WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a period of twelve months as from the 23rd day of September, 1937.

All that portion of the Avon River (near the Townsite of York) lying between Gwanbygine and the road which crosses the said river near Burges' Siding.

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvement—City of Perth:—Ten-inch diameter water main in Irwin street, from St. George's terrace to Murray street, with valves and all necessary apparatus (length about thirteen and a half chains), and the lifting of the existing three-inch diameter water main, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 5938.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has approved of the attached Rules and Regulations made by the Corrigin Hospital Board.

CORRIGIN DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

Rules and Regulations.

1.—Name.

The name of the institution shall be the Corrigin District Hospital.

2.—Board of Management.

The administration of the Hospital shall be vested in a Board of Management of seven members, appointed by the Governor. They shall be selected at the annual general meeting of the subscribers held in the month of July of each year. The members selected shall be appointed for two years, with the exception that of the members selected at the annual general meeting to be held in July, 1938, three members shall be appointed for a period of one year and four members for a period of two years. For the purpose of determining the period of appointment of the members selected at the annual general meeting to be held in July, 1938, the four members receiving the largest number of votes shall be appointed for two years and the remainder for one year. In the event of equality of votes, or the selection being held without a poll, the members to be appointed for the different periods shall be selected by lot. Retiring members shall be eligible for re-selection.

The Board shall be responsible for the entire control of the institution.

3.—Definition of Subscriber.

(a) Every person subscribing not less than £10 in one amount, the money not having been collected from the public, shall be entitled to be declared a life governor.

(b) Every person subscribing 10s. 6d. or more per annum shall be deemed a subscriber.

Annual subscriptions shall be due on the 1st of July of each year.

4.—Benefits for Subscribers.

Subscribers who are financial will be entitled to a reduction of 1s. per day off the scale of charges as set out in Rule 20. This shall also apply to the wife or dependant of any financial subscriber.

Subscribers shall not be entitled to benefits in cases of: (a) Accouchements, abortive or otherwise; (b) over-indulgence in intoxicants; (c) venereal disease; (d) insanity; (e) workers' compensation cases; (f) dental operations; (g) operations of choice.

4a.

Any person subscribing to the Hospital Fund an amount of £4 per annum shall be entitled to free attendance at the Hospital if the subscription be paid at least 14 days before admission.

5.—Selection of Board.

Only life governors and financial subscribers shall be eligible for selection as members of the Board.

Nominations for selection to the Board must be lodged with the secretary at least seven days before the date of the annual general meeting and must be signed by two life governors or financial subscribers and by the candidate.

6.—Annual Meeting.

The annual general meeting of subscribers shall be held in the month of July of each year, and not less than seven clear days' notice of such meeting shall be given by the Chairman or secretary. Notice of the meeting shall be advertised in one or more papers circulating in Corrigin and District.

A special general meeting of subscribers shall be called within fourteen days, on the requisition to the Chairman of at least ten financial subscribers. The requisition shall state the business of the meeting, and no other business shall be dealt with at such special general meeting.

The order of business at the annual meeting shall be and include:—Confirmation of minutes of the previous annual meeting; report of Board for the previous year; secretary's report, balance sheet, and statement; auditor's report; business of which due notice has been given; selection of the Board of Management and auditor; any other business allowed.

6a.—Appointment of Officers.

The Board shall, after it has been duly appointed and at its first meeting after such appointment, elect one of its members to be Chairman.

The Chairman shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the Board, and shall be *ex officio* member of all Subcommittees.

7.—Board Meetings.

The Board shall hold a regular meeting at least once in each calendar month. A special meeting may be called by the Chairman or secretary, or by the secretary, when requested to do so by three members of the Board. In each case all members of the Board are to be notified.

The order of business at Board meetings shall be:—Minutes of the last meeting; business arising from minutes; reports; correspondence; accounts; notice of motion; general.

In the case of any member of the Board being absent from three consecutive meetings without reasonable explanation or leave of absence, the Board may recommend to the Governor that his seat be declared vacant.

8.—Quorum.

A majority of the members of the Board shall form a quorum.

9.—Vacancies.

