Greeting:

I, THE said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you the Honourable Albert Asher Wolff, Puisne Judge of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, to be a Royal Commission generally to investigate, inquire into, report, and advise upon the present condition of the University of Western Australia, including among other matters the constitution, functions, and powers of the Senate and of Convocation respectively, the financial position of the University, the use by the Senate of the University endowment lands and other real and leasehold property belonging to the University, and the government and administration of the University, and, in particular, without in any way limiting the generality of the powers hereby conferred, to do each and all of the following things, that is to say:—

1. As regards the Senate:—To inquire into, report, and advise upon and make recommendations in relation to the following matters:—

- (a) The number of members to constitute the Senate necessary for the good government of the University;
- (b) The mode of election or appointment of members of the Senate;
- (c) The tenure of office of members of the Senate;
- (d) The number of members of the Senate who should be appointed upon the nomination of the Government of the State;
- (e) The number of members of the Senate who should be appointed on the nomination of other persons, institutions, associations, or bodies of persons;
- (f) The number of members of the Senate who should be elected by persons, institutions, associations, or bodies of persons, other than the Government of this State;

(g) The persons, institutions, associations, or bodies of persons who should be authorised to nominate for appointment or to elect members of the Senate;

(h) The qualifications (if any) which persons should possess to be eligible for nomination and appointment or for election as members of the Senate;

(i) The functions and powers of the Senate, and whether the present functions and powers should be reduced or increased, and, in either case, in what manner and to what extent.

2. As regards Convocation:—To inquire into, report, and advise upon and make recommendations in relation to the following matters:—

(a) Whether Convocation should have the right to elect members of the Senate, and, if so, the number of such members who should be elected by Convocation;

(b) The mode of election by Convocation of members of the Senate;

(c) The basis of admission of persons to membership of Convocation, and whether any alteration in such basis is necessary or desirable;

(d) The qualifications (if any) which persons should possess to be eligible for admission to membership of Convocation;

(e) The functions and powers of Convocation, and whether the present functions and powers should be reduced or increased, and, in either case, in what manner and to what extent;

(f) Generally in relation to the usefulness of Convocation and the means by which and the manner in which the usefulness of Convocation might be extended.

3. As regards Finance:—To inquire into, report, and advise upon and make recommendations in relation to the following matters:—

(a) The present assets of the University, and the use which is being made of them;

(b) The present sources of income and their adequacy and the use which is being made of such income;

- (c) The present investments of the University and whether the same have been made to the best advantage of the University;
- (d) The effect on University finance of bequests, legacies, and gifts of property which have been made or given in favour of or to the University, and the consequential undue strain (if any) which has been imposed on the University by maintenance obligations;
- (e) The necessity for or desirableness of obtaining for the University legislative authority to utilise for maintenance purposes portion of the income derived from trust estate regardless of the trusts affecting such estate;
- (f) The scholarships which are or may be granted by the University, and the manner in which such scholarships compare in number and value with scholarships granted by other Universities in the Commonwealth of Australia.

4. As regards University endowment lands and other real and leasehold property belonging to the University:—To inquire into, report, and advise upon and make recommendations in relation to the following matters:—

- (a) The University endowment lands previously and now held by the University;
- (b) Other real and leasehold lands previously and now held by the University;
- (c) The use which previously has been made and is now being made by the University of the University endowment lands and other real and leasehold property aforesaid;
- (d) Whether such use has been for the best advantage of the University, having regard to the purposes for which the said lands were granted to or acquired by the University;
- (e) The value of the University endowment lands aforesaid as a means of assisting the University.

5. As regards administration:—To inquire into, report, and advise upon and make recommendations in relation to the following matters:—

- (a) The present system of administration and its effectiveness;
- (b) The manner in which the administration of the University might be improved;
- (c) The means by which the system of administration can be enlarged in order to extend the scope of the activities and operations of the University with a view to—
- (i) encouraging the people of the State to develop a greater and more intimate interest in the University; and
- (ii) providing for the people of the State greater facilities for educational instruction and the acquisition of knowledge.

6. Generally in relation to all the matters aforesaid, to consider and make any recommendations, including any legislation you may deem necessary or desirable, which in your opinion are justified or warranted by any of the inquiries and investigations made by you under the authority of these presents.

AND I hereby declare that you shall, by virtue of this Commission, be a Royal Commission within the Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902, as reprinted in the Appendix to the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1928, and that you shall have the powers of a Royal Commission or the chairman thereof under that Act.

AND I hereby request you, as soon as reasonably may be, to report to me in writing the result of this your Commission.

WHEREAS by section 17 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-40, it is provided the Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare (*inter alia*) what length of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net; Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, declare and proclaim as follows:—That with respect to fishing nets known as garfish nets, for catching fish of the species set out in the First Schedule hereto, to be used in all tidal waters open to net-fishing at Peel's Inlet (Mandurah) from the 1st day of February to the 31st day of October in each year, a net with the length of net and size of mesh as set out in the Second Schedule hereto shall be a lawful net.

First Schedule.

Garfish only.

Second Schedule.

