WHEREAS it is provided by the Game Act, 1912-13, that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof, and that the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operations of any such declaration under the said Act any defined locality: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 30th day of July, 1924, it is provided that the portions of the State and localities defined in the Schedule thereto shall be a Reserve for Grey Kangaroos, known scientifically as *Mac-*

*ropus giganteus*: And whereas it is desirable to exempt from the operations of the said Proclamation a defined locality: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, exempt from the operations of the aforesaid Proclamation and the declaration contained therein all those localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto as from the 1st day of January, 1940, until the 31st day of March, 1940.

#### Schedule.

All that part of the Gingin Road District lying to the west of the Midland Railway line.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 25 of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1910-1937, as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938, that the Governor may by Proclamation declare any article to be a poison within the meaning of the said Act, and may revoke or vary any Proclamation made under the said section by a subsequent Proclamation: And whereas the Governor has under and in accordance with the said section from time to time proclaimed certain articles to be poisons as aforesaid: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to add to such poisons declared as aforesaid: Now therefore I the said Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and

in exercise of the power conferred upon me in that behalf by section 25 of the said Act do hereby declare that the article specified in the Schedule hereunder shall be deemed a poison within the meaning of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1910-1937, and that the name thereof shall be inserted in Part 11 of the Fifth Schedule to the said Act.

Schedule.

The description of the article declared aforesaid as a poison and to be inserted in Part 11 of the Fifth Schedule to the Act is as follows: Metaldehyde, its preparations and admixtures thereof.

PROCLAMATION

Lieutenant-Governor. } and its Dependencies in the Common-  
[L.S.] } wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-38, it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit, inter alia, all persons from—(a) Taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of any year: And whereas the "Prawn" is a prescribed species of fish within the meaning of this provision: And whereas by section 17 of the same Act the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule shall be closed against the taking of "Prawns" by means of any net other than a hand-scoop net (such net not to exceed a total length of nine feet upon either the cork line or lead line) from the 1st day of January, 1940, until the 31st day of December, 1940, inclusive; and, further, that any net which does not exceed 25 fathoms in length and has a mesh throughout the whole of the net of not less than one-half inch measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall be a lawful net when used or intended to be used for the capture of "Prawns" in any Western Australian waters except those portions defined in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule.

That portion of the Swan River extending in a westerly and southerly direction downwards to its entrance at Fremantle from a line drawn from the Point Walter Jetty (Walter Point) to Point Resolution, and the Swan River and its tributaries extending upwards in a northerly and north-easterly direction to its head from the Narrows at Mill Point.

That portion of the Canning River and its tributaries upwards to its head from the Lower Canning Bridge.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-38, it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from—(a) Taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture; (b) Taking any fish whatsoever by any specified means of capture; (c) Taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of any year: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the power aforesaid and of any other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a term of three (3) years as from and inclusive of the 1st day of January, 1940, provided that nets of not more than fifty (50) yards in length, and with meshes of not less than three (3) inches, may be used in the said waters from the 1st day of December in each year until the 30th day of April in the succeeding year.

Moore River (the whole):—Situate about 45 miles north of Fremantle.

Constitution of Health District at Kellerberrin under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-37.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-37, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute any portion of the State not being a Municipal District, to be a Health District, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the order: And whereas it is desired to constitute a Health District with the boundaries and under the name hereinafter specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute the area of land embraced in the undermentioned boundaries a Health District under the provisions of the said Act, such District to be styled the Kellerberrin Health District.

Sandalwood Act, 1929.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 2 of the Sandalwood Act, 1929, the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council, limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period therein stated: And whereas it is desirable to limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period from the 1st day of December, 1939, to the 29th

day of February, 1940, to 360 tons: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period from the 1st day of December, 1939, to the 29th day of February, 1940, to 360 tons, exclusive of sandalwood required for oil distillation purposes within the State.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council hereby makes the following Order under the authority of section 48 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1935, namely, that in pursuance of clause (b) of paragraph (vii) of subsection (1) of section 46 of the said Act the Marradong Road Board is hereby empowered to make by-laws prohibiting the passage of heavy or obstructive traffic over any specified road, either generally or during certain months of the year.

Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1939—Harvey  
No. 3 Irrigation District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 8/39.

WHEREAS by the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1939, it is provided that the Governor may on the recommendation of the Minister acting with the advice of the Commissioners appointed under the said Act by Order in Council constitute any defined part of the State an Irrigation District for the purposes of the said Act; specify the boundaries of such district; assign a name to such district; state the particulars of the scheme of local works for the service of such district; state the estimated cost of such scheme; and state the quantities of water assigned to such district, and the sources from which, the seasons at which, and the conditions under which and subject to which they are to be received: Now, therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor by and with the advice of the Executive Council on the recommendation of the Minister acting with the advice of the said Commissioner doth hereby:—(a) Constitute that portion of the State defined in the Schedule hereto an Irrigation District for the purpose of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1939, with the boundaries set forth in the said Schedule; (b) Assign the name of "Harvey No. 3 Irrigation District" to such district; (c) State the particulars of the scheme of local works for the service of the said District as follows:—Construction of the necessary Storage Reservoir, Supply Channels, Flumes, Stops, Bridges, etc.; (d) State the estimated cost of such scheme at £808,000 of which £493,000 is incurred for supply and distribution of water in Harvey No. 3 Irrigation District. (e) State the quantity of water assigned to the district and the sources from which, and the seasons at which, and the conditions under which, and subject to which they are to be received as follows:—Such portion as may be legally available and assigned for irrigation within the Harvey No. 3 Irrigation District of the summer flow of the Harvey River with the water from time to time conserved in storage reservoirs on the Harvey River, such water to be taken as required throughout the year; (f) Declare that this Order in Council shall take effect as from the 22nd day of December, 1939.

