ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 2821/18.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-39, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons, to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of subleasing: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Class "A" Reserve 17060, at Keane's Point, should vest in and be held by the State Gardens Board in trust for Recreation and other purposes incidental thereto: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the State Gardens Board in trust for Recreation and other purposes incidental thereto, with power to the said State Gardens Board to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding fifty (50) years from the date of the lease.

Metropolitan Sewerage, Subiaco District (Karrakatta Military Camp), Pumping Station and Rising Main:—

- (a) Concrete tanks and brick and tile superstructure, electric pumps, and all apparatus connected therewith;
- (b) rising main from pumping station to Subiaco main sewer;
- (c) overflow to sump, as shown in blue on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 6474.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 19th day of July, 1940.

THE following Rules of Court under section 172 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939, are published for general information.

INCOME TAX ASSESSMENT ACT, 1937-1939.

Rules of Court for regulating the Practice and Procedure in relation to Appeals to the Supreme Court against Assessments made by the Commissioner under the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939.

The Honourable Sir John Alfred Northmore, K.C.M.G., Chief Justice of Western Australia; The Honourable John Patrick Dwyer, and the Honourable Albert Asher Wolff, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, acting in pursuance of the powers vested in us by subsection (2) of section 172 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939, do make and enact the following Rules of Court:—

PART 1.—APPEALS FROM COMMISSIONER'S DECISION TO THE SUPREME COURT.

1. (1) Where, in pursuance of the request made by a taxpayer under the provisions of section 170 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939, the Commissioner is required to forward the taxpayer's appeal, or to refer the decision of the Commissioner or to forward the objection of the taxpayer (as the case may be) to the Supreme Court, the Commissioner shall, for the purpose of complying with such request, file in the Central Office of the Supreme Court a printed or typewritten statement in quadruplicate containing the following particulars, namely:—

- (a) the name and address of the taxpayer;
- (b) full details of the taxpayer's objection and the grounds thereof as made by the taxpayer under section 168 of the Act and received by the Commissioner; and
- (c) full details of the decision of the Commissioner in relation to such objection.

(2) Within ten days after filing the said statement in the Central Office of the Supreme Court as aforesaid, the Commissioner shall serve notice thereof, together with a copy of the statement upon the taxpayer.

2. Within ten days after receiving notice from the Commissioner as aforesaid, the taxpayer shall—

- (a) set down the appeal for hearing at the next available sittings of the Supreme Court; and
- (b) give to the Commissioner in writing ten days' notice of the date of the sittings for which the appeal has been set down to be heard.

3. (1) When the Commissioner files the statement aforesaid in the Central Office of the Supreme Court as provided for in Rule 1 hereof, he shall also forward to the proper officer of the Court a copy of the assessment to which the appeal relates, including any amendment thereof, and of any other documents necessary for the hearing of the appeal.

(2) If any dispute shall arise between the parties concerning the documents so to be forwarded, the Judge of the Supreme Court hearing the appeal may direct that any document not already forwarded shall be forwarded to the proper officer aforesaid.

PART 2.—APPEALS FROM BOARD OF REVIEW TO FULL COURT.

4. Appeals to the Full Court of the Supreme Court of the State from decisions of the Board of Review under subsection (5) of section 171 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939, shall be instituted by Notice of Appeal.

5. Within thirty days of the Board of Review communicating its decision to the party desiring to appeal therefrom, such party shall—

- (a) serve one copy of the notice of appeal upon the opposite party;
- (b) serve one copy of the notice of appeal upon the Board of Review;
- (c) file a copy of the notice of appeal in the Central Office of the Supreme Court at Perth.

6. The Notice of Appeal shall be entitled In the Full Court of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, and shall state:—

- (a) the nature of the decision of the Board of Review from which the appeal is brought;
- (b) whether the whole or part of the decision is appealed from and if part only, which part thereof;
- (c) the question or questions of law involved in the decision.

7. Within ten days of the service upon the Board of Review of the Notice of Appeal the Board of Review shall transmit to the Registrar of the Supreme Court:—

- (a) the materials before it;
- (b) a copy of its decision;
- (c) a copy of any statement made by the members of the Board of Review of the reasons for their decision.

8. (a) The appellant shall cause to be prepared for the use of the Full Court a transcript consisting of—

- (1) the material notice or notices of assessment by the Commissioner;
- (2) the taxpayer's objection thereto;
- (3) the Commissioner's decision upon such objection;
- (4) the taxpayer's request to the Commissioner to refer the Commissioner's decision to the Board of Review;
- (5) the reference by the Commissioner to the Board of Review;
- (6) the assessment, determination, and decision of the Board of Review;
- (7) the statement, if any, of the reasons of the members of the Board of Review;
- (8) so much of the materials before the Board of Review as the Registrar may require;

and the appellant shall for that purpose have access to the documents transmitted by the Board of Review to the Registrar of the Supreme Court.

(b) The appellant, at least four days before the first day of the sittings at which the appeal is to be heard, shall leave with the Registrar of the Supreme Court three copies of such transcript and serve upon the respondent two copies thereof.

