FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with, or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937.

Prohibited Periods.

 HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to declare, under section 8 of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, that it shall be unlawful to set fire to the bush in Gingin Road District during the periods set out hereunder and to approve of the suspension of the operation of such prohibition, so far as it extends to the Midland Railway Reserve, for the period extending to the 21st December, 1939, inclusive:—

Gingin Road District:—(1) All that portion of the district lying within three miles of the coastline—15th November, 1939, to 1st January, 1940; (2) that portion of the district starting on the east boundary of the district at a point opposite Boongarra and running due west along the north boundary of the Midland Railway Company's Location No. 1373 to Boonanarring Brook; thence southward along a road and the west boundary of Location No. 128 and from the south-west corner of the said location in a southerly direction to the south boundary of Location 2581 and from there due east to the railway line; thence in a southerly direction along the railway line to the extreme south boundary of the district, then following the south boundary to the eastern boundary and from there back to the starting point opposite Boongarra, along the east boundary of the district—15th November, 1939, to 7th March, 1940; (3) within the boundaries of Gingin Townsite—1st December, 1939, to 15th February, 1940; (4) balance of district—15th November, 1939, to 15th February, 1940.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1938, that for the purposes of the said Act, the word "Town" or "Townsite" means and includes *inter alia* any land (including privately owned subdivided land) which the Governor may see fit, as he is hereby empowered, to declare by Proclamation to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas all that land situate within the Perth Road District, and more particularly described, defined, and delineated in the Schedule hereto, is land which the Governor may by virtue of section 5 of the said Act declare by Proclamation to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Act, and for all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do hereby declare that all that land situate within the Perth Road District, and more particularly described, defined, and delineated in the Schedule hereto shall be a Townsite, to be known as "Joondanna Heights," within the meaning and for the purpose of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1938.

Joondanna Heights.

All that portion of Osborne Ward of the Perth Road District bounded on the south by portion of the common boundary between the Perth Road District and the City of Perth as now constituted or as may be afterwards amended, on the west by the western side of Main street, on the north by the northern side of Balcatta Beach road (also known as Curtis street), and on the east by the eastern side of Wanneroo road, and, in addition, all allotments and parcels of land outside the previously specified area which have a frontage to either Main street, The Plaza, Balcatta Beach road, or Wanneroo road. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,
TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Profiteering Prevention Act, 1939, that the Governor may from time to time, on the report and advice of the Commissioner of Prices under section 11 of the said Act, fix and declare the maximum price at which any commodity may be sold, and may by a subsequent Proclamation revoke or vary any such Proclamation: And whereas by Proclamation issued under the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th day of October, 1939, the Governor fixed and declared the maximum price that was to be charged from time to time upon any sale of commodities declared under section 6 of the said Act by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of even date to be commodities to which the said Act applied: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to vary the said Proclamation fixing and declaring the prices as aforesaid: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting

with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the report and advice of the Commissioner of Prices aforesaid, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me in that behalf by section 13 of the said Act, do hereby vary the Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th day of October, 1939, fixing and declaring the maximum prices at which commodities to which the Profiteering Prevention Act, 1939, applies may be sold, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder, and do hereby declare that this Proclamation may be cited as the Profiteering Prevention Act, 1939, Proclamation Number 3.

SCHEDULE.

1. Paragraph 2 of the said Proclamation is varied as follows:—

(a) by inserting after subparagraph (a) thereof a new subparagraph, to stand as subparagraph (ai) as follows:—

(ai) Where after the prescribed date a trader has received or receives new stock substantially identical in quality with stock sold by him prior to the prescribed date, but of which none remained unsold on the prescribed date, the maximum price for sale of the new stock shall, with the approval of the Commissioner first obtained, be the sum that represents the cost of such new stock plus gross profit thereon calculated on the same basis as that on which gross profit had been calculated by the trader on substantially identical old stock sold before the prescribed date.

(b) by inserting after subparagraph (c) thereof a new subparagraph (d), as follows:—

(d) Provided that it shall be regarded as compliance with subparagraphs (a), (ai), (b), and (c) of this paragraph if a trader proves to the satisfaction of the Commissioner that for the purposes of ascertaining the maximum selling price the quantity and value of old stock in the Commonwealth of Australia and the quantity and value of new stock in the Commonwealth of Australia possessed by that trader or by any group of traders approved by the Commissioner have been taken into consideration.

2. Paragraph 3 of the said Proclamation is varied by inserting after subparagraph (a) thereof a new subparagraph, to stand as subparagraph (ai), as follows:—

(ai) Where after the prescribed date a trader has received or receives new stock substantially identical in quality with stock sold by him prior to the prescribed date, but of which none remained unsold on the prescribed date, the maximum price for sale of the new stock shall, with the approval of the Commissioner first obtained, be the sum that represents the cost of such new stock plus gross profit thereon calculated on the same basis as that on which gross profit had been calculated by the trader on substantially identical old stock sold before the prescribed date.

3. Paragraph 4 of the said Proclamation is varied by inserting after subparagraph (a) thereof a new subparagraph, to stand as subparagraph (ai), as follows:—

(ai) Where after the prescribed date a manufacturer manufactures commodities substantially identical in quality with stock sold by him prior to the prescribed date, but of which none remained unsold on the prescribed date, the maximum price for sale of the new stock shall, with the approval of the Commissioner first obtained, be the sum that represents the cost of such new stock plus gross profit thereon calculated on the same basis as that on which gross profit had been calculated by the trader on substantially identical old stock sold before the prescribed date.
