WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets, and also against the use of fishing lines set for the capture of sharks, as from the 1st day of January, 1938, until the 31st day of December, 1938, inclusive.

Schedule.

Scarborough Beach.—All that area of Western Australian waters at Scarborough Beach commencing at a point fronting the western extremity of Reserve street and extending in a southerly direction to a point two chains south of Brighton road and to a width of one-half mile from high-water mark.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from—(a) taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture; (b) taking any fish whatsoever by any specified means of capture; (c) taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time, in any specified year, or during a specified portion of every year: And whereas the "Crayfish" is a proscribed species of fish within the meaning of the hereinbefore recited provisions: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the taking of "Crayfish" by means of pots or "cribs," hoop nets, or meshing nets, from the 1st day of January, 1938, until the 31st day of December, 1938.

Locality Schedule.

- The whole of the waters of Rottnest Island within a radius of half-a-mile from the line of foreshore.
- The waters of the Swan River and its tributaries.
- The waters of Koombana Bay (Bunbury).

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from the 1st day of January, 1938, until the 31st day of December, 1940.

Schedule.

(1) The waters of the Swan river and its tributaries extending in a north, easterly, and north-easterly direction from a line drawn from the north-eastern extremity of the Mill Point Wharf (situated on the western side of Belches or Mill Point) to the north-western extremity of the Harbour and Lights Wharf (situated on the western side of the river between the Swan Brewery and Eliza Point) to the railway bridge at Guildford (except for prawns, *vide* separate Proclamation).

(2) The waters of the Swan river and its tributaries extending from the Upper Swan Bridge (near Midland) to the head of the Swan river (except for prawns, *vide* separate Proclamation).

(3) The waters of the Swan river and its tributaries west, south, and south-west of a line drawn from the south-western extremity of Point Resolution to the south-western extremity of the Point Walter Jetty (situated at Point Walter) to a line drawn from the western extremity of the South Mole to the western extremity of the North Mole (at Fremantle).

(4) The waters of the Canning river and its tributaries from the Lower Canning Bridge to the head of the said river (except for prawns, *vide* separate Proclamation).

(5) The whole of the waters of the Channel Entrance to Peel's Inlet (Mandurah) bounded on the north by a line drawn in an easterly direction from the extremity of the western point of entrance (at the bar) to a point on the mainland on the eastern shore, and on the south by lines drawn in an easterly direction from the south-eastern corner of Murray Location No. 5 to the southern extremity of Channel Island; thence to the south-western extremity of Creery Island and by its southern foreshore to the eastern extremity of that island; thence by a line drawn in a north-easterly direction to a point on the foreshore of the mainland.

(6) The whole of the waters of the Murray river and the Serpentine river (including their estuaries, tributaries, lakes, and lagoons, the waters of which during any time of the year have access directly or indirectly to the sea) lying north, east, and south-east of a line drawn from a point on the eastern foreshore of Peel's Inlet situated east of the southernmost point of Goongoolup Island and extending in a westerly direction half-a-mile; thence in a northerly direction to the foreshore of Peel's Inlet to a point lying west of the western side of the entrance to the Serpentine river.

(7) The whole of the waters of the Harvey river and that portion of the Harvey estuary south of that part known as the "Ford," which extends from Reserve No. 2990, on the western side of the said estuary, to Reserve No. 2991, on the eastern side of the said estuary.

(8) That portion of the waters of Koombana bay (Bunbury) situated southward of a line drawn from the junction of the Stone Causeway with the Bunbury

Jetty to a white post situated on the foreshore 27 chains eastward of the north-eastern corner of the Quarantine Reserve at North Bunbury.

(9) The whole of the waters of Toby's Inlet and that portion of the ocean waters within a radius of a quarter-of-a-mile from the entrance on either side to the said Toby's Inlet.

(10) The whole of the waters of the King river, including its tributaries, and portion of Oyster Harbour (Albany) north and west of a line drawn in an easterly direction from a point on the western foreshore of the said Oyster Harbour fifty (50) chains south from the south-western extremity of the Lower King bridge, to a point on the eastern shore of Oyster Harbour, near Swan Point, sixty-eight (68) chains south from the south-eastern extremity of the Kalgan river bridge.

(11) The whole of the waters of the Kalgan river, including its tributaries, and portion of the waters of Oyster Harbour north of a line drawn in a westerly direction from a point on the eastern foreshore of Oyster Harbour, near Swan Point, sixty-eight (68) chains south from the south-eastern extremity of the Kalgan river bridge, to a point on the western foreshore of Oyster Harbour fifty (50) chains south of the south-western extremity of the Lower King bridge.

(12) All that area of the southern portion of the waters of Oyster Harbour (Albany) and the waters of the Channel Entrance to Oyster Harbour from King George's Sound bounded by the following lines:—On the south by a line drawn in an easterly direction from a point on the foreshore ten (10) chains south of Emu Point to the opposite foreshore, on the north by a line drawn in a north-easterly direction from a peg on the foreshore marked 14 (about 440 yards westward of Emu Point), to the southern extremity of Green Island, and thence by a line drawn in an east-south-easterly direction from the southern extremity of the said Green Island to a point on the southern foreshore of Oyster Harbour 115 chains eastward of the eastern point of entrance to Oyster Harbour.

(13) The whole of the waters of the Denmark river and its tributaries and that portion of the waters of Wilson's Inlet within a radius of half-a-mile from the mouth of the said Denmark river.

(14) The whole of the waters of the Hay river and its tributaries and that portion of the waters of Wilson's Inlet within a radius of half-a-mile from the mouth of the said Hay river.

(15) The whole of the waters of the Preston river, the Collicie river, and the Capel river, with their tributaries.

(16) That portion of the waters of Champion Bay (Geraldton) extending from a point on the foreshore 100 yards eastward of the Geraldton railway jetty to a point on the foreshore 100 yards to the westward of the said jetty, and thence half-a-mile into the waters of the said Champion Bay.

(17) That portion of the waters of Champion Bay (Geraldton) extending from a point on the foreshore 100 yards eastward of the Geraldton Esplanade Jetty to a point on the foreshore 100 yards westward of the said jetty, and thence half-a-mile into the waters of the said Champion Bay.

(18) All that portion of Western Australian waters known as the "Dead" water, situated in Sussex Location No. 11.

(19) All that portion of the waters of Cockburn Sound (near Rockingham Beach) lying south of a line drawn from the north-western extremity of Point John, intersecting the north-western extremity of the northernmost pier or jetty at Rockingham beach, and extending to a point on the foreshore at the said Rockingham beach.

(20) All that portion of the Western Australian waters contained in the Vasse and Wonnerup estuaries.

(21) The whole of the waters of Torbay Inlet (near Albany), including the Channel Entrance both north and south of the Flood Gates, and the waters of the creeks flowing into the inlet.

(22) That portion of the waters of the Gascoyne river (Carnarvon) lying between the Jetty tramway bridge and a line drawn from the beacon on the south-eastern corner of Babbage Island to Mangrove Point on the mainland.

(23) All that portion of the ocean waters of Rott-nest Island lying east of the north-eastern extremity of North Point (on the northern side of the said island), and east of the south-western extremity of Salmon Point (on the southern side of the said island) and within the sea limits of half-a-mile from the fore-shore.

(24) The whole of the waters of Grassmere Lake, also known as Nine-Mile Lake (near Albany), and the waters of the creeks flowing into it.

(25) The waters of Geographie Bay, near Wonnerup Inlet, bounded on the south by a north-westerly line drawn from a point on the foreshore fifteen (15) chains south-east from the southern side of the "Old Jetty," and extending into the waters of the said bay a distance of 40 chains; thence by a line drawn in a north-easterly direction a distance of about 120 chains; thence by a line drawn in a south-easterly direction extending to the foreshore of the said bay at a point 60 chains north of the northern point of entrance to Wonnerup Inlet, and thence in a south-westerly direction by the foreshore of the said bay to the point of commencement.

(26) All that portion of Western Australian waters known as "The Quarries," or Channel, near Cape Natauraliste.

(27) All that portion of Western Australian waters known as Yallingup bay, starting from the point of high-water mark at the Rocky Point half-a-chain south of the mouth of Yallingup Brook; thence into the water a quarter-of-a-mile; thence north-easterly to a point a quarter-of-a-mile from the north-west corner of Government Reserve No. 8427A; thence easterly to the point of high-water mark on the foreshore and back to the point of commencement.

