WHEREAS it is enacted by section 117 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-37, that the expression "Public holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified, and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that Monday, the 30th day of January, 1939, shall be a public holiday throughout the State for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be observed as a public holiday under every part of the said Act in which the expression occurs.

WHEREAS by section 158 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920/1937, it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation temporarily suspend the operations of the said Act, in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed for any shop or shops: And whereas it is expedient to exercise such power in manner herein-after appearing: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation suspend the operations of the said Act between the hours of

eleven o'clock and half-past eleven o'clock in the evening of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in every week, and eleven o'clock and fifteen minutes to twelve in the evening of every Saturday during the period commencing on the first day of January, 1939, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1939, throughout that portion of the State to which the Act applies and in so far as it applies to the closing time of confectioners, fruit, vegetable, and milk shops; provided the said shops shall not be kept open for the sale or offering for sale of any other goods which cannot otherwise be lawfully sold or offered for sale between the times aforesaid.

The Pearling Act, 1912-31.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

C.S.D. 2856/21; Ex. Co. No. 2926.

WHEREAS by section 45 of the Pearling Act, 1912-31, it is made lawful for the Governor to close any portion of a Pearl-shell Area and to prohibit the gathering, collection, or removal of any pearls or pearl-shell within or from the portion so closed for a specific period: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the whole of that portion of the Shark Bay Pearl Shell Area, known as the South Passage Section, other than those portions held under Exclusive License, shall be closed, and that the gathering, collection, or removal of pearls or pearl-shells within or from that portion so closed shall be prohibited: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the

Executive Council, hereby directs that the abovementioned portion of the said Pearl Shell Area shall be closed, and that the gathering, collection, or removal of pearls or pearl-shells within or from the portion so closed shall be prohibited for a period of twelve (12) months from the 14th day of December, 1938.

Murray and Serpentine-Jarrahdale Road Districts—
Alteration of Common Boundary.

Agricultural Products Act, 1929.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Agrie. No. 5816/16.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 9 of the Agricultural Products Act, 1929, that the Governor may make regulations not inconsistent with this Act, prescribing all such matters as by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed, or as may be necessary or convenient to be prescribed for giving effect to this Act: And whereas by a notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 21st day of January, 1938, the Lieutenant-Governor in Council made certain regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas it is now deemed expedient to amend the said regulations in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said Act, doth hereby amend the said regulations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 21st day of January, 1938, as aforesaid in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto:—

Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations, made under and for the purposes of the Agricultural Products Act, 1929, are amended as follows:—

1. By adding to paragraph (1) of regulation 4 a subparagraph as follows:—
(e) Cooking.
2. By deleting from subparagraph (a) of paragraph (3) of regulation 4 the definition of "extra fancy" and inserting in lieu thereof a new definition as follows:—

"Extra fancy" shall consist of sound, clean, well-formed mature apples of one size and one variety, free from broken skins and from disease, and, in the case of coloured varieties of apples as distinct from those varieties which at maturity are yellow or green, bearing on each apple thirty per centum of colour characteristic of the variety of the apple. Slight blemishes from any cause may be permitted, provided the total number of blemished apples in any case does not exceed ten per centum of the total number of apples in the case and the total area covered by such blemishes on any apples does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of one quarter of an inch. Russeting shall not be deemed to be a blemish unless more than ten per centum of the surface of the apple is affected.

3. By adding at the end of subparagraph (a) of paragraph (3) of regulation 4 a new definition as follows:—
 “Cooking” may consist of any varieties provided they are not less than two and a half inches in diameter, and, save and except as regards maturity and colour, conform with the requirements of “extra fancy” grade apples, or, save and except as regards maturity, conform with the requirements of “fancy” grade apples.
4. By adding at the end of subparagraph (b) of paragraph (3) of regulation 4 a new definition as follows:—
 “Cooking” may consist of any varieties provided they are not less than two and a half inches in diameter, and, save and except as regards maturity, conform with the requirements of either “extra fancy” grade or “fancy” grade pears.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

IN THE LICENSING COURT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

In the matter of the Licensing Act, 1911 (Consolidated), and the matter of a Petition for authority to grant a new License.

To His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia:

The humble Petition of the undersigned, being a majority of the electors living in area hereinafter defined sheweth as follows:—

(1) That your petitioners constitute a majority in number of the electors living in an area comprised within a circle having a radius of forty chains from the centre of all that piece of land situate at the corner of Guildford road and Maple street, Rivervale, and being portion of Swan Location 35 and being Lots 33 and 34 on Diagram, the subject of Certificate of Title volume 646, folio 182, and which said land is situate within the Licensing District of Canning, in the said State.

FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST.

Amendment of Regulations.

C.S.D. 99/36; Ex. Co. No. 2954.

THE Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners hereby amend the regulations made under the Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902, and as reprinted by the Government Printer with all amendments up to the 30th day of September, 1938, as follows:—

No. 1.—Interpretation.

Delete the existing term "Interstate vessel" and the meaning assigned thereto and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

"Interstate vessel" means a vessel owned and registered within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia, New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State, or Newfoundland (as signatories to the "British Commonwealth Merchant Shipping Agreement" dated 10th December, 1931), and ordinarily trading only between

- (a) this State and any other Australian State or States and/or New Zealand; or
- (b) Fremantle and any port or ports in the Dutch East Indies, Straits Settlements, Federated Malay States, Borneo, or any other ports in South Eastern Asia and as far as Hong Kong, via one or more of the coastal ports of Western Australia in either or both directions.

No. 63.—Speed of Vessels in Harbour.

Delete the existing regulation and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

The speed of any vessel within the Entrance Channel or Inner Harbour shall not exceed the minimum speed at which such vessel may be safely navigated.

No. 76.—Lights and Gangways on Vessels Alongside Wharves.

Delete the existing regulation and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

Every vessel berthed at any wharf shall at all times be provided with such appliances as gangways and manropes, and shall exhibit such lights as may in the opinion of the Harbour Master be necessary for the convenience and safety of persons passing to and from such vessel. Every gangway fixed for the purpose of

giving access to a vessel shall from sunset to sunrise be brightly illuminated as long as such gangway is in communication with the shore, and a watch shall be continuously set upon the said gangway.

Nos. 103 to 107, inclusive.

Delete the existing regulations and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

No. 103.—Pilotage Compulsory.

Pilotage shall be compulsory upon every vessel not specifically exempted therefrom by these regulations through all waters within the boundaries of the port, excepting between Gage Roads and the Pilot Boarding Ground in respect of vessels leaving the port.

No. 104.—Exemptions.

(a) All vessels not exceeding one hundred tons gross register, and all coasting and interstate vessels the masters whereof hold operative Pilotage Exemption Certificates, shall be exempt from pilotage, and no charge shall be made for such service, excepting where the services of a pilot are utilised, in which case the usual charges for such services shall apply: Provided that pilotage inwards shall be compulsory from Gage Roads to Inner Harbour upon any vessel the master whereof, though the holder of a Pilotage Exemption Certificate, has not during the preceding five years entered the port as master or mate of any vessel.

Building By-laws.

P.W. 700/38.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-34, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any purpose in the said Act mentioned, the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1.—Interpretation.

“Act” means the Road Districts Act, 1919-34.

“Board” means the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board.

“Building” means any house, store, shop, stable, shed, verandah, lean-to, bough shed or tent.

“Owner” means the owner of any land as interpreted under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-34.

“Builder” means any builder, contractor, or painter or person engaged in the erection of any building within the meaning of these by-laws.

“Townsite” means any townsite situated within the Road District.

“Footpath” means any part of a street set apart for the sole use of pedestrians and whether the footpath be made or kerbed or otherwise.

“Surveyor” means the person appointed by the Board for the time being as building surveyor or acting building surveyor for the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board.

2.—Applications, Plans and Notices.

Before the erection of a building is commenced one copy of the plans and specifications, and an application in writing for approval thereof, shall be submitted to the Board. Provided the Board may, if it see fit, dispense with the necessity for the submission of the plans and specifications, and reduce or dispense with the payment of a fee with the application for approval to make minor alterations in a building. Provided also, that any building (other than a verandah or aviary) used or intended to be used for the keeping of domestic animals, shall be wholly detached from any dwelling-house. Provided also, that where it is desired to make some minor alterations to a building not materially affecting its stability, lighting, ventilation, or the size of rooms, the application may, in the first place, be made without submitting plans and specifications, which shall, however, be submitted if the Board so requires. The application shall describe the building and show the purpose for which the building is to be used. The plan shall consist of a general plan and elevation and a block plan. The block plan shall show the relation of the building to the boundaries of the site, and to other buildings and structures thereon. The specifications shall describe the construction and materials of which the building is to be built, and the method of drainage, sewerage, and water supply, and state whether the material will be new or second-hand, and, if second-hand materials are to be used, shall give particulars. When giving approval, the Board may impose a condition that forty-eight hours' notice shall be given prior to the covering of any or all of the following works, in order that they may be inspected, that is to say:—Trenches, before foundations are laid; foundations, before trenches are filled in, and drains before they are covered in.

