WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1938, that for the purposes of the said Act, the word "Town" or "Townsite" means and includes, *inter alia*, any land (including privately owned subdivided land) which the Governor may see fit, as he is hereby empowered, to declare by Proclamation to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas all that land situate within the Mundaring Road District and more particularly described, defined, and delineated in the Schedules A and B hereto, is land which the Governor may by virtue of section 5 of the said Act declare by Proclamation to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council

and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Act, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do hereby declare that all that land situate within the Mundaring Road District and more particularly described, defined, and delineated in the Schedules A and B hereto, shall be Townsites, to be known as "Darlington" and "Greenmount" respectively, within the meaning and for the purpose of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1938.

## SCHEDULE A.

## Darlington Townsite.

Bounded on the northward by a line commencing at the north-west corner of Greenmount Suburban Lot 220 and extending east along its north boundary, north along part of the west and east along north boundary of Swan Location 951, north along part of the west and east along the north boundary of Lot 61 and continuing east along the north boundaries of Lots 53, 52, 51, and 50 to the north-east corner of the last-mentioned; bounded on the eastward by a line commencing at the north-east corner of Lot 50 and extending south along its east boundary and the east boundary of Lot 57, east along part of the south boundary of Glen Forrest Lot 123 to the production north of the west boundary of Location 1264, south along said production and west boundary of Location 1264 to its south-west corner, eastward along the southern boundary of Location 1264, and part of the southern boundary of Location 1245 to the production north of the west boundary of Location 1268, south along said production and said boundary of Location 1268 to the production west of the north boundary of Lot 19, east along said production and north boundary of Lot 19 and north boundaries of Lots 368-373 inclusive, and south along east boundaries of Lots 373, 374, 18, 21, and 22 to the south-east corner of the last-mentioned; bounded on the southward by a line commencing at the south-east corner of Lot 22 and extending west along its south boundary and the south boundaries of Lots 23, 24, 27, 28, 35, and 36 and part of the eastern and the southern boundaries of Lot 218 to the south-west corner of the last-mentioned; bounded on the westward by lines commencing at the south-western corner of Lot 218 and extending north along its west boundary to the south boundary of Lot 219, west along part of the south and north along the west boundary of Lot 219 and the west boundaries of Locations 1247, 1248, and Lot 220 to the starting point.

## Greenmount Townsite.

All that piece and parcel of land bounded on the northward by a line commencing at the intersection of a northern boundary of the Midland Junction Municipality with a southern side of the Mahogany Creek Deviation Railway Reserve and extending in an easterly direction along said side of railway reserve and the northern side of Road No. 6623 to the east boundary of Swan Location 16; on the eastward by a line commencing at the last-mentioned point and extending south along said boundary of Location 16 to the south-west corner of Reserve No. 21081; on the southward and westward by a line commencing at the south-west corner of said Reserve No. 21081 and extending west along part of the south boundary of said Location 16, and in a general north-westerly direction along an eastern side of the Eastern Goldfields Railway Reserve to the east side of Ruby street; thence northward and westward along part of the Midland Junction Municipal boundary to the starting point.

## Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 15 of the Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938, that the Governor may from time to time, on the recommendation

of the Wheat Products Prices Committee as constituted by the said Act by Proclamation, fix minimum and maximum prices at which substances included in the definition of flour or in the definition of wheat products may be sold in the State, or in any specified part of the State, by any person, and that the Governor may from time to time revoke or vary any Proclamation issued under the said section by a subsequent Proclamation: And whereas the Governor, under and in accordance with the said section, fixed certain prices, *inter alia*, in respect of bran and pollard, being substances included in the definition of wheat products, by a Proclamation dated the 31st day of August, 1939, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 31st day of August, 1939, which Proclamation has not been revoked and is still in force: And whereas it is now deemed expedient to vary the said Proclamation in the manner hereinafter mentioned, with the intent that such Proclamation as so varied shall continue in force and have effect: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in accordance with the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee aforesaid, and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby vary the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned dated the 31st day of August, 1939, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 31st day of August, 1939, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder; and also declare that the said Proclamation as varied by this present Proclamation shall continue in force and effect until revoked or further varied by a subsequent Proclamation: And that this present Proclamation shall have effect as from and after the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

Schedule.

1. In subparagraph (i) of paragraph (B) of clause 1 of the said Proclamation relating to brand sold in any part of the State, the amount “£5 0s. 0d.” is deleted and the amount “£4 10s. 0d.” is inserted in lieu thereof.

2. In subparagraph (i) of paragraph (C) of clause 1 of the said Proclamation relating to pollard sold in any part of the State, the amount “£4 10s. 0d.” is deleted and the amount “£4 0s. 0d.” is inserted in lieu thereof.