(28) The whole of the waters of Nornalup Inlet, Walpole Inlet, Deep river, and the Frankland river, with its tributaries.

(29) All that portion of the ocean waters at Fremantle lying between the South Mole and the Fish Market's Breakwater and between the Fish Market's Breakwater and the Fish Market's jetty bounded on the west by a line running from the western extremity of the South Mole to the southern extremity of the Fish Market's Breakwater; thence to the southern extremity of the Fish Market's Jetty.

(30) All that area of Western Australian waters from the north-eastern extremity of the North Mole (near Rous Head) at Fremantle, and extending in a northerly direction to the south-western extremity of North street, Cottesloe, with a width of a quarter-of-a-mile from the foreshore.

(31) The whole of the waters (including their tributaries) of Parry's Harbour.

(32) The waters of the Channel Entrance to Hardy's Inlet (Augusta) situated between a line drawn in a north-easterly direction from Duke's Head (on the western side of the Inlet) to Point Frederick (on the eastern side of the inlet) and a line drawn in a westerly direction from Point Irwin (on the eastern side of the inlet) to a point where the southern boundary of Harford street touches the foreshore on the western side of the inlet.

(33) The whole of the waters of Carrolup river (near Katanning).

(34) All that portion of the ocean waters at Yan-chep beach commencing at a point on the foreshore one half-mile north-west of the north-western corner of Reserve No. 12439 and extending in a generally south-easterly direction to a point on the foreshore one quarter-mile south-east of the south-western corner of the said reserve, and extending seaward to a distance of one half-mile from the foreshore.

(35) The whole of the waters of Bow river (near Irwin's Inlet.)

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit (*inter alia*) all persons from—(a) taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time, in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any year: And whereas the "Prawn" is a prescribed species of fish within the meaning of this provision: And whereas by Section 17 of the same Act the Governor may by Proclamation declare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule shall be closed against the taking of "Prawns" by means of any net other than a hand-scoop net (such net not to exceed a total length of nine feet upon either the cork line or lead line) from the 1st day of January, 1938, until the 31st day of December, 1938, inclusive: And, further, that any net which does not exceed 25 fathoms in length and has a mesh throughout the whole of the net of not less than one-half inch measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternative corners are in contact shall be a lawful net when used or intended to be used for the capture of "Prawns" in any Western Australian waters, except those portions defined in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule.

That portion of the Swan river extending in a westerly and southerly direction downwards to its entrance at Fremantle from a line drawn from the Point Walter Jetty (Walter Point) to Point Resolution, and the Swan river and its tributaries extending upwards in a northerly and north-easterly direction to its head from the Narrows at Mill Point.

That portion of the Canning River and its tributaries upwards to its head from the Lower Canning Bridge.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from—(a) Taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture; (b) taking any fish whatsoever by any specified means of capture; (c) taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any year: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of any other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

(1) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the First Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets

as from the First day of January, 1938, until the Thirtieth day of April, 1938, and as from the First day of August, 1938, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1938, inclusive.

(2) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Second Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1938, until the Thirty-first day of March, 1938, and from the First day of October, 1938, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1938, inclusive.

(3) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Third Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1938, until the Twenty-third day of March, 1938, and from the Sixteenth day of May, 1938, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1938, inclusive.

(4) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fourth Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the taking of English Perch by any method of capture as from the First day of July, 1938, until the Thirty-first day of October, 1938, inclusive.

First Locality Schedule.

All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottnest Island lying west of the north-eastern extremity of North Point (on the northern side of the said island) and west of the south-western extremity of Salmon Point (on the southern side of the said island) and within the sea limits of half-a-mile from the foreshore.

Second Locality Schedule.

(a) That portion of the waters of Geographie Bay extending from the north-western side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

(b) That portion of the waters of Geographie Bay extending from the south-eastern side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

Third Locality Schedule.

That portion of the ocean waters near the entrance to Peel's Inlet bounded by the following lines:—On the west by a line drawn in a northerly direction for a quarter of a mile from the extremity of Robert Point (on the western side of the Bar); thence by a line running in an Easterly direction until it meets the foreshore of the mainland (on the eastern side of the entrance to Peel's Inlet); thence in a generally southerly direction along the line of foreshore to the Bar; thence by a line in a generally westerly direction to the western point of entrance to the Bar, and thence in a generally westerly direction along the line of foreshore to the point of commencement.

Fourth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of the Capel River (near Bunbury), including the creeks flowing into it.

Schedule.

Carlecatup Creek (near Kojonup):—The whole of the waters of Carlecatup Creek.

Hotham River:—The whole of the waters of the Hotham River.

Salt River (or Pallinup Estuary):—The whole of the waters of the Salt River (or Pallinup Estuary).

Bremer (or Wellstead) Estuary:—The whole of the waters of the Bremer (or Wellstead) Estuary.

Wilson's Inlet (Denmark):—

(1) All that area of Wilson's Inlet, near the Channel Entrance, westward of a line drawn in a generally northerly direction from the north-western corner of Location No. 1992 (on the southern shore of the Inlet), to the south-western corner of Location No. 5433 (on the northern shore of the Inlet); and

(2) All that area of Wilson's Inlet, including the streams flowing into it, eastward of a line drawn in a generally northerly direction from the north-western corner of Location No. 2229 (on the southern shore of the Inlet), to the south-western corner of Location No. 1500 (on the northern shore of the Inlet).

Port Dongarra (Dongarra):—All that area of Western Australian waters at Port Dongarra (Dongarra) commencing at high-water mark at a point 200 yards north of the Dongarra Jetty; thence extending in a north-westerly direction to a distance of 200 yards; thence in a south-westerly direction to a distance of one-half-mile, and thence in a south-easterly direction to a point on the foreshore 200 yards South of the said Jetty.

WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway, within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the City of Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain land, named and described in the Schedule hereunder, which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of the City of Perth, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall from the date of this Proclamation be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway, within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

(1) Where any person whilst a patient in the hospital, whether before or after the commencement of this Rule, has deposited or placed in the possession of the hospital authorities for safe custody any article or thing belonging to him, or upon ceasing to be a patient in the hospital has left in the hospital any article or thing belonging to him, and in either case such person does not claim or demand from the hospital authorities the return or delivery to him or his nominee of the article or thing so deposited or left within six months after the date when he ceased to be a patient in the hospital as aforesaid, the Board may by notice published in the *Government Gazette* publish a description of the article or thing aforesaid and the name of the owner thereof, and give notice of the intention to sell such article or thing after the expiration of three months from the date of the publication of such notice in the *Government Gazette*.

(2) If, within three months after the date of the publication of notice by the Board as aforesaid the owner or some person duly nominated and authorised in writing in that behalf by the owner does not in person claim or demand from the Board the return or delivery of the article or thing aforesaid, the Board may at any time after the expiration of the said period sell by auction or private contract or otherwise dispose of or destroy the article or thing aforesaid, as it shall think fit.

(3) The net proceeds derived by the Board from the sale of any article or thing under the authority of paragraph (2) hereof shall be placed to the credit of a Trust Account, to be kept by the Board, and shall remain so credited for a period of six years from the date when such proceeds were placed to the credit of such Trust Account.

(4) If before the expiration of such period of six years the owner of the article or thing sold or his legal personal representative or some other person lawfully claiming under such owner does not claim and establish his right to such proceeds, such proceeds as credited in the said Trust Account shall, after the expiration of the said period of six years, cease to be the property of the owner of the article or thing sold or of his legal personal representative or of any person lawfully claiming under such owner, and shall become the property of the Board of the hospital. Thereupon the said proceeds may be withdrawn from the said Trust Account and shall form part of the ordinary funds of the Board.

PUBLIC CEMETERY, MANJIMUP, BY-LAWS.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Board of the Public Cemetery, Manjimup, the said Board make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Board as set forth in the Schedule A shall be paid at the times and manner therein stated.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make application to the Board. Upon such application being approved by the Board, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an Order for Burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for application within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. The Board shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be reopened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the Order for Burial shall be handed to and retained by the secretary.

6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to or interred in the cemetery.

7. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

8. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

9. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered or a Coroner's Order for Burial is handed to the Board.

10. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.; 1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m., and no burial shall be allowed to take place nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour, except by written permission of the Board.

11. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

12. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery or proceed, except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Board from time

to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

13. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

14. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery or to discharge any fireworks therein.

15. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

17. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circular, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

18. No person employed by or under the Board shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Board, and any such person proved guilty of accepting such gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

19. Any person requiring an Exclusive Right of Burial in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Board in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

20. Subject to the By-laws the secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

21. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Board may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a Grant in the prescribed form in the Schedule.

22. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Board may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a Grant in the prescribed form in the Schedule.

23. Every Grant shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any grave or vault shall be allowed, unless upon production of the Order for Right of Burial aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Board.

24. Every coffin placed within any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in or cemented and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Board.

25. If application be made for an Order for Right of Burial in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than to whom the Grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

26. Should the grantee be unable to produce the Grant of Right of Burial on making application for a grave to be reopened for the purpose of interment through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, and shall pay the fee for a copy of such Grant of Right of Burial, as prescribed in Schedule A, before an Order for Burial shall be issued by the Board.

27. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Board, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

28. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Board, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

29. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Board, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

30. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing same.

31. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the secretary to the Board the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws is not complied with to the satisfaction of the Board.

32. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall as far as possible be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by the tradesmen shall be admitted by such entrance as the Board shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

33. No catacomb shall be allowed.

34. Subject to the approval of the Board each applicant for an Order for Right of Burial shall within three months from the date of the application enclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slate, or stone, and shall cause to be placed thereon a number plate bearing the number of the grave or vault. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the grantee. Should the grantee's residence not be known or be out of the State, the Board shall have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee. No mounds shall be allowed.

35. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.

36. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave, except such as shall be approved by the Board.

37. All workmen, whether employed by the Board or by any other person, shall at all times whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery be subject to the supervision of the Board, and shall obey such directions as they shall find it necessary to give; and any workmen permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Board, commits an offence against these By-laws.

38. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Board.

(c) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Board.

(d) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch and only during regulation hours.

39. Prior to the conducting of any interment within the cemetery, or making use of the cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the Board an annual fee of 10s. 6d., and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Board may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a permit, to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and unless in the possession of such a permit no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the cemetery.

40. The Board may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantees to do so. If the grantees do not desire the Board to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Board for that purpose.

41. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Board, or those licensed by the Board, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

42. Any person committing any breach of these By-laws and Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws lawfully made under authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and, in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall forthwith be removable from the cemetery by the Board, the secretary, or other officer of the Board, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.

43. A plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situations, and number of grave and a register of all Certificates of Right of Burial shall be kept at the office.

Additional By-laws.

44. Notwithstanding anything contained in the existing By-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to

erect headstones on the graves of deceased soldiers without payment of any fee.

45. Free ground may be granted, if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Board—

(a) that the deceased was a returned soldier and that he died as a result of injuries or disease received in the late war;

(b) and that the relatives of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances: provided that such Grant shall be made subject to the condition that only the remains of deceased soldiers shall be interred in the grave.

46. The Board may maintain the graves of deceased soldiers free of cost for a term of seven years.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Manjimup Cemetery Board held in the Board Room on the 13th day of November, 1937.

Amendments and Additions to By-laws of Karrakatta Cemetery.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Corres. 8074/96, Vol. 7. Perth, 15th December, 1937.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under the provisions of the above Act, of the following amendments and additions to the By-laws of the Karrakatta Cemetery.

G. L. NEEDHAM, Under Secretary for Lands.

By virtue of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897" (61 Vic., No. 23), as amended by the Acts 62 Vic., No. 25; 63 Vic. 38, and 2 Ed. VII., No. 42, and the Cremation Acts, 1929 and 1935, and of all other Acts and powers in that behalf thereunto them enabling, the Trustees of the Karrakatta General Cemetery make the following By-laws:—

1. The existing By-laws as appearing in the Government Gazette on the Sixteenth day of May, 1924, are amended as follows:—

By-law No. 5 is amended by inserting the words "or cremated" after the word "interred."

By-law No. 12 is amended by inserting after the word "burial" the words "or cremation."

By-law No. 13 is amended by inserting after the word "graveside" the words "or crematorium, as the case may be."

By-law No. 25 is amended by inserting after the word "interments" the words "or cremations."

By-laws No. 47, 48, and 49 are revoked.

By-law No. 50 is amended by inserting after the word "interments" the words "or cremations."

By-law No. 57 is revoked.

2. The following new By-laws are made to be numbered as shown below:—

55. The hours for cremations shall be as follows:— From 9.30 a.m. to 3.30 p.m. on any day of the week, from Monday to Saturday both inclusive, except on Christmas Day or Good Friday.

56. Any administrator, as defined by the Cremation Acts, desiring to have the remains of any dead human body cremated shall make an application on the Form No. 1 in Schedule B.

All applications for cremation shall be made at the office of the Trustees in such time as to allow at least five working hours' notice being given the Trustees prior to the time fixed for the cremation.

57. On lodgment with the Trustees of the said application together with the permit to cremate issued by the Registrar General or District Registrar under "The Cremation Acts, 1929-1935," and on payment of all fees payable as per Schedule C, the cremation will be arranged at the time to be stipulated by the Trustees on the said application form.

58. The funeral director shall deposit the casket on the catafalque in the crematorium and all further services will be rendered by and be under the sole control of the Trustees.

59. The ashes will be made available to the said administrator twenty-four hours after the completion of the cremation and upon delivery to the Trustees of the approval of the Commissioner of Public Health. If not claimed by the administrator, or if no arrangements regarding the disposal thereof are made by the said administrator with the Trustees (see Form No. 3 in Schedule B) within fourteen days after cremation, such ashes will be buried in ground set aside by the Trustees for such purpose within the crematorium site. A fee

of ten shillings per month or part thereof will be charged by the Trustees for the holding of ashes in safe custody, if such ashes are so held at the written request of the administrator after the expiration of the fourteen days. The fee must be paid punctually in advance each month and in default the Trustees may bury the ashes.

60. Any person desirous of placing on record his desire to have his dead body cremated after death may do so in Form No. 2 in Schedule B. The form shall be made out and executed in duplicate, and one copy shall be lodged at the office of the Trustees and one copy retained by the applicant.

61. Directions as to the method of disposing of the ashes of a dead human body after cremation shall be given by the administrator in Form No. 3 in Schedule B, and such directions shall specify the desired method of disposal. Together with such directions, the administrator shall pay the relevant fee set out in Schedule C.

62. Application for a Cremation Agreement may be made by a person who desires to have his dead body cremated after death (in the Form No. 4 in Schedule B), and on lodgment at the office of the Trustees of such application, duly completed, together with payment to the Trustees of the relative fees set forth in Schedule C, the Trustees will issue to the applicant a Cremation Agreement in the Form No. 5 in Schedule B.

63. An administrator who desires to obtain delivery of ashes for removal from the crematorium may do so upon lodging at the office of the Trustees the written approval of the Commissioner of Public Health under Section 4 (c) of "The Cremation Acts, 1929-1935," together with a receipt in the Form No. 6 in Schedule B, and upon paying the relative fees set forth in Schedule C.

64. Any person committing any breach of any By-law or Regulation, or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, and in case of a continuing breach a further sum not exceeding one pound for every day during which such breach continues.

65. Any person committing a breach of any By-law in the Cemetery shall in addition to being liable to a penalty under any By-law be liable to be forthwith removed from the Cemetery by the Trustees or the Superintendent or other employee of the Trustees or by any police constable. If such person resists removal, or if and as often as such person so removed shall, unless with the consent of the Superintendent, again enter the Cemetery within twenty-four hours of his removal therefrom, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

66. The fees set forth in Schedule C shall be paid to the Trustees by the persons and at the times hereinbefore respectively provided in respect of the matters therein mentioned.

THE BULK HANDLING ACT, 1935.

L. & S. 156/36.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has approved of the amendment of the Regulations made under "The Bulk Handling Act, 1935," as follows:—

(For previous Regulations see *Government Gazettes* of the 31st day of January, 1936, page 182; the 13th day of November, 1936, page 1894; the 8th day of January, 1937, page 5. and the 5th day of February, 1937, page 209.)

1. Regulation 2 (relating to fees) (as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 31st day of January, 1936) is amended—

(i) by adding after the existing charge now reading "Shipping charge for the 1936-1937 wheat season—1s. 3d. per ton" as inserted by Regulations published in the *Government Gazettes* of the 8th and 15th days of January, 1937, the following charge for the 1937-1938 wheat season:—

"Shipping charge for the 1937-1938 wheat season—1s. 3d. per ton";

- (ii) by striking out the word "delivery" in the reference to the fee "for special services incurred by arrangement";
- (iii) by adding the following further charge at the end of the scale of fees:—

Where the holder of a warrant requires delivery of any wheat after the 30th day of July in any wheat season and the wheat is required to be delivered to a destination other than the port to which wheat is customarily railed from the siding of receipt of the wheat shown on the warrant the company may charge the holder—

Any additional rail-
age actually and
reasonably incurred
in the delivery of
the wheat.

