AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 25th day of May, 1939, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Supreme Court Act, 1935.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 147 in Part VIII. of the Supreme Court Act, 1935, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been or are about to be made by the Legislature or other competent authority of or in any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom and outside the Commonwealth of Australia for the enforcement within that part of His Majesty's Dominions of judgments as hereinbefore defined, so far as that definition relates to Western Australian judgments, orders, and awards, the Governor may by Order in Council declare such part of His Majesty's Dominions to be a reciprocating State for the purposes of Part VIII. of the Supreme Court Act, 1935, aforesaid, and that the said Part VIII. of the said Act shall extend and apply with respect to that part of His Majesty's Dominions and thereupon such part of His Majesty's Dominions shall become a reciprocating State within the meaning of the said Part

VIII. of the said Act, which shall extend and apply to such part of His Majesty's Dominions accordingly: And whereas by section 146 in Part VIII. of the Supreme Court Act, 1935, it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council declare any Court in any reciprocating State to be a Superior Court, within the meaning of the said Part VIII. of the said Act: And whereas the Lieutenant-Governor of this State is satisfied that the Legislature of the Dominion of New Zealand has by the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act, 1934, of the said Dominion made such reciprocal provisions as aforesaid: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid conferred upon him by sections 147 and 146 in Part VIII. of the Supreme Court Act, 1935, doth hereby declare as follows:—

- (a) that the Dominion of New Zealand is a reciprocating State for the purposes of Part VIII. of the Supreme Court Act, 1935, of this State;
- (b) that Part VIII. of the Supreme Court Act, 1935, aforesaid shall extend and apply with respect to the Dominion of New Zealand; and
- (c) that the Supreme Court of New Zealand in the Dominion of New Zealand as such reciprocating State aforesaid is a Superior Court within the meaning of Part VIII. of the Supreme Court Act, 1935, aforesaid.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1), of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

MARKETING OF ONIONS ACT, 1938.

Department of Agriculture,

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by sections 3 and 19 of the Marketing of Onions Act, 1938, has been pleased to make, under and for the purposes of the said Act, the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

MARKETING OF ONIONS ACT, 1938.

Regulations.

1. Every request by growers under subsection (1) of section 3 or under subsection (1) of section 10 of the Act shall be made in accordance with Form No. 1 in the Appendix to these regulations: Provided that any request made under subsection (1) of section 3 of the Act and received by the Minister after the date of the assent to the Act and before the commencement of the Act shall be deemed to be in compliance with and sufficient for the purposes of the Act, and these regulations, if such request has been made in a form which is substantially in conformity with Form No. 1 in the Appendix to these regulations, and may be dealt with accordingly.

2. (1) For the purposes of examining requests of growers made under either subsection (1) of section 3 or under subsection (1) of section 10 of the Act, and for the purposes of taking any poll provided for in the said sections, there shall be a Returning Officer.

(2) The Returning Officer shall be such person as the Minister may by writing under his hand from time to time appoint to be the Returning Officer for the purposes of these regulations.

(3) Where the Minister appoints some person other than the Under Secretary for Agriculture to be the Returning Officer, notification of such appointment shall be published in the *Government Gazette* and in the *West Australian* newspaper.

(4) The Minister may appoint a person to be Returning Officer in relation to a particular request, and to the taking of the poll in relation to such request, or may appoint a person to be Returning Officer generally in relation to all requests and all polls whilst his appointment continues in operation.

(5) The Minister may cancel the appointment of any person as Returning Officer, but notification thereof shall as soon as reasonably may be published in the *Government Gazette* and in the *West Australian* newspaper.

(6) Unless and until the Minister appoints some other person to be the Returning Officer, or if there be no other person holding office as Returning Officer, the Under Secretary for Agriculture shall be the Returning Officer for the purposes of these regulations.

3. Every request made by growers under either subsection (1) of section 3, or under subsection (1) of section 10 of the Act, shall be sent or delivered to the Returning Officer at his official address.

4. (1) Upon receipt of any request aforesaid, the Returning Officer shall examine the same, and shall ascertain whether, and satisfy himself that, the persons who have signed such request as growers are in fact growers within the meaning of the Act, and are not in any way disqualified from joining in the said request by subsection (3) of section 3 of the Act.

(2) For the purposes of this regulation the Returning Officer may by notice in writing under his hand sent or given to any person whose signature appears on a request, require such person to furnish to the Returning Officer proof to his satisfaction that such person is entitled to join in such request, and if such person fails or refuses within the time specified in the notice to furnish the proof required, the Returning Officer may strike the name of such person out of the said request, and by notice in writing to such person advise him accordingly.

(3) Where as the result of the striking the name of any person out of a request, the number of persons whose names remain on the request is reduced below fifty, the Returning Officer shall by notice in writing inform the persons whose names remain on the said request, accordingly, but shall thereafter retain the request in his possession for one month.

(4) If within the said period of one month any person alleging himself to be a grower not disqualified by subsection (3) of section 3 of the Act, appears personally before the Returning Officer and requests permission to join in the request then in possession of the Returning Officer as aforesaid, and to subscribe his name thereto as a grower-making such request, the Returning Officer may, if he is satisfied that the applicant is not disqualified as aforesaid, permit him to subscribe his name to the said request, and thereupon such applicant shall be deemed to have been an original party and subscriber to the said request.

(5) If within the said period of one month aforesaid the addition of subscribers to the said request as provided for in paragraph (4) hereof causes the number of names of growers signed on such request to be increased to not less than fifty, the said request shall be deemed to be in order, and thereafter subsection (1) of section 3 or subsection (1) of section 10 of the Act, as the case may be, shall apply and be given effect to, according to the tenour thereof.

(6) If at the expiration of the said period of one month the number of names remaining on the request then in possession of the Returning Officer as aforesaid is still less than fifty, the Returning Officer shall reject the petition by which such request is made.

5. Where a request which has been received by the Returning Officer is found by the Returning Officer to be in order in accordance with the Act and these regulations, the Returning Officer shall certify to the same by a memorandum in writing under his hand on the request, and then submit the same to the Minister for presentation to the Governor in Council.

6. When in accordance with subsection (1) of section 3 or subsection (1) of section 10 of the Act, the Governor issues a proclamation fixing a day for the taking of a poll of growers, the day so fixed shall not be less than one month or more than three months after the date of the publication of the proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

7. Within fourteen days after the publication of a proclamation fixing a day for the taking of a poll of growers, the Returning Officer shall by such notice or advertisement as in his opinion is reasonably sufficient, inform growers or enable growers to be informed—

- (a) of the intention to take the poll;
- (b) of the date fixed for the taking of the poll; and
- (c) of the place where growers wishing to vote at the poll may obtain the necessary ballot papers.