3.—Fees and Permits.

No person shall commence any building, erection, or any structure, or any addition or any alteration to any building, erection, or structure, without having first obtained from the Board a written permit for the commencement of same, and without having first paid to the Board the fees in respect thereof set forth in these by-laws. Each building, erection, or structure must be completed within the undermentioned specified time from the date of issue by the Board of the permit therefor:—

(a) Brick, stone or concrete—six months.

(b) All other buildings—three months.

The fees payable in respect to buildings, erections, or structures shall be as follows:—

(a) The expression “Floor area” applied to building shall mean the aggregate superficial areas of so many horizontal sections thereof as there are floors in the said building. The horizontal section of each floor shall be made at the point of its greatest surface dimensions, inclusive of external walls and of such portion of the party walls as belongs to the building, and also of all verandahs and balcony floors, covered ways, and light courts.

(b) The expression “Square,” applied to the measurement of the area of a building, means the area of 100 superficial feet.

For the first five squares in every building—1s. per square.

All squares or part of a square over the first five squares—2s. 6d. per square.

Minimum charge for every building—2s. 6d.

4.—General Provisions.

Each building in a terrace of buildings or in a pair of semi-detached buildings shall be deemed to be a separate building for the purpose of this by-law.

Every building shall be provided with one or more proper manholes in the ceiling, so as to give access for electrical and other fittings. The Board may reject any plans or specifications which in their opinion are not in keeping with the size and character of the adjacent

buildings. Every dwelling-house shall be provided with a water storage capacity of at least 1,000 gallons, properly connected up with gutters of roof.

5.—Site, Healthiness of.

A person shall not, without the permission of the Board, erect a building on any site which shall have been filled with any material impregnated with faecal or with animal or vegetable matter, or upon which any such matter may have been deposited, unless and until such matter shall have been properly removed by excavation or otherwise from any such site, and depressions filled in with clean soil. Every person who shall erect a building shall cause the subsoil of the site of such building to be effectively drained wherever in the opinion of the Board the dampness of the site renders such a precaution necessary.

No person shall commence to build any structure without having first provided proper and sufficient sanitary accommodation, to the satisfaction of the Board, for all persons engaged or employed upon any such structure.

Fowl houses, of not more than 200 square feet in area and no more than 6 feet in height, may be erected at the rear of any dwelling; provided that the nearest portion of any such fowl house is at least 30 feet from any building used as or intended for a dwelling and at least 4 feet from the boundary of land not in the same occupation. Fowl houses of larger area may be erected if at a distance of at least 50 feet from any street and 40 feet from any dwelling-house and occupation: Provided that the roof and walls are covered with galvanised iron or other fire-resisting material approved by the surveyor, and that the building shall not be more than 7 feet high. The Board may refuse or postpone approval to build upon a site which is unhealthy by reason of its liability to dampness, unless and until the site has been rendered dry, sound, and well drained to the satisfaction of the Board.

If the Board so direct in any particular case, the whole or part of the ground surface or site of the dwelling shall be covered with a layer of good cement concrete or tarred metal rammed solid and at least four inches thick.

6.—Position of Building Site.

No building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, and no addition to any such building, shall be built, constructed, or erected within a distance of four feet six inches, measured horizontally, off any street, road, land, or right-of-way at the side of such buildings.

7.—Access to Rear.

Where there is no public or convenient access to the rear of the site of any building for the removal of night-soil, the building shall be so designed as to leave outside the building a way of access at least 4 feet wide from a public road to the privy closet, and for the removal of garbage and refuse.

8.—Outbuildings.

In the case of an application to erect (as appurtenant to any building) any outbuilding from the use of which unpleasant odours or unusual risk of fire may reasonably be expected to rise, the Board may determine in what position upon the allotment such building may be erected.

9.—Tents—Canvas Buildings.

The Board may grant, subject to conditions, or refuse permission to erect a structure of calico-canvas or other textile material, and if such structure is erected without the Board's permission it may order its removal or demolition.

10.—Materials and Workmanship.

Materials which have been used in the construction of any cess-pit, drain, or sewer, or which for any other reason are dangerous for health, shall not be used in the erection of any buildings. Faulty or unsuitable material shall not be used in any building.

Every part of a building shall be erected and finished off in a good and workmanlike manner.