Should a vacancy occur on the Board during the year, the Board shall recommend a suitable person to the Governor for appointment until the next annual general meeting; provided that such vacancy does not occur by

the resignation of a member and such resignation being in the nature of a protest, in which case a public meeting shall be called for the purpose of electing a member to fill the vacancy.

10.—Visiting Committee.

A Subcommittee of two may be appointed at each ordinary meeting to be a Visiting Committee, who shall visit and inspect the wards weekly, between the hours of 1 and 8 p.m., and receive any complaints from patients.

The Board may appoint two ladies each year to act as visitors to the Hospital. Such appointment may be at any time cancelled, and vacancies filled at the discretion of the Committee.

11.—Admission of Patients.

No infectious diseases to be treated in the Hospital except in cases of emergency.

No patient suffering from venereal disease or delirium tremens to be admitted to the hospital except in cases of emergency.

12.—Appointment of Staff.

The Board may appoint from time to time medical officer, secretary, matron, nurses, orderlies, cook and other servants, as may be deemed necessary, and may assign reasonable remuneration for their services, and may remove them and appoint others in their stead.

13.—Duties of Matron.

The matron shall, subject to the direction of the Board, have full control of the internal administration of the Hospital, and all things appertaining thereto.

The matron shall be responsible for the good order and cleanliness of the institution, and the clothing of the patients, the preparation and service of meals, and the proper and efficient nursing of patients. She shall see that the Hospital is at all times left in charge of a competent nurse; that the report books and out-patients' register are entered up regularly daily; shall be responsible for the stores and see that the directions of the doctor are carried out; take charge of all moneys and valuables of patients, and, in the case of insanity or death, hold the same to the order of the Board. A report shall be drawn up at the end of each month showing the record of the Hospital for that period. The report shall be written by the matron and handed to the secretary for presentation to the Board. All accounts shall be checked by the matron, and the same shall, after being checked, be certified as to their correctness or otherwise.

The matron shall, on taking charge, check and sign a stock book containing a list of all furniture, bedding, linen, clothing, glass, crockery, cutlery, cooking and kitchen utensils, etc., and be responsible for same.

The matron shall requisition the Board for clothing, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, crockery, utensils and appliances of every kind required for the use of the Hospital. She shall enter them in the stock book and be responsible for them.

The matron shall not permit strangers or visitors to remain after the usual visiting hours, nor to crowd around any bed, but shall quietly request such visitors to retire; and, if such request is not at once complied with, shall report the same to the Board.

14.—Nursing and Domestic Staff.

Each nurse shall be responsible to the matron for the efficient nursing of the patient, the charge of all linen, furniture, and other articles under her charge, and the cleanliness and management of her ward. She shall strictly obey the orders of the matron, and take such day or night duties as directed by the matron. Unless otherwise approved by the Board, all nurses shall reside on the premises.

Each probationer shall be responsible to the matron, who shall lay down a programme of duties from time to time. Probationers' salaries shall be dealt with by the Board at intervals of six months, and no increase shall be granted unless the same has been recommended by the matron.

All members of the domestic staff shall be ready to carry out orders at any time. They shall carry out faithfully all orders of the matron, and shall be respectful and orderly in conduct.

15.—Annual Leave.

Leave shall be granted to the matron and nurses in accordance with any Award governing the Nursing Staff, and two weeks' annual leave to all other employees of the Board, in addition to one day per week. No leave is to be allowed to accumulate, and all applications for leave to be approved by the Board.

16.—Secretary.

The secretary shall be appointed by the Board, subject to any written agreement. He shall conduct the correspondence and have charge of all documents relating to the Hospital. He shall summon and attend all meetings of the Board, and of Subcommittees, and shall keep minute books, in which all the proceedings of these meetings shall be inserted, and shall see that, as far as practicable, all resolutions or orders passed at such meetings are forthwith carried into effect.

The secretary shall keep the following books:—Minute Book, Cash Book, Fees and Donation Ledger, Letter Book, Letter File, Stock Book, inventory of all furniture and effects, record of all accounts passed, record of all salaries, monthly return of patients, monthly return of fees and donations received, monthly return of fees outstanding each month.