The Schedule.

All that portion or parcel of land bounded by lines commencing at the junction of the western boundary of Wellington Location 3048 with the northern bank of the Northern Contour Channel and proceeding in a general westerly direction, following the said northern bank of the said Northern Contour Channel to a point on the Armadale-Pemberton road, on the western boundary of Korijekup Estate Lot 60; thence in a general northerly direction along the eastern bank of the aforesaid North-

ern Contour Channel to Weekes Brook; thence crossing the said Weekes Brook and continuing in a general northerly direction along the eastern bank of the aforesaid Northern Contour Channel to Clarke Brook; thence crossing the said Clarke Brook and continuing in a general northerly direction along the eastern bank of the aforesaid Northern Contour Channel to Logue Brook; thence crossing the said Logue Brook and continuing in a general northerly direction along the eastern bank of the aforesaid Northern Contour Channel through the townsite of Wagerup to Wagerup Brook; thence crossing the said Wagerup Brook and continuing northerly along the eastern bank of the aforesaid Northern Contour Channel to Bancells Brook; thence crossing the said Bancells Brook and continuing in a general northerly direction along the eastern bank of the aforesaid Northern Contour Channel to Yalup Brook; thence crossing the said Yalup Brook to its northern bank and proceeding in a general westerly direction along the said northern bank of the aforesaid Yalup Brook crossing the Armadale-Pemberton road, and the South-Western Railway to the Eastern boundary of Wellington road; thence continuing westerly, crossing Harvey Agricultural Area Lot 150 to a point situate on the western boundary of the said Lot 150 at the junction of Samson Brook South Drain with Brockman road; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of the said Brockman road crossing Murray road and continuing to a point opposite to the north-eastern corner of Harvey Agricultural Area Lot 203; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the said Lot 203 to its north-western corner thence southerly along the western boundary of the aforesaid Lot 203 and the western boundary of Lot 324 to its south-western corner thence easterly along the southern boundary of the said Lot 324 to a point opposite to the north-western corner of Wellington Location 1019 thence southerly crossing Bancell road and proceeding along the western boundary of the said Location 1019 and the western boundary of Wellington Location 303, crossing Bagot road to the northern boundary of Harvey Agricultural Area Lot 95 thence westerly along the northern boundary of the said Lot 95 to its north-western corner, thence southerly along the eastern boundary of Harvey road to the south-western corner of Harvey Agricultural Lot 104, thence westerly, crossing the said Harvey road and proceeding along the northern boundary of Harvey Agricultural Area Lot 109 to its north-western corner, thence southerly along the eastern boundary of a surveyed road to Clarke Brook Drain thence proceeding south, crossing the said Clarke Brook Drain Riverdale road, Thomson road and the Harvey Main Drain Reserve to the north-eastern corner of Wellington Location 3164 thence westerly along the northern boundary of the said Location 3164 and proceeding across Jackson road to the north-eastern boundary of Uduc Agricultural Area Lot 53, thence proceeding north-westerly to the most northerly angle of the said Lot 53, thence westerly across Babbage road and southerly along the western boundary of Babbage road to and across Smith road to the north-eastern corner of the Uduc Agricultural Area Lot 41 to junction with the northern boundary of Harvey No. 2 Irrigation District at the aforesaid corner, thence generally easterly and southerly following the said boundary of the aforesaid Harvey No. 2 Irrigation District as described by an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* dated the 10th day of June, 1932, and as amended by Orders-in-Council published in the *Government Gazette* dated the 31st day of July, 1936, and the 23rd day of October, 1936, to its junction with the boundary of the Harvey No. 1 Irrigation District, thence easterly generally along the boundary of the said Harvey No. 1 Irrigation District as described by an Order-in-Council published in the *Government Gazette* dated the 24th day of December, 1914, and as amended by an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* dated the 13th day of July, 1917; to the western boundary of Wellington Location 3048, thence northerly along the said boundary, crossing the Northern Contour Channel to the point of commencement.

Commencing again at the Top Water Level of the Harvey Reservoir at the eastern extremity of Harvey No. 2 Irrigation District near Road No. 2401 and proceeding upstream in a general southerly and easterly direction through Wellington Location 50 embracing the bed of the Harvey River up to and including the whole of the proposed Stirling Reservoir Basin.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 4 of the Dairy Cattle Compensation Act, 1926, that the said Act shall apply only in those portions of the State comprised within districts defined from time to time for the purposes of the said Act by an order in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, and that any such Order in Council may, by a subsequent order, be altered or revoked: And whereas by Order in Council made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th day of November, 1927, a district was defined as aforesaid: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to revoke such Order in Council and to define a new district as aforesaid: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council pursuant to section 4 of the Dairy Cattle Compensation Act, 1926, doth hereby by this Order in Council revoke the Order in Council made under the said Act and published in the *Government*

*Gazette* on the 11th day of November, 1937 and doth hereby order that such portion of the State as is defined in the Schedule hereunder shall be a district to which the said Act shall apply.