9. The appeal shall be set down for hearing at the first sittings of the Full Court occurring after the expiration of twenty-one days from the filing of the notice of appeal.

10. These Rules may be cited as the Income Tax Appeals Rules, 1940.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

Mosman Park Local Health Authority.

P.H.D. 144/22.
WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1937, the Governor caused to be prepared and to be published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th day of September, 1939, a Model By-law relating to the transport of meat in the form hereinafter set forth: And whereas, under the provisions of the said

Act, a local authority may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-law, with or without modification: Now, therefore, the Mosman Park Health Authority, being a local authority under the said Act, doth hereby resolve to adopt the whole of such by-law without modification.

The by-law referred to above is as follows:—

(a) Every vehicle used in the transport of meat (excepting butchers' delivery vehicles used for delivery of cut joints to householders and vehicles used by the producer for the conveyance of carcase meat to the market) shall conform with the following:—

- (i) The vehicle shall be completely enclosed so as to protect the meat from the weather and from flies and dust.
- (ii) The vehicle shall be constructed of wood or metal, and all internal surfaces shall be finished to a smooth surface.
- (iii) The vehicle shall be properly ventilated.
- (iv) The vehicle shall be provided with rails and hooks secured to the upper portion thereof, and shall be of ample proportions, so that meat hung on such hooks shall be clear of the floor.
- (v) No meat (except edible offal) shall be placed on the floor of the vehicle.
- (vi) Edible offal, when carried on the floor, shall be contained in impervious containers.
- (vii) The vehicle, edible offal containers, hooks and rails shall at all times be kept in a thoroughly clean condition.

(b) No vehicle used for the transport of meat shall be used at any time for the transport of any offensive matter.

(c) No meat shall be carried on any railway, except in trucks provided for that purpose, or unless such meat is hung on hooks and is clear of the floor.

(d) Any person engaged or employed in the transport or delivery of carcase meat shall at all times, when so engaged, wear a cap with a detachable covering made of durable washing material, which shall

completely cover his clothes. He shall cause such cap covering and over-all to be kept at all times in a thoroughly clean condition.

(e) i. Butchers' delivery vehicles shall be completely enclosed to protect the meat from the weather, flies and dust. The vehicle shall be constructed of wood or metal, and all internal portions finished to a smooth surface.

ii. They shall be properly ventilated. The floor of such vehicles shall be constructed of or completely covered with a smooth impervious metal.

(f) Butchers' cutting carts shall be constructed in a similar manner as specified for butchers' delivery carts, but shall be of ample dimensions to permit all carcase meat to be hung on hooks affixed to the roof of such vehicle. All carcase meat shall be hung on such hooks, in such manner that the meat is clear of the floor. Carcase meat in this clause shall mean any quarter or more of any carcase.

(g) All carcase meat conveyed by producers to the markets shall be completely covered with clean canvas or other wrappings, approved by the inspector, in such manner as thoroughly to protect such meat from flies and dust.

(h) In this by-law the word "producer" shall mean a person who delivers to the market carcases of animals reared or produced on his own farm or property.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting pursuant to the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1937 (as reprinted under the provisions of the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938), has been pleased—(a) to amend the regulations made by the Governor, and (b) to approve of the amendment by the Midwives Registration Board of the regulations made by the said Board under and for the purposes of Part XII. of the Health Act, 1911-1937, aforesaid, as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th day of January, 1924, and from time to time thereafter amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

The above-mentioned regulations are amended as follows:—

1. The definition of "Clerk," under the heading "Definitions" in the introductory part of the said regulations, is amended by adding at the end of the said definition of "Clerk" the words "who shall be a trained nurse."

2. Regulation 1 of Part A of the said regulations is repealed and a regulation is inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—

1. Meetings—The Board shall meet at such times as are necessary, on a day to be fixed, to suit the convenience of its members. The chairman may at any time convene a meeting of the Board and the Clerk shall convene a meeting, if required to do so, by any two members of the Board by writing under their hands.

3. Regulation 4 of Part A of the said regulations is repealed and a regulation is inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—

4. Order of business—The order of business shall be as follows:—

- (1) Minutes of the last meeting,
- (2) Correspondence,
- (3) Registrations,
- (4) Reports of Committees,
- (5) Notices of motion,
- (6) Business arising directly under the Act,
- (7) Any other business.

Provided that the Board may at any meeting vary the order of business on the ground of urgency or convenience.

4. Regulation 1 of Part B of the said regulations is amended as follows:—

(a) by deleting from paragraph (a) the word "make" in line two of the said paragraph and inserting in lieu thereof the word "made."

(b) by deleting paragraph (b) and inserting in lieu thereof a paragraph as follows:—

(b) Certificates to the effect that the candidate has undergone the training set forth in these regulations.

(c) by deleting from paragraph (c) the word "moral" in line one of the said paragraph.

5. Regulation 1 of Part C of the said regulations is amended as follows:—

(a) by deleting the words "mechanism of labour—vertex, face, and breech presentations" where they appear under the subheading "midwifery" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "mechanism of labour—vertex, face, brow, transverse and breech presentations."