2. A further Regulation is added after Regulation 2A (which was inserted by the Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 13th day of November, 1936) as follows:—

Deduction for Shrinkage for the 1937-1938 Wheat Season.

2B.—In respect of all wheat delivered to the Company in the 1937-1938 wheat season, the Company shall be entitled to make a deduction from the total weight of wheat received of one half per cent. to compensate for shrinkage.

3. The following amendments are made to the Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 13th day of November, 1936:—

- (1) Regulation No. 1 is amended by striking out the words "Before accepting delivery of" in the first line and substituting the words "Upon wheat being tendered or before a warrant is issued for."

- (ii) Regulation No. 2 is amended by adding a subregulation after subregulation (2), as follows:—

(2a) Where in respect of wheat for any season subsequent to the 1937-1938 wheat season a grower requires a warrant to be issued in the name of a person nominated by him, he shall fill in and sign a request in the form No. 13 in the Schedule.

- (iii) Regulation No. 4 is amended—

- (a) by inserting the following words in parenthesis after the word "wheat" in line 6 of subregulation (2):—

(Including wheat containing weevils or wheat in weevil infested containers);

- (b) by adding a subregulation after subregulation (4), as follows:

(5) The Company shall not deliver or attempt to deliver to the holder of a warrant wheat which any person is forbidden to deliver to the Company under the provisions of this regulation, and the preceding provisions of this regulation shall apply with all necessary modifications to any such delivery or attempted delivery by the Company.

- (iv) Regulation 5 is amended by adding a further subregulation after subregulation (3), as follows:—

(3a) The grower, however, may at his option require a sample to be submitted to the Company, and in that event he shall request the officer of the Company to take a sample of the wheat in dispute, seal it in an envelope supplied for the purpose and post it to the secretary of the Company in Perth. All three operations shall be conducted by the officer in the presence of the grower. The secretary of the Company shall give a decision in the matter and such decision shall be final between the parties. No fees shall be charged to the grower for this service.

- (v) Regulation No. 10 is amended by inserting after the word "warrants" in the first line the following words:—"representing wheat grown by one grower and delivered at one particular siding," and inserting the word "such" before the word "warrant" in the second and third lines.

- (vi) A new Regulation is added after Regulation No. 12, as follows:—

Adjustment for Excess or Short Delivery under Condition No. 1 of the Second Schedule of the Act.

13. Where the Company delivers wheat in trucks or hoppers and the holder of a warrant (other than a wheat merchant or a miller) is required to take either more wheat than represented by the warrant or less wheat than represented by the warrant under the provisions of paragraph (a) of condition No. 1 in the Second Schedule to the Act, the holder shall pay the Company for any excess, and the Company shall pay the holder for any shortage in wheat delivered, according to the quantity of wheat stated on the face of the warrant. The payment in respect of such excess or shortage shall be on the basis of the market price for the wheat on the day on which such delivery takes place.

- (vii) Form No. 11 in the Schedule to the Regulations is amended by striking out the words "when required" and inserting the words "delivery date" in lieu of the words struck out.

- (viii) A further form is added in the Schedule after form No. 12:—

(For previous Regulations see *Government Gazettes* of the 31st day of January, 1936, page 182; the 13th day of November, 1936, page 1894; the 8th day of January, 1937, page 5, and the 5th day of February, 1937, page 209.)

PURSUANT to Section 41 of "The Bulk Handling Act, 1935," His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council hereby makes Regulations dealing with the receipt, handling, and delivery of a grade of wheat to be styled "Grade Western Australia No. 2" and prescribes a standard for that grade, as follow:—

1. The Company may receive wheat of the 1937-1938 wheat season which complies with the standard hereinafter specified.
2. All such wheat shall be handled separately from and binned separately from other wheat received by the Company:—
3. The following shall be a description of the standard:—
 - (a) Subject to the conditions stated hereunder, it will include wheat which is below the limits of variation allowed for other prescribed grades.
 - (b) The wheat shall be dry, free from weevils or other insects and free from smutty, musty, or other commercially objectionable smell.
 - (c) The bushel weight of the grain as received by the Company will be less than 60 lbs., with a limit of variation to 56 lbs.
4. The Company shall issue a distinctive warrant for every parcel of wheat received of this grade so that the wheat can be clearly distinguished from other grades prescribed.
5. The form of warrant may be the same as that issued for Western Australian Standard White, except that it shall have a distinct statement at the head of the warrant that the warrant is issued in respect of Grade Western Australia No. 2 wheat, and shall be on a different coloured form from that used for the 1937-1938 wheat season for Western Australian Standard White.
6. The dockages shall be as prescribed in the Act.
7. The Company shall be entitled to make a charge to cover the actual cost of any extra railage reasonably incurred by reason of the special nature of the wheat; for example, by reason of the light weight of the wheat, trucks cannot be loaded to their full capacity in weight.
8. For extra services occasioned by special handling and binning of this grade of wheat, the Company shall be entitled to make an additional charge of $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per bushel.
9. The Company shall not be bound to accept wheat of this standard at any particular siding where there is not sufficient quantity of the wheat offering to justify the Company economically in receiving the wheat:

Provided that any person aggrieved by reason of the refusal of the Company to receive any wheat of this standard at any particular siding for reasons stated in this Regulation may appeal within fourteen days after such refusal to the Minister, whose decision shall be final.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

Storemen—Government Stores Branch.

No. 30 of 1937.

(Registered 29-11-1937.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this tenth day of November, 1937, between the West Australian Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter referred to as "the Union"), of the one part, and the Honourable the Treasurer for the State of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as "the employer"), of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto, as follows:—

1.—Hours.

The ordinary working hours for all workers shall be forty-four per week and shall be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., from Monday to Friday inclusive, and from 8 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturday: provided the hours shall not exceed the hours usually and customarily worked prior to the date of this Agreement. One hour shall be allowed for luncheon, which shall be given between the hours of 12 noon and 2 p.m.

2.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked outside of or in excess of the usual hours shall be overtime, and be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours after the usual stopping time, and thereafter double time. This subclause shall not apply to work on Saturday. Work shall definitely cease at noon on Saturday.

(b) For all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, double time rates shall be paid. For any work performed on other gazetted public service holidays equivalent time off shall be granted.

(c) In the computation of overtime each day's work shall stand by itself.

3.—Holidays, Annual Leave, and Long Service Leave.

(a) The following holidays shall be observed as holidays and be paid for, namely:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, also any other holidays gazetted under the Public Service Act and applying within the area of this Agreement.

(b) In addition to the above one week on full pay shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service. A worker not completing one year of service shall, after the completion of one month's continuous service, be granted pay in lieu of holidays in proportion to the length of service.

(c) A worker entitled to holidays under this clause shall receive at least two weeks' notice from his employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer that such worker shall take his holiday: Provided, however, that this clause shall not apply in the case of any worker summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

(d) Long service leave shall be granted in accordance with the conditions applying to Government full-time wages employees generally and in accordance with any amendments thereto, as may be made from time to time.

4.—Interpretations.

(a) "Head storeman" shall mean a person performing the duties of a storeman and who is in charge of one or more men.

(b) "Storeman working singly" shall mean a storeman working where no other storeman is employed in the establishment.

(c) "Despatch hand" shall mean a worker who may handle goods or receive goods from Departments and passes them over to the packing room, or prepares and hands over packages to carters for delivery and who shall be responsible for the proper checking off of such packages, and for the proper branding and marking thereof and keeping necessary records, such as rail notes and cart notes.

(d) "Packer" shall mean a person who packs goods for transport.

5.—Wages.

The minimum rates of wages and margins payable shall be as under:—

6.—Higher Duties.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two hours in any shift shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift: provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole shift.

7.—Proportion of Juniors.

(a) The number of male juniors, with the exception of junior packers, shall not exceed the proportion of one to one for the first five male seniors, and thereafter one junior to every two male seniors or fraction thereof.

Provided that the number of junior packers shall not exceed the proportion of one junior to every four senior packers.

