Greeting:

KNOW YE that I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you Richard Cunliffe Wilson, John Stuart Foxall, and Francis Gloster Forman to be Commissioners generally to inquire into and report upon each and all of the following things, that is to say:—

1. To inquire into and ascertain—
 - (a) the cause of the recent "creep" at the Proprietary Coal Mine at Collie;
 - (b) the steps which may be taken for the prevention of similar future occurrences; and
 - (c) any other matters relevant to the inquiry.
2. To examine and report upon the various matters inquired into by you in accordance with this Commission; and
3. To make such recommendations as to you may seem meet in relation to any matters found by you as the result of your said inquiry.

AND I declare that you shall, by virtue of this Commission be a Royal Commission within the Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902, as reprinted in the Appendix to the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1928, and that you, the said Richard Cunliffe Wilson shall be Chairman of the said Royal Commission and shall have the powers of a Royal Commission or the Chairman thereof under that Act.

AND I hereby request you, as soon as reasonably may be, to report to me in writing the result of this your Commission.

WHEREAS by section 9 of The Fisheries Act, 1905-38, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedules hereto, for a period of three years from the date of publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

First Schedule.

All that area of Western Australian waters in Cockburn Sound commencing at a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards north of Robb's Jetty and extending to a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards south of the said jetty, and extending into the waters aforesaid to a distance of a quarter of a mile from high-water mark.

Second Schedule.

That area of Western Australian waters in Cockburn Sound commencing at a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards north of the jetty fronting

Douro road, South Fremantle, to a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards south of the said jetty, and extending into the waters aforesaid to a distance of a quarter of a mile from high-water mark.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 22nd day of February, 1940, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 167 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939, that the Governor may appoint a Board of Review, consisting of a Chairman and two other members, that the State may arrange with the Commonwealth for the holding by the Chairman and members of a Board of Review under the Commonwealth Act known as the Commonwealth Income Tax Assessment Act, 1936-1938, of the offices of Chairman and members respectively of the Board under the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939, of the State, and that the Governor may appoint as Chairman and members of the Board the Chairman and members for the time being of any Board of Review under the said Commonwealth Act, and with the same tenure of office as they hold under the said Act: And whereas, it being deemed desirable and expedient that, pursuant to section 167 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939, a Board of Review shall be appointed for the purposes of Part V. of the said Act, and that the Chairman and members for the time being of the Board of Review as now constituted under and for the purposes of the Commonwealth Income Tax Assessment Act, 1936-1938, shall be appointed as the Chairman and other members respectively of the Board of Review to be appointed as aforesaid, the State has duly arranged with the Commonwealth for the holding by the Chairman and members for the time being of the Board of Review under the said Commonwealth Act of the offices of Chairman and members respectively of the Board of Review to be appointed under the said Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred by section 167 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939, and for the purposes of Part V. of that Act doth hereby:—

- (a) Appoint a Board of Review, consisting of a Chairman and two other members; and
- (b) appoint as the Chairman and the other two members respectively of such Board of Review the persons who at the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Government Gazette* are the Chairman and other two members respectively constituting the Board of Review appointed and functioning under the Commonwealth Income Tax Assessment Act, 1936-1938; and
- (c) declare that such persons shall hold office as Chairman and members respectively of the Board of Review appointed by this Order in Council during such time as they continue to hold their offices as Chairman and members respectively of the Board of Review under the said Commonwealth Income Tax Assessment Act, 1936-1938, subject however to the provisions of section 167 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939, aforesaid and to the continuance of the arrangement made between the State and the Commonwealth hereinbefore-mentioned, in pursuance whereof the said appointment of the said persons as Chairman and members respectively of the Board of Review hereby appointed is hereby made.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

INCOME TAX ASSESSMENT ACT, 1937-1939.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (1) of section 172 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939, has been pleased to make rules for regulating the practice and procedure in relation to appeals dealt with by the Board of Review appointed under and for the purposes of Part V. of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939, as set out in the Schedule hereunder.

INCOME TAX ASSESSMENT ACT, 1937-1939.

Rules for Regulating the Practice and Procedure in Relation to Appeals dealt with by the Board of Review appointed under and for the purposes of Part V. of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939.

1. (1) Where in pursuance of the request made by a taxpayer under the provisions of section 170 of the Act the Commissioner is required to forward the taxpayer's appeal or to refer the decision of the Commissioner or to forward the objection of the taxpayer (as the case may be) to the Board of Review, the Commissioner shall, for the purpose of complying with such request, furnish the Board of Review with a printed or typewritten statement, in quadruplicate, containing the following particulars, namely:—

- (a) the name and address of the taxpayer;
- (b) full details of the taxpayer's objection and the grounds thereof, as made by the taxpayer, under section 168 of the Act and received by the Commissioner; and
- (c) full details of the decision of the Commissioner in relation to such objection, and the grounds of such decision.

