FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (i), of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

DENTAL BOARD OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Amended Rules.

Whereas under the provisions of the Dentists Act, 1894, the Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1899, and the Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1920, the Dental Board may make rules, and may amend, repeal, and add to such rules: Now, therefore, the Dental Board doth amend the rules made under the said Acts by amending Rule No. 27 to read as follows:—

27. No articles of apprenticeship shall be registered unless and until the apprentice therein named shall have passed:—

- (a) an examination entitling the candidate to matriculation in the Faculty of Science at the University of Western Australia. If physics be not one of the subjects passed at the leaving standard, then the candidate must have obtained a pass in that subject at the junior standard; or
- (b) an examination entitling him to enter the dental course of any University in the British Dominions which grants a degree in dentistry and which degree is recognised by this Board.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-37.

Department of Public Health,
Perth, 16th February, 1939.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has, in accordance with section 295 of the Health Act, 1911-37, caused to be amended the Model By-laws prepared in accordance with the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927, by the insertion therein after by-law 4 of Part I. of the said Model By-laws of a new Model By-law, to stand as Model By-law 4A, as follows:—

4A. In relation to bathroom and laundry facilities to be provided in houses or public places or private places in accordance with the provisions of section eighty-one of the Act, the following provision shall apply, that is to say:—

(1) Every house and every public place and every private place to which section eighty-one of the Act relates, and which is so situated that connection between such house or place with a public water supply is available, shall be provided with—

- (a) at least one bathroom, which shall be not less than six feet wide and not less than six feet long, and which shall be equipped with either a shower bath or a plunge bath, and also with a wash basin; and
- (b) laundry facilities consisting of—
 - (i) at least one set of two washing troughs properly supported at a suitable height from the floor level; and
 - (ii) at least one copper properly supported and enclosed with brick work or sheet iron.

(2) The bathroom and the laundry facilities provided in a house or public place or private place in accordance with section eighty-one of the Act shall at all times, whilst such house or public or private place is occupied or used or available for occupation or use, be kept and maintained in good order and condition and fit for use as a bathroom or as laundry facilities respectively.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

Resolution.

WHEREAS by section 295 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, it is provided that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a Local Authority under any of the provisions of the said Act, and that a Local Authority may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws: And whereas Model By-laws have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927; the 20th day of October, 1933; the 5th day of October, 1934; the 1st day of February, 1935; the 12th day of February, 1937; the 2nd day of July, 1937; the 15th day of October, 1937; the 22nd day of April, 1938; and the 29th day of April, 1938: Now, therefore, it is resolved and determined by the Coolgardie Road Board, being a Local Health Authority within the meaning of the said Act, that the whole of such Model By-laws be adopted for the Health District of Coolgardie.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this 16th day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, between the Mayor and the Councillors of the Municipality of Boulder (hereinafter termed "the employer"), of the one part, and the Eastern Goldfields Municipal and Roads Board Labourers' Union of Workers, being a Union of workers registered under the provisions of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1912-1935 (hereinafter termed "the employees"), of the other part: Whereby the said parties are mutually agreed as follows:—

The basic wage at the rate of £4 15s. 2d. per week.

Men working with tar, bitumen, colas, or other road-making compounds to receive 1s. 2d. per day above the ordinary rate paid to them as dirt money.

Rubbishmen driving a motor truck and picking up household rubbish, to be paid 1s. 2d. per day over the rate paid as rubbishmen.

Casual hands employed for less than one week to receive 1s. per day above the rate specified for the particular work on which they are engaged.

Men tarring sanitary pans to be paid 1s. 2d. per day over the rate paid to sanitary workers, such as stagemen, when so engaged.

2.—Hours of Labour.

(a) Generally:—The hours of all employees shall not exceed forty (40) hours per week, divided as follows:—Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays—work shall commence at 8 a.m. and continue, with one hour intermission for dinner, until 5 p.m.