(b) Where no female assistant in receipt of the full adult wage is employed one junior female assistant may be employed.

Where one senior female assistant is employed two junior female assistants may be employed.

Where two senior female assistants are employed three junior female assistants may be employed.

Where three senior female assistants are employed four junior female assistants may be employed.

Where four senior female assistants are employed five junior female assistants may be employed.

And thereafter the proportion shall not exceed five junior female assistants to four senior female assistants.

(c) In this clause the word "senior" shall mean a person of twenty-one years of age or over.

8.—Record Book.

The wages sheets of the Department will be open for inspection by the secretary or other accredited representative of the Union at the Head Office of the Controller of Stores during ordinary business hours.

9.—Contract of Service.

(a) Employment shall be weekly, and a week's notice shall be given by the worker or the employer to terminate the engagement or a week's wages be paid in lieu of same.

(b) In cases of dismissal for misconduct or dereliction of duty, such notice shall not be due and wages shall be paid up to time of dismissal only.

10.—Board of Reference.

In the event of a dispute arising upon any matter shown in this Agreement, the point in dispute shall be referred to a Board consisting of a representative of the Department, a representative of the Union, and a Chairman to be mutually agreed upon by such representatives; failing their agreement, the Industrial Registrar of Western Australia shall be Chairman. The decision of the Board shall be final and binding.

11.—Preference.

Preference of employment shall be given to Unionists.

12.—Area.

This Agreement shall apply to persons employed by the Treasurer on Classifications prescribed in Clause 5 under the direct control of the Controller of Stores, and shall be limited in its effect to the following localities within the Metropolitan Area, namely:—

- (a) Government Stores Buildings:—So much of Government Reserve B \uparrow 1153 as forms part of Perth Town Lot P10 (Murray street, Perth).
 (b) North Fremantle Government Store:—So much of Government Reserve \uparrow 11069 as forms part of North Fremantle Lot NF 31 (John street).
 (c) Fremantle Store:—Being part of old Customs Office building on old Customs Crown Reserve at corner of Cliff and Dalgety streets, Fremantle.

13.—Term.

This Agreement shall remain in force for a period of three years from date thereof: provided that at any time or times after the expiration of the first twelve months either party shall have the right to demand a review of the Agreement or any part thereof by giving one month's notice in writing to the other party.

In the event of the parties failing to agree in regard to any items on which a variation is sought, it is agreed that such items shall be referred to a Board of Reference, or to an arbitrator to be mutually agreed upon, and failing agreement as to the Chairman of the Board or the arbitrator, the Industrial Registrar shall be the Chairman or the arbitrator as the case may be.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 31 of 1937.

(Registered 29/11/1937.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," this nineteenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, between the Minister for Agriculture and the Minister for Education (hereinafter referred to as the "Ministers"), of the one part, and the Australian Workers' Union Westralian Branch Pastoral and Agricultural Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed between the parties hereto as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply throughout the State to all employees specified in Clause 3 hereof engaged at Research Stations and/or on Experimental Farms owned

by the West Australian Government (including the Muresk Agricultural College and the School of Agriculture, Narrogin).

2.—Hours of Labour.

Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work.

3.—Wages.

(a) Basic wage:—Metropolitan Area—Males £3 14s. 11d.; females £2 0s. 5d.

South-West Land Division (excluding Metropolitan Area)—Males £3 15s. 10d.; females £2 0s. 11d.; Gold-fields Areas and all other portions of the State, excluding the South-West Land Division—Males £4 7s. 0d.; females £2 7s. 0d.

(b) Instructors at Muresk 24 0

(When required to attend to and drive over two horses for over two hours in any one day, 1s. 6d. per day extra).
 Grooming and harnessing shall be done in the worker's own time.

Cooks—

(c) The deductions specified hereunder will be made in the case of married or single men for the following privileges:—

Married men.—Not exceeding 25 per cent. of the male basic wage for quarters, use of milking cow, and the supply of mutton under the existing arrangements.

Single men.—Not exceeding 18 per cent. of the male basic wage for quarters and the supply of mutton under the existing arrangement.

Where the use of cow and/or the supply of mutton is not available to the employee, the amounts obtained by the above deductions will be reduced as follows:—

For the use of cow 2s. 6d. per week.
 For the supply of mutton 4s. 0d. per week.

In the case of juniors the deductions specified shall be made on the rate of wage the junior is being paid and not on the male basic wage.

The existing arrangement as regards the supply of milk and butter at Muresk shall continue.

Employees provided with board and lodging for themselves only shall be charged an amount equal to 28 per cent. of the male basic wage.

The deductions specified above shall be made from the wages set out in this clause.

4.—District Allowances.

District allowances shall be paid as follows:—At Yilgarn, Salmon Gums, and Dampawah—5s. per week.

5.—Holidays.

Employees shall be entitled to sixteen paid holidays per annum. When employed for a lesser period than twelve months, *pro rata* holiday pay shall be granted after one month's continuous service.

The amount of weekly leave shall continue as at present.

6.—Preference of Employment.

Preference of employment in respect of the classes of workers covered by this Agreement shall be given to financial members of the Australian Workers' Union Westralian Branch Pastoral and Agricultural Union of Workers: provided that any employee or applicant for employment who is a member of another recognised industrial Union, and who produces proof of such membership, shall be entitled to equal preference: provided that such employee or applicant shall, within fourteen days of the expiry of his current ticket with the other Union, make and complete an application for membership with the Australian Workers' Union Westralian Branch Pastoral and Agricultural Union of Workers.

7.—Long Service Leave.

Long service leave shall be granted by the Ministers in accordance with the conditions relating to full time Government wages employees generally.

8.—Overtime.

All work done outside the daily spread or beyond forty-four hours in any week shall be deemed to be overtime: provided that any necessary attention to stock shall not be deemed overtime.

A worker required to attend to stock outside his regular working hours or outside the spread of shifts shall receive an allowance of 9s. per week of seven days: provided this shall not apply to the duties of grooming and harnessing specified in Clause 3 (b).

Overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

9.—Spread of Shifts.

The daily spread of shifts shall mean the period between the time when the worker first commences work and the time he or she finishes work for the day.

The daily spread of shift shall not exceed twelve hours.

10.—Lanterns, etc.

Kerosene and lanterns shall be provided by the Minister for the use of employees, when such are necessary, to attend to horses and other stock.

11.—Junior Workers.

Junior workers may be employed in the proportion of one junior to every four or fraction of four adult male workers.

The rates of pay for junior workers shall be as under:—

14 to 15 years—	40 per cent. of male basic wage.
15 to 16 years—	50 per cent. of male basic wage.
16 to 17 years—	60 per cent. of male basic wage.
17 to 18 years—	70 per cent. of male basic wage.
18 to 19 years—	80 per cent. of male basic wage.
19—	Full basic wage.

12.—Term of Agreement.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three years from the 22nd day of November, 1937: Provided that, after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof, either party may apply to the other for a variation or amendment of Agreement or any part thereof. In the event of the parties failing to agree it is agreed that the matters in dispute shall be referred to the Industrial Registrar for final determination.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 32 of 1937.

(Registered 7/12/1937.)

PLUMBING.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," this second day of November, 1937, between the Chairman and Members of the Kalgoorlie Roads Board (hereinafter called "The Employers") of the one part, and The West Australian Plumbers and Sheetmetal Workers' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "The Union"), of the other part, witnesseth, that for the considerations

hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Scope of Agreement.

This Agreement shall apply to workers employed to do the work in lead or any of those metals which have superseded lead, or who work or fix galvanised iron or zinc or other metals in connection with the erection, alteration, or repair of buildings, who make articles of galvanised iron or other metals of ten gauge or lighter in or in connection with a plumber's shop and particularly including the following classes of work:—

- (a) (i) Work in sheet-metal, galvanised iron, or other sheet-metal; the manufacture of baths, bath-heaters, tanks, vats, chimneys, sky-lights, bins, etc.
- (ii) Pipe work in lead, sheet-metal, wrought-iron, cast-iron, copper or brass;
- (iii) Installing and/or repairing of water (hot or cold) systems, steam, gas, air, oil (heating and cooking) or vacuum installations and repairing thereof;
- (iv) Sanitary and general plumbing;
- (v) Installing pumping plants, erecting windmills, and installing pipes, pumps, and tanks in connection therewith for domestic and irrigation purposes;
- (vi) Fitting and fixing corrugated asbestos sheets, asbestos gutters, downpipes, ridgings, rain-heads and flashings, etc.
- (b) Workers employed in chemical plumbing.