8. (1) As soon as reasonably may be, but in any event within fourteen days after the publication of the proclamation fixing a day for the taking of a poll, the Returning Officer shall cause ballot papers to be prepared for use at the poll.

(2) Where the poll is to be taken under the provisions of subsection (1) of section 3 of the Act, the ballot paper shall be in the Form No. 2 in the Appendix to these regulations.

(3) Where the poll is to be taken under the provisions of subsection (1) of section 10 of the Act, the ballot paper shall be in the Form No. 3 in the Appendix to these regulations.

9. (1) As and whenever any person claiming to be a grower desires to vote at any poll to which these regulations relate, he shall make application to the Returning Officer for a ballot paper.

(2) Such application may be made in person by the applicant, or by letter to the Returning Officer, signed by the applicant, and in either case the application shall be supported by evidence satisfactory to the Returning Officer of the eligibility of the applicant to vote at the poll.

10. As and when an application is received by the Returning Officer from persons desiring to vote at a poll, and the Returning Officer is satisfied that the applicant is eligible to vote, the Returning Officer shall enter the name and address of the applicant in a register, to be kept for the purpose, which thereafter shall be the electoral roll for the purposes of the poll in relation to which applications have been received as aforesaid, and also—

- (a) when the application is made in person, the Returning Officer shall cause the applicant to sign his usual signature in the said register opposite the entry therein of his name and address; and

- (b) when the application is made by letter, the Returning Officer shall make upon the said letter such mark as may be sufficient to identify the letter with the entry made in the register relating to the applicant, and thereafter shall retain the letter in a safe place for purposes of reference.

11. (1) Where the grower making application for a ballot paper is a partnership, one only of the partners shall be entitled to vote on behalf of the partnership. In such case the partners shall themselves select one of their number to represent the partnership and to be the applicant for the purposes of these regulations. The person so selected shall thereupon make the application in his own name, but his application shall be accompanied by a notification in writing of his selection by the partnership signed by the other partners.

(2) Where the grower making the application for a ballot paper is a company or an association, the board of directors of the company or the committee of management of the association, as the case may be, may by resolution appoint any person to represent the company or the association and to make the application on behalf of the company. In such case the person so appointed shall be the applicant for the purposes of these regulations; he shall make the application in his own name, but his application shall be accompanied by a notification in writing of his appointment, signed by the secretary of the company or of the association, as the case may be.

12. As and when an applicant for a ballot paper has been duly enrolled as provided for in regulation 10, the Returning Officer shall, as the case may require, give or send to the applicant a ballot paper, with the initials of the Returning Officer or of some other person authorised in that behalf by the Returning Officer indorsed on the back thereof, together with an envelope marked "Ballot paper envelope," and another envelope addressed to the Returning Officer:

Provided that no ballot paper shall be given or sent to any applicant if the Returning Officer is satisfied that the ballot paper cannot be returned to him completed before the time fixed for the closing of the poll.

13. The method of marking the ballot paper shall be as follows:—

If the voter desires to vote in the affirmative on the question, he shall do so by striking out the word "No" on the ballot paper, and if he desires to vote in the negative on the question, he shall do so by striking out the word "Yes" on the ballot paper.

14. A ballot paper shall be informal for any one of the following reasons, namely:—

- (a) it does not bear on the back thereof the initials of the Returning Officer, or of some other person duly authorised by the Returning Officer to initial the ballot papers;
- (b) the counterfoil issued with the ballot paper is not properly completed and signed by the voter;
- (c) the name of the voter appearing on the counterfoil does not appear in the register of applicants kept by the Returning Officer;
- (d) the signature of the voter as written on the counterfoil is in the opinion of the Returning Officer different from the signature of the applicant for the ballot paper as written by such applicant, either in the register of applicants kept by the Returning Officer or in his letter of application received by the Returning Officer; or
- (e) the voter when voting on the question has failed to strike out one of the words "Yes" and "No" appearing on the ballot paper, or has struck out both such words.

15. (1) When the voter has marked the ballot paper as provided for by regulation 13, he shall—

- (a) detach the counterfoil from the ballot paper and enclose the ballot paper alone in the envelope marked "Ballot paper envelope" and seal the envelope;
- (b) then complete and sign the counterfoil;
- (c) then enclose the counterfoil and the sealed ballot paper envelope in the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer, and seal the last-mentioned envelope; and
- (d) then deliver or send the last-mentioned envelope sealed with its enclosures aforesaid so as to be in the hands of the Returning Officer before the time fixed for the closing of the poll.

(2) Where the envelope containing the ballot paper envelope and the counterfoil is received after the time fixed for the closing of the poll; or where, when the said envelope is sent through the post, sufficient postage has not been prepaid thereon, the Returning Officer shall reject the same and the ballot paper shall be excluded from the poll.

16. When an applicant to whom the Returning Officer has issued a ballot paper satisfies the Returning Officer before the time fixed for the closing of the poll that the ballot paper so issued to him has been lost or destroyed, the Returning Officer may issue another ballot paper with the necessary envelopes to such applicant.

17. The Returning Officer shall provide and keep a locked ballot box, and shall place therein the envelopes addressed to him unopened as and when received by him, and leave the same in the ballot box until after the time fixed for the closing of the poll.

18. The scrutiny and count of votes returned in the poll shall be conducted by the Returning Officer and shall be commenced as soon as reasonably may be after the closing of the poll.

19. For the purpose of such scrutiny and count the Returning Officer shall—

- (a) open the ballot box and remove therefrom all the envelopes contained therein;
- (b) open each outer envelope and remove therefrom the counterfoil and sealed ballot paper envelope contained therein;
- (c) examine the counterfoil and satisfy himself that the same is duly completed and signed, and also that the voter who has signed the counterfoil is an applicant registered in the register of applicants kept by the Returning Officer as aforesaid, and that the signature on the counterfoil is the same as the signature of the said applicant;

103. No person shall distribute milk between the hours of 9.30 a.m. on one day and 1 a.m. on the following day--

- (a) to any consumer in the metropolitan area outside the districts defined in the Sixth Schedule to these regulations, or
- (b) to any holder of a Milk Shop or Milk Store License in the metropolitan area outside those districts.

104. No person shall distribute milk between the hours of 12 noon on one day and 1 a.m. on the following day--

- (a) to any consumer in the metropolitan area within either of the districts defined in the Sixth Schedule to these regulations, or
- (b) to any holder of a Milk Shop or Milk Store License in the metropolitan area within either of those districts.

105. Nothing in regulations 102 to 104 inclusive shall prevent any person holding the appropriate license from distributing cream in the metropolitan area at any hour.

