by the grades set out in such new class.

(e) Every officer shall be paid at least the minimum of his new class on or before the 1st July, 1939, and shall thereafter receive annual increments in accordance with the grades in his new class.

(f) All appointments or promotions made after 27th January, 1937, and before the 1st July, 1939, shall be

in accordance with the classification scale prescribed in the 1936 classification, and in such cases officers shall proceed to the maximum of their classes in accordance with the annual incremental scale provided in the 1936 classification until they reach the minimum of their new class, when they will proceed by increments corresponding to the grades in such classes. The provision under Subclause (e) of this clause shall also apply.

10.—Basic Wage.

The salary rates contained herein shall be subject to adjustment in accordance with the basic wage declarations made by the Court of Arbitration in the following manner:—

- (a) Adult Male Officers—The nearest multiple of five pounds (£5) to the result obtained by multiplying the State weekly basic wage by fifty-two and one-sixth ($52 \frac{1}{6}$).

Basic wage in the Metropolitan Area as at the 1st day of January, 1936, £3 10s. 6d. (deemed to be equivalent to £185 per annum for the purposes of this Agreement).

- (b) Adult Female Officers—Seventy-five per centum of the adult male rate calculated to the nearest £1.
- (c) Officers under 21 years of age—Pro rata with the adult male minimum of £185 per annum.
- (d) Officers located in an area for which an independent basic wage has been declared higher than the metropolitan basic wage shall be paid the difference between such basic wage rates as an allowance.

11.—Maintenance of Rights of Appeal.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained or implied the rights of officers in respect of all appeals under "The Public Service Appeal Board Act, 1920," shall be preserved and maintained, subject to any legal rights which the Commissioner or any other respondent may have in relation thereto.

12.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall be for a term of five (5) years commencing from 28th January, 1937.

Provided that either party to this Agreement may, after the 28th January, 1938, negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Agreement, and if both parties agree such Agreement may be amended by a supplementary Agreement which shall be concurrent with this Agreement.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," the Board of any Road District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purpose in the said Act mentioned, the Upper Blackwood Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the Board under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Hawkers.

1. (a) No person shall hawk any fruit, fish, vegetables, drapery, softgoods, hardware, or any other articles of merchandise within any part of the Board's District without first obtaining a license from the Board.

(b) Provided that nothing contained in these By-laws shall apply to:—

- (1) any person or persons or company carrying on a business or trade whose premises are registered under the Shops and Factories Act and have been established and situated within the Upper Blackwood Road District for a period of at least six months;
- (2) a registered milk vendor;
- (3) any farmer, so far as these By-laws may or would affect the sale of the produce of a farm;
- (4) any church, association, club, or charitable organisation established in the District for the benefit of the public.

(c) Any person who trades or travels on foot, or with any vehicle or animal, or carries to sell or expose or offer for sale within the Board's District any of the articles or things abovenamed, shall be deemed to hawk same.

A Hawker's License shall be in the Form No. 1 in the Schedule A attached hereto.

(d) The fees to be paid for a license issued to a hawker shall be as set forth in Schedule B attached hereto.

Stall-keepers.

2. (a) No person shall keep or conduct any movable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street or way, recreation ground, or reserve within the Board's District for the sale of any fruit, fish, vegetables, meat, or any other articles of merchandise, unless he shall be the holder of a current license from the Board entitling him so to do.

(b) A Stall-keeper's License shall be in the Form No. 2 in the Schedule C attached hereto.

(c) The fees to be paid for the license issued to a stall-keeper shall be as set forth in the Schedule D attached hereto.

3. Every person who wishes to obtain a Hawker's or Stall-keeper's License shall apply in writing to the secretary of the Board therefor, stating the term and kind of merchandise for which he desires to be licensed.

The granting or refusing of a Hawker's or Stall-keeper's License shall be in the absolute discretion of the Board, and, when granted, shall not be transferable. The Board may refuse to grant a license for any reason it may see fit, and every license granted under these By-laws shall remain in force for the period stated therein only.

4. Every hawker, whilst hawking, and every stall-keeper, whilst using or occupying his stall, shall carry his license with him, and shall at all times produce the same on demand to any officer of the Board, or to a police officer.

5. The secretary of the Board or other officer appointed by the Board, or any officer of the Police Force, may demand from and inquire of any individual committing or suspected of committing any offence against or breach of these By-laws, his name and address, and every person who shall refuse or neglect to give his name and address when required so to do shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

6. Every person offending against any provision of these By-laws shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20.

INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION ACT, 1912-1935.