(b) Sanitary employees:—The hours of labour for sanitary employees shall not exceed forty (40) hours per week, divided as follows:—Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays—work shall commence at 5 a.m. at the stables and finish at 2 p.m.: Provided always and it is agreed, that such division may be mutually rearranged by mutual consent of both parties. It is specially agreed that from April 1st to October 1st starting time shall be varied for work not to start before 6 a.m.

(c) Electric light employee members of this Union:—Work shall commence every day, on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, at 7.30 a.m. and continue, with one hour intermission for dinner, and finish at 4.30 p.m.

3.—Overtime.

All time worked in excess of the hours stated herein, each day's work to stand by itself, shall be considered as overtime and paid for at the following rates:—For all work done beyond the hours of duty on any ordinary day, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter. All work performed on Sundays shall be paid for at double time rates. Sunday, for the purpose of this clause, shall be from midnight on Saturday to midnight Sunday.

4.—Holidays—Public.

Every employee shall be allowed the following holidays on full pay:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Easter Monday, Boulder Cup Day and Labour Day. Casual hands in the employ of the Council for more than one week continuously shall be entitled to those six (6) public holidays, should those days fall

due during the period of their employment. Every employee compelled to work on such days shall be paid double time rates. When any of these holidays fall on Saturday or Sunday the following Monday, Tuesday to be observed as a holiday.

5.—Annual Holidays.

Every employee shall, in addition to Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Easter Monday, Labour Day, and Boulder Cup Day, be allowed a fortnight's holiday, including ten (10) working days on full pay, once in each year.

Employees working less than twelve (12) months shall be allowed one (1) day's holiday on full pay for each month employed: provided that, should the employment be terminated before the end of a month, he shall be paid a proportionate amount as holiday pay for such portion of month worked. For the purpose of this clause, twenty (20) days to be calculated a month.

If a holiday as above defined occurs during a period of sickness or accident of an employee, full pay shall be granted to the employee: provided a satisfactory medical certificate be or has been furnished to the Council by or on behalf of such employee and that such period of sickness has not been of more than one month's duration at the time such holiday occurs.

6.—Annual Holidays Notice.

Notification of annual leave shall be given to the employees entitled thereto at least one (1) week before the commencement of such leave.

7.—Annual Leave, Mixed Functions.

Any employee who has been engaged on mixed functions during the year, when their annual leave falls due, shall be paid for such leave at a rate computed on the average weekly earnings of such employee for the twelve months preceding such leave.

8.—Sick Pay.

Twelve days' sick pay at half rates on account of sickness shall be granted to all employees. A doctor's certificate to be produced on each occasion a man is off sick; sick pay shall not be granted for more than twelve (12) days in the aggregate in each year.

9.—Aprons.

Two (2) aprons each per year to be provided for use of the drivers and stagemen and off-siders in the Sanitary Department, if required. Two (2) pairs of rubber boots to be supplied to stagemen per year, if required.

Goggles and respirators to be provided to all men employed at rock-crushing plant or men carting metal therefrom.

Two (2) suits of overalls and two (2) pairs of rubber boots per year to be provided to the man working tar sprayer, if required. The boots and overalls to be only used when working with tar.

A flyproof room of suitable dimensions to be provided at cleansing stage for use of sanitary employees.

A change room, equipped with hot and cold shower baths, to be provided at the Sanitary Depot for use of sanitary employees.

10.—Oilers.

Men having to work in the rain, oilers to be provided, the style of oiler to be optional.

11.—Mixed Functions.

Any employee using tradesmen's tools and doing the work of tradesmen shall be paid the ruling rate in the district for the class of work upon which he is employed; likewise an employee taking the place of a higher paid employee, or doing work classed at a higher rate, such employee shall be paid the higher rate of wage; if employed at the higher rate for two or more hours, he shall be paid the higher rate for the whole of that shift.

12.

Any employee turning up to work at the usual starting time, if his services are not required, he shall be paid for two hours at his usual rate.

13.

In the event of the full complement of men not being required, men shall be employed in **rotation**.

14.