Bricks used in any building shall be good, hard, and well burnt, and if old or second-hand, shall be thoroughly cleaned and approved by the Board in writing before being used.

The Board may give authority to build iron chimneys, but in the erection they shall be laid on either stone, brick, or concrete base, and lines three feet high with brickwork, and free from all woodwork.

11.—Testing Materials.

The Board may test any building materials and prohibit the use of such materials as are proved unfit for the purpose for which they are intended to be used.

12.—Timber Construction.

All timbers used in any building are to be sound, free from rot or any other imperfection whereby the strength of the material may be impaired.

The following conditions shall apply as to the spacings and scantlings of timber:—

(1) Stumps shall not be less than 4 inches, jarrah or other approved timber, spaced 5 feet centre to centre, and fixed on 6 x 1½ inch sole plates. Stumps shall be tarred and sunk at least half their exposed length in the ground; provided that no stumps shall be less than 12 inches in the ground. Tarring is to extend for 6 inches above ground surface.

(2) Studs and ceiling joists shall not be less than 3in. x 2in., spaced not more than 2 feet apart, centre to centre, properly secured and braced.

(3) Rafters shall not be less than 3in. x 2in., spaced not more than 3 feet apart.

All rafters must be securely braced with purlins and collar ties.

(4) Floor joists shall not be less than 4in. x 2in., spaced 2 feet apart, centre to centre.

(5) Floor bearers shall not be less than 4in. x 3in., spaced not more than 5 feet apart.

In addition to the bearers required for spacing, an additional bearer of 4in. x 3in. must be placed under each wall or partition.

13.—Awnings and Verandahs.

The Board may require that any or all awnings or verandahs proposed to be erected over a public place shall be of the cantilever type. No verandah shall be closed for living or sleeping purposes without the Board's written consent.

No verandah shall be erected over any footpath unless it is 8 feet in height from the footpath, and, if supporting posts be used, these shall be placed nine feet from the building line to the outside of the posts and as close to the kerbing as the Board may direct, to conform with the footpath width of 9 feet.

14.—Footings.

Every person who shall erect a building of brick, stone, or the like shall construct every wall of such building, unless built upon a hard rock foundation, to rest upon proper footings, or upon a sufficient beam.

15.—Damp Course.

Every person who shall erect a building shall insert damp-proof courses of lead, slate bedded in concrete, or natural asphalt; provided, that the Board may permit the omission of damp-proof courses from closets, outbuildings, and the like structures.

Damp-proof courses shall be inserted in walls to their full width and in such manner that there shall be no open spaces, cracks, or gaps in the damp-proof courses along the full length of the walls.

Damp-proof courses shall be inserted in walls in each position in such manner that:—

(a) Moisture from the earth shall be prevented from reaching the lowest floor timbers or the walls above the underside of the lowest floor joists, or, where solid floors are laid, shall be prevented from reaching higher than 3½ inches above such floors.

(b) Moisture penetrating the chimney, parapet, or other walls above the roof shall be prevented from reaching any part of the inner walls or the inner portion of inner face of outside walls below the upper side of the ceiling joists in either case.

(c) Moisture penetrating the outer portion of cavity walls shall be prevented from reaching the inner portion or inner face of such walls above or about window, door, and other frames or openings.

This clause shall apply to all walls constructed of brick, stone, or concrete, and to all walls of any material readily permeable by water.

16.—External Walls, Structure.

Every person who shall erect a building shall cause the external walls thereof to be constructed of brick, stone, concrete, timber, or other material approved by the Board. If built of brick, stone, concrete, or the like the external walls shall, except where herein provided to the contrary, be not less than 9 inches in thickness; provided that the walls of sheds, laundries, outbuildings,

and the like not exceeding 10 feet in height may, if the Board so permit, be $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches in thickness. Cavity walls may be built, provided that two sections are securely tied together by a sufficient number of wire ties or other effective method, and, when used, the combined thickness or the inner and outer part shall be deemed to be the thickness of the wall. Bottoms of all cavities shall be carefully raked out before the completion of the building and all ties kept free from mortar droppings. Where cavity walls are used, weep-holes shall be left at foot of cavity not more than 6 feet apart, and over all damp-proof courses inserted to protect walls, weep-holes shall be left not more than three feet apart. Notwithstanding to the contrary in this clause, the Board may permit the erection of dwellings not more than two storeys in height of concrete with walls of less than the prescribed thickness, if satisfied that such proposed dwellings will be hygienic and structurally sound.

17.—Party Walls.