Total length of net not exceeding 150 fathoms. Length of bunt not more than one-third of the total length of the net. Mesh of bunt not less than 1½ inches. Length of wing not less than the length of the bunt, nor less than one-third of the total length of net. Mesh of wing not less than 2 inches.

The Proclamation relative to garfish nets dated the 8th March, 1922, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 10th March, 1922, is hereby rescinded.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-40, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: And whereas by section 10 of the said Act, every such Proclamation may be revoked or varied at any time: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power thereunto so enabling, vary the Proclamation dated 19th December, 1940 (published in the *Government Gazette* of 3rd January, 1941), by omitting from the Schedule thereto the paragraphs numbered (16) and (17) and inserting in lieu thereof the following new paragraph (16):—

(16) That portion of the waters of Champion Bay (Geraldton) extending from a point on the foreshore 100 yards eastward of the Railway Jetty to a point on the foreshore 100 yards to the westward of the Esplanade Jetty, and thence half a mile into the waters of the said Champion Bay.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1939, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons, to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of subleasing: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 22243 (Geraldton Lot 1219) should vest in and be held by the Municipality of Geraldton in trust for Park and Recreation: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Municipality of Geraldton in trust for Park and Recreation, with power to the said Municipality of Geraldton to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one (21) years from the date of the lease.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section 10: And whereas Amalgamated Collieries of W.A., Limited, a duly incorporated company, having its principal place of business at St. George's terrace, Perth, and being an employer within the meaning of the said Act, has duly made application in accordance with the Act and the regulations thereunder, for exemption from the operation of the said section 10, and has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that as such employer aforesaid it has established a fund for insurance against its

said liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a bond of the Bank of New South Wales for £5,000, charged with all payments to become due by the said company under its said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred upon him by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said Amalgamated Collieries of W.A., Ltd., as such employer aforesaid from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, for a period of twelve months calculated from and including the 1st day of March, 1941.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section 10: And whereas Midland Railway Company of Western Australia, Limited, a duly incorporated company, having its principal place of business at Midland Junction, and being an employer within the meaning of the said Act, has duly made application, in accordance with the Act and the regulation thereunder, for exemption from the operation of the said section 10, and has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that as such employer aforesaid it has established a fund for insurance against its said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a fixed deposit receipt of the English, Scottish, and Australian Bank for £5,000, charged with all payments to become due by the said company under its said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred upon him by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said Midland Railway Company of Western Australia, Limited, as such employer aforesaid, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, for a period which shall be deemed to have commenced on the 8th day of February, 1941, and which shall end on the 7th day of February, 1942.

Canning Road District—Redivision into Wards and Reallocation of Members.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1885/29.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1939, doth hereby redivide the Canning Road District (hitherto divided in five Wards) into four Wards, the boundaries of which are described in the Schedule hereunder; and, consequent upon such redivision, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the said advice and consent, doth hereby declare that the number of members to constitute the Canning Road Board shall be eight, in lieu of thirteen, and doth determine that the eight members shall be allocated to the Wards as follows:—West Ward—2 members; Central Ward—2 members; South Ward—2 members; North Ward—2 members, and doth declare and direct that all the existing members of the Board of the said District shall go out of office on the 18th day of April, 1941, and that the date of the election consequent thereon shall be the 19th day of April, 1941.

Provided that persons owning or occupying rateable land in the Denmark Road District shall, subject to obtaining the necessary permit, be at liberty to depasture upon any reserve aforesaid horses up to a maximum number of five horses at one time without payment of any fee.

3. (1) Any person who desires to place any horse or other great cattle or any sheep upon any reserve aforesaid may apply to the Denmark Road Board for a permit so to do.

(2) The application shall be in writing, signed by the applicant, and shall contain a statement of the following information:—

- (a) the kind and number of animals to be depastured;
- (b) the brands, colour, marks, and sex of horses or great cattle proposed to be depastured;
- (c) the period for which the depasturing is desired.

4. (1) Any application for a permit under these by-laws may be granted or refused by the Board, and, when granted, shall be so granted subject to payment of the fee prescribed by these by-laws and to due compliance by the applicant with all the requirements of these by-laws.

(2) If any person, being the holder of a permit issued under these by-laws, makes default in the due payment of any fee payable by him hereunder, or in the due observance of these by-laws, the Board may, by notice in writing to such person, cancel his said permit.

5. The fees payable for depasturing any horse or other great cattle and any sheep on any reserve shall be:—

- (a) for each horse or for each head of other great cattle—ten shillings per annum.
- (b) for every 1,000 sheep or fractional part of 1,000 sheep—ten shillings per week.

6. Every permit issued under these by-laws shall be in writing signed by the secretary of the Board, and shall be in the form prescribed in the Appendix to these by-laws.

7. (1) Any horse or other great cattle or any sheep found depasturing on any reserve, and in respect whereof no current permit under these by-laws has been issued by the Board, or in respect whereof a permit issued by the Board has expired or has been cancelled, may be removed from such reserve by any officer or servant of the Board, upon the order of the secretary of the Board.

(2) The removal from the reserve provided for in paragraph (1) shall in every case be carried out at the risk of the owner of the animals removed; and any expense incurred by the Board in effecting such removal shall be a debt owing to the Board by such owner.