In the engagement of its employees, the employers shall give preference to Unionists, and men engaged by the Council shall become members of the Eastern Goldfields Municipal and Roads Board Labourers' Union of Workers within three (3) weeks of date of engagement, and this Union guarantees to accept the employees of the Council as members of this Union.

15.—First Aid Outfit.

The Council shall, at depots and stables, provide full and complete first aid boxes for the use of employees and shall from time to time keep same renewed and in proper order.

16.—Full Payment for Shift.

After beginning a shift, employees shall not be paid for less than a full shift, unless they leave of their own accord, or dismissed for misconduct.

17.—Inspection of Time and Pay Sheets.

A duly accredited official of the Union shall be allowed to collect Union dues at the pay office, and shall be allowed to inspect the time and pay sheets relating to any employee affected by this Agreement, and make extracts therefrom.

18.—Rights and Privileges.

Any employee who may be, at the date of the signing of this Agreement, in receipt of a higher rate of pay for his particular class of work than is herein prescribed, or in receipt of any privileges or allowance other than herein prescribed, shall not suffer, by reason of this Agreement, any reduction in the amount which such employee was receiving above the rate prescribed in this Agreement, or loss of any privilege or allowance.

19.—Conciliation Committee.

In the event of any new class of work being introduced not provided for in this Agreement, a Conciliation Committee, consisting of two members of the Council and two members of the Union, with an independent chairman, shall meet and decide the rates of pay and conditions appertaining to such work.

20.

In all contracts let by the Council for work to be performed, the rates of pay and conditions of work set out in this Agreement shall be embodied in the conditions of contract.

21.—Interpretation Clauses.

For the purpose of this Agreement the terms used shall be interpreted or defined as follows:—

Men cleaning septic tanks means men engaged cleaning out septic tanks and soak wells, but not merely pumping the liquid from the septic tank or soak well. The rate as set to be the minimum rate.

Men driving motor sanitary van or slop motor means one engaged driving and collecting nightsoil from house to house, and conveying pans containing nightsoil to the trenches, or otherwise, or engaged driving and pumping slops into the slop tank to be taken to the trenches.

Stagemen means one who is engaged cleaning pans at the cleansing stage and loading nightsoil in tank carts to be carted to the trenches.

Trenchmen means one who is engaged at the trenches, and, after the trenches have been ploughed, cover with earth, nightsoil deposited in same.

Slopmen means one who collects the liquid waste from hotels, laundries, and other premises, also urine from pans and tanks in the municipality, and empties same, but does not include driving the motor truck.

Ploughmen means one who ploughs trenches for the reception of nightsoil and any other land required.

Handling nightsoil means—

- (a) assisting the motor driver in picking up pans containing nightsoil but does not mean driving the truck;
- (b) emptying pans into trenches or tank carts, or assisting in the disposal of nightsoil.
- (c) any other work appertaining to the disposal of nightsoil.

Cleaning silt pits means men engaged in emptying and cleaning the silt pits at the corner of Burt and Lane street, Piesse and Lane streets, and Burt and Brookman streets.

Men tarring pans means one who tars pans in use after being cleansed or new pans before being used.

Rubbish men driving motor truck, 1s. 2d. per day extra means one who performs the double duty of driving the truck and picking up rubbish.

Rubbish men means one who is engaged collecting rubbish which has been deposited by householders in boxes and other utensils, also rubbish thrown in the streets and in any right-of-way, but does not drive the truck.

Spreaders means one who is engaged spreading metal or other material on new works or works being reconstructed, or men engaged forming, levelling, or spreading after the scarifier, but shall not include horse drivers or motor drivers spreading his own load or doing patching work.

Concreter means one who under the instruction of the town clerk or foreman, carries out or supervises the doing of any concrete work.

Casual hands means anyone employed by the Council for less than one (1) week.

Municipal labourer not scheduled means one who is engaged on any class of work as a labourer not otherwise specified in this Agreement.

Minimum wage—The minimum wage shall be one hundred and ten shillings and eightpence (110s. 8d.) per week of forty (40) hours.

Week's work—Week's work shall comprise five days, each of eight hours excluding lunch time, Mondays to Fridays, inclusive.