## Schedule.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the sea shore situate West of the 12 Mile Post on the Wanneroo road and extending east passing through said mile post to the Meridian of 116 degrees 3 minutes of east Longitude; thence south along said meridian to a point east of a point situate one mile south of the centre of the Kelmscott Railway Station; thence west passing through the said point to the sea shore, and thence generally northerly along said sea shore to the starting point.

### THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

#### Health By-laws—Amendment.

P.H.D. 515/39.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1937, a Local Health Authority may make by-laws and may amend, repeal or alter any by-law so made: Now, therefore, the Council of the City of Perth, being a Local Health Authority, doth hereby order that the by-laws made by it under the said Act and gazetted on the 24th day of December, 1925, be amended as follows:—

Part I. is amended by the deletion of paragraphs (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) of clause 15 (1) and by the insertion of new paragraphs in lieu thereof as follows:—

(b) It shall be at least four feet in diameter and five feet in depth. It shall be lined with bricks laid with open joints the top two courses to be built in cement mortar and shall be provided with an impervious cover of 9in. x 3in. jarrah or 2in. reinforced concrete which shall have above it at least twelve inches of soil. Where jarrah is used for covering the joints shall be covered with Malthead or sheet iron.

(c) The house fittings shall be of a type approved of and tested by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Department and all such fittings shall be discharged over an open gully provided with a water-sealed trap.

(d) From such trap liquid wastes shall be conducted direct to the soak well by means of an earthenware drain, circular in shape, and at least four inches in diameter and laid with a proper fall.

The drain shall be ventilated in accordance with the by-laws and practices of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Department.

(e) The soak well shall be ventilated by means of a four-inch vent of an approved type.

(f) Where there is a series of more than one soak well, the earthenware drain from the house shall connect with only one of such wells, and the connection between the well into which the connection discharges and subsequent wells shall be by means of a long square, and the inlet and outlet pipes at a height of not less than three feet from the bottom of the respective wells.

Amendment of Health By-laws.

P.H.D. 1227/30.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1937, a Local Health Authority may make by-laws, and may amend, repeal, or alter any by-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Council of the City of Fremantle, being the Local Health Authority of the Municipality of the City of Fremantle, doth hereby order that the by-laws made by it under the said Act and gazetted 2nd August, 1935, be amended as follows:—

## Part VII.—Food.

Add after clause 14, the following by-law:—

14a. (1) No person shall sell or permit to be sold any food in or from any shop, stall, or barrow for the purpose of being carried away from such shop, stall or barrow, unless such food is wrapped or packed so as to be protected from contamination.

(2) When paper is used for such wrapping or packing, only clean new white or brown paper shall be used, and such paper shall have no writing or printing thereon, except upon the outside thereof: Provided that vegetables, including salad vegetables, may be wrapped in clean newspaper obtained direct from the publisher thereof and not previously sold or used for any purpose.

Amend by-law 12 by deleting in the fourth line the words "nine inches" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "two feet" in respect of the above.

SUPERANNUATION AND FAMILY BENEFITS ACT, 1938-1939.

Regulations.

- These regulations may be cited as the Superannuation Regulations.
- These regulations are divided into Parts as follows:—
  - Part I. *rr* 3 to 5—Preliminary.
  - Part II. *rr* 6 to 13—Election by employees to become contributors or qualified contributors.
  - Part III. *rr* 14 to 18—Times for certain elections by contributors.
  - Part IV. *rr* 19 to 33—General.
  - Part V. *rr* 34 to 39—Financial.
  - Part VI. *rr* 40 to 56—Election by contributors of a candidate for appointment as a member of the Board.
  - Part VII. *rr* 57 and 58—Appeals.
  - First Appendix—Forms.
  - Second Appendix—Rates of contributions by qualified contributors.
  - Third Appendix—Lump sum credits scale.

Part I.—Preliminary.

- In the regulations, unless the contrary intention appears:—
  - “the Act” means the Superannuation and Family Benefits Act, 1938-1939.
  - “the Board” means the Superannuation Board constituted under the Act.

“the Fund” means the Superannuation Fund established under the Act.  
 “Railways and Tramways Endowment Fund” means the Endowment Section of the Western Australian Government Railways and Tramways Employees’ Death Benefit and Endowment Fund as established and administered under the authority of section 63A of the Government Railways Act, 1904-1933.

4. Where an employee of the kind referred to in subsection (1a) of section 35 of the Act elects to become a contributor or a qualified contributor, the rate of the contribution payable by him shall be the rate prescribed for that age which is also the maximum age for retirement of such employee.

5. The period over which an employee governed by regulation 4 hereof shall pay twenty-six periodical payments of contributions as provided for in paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 35 of the Act shall commence as from the first day of July, 1939.

*Part II.—Election by Employees to become Contributors or Qualified Contributors.*

6. An employee who is employed in the Service at the commencement of the Act and wishes to become a contributor as provided for in section 31 of the Act shall give notice of his election to become a contributor in the Form No. 1 in the First Appendix to these regulations.

7. An employee whose employment commences after the commencement of this Act and who wishes to become a contributor as provided for in section 31 of the Act shall give notice of his election to become a contributor in the Form No. 2 in the First Appendix to these regulations.

8. An employee in the Service at the commencement of the Act who wishes to become a qualified contributor as provided for in section 33 of the Act shall give notice of his election to become a qualified contributor in the Form No. 3 in the First Appendix to these regulations.

9. The form of election from every employee in the Police Department who elects to become a contributor under the Act shall be accompanied by an application under subsection (2) of section 32 of the Act in regard to the disposal of moneys payable out of the Police Benefit Fund for his benefit. Such application shall be in the Form No. 4 in the First Appendix to these regulations.