3. In the Schedule to the said Proclamation the prices stated in the second column under the heading “Bran, Price on Rails at Station,” and the prices stated in the third column under the heading “Pollard, Price on Rails at Station,” shall be and are hereby all and each and every one of them reduced by the sum of ten shillings.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 6 of the Profiteering Prevention Act, 1939, that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation declare commodities to which the said Act shall apply: And whereas by Proclamation issued under the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th day of October, 1939, certain commodities were declared as commodities to which the said Act applied: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to add to such commodities declared as aforesaid “All goods, wares, and merchandise”: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred upon me in that behalf by section 6 of the said Act, do hereby declare that, in addition to the commodities declared as commodities to which the said Act shall apply by Proclamation issued under the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th day of October, 1939, “All goods, wares, and

merchandise” shall be declared as commodities to which the Profiteering Prevention Act, 1939, shall apply, and whereas it is provided by section 13 of the said Act that the Governor may from time to time, on the report and advice of the Commissioner of Prices, under section 11 of the said Act, by Proclamation fix and declare for any commodity the maximum price at which it may be sold: And whereas by Proclamation issued under the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th day of October, 1939, and subsequently varied by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th day of November, 1939, and cited as the Profiteering Prevention Act Proclamation Number 3, I fixed and declared the maximum price that was to be charged upon any sale of commodities declared under section 6 of the said Act by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th day of October, 1939, to be commodities to which the said Act shall apply: And whereas the Commissioner of Prices under section 11 of the said Act has reported and advised that the maximum price that may be charged upon the sale of “All goods, wares, and merchandise” as declared aforesaid by this Proclamation should be fixed and declared: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and on the report of the Commissioner of Prices aforesaid and in exercise of the power conferred upon me in that behalf by section 13 of the said Act, do hereby fix and declare that the maximum price that may be charged upon the sale of “All goods, wares, and merchandise” as declared aforesaid, shall be as set out in the Schedule to the Proclamation issued under the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th day of October, 1939, and as varied by the Profiteering Prevention Act Proclamation Number 3, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th day of November, 1939: And do hereby declare that this Proclamation may be cited as the Profiteering Prevention Act, 1939, Proclamation Number 4.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 3 of the Marketing of Onions Act, 1938, that if, on the taking of a poll in accordance with subsection (1) of the said section, more than three-fifths of the votes polled are in favour of the constitution of a Board under the said Act, the Governor may by a subsequent Proclamation declare that a Board, to be known as “The Western Australian Onion Marketing Board,” shall be constituted, and may thereby appoint a day for the election by growers of the elective members who shall sit on the Board: And whereas on the taking of a poll recently, in accordance with subsection (1) of section 3 of the said Act more than three-fifths of the votes polled were in favour of the constitution of a Board as aforesaid: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by subsection (2) of section 3 of the said Act, do hereby declare that a Board, to be known as “The Western Australian Onion Marketing Board,” shall be and is hereby constituted under and for the purposes of the said Act, and appoint the twenty-second day of December, 1939, for the election by growers of the first elective members who shall sit on the said Board.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1938, the Board of any Road District is empowered to make by-laws for all or any of the purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Melville Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

(1) Where any land which adjoins or abuts upon any road within any portion of the Board's district is not fenced in or enclosed to the satisfaction of the Board, or the fence thereof has been allowed to fall into disrepair, the Board may from time to time by writing under the hand of the secretary of the Board, order such land, so far as the same adjoins or abuts upon any road, to be enclosed with a substantial fence of the description and materials hereinafter set forth.

(2) The owner of the said land, after due service on him of such order, shall in such manner and in such time as shall be expressed therein, at his own cost, well and sufficiently fence so much thereof as abuts upon any road, to the satisfaction of the Board.

(3) All fences which the Board shall order to be erected under the provisions of these by-laws, unless constructed of stone or brick or a composite of stone or brick or concrete and wrought metal, or otherwise constructed in conformity with the plan and specification previously submitted to and approved by the Board, shall be constructed wholly of sawn jarrah timber, and to the following specifications:—

Posts not less than 6in. x 3in. in section, not less than 4 feet out of the ground and 2½ feet in the ground, nor more than 6 feet out of the ground, nor less than one-third of the total length in the ground, and placed 8 feet centres, the tops to be properly aligned, two rails to each panel of not less than 4in. x 2in. in cross section, and covered with pickets 3in. wide, and not less than ¾ of an inch thick, spaced 2 inches apart. The whole to be constructed to the satisfaction of the secretary of the Board.

(4) Any person failing to comply with any order made under these by-laws, or offending against any of the provisions of these by-laws, shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

be laid weekly for each 1,000 acres or part thereof owned or occupied.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-38, the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in that portion of Western Australian waters described in the Schedule hereto by means of a fishing line known or described as "long line" or "set line," from the date of publication hereof, until further notice.

The whole of the waters of Warnbro' Sound (Safety Bay), including the waters surrounding the offshore rocks and islets, bounded on the north by a line drawn from Mersey Point and extending seawards to a position one mile west of that Point; thence by a line drawn in a generally southerly direction to a position one and one-half miles west of Becher Point; thence by a line drawn in an easterly direction to the said Becher Point.