17.—Residential Rule.

No person other than the Hospital Staff or patients shall reside on the premises or have any meals there without permission of the matron; nor shall any visitors to employees be permitted to remain after 10 o'clock p.m., except for exceptional circumstances, for which permission may be granted by the matron.

18.—Ministers of Religion.

Ministers of religion shall have access to patients of their respective denominations between the hours of 1 and 6 p.m. daily, and at such other times as may be necessary, but, prior to entering the ward, must obtain matron's consent.

19.—Visitors.

(a) Visitors may be admitted on all days between the hours of 2.30 and 4.30 p.m. Visitors at any other times will only be allowed by special permission of the matron (*vide* Board notice).

(b) All visitors must obey the directions of the matron or nurse on duty.

(c) No visitor shall enter any ward without first obtaining permission from the matron or nurse in charge.

20.—Scale of Charges.

Surgical cases (not including medicines, dressings, or drugs)—9s. per day.

General cases—9s. per day.

Children—8s. per day.

Maternity cases—£4 4s. per week; waiting time—25s. per week, or 6s. per day.

Out-patients—1s. to 5s., at discretion of the matron, per attendance.

Theatre fee (major operation)—£1 1s.

Theatre fee (minor operation)—10s. 6d.

Private ward—£1 1s. per week extra.

X-Ray (minor)—10s. 6d.; X-Ray (major)—£1 1s.

21.—Complaints.

Complaints from subscribers or patients shall be made or taken in writing and lodged with the Chairman of the Board or the secretary within fourteen (14) days of the occurrence, or within such further time as the Board shall decide. Such complaint shall be dealt with by the Board, and their decision shall be final and binding on all parties.

The Board may refuse to inquire into any complaint which is not lodged within the time specified.

22.—Amendment of Rules.

These Rules shall not be altered, amended, varied, or added to except under notice given in writing to the secretary stating the proposed alteration or amendment, and the secretary shall give each member of the Board not less than seven days' clear notice in writing thereof prior to the proposed alteration being discussed.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1935.

I, REGINALD CYRIL EVERITT ATKINSON, Commissioner of Public Health of Western Australia, acting under the power and authority conferred on me by Section 207 of "The Health Act, 1911-1935," do hereby make the following general order for the purpose of more effectively checking or preventing the spread of the dangerous infectious disease *Acute Anterior Poliomyelitis* (Infantile Paralysis):—

1. That the parent or guardian of or any person responsible for the care or custody of any child of the age of 16 years or under who arrives in this State from the State of Victoria shall immediately notify the Commissioner of Public Health of the arrival of such child, giving the name, the age, and the address or prospective address of such child, together with the date of departure from the State of Victoria.
2. That the parent or guardian of or any person responsible for the care or custody of any child referred to in paragraph 1 hereof shall, upon any change in the address or prospective address of such child, immediately notify the Commissioner thereof.
3. That such child shall remain in isolation at any address so notified until the expiry of twenty-one (21) days from the date of departure of such child from the State of Victoria, and the occupants of such house shall submit to inspection by and surveillance of officers of the Public Health Department or of the respective Local Health Authority.
4. That as far as possible any such child shall be kept away from all other children in the same house.
5. That any sickness whether of a child referred to in paragraph 1 hereof, or of an adult, occurring at the address of such child during the said period of isolation shall be immediately reported to a medical practitioner.
6. That any medical practitioner called to a case of any such sickness shall immediately give notice thereof to the Commissioner of Public Health and the medical officer of the District in which such case occurs.
7. That no child of the age of 16 years and under who has entered this State from the State of Victoria prior to the date of this proclamation shall attend any school until the expiration of 21 days from the date of departure from Victoria.
8. Every Local Authority, pursuant to the power contained in Section 25 of the said Act, is hereby authorised and directed to carry out the provisions of the above order.
9. This order shall have effect within every Health District in the State of Western Australia.

THE MEDICAL ACT, 1894.