10. Every application made to the Board by a contributor under this Act who is also a contributor to the Railways and Tramways Endowment Fund in accordance with subsection (3) of section 32 of the Act or under section 78 of the Act shall be in the Form No. 5 in the First Appendix to these regulations.

11. Applications under section 76 and section 77 of the Act in regard to life assurance policies shall be in the Form No. 6, 7 or 8 in the First Appendix to these regulations or in such other form as the Board may from time to time require.

12. Every contributor and every qualified contributor shall, if and when required by the Board so to do and whether in connection with his election to become a contributor or a qualified contributor or in connection with any other matter within the provisions of the Act, furnish to the Board in such form as the Board may specify documentary proof of his own age, and, if he has married, of his marriage, and of the age of his wife and of the ages of his children (if any).

13. The form of election from every employee (whether as a contributor or as a qualified contributor) who has not been in the service of the State for ten years and has not been required as a condition of his employment to pass a medical examination shall be accompanied by a certificate from a duly qualified medical practitioner in accordance with section 34 of the Act.

*Part III.—Times for Certain Elections by Contributors.*

14. Subject to the Act, the time within which an employee, to whom subsection (4) of section 36 of the Act applies, may, in accordance with the said subsection, apply to the Board to reduce the number of units in respect of which he shall contribute, shall be six months from the date of the commencement of his employment.

15. (1) Subject to the Act, the time within which a contributor, to whom paragraph (a) of subsection (5) of section 36 of the Act applies, may elect to increase the amount of his contribution as authorised by the said paragraph (a), shall be two months from the date upon which payment of his salary at the increased rate is approved, or from the date upon which such increased salary becomes payable, whichever is the later.

(2) Subject to the Act, the time within which a contributor, to whom the proviso to subsection (5) of section 36 of the Act applies, may apply to the Board to increase the number of units or to continue contributing for the same number of units, as the case may be, shall be two months from the date of the declaration of the basic wage affecting the salary of the contributor; but the adjustment, if any, in the number of units shall operate from the date upon which the salary of the contributor was affected by the said declaration.

(3) Every such application shall be in writing signed by the applicant and shall be in such form as the Board may from time to time require.

16. The further time to be prescribed within the meaning and for the purposes of subparagraph (b) of paragraph (ii) of the proviso to paragraph (b) of subsection (6) of section 36 of the Act shall be that period which ends on the 31st day of January, 1940.

17. The time within which a contributor, to whom subsection (7) of section 36 of the Act applies, may elect to contribute for a limited number of units as authorised by the said subsection (7) shall be that period which ends on the 31st day of January, 1940.

18. (1) Subject to the Act, the time within which a contributor, to whom section 38 of the Act applies, may apply to the Board to reduce the number of units of pension in respect of which he shall contribute as authorised by the said section 38, shall be two months from the date when the contributor is reduced to the lower salary group from the salary group upon which is based the number of units in respect of which he has been contributing.

(2) Where a contributor makes application under section 38 to the Board to reduce the number of units in respect of which he shall contribute as authorised by the said section, he shall state in his application whether he desires excess contributions then already paid by him to be credited towards a paid-up pension or to be refunded to him.

(3) Every such application shall be in writing signed by the applicant and shall be in such form as the Board may from time to time require.

(4) When the application of a contributor made under section 38 of the Act is approved by the Board, the reduction of units applied for and approved shall take effect as on and from the first salary pay day of the contributor next following the date of the approval by the Board as aforesaid.

*Part IV.—General.*

19. An employee who becomes a qualified contributor as provided for in section 33 of the Act, shall, as provided for in section 39 of the Act, contribute to the Fund at the appropriate rate set forth in the Table contained in the Second Appendix to these regulations.

20. Where an employee employed in the Police Department or an employee employed in the Government Railways and Tramways Department becomes a contributor and, by virtue of subsection (2) of section 32 of the Act in the case of an employee employed in the Police Department, or by virtue of subsection (3) of section 32 aforesaid in the case of an employee employed in the Government Railways and Tramways Department, the Board receives from the Police Benefit Fund or from the Railways and Tramways Endowment Fund a lump sum for the credit of the employee, the amount so received when the employee desires the same to be used to redeem forthwith future contributions which will be payable by him, shall be credited and so used in proportion to the amounts specified for the relative age as set out in Part 1 or in Part 2 of the Third Appendix to these regulations, as the case may require.

21. (1) Where under the Act a contributor or a qualified contributor is required to pay contributions to the Fund from a specified date, deductions from salary for the purposes of the payment of such contributions shall, unless otherwise expressly provided, commence on the first salary pay day next following after such specified date.

(2) Where under the Act an employee is required to contribute to the Fund from the date of the commencement of his employment, deductions from salary for the purposes of the payment of his contributions shall be made on or from the first salary pay day occurring during his employment.

(3) Each normal contribution and each salary pay-day shall relate to a Superannuation Fortnight, the first such fortnight being that commencing on the 1st day of July, 1939, the second on the 15th day of July, 1939, and so on.

22. (1) The total of each fortnightly payment of contributions payable by contributors and qualified contributors shall be balanced or reconciled with the total deductions from salary shown in the salary registers (or corresponding records) for the relative fortnight.

(2) In every instance in which the prescribed deduction is not made, the necessary adjustment, unless otherwise expressly provided, shall be made on the next succeeding payment of salary.

