1.—Payment of Interest on Capital.

(1) All dues, charges, rents, and other moneys levied and collected by the Commissioners under section 58 of the Act shall, after payment thereof of all fees, salaries, and wages, and other expenditure lawfully incurred by the Commissioners be charged with the payment to the Treasurer of interest in respect of the value of property from time to time vested in or charged against the Commissioners under section 56 or section 57 of the said Act, at such rate as shall be determined annually from time to time by the Governor in Council. This regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1937, so that interest shall be charged at the rate hereinbefore mentioned as from the 1st day of January, 1937.

(2) For the purpose of this regulation, interest shall commence to accrue from the 1st day of the financial year next following the date when such property is charged to the Commissioners.

2.—Provision for Sinking Fund.

As from the 1st day of July, 1937, the Commissioners shall make payment to the Treasury as a contribution in each and every year towards sinking fund as follows:—

7s. 6d. per cent. on the balance of indebtedness owing on Loan Capital Account as at the 30th day of June, 1927, and 10s. per cent. on all capital indebtedness incurred since the last-mentioned date: Provided that, in assessing the contribution on capital indebtedness at 7s. 6d. per cent. and 10s. per cent. abovementioned, credit shall be given for any repayments made from time to time, and 4½ per cent. on the amount by which the capital indebtedness of the Commissioners has been reduced as the result of sinking fund contributions since the 1st day of July, 1927.

3.—Provision for Replacement of Fund.

The Commissioners shall pay the Treasury the sum of £2,000 per annum as a provision for a replacement fund, to be invested in such manner as the Treasurer may think fit.

Charge of 2s. per hour for the purpose of decorating the hall if such is done at night.

Trestles may be hired at 2s. 6d. per day, including seats, 3s. per day, the hire charge to be paid before taking delivery, and, if such furniture is not returned within three days, the above charges to be doubled.

Glasses may be hired at 6d. per dozen and a deposit of 5s. is required to be left with the caretaker prior to the hirer taking same, to cover possible breakages.

The Committee is empowered to determine whether certain local bodies desiring the use of the hall for meetings in the interest of the district shall be granted such use of hall free of charge, but it is stipulated that no charge or collection shall be made by the users of the hall on such occasions.

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906-1938.

City of Fremantle.

A by-law of the City of Fremantle, made under section 180 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-38, and numbered 151, restricting the breaking in of horses and the driving of cattle in and along the streets of the City of Fremantle.

P.W. 1331/34.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-38, the Mayor and Councillors of the city of Fremantle order as follows:—

1. Between the hours of 7 a.m. and 12 o'clock midnight, during the months of May, June, July, August, and September, or between the hours of 6 a.m. and 12 o'clock midnight, during the months of October, November, December, January, February, March, and April—

(a) no unbroken horses shall be led, ridden, or driven along the streets of the city of Fremantle;

(b) no cattle or camels shall be driven along the streets of the city of Fremantle.

Provided that nothing in this by-law contained shall restrict or prohibit the conducting or leading by any sufficient halter, reins, or other appliance of any horse or any milch cow along the said streets during the beforementioned hours.

- Any person who shall drive, conduct, or lead or cause to be driven, conducted, or led any unbroken horse or any cattle or camels in, along, or across the streets of the city of Fremantle contrary to the provisions of this by-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds (£10) for every such offence.
- All existing by-laws of the city of Fremantle dealing with the matters mentioned in this by-law are hereby repealed.