(2) When furnishing the statement aforesaid to the Board of Review, the Commissioner shall also furnish the taxpayer with a copy of such statement, either by delivering the same or sending it by post addressed to the taxpayer.

2. (1) After receipt of the statement aforesaid the Chairman of the Board of Review shall, subject to paragraph (2) of this rule, fix a day and time and place for the review by the said Board, and cause notices thereof in writing to be served upon the Commissioner and the taxpayer respectively.

(2) The day and time for a review as fixed by the Board of Review shall be so fixed as to enable the Commissioner and the taxpayer to receive at least fourteen days' notice thereof, and the notice of the day and time so fixed to be served upon the Commissioner and the taxpayer shall be served upon them not less than fourteen days prior to the day fixed for the review.

(3) A notice under this rule may be served either personally or by post, and, if served by post, service shall be effected by properly addressing, prepaying, and posting the notice as a letter to the address of the Commissioner, or to the address of the taxpayer, as the case may require, and, unless the contrary is proved, service shall be deemed to have been effected at the time when the letter would have been delivered in the ordinary course of post.

3. (1) All references for the purpose of review by the Board shall be numbered consecutively in the order in which they are made, and, unless the Chairman of the Board directs otherwise, the reviews shall take place in the order in which the references are received by the Board.

(2) The sittings of the Board for the purpose of reviews shall be held in such place or places and at such time or times as are fixed by the Chairman of the Board.

(3) The Board shall not be required to sit on public holidays, or during a yearly vacation commencing on the twenty-fifth day of December and ending on the next following twenty-first day of January.

4. (1) Subject to the provisions of the Act, reviews by the Board shall be conducted in such manner as the Chairman of the Board from time to time directs.

(2) Either party to a review by the Board may nominate a person to represent him at the review.

(3) The Chairman of the Board may adjourn any review from time to time, as he thinks fit.

5. (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this rule, the Board:—

(a) shall take all oral evidence on oath or affirmation, and for that purpose the Chairman of the Board, or, in the absence of the Chairman, the acting Chairman, shall have power to administer oaths and affirmations; and

(b) may receive, without formal proof, a document containing any statement or particular which in the opinion of the Board is relevant to the question in issue in the review (not being a document which has been brought into existence solely for the purpose of the review) and may take into consideration such statement or particular.

(2) In the exercise of the powers under section 225 of the Act conferred on the Board by virtue of subsection (5) of section 167 of the Act, the Chairman of the Board may by notice in writing require any person:—

(a) to furnish the Board with such information as in the opinion of the Chairman is necessary for the purpose of a review by the Board; and

(b) to attend and give evidence before the Board, or before any officer authorised by the Chairman of the Board in that behalf, concerning his or any other person's income or assessment, and may require him to produce all books, documents, and other papers whatever in his custody or under his control relating thereto—

and the Chairman of the Board may require the information or evidence to be given on oath or affirmation, and either verbally or in writing, and for that purpose the Chairman or the authorised officer aforesaid shall have power to administer an oath or affirmation.

(3) The expenses to be allowed to any person required to attend and give evidence under paragraph (2) of this rule shall be those prescribed by regulation 55 of the regulations made under the Act in respect of persons required under section 225 of the Act to attend and give evidence before the Commissioner.

6. (1) The Board shall forward copies of its decision on each review to the Commissioner and to the taxpayer concerned, and the Commissioner shall, unless the decision has been appealed from, give effect to the decision of the Board in the manner required by the Act.

(2) The Board may from time to time compile and publish summaries of its decisions.

7. Subject to paragraph (3) of rule 3 hereof, the members of the Board shall be in attendance at such time and at such place as is from time to time appointed by the Chairman of the Board for the performance of their duties.

8. Communications to the Board may be addressed to the Chairman of the Board, in the care of the State Commissioner of Taxation, Box A15, General Post Office, Perth.

9. These rules may be cited as the Income Tax Appeals (Board of Review) Rules, 1940.

The Schedule.

Regulations numbers 3, 4, and 5 are repealed and new regulations are inserted in lieu thereof, as follows:—

3.—Subscribers.