2.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the area covered by the Kalgoorlie Roads Board.

3.—Hours.

- (a) The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) in any one week and shall not exceed eight (8) hours daily, to be worked between the hours of 7.45 a.m. and 4.30 p.m., from Monday to Friday inclusive.
- (b) Lunch interval shall not exceed one hour.

4.—Wages.

The minimum rate of wage payable to workers under this Agreement, other than a duly registered apprentice or probationer, shall be 3s. 2-1/10d. per hour.

Where the work involves opening up drains four inches in diameter and upwards for the purpose of clearing chokages, there shall be paid in addition to the prescribed rate of wage the sum of threepence (3d.) per hour.

Workers employed on chemical plumbing shall receive 2s. per day extra.

Leading hand:—Leading hand means any tradesman placed in charge of three (3) or more other tradesmen or six (6) other workers, and shall be paid 2s. 6d. per day above the minimum rate hereinbefore prescribed for his trade.

5.—Casual Employees.

Any employee who is employed for a period of less than five consecutive working days, exclusive of hours of overtime worked, shall be classed as a casual employee, and shall be paid ordinary rates plus ten per cent. (10%).

6.—Overtime.

(a) Overtime shall be paid for all work required to be performed outside the usual working hours, as follows:—Time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the premises, he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.

(c) When a worker is required to continue working after the usual ceasing time for more than one hour without having been notified on the previous day, he shall be provided with any meal required, or shall be paid two shillings (2s) in respect to such meal required.

(d) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal.

(e) When a worker is required to be on duty before the usual starting time, he shall be paid double time until the usual starting time.

7.—Travelling Time.

All travelling time from and to the employer's place of business or from one job to another during the hours of work shall be paid for by the employer at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares in connection with such travelling.

8.—Payment of Wages.

Pay day shall be on alternate Fridays. Any worker leaving or being discharged shall be paid the full amount of wages due to him within one hour of ceasing work, or within one hour of the opening of the office, if such office was closed at the time of his ceasing work, whenever same is practicable.

9.—Holidays.

(a) Each worker shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' annual leave on full pay, or, should the period of continuous employment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid holiday pay in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment. Annual leave shall be taken at a time suitable to the convenience of the employer: provided that, where a worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct, he will not be entitled to the benefits of this clause.

(b) The amounts to be paid under Subclause (a) shall be calculated at the rate prevailing at the time the payment is made.

(c) All work performed on Sunday, New Year's Day, Boxing Day, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Kalgoorlie Cup Day be paid for at double time rate.

(d) The provisions as to annual leave shall not apply to casual workers.

10.—Country Work.

Any worker sent by his employer to a job or is engaged for a job at such a distance that he cannot return to his home each night shall be paid six shillings per day extra, unless the employer can provide board and lodging. All travelling time not exceeding eight hours in any one day to and from the job shall be paid for at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares.

11.—Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect from the period of six calendar months from the date thereof and after the expiration of such period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

12.—Apprentices.

(a) The provisions of Schedule I. hereto, marked "Apprenticeship Regulations," subject to any modifications or alterations contained in this clause, are hereby embodied in and form part of this Agreement.

(b) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every three (3) or fraction of three (3) journeymen employed by him.

Provided that the fraction of three (3) shall not be less than one journeyman.

(c) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be:—

(d) The wages of apprentices under this Award shall be subject to alteration by the Court when the wages of journeymen under this Agreement are reviewed.

13.—Tools of Trade.

The following tools shall be provided by the employer:—Metal pots, plumbing irons (but this shall not include copper soldering bits), mandrils, long dummies, stock and dies for iron and brass pipes, cutters, all tongs over 12in., vices, hack saws and blades, taps and drills, hatchets, files, cramps, caulking tools, and chisel for brick and concrete.

The employer shall also supply all tools required for work to be performed on wrought iron and lead pipes over 2in. in diameter.

The worker shall supply only the usual kit bag of tools and blow lamp.

14.—Time and Wages Book.

A time and wages book shall be kept by each employer, in which shall be entered the name of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received by him each week. The employer shall be responsible for the proper posting of the book each week; the said book shall be open to the authorised representative of the Union at any time during working hours, and he shall be allowed to take necessary extracts therefrom.

Provided that any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed a compliance with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.

15.—Representative Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Agreement, an accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised without the consent of the employer more than once in any one week.

16.—Weekly Hiring.

(a) A week's notice of intention to terminate the employment shall be given on either side, except in the case of casual workers.

(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of Clause 18, or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of the Agreement.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

(e) When notice is given to an employee by his employer or his responsible representative to present himself for work, and he attends where so directed and his services are not required for reasons other than those due to weather conditions, such employee shall be paid five shillings in addition to any expense necessarily incurred in travelling to and from the job.

17.—No Reduction.

Any worker who has been prior to the date of this Agreement in receipt of a higher rate of pay for his particular class of work than that prescribed by the Agreement heretofore in force shall not by reason of this Agreement suffer any reduction in the amount by which such higher rate of pay exceeded the amount formerly prescribed; such excess amount shall not be affected by this Agreement.

18.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one half day for each completed month of service; provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) Holiday pay shall not accrue during the workers' absence from duty, except on account of sickness, in accordance with Subclause (a) hereof.

19.—Preference to Unionists.

Preference of employment under this Agreement shall be given to members of The West Australian Plumbers and Sheet-metal Workers' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth.

20.—Term.

The currency of this Agreement shall be three (3) years from the commencement of the first pay period next following the date hereof:

Provided that, after the expiration of twelve (12) months, either party may apply to the other for a variation or amendment of this Agreement.

SCHEDULE I.

Apprenticeship Regulations.

Definitions.

1. (1) "Act" means "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," and any alteration or amendment thereof for the time being in force.

(2) "Apprentice" means any person of either sex of any age who is apprenticed to learn or to be taught any industry, trade, craft, or calling to which these Regulations apply, and includes an apprentice on probation.

(3) "Award" includes Industrial Agreement.

(4) "Court" means the Court of Arbitration.

(5) "Employer" includes any firm, company, or corporation.

(6) "Minor" means a person not less than fourteen years of age and not more than eighteen years of age who customarily works under the direction of or in association with an employer, master, or journeyman upon the material and with the tools or implements used in the industry.

(7) "Registrar" means the Registrar of the Court.

Employment—Probation.

2. No minor shall (except where provision is otherwise made in this Award) be employed or engaged in the industry, except subject to the conditions of apprenticeship or probationership herein contained.

3. (1) Every apprentice shall be employed on probation for a period of three months to determine his fitness or otherwise for apprenticeship, and shall work only for such hours per day and for such remuneration as may be prescribed by the Award. In the event of his becoming an apprentice such probationary period shall be counted as part of the term of apprenticeship.

(2) The Court may in any case where it seems expedient to do so, order that the probationary period of employment be extended for a further period not exceeding three months.

4. (a) Any employer taking an apprentice on probation shall within 14 days thereafter register such probationer by giving notice thereof to the Registrar in the prescribed form. If at the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations an employer is employing any apprentice or probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall forthwith apply for the due registration of such apprentice or probationer.

(b) At the end of the period of probation of each apprentice, if mutually agreed upon by the employer and the legal guardian of boy, but not otherwise, he may become an apprentice under an agreement.

5. The employer of every apprentice shall keep him constantly at work and teach such apprentice or cause him to be taught the industry, craft, occupation, or calling in relation to which he is bound apprentice, by competent instruction in a gradual and complete manner, and shall give such apprentice a reasonable opportunity to learn the same, and receive, during the period of his apprenticeship, such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as may be necessary. And every apprentice shall, during the period of his apprenticeship, faithfully serve his employer for the purpose of being taught the industry, craft, occupation, or calling in relation to which he is bound, and shall also conscientiously and regularly accept such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as aforesaid, in addition to the teaching that may be provided by his employer.

6. An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under an Award of the Court.

Advisory Committee.

7. A Board to be called "The Advisory Committee" may be appointed by the Court to advise in regard to any apprenticeship matter. Such committee shall consist of the following:—

(a) Some person appointed by the Court who shall act as Chairman.

(b) Two representatives appointed by the employers.

(c) Two representatives appointed by the industrial union or unions of workers in the trade.

The Advisory Committee shall have such powers and duties as the Court in each case may determine.