(2) A new Schedule is added to the said regulations after the Fifth Schedule, as follows:—

Sixth Schedule.

(A) That portion of the City of Perth bounded by the Swan River from Victoria avenue to Spring street, by Spring street from the Swan river to Mount street, by Mount street from Spring street to St. George's terrace, by St. George's terrace from Mount street to George street, by George street from St. George's terrace to Wellington street, by Wellington street from George street to Victoria avenue, and by Victoria avenue from Wellington street to the Swan river.

(B) That portion of the City of Fremantle bounded by Marine terrace from Cliff street to Essex street, by Essex street from Marine terrace to South terrace, by Henderson street from South terrace to Queen street, by Queen street from Henderson street to Holdsworth street, by Holdsworth street from Queen street to Parry street, by Parry street from Holdsworth street to Adelaide street, by Edward street from Adelaide street to Elder place, by Elder place from Edward street to Market street, by Phillimore street from Market street to Cliff street, and by Cliff street from Phillimore street to Marine terrace.

RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD ACT, 1920.

No. 1 of 1939.

Between the West Australian Railway Officers' Union (Applicant) and the
Commissioner of Railways (Respondent).

THE Railways Classification Board doth hereby make the following Award in connection
with the application of the abovenamed parties:—

AWARD.

Conditions of Service.

1.—Term of Award.

This Award shall operate from the 3rd June, 1939, and shall remain in force for
three years from that date: Provided that either party shall have the right to apply
for a variation of the same after the expiration of six months, as provided for under
section 21 of the Act.

2.—Area and Scope of Award.

This Award shall apply to all officers employed in the Western Australian Govern-
ment Railways, except Heads and Sub-Heads of Branches and such officers who are
members of the Western Australian Division of the Association of Railway Professional
Officers of Australia.

3.—Interpretations.

For the purpose of this Award—

“Head of Branch” shall mean Secretary for Railways and Assistant to the Com-
missioner, Chief Traffic Manager, Chief Civil Engineer, Chief Mechanical Engineer,
Comptroller of Accounts and Audit, and Comptroller of Stores, or such other Head of
Branch as may hereinafter be appointed.

“Subhead” shall mean the following officers or other Subhead, as may be hereinafter
appointed:—

Secretary for Railways' Branch:

Officers-in-charge Assets; Commercial Freights and Fares; Finance and Staff
Sections; Advertising Agent; Industrial Agent.

Traffic Branch:

Assistant Chief Traffic Manager and District Traffic Superintendent, Metro-
politan District; District Traffic Superintendents; Chief Clerk to Chief
Traffic Manager and Claims Agent.

Loco. Power Section:

Superintendent of Loco. Running; District Loco. Superintendents.

Mechanical Branch:

Workshops Manager; Chief Boiler Inspector; Chief Clerk to Chief Mechanical
Engineer; Mechanical Inspector.

Civil Engineering Branch:

Assistant Chief Civil Engineer; Electrical and Signal Engineer; Chief Clerk
to Chief Civil Engineer.

Accounts and Audit Branch:

Auditor of Disbursements; Chief Book-keeper; Chief Staff Clerk; Paymaster
and Receiver; Chief Audit Clerk; Chief Statistical Clerk.

Stores Branch:

Chief Clerk; Mill Manager.

“Department” shall mean Western Australian Government Railway Department.

“Union” shall mean the West Australian Railway Officers' Union, or such other
title as may be hereinafter registered under.

“Home station”—Whenever the words “home station” are used they shall mean
the station to which an officer is attached.

“Married officer” does not include a married officer whose wife and family are
neither resident with nor dependent upon him, but includes a single officer who has a
parent or child solely dependent upon him and resident in the State of Western Aus-
tralia.

4.—Probation.

(a) A junior male clerk, who within the first two years of his service passes the
prescribed examination in—

- (i) Pitman's shorthand—80 words per minute; or
- (ii) Typewriting—40 words per minute; or
- (iii) Telegraphy—15 words per minute sound, 15 words per minute transmission;
or
- (iv) Timekeeping; or
- (v) Railway Accounts;

or any subject suitable to the Branch he has been appointed to, shall be granted scale
increase of salary three months prior to his birthday. Provided that, in respect to (i)
and (ii), the increase shall apply only to the ensuing scale increase, but in respect to
(iii), (iv), and (v) shall apply to future service.

(b) In addition, a junior male clerk who holds certificates for Railway accounts
and telegraphy or time-keeping, as per (a), and qualifies in safe-working, or the qualify-
ing examinations suitable to his Branch, on or before attaining the age of 21 years,
shall be granted a further advance of three months on his scale increase, and such in-
crease shall apply to his future service.

5.—Hours of Duty.

(a) (i) The hours of duty of officers (other than Transport Officers) employed in
the Head and District Offices shall be—

Where a five-day week is worked:—Monday to Friday—8.45 a.m. to 5.6 p.m.,
with interval of three-quarters of an hour for lunch.

Where a six-day week is worked:—Monday to Friday—9 a.m. to 5 p.m., with
interval of one hour for lunch; Saturday—9 a.m. to 12 noon.

(ii) Officers required on duty on Saturday mornings in Head and District Offices
shall as far as practicable be booked off on the following Friday afternoon to adjust
their hours.

(iii) Transport officers shall not be rostered for more than thirty-eight hours per week.

(iv) The hours of duty, Monday to Saturday, as specified in paragraph (i) may be varied in such manner as is mutually agreed upon between the Department and the Union.

(b) The hours of telegraphists shall be six and a half per shift at the Perth Operating Room, exclusive of meal hour. At other stations, seven hours per shift, exclusive of meal hour.

(c) Station-masters, assistant, and night-station-masters and relief officers shall work forty-four hours per week, exclusive of Sundays.

(d) The spread of shift for station-masters, assistant, and night station-masters and relief officers shall not exceed ten hours over all, except at stations where the train service renders it impracticable, where the spread may be extended to twelve hours.

(e) There shall be no fixed hours of duty for inspectors or other officers who are required to travel in the performance of their duties: Provided that this subclause shall not apply to pay officers.

(f) All other officers shall work forty-four hours per week, exclusive of Sundays: Provided that, where the present custom is to work a lesser number of hours, such custom shall continue.

(g) Any time taken by an officer in handing over at change of shifts shall not be counted as time worked.

(h) No officer shall be booked off for meals or adjustment of hours between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.

(i) The recognised meal hours for all officers shall be between the following hours:— breakfast—7.0 a.m. to 9.0 a.m.; lunch—11.45 a.m. to 2.0 p.m.; tea—5.0 p.m. to 7.30 p.m., with a minimum of thirty-five minutes for a meal.