Notwithstanding that the rate is expressed in a weekly amount, it is hereby declared that the contract of service is a daily one.

Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall come into force on the day of the date hereon, and shall remain in force for the period of three (3) years thence ensuing and thereafter subject to the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, and shall apply to all works and undertakings carried out by the said employer in the Eastern Goldfields District.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, the Seventeenth (17th) day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, between The West Australian Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part, and The Shell Company of Australia, Limited; The Vacuum Oil Company Proprietary, Limited, and The Texas Company (Australasia), Limited (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the other part, witnesseth, that for the considerations herein-after appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

Clause (1)—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all workers whose vocations prior to the date hereof were covered by any industrial Award or Agreement to which the Union was a party in respect of the receiving, handling, or

dispatching of oil and/or petroleum products or their containers, but shall not apply to depot-keepers, depot superintendents, officers in charge, or checkers, or any worker who is at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, to which the Union is not a party. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to cover workers employed as:—pipe line attendants, general labourers, gardeners, rubbishmen, head blenders, manufacturers in charge.

Clause (2)—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the South-Western Land Division of the State of Western Australia.

Clause (3)—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be two years from the date hereof.

Clause (4)—Definitions.

(a) "Leading hand" shall mean a worker who is appointed in writing as a leading hand by the officer-in-charge of the depot, installation and/or warehouse.

(b) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice: Provided that the minimum engagement for a casual hand shall not be less than four (4) hours in any one day, to be worked in one continuous period.

A casual hand engaged and not permitted to commence work shall receive two (2) hours' pay at the prescribed rate of pay for casuals.

(c) "Weekly hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one week's notice on either side. Such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week. Provided that any worker employed for a period of four (4) consecutive weeks or less shall be classed as a casual hand, and paid not less than the appropriate minimum rate of wages herein prescribed for casual hands, but this proviso shall not apply in cases where a worker employed as a weekly hand has been dismissed for incompetence or unsuitableness or for any cause referred to in clause (14) hereof.

(d) "Adult":—For the purposes of this Agreement, the word "adult" shall mean a worker twenty-one (21) years of age and over, or a worker who is in receipt of the prescribed adult rate of pay.

Clause (5)—Hours.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked in five and one half days.

(b) Such hours shall be worked between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday, inclusive, and between 7.30 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday.

(c) No day's work shall exceed eight (8) hours Monday to Friday, inclusive, to be worked in one continuous shift. Four hours shall constitute a day's work on Saturday, also to be worked in a continuous shift. The intervention of the luncheon period shall not be deemed to break a shift.

Clause (6)—Overtime.

(a) Work performed after 12 noon on Saturday or on Sundays or prescribed holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(b) Except as provided in subclause (a) hereof, all overtime worked shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(c) Where a worker is required to work continuously after the first four (4) hours of overtime have been worked, he shall be paid for all such work performed at the rate of double time until his usual starting time the next day.

(d) In the computation of overtime each day shall stand by itself.

Clause (7)—Meal Time.

(a) One hour shall be given and taken for a meal.

(b) Lunch hour shall be taken between 12 noon and 2.15 p.m.

(c) Tea hour shall start, in respect of each individual worker, within thirty (30) minutes after his finishing time.

(d) Where work is performed outside the ordinary working hours, breaks of one hour each for meals shall be allowed between 12 o'clock midnight and 1 o'clock a.m. and between 7 a.m. and 8 a.m.

(e) The meal hours referred to in this clause shall be taken in one continuous period.

Clause (8)—Meal Money.

Each worker shall, if required to work after his finishing time from Monday to Friday, or after his finishing time on Saturday, be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) for meal money. Provided that meal money shall not be payable where a worker continues to work on after his finishing time for one half hour or less.

Clause (9)—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall be granted to weekly hands as paid holidays:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(b) A holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each weekly hand on completion of each year of service. A weekly hand not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays, in proportion to the length of his service.

(c) Where a worker is entitled to holidays under this clause he shall receive at least two (2) weeks' notice from his employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer for such worker to take his holidays.