8. The moving of animals to or from any reserve by a permit holder shall be carried out at all times, subject to the supervision and directions of the Board's ranger, and the arrangements for such moving shall be made with the said ranger accordingly.

9. The Board and the officers and servants of the Board shall not in any way be liable for any loss of or damage or injury to any animals depasturing or upon any reserve, whether pursuant to a permit issued under these by-laws or not.

10. If any person by any act or omission contravenes to any respect any provision of these by-laws, he shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, and, in addition, when the offence is of a continuing nature, to a daily penalty not exceeding two pounds for every day or part of a day during which the offence continues, but so that the penalty imposed shall not exceed in the aggregate the sum of twenty pounds.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937.

By-laws of the Plantagenet Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance, and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Plantagenet.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain, and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws, and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application accompanied by a copy of these by-laws shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

A Bush Fire Brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof: Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a Bush Fire Brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such Brigade is established, the Brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

Appointment of Officers.

2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant, and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who in the Board's opinion have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The secretary of the Board, or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.

4. The Board may appoint an Equipment Officer, who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain, where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the Equipment Officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint Bush Fire Control Officers in accordance with the requirements of the District and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal, and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act, shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting, and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant, and, in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall, when so directed by the Board, instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a Bush Fire Brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members; (b) fire-fighting members; and (c) associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates:—

(i) Owner or occupier of land within the Brigade Area—minimum subscription of	10 0
(ii) Other persons—a minimum subscription of	5 0

(3) Fire-fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.

(4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.

(5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire-fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.

(6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire-fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

Meetings of Brigades.

9. Meetings of the Brigades established within the district shall be held annually and immediately before the closed fire season, and other meetings when requested by two or more captains of Brigades.

These by-laws under the Bush Fires Act, 1937, were passed by a resolution of the Plantagenet Road Board (a local authority under the provisions of such Act) at a meeting held at Mount Barker on November 8th, 1940.

By-laws of the Beverley Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance, and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Beverley.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain, and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations thereunder, the Brigades shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws, and a name shall be given to the Brigade, and application accompanied by a copy of these by-laws shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

Each Ward Brigade shall be responsible for the combatting of fires within its specified ward. The fire area of the Central Ward Brigade shall embrace all lands within a radius of seven miles from the Beverley Road Board Office, other areas being as defined by the Road Board Ward boundaries.

Appointment of Officers.

2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant, and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who in the Board's opinion, have the necessary qualifications and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The secretary of the Board or such person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.

4. The Board may appoint an Equipment Officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain, where, if possible, motor trucks, can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the Equipment Officer shall appoint a depot Officer to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint a Bush Fire Control Officer in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal, and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for the duties under this Act, shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in the fire-fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant, and, in the absence of the first, the second or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall, when so directed by the Board, instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

7. The membership of a Bush Fire Brigade may consist of all owners and occupiers of rateable land within the road district of the Board, together with persons who shall signify to the captain their desire to become members of the Brigade.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., and generally for the purpose of this Act shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act, and all reimbursements made by the Board to any officer of any Brigade or other person for travelling or other expenses, costs, damages, or disbursements incurred by such officer or person under this Act, or in connection with the working of any Brigade, shall be in the sole and absolute discretion of the Board.

Meetings of the Brigade.

9. A meeting of a Brigade may be called by the captain thereof at any time he may deem necessary and convenient, by advertisement in the district newspaper.

These by-laws under the Bush Fires Act, 1937, were passed by a resolution of the Beverley Road Board (local authority) at a meeting held at Beverley on 9th November, 1940.

By-laws relating to Fencings.

P.W. 591/38.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1939 the Road Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Denmark Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws.

1. Repeal:—All by-laws made by the Denmark Road Board relating to "fencing."

2. Make the following Fencing by-laws:—"The owner of any land abutting on any road in any town-site shall fence all such boundaries so abutting, with such description of any fence as may be directed by the Board, and shall maintain every such boundary fence erected, or to be erected, in good order. In the event of such fence not being erected or repaired after

due notice has been given so to do, the Board may fence or repair such fences and recover the cost of so doing from the owner or owners of the land.

Fences on frontage of streets or roads in the Town-site shall be constructed with sawn or squared timber posts 5 in. x 3 in. not less than 18 in. in the ground, and 4 feet out of the ground, with not less than two 4 in. x 2 1/4 in. sawn rails, and pickets not more than 3 in. apart, or posts and rails as above, with 3 foot cyclone mesh netting.

Fences on r.o.w. and divisional fences to consist of sawn or squared timber posts 5 in. x 3 in. not less than 18 in. in the ground, and four feet out of the ground, with two 4 in. x 2 in. sawn rails, and covered with not less than five foot g.e. iron, or sawn boards not less than five feet high, such boards to be nailed close together so as not to leave any space between.

Posts to be not more than nine feet apart. The Board will consider the erection of any more substantial or ornamental fence."

A resolution adopting the foregoing by-laws was passed by the Denmark Road Board on the 10th day of February, 1941.