23. Where the amount of contribution payable includes a fraction of a penny amounting to a half-penny or more, the next higher penny shall be deducted from the salary or paid by the contributor or qualified contributor.

24. (1) A contributor or a qualified contributor who is absent through illness and is receiving less than full pay may, upon application to the Board, be allowed an extension of time for payment of contribution.

(2) Such application shall be in writing signed by the applicant or his agent when the applicant is unable to write, and shall be in such form as the Board may from time to time require.

25. (1) In the case of a contributor or a qualified contributor being granted leave of absence with pay, then, subject to any permission or allowance by the Board under Section 47 of the Act or regulation 24 hereof, the contributions payable by such contributor or qualified contributor during his said leave of absence shall be deducted from his salary in the same way as if he were not on leave of absence.

(2) In the case of a contributor or a qualified contributor being granted leave of absence without pay, then, subject to any permission or allowance by the Board as aforesaid, such contributor or qualified contributor shall either make payment in advance of the whole of the contributions which will become payable while he is on leave of absence as aforesaid, or otherwise make payment of contribution fortnightly during the time when he is on leave of absence as aforesaid on the days when, if he were not on leave of absence without pay as aforesaid, the amount of every such fortnightly payment of contribution would be deducted from his salary in accordance with the Act.

(3) If any contributor or qualified contributor to whom paragraph (2) of this regulation applies, fails or neglects punctually to make payment of contributions in compliance with the said paragraph (2), the Board may upon application in writing permit payment of the arrears and interest thereon in such sums and at such periods as it may approve. Where the Board has so authorised the payment of arrears and interest in instalments, all such arrears and interest thereon shall be paid before a pension is authorised.

(4) If any contributor or qualified contributor to whom paragraph (3) of this regulation applies fails or neglects to make application in accordance with the said paragraph (3) within one month of the date upon which the first unpaid contribution was due, he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

26. (1) Where a qualified contributor, whose employment in the Service ceases before he has reached his maximum age for retirement, wishes to continue to contribute to the Fund as provided for in section 48 of the Act, he shall give notice to the Board in accordance with Part I of the Form No. 9 in the First Appendix to these regulations.

(2) Any qualified contributor who, as provided for in sections 48 and 69 of the Act, wishes to discontinue payment of contributions and obtain from the Fund the amount of the contributions paid by him, shall give notice to the Board in accordance with Part 2 of the Form No. 9 in the First Appendix to these regulations.

(3) A qualified contributor continuing to contribute to the Fund after his employment in the Service has ceased shall be subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2), (3) and (4) of regulation 25 hereof in regard to the payment of contributions by a qualified contributor on leave without pay to the same extent as if he were a qualified contributor on leave without pay, and the said paragraphs (2), (3) and (4) of regulation 25 aforesaid shall be deemed, with such adaptations as may be necessary, to be incorporated with and form part of this regulation.

27. Where the wife of a qualified contributor dies during his life and while he is still liable to contribute to the Fund and there are no children under sixteen years of age surviving such wife, the qualified contributor may, after notice to the Board in writing and upon proof to the satisfaction of the Board of the death of his wife and of the fact that there are no children as aforesaid, discontinue the payment of further contributions to the Fund and receive out of the Fund such amount as upon the determination of the Board is a reasonable surrender value for contributions which he has made.

28. Upon the death of a contributor or of a qualified contributor, the Department in which the deceased was employed, if he were so employed, at the time of his death shall—in such form as the Board may from time to time require—notify the Board of such death, and, except in respect of outstanding or unpaid contributions, shall not thereafter deduct contributions from any subsequent payment of moneys accrued to the deceased to his legal representative or any other person.

29. (1) In each instance in which it is contemplated permanently terminating the services of an employee who is a contributor under the Act, owing to his condition of health (whether on account of accident or otherwise), the Department concerned shall furnish to the Board all available information in regard to the case (including the personal file of the employee) and shall obtain advice from the Board before notice in regard to termination of services is given to the employee.

(2) The conditions of retirement in relation to pension under section 57 of the Act and the commencing date for such pension or other benefit, shall, subject to the payment of a minimum of twenty-six contributions at the periodical rates applicable to the contributor, be determined by the Board according to the circumstances of the particular case.

(3) The time within which a contributor may make his choice under paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 57 of the Act and give notice thereof in writing to the Board shall be not later than one month after he is notified of his retirement. In default of such choice the Board shall determine in which form payment shall be made.

(4) The prescribed authority to be informed in accordance with section 74 of the Act of the condition of health of a pensioner to whom a pension under section 57 of the Act is being or is to be paid shall be the principal officer administering the department in which the pensioner was employed at the date of his retirement.

(5) The time within which a contributor may exercise the right to obtain a second medical report in accordance with the proviso to section 79 of the Act shall be fourteen days after the date of the communication from the Board notifying him of the tenor of the report of the medical officer appointed under section 79 for the purposes of the Act.

30. Every person in receipt of a pension under the Act, if and whenever called upon by the Board so to do, shall furnish to the satisfaction of the Board evidence of his (or her) continued right to such pension, and particularly—

- (a) that the person concerned is still alive
- (b) in the case of a widow, that the person concerned has not remarried; and
- (c) in the case of children, that they are still in the care of the person or persons to whom the pension is being paid on their behalf.

31. Before payment of pension is made, following the death of a contributor or of a qualified contributor, the Board shall be furnished with a certificate of death relating to the death of such contributor or qualified contributor; and also, unless the same has been previously furnished in accordance with these regulations, with documentary proof of marriage and of ages of the widow and of the children of the deceased, where the deceased was married and left a widow and children, or any such next-of-kin surviving him.