(b) by deleting the words "complicated labour—eclampsia, rupture of the uterus" where they appear under the subheading "midwifery" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "complicated labour—toxaemias of pregnancy, rupture of the uterus."

6. Regulation 9 in Part C of the said regulations is repealed, and a regulation is inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—

9. Examinations shall be held at such times and places as the Board shall direct and the Clerk shall give at least two months' notice of the holding of each examination.

7. New regulations are added to Part C of the said regulations, after regulation 9, as follows:—

10. (1) Every candidate applying to sit for examination shall remit or lodge with her application form the prescribed examination fee.

(2) In the case of a candidate for the final examination sitting for the first time, the examination fee shall be one pound one shilling.

(3) In the case of a candidate for the final examination sitting for the second time, no additional examination fee shall be payable.

(4) In the case of a candidate for the final examination failing to satisfy the examiners for the second time, the examination fee payable by the candidate on each further occasion when she sits for the final examination shall be ten shillings and sixpence.

11. Any person who produces an approved certificate of examination issued by any authority in any State or country outside Western Australia with which the Board has entered into a reciprocal agreement, may be registered by the Board without further examination, on payment of the prescribed fee.

8. Regulation 2 in Part D of the said regulations is repealed and a regulation is inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—

2. Whenever the medical officer of any local authority has reason to believe that any nurse is incompetent or has been guilty of negligence in a professional respect, he shall so report to the Board.

9. Regulation 2 in Part E of the said regulations is repealed and a regulation is inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—

2. When called to a confinement, a nurse must take with her a bag furnished with a removable lining, which can be disinfected, and containing the following requisites, namely:—

- (a) a gauze mask to cover the mouth and nose during delivery or vaginal examination;
- (b) a pair of sterilised rubber gloves;
- (c) an appliance for the giving of vaginal injections;
- (d) a separate appliance from the above for the giving of enemata;
- (e) a catheter;
- (f) a pair of scissors;
- (g) a clinical thermometer;
- (h) a nail brush;
- (i) a mucous catheter;
- (j) a hypodermic syringe;
- (k) pituitrin, to be used only in the third stage;
- (l) a supply of cotton wool and material for tying the cord;
- (m) a bottle containing sterile salt tablets;
- (n) efficient preparations for disinfecting the hands, for douching in special cases, and for cleansing the infant's eyes.

10. Regulation 4 in Part E of the said regulations is amended by deleting therefrom the words "as long after as may be necessary" in lines five and six of the said regulation and inserting in lieu thereof the words "for a period thereafter of at least twelve hours."

11. Regulation 5 in Part E of the said regulations is amended by adding at the end thereof the words "and so indicate upon the chart."

12. Regulation 7 in Part E of the said regulations is amended by inserting therein after the word "organs" in line four the words in brackets as follows:—" (wearing a mask while so doing)."

13. Regulation 9 in Part E of the said regulations is amended by adding at the end thereof the words "and record her findings on the chart daily."

14. Regulation 15 in Part E of the said regulations is amended as follows:—

(a) by adding under the subheading "During Pregnancy" a paragraph as follows:—

(c) Any presentation other than normal.

(b) by deleting the words "In cases of serious rupture of the perinaeum, or of other injuries of the soft parts" where they appear under the sub-heading "During Labour" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "In any case of rupture of the perineum or soft parts."

(c) by deleting all the words under the subheading "In the case of the child" and inserting in lieu thereof, under the said subheading, the words in lines as follows:—

- Asphyxia.
- Injuries received during birth.
- Any malformation or deformity in a child that seems likely to live.
- Haemorrhage of the newly born.
- Lowered vitality.
- Inflammation of, or discharge from, the eyes, however slight.
- Serious skin eruptions.
- Inflammation about the navel.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937.

By-laws of the Preston Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance, and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Preston.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain, and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws, and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application, accompanied by a copy of these by-laws, shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

A Bush Fire Brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof: Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a Bush Fire Brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such Brigade is established, the Brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

Appointment of Officers.

2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant, and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who in the Board's opinion have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The secretary of the Board, or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.

4. The Board may appoint an Equipment Officer, who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain, where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the Equipment Officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint Bush Fire Control Officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal, and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire-fighting, and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant, and, in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire, shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall, when so directed by the Board, instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a Bush Fire Brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members; (b) fire-fighting members, and (c) associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates:—

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937.

By-laws of the Wandering Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance, and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Wandering.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain, and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws, and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application, accompanied by a copy of these by-laws, shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

A Bush Fire Brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof: Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a Bush Fire Brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such Brigade is established, the Brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

Appointment of Officers.

2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant, and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who in the Board's opinion have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The secretary of the Board, or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.

4. The Board may appoint an Equipment Officer, who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain, where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the Equipment Officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint Bush Fire Control Officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal, and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire-fighting, and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant, and, in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire, shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall, when so directed by the Board, instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a Bush Fire Brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members; (b) fire-fighting members, and (c) associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates:—

(3) Fire-fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.

(4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire-fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.

(5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire-fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.