(j) Officers brought on duty outside their ordinary rostered hours shall, except when such duty exclusive of meal time is continuous with the ordinary shift, be paid for all such time, with a minimum of a quarter day's pay at ordinary rates where less than a quarter day is worked.

(k) No junior clerk shall, except in cases of emergency, be rostered for duty between the hours of 12 midnight and 6.0 a.m.

6.—Travelling Time.

(a) Officers in receipt of a salary less than the minimum of the first class will be credited with ordinary time when travelling on duty for the first eight hours, and at half time thereafter up to a maximum of eight hours in any one day.

(b) Any officer stationed in a suburban area who has to take up duty temporarily in such area shall be credited with any time occupied in travelling to and from his place of temporary employment in excess of that usually occupied in travelling from his home to his regular place of employment.

(c) If travelling time is not adjusted during the week in which it is incurred, such time will be paid for at ordinary rates.

(d) When a sleeping berth is occupied, travelling time between 10.0 p.m. and 7.0 a.m. shall not be counted.

(e) When travelling by sea, time beyond ordinary day's hours shall not be counted.

(f) This clause shall not apply to officers on transfer or to those who come under the provisions of subclause (e) of clause 5.

7.—Overtime.

(a) Overtime shall mean all time worked in excess of the recognised working hours in any one week, and can only be claimed under the following conditions:—

Less than 30 minutes—	Not to be paid for
30 and up to 37 minutes—	Half an hour
38 and up to 52 minutes—	Three-quarters of an hour
53 and up to 67 minutes—	One hour
68 and up to 82 minutes—	One hour and a quarter
83 and up to 97 minutes—	One hour and a half,

and thereafter on similar basis.

(b) Overtime shall be paid for at the ordinary rate of pay for all time worked in excess of the recognised working hours up to two hours per day; over that period, time and a quarter. All time worked in excess of a spread of twelve hours shall stand alone and be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.

(c) All officers engaged on work which may be defined by the Commissioner as special, in excess of the recognised working hours, shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a quarter for the whole of such overtime.

(d) The recognised hours of duty shall be as laid down in clause 5, subclauses (a) to (g).

(e) In computing the number of hours worked per week, time absent on sick leave and holidays, when paid for, shall be treated as time worked.

(f) Any periods up to five minutes on any days are not to count in the week's total. The first two hours' overtime or any portion thereof in any one day, may be adjusted within one week of being worked; such adjustment shall take place by being brought on later or booked off earlier, but any overtime beyond the two hours will stand alone and be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.

(g) The foregoing subclauses (a) to (f) shall apply to—

- (i) the Head and Administrative officers;
- (ii) metropolitan and suburban station officers;
- (iii) station and other officers at depot stations.

(h) The foregoing subclauses (a) to (f) shall apply also to all other stations regarding overtime worked through—

- (i) the late or irregular running of trains;
- (ii) the running of specials or conditional trains;
- (iii) on account of the absence of other members of the staff; or
- (iv) increased volume of traffic.

(i) All other overtime worked shall be paid for at the discretion of the Commissioner.

(j) Any officer in receipt of a salary in excess of the maximum of the second class shall not be entitled to overtime pay.

8.—Sunday Time.

(a) Officers who are called upon for Sunday duty shall, if the work is of such nature that it cannot be carried out within the usual hours of duty, be paid for such duty at the rate of time and a half: Christmas Day and Good Friday to be considered as Sundays, insofar as this subclause operates.

(b) The following shall be the scale for calculating Sunday time:—

(i) Less than a quarter of an hour worked in continuance of a shift beginning on a Saturday or in commencement of a shift terminating on Monday—Nil.

(ii) Any officer brought on duty on Sunday shall be paid a minimum of a quarter day's pay at the rate applicable to the day; provided that this shall not apply in the case of a shift starting on Sunday and continuing into Monday.

(iii) If an officer works a broken shift on Sunday, a minimum of a quarter day's pay at the rate applicable to the day shall be paid for each section. A shift shall be deemed broken when more than two hours elapse from first signing off to again signing on.

(c) An officer who on a Sunday works more than his ordinary week day rostered shift shall be paid for the actual time worked. A rostered shift shall be one-sixth of the usual working hours for a week.

(d) No break of shift shall be allowed between the hours of 12 midnight and 7.0 a.m. or 10.0 p.m. and midnight.

(e) In computing Sunday time for inspectors, or such officers who have no set hours of duty, the ordinary hours of duty shall be deemed to be those worked at the Head and District Offices.

(f) The meal hours as prescribed in subclause (i) of clause 5 shall apply as regards Sunday duty.

9.—Leave of Absence, Annual.

(a) After twelve months' continuous service, all officers shall be entitled to annual paid leave of two weeks and public holidays, or days in lieu thereof.

(b) Officers stationed at Yalgoo and Goongarrie and north and east thereof, and between Norseman and Esperance, shall be allowed two days extra when clearing annual leave. Officers stationed on the Port Hedland-Marble Bar Railway shall be granted twelve days extra when clearing annual leave.

(c) Leave of absence shall be calculated to the close of each financial year, and shall be paid for at the salary the officer is in receipt of at the time such annual leave is taken.

(d) The leave shall be applied for and taken out at a time convenient to the Department before the 30th June following the year for which it fell due. At the expiration of that time the leave shall lapse, unless such leave shall have been deferred by the Department or the permission of the Commissioner obtained for its accumulation.

(e) In urgent cases leave in addition to the foregoing may be granted, without pay, for a period not exceeding six months. Any public holidays falling due during the period in which an officer is on leave without pay shall not be paid for.

(f) Subject to the proviso hereto, any officer with more than six months' service who may resign or be dismissed from the service, shall be entitled to receive payment for any holidays *pro rata* up to the time of leaving the service: Provided that, if an officer be dismissed for being under the influence of liquor, or for drunkenness, he shall be entitled to be paid for such leave (if any) as was due up to the 30th June previous, and, if dismissed for peculation or theft, tampering with ticket issues, or manipulation of the books of the Department, he shall not be entitled to payment for any holidays.

(g) The next-of-kin of a deceased officer shall be granted payment of *pro rata* annual leave to the date of the decease of the officer.

(h) Officers when working a five-day week shall, where clearing days in lieu of public holidays worked, be debited with days Monday to Friday.

10.—Absence without Pay.

Any term in excess of three months an officer is absent from duty from any cause without pay shall not for any purpose be included as part of such officer's period of service.

11.—Long Service Leave.

(a) The Commissioner shall grant to any officer who has continued on the salaried staff for ten years, long service leave for three calendar months on full pay, or six calendar months on half-pay. For the subsequent period of ten years the same conditions shall apply, and thereafter for every seven years similar leave shall be granted.