Nos. 30 and 45 of 1936.

Between Coastal District Committee Amalgamated Engineering Union Association of Workers and Australasian Society of Engineers' Industrial Union of Workers, Goldfields No. 1 Branch, Applicants, and Yampi Sound Mining Company, Limited, Respondent.

THE Industrial Board for the Engineering Section of the Iron Ore Mining Industry over Yampi Sound, in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon it by Section 107 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," and in pursuance of a remission to it by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

AWARD.

1.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to workers engaged in the vocations mentioned herein and employed in or in connection with the production of iron ore in Yampi Sound.

2.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours, exclusive of crib time, shall constitute a week's work for surface workers:—on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, eight (8) hours, and on Saturdays, four (4) hours.

(b) When more than one shift is worked on the surface, forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work:—on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, eight (8) hours, inclusive of crib time, and on Saturdays, four (4) hours, exclusive of crib time.

(c) Provided, however, that in the case of continuous and/or shift work this provision shall be deemed to have been complied with if the ordinary working hours do not exceed eighty-eight (88) hours per fortnight, to be worked in shifts of eight (8) hours each, including crib time: Provided, further, that by agreement between an employer and the Union, the hours of work may be worked under a roster which shall provide for an average of forty-four (44) hours per week, spread over a period of three (3) weeks.

The actual times for starting and finishing work shall be as agreed upon between the employer and the workers, but, in the event of these parties being unable to agree, shall be as fixed by a Board of Reference constituted under Clause 15 of this Award.

3.—Smoke-ohs.

Two (2) breaks of ten (10) minutes each shall be allowed in each shift to all workers during working hours: Provided that such breaks do not prevent the continuous operation of essential machinery.

4.—Overtime.

(a) For all work done beyond the hours of duty on any ordinary day, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) All work done on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and Labour Day shall be paid at double time, except work in connection with repairs to machinery which has broken down and caused a stoppage of operations, for which the ordinary overtime rates provided in Subclause (a) shall apply.

(c) When computing overtime the district allowances shall not be computed as an addition to the day's pay.

(d) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time due to private arrangement between the workers themselves, or which is necessary for effecting periodical rotation of shifts, or which is owing to a relieving man not coming on at the appointed time. The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime, due to a relieving man not coming on at the proper time, shall not exceed two (2) hours, after the expiration of which overtime rates shall apply for the whole shift.

(e) A worker who is called upon to start work before his usual starting time, when he has worked overtime in the preceding shift, shall be paid double time up to his usual starting time.

(f) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one hour, he shall be paid overtime rates until he gets his meal time.

5.—Annual Holidays.

(a) Annual holidays shall be taken at the convenience of the management.

(b) Workers shall receive one month's notice of the date on which the holiday is to commence.

(c) Annual holidays, which shall include eighteen (18) working days on full pay, shall be granted once in each year to every worker: Provided he has worked two hundred and eighty-five (285) shifts at ordinary rates of pay, and should he have worked less than two hundred and eighty-five (285) such shifts when the holiday is taken, or at the termination of his employment, he shall be paid for a proportionate number of holidays. Payment for the said holidays shall be at the rate of pay the worker is receiving immediately before the holiday is taken or employment terminated: Provided further, that where the worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct, he shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause.

(d) A piece-worker shall be entitled to be paid when on holiday the minimum rate for his grade.

6.—Travelling.

(a) Any worker engaged by the employer to work at Yampi Sound shall refund to the employer the amount of fare (if any) paid on his behalf by the employer to the nearest port to Yampi Sound at which passenger-carrying vessels call. The refund shall be made in such a manner as is agreed upon in writing by the worker and the employer.

(b) Each worker engaged by the employer shall be entitled to a refund of any fare paid by the worker to Yampi Sound: Provided such worker shall have worked six (6) months continuously for the employer. This clause shall apply only to the fares incurred for the purpose of entering the service of the employer at the original engagement.

7.—Rates of Wages.

The following shall be the minimum rates of wages payable to the workers employed in the vocations set out hereunder:—

Subject to Clause 22 hereof, a junior worker may be employed in any of the vocations mentioned in this Award: Provided that, in the event of any dispute be-

tween the parties to this Award as to the appropriateness of the employment of a junior worker in any of the vocations mentioned, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for decision.

8.—District Allowance.

In addition to the wages prescribed in Clause 7 of this Award, an allowance of twenty shillings (20s.) per week shall be paid to all workers.

9.—Board and Lodging.

If required, workers shall be provided with suitable board and lodging. Such lodging shall include the provision of a stretcher, mattress and pillow.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct the sum of twenty-eight shillings (28s.) per week from the wages of each worker for the board and lodging so provided.