32. Any person who under the Act or these regulations is liable to furnish to the Board any information relating to any matter or thing in respect of which the Board in accordance with the Act or these regulations may require such information, and who, when furnishing such information, makes any statement or gives any particulars which is or are false, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

Penalty—Ten Pounds.

33. Any person who, in contravention of these regulations, does any act, matter or thing which by these regulations he is forbidden to do or fails, refuses or neglects to do any act, matter or thing which by these regulations he is required to do, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and where no penalty is particularly prescribed under these regulations for any such offence the person guilty of an offence under these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each such offence.

#### *Part V.—Financial.*

34. (1) All moneys deducted from salaries for the purposes of the Act and these regulations shall be brought to account and remitted each fortnight, within three days of the final pay-day in the Superannuation Fortnight provided for in Regulation 21, to the Receiver of Public Moneys, to whom the collections of the department making the said deductions are usually paid, for credit to the Fund.

(2) Each remittance of moneys made in accordance with paragraph (1) of this regulation shall be accompanied, unless the Board otherwise authorises, by statements in such form as may be required by the Board, setting out—

- (i) the deductions in relation to individual contributors or qualified contributors; and
- (ii) particulars of all terminations of employment, and the reasons therefor and all transfers of contributors or qualified contributors to and from other departments; and
- (iii) particulars of new contributors and of changes of salary of existing contributors; and
- (iv) any other information affecting the status or contributions of a contributor or qualified contributor employed in the department.

35. Pensions shall be paid fortnightly on each alternate Friday: Provided that in the event of the pension pay day falling on a public holiday, payment of pensions shall be made on the Thursday immediately preceding such public holiday.

36. The amount of pension in respect of one day shall be one-twelfth of the fortnightly amount of such pension as ascertained in accordance with section 70 of the Act.

37. Pensions shall be paid by means of cheques crossed "not negotiable" and made payable to order.

38. Cheques drawn on the Bank account or accounts of the Superannuation Fund shall be signed by the members and/or the officers of the Board as from time to time authorised by resolution of the Board.

39. On the first working day next following each fortnightly pension pay day, the total amount representing the proportion of pensions and other amounts payable by the State under the Act, as notified by the Board to the Under Treasurer of the State shall be paid by the Treasury Department to the Superannuation Fund.

*Part VI.—Election by Contributors of a Candidate for appointment as a Member of the Board.*

Appointment of Election Officials.

40. (1) For the purpose of the election of a contributor to be appointed a Member of the Superannuation Board, the Chief Electoral Officer for the State shall be the Returning Officer.

(2) The Returning Officer may, by writing under his hand, appoint a person to be his substitute, and may in like manner appoint persons to assist him or his substitute as Poll Clerks in the conduct of the election.

(3) The Returning Officer, the Substitute Returning Officer, and each Poll Clerk shall, before entering upon any of their duties in connection with the election, make and sign a declaration in the Form S.B. 91 in the First Appendix to these regulations.

(4) Where any such declarant makes any disclosure or does any act matter or thing in breach of his promise or declaration contained in the declaration made by him he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

Voters.

41. (1) All employees who seven days before the nomination day fixed in relation to an election are contributors to the Superannuation Fund shall be qualified to vote at the election. The personal records kept by the Superannuation Board shall be the voters' roll for this purpose.

(2) The election shall not be invalidated by reason merely that ballot-papers have been irregularly forwarded to persons who are not qualified to vote, or have not been sent to persons who are qualified to vote, unless in the opinion of the Minister such irregularity or omission has affected the result of the election.

Nominations.

42. (1) No person shall be capable of being elected for appointment as a Member of the Board unless duly nominated.

(2) A nomination shall be in the Form S.B. 92 in the First Appendix to these regulations; shall be signed by not less than twenty contributors; shall contain the consent of the candidate to act if elected; and shall be lodged with the Returning Officer at the Chief Electoral Office, Perth, not later than twelve o'clock noon on the nomination day to be fixed by the Minister and notified in the *Government Gazette* as hereinafter provided for.

Withdrawal of Nominations.

43. Any candidate may, by written notice (bearing his personal signature and witnessed by a contributor) addressed to the Returning Officer and lodged with him not later than twelve o'clock noon on nomination day, withdraw his consent to his nomination and thereupon such candidate shall be considered as not having been nominated and the Returning Officer shall omit the name of such candidate from the ballot-papers.

Nomination Day and Election Day.

44. (1) For the purpose of the first election of a contributor to be appointed as a member of the Superannuation Board, the Minister shall fix a day to be the nomination day for such election, and shall cause notice thereof to be published in the *Government Gazette*. Provided that the day fixed as nomination day as aforesaid shall be a day not less than one month and not more than three months after the date of the publication of the notice in the *Government Gazette*.

(2) For the purpose of every subsequent election of a contributor to be appointed as a member of the said Board, the Minister shall, not less than three months before the expiration of the term of office of a contributor member of the Board and not later than fourteen days after the occurrence of an extraordinary vacancy in the office of a

contributor member of the Board, as the case may be, fix a day to be the nomination day for the election of a contributor to be appointed as a member of the said Board, following the expiration of the term of office of the contributor member then in office or in the place of the contributor member whose office has become vacant as aforesaid, and shall cause notice thereof to be published in the *Government Gazette*. Provided that the day fixed as nomination day as aforesaid under this paragraph shall be a day not less than one month and not more than three months after the date of the publication of the notice in the *Government Gazette*.