(b) Service prior to attaining the age of eighteen years shall not count in computing long service leave.

(c) Any public holidays occurring during the period in which an officer is on long service leave will be calculated as portion of the long service leave, and extra days in lieu thereof shall not be granted.

(d) If a deceased officer leaves a widow, dependant children, mother and invalid sister, payment *pro rata* of long service leave up to the date of such officer's death shall be granted to such dependant or dependants.

(e) (i) Officers regressed to the wages staff and re-appointed to the salaried staff, or appointees from wages to salaried staff shall, for the purpose of this clause, be treated as if the whole of their service had been served on the salaried staff: Subject to the proviso that officers who had less than ten years' salaried service but more than ten years' wages service and salaried service combined as at the 1st January, 1927, shall be entitled to the first period of leave on that date.

(ii) For the next period of leave the qualifying service will be ten years from the 1st January, 1927, and for subsequent leave the qualifying service will be seven years from the 1st January, 1937.

(f) Any officer who resigns or is retired from the service, except as provided for in subclause (g), shall be paid for long service leave due at the time of resignation or retirement.

(g) Any officer who retires or is retired upon reaching the retiring age, or through ill-health, shall be paid for long service leave *pro rata* to date of retirement.

(h) An officer dismissed from the service shall not be entitled to payment in respect of long service leave other than for leave that had accrued due to him prior to the date of the offence for which he was dismissed.

(i) A female officer resigning from the service for the purpose of getting married, and who has been continuously employed for three years and over, shall be granted payment *pro rata* for her long service leave at the date of retirement, subject to the proviso in subclause (b).

12.—Sick Leave.

(a) Any officer who is incapacitated for duty in consequence of illness or injury shall as soon as possible advise his superior officer in sufficient time to admit of arrangements being made for the performance of his duties. Any such officer who fails to do so shall be treated as absent without leave.

(b) Any officer so incapacitated for duty shall also notify his superior officer in sufficient time of the date on which he will be able to resume duty, to enable the necessary arrangements to be made.

(c) Should the absence be prolonged beyond one day the officer shall, except as provided in paragraph (d), forward to his superior officer on the second day thereof a certificate from any legally qualified medical practitioner showing the nature of the illness and the probable duration.

(d) Any such officer who resides more than five miles from a legally qualified medical practitioner shall intimate that fact to his superior officer, within whose discretion it shall lie as to whether a certificate is required or not.

(e) Any officer who finds that he is unable to resume duty on the expiration of the period shown in the first certificate, shall thereupon furnish a further certificate, and shall continue to do so upon the expiration of the periods respectively covered by such certificates: Provided, however, that the maximum periods between the dates of furnishing any two medical certificates shall be fourteen days.

(f) In cases where incapacity for duty is obvious to the Head of the Branch, he may relieve the officer of the necessity of providing medical certificates.

(g) Any officer shall, if so directed, present himself for examination by a medical officer, at such time and place as may be fixed.

(h) Any officer who has been absent for three days (not continuous) in one financial year shall, if so instructed by his superior officer, furnish a medical certificate for absences of one day only.

(i) Officers who have conformed to the foregoing may be granted sick leave (exclusive of annual and long service leave) as follows:—

- Officers with six or less than six months' service—Nil.
- Officers with more than six months but less than three years' service—Two weeks on full pay for each completed six months' service.
- Officers with three years' service and over—Three months on full pay and three months on half pay.

(j) Such leave may be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave on pay provided for must not be exceeded.

(k) In no case shall an officer be granted more than three months on full pay and three months on half pay in any one triennial period, unless otherwise determined by the Commissioner. The triennial period to be the three years preceding the date of illness for which payment is claimed.

(l) No payment will be made for any absence due to an officer's own fault, neglect, or misconduct.

(m) Indisposition, not necessitating confinement to the house, will not be regarded as illness in respect of which leave of absence will be granted under this section, excepting under special circumstances, to be approved by the Commissioner.

(n) When an officer is absent as the result of an accident which occurred on duty and is entitled to compensation in accordance with the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act, and is due for sick leave on full pay, half the period of absence only shall be debited against sick leave. Officers due for sick leave on half pay shall not be granted sick leave when in receipt of compensation.

13.—Away from Home Allowance.

(a) Allowances to meet the travelling expenses of officers will be paid as under:—

1. Traffic officers engaged on regular relief duties:—

(b) Daily allowance for the first ten days—10s. per day.
Daily expenses after ten days' residence at the same place to be reduced by 25 per cent.

(c) Where an officer is engaged at one station for one continuous period of four weeks or more, an amount of £2 2s. 6d. per week shall apply in lieu of the foregoing and shall operate as from the first day of taking up duty at such station.

(e) Where an officer is engaged at a station for one continuous period of four weeks or more, the following scale allowance shall apply in lieu of the foregoing and operate from the first day of taking up duty at such station:—

3. General:—(Applicable to all officers.)

(f) The daily rate shall represent in equal portions the expense for three meals and a bed. For the purpose of computing expenses, in the case of arrival at home station, breakfast shall be allowed for, if arrival is later than 8 a.m.; lunch, if later than 1 p.m.; tea, if later than 6 p.m., and bed, if later than 11 p.m. Where an officer does not incur expense in obtaining sleeping accommodation, the bed allowance shall not be payable, unless approved by the Head of the Branch.

(g) An officer absent from his home station (not temporarily lodging away from his home station) shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in suburban areas and two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) outside suburban areas for his second and each succeeding meal: provided that any officer who in fact incurs expense in procuring his first meal shall be entitled to be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in suburban areas, and two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) outside suburban areas, in respect thereof.

(h) When a sleeping berth is provided, the bed allowance will not apply, except when a bed has been paid for elsewhere for a portion of the night.

(i) An officer on a weekly rate of expenses sleeping at a barracks where no other accommodation is available shall be charged the sum of seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per week.

(j) Incidental expenses, such as cab fares and cartage of personal luggage, will be allowed: provided the time away from home station is sufficient to warrant such expenditure.

(k) Where an officer required to work after his usual finishing time cannot reasonably be expected to go to his home or lodging for a meal he shall, subject to the approval of the Head of the Branch, be allowed any expense incurred in obtaining a meal, up to a maximum of 1s. 6d. in suburban areas and 2s. 6d. outside such areas. This clause shall not operate where the excess time does not exceed one hour.

(l) In cases where an officer is engaged at other than his home station in receipt of weekly rate of allowance, and is temporarily away from such station, the daily allowance will be paid in lieu of the weekly rate for the period of such temporary absence, for twenty-four hours or over; if the absence is less than twenty-four hours, reasonable actual expenses will be paid.