8. (i.) No employer shall refuse employment to any person, or dismiss any worker from his employment, or injure him in his employment or alter his position to his prejudice, by reason merely of the fact that the worker is a member of any Advisory Committee, or by reason merely of anything said or done or omitted to be done by any such person or worker in the course of his duty as such member.

(ii.) In any proceeding for any contravention of this Regulation it shall lie upon the employer to show that any person proved to have been refused employment, or any worker proved to have been dismissed or injured in his employment or prejudiced whilst acting as such member, was refused employment or dismissed or injured in his employment or prejudiced for some reason other than that mentioned in this Regulation.

Agreement of Apprenticeship.

9. (a) All agreements of apprenticeship shall be drawn up on a form approved by the Court, and signed by the employer, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice, and the Registrar. No employer, guardian or apprentice shall enter into any agreement or undertaking purporting to add to, vary, alter or amend any such agreement without the approval of the Court.

(b) There shall be three copies of each agreement, of which one copy shall be held by the employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one copy shall be retained by the Registrar.

(c) The apprenticeship agreement shall be completed within one month of the termination of the probationary period.

(d) Every agreement of apprenticeship shall be subject to the provisions of the Agreement in force for the time being applicable to apprenticeship in the industry.

10. Every agreement entered into by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice shall be for a period of five years, but this period may be reduced in special circumstances with the approval of the Court.

11. Every agreement of apprenticeship entered into shall contain—

- (a) The names and addresses of the parties to the agreement.
- (b) The date of birth of the apprentice.
- (c) A description of the industry, craft, occupation or calling or combination thereof to which the apprentice is to be bound.
- (d) The date at which the apprenticeship is to commence and the period of apprenticeship.
- (e) A condition requiring the apprentice to obey all reasonable directions of the employer and requiring the employer and apprentice to comply with the terms of the industrial Award so far as they concern the apprentice.
- (f) A condition that technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the employer's expense, and shall be in the employer's time, except in places where such instruction is given after the ordinary working hours.
- (g) A condition that in the event of any apprentice, in the opinion of the examiners, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard.
- (h) The general conditions of apprenticeship.

Transfer of Apprentices.

12. (a) The Court shall have power to transfer an apprentice from one employer to another either temporarily or permanently—

- (i.) if the employer does not provide the necessary facilities for the apprentice to become proficient in his trade; or
- (ii.) upon the application of the employer or the apprentice for good cause shown.

(b) The transfer of every agreement shall be on a form approved by the Court, and shall be made out in quadruplicate, and shall, unless the Court otherwise directs, be signed by the late employer or his assigns, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice, the Registrar, and the new employer. The transfer form shall be completed within two months of the date on which the transfer is effected.

(c) One copy of the transfer agreement shall be held by the late employer, one shall be held by the new employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one shall be retained by the Registrar.

13. Should an employer at any time before the determination of the period of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the service of the apprentice he may with the consent of the apprentice and guardian transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and pay the rate of wages prescribed by the Court in its Award or otherwise according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer.

14. On the transfer or termination of any apprenticeship, from whatever cause, the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate stating what time he has served, full particulars of the branches of the trade or industry in which he has received instruction, the proficiency attained, and shall also notify the Clerk of the Court, and the cause thereof.

15. In the event of an employer being unable to provide work for the apprentice or to mutually agree with the legal guardian of the apprentice to cancel the agreement or to arrange a transfer, application may be made to the Court to arrange for such transfer or to have such agreement cancelled.

16. Where a person is apprenticed to partners his agreement of apprenticeship shall upon the retirement or death of any partner be deemed to be assigned to the continuing partner or partners.

Cancellation of Agreement.

17. Every agreement shall include a provision that it may be cancelled, by mutual consent, by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice giving one month's notice in writing to the Court and to the parties concerned that such apprenticeship shall be terminated.

18. If the apprentice shall at any time be wilfully disobedient to the lawful orders of the employer, his managers, foremen or other servants having authority over the apprentice, or be slothful, or negligent, or dishonest, or shall otherwise grossly misbehave himself, or shall not conduct himself as a good and faithful apprentice should do, or shall not faithfully observe and keep his part of his agreement, then it shall be lawful for the employer, with the consent of the Court, to discharge the apprentice from his service.

19. The Court may in its discretion for any cause which it may deem sufficient on the application of any party to an apprenticeship agreement vary or cancel the agreement, either unconditionally or subject to such terms and conditions as it may deem advisable.

20. No apprentice employed under a registered agreement shall be discharged by the employer for alleged misconduct until the registration of the agreement of apprenticeship has been cancelled by order of the Court on the application of the employer.

Provided, however, that an apprentice may be suspended for misconduct by the employer, but in any such case the employer shall forthwith make an application for cancellation of the agreement of apprenticeship, and in the event of the Court refusing same the wages of the apprentice or such portion thereof, if any, as the Court may order shall be paid as from the date of such suspension, and, in the event of the application for cancellation being granted, such order may take effect from the date when the apprentice was suspended.

21. Subject to the provisions of the Acts relating to Bankruptcy and Insolvency and the Winding-up of Companies, the following provisions shall apply:

- (a) The Trustee or Liquidator, as the case may be, may give written notice to the apprentice and his parent or guardian of his intention to discontinue the employment of the apprentice from a date to be named in such notice, and thereupon the agreement shall be deemed to be terminated from the said date; subject, however, and without prejudice to the right of the apprentice, his parent or guardian, to compound, compromise, or agree upon or to sue for and recover such damages (if any) as he may have sustained through such rescission of the agreement as aforesaid.
- (b) Any proceedings for damages hereunder must be commenced within six weeks after the service on the apprentice of the notice referred to in Subclause (a) hereof, otherwise any claim for damages shall be deemed to be waived and forfeited.

Extension of Term.

22. Subject to Regulation 37, time lost by the apprentice through sickness or any other cause whatsoever may, with the consent of the Court on the application of any party, be added to the original term in the apprenticeship agreement at the end of the year of service in which the time has been lost or at the termination of the apprenticeship period.

23. The term of apprenticeship may be extended by the Court on the failure of an apprentice to pass any of the examinations, and for such purpose it shall be the duty of the examiners to make any necessary recommendation to the Court. Any extension of the term of apprenticeship shall be subject to all the conditions and stipulations in the original agreement, except as to rates of wages, which shall be such amount as the Court may determine.

Technical Education Classes.

24. (a) Every apprentice shall attend regularly and punctually a Government or other approved technical school vocational classes or classes of instruction, for instruction in such subjects as are provided for his trade. This clause shall be deemed to have been com-

plied with if the apprentice takes a course in an approved correspondence school: Provided, however, that attendances shall not be compulsory when the apprentice is resident outside a radius of 12 miles from the place where instruction is given, or in the case of illness of the apprentice the proof whereof lies on him: Provided also that if technical instruction is not available in the locality in which the apprentice is employed and is available by correspondence, at reasonable cost to be approved by the Court, the Court may prescribe such correspondence course as the technical instruction to be taken by the apprentice and paid for by the employer.

(b) The fees for the classes attended by the apprentice shall be paid by the employer.

(c) The period during which apprentices are to attend such technical school or classes if any shall be four hours per week.

25. Where in any case it is shown to the satisfaction of the Court that any apprentice, by reason of his engagement on country work or other good cause, cannot conveniently attend a technical school or other prescribed classes, such of these Regulations as relate to attendance at a technical school or other prescribed classes, and to examinations, shall not apply to such apprentice, but he shall be subject to such conditions as the Court may direct.

26. If the examiners or the industrial union or employer concerned make representations to the Court that the facilities provided by the Technical School or other place of vocational training for the teaching of apprentices are inadequate, the Court may make such investigations and such report to the Minister controlling such Technical School, or such other place, as it deems necessary.

27. When an apprentice attends a technical school, vocational classes, or other class or classes of instruction during his ordinary working hours, where such is prescribed, the time so occupied shall be regarded as part of the term of his apprenticeship, and the employer shall not be entitled to make any deduction from the wages of the apprentice for such time.

Examinations.

28. (a) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination at the places and times appointed by the Registrar after consultation with the examiners.

(b) Every apprentice shall, prior to submitting himself to examination, produce to the examiners a certificate that he has made at least 70 per centum of attendances at the technical school or other place of instruction unless he is exempted from such attendance for good cause.

(c) The clerk of the Court shall notify the examiners of the names and addresses of the apprentices required to submit themselves to examination.