10.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid fortnightly.

11.—Mixed Functions.

(a) Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two (2) hours in any shift shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift: Provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two (2) hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole shift.

(b) A worker's regular rate of pay shall not be reduced whilst he is temporarily employed at work classified with a lower minimum, owing to shortage of material occasioned by the employer's default, or for any other cause within the control of the employer.

12.—Accidents and Transportation.

In cases of accident or serious illness, the employer shall make necessary arrangements for the transport of the injured worker to the nearest hospital, and, when deemed necessary, by the first-aid attendant, some person shall accompany the injured worker; such attendant to be transported free, and be paid for all lost time and reasonable expenses incurred.

13.—Water Supply.

The employer shall provide potable water for workers in quantities not less than three (3) gallons per day per man.

14.—Representative interviewing Workers.

(a) The duly appointed representatives of the Union on the works shall be recognised by the employer.

(b) In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Award, an accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour, on the business premises of the employer.

15.—Settlement of Disputes.

The Board appoints for the purposes of the Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a Chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations to "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

16.—Contract of Service.

(a) A week's notice of intention to terminate the employment shall be given on either side, except in the case of casual workers.

(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of Clause 17, or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of the Award.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for wilful misconduct, and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed, because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it or by any other Association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

17.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) Provided evidence satisfactory to the management is produced, a worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one half day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) Holiday pay shall not accrue during the worker's absence from duty, except on account of sickness in accordance with Subclause (a) hereof.

18.—Record Book.

(a) The employer shall keep a time and wages record, showing the name of each worker and the nature of his work, the hours worked each day, and the wages and allowances paid each week. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed a compliance with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.

(b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection to a duly accredited official of the Union during the usual office hours, at the employer's office or other convenient place, and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom.

19.—Definitions.

(a) A "Leading hand" means any tradesman placed in charge of three (3) or more other tradesmen or six (6) other workers, and shall be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day above the minimum rates hereinbefore prescribed for his trade.

(b) Any tradesman not specially employed as a welder who in addition to his employment as such is also required to do welding shall be entitled to receive one shilling (1s.) per day extra whilst so employed.

(c) "Electrical fitter" means a worker employed in making, repairing, altering, assembling, testing, winding, or wiring electrical machines, instruments, meters or other apparatus other than wires leading thereto. The work of an electrical fitter shall not be tested by a worker of a lower grade.

(d) "Electrical wireman" means a worker engaged in installing electrical light, meters, bells, or telephones, or running, repairing, and testing of wires used for power, light or heating purposes.

(e) "Electrical linesman" means a worker engaged (with or without labourers assisting) in erecting poles for electrical wires, or erecting wires or cables on poles or over buildings, or tying it or them to insulators, or joining or insulating it or them, or doing any work on electrical poles off the ground, but no linesman shall be allowed to work off the ground on live wires without the assistance of a labourer.

(f) "Pipe fitter" means any worker laying or repairing pipes other than live steam pipes. All work on live steam pipes shall be tradesman's work.

20.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of one year from the date hereof.

21.—Shifts.

Men working shifts not subject to weekly rotation shall be paid for each shift other than day shift at the rate of time and a quarter.

22.—Junior Workers.

Junior workers under the age of twenty-one (21) years and not less than seventeen (17) years of age may be employed in the proportion of one junior to every three (3) or fraction of three (3) adult workers employed under this Award. For the purpose of calculating the number of junior workers allowed to be taken at any time, the average number of adult workers employed on all working days of the six (6) months immediately preceding such time shall be deemed to be the number employed: Provided that the fraction of three (3) shall not be less than one: Provided further, that in the case of any business established for less than six (6) months, the method of calculation of the proportion of junior workers shall be determined by the Board of Reference.

23.—Piecework.

(a) Subject to the minimum wage rates and other conditions herein prescribed, an employer may remunerate any of his workers under any system of payment by results.

(b) The Union may during the currency of the Award apply to the Court for the correcting or regulation of any piece-work rate, time bonus rate, task rate, or any other system of payment by results.

24.—Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate prescribed by this Award may be paid such lesser rate as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the employer and the secretary of the Union, or failing such agreement within twenty-four (24) hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary who shall if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six (6) calendar months from the date thereof and after the expiration of the

said period until the wage shall have again been fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

25.—University Students.

Provision may be made by agreement between the parties as to terms and conditions for employment, but any such agreement shall be submitted to the Court for approval within one month after the making thereof.