(m) Where an officer is relieving on expenses for a period of less than twenty-eight days, he shall not receive greater payment for relieving expenses than he would have received if he had been relieving for twenty-eight days.

(n) An additional allowance of fifteen per cent. shall be granted an officer stationed outside the areas defined in clause 16, subclause (a), when travelling within such areas.

(o) Where officers travel by steamer on which the fare paid includes sustenance, an allowance of fifteen per cent. of the passage money shall be paid in lieu of the ordinary travelling allowance.

(p) Officers travelling on duty to the Eastern States via the Trans-Australian Railway will be paid such allowance from time of leaving Kalgoorlie until return thereto, as the Commissioner may determine.

(q) Any unmarried officer who is required to undertake duties away from his headquarters, and who remains at one foreign station for a period exceeding twenty-eight days, will not be granted away from home allowance, but will be paid any reasonable expenses incurred in travelling to and from his headquarters.

(r) Subclauses (c), (e), (m), and (q) will not apply until an officer has received information that his stay at one place will be of such duration as to bring him under the provisions of these subclauses.

(s) In the case of officers whose salaries have been placed in a range outside the fixed classes, the away from home allowance shall be paid at the rate provided for the class in which the minimum rate of salary of the officer concerned is embraced.

(t) In special cases the above scale may be increased by the Commissioner.

14.—Lodging Allowance.

(a) Any junior under seventeen years of age who in the opinion of the Head of the Branch is obliged to reside away from home owing to the requirements of the Department, shall be granted a board and lodging allowance equivalent to the difference between his annual salary and that provided for a junior aged seventeen to eighteen years.

(b) No allowance under this clause will be continued—

- (i) during absence from duty without pay;
- (ii) during any period of annual leave;
- (iii) during any period of other absence from duty with pay, unless the officer concerned continues to reside away from his home;
- (iv) during any period (after the expiration of one month) in which the officer is continuously in receipt of travelling or away from home allowance.

15.—Transfer Allowance.

(a) Any officer transferred from one station to another over one mile distant involving a change of residence shall—

- (i) be paid not less than £4 for a married officer and 15s. for a single officer. A married officer who does not transfer his family shall be treated as a single man: Provided that, should he subsequently transfer his family, he shall be entitled to the difference between the rates for single and married men;
- (ii) be paid such further out-of-pocket expenses (if any) as the Commissioner in his discretion shall decide to have been reasonably incurred;
- (iii) be granted free passes for self and family and free railway transport of his furniture and effects, including one cow, or two goats and one dog.
- (iv) No officer shall lose time by reason of being transferred.

(b) Any officer who is transferred from one place to another to suit himself, or who is transferred by way of punishment, shall be entitled to the provisions of subclause (iii) only.

(c) Married officers (if necessary) shall be allowed one day for packing and one day for unpacking.

(d) The granting of an allowance in excess of that provided to meet special cases shall be at the discretion of the Commissioner.

(e) Officers transferred to districts necessitating travelling a full night shall be supplied with sleeping berths for themselves and families on trains which have the accommodation, provided such berths are available.

(f) No married officer shall be transferred for a less period than three months. If required to work temporarily away at another depot or station for relief or other purposes for a less period, he shall be paid away from home allowance as per clause 13.

(g) Officers stationed within the Goldfields Areas shall be entitled to transfer, with expenses, to Metropolitan or Coastal Area after a period of three years, and such transfer, upon request, shall be arranged as soon thereafter as the exigencies of the service will permit.

(h) An officer transferred (other than at his own request), unless to conserve his seniority, or to obtain promotion, and unable to secure housing accommodation, may be granted expenses, at the discretion of the Commissioner.

16.—District Allowance.

(a) Married officers shall be paid allowances as under:—

- (i) Carrabin and Bullfinch to Kanowna—£20 per annum, except in towns of Southern Cross, Coolgardie, Kalgoorlie, and Boulder, and within five miles radius thereof, where the allowance will be £10 per annum;
- (ii) Coolgardie (exclusive) to Salmon Gums—£20 per annum.
- (iii) Southward of Salmon Gums to Esperance—£10 per annum.
- (iv) Northward of the Kalgoorlie radius—£30 per annum;
- (v) Wurarga and eastward and northward thereof to Meekatharra—£30 per annum;
- (vi) Three miles eastward of Meekatharra to Wiluna—£40 per annum;
- (vii) Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe line—£30 per annum;
- (viii) Port Hedland-Marble Bar line—£80 per annum.

(b) The rate of district allowance which may be paid to a single officer shall be one-half of that paid to a married officer.

(c) Where an officer stationed in a district carrying an allowance is on long service leave, no allowance will be paid unless the officer or his family remain in such district.

(d) An officer brought away temporarily for relief purposes from a district carrying an allowance shall be paid the allowance: provided such officer's family remains in such district.

(e) District allowances shall not apply when an officer is absent without pay, and, in the case of an officer leaving the service for any cause and due for payment in lieu of holidays, allowance shall not be paid for the period of such holidays.

17.—Free Passes, Privilege Tickets, etc.

(a) After twelve months' continuous service an officer shall be allowed three first class passes per annum, as under:—

One station to station pass on the occasion of the annual or long service leave, to cover the full term of leave due;

Two privilege passes from one given station to another and return.

In addition to the officer, the passes shall be available for his wife and members of his family under eighteen years of age unmarried, unmarried daughters over eighteen years of age, and the parents of an officer: provided they are resident with and dependent upon him for support. A widower with his child or children resident with him and who regularly employs a housekeeper may at the discretion of the Commissioner be granted passes for such housekeeper; in like manner, an unmarried officer supporting younger brothers and or sisters may be granted such passes for such housekeeper.

(b) Upon request an officer may be granted a separate station to station pass for his wife and dependants, as mentioned in subclause (a) hereof, where it is inconvenient for both to travel at the same time.

(c) After six months' continuous service an officer shall be entitled to the passes mentioned in subclause (a) in proportion to length of service; should any officer through illness be unable to use his station to station pass on the occasion of his annual leave, he shall be entitled to the use of such pass on the occasion of taking leave without pay during the year in which same is due.

(d) An officer who resigns or is retired from the service and has leave due shall be granted a free pass, station to station, for the term of such holidays: provided that, should an officer not have given the requisite notice or obtained the consent of the Commissioner to leave the service, as provided for in clause 19, he shall forfeit all claim to any passes he would otherwise have been entitled to under the provisions of this clause.

(e) On production of the prescribed certificate, free tickets will be issued to an officer, for the sole purpose of attending approved classes at the Railway Institute.

(f) Officers in isolated parts may be issued free passes, at the discretion of the Head of the Branch, for the purpose of obtaining medical attention.