Two, but not more, residences may be erected together in one block, provided that they shall be separated from each other by a wall of concrete, brick, or stone at least six inches in thickness, properly reinforced to the satisfaction of the surveyor, projecting, in the case of wooden houses, at least one inch through the woodwork, front and back, and in all cases projecting 1 foot 6 inches through the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same, whether belonging to the same or not. Each building or dwelling-house in a block shall be subject to the provisions of the by-laws applicable to its class, save that the site or curtilage of each building shall have a superficial area of at least 4,000 square feet and a frontage of at least 33 lineal feet to a street or road.

18.—Rooms: Size: Cubic Space.

Every person who shall erect a building shall provide that:—

(a) The areas of the floors of all the habitable rooms in such building shall, taken together, average not less than 120 square feet per habitable room.

(b) A habitable room shall not in any case have a floor area of less than 80 square feet, and

(c) A habitable room shall not in any case have a cubic space of less than 880 cubic feet; provided that in each dwelling-house and in each flat of a residential flat building, there shall be at least one habitable room, the cubic space of which shall not be less than 1,296 cubic feet. No main room in any building shall be less than 10 feet in height from floor to ceiling.

(d) All shops shall have a clear space of 11 feet from floor to ceiling.

19.—Lighting and Ventilation.

For the purpose of ventilation, every building shall be so erected that there shall be between the underside of every joist upon which the lowest floor of such building is laid and the ground surface of the asphalt or concrete with which the ground or site of the building may be covered, a clear space of 12 inches at least in every part, and such space shall be thoroughly ventilated and cross-ventilated by means of suitable and sufficient air-bricks or other effectual method. Provided that, where the lowest floor is so constructed (by filling with concrete, asphalt, or other approved material) as not to permit the harbouring of rats, this provision shall not apply.

20.—Rooms, Air Bricks, Louvres, etc.

Every room of a building shall be so constructed that for every 1,000 cubic feet or part thereof of air space in the room there shall be 24 square inches at least of unobstructed ventilation to the outer air by means of air-bricks situated at or near the level of the ceiling or any other efficient means.

21.—Rooms, Windows.

Every habitable room or alcove in which food is intended or likely to be stored or prepared, and every bathroom, enclosed laundry, and privy closet shall have at least one vertical window opening directly to the outside air. One half at least of such window shall be constructed to open to its full extent and so that the opening shall extend to the top of the window. Provided that, in a pantry, any other system of ventilation may be substituted for windows, if the Board be satisfied that such system is equally efficient.

22.—Lanndries and Kitchens.

A dwelling of any kind shall not be erected with the kitchen and laundry combined in one room.

23.—Windows.

Any window the top of which is more than 12 feet above either the ground of an external flat surface or slightly sloping roof sufficient for safety shall be so constructed that it can be cleaned from the interior of the building.

24.—Drainage, Levels.

Every person who shall erect a building shall construct the lowest storey of such building at such a level that in the opinion of the Board it may be practicable to construct a drain sufficient for the effectual drainage of such building. No person shall build or erect, or cause or permit to be built or erected, any building, erection, tent, or addition to any building, erection, or tent on any land unless curtilage thereof can be properly drained, and the Board may refuse permission to build and erect any building, erection, tent, or additions, unless and until it is satisfied that the proposed building, erection, tent or additions, and the site and curtilage can be properly drained. No water is to be discharged on to the surface of any footpath.

25.—Miscellaneous.

The Board may permit the enclosure and use of any public place in connection with the building, or taking down a building or the alterations or repair of a building.

26.—Skylights.

The Board may order the alteration or repair, or both, of any skylight in any building, if such skylight be in the opinion of the Board in such a condition as to be detrimental to health or dangerous.

27.—Existing Buildings.

If in the opinion of the Board any building has been allowed into an unsafe or insanitary condition, either by faulty construction or any other cause, the Board may give notice in writing to the owner or occupier to repair such building, and in the event of no action being taken within seven days by the said owner or occupier to remedy any defect complained of in the said notice, the said owner or occupier shall be liable to a fine, as hereinafter provided, until such time as the building shall be placed in a safe and sanitary condition, and the owner or occupier shall be liable for all charges incurred in doing the necessary works, and, moreover, if in the opinion of the Board any building does not warrant the expense of repairing, the owner, after receiving notice, shall remove the building within seven days. Failing this, he will be liable to a fine, as hereinafter mentioned, for not removing building after receiving the notice. The Board may remove same and charge the owners with the cost of doing so, and recover the same in any court of competent jurisdiction or sell the material to cover the cost of taking down.