(d) Subclause (b) of this clause shall not apply in the case of any worker summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

Clause (10)—Wages.

A "Leading hand" shall be paid the sum of five shillings (5s.) per week in addition to the margin laid down above for weekly hands.

(d) Casual hands, other than casuals provided for in subclause (f):

(i) Adults:—The rates prescribed in subclause (b) hereof, plus 3d. per hour.

(ii) Juniors:—The rates prescribed in subclause (c) hereof, plus 1½d. per hour.

(e) Workers engaged in decanting or filling bitumen into drums, tanks or other containers shall be paid at the rate of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week extra.

(f) Casual hands engaged:— Per hour.

(i) unloading from rail, truck or other vehicle, shipments of oil and/or petroleum products in packages arriving direct from overseas ships, or

(ii) trans-shipping oil and/or petroleum products in packages arriving direct from overseas ships, from rail, truck or other vehicle to another rail, truck or other vehicle 2s. 10-19/44ths. d.

Clause (11)—Change Room.

Where an employer usually has more than six (6) workers engaged under the terms of this Agreement he shall provide his workers with a suitable room for keeping their hats and clothing and to use as a room in which to partake of their meals. Such room shall be situated within a reasonable distance of the employer's place of business and shall be kept in a proper state of cleanliness.

Clause (12)—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for the time so employed.

Clause (13)—Proportion of Juniors.

The number of male juniors shall not exceed the proportion of one to one for the first five male adults and thereafter one junior to every two (2) or fraction of two (2) male adults.

Clause (14)—Engagement.

Except in the case of casual hands, one week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the contract of service: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct, or if, after receiving one week's notice, such worker does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

Clause (15)—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing the following particulars:—

- The name of the worker.
- The class of work performed by him.
- The wages and overtime (if any) paid to each worker.
- The age of each junior worker.
- The hours worked each day.

Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed a compliance with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.

Such record or records shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on any working day, from Monday to Friday inclusive.

Clause (16)—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

Clause (17)—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint, for the purpose of the Agreement, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Agreement, the functions of:—

- adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them;
- classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement;
- deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

Clause (18)—Country Work and Travelling Time.

(a) When a worker is engaged on outside work, the employer shall pay all fares, and a proper allowance at current rates shall be paid for all necessary meals. Fares shall be second-class, except when travelling by coastal boat, when saloon fares shall be paid.

(b) When a worker is engaged at such a distance that he cannot return at night, suitable board and lodging shall be found at the employer's expense.

(c) Travelling time outside ordinary working hours shall be paid for at ordinary rates up to a maximum of twelve (12) hours in any twenty-four (24) hour period, from the time of starting on the journey: Provided that, when the travelling is by boat, not more than eight (8) hours shall be paid for in such period.

Clause (19)—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:—

(i) Name in full.

(ii) Age and date of birth.

(a) The certificate shall be signed by the worker.

(b) No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages, in the event of his age being wrongly stated on this certificate: Provided that this subclause shall operate only for the first three (3) months from the date of the worker's first engagement, thereby enabling the employer, if he so desires, to obtain proof of the junior worker's age.

Clause (20)—Special Conditions for Casual Hands referred to in Clause (10) (f).

(a) Work performed during the tea hour:—

When a casual hand is required for duty during his tea hour, whereby his meal is postponed, he shall be paid at the rate of double time until he gets his meal.

(b) Pick up:—

(i) The engagement places shall be at the employers' stores.

(ii) A casual hand shall, as from the time of being picked up, be paid the rate prescribed in clause (10) (f) of this Agreement: Provided that a casual hand, having been picked up and turned to work, which is outside the scope of clause (10) (f), shall be paid the rate provided in that clause, as for four (4) hours, at the least, but thereafter, and until turned to work within the scope of the said subclause, he may be paid such lesser rate as may be elsewhere prescribed for work outside such scope.

In witness whereof the parties hereto have hereunto set their hands the day and year first hereinbefore written.