(3) In the case of all elections, election day shall be the thirty-fifth day after the nomination day.

#### Names of candidates to be advertised.

45. On the day following the nomination day, or as soon thereafter as possible, the Returning Officer shall cause a list to be published in the *Government Gazette* containing the full name of every candidate nominated, together with particulars of the department or branch in which he is employed, and also shall cause copies of such list to be circulated or posted in a conspicuous place in every department and branch in which persons qualified to vote are employed.

#### Uncontested Elections.

46. If one candidate only is nominated, that candidate shall be duly elected and thereupon regulation 55 hereof shall apply.

#### Polling.

47. (1) If more candidates than one have been nominated, a vote shall be taken to decide the election. The Returning Officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed in the form S.B.93 in the First Appendix to these regulations, or to the like effect, and shall, by himself or his substitute or a poll clerk, sign or initial, or stamp with a facsimile of his signature or initials, each of such ballot-papers, and shall enclose one ballot-paper with an unfastened envelope addressed to the Returning Officer in another envelope for each and every voter and send the same by post, or other suitable method, to every such voter.

(2) After having recorded his vote, the voter shall enclose such ballot-paper in the envelope furnished to him with the address of the Returning Officer thereon; shall sign his name in the space provided for the purpose on the face of the envelope; shall state his department and location; and shall stamp and post, or deliver (or cause to be delivered) the same so that it shall be received by the Returning Officer not later than twelve o'clock noon on the election day as fixed by regulation 44 hereof.

(3) Any ballot-paper which is not enclosed in such addressed envelope with the signature of the voter and the other specified particulars thereon, or in which the directions for marking the ballot-paper as printed thereon have not been complied with, and any ballot-paper forwarded through the post the postage thereon not being fully prepaid, shall not be counted in the scrutiny. The decision of the Returning Officer as to the validity or invalidity of a ballot-paper shall be final.

(4) Upon a voter making and transmitting to the Returning Officer a statement in writing (setting out his full name, department and branch) that he has not received his ballot-paper, or that the ballot-paper received by him has been destroyed and that he has not already voted, the Returning Officer may issue a new ballot-paper to such voter.

#### Preferential Voting.

48. A voter shall mark his ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference, and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the figures 2, 3 and 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names, so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference in relation to all such candidates.

#### Scrutineers.

49. (1) Each candidate at an election shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present when the envelopes containing ballot-papers relating to such election are being opened at the commencement of the scrutiny and to remain during the scrutiny.

(2) Every scrutineer shall, before he acts as such, make and sign before the Returning Officer a like declaration to that which the Returning Officer and other officers employed in the conduct of the election are required to make and sign, and the provisions of paragraph (4) of regulation 40 hereof shall apply to such scrutineer.

#### The Scrutiny.

50. (1) The scrutiny shall not commence until after twelve o'clock noon on the election day. The Returning Officer may from time to time adjourn the scrutiny to a day and hour fixed by him and notified to the scrutineers.

(2) The Returning Officer or the Substitute Returning Officer, or any Poll Clerk duly appointed, shall:

- (a) produce unopened all envelopes containing ballot-papers received up to the time of closing the ballot;
- (b) examine each envelope, and if it is properly signed, and if it contains the necessary particulars thereon, and otherwise complies with the provisions herein contained, accept the vote for further scrutiny;
- (c) if an envelope is not properly signed or otherwise does not comply with the provisions herein contained, reject the vote without opening the envelope;
- (d) place the unrejected envelopes on a table, face downwards, so that the signatures of the voters shall not be visible;
- (e) open each unrejected envelope, withdraw the ballot-paper contained therein, and without inspecting the vote or permitting any other person to do so, deposit the ballot-paper in a ballot-box; and

- (f) when all unrejected envelopes have been opened and the ballot-papers withdrawn therefrom and deposited in the ballot-box, open the ballot-box and examine the ballot-papers therein. If upon such examination any ballot-paper is found not to have been marked in the manner provided by regulation 48 hereof, he shall exclude the same from the scrutiny. After the exclusion of the informal ballot-papers as aforesaid, he shall count the formal ballot-papers then remaining and ascertain the result of the election.

Provisions of State Law to operate.

51. Subject to the provisions contained in these regulations, each election shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the law for the time being regulating elections for the Legislative Assembly, as far as they can, with necessary adaptations, be made applicable.

Recounts.

52. (1) At any time before the gazettal of the results of the election as provided in regulation 55 hereof, the Returning Officer may, if he thinks fit, on the written request of any candidate setting forth the reasons for the request, or of his own motion, make a recount of the ballot-papers.

(2) If the Returning Officer refuses a request of a candidate to make a recount of the ballot-papers, the candidate within the time specified in the immediately preceding Regulation, may, in writing, appeal to the Minister to direct a recount, and the Minister may, at his discretion, either direct a recount or refuse to direct a recount.

Disputes.

53. Any matter in dispute in connection with an election shall be referred to the Minister and the decision of the Minister shall be final and conclusive.

Cases of Equal Voting.

54. If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes, the Returning Officer shall decide by lot which candidate shall be declared defeated.

Publication of Results and Appointment of Elected Candidate.

55. (1) The Returning Officer shall prepare a statement showing the result of each election and the name of the candidate elected, and promptly transmit the statement to the Minister, who shall notify the result in the *Government Gazette*.