(g) Free passes shall not apply to race specials, guaranteed specials, or special excursion trains within a fifty-mile radius, or when, in the opinion of the station-master at the station where the officer desires to commence his journey, there is not ample room on the train.

Market Passes:

(h) Officers stationed outside Suburban Areas will be issued market passes once per month to the most convenient market town. The passes may be issued in favour of the officer, his wife or his housekeeper, and children between the ages of five and fourteen years. An officer's wife or housekeeper may be granted a market pass, which may include a perambulator or go-cart, once per fortnight if required.

Free Freight:

(i) Domestic supplies up to a maximum weight fortnightly of two hundredweight for married men and one hundredweight for single men shall be carried free by rail to home station from the most convenient market town, and, in addition, meat, bread, vegetables, and dairy produce, when not obtainable locally, shall be carried free from the nearest town where same are procurable. All such supplies must be for the sole use of the officer and his family.

Market Towns:

(j) The following shall be approved market towns:—Albany, Armadale, Bencubbin, Beverley, Boyup Brook, Bridgetown, Brookton, Bruce Rock, Bumbury, Busselton, Collie, Coolgardie, Corrigin, Cue, Cunderdin, Dalwallinu, Denmark, Donnybrook, Doodlakine, Dowerin, Dumbleyung, Esperance, Fremantle, Geraldton, Goomalling, Gnowangerup, Harvey, Kalgoorlie, Katanning, Kellerberrin, Kojonup, Kununoppin, Lake Grace,

Leonora, Manjimup, Margaret River, Meckering, Meekatharra, Merredin, Midland Junction, Mount Barker, Mount Magnet, Morawa, Mullewa, Naamup, Narembeen, Narrogin, Norseman, Northam, Northampton, Pemberton, Perth, Pingelly, Pinjarra, Port Hedland, Quairading, Toodyay, Southern Cross, Wagin, Waroona, Wickepin, Wiluna, Wongan Hills, Wyalkatchem, Yalgoo, Yarloop, York.

Privilege Tickets:

(k) After six months' continuous service, an officer shall be allowed privilege return tickets for himself, wife, and members of his family under eighteen years of age; also unmarried daughters over eighteen years of age, and his parents, provided they are resident with and dependent upon the officer's earnings. The charge for privilege tickets to be half the single fare for the return journey, with a minimum of 1s. for adults and 6d. for children.

(l) For the purpose of this clause, a member of the family shall be deemed to be dependent: provided such member's income does not exceed 15s. a week, exclusive of old age or invalid pension; but a member of the family temporarily out of employment shall not be deemed to be dependent.

18.—Privilege Season Tickets.

(a) First-class season tickets at one half the ordinary season ticket rates will, on application and on production of the departmental certificate, be issued to an officer to enable him to travel between his place of occupation and the station nearest his place of residence. To an officer in receipt of 45 per cent. of the basic wage or under, one-quarter of the ordinary season ticket rates shall be charged.

(b) These season tickets shall be available only whilst the holder is in the employ of the Department.

(c) Should the holder resign or change his place of residence a refund of the unexpired value of the ticket will be made if handed in at the time.

19.—Resignations and Retirements.

(a) No officer shall leave the Department until the expiration of one month's written notice of his intention so to do, without the approval of the Commissioner.

(b) One calendar month's notice shall be given by the Commissioner to any such officer whose services are no longer required; provided that this subclause shall not apply to cases of summary dismissal for misconduct.

20.—Promotion.

(a) Promotion and the selection of an officer to act in a higher position shall be governed by relative ability, suitability, record, and experience. If everything else is deemed equal, the senior officer shall be selected for promotion.

(b) As a general rule, officers and employees of the Branch in which the vacancies occur will be promoted to the higher position, but the Commissioner may, when he considers it advisable, for the good of the service, select an officer from one Branch for position in another, either in the same or in a higher class.

(c) When considered necessary, a person from outside the service may be appointed to any position in the service: provided that there is not an officer in the service capable of filling the position.

(d) No officer shall refuse compliance with any order directing his transfer from one position to another, but if on appeal the Commissioner is satisfied the objection is sound, then such officer shall not be penalised.

(e) An officer desiring to be passed over in the event of promotion being offered, shall, if his request be acceded to, forfeit all claim to promotion for two years, but if good and sufficient reason be given the Commissioner, he may restore such claim.

(f) All officers promoted to a higher position shall be subject to a probationary period of six months and be paid the minimum rate of salary assigned to the class to which they are promoted. At the end of such period, the Head of the Branch shall report to the Commissioner as to the fitness of the officer for the higher position; if the report is satisfactory, the appointment will be confirmed as from the date of taking up duty; if unsatisfactory, the officer will be provided for at the same salary as he was in receipt of prior to the period of probation in the higher position.

(g) When a vacancy occurs in the service, if the senior officer is not selected for promotion, applications shall be advertised in the *Weekly Notice*.

(h) A list of promotions shall be published in the *Weekly Notice* within 14 days of the Commissioner's approval. Any officer who considers that he has been unjustly passed over may appeal, in the first place to the Head of his Branch, and, if not satisfied with the latter's reply, may then appeal to the Commissioner, whose decision shall be final. The Head of the Branch or the Commissioner shall reply to the appeal within 21 days, but no appeal will be considered unless forwarded so as to reach the Head of the Branch within fourteen days after receipt of the *Weekly Notice*, and the Commissioner within fourteen days after date of receipt of the reply from the Head of the Branch.

(i) Preference shall be given to unionists with regard to employment, except in the case of juniors.

21.—Acting in higher Capacities.

(a) When an officer, other than relief officers in class 5 or higher classes, performs the duties of the position higher than that in which he is classified for a term exceeding fourteen days (continuous or broken) within any one financial year, he shall be paid from the end of that period, while performing any such duties, at the minimum salary attached to such higher position.

(b) An officer (other than relief officers in class 5 or higher classes) called upon to occupy a higher position temporarily, shall be entitled to increments as though he had been permanently promoted to such position; provided that in the case of the first increment the officer shall have performed the higher duties for twelve months continuous or broken period; provided further, that the officer shall be entitled to receive a second increment if he shall have performed the higher duties for two years continuous or broken period. Absence on annual leave, long service leave, or sick leave on pay, shall be counted as service, provided the officer resumes in the same or another higher position.

22.—Temporary Clerks.

- (a) Temporary clerks shall not be engaged, without the approval of the Commissioner, in any position classified above the sixth class.
- (b) The provisions of clauses 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 12, 13, 15, 16, 17, and 18 will apply to temporary clerks.
- (c) The provisions of clause 19, provided that the notice to leave received and given shall be one week in lieu of one calendar month, shall apply to temporary clerks.
- (d) The rate of pay shall be—
 1st six months—Basic rate, plus margin 21s. per week.
 After six months—Basic rate, plus margin 24s. per week.