28.—Removal of Building.

No building or erection shall be removed into and erected or re-erected in the Road District, or removed from any part of the district to and erected or re-erected in another part thereof, unless the owner or person carrying out the removal first obtain written permission from the Board to do so. Before such permission shall be granted not less than seven clear days' notice in writing shall be given to the Board or the surveyor of the desire to remove and erect or re-erect such building or erection. Such notice shall contain or be accompanied by the following:—

(a) Particulars of the building which it is proposed to remove.

(b) Particulars of the situation of and plan of the land upon which it is proposed to erect or re-erect or place such building thereon, and a tracing copy of such plan, to be retained by the Board.

(c) A plan giving the dimensions of the building, and any proposed alterations or additions thereto, and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the Board.

(d) A specification giving particulars of the construction of the existing building and of the alterations and additions (if any) which it is intended to make when the building is erected or re-erected.

(e) Evidence satisfactory to the Board that such house has not been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation, and a certificate from the Health Officer of the Road District from which the building is proposed to be removed that, within a reasonable time prior to the date of the removal, no case of disease of an infectious or contagious nature has occurred therein.

(f) Such further particulars in writing regarding the same as shall be sufficient to enable the Board or its sur-

veyor to determine if all the provisions of any Act of Parliament, by-law, or regulation applicable thereto are or will be complied with. No written permission shall be given unless such removed building when erected or re-erected shall comply with the provisions of the by-law as applicable to new buildings. No building or erection that has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation shall be removed into or re-erected within any townsite. No building or erection in which any case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred during the preceding six months shall be removed into or re-erected within any townsite. No removed building shall be occupied until the surveyor shall have certified in writing that all the provisions of the by-law have been observed and complied with in respect to such building. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands. Provided that, in its altered position, it shall comply in all respects with this by-law, and that in the progress of such removal the building be not taken on to any street, road, or public place.

29.—Proportion of Site which may be covered.

A dwelling-house, together with its appurtenances, to be erected on an allotment, shall not occupy more than two-thirds of such allotment, and the minimum of unoccupied area shall not be less than 500 superficial feet. Provided that this shall not prevent the Board from granting approval to the erection of dwelling-house occupying more than two-thirds of an allotment, or with a minimum of unoccupied area of less than 500 superficial feet in replacement of an existing dwelling-house which occupies more than two-thirds of that allotment, or has a minimum of unoccupied area of less than 500 superficial feet, as the case may be. Provided also, that where situated on a site considered by the Board to be an established shopping locality, the Board may permit a dwelling which is to be a shop and dwelling combined to occupy not more than four-fifths of the allotment, subject to the unbuild upon area, being not more than 500 square feet. After the adoption of this by-law all subdivisions of resubdivisions of allotments must be such as to have a frontage to a street or road of not less than 66 lineal feet and a depth of not less than 165 lineal feet, or, with such measurements, to equal one quarter of an acre in area. Such subdivisions or resubdivisions must be lodged with the Board for approval before commencing to build, and shall apply throughout the whole of the townsites in the Augusta-Margaret River District without special approval of the Board. A shop or business premises without a residence or living quarters may be built on land with a frontage of less than 66 feet: provided that no shop shall be built on land having a frontage of less than 16 feet to a street or road and an average depth of 130 feet. There shall be back access from right-of-way 10 feet wide at least.

For the purpose of this clause the Board may agree to a subdivision with frontage less than 66 feet, but notwithstanding any such approval, no dwelling shall be erected upon the subdivided land, except in accordance with these by-laws. No land upon which any dwelling-house has been erected shall thereafter be reduced in area below the minimum area prescribed by this by-law. Provided always, that notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided to the contrary, the Board may on application under special circumstances and for special causes, and at a meeting of which due notice has been given to each member, declare that the provisions of the by-law either in whole or in part shall not apply to any particular area of land.

No building shall be erected in such a position that it shall lie between another building or any part thereof and street, unless such other building has a direct and unobstructed access to some other street at least 16 feet wide.

30.—Space outside Windows on side land.

If there be any side wall of a dwelling-house in which it is proposed to provide a window or door opening, that wall shall be set back (throughout its whole length) from the side line of the allotment to a distance of three feet, in the case of a dwelling-house of one or two storeys, to a distance of 5 feet, in the case of a dwelling of more than two storeys.

31.—Enforcement: Inspection: cutting into Building.