Whereas by "The Medical Act, 1894," the Medical Board thereby constituted may with the approval of the Governor in Council from time to time make and prescribe, amend, repeal, or add to Rules as to the Board may seem meet for the matters and purposes in the Act mentioned: Now, therefore, the said Board, by virtue of the powers vested in them and under the Act, by and with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, hereby at a meeting held at Perth the fifth day of August, 1936, make and prescribe the following new Rule, to be numbered 8a:—

The registration fee paid by any medical practitioner employed by the Commonwealth Government who may be required to register as a medical practitioner in Western Australia for the purpose of carrying out the duties of his department for a period not exceeding six months shall be refunded to such medical practitioner at the conclusion of his temporary employment in Western Australia, upon such medical practitioner entering into a bond with the Board containing a covenant to pay the prescribed registration fee in the event of such medical practitioner at any future time seeking to practise medicine in Western Australia.

THE CEMETERIES ACT, 1897.

Greenough Public Cemetery—By-laws.

Department of Lands and Surveys,

Perth, 7th September, 1937.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws for the Control and Management of the Greenough Public Cemetery (Reserve 21717).

Public Cemetery, Greenough—By-laws.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Greenough, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees as set forth in the Schedule A shall be paid at the times and manner therein stated.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an Order for Burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be reopened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the Order for Burial shall be handed to and retained by the secretary.

6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate, bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to or interred in the Cemetery.

7. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

8. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

9. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's Order for Burial is handed to the Trustees.

10. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.; 1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.; and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees.

11. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

12. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the Cemetery, or proceed, except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

13. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

14. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the Cemetery or to discharge any fireworks therein.

15. No dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the Cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

17. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circular, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

18. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.

19. Any person requiring an Exclusive Right of Burial in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees in writing, specifying the locations of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

20. Subject to the By-laws, the secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

21. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a Grant in the prescribed form in the Schedule.

22. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a Grant in the prescribed form in the Schedule.

23. Every Grant shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any grave or vault shall be allowed, unless upon production of the Order for Right of Burial aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

24. Every coffin placed within any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

25. If application be made for an Order for Right of Burial in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

26. Should the grantee be unable to produce the Grant of Right of Burial on making application for a grave to be reopened for the purpose of interment, through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, and shall pay the fee for a copy of such Grant of Right of Burial as prescribed in Schedule A, before an Order for Burial shall be issued by the Trustees.

27. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

28. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

29. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

30. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing same.

31. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws is not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

32. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by the tradesmen shall be admitted by such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

33. No catacomb shall be allowed.

34. Subject to the approval of the Trustees, each applicant for an Order for Right of Burial shall, within three months from the date of the application, enclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slate, or stone, and shall cause to be placed thereon a number plate, bearing the number of the grave or vault. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the grantee. Should the grantee's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the Trustees shall have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee. No mounds shall be allowed.

35. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.

36. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave, except such as shall be approved by the Trustees.

37. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they shall find it necessary to give; and any workmen permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees, commits an offence against these By-laws.

38. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

- (b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
- (c) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.
- (d) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch and only during regulation hours.

39. Prior to the conducting of any interment within the Cemetery, or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees an annual fee of 10s. 6d., and shall, at the time of making such payment, give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a Permit, to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and, unless in the possession of such a Permit, no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

40. The Trustees may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantees so to do. If the grantees do not desire the Trustees to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Trustees for that purpose.

41. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Trustees, or those licensed by the Trustees, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

42. Any person committing any breach of these By-laws and Regulations or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws lawfully made under authority of any Act relating to Cemeteries shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and, in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall forthwith be removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, the secretary, or other officer of the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.

43. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation, and number of grave, and a register of all Certificates of Right of Burial shall be kept at the office.

Additional By-laws.

44. Notwithstanding anything contained in the existing By-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to erect headstones on the graves of deceased soldiers, without payment of any fee.

45. Free ground may be granted, if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Trustees—

- (a) that the deceased was a returned soldier and that he died as a result of injuries or disease received in the late war;
- (b) and that the relatives of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances: provided that such Grant shall be made subject to the condition that only the remains of deceased soldiers shall be interred in the grave.

46. The Trustees may maintain the graves of deceased soldiers free of cost for a term of seven years.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at their office, Greenough, on the 7th day of May, 1935.