Any person may become a subscriber to the Hospital and be entitled to the benefits set forth in clause 4 hereof, provided subscriptions are maintained as follows:—

- (a) In the case of employees of a mining company, by payment through the company of 4s. per fortnightly pay;
- (b) In the case of employees of any other employer, by payment through such employer of 1s. 10d. per week or 8s. per calendar month;

- (c) In the case of any individual acting on his own behalf, by payment at the rate of £4 16s. per annum, payable in advance, for any period not less than one calendar month;
- (d) Provided that a person in employment shall be registered by the secretary of the hospital as a subscriber and become entitled to all benefits as from the date authority was given for deduction of subscriptions from wages due: Provided further, that an individual acting on his or her own behalf shall not be entitled to any benefit until fourteen days after becoming a subscriber.

4.—Subscribers' Benefits.

Any subscriber who is qualified under the conditions of clause 3 shall be entitled to the following benefits for himself and/or dependants, subject to the provisions of clauses 7 and 8:—

- (a) Treatment free of charge in the Westonia District Hospital for any period not exceeding three months;
- (b) Treatment free of charge as an out-patient between the hours of 10 a.m. and twelve noon and 3 p.m. to 5 p.m., except in case of emergency, when treatment may be obtained at any time;
- (c) Provided that, in the event of the Matron in charge advising the removal of any patient who is entitled to subscribers' benefits to the nearest hospital for treatment by a medical practitioner, the Board will pay up to ten pounds on the aggregate of the following accounts:—
 1. Cost of transporting patient to nearest hospital or to nearest doctor.
 2. Doctors' fees.
 3. Hospital fees.
 4. Drugs and dressings.
- (d) Provided further, that subscribers shall not be entitled to free treatment in the following cases:—

1. Cases coming under the Workers' Compensation Act;
2. Confinements or miscarriages;
3. Conditions arising from alcoholism, venereal disease, acts of bravado, or immoral conduct of any kind;
4. Dental operations or major surgical operations.

For the purposes of this clause "dependant" shall mean the wife, parent, and grandparent of a subscriber, and the sons, daughters, brothers and sisters not over sixteen years of age of a subscriber who are actually residing with and wholly dependent on him at the date of the illness or accident for which subscribers' benefits are claimed.

5.—Fees.

The following charges shall be payable in cases where the rules do not provide for free treatment:—

- (a) General cases—9s. per day;
- (b) Maternity cases, for a period up to 12 days after confinement—Subscribers, £4 4s.; non-subscribers, £5 5s. After 12 days' confinement, 9s. per day all patients; waiting cases, 8s. per day;
- (c) Maternity cases requiring more than 12 days' confinement shall be brought under the notice of the Hospital Board. Subscribers who desire to receive maternity benefits at the rate of £4 4s. must be financial three months in advance;
- (d) Outpatients, 2s. 6d. per visit to hospital plus cost of medicines, drugs, and dressings supplied;
- (e) When cases are visited by the Matron in charge at residence:—Subscribers within one mile radius of hospital free; non-subscribers, 9s. for first visit and 5s. for each subsequent visit. Outside one mile radius arrangements must be made with the Board, and the cost of conveyance necessary to and from the patient's residence shall be paid by the patient.

By-laws of the Brookton Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance, and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Brookton.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain, and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations

thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws, and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application, accompanied by a copy of these by-laws, shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly. A Bush Fire Brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof. Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a Bush Fire Brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such Brigade is established, the Brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

Appointment of Officers.

2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant, and such additional lieutenants, as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who in the Board's opinion have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The secretary of the Board, or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.

4. The Board may appoint an Equipment Officer, who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot, approved by the captain, where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the Equipment Officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint Bush Fire Control Officers, in accordance with the requirements of the District, and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal, and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting, and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and, in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire, shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall, when so directed by the Board, instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a bush fire brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members; (b) fire fighting members; and (c) associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade, at the following rates:—

(ii) Other persons—a minimum subscription	
of	5 0

(3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.

(4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.

(5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable, either by fire fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.

(6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

Meetings of Brigade.

9. Meetings of the Brigade shall be held as follows:—One annual meeting and at least one meeting prior to and one immediately after the bush fire season each year and other meetings, as the captain of the Brigade may deem necessary, shall be held and minutes of such meetings be recorded.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 1 of 1940.

(Registered 25/1/40.)

Bulk Handling of Wheat at Bunbury.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-35, this thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, between the Bunbury Harbour Board (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the one part, and the Australian Workers' Union Westralian Branch Pastoral, Agricultural, Horticultural, and Tobacco-curing Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, witnesseth, that for the consideration hereafter appearing, the parties hereto

mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

Clause 1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to workers engaged by the Bunbury Harbour Board in handling wheat in connection with the operations of the bulk handling terminal silo at Bunbury.

Clause 2.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be three (3) years from the date hereof.

Clause 3.—Hours.