The Board may order the opening or cutting into or pulling down of any work where the Board has reason to believe or suspect that anything is being done in contravention of the Act or of any by-law, and, in the event of the work being found to have been done in contraven-

tion of the Act or the by-laws, the person doing the work shall be required to comply with the Act or the by-law, and shall bear the full cost of such pulling down, opening, or cutting into, as well as the cost of reinstating. The surveyor or his representatives shall have the power to enter at any time upon any building in course of erection for the purpose of inspecting such building, and may require the production of the approved plans thereof, which are to be available on the buildings during ordinary working hours whilst the building is in course of construction.

32.—Inspection before Occupation.

Before permitting any person to use or occupy any uncompleted building, and forthwith upon completion of any unoccupied building, the person by or in consequence of whose order the building is being erected, shall give notice to the Board. Forthwith upon receipt of notice as aforesaid, the Board shall instruct the building surveyor to make an inspection, and such surveyor shall inspect and report to the Board whether or not the building has been erected in accordance with this by-law, and without material deviation from the approved plan and specifications, but this shall not read to permit any alteration whatever in the position of the building on the site. Such report shall not be deemed to be evidence (in the event of any prosecution hereunder) that this by-law is being complied with.

33.—Penalties.

Any person who erects a building in contravention of this by-law, or any person who neglects to comply with any provision set forth therein, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), and also a daily penalty of One pound per day for any continuance of the offence.

Traffic Regulations, 1936.

Additions and Amendments.

P.W. 662/37.

THE Traffic Regulations, 1936, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 26th day of August, 1936, are hereby amended as follows:—

1. Subregulation 3 of regulation 62 is deleted and the following inserted in lieu thereof:—

62 (3). For motor cars, motor wagons, motor carriers, motor omnibuses and caravans, when such caravans are propelled by their own power:

Two headlamps so constructed and placed one on each side of such vehicle as to exhibit a bright white approved light in the direction in which the vehicle

is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp so constructed and placed as to exhibit a bright red light from the rear of the vehicle, and a bright white light to illuminate only the rear number plate, so as to make the inscription thereon plainly distinguishable:

Provided that such rear lamp shall be so affixed or fitted as will prevent its light from being switched off while the vehicle is in motion.

2. A new regulation is inserted, to be numbered 305B.

South Perth Road District.

305B. No person in charge of any vehicle shall cause or permit such vehicle to stand on that portion of Suburban road, South Perth, from a point 80 feet east of Mends street to a point 50 feet east of Parker street on Saturdays, Sundays, and public holidays.

A By-law of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie, made under section 179, subsection (4), of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906, and numbered 132, for the general management of Public Baths, the conduct of the visitors thereat, and for fixing the charge to be made for the use thereof:—

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie order as follows:—

By-law No. 117 of the said Municipality published in the *Government Gazette* of 30th January, 1914, is hereby repealed.

1.—Hours of Admission.

During the period October to April, inclusive, the baths shall be open daily from 6 a.m. to 10.30 p.m.

2.—Costumes.

Every person using the swimming pool must wear a proper bathing gown or bathing dress, to the approval of the attendant in charge of the pool premises.

3.—Entrance.

Every person shall, before being admitted to the baths premises, pay to the authorised money taker the admission charge herein provided, and shall enter the baths only through the gate or turnstiles set apart for entrance purposes.

4.

No person shall knowingly occupy any dressing room or the swimming pool for a longer period than one hour, or any shower bath for an unreasonable time, unless such person shall upon demand being made by any of the bath attendants in charge again pay to the authorised money taker the same sum as under this by-law would be payable by such person as a charge for admission to such dressing room or swimming pool.

5.—Charges for Admission.

The charges for admission to and for the use of the baths premises and its appurtenances shall be as follows, viz.:—

Adult, including spectators	6d.
Juniors, including spectators, under age of 14 years	3d.
Locker charges	2d.
Hire of towel	3d.
Hire of bathing costume	3d.
Care of valuables	1d.
Deposit of key	1/-
Loss of key	1/-
Season tickets, not transferable:—	
Adult—£2 2s. per season.	
Junior under age of 14 years—£1 1s. per season.	

Scholars of colleges and technical schools in parties of not less than 12 accompanied by a teacher—3d. each.

Scholars of State and other registered primary schools, in parties of not less than 12, accompanied by a teacher, half price, i.e.—1½d. each. (For this purpose baths premises will be available one day per week within school hours.)

Carnivals:—One-third of the gross takings, with a minimum of £10 10s. for period not exceeding five hours and on no account extending beyond midnight on the day of hire.