(d) The employer shall place at the disposal of the examiners such material and machinery on his premises as may be required by them, and shall in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

29. (a) The examiners shall be persons skilled in the industry and appointed as prescribed by the Award. Failing provision or appointment as aforesaid the Court may appoint such person or persons as it may deem fit. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them or nominated by the Court or the President at the request of any of the examiners, and the decision of such person shall be final and conclusive.

(b) It shall be the duty of the examiners to examine the work, require the production of the certificate of attendance, inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and as to the opportunities provided by the employer for each apprentice to learn, and to submit a report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination within one month from the date of holding the examination, but this period may be extended by the Court.

(c) Such examination shall, where possible, include theory and practice as applied to the trade, industry, craft, occupation, or calling to which the apprentice is indentured.

30. The Registrar shall, after each examination, issue a certificate to each apprentice indicating his degree of proficiency, taking into consideration the term of apprenticeship served. A duplicate of such certificate shall be lodged by each apprentice with his employer and the secretary of the Union, each of whom shall keep the same in safe custody, and produce the same for inspection by the Industrial Inspector whenever demanded by

the latter to do so. When the final examination has been passed the certificate shall also be signed by the examiners.

31. Whenever it is possible so to do, the examiners, before entering upon the examination, shall draw up a syllabus showing what, in their opinion, is the stage of proficiency which an apprentice should attain at each of the examinations prescribed. The syllabus shall be subject to review by the Court at any time, and shall be kept as a record by the Clerk of the Court and a copy handed to the examiners before each examination. The said syllabus may be subject to alteration from time to time by the examiners, who shall forthwith notify the Clerk of the Court thereof.

32. In lieu of, or in addition to, examiners above referred to the Court may appoint, wholly or partly, examiners to be appointed by the Director of Technical Education for the whole or any portion of the subjects of instruction, and at such remuneration as the Court may determine.

33. In the event of an apprentice failing to pass any of his examinations the employer may apply to the Court to disallow the increase in wages prescribed by the Award, and the Court, on any such application, may make such order as the circumstances of the case may seem to require.

34. Upon the failure of an apprentice to pass two consecutive examinations, it shall be the duty of the examiners to report same to the Court with a recommendation as to the cancellation of the apprenticeship agreement, or such other remedial measures (*i.e.*, increased time for technical instruction) as they may deem advisable. The Court, after notice to all parties concerned, may cancel the agreement or make such other order in the circumstances as it may deem necessary.

35. Upon the completion of the period of training prescribed for apprenticeship, each apprentice shall be required to pass the final examination test to the satisfaction of the examiners, and upon passing this test shall be provided with a certificate to that effect by the Registrar.

Lost Time.

36. The employer shall pay the apprentice for all time lost through sickness or the holidays prescribed by this Award: Provided—

(a) payment for such sickness shall not exceed a total of one month in each year;

(b) where the time lost through sickness exceeds four consecutive working days, the employer may demand from the apprentice the production of a medical certificate, and a further certificate or certificates may be required if any time is lost through sickness within seven days from the date of resumption of duty, the cost if any of such certificate or certificates not exceeding 5s. to be borne by the employer;

(c) An apprentice shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident or sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

37. The employer shall pay the apprentice, in respect of time lost through compulsory military or naval training, the amount by which the wages prescribed by the Industrial Award for the trade, calling, craft, occupation, or industry exceeds the amount received by the apprentice from the Department of Defence: Provided, however, that this clause shall not apply to military or naval training imposed through failure to attend compulsory parades.

All time lost by reason of compulsory military or naval training other than the additional training mentioned in the above proviso shall count as part of the apprenticeship.

38. When an apprentice is absent from work for any cause other than sickness or in pursuance of the provisions of these Regulations, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the apprentice an amount proportionate to the time so lost.

39. When an apprentice cannot be usefully employed because of a strike the employer shall be relieved of his obligations under the apprenticeship agreement during the period of the strike.

Part-time Employment.

40. Where in any case an employer is temporarily unable to provide work to employ an apprentice for his

full time, application may be made by the employer to the Court for permission to employ the apprentice for such lesser time per week or per month, and at such remuneration as the Court may determine, being not less than the proportionate amount of the rate of wages prescribed by the Industrial Award for the trade, calling, or industry. If the Court grants the application, holidays will be reduced pro rata.

Miscellaneous.

- 41. (1) The Registrar shall prepare and keep a roll of apprentices containing— (a) a record of all apprentices and probationers placed with employers; (b) a record of all employers with whom apprentices are placed; (c) a record of the progress of each apprentice, recording the result of the examiners' reports; (d) any other particulars the Court may direct. (2) These records shall be open to inspection by employers and the Union of workers interested upon request.

42. For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the twelve months immediately preceding such time shall be deemed to be the number of journeymen employed. Where the employer is himself a journeyman regularly and usually working at the trade he shall be counted as a journeyman for the purpose of computing the number of apprentices allowed. Where a business is in operation for less than twelve months the method of ascertaining the number shall be as agreed by the parties to the Award, or if no agreement arrived at, as determined by the Court.

43. Every industrial inspector appointed in pursuance of the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," shall have the power to enter any premises, make such inspection of the premises, plant, machinery, or work upon which any apprentice is employed or could be employed, interview any apprentice or employee, examine any books or documents of the business relating to the wages and conditions of apprentices, interrogate the employer in regard to any of the above-mentioned matters.

44. With a view to determining whether the number of apprentices being trained is sufficient to meet the future requirements of the industry in the matter of skilled artisans, the Registrar may require any employer to furnish him with any specified information relating to the said industry, or relating to the workers engaged therein.

45. In every application under Clauses 15, 18, 19, 20, 22, 23, 33, and 40 of this Schedule, the Union of workers registered may intervene and make such representations at the hearing as it may deem necessary. The representative shall be appointed in the manner prescribed by Section 65 of the Act.

1. The apprentice of his own free will, and with the consent of the parent (or guardian), hereby binds himself to serve the employer as his apprentice, and to learn the trade of.....for a period of.....years, from the.....day of....., One thousand nine hundred and.....

2. The parent (or guardian) and apprentice hereby for themselves and each of them and their and each of their respective executors, administrators, and assigns covenant with the employer as follows:—

(a) That the apprentice shall and will truly and faithfully serve the employer as his apprentice in the said trade at.....aforesaid, and will diligently attend to his work at the said trade and will at all times willingly obey the reasonable directions of the employer, his managers, foremen, and overseers, and will not during the apprenticeship, without the consent in writing of the employer, sell any goods which the employer makes or employ himself in the service of any other person or company in any work, or do any work which the employer undertakes, other than for the employer, and will not absent himself from the employer's service without leave, and will comply with the provisions of the Regulations and of all Awards and Agreements made under "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," or any other Act in force so far as the same shall relate to his apprenticeship.

(b) That the apprentice will not do or knowingly suffer any damage to be done to the property of the employer.

3. The employer for himself, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns HEREBY COVENANTS with the apprentice as follows:—

(a) That the employer will accept the apprentice as his apprentice during the said term, and will during the said term, by the best means in his power, cause him to be instructed in the trade of.....and will provide facilities for the practical training of the apprentice in the said trade.

(b) That the technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the expense of the employer and shall be in the employer's time, except in places when such instruction is given after the ordinary working hours.

(c) In the event of the apprentice, in the opinion of the examiner or examiners appointed by the Arbitration Court, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable the apprentice to reach the necessary standard.

(d) That the employer will observe and perform all the conditions and stipulations of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," or any Act or Acts amending the same and any Regulations made thereunder, as far as the same concern the apprentice, AND ALSO the conditions and stipulations of any relative Award or Industrial Agreement for the time being in force.

4. IT IS FURTHER AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO:—

(a) That the apprentice shall not be responsible for any faulty work or for any damage or injury done to materials, work, or machinery, tools, or plant other than wilful damage or injury during the course of his work.

(b) That the apprentice shall not be required to work overtime without his consent.

(c) This Agreement may, subject to the approval of the Court, be cancelled by mutual consent by the employer and parent (or guardian) giving one month's notice in writing to the Court and to the parties concerned that this Agreement shall be terminated, and on such mutual consent being given the apprenticeship

shall be terminated without prejudice to the rights of any of the parties hereto in respect of any antecedent breach of the provisions of this Agreement.

(d) Other conditions:—

5. This Agreement is subject to amendment, variation, or cancellation by the Court pursuant to the powers to that effect contained in or implied by the provisions relating to apprentices contained in the Award.