The ordinary hours of work shall not exceed forty-four (44) hours in any one week and shall not exceed

eight hours daily, to be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., from Monday to Friday, inclusive, 8 a.m. and noon Saturday.

Clause 4.—Overtime.

Overtime, as hereinafter defined, shall be paid for at the following rates:—

- (a) Between 6 p.m. and midnight, Monday to Friday, inclusive, ordinary rate and a half.
- (b) Between midnight and 7 a.m., Monday to Saturday, inclusive, double ordinary rate.
- (c) For work done on Saturday between noon and midnight, double ordinary rates shall be paid.

Payment for time worked on Sundays and holidays shall be as under:—

- (d) Ordinary holidays.—For work done on ordinary holidays the rates shall be:—
 - (1) between midnight and 7 a.m.—two and a half times the ordinary rate;
 - (2) between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.—ordinary rate and a half;
 - (3) between 5 p.m. and midnight—double ordinary rate.
- (e) Sundays and extraordinary holidays:—For work done between midnight on Saturday and midnight on Sunday and between midnight and midnight on extraordinary holidays, two and a half times the ordinary rate shall be paid.

Clause 5.—Holidays.

The holidays shall be as follows:—

- (a) Extraordinary Holidays:—Christmas Day, Good Friday, Labour Day, Picnic Day, and Sundays.
- (b) Ordinary Holidays:—New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Easter Monday, Boxing Day, State Foundation Day, and Anzac Day.

Clause 6.—Wages.

Basic wage at the rate of £4 3s. 1d. per week, calculated on an hourly basis.

(a) Margin:—The margin per hour shall be such amount as is necessary to make the total wage, exclusive of any other allowances herein provided, equal the ordinary rate of wage provided by the Award applicable to waterside workers at the Port of Bunbury from time to time.

(b) Men working outside the silo when employed in the discharge of bulk wheat trucks, on rolling up canvasses and the spoutman loading trucks, and men shunting trucks after they are loaded, shall be paid sixpence (6d.) per hour extra.

(c) Men employed inside the silo as weighman, peridical cleaners, and men employed on the first floor, shall be paid ninepence (9d.) per hour extra.

(d) Men employed in the top gallery shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per hour extra.

Clause 7.—Smoko.

A smoko of 15 minutes' duration shall be allowed at 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. to all men employed when the silo is operating.

Clause 8.—Inspections.

Any officer or other person authorised by the Union may, on any day for the purpose of investigating any alleged breaches of this Agreement, and after giving notice to the employer or his agent, enter any premises on which the operations of this Agreement are being carried on, inspect such operations and speak to workers, provided that such inspection shall not in any way be exercised so as to cause any delay in such operations.

Clause 9.—Payment of Wages.

All wages shall be paid in cash, on or before Friday in each week, within ten minutes of the time for finishing work. Provided that, when the engagement of the worker is terminated, all wages and holiday pay due shall be paid within ten minutes of the termination of the engagement.

Clause 10.—Time of Duty.

(a) The time of duty shall begin at the time and place to which the employee is directed to present himself for work.

(b) Employees who are engaged for work shall be paid as for two hours at least, and after two hours of duty they shall be paid for each fraction of a half-hour of duty as if it were a full half-hour.

(c) When men are required for duty on a holiday they shall be engaged on the working day immediately preceding the holiday and ordered to start at a stated place and time.

(d) Employees who present themselves by direction of the employer for work after meal hours, without having been discharged, shall be paid as for one hour at the least, even if they are not turned to work.

Clause 11.—No Reduction.

This Agreement shall not in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker who is at present receiving above the minimum rate.

Clause 12.—Preference.

Preference under this Agreement shall be given to members of the Union.

Clause 13.—First Aid Kit.

A first aid kit, in accordance with the Schedule referred to herein, shall be supplied by the employer and same shall be accessible at all times.

- 6 triangle bandages.
- 6 one-inch roller bandages.

- 1 pair surgical scissors.
- 1 small enamel basin.
- 1 packet safety pins.

Clause 14.—Constitution of Gang.

(a) When 26 trucks are to be unloaded, the following number of men shall be employed: Provided that, when a lesser number of trucks are to be unloaded, the number of men to be employed may be proportionately reduced:—1 shunter; 1 man on capstan; 6 men discharging; 2 men rolling canvas fittings; 1 weighman; 1 tally clerk; 1 man removing canes and sheets (when necessary).

(b) When loading wheat into trucks and three shoots are being used simultaneously, four (4) men shall be employed. Provided that, when less than three shoots are being used, the number of men may be reduced proportionately.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 2 of 1940.