6.—Control of Premises.

(a) Every person using the baths premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the baths manager with regard to such use.

(b) No person shall obstruct, interfere, or hinder the baths manager in the performance of any duty in the baths premises.

7.—Towels, etc.

Any person hiring any towel or bathing gown or other article from the attendants or persons in charge of the baths premises shall return same on leaving the baths premises.

8.—Offences.

(a) No person using or entering the baths premises, nor any officer or servant or other person employed thereat, shall at any time bring or introduce into the baths premises any spirituous or other intoxicating liquors.

(b) No person shall enter or remain in or on the baths premises whilst in a state of intoxication.

(c) Every person shall, before using the swimming pool, make use of the cleansing shower baths provided, in which use of soap is permitted.

(d) No person shall use soap in any part of the baths premises other than in the cleansing shower baths.

(e) No person shall at any time whilst in the swimming pool use any substance or preparation whereby the water in the swimming pool may be discoloured or rendered turbid or otherwise unfit for the proper use of bathers.

(f) No person shall wilfully and improperly foul or pollute water in any shower bath or in the swimming pool, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel or bathing gown or dress, or any dressing room, closet, box, or compartment or other part of the baths premises or any furniture or other article therein.

(g) No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently injure or destroy or otherwise improperly interfere with any lock, tap, or fittings in or about the baths premises, nor carelessly or negligently damage or injure any furniture or fittings or any towel or bathing gown or other article supplied for use in the baths premises, nor write upon or deface the walls or partitions or any other part of the baths premises, or discharge litter of any description on or about the baths premises.

(h) No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal belonging to such person or under his or her control to enter or remain in or upon the baths premises.

(i) No person shall at any time, while being upon the baths premises, use any indecent or offensive language or behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

(j) No male person shall enter any portion of the baths premises set apart for females, and no female person shall enter any part of the pool premises set apart for males.

(k) No person shall climb up to or on any partition or roof or any other portion of the baths premises.

(l) No person shall spit or expectorate in the baths or on any of the platforms or in any of the dressing rooms, or commit any nuisance on or in any part of the baths or baths premises.

(m) No person resorting to the baths shall in any way interfere with any other person therein, nor throw or push, nor attempt to throw or push any person into the swimming pool, or throw any stones or sticks or any other matter or thing to the annoyance of or interference with any other person using the baths premises.

(n) No person shall smoke in any prohibited portion of the baths premises.

(o) No person shall, while suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease, or whilst in an uncleanly condition, make use of the swimming pool or any bath or dressing room. Any person offending or attempting to offend against this regulation shall, upon the request of any bath attendant, immediately withdraw from the baths premises and may be summarily ejected therefrom.

9.—Lost Articles.

(a) Any person finding any article which may have been left in any dressing room or in any other part of the baths premises shall, immediately after finding such article, deliver the same to one of the attendants in charge of the baths premises, who shall thereupon register a description of the same, and all particulars relating thereto, in the book kept for that purpose, and any person who shall have lost such article shall, upon giving satisfactory proof thereof, receive such article from the attendant in charge, upon entering his or her signature and address in the book referred to and a receipt for such article in the aforesaid book.

(b) The manager shall report weekly to the Town Clerk on lost property and produce the aforementioned book for inspection.

(c) The Council will not be responsible for any articles lost by or stolen from any persons whilst in the baths premises.

10.—Carnivals.

(a) During the holding of any swimming carnival the persons, club, association, or organisation conducting the same shall be responsible for seeing that good order and conduct are maintained by the competitors and spectators, and that there is no overcrowding, also that no damage is done to the building or fittings or other portions of the baths premises.

(b) At all swimming carnivals all competitors shall wear proper and approved swimming costumes.

(c) Any person, club, association, or organisation to whom the baths premises are granted for the purpose of holding a swimming carnival shall at least one week before the date of such carnival forward to the Town Clerk a copy of the programme of events to be competed for thereat; any item on such programme that the Mayor and Town Clerk do not approve of shall be struck out, or so altered as they direct.

11.—Enforcement of By-laws.

(a) Any person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

(b) Every person who shall infringe any by-law for the regulation of the baths may be summarily removed therefrom, and from every part thereof, by the manager or any other officer of the Council, or may be arrested by such manager or other officer and given into the custody of a police constable.

(c) The manager may refuse admittance to the baths of any person who shall have been convicted of wilfully disobeying or infringing any of the by-laws of the public baths, until such time as the Council may decide that such person shall be readmitted.