(2) As soon as reasonably may be after such notification, the Minister shall cause the name of the elected candidate to be placed before the Governor in Council in order that such candidate may in accordance with Section 8 of the Act be appointed by the Governor as a Member of the Superannuation Board.

Disposal of Ballot Papers, etc.

56. (1) The envelopes containing ballot-papers withdrawn from scrutiny in accordance with paragraph (2) of regulation 50 hereof and the ballot-papers rejected as informal after examination in accordance with the said regulation 50 shall forthwith be placed in a sealed parcel by the Officer specified in that regulation.

(2) The Returning Officer shall, one month after the publication of the result of the election, destroy all ballot-papers and envelopes used at such election.

*Part VII—Appeals.*

Lodgment of Appeals.

57. (1) Any person aggrieved by any decision of the Board and desirous of appealing therefrom under the provisions of section 80 of the Act, shall lodge notice of appeal in the form S. B. 94 in the First Appendix to these regulations, together with a statement of the grounds of the appeal, with the Registrar of the Supreme Court, and serve a copy of such notice, and of the statement of the grounds of the appeal, on the Board, at its office, within fourteen days after the appellant has been informed of the decision against which he desires to appeal.

(2) On proof by affidavit to the satisfaction of the Registrar with whom notice of appeal has been lodged that a copy of the notice and of the statement of the grounds of the appeal have been duly served on the Board, he shall cause to be sent to the appellant and the Board notice in the form S. B. 95 in the First Appendix to these regulations of the date and time of the hearing of the appeal, which date shall not be less than fourteen clear days from the service of such notice.

Hearing of Appeals.

58. (1) At the hearing of the appeal the parties may appear, either personally or by counsel or solicitor, or by their representatives.

(2) If either party after notice as aforesaid neglects to appear on the date and time fixed for hearing the appeal, the Judge may—(a) where the appellant fails to appear, dismiss the appeal; or (b) where the Board fails to appear, hear the appeal or adjourn it to another date.

(3) On the hearing and determination of the appeal, the Judge may make such order as to costs to be paid by either party to the appeal to the other party as he may think fit. Any order as to costs so made shall be deemed to be an order of the Supreme Court and may be enforced accordingly.

(4) On the hearing of the appeal the appellant shall open his case; he shall not raise any ground of appeal other than those contained in the statement served with his notice of appeal; and the appeal shall proceed as nearly as may be according to the procedure and rules of evidence relating to a trial of a proceeding in the Supreme Court and the rules and practice in such Court shall, in so far as applicable and not inconsistent with these regulations, apply to appeals heard hereunder.

**Section 30 (2).**—Any employee may, subject to this Act, elect to become a contributor under this Act, and when any employee does so elect then during such time thereafter as he continues to be an employee he shall continue to be a contributor, and shall in all respect as such contributor be subject to and be bound by the provisions of this Act.

**Section 33.**—(1) Where an employee employed at the commencement of this Act is qualified by length of service for a superannuation allowance under the provisions of the Superannuation Act, 1871, and does not become a contributor under this Act this Act shall not operate so as to deprive him of any eligibility for superannuation allowance under the Superannuation Act, 1871.

(2) Where an employee employed at the commencement of this Act is qualified by length of service for a superannuation allowance under the provisions of the Superannuation Act, 1871, such employee may elect to become either a contributor or a qualified contributor under this Act and section thirty-one of this Act shall, with such adaptations as are necessary, apply.

(3) Where an employee mentioned in subsection (2) of this section elects to become a contributor under this Act he shall be liable to contribute to the fund under this Act as if he were contributing for the full benefits of a pensioner under this Act and shall, as from the date when he becomes a contributor as aforesaid but subject as in this subsection hereinafter provided, cease any longer to be eligible for any superannuation allowance or other benefit whatsoever under the said Superannuation Act, 1871.

Provided that if, when such employee reaches the maximum age for retirement under this Act, such employee is, except for this subsection, still a person to whom the Governor may lawfully grant a superannuation allowance under the Superannuation Act, 1871, such employee, in addition to becoming a pensioner under this Act, shall be entitled to receive from the State and the State shall pay to him such amount as upon an actuarial determination made by the Government Actuary is the reasonable equivalent of that portion of the aggregate contributions made by him as a contributor under this Act for and on account of the pension payable to him personally as a pensioner under this Act.

(4) Where an employee mentioned in subsection (2) of this section elects under this section to become a qualified contributor the following provisions shall apply:—

- (a) Subject to the Superannuation Act, 1871, the employee will continue to be qualified and eligible for the grant of a superannuation allowance under that Act;
- (b) The employee shall not be entitled to any benefits personally as a pensioner under this Act;
- (c) The employee shall contribute to the fund at a rate to be prescribed by regulations for the number of units of pension for which he would be required under this Act to contribute as a contributor; and
- (d) Upon the death of the employee his widow and children shall be entitled in respect of the units of pension for which the employee was contributing as a qualified contributor under this section to receive from the fund in accordance with this Act the same benefits to which they would have been entitled if the employee had been a contributor or a pensioner under this Act.

**MEDICAL EXAMINATION.**

**Section 34.**—When any employee elects to become a contributor or a qualified contributor under this Act, and such employee has not been required as a condition of his employment to submit himself for examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to his mental and physical health, such employee shall not be eligible or entitled under this Act to become a contributor or a qualified contributor unless and until he has in accordance with the regulations submitted himself for examination as to his mental and physical health and has been certified to be free from mental and physical infirmity likely to affect seriously and prejudicially a reasonable expectation of life in such employee.