(Registered 8/2/40.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this 15th day of January, One thousand nine hundred and forty, between Amalgamated Collieries of W.A., Limited, and the Griffin Coal Mining Company, Limited (hereinafter called "the Employers") of the one part, and Federated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Branch (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, Witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to an area comprised within a radius of ten (10) miles from the Post Office, Collie.

2.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all workers employed as clerks (including telephone assistants and messengers, where such workers do clerical work) in the Coal Mining Industry.

3.—Hours.

The ordinary hours of work shall be:—(a) Forty-four (44) per week at the Central Office; (b) eighty-eight (88) per fortnight at the Mines offices.

4.—Overtime.

(a) (1) Central Office:—All time worked in excess of the hours mentioned in clause 3 (a) hereof, or after 6 p.m., Mondays to Fridays, inclusive or after 1 p.m. on Saturdays, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first three (3) hours and double time thereafter.

(2) Mines Offices:—All time worked in excess of the hours mentioned in clause 3 (b) hereof, or after 4.30 p.m., Monday to Friday, inclusive, or after 4.30 p.m., on Back Saturdays, or after 1 p.m. on Pay Saturdays, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first three (3) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) All time worked on Sundays or on the holidays prescribed by clause 7 hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause, a clerk in receipt of a salary of three hundred and fifty pounds (£350) per annum or over shall not be entitled to payment for overtime.

(d) In no case shall any worker work overtime unless and until he has received authority from the employer so to do, prior to the working of such overtime.

5.—Meal Money.

If a worker is required to continue working for more than one (1) hour after the finishing times as mentioned in clause 4 (a) hereof, without having been notified the previous day, he shall be entitled to be paid the sum of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) as meal money.

6.—Wages.

(a) Basic wage: Males £4 3s. 1d. per week; females £2 4s. 10d. per week.

(d) Experience:—Where the worker has had training in commercial subjects at a recognised commercial college or technical school for a period of six (6) months or longer, fifty per cent. (50%) of such period of training, with a maximum allowance of six (6) months, shall be regarded as experience, for the purpose of determining the rate of wage payable.

(e) Casual clerk:—Casual clerks may be employed at an hourly rate for a lesser period than two (2) weeks, and shall be paid, whilst so employed, twenty-five per cent. (25%) in addition to the rates prescribed above, with a minimum engagement of four (4) hours.

(f) The employer shall pay ordinary rates for all time spent in travelling during the worker's ordinary working hours. The employer shall pay the amount of any fares actually incurred by the worker in excess of those ordinarily incurred by the worker in travelling from his home to his work-place and return, when travelling at the employer's request.

7.—Holidays.

The following days shall be observed as holidays and paid for, namely:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Anzac Day.

8.—Annual Leave.

(a) Workers, other than casual workers, shall be entitled to twelve (12) days (equivalent to two weeks' pay) annual leave on full pay.

(b) A worker not completing a year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays in the proportion that his length of service bears to the full year's employment.

(c) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay in accordance with the provisions of clause 9 hereof, or when on annual leave in accordance with sub-clause (a) of this clause, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

(d) A worker who is summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty, or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall lose all rights under this clause.

(e) Annual leave shall be taken within twelve (12) months of falling due.

9.—Payment for Sickness.

No worker shall be entitled to payment of wages for any absence from his employment, on the ground of personal ill-health, for more than one day per month during each year of service. This allowance shall not be cumulative. Provided that a worker with at least two (2) years of service, who produces to his employer a medical certificate that absence from his employment on the ground of personal ill-health necessitates a longer absence than the period allowed of one day per month of service shall be entitled to payment for sickness up to twenty-four (24) days.

10.—Engagement.

The employment of any worker shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice on either side: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders, or for misconduct, or if after receiving one week's notice, such worker does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

11.—Reference.

A reference shall be given to any worker of not less than three (3) months' service, containing all necessary information in regard to length of service and duties performed.

12.—Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Agreement applies, the

class of work performed, the hours worked each day and the wages paid to each worker each pay; the age and length of experience of each junior worker. The employer and the worker shall be jointly responsible for the proper posting of the record each pay. The said record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on any working day, from Monday to Friday, inclusive.

13.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint, for the purpose of this Agreement, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each board shall consist of a chairman and two others representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties, as prescribed by the regulations. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Agreement, the functions of:—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them;
- (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

14.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged, shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—(1) Name in full; (2) Age and date of birth; (3) Name of each previous employer; (4) Length of service with each previous employer; (5) Class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such of the above particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be endorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer upon request by the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay, in the event of his age or of the length of service with a previous employer being wilfully misstated in the certificate, and he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Agreement.

15.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be three (3) years as and from 24th December, 1939.