23.—General Regulations.

An officer who is required to attend any medical or departmental examination shall be granted pay and expenses in accordance with clause 13 for any period for which he is necessarily absent from his ordinary duties in connection therewith.

24.—Classification.

- (a) All positions set out in the Schedule annexed hereto are in their respective proper classes and shown in alphabetical order.
- (b) The Commissioner shall, as soon as possible after coming into force of this Award, issue a printed classification for each officer, showing the officers in their order of seniority, positions occupied and salaries, in Branch and section groups, with date of appointment to salaried staff and date of appointment to classified position.
- (c) Officers performing postal duties shall be paid fifty per cent. and Savings Bank duties one hundred per cent. of the allowances received by the Railway Department from these Departments, in addition to their salaries, but such shall not in any case be deemed part of the salary of such officer, nor shall the officer claim Sunday time or overtime caused through Postal and/or Savings Bank duties.
- (d) Nothing in this classification shall lower the rate of salary any officer was in receipt of at the coming into force of the Award.

25.—Payment of Salaries.

- (a) Salaries shall be paid fortnightly on each alternate Friday, except where the usual pay-day falls on a public holiday, when payments shall be made on the previous Thursday.
- (b) A day's salary shall be calculated as one three hundred and thirteenth of the yearly rate of salary.
- (c) The salary for a fortnight shall be computed by dividing the yearly rate by three hundred and thirteen and multiplying the result by twelve.
- (d) The provisions of the Award shall be suspended during any period in which by reason of any action on the part of all or of any section of the Commissioner's employees, or for any other cause beyond his control, he is unable wholly or partially to carry on the running of trains, or the Workshops, and the Commissioner will not be liable for payment of salary to any officer whom he does not call upon for duty during any such period.

26.—Rates of Pay.

(Note.—The basic rate as referred to in this Award shall be that as determined from time to time by the State Court of Arbitration.)

(g) (i) If a male officer is retained on the maximum of the sixth class (clerical or stationmasters) or the fourth class (assistant and night stationmasters) for five years, and has not refused promotion to a higher class, and the Head of his Branch certifies that such officer is eligible and would be recommended for promotion on the grounds of good conduct and efficiency, he may be paid, on the approval of the Commissioner, an allowance of £10 per annum.

(ii) If such officer is subsequently promoted to class five clerical and stationmasters or class three assistant and night stationmasters, he will be entitled to advancement to the maximum of that class twelve months from the date he received the allowance.

(h) Officers occupying the positions set forth in the attached Schedule shall be paid a salary not less than the minimum provided for the class in which such position has been classified: provided that, where an officer has been on the minimum, intermediate, or maximum of his class he shall be advanced to the equivalent range under this Schedule. Officers who are classified on range of salary outside the Schedule of salaries shall be advanced similarly to those coming under the general schedule.

(i) Officers (other than juniors) occupying all other positions will be paid the salary set forth in sixth class subclause (b).

(j) Any officer over 21 years of age who has passed the Pay Officer's examination and is engaged in paying salaries or wages half or more of his time, shall be classified in the fifth class.

(k) Advancement from minimum to maximum of any class shall be by yearly increment: provided such advancement shall be approved by the Commissioner, upon satisfactory report from the Head of the Branch in which the officer is employed, of his conduct, diligence, and efficiency, and provided also, that the advancement in salary shall not be granted to an officer if the Commissioner determines that such officer has not performed his duties satisfactorily for the preceding twelve months, or that such officer has been guilty of misconduct which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, justifies the postponement or refusal of the advancement.

(l) An officer who is unable from any cause to perform the duties of his position and is in consequence provided with employment in another position in a lower class shall, unless the Commissioner directs otherwise, be paid the maximum rate for the class in which he has been provided.

(m) Nothing in this Award shall be deemed to limit the power of the Commissioner to pay any officer at a higher rate than that prescribed in any case, where he may consider the same to be merited or warranted by the officer occupying such position.

(n) The rates of pay for all officers shall be subject to adjustment in accordance with basic wage declaration of the State Court of Arbitration: provided that the basic wage payable shall be the nearest multiple of £5 to the result obtained by multiplying the State weekly basic wage by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6th).

28.—Railway Construction, etc., Work.

(a) This section of the Award shall apply to clerical officers, foremen, timekeepers, and storemen employed on railway construction and/or special maintenance or reconstruction work on opened lines.

(b) The hours of duty for all officers employed on construction work shall be 44 hours per week.

(c) Sunday Time:—Clause 8 of General Award shall apply.

(d) Travelling Allowances:—Officers called upon to travel away from the job shall be paid expenses as per clause 13 of the principal Award.

(e) Accommodation:—Officers shall be supplied with accommodation, including stretcher, crockery, and cooking utensils, rent free. At the discretion of the Head of the Branch a cook may be provided.

(f) District Allowance:—District allowance as provided in clause 16 of the principal Award shall apply.

(g) Free Passes, Privilege Tickets:—The conditions of clause 17 of the principal Award shall apply subject to the proviso that officers who have not their families with them shall be granted four privilege passes per annum.

(h) Preparatory and Completion Work:—In cases where preparatory work in Perth has to be performed before proceeding to job and/or where work has to be finalised after return to Perth, the rates of pay shall operate from time of commencement of work to date of finishing. In other cases payment starts from time of leaving Perth and ceases on return thereto.

(i) Leave of Absence:—Clause 9 of General Award shall apply, subject to the proviso that if the engagement is for period of less than six months, one day's leave for each month shall be granted.

(j) Sick Pay:—Sick pay will be granted in accordance with the provisions of clause 12 of the principal Award.

(k) Long Service Leave:—The provisions of clause 11 of the principal Award shall apply.

(l) Rates of Pay:—The following rates of pay, including all payments for overtime and allowances, other than district allowances, shall operate:—

Foremen:—Margins ranging from 45s. to 95s. per week; actual margin for each job to be fixed by the Head of the Branch.

Clerical Staff, Timekeepers and Storemen (Wages):	Margin over Basic Wage per week.
1st clerk with one or more clerks and/or timekeeper ..	45s.
1st clerk with one or more clerks and/or timekeeper, if required to act as paymaster	55s.
1st clerk without assistance	35s.
Traffic clerk	30s.
Timekeeper and assistant clerk	24s.
Storekeeper	20s.

Inspector Permanent Way:—Minimum salary of First Class Inspector plus an allowance at the rate of £55 per annum whilst on the job.

Clerical Staff (Salaried):—Minimum of Fifth Class or classified salary, whichever is the greater, plus an allowance at the rate of £55 per annum.
