WHEREAS by regulation 2 of the Building Regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the Road Districts contained in the Second Schedule to the Road Districts Act, 1919-1939, it is provided, in reference to buildings on any block of land laid out for such purpose, that the area allotted to any building intended to be or capable of being used as a dwelling-house, and the open space used in connection with such building, shall, together, be not less than the area for the time being fixed by Proclamation as the proper area to be allotted to such building. Now therefore I the said Lieutenant. to such building: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the

proper area to be allotted to every building intended to be or capable of being used as a dwelling-house and the open space to be used therewith in the South Perth Road District, shall be an area of not less than 6,000 square feet.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby redivide the Wandering Road District into three Wards, with the names, boundaries, and number of members allotted to each Ward as described in the Schedule hereto:

SCHEDULE.

North-East Ward.

Bounded on the westward by lines commencing on the district boundary at a point in prolongation north of the east boundary of Late Poison Lease 8/229 and extending south along said prolongation and east boundary to the north boundary of late Poison Lease 8/232; thence east and south along parts of the north and east boundaries of the latter lease to the northern side of Road No. 4386; thence eastward along said side of Road No. 4386 to the prelongation north of the west boundary of

Avon Location 12341; thence south along said prolongation and east and south along the north and east boundaries of said location, east along part of the north boundary of Location 9143, and south along the east boundary of the latter location and the east boundaries of Locations 5978, 5976, 4771, and 4952 to the northwestern side of Road No. 556 at the south-east corner of the last-mentioned location; thence north-eastward along said side of Road No. 556 to the prolongation west of the south boundary of Location 5783; thence east along said prolongation and part of the south boundary of Location 5783 to the prolongation north of the west boundary of Location 5623; thence south along said prolongation and west boundary of Location 5623 and the west boundaries of Locations 5622, 5621, and 5620, east along part of the south boundary of the last-mentioned location, again south along the east boundary daries of Locations 5741 and 5742 and west along the south boundary of the last-mentioned location to the east boundary of Location 5786; thence south along the east boundaries of Locations 5786, 12244, and 25837, and west and south along the north and part of the west boundary of Location 25835 to the prolongation east of the south boundary of Location 10965; thence west and north to and along the south and a west boundary of Location 10965 and west, north, and again west along parts of the south and west boundaries of Location 6603 and part of the south boundary of Location 6605 to the prolongation north of the east boundary of Location 19781; thence south along said prolongation and east boundary of Location 19781 and its prolongation south to the northern side of Road No. 771; on the sonthward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned point and extending eastward along the northern side of Road No. 771 to the prolongation north of the west boundary of Location 11442; thence south and east along the said prolongation and west boundary and the south boundary of the last-mentioned location and south, east, and north along part of the west, the south, and the east boundaries of Location 15055 and the prolongation north of the last-mentioned boundary to the northern side of Road No. 771; thence eastward along said side of Road No. 771 to the prolongation west of a south boundary of Location 21499; thence eastward along said prolongation and south boundary of Location 21499, south and east along a west and the southernmost boundary of the last-mentioned location, and contimning eastward along the southern boundary of Location 11181 and north along part of its east boundary to the prolongation west of the south boundary of Location. tion 8615; thence east along said prolongation and south boundary of Location 8615 and north along its east boundary and the prolongation north to the north-western side of Road No. 771; thence north-eastward along said side of Road No. 771 and the north-western side of Road No. 359 to the west boundary of Location 6688; thence north, east, and south along the west, north, and east boundaries of the last-mentioned location to the north-western side of Road No. 359 at the south-east corner of Location 6688 and north-eastward along said side of Road No. 359 to its intersection with the district boundary; on the eastward and northward by parts of the district boundary from the last-mentioned inter-section to the starting point. (2 members.)

South Ward.

Bounded on the north-westward by the southern boundary of the North-East Ward from the eastern boundary of the district to the prolongation south of the east Loundary of Location 19781; thence by lines continuing from the latter point westward along the northern side of Road No. 771 to the prolongation north of the easternmost boundary of Location 6654; thence southward along said prolongation and easternmost boundary, and west, south and again west along a south, an east, and the southernmost boundary of said Location 6654 and the prolongation west of the last-mentioned boundary to the eastern boundary of Location 1720; thence southward along said eastern boundary of Location 1720 and eastern boundaries of Locations 5133 and 5134, west along the south boundary of the last-mentioned location, south along part of the east boundary and west along the south boundary of Location 17694 to the western side of Road No. 770, southward along said side of Road No. 770 to the north boundary of Location 2063; thence west along part of the north, and south along the west boundary of Location 2063 to the district boundary; on the eastward and southward by parts of the district boundary from the last-mentioned point to the starting point. (3 members.)

North Ward.

Bounded on the northward and eastward by parts of the district boundary and the western boundary of the North-East Ward from the 33-Mile Post on the Perth-Albany road to the junction of the said western boundary of the North-East Ward with the north-western boundary of the South Ward; on the southward by part of the north-western boundary of the South Ward, from the said junction to the southern boundary of the district at the south-west corner of Avon Location 2063; thence by part of the southern boundary of the district from the south-west corner of said Location 2063 to the western boundary of the district at the intersection of the western side of the Perth-Albany road with the right bank of the Hotham river; on the westward by part of the district boundary from the last-mentioned point to the starting point. The Government Transways Act, 1912, and the Public Works Act, 1902.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2 of the Public Works Act, 1902, that a tramway is a public work for the purposes of the said Act, and by section 11 of the said Act that the Governor may by Order in Conneil authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any public work: And whereas it is enacted by section 3 of the Government Transways Act, 1912, that the Minister may, pursuant to any Order in Council whereby the construction of transways is authorised, construct such tramways on roads, and in relation thereto may do and perform all the acts, matters and things in the said section 3 mentioned: And whereas it is enacted the said section 3 mentioned: And whereas it is enacted by section 2 of the said Government Trainways Act, 1912, that all trainways the property of the Government and declared by the Governor by Order in Council to be a Government trainway shall be Government trainways within the meaning of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lientenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in version of the property surface. and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said two Acts respectively, doth hereby authorise the construction of the trackless transway as described in the Schedule hereto: And doth hereby declare that the said trackless tramway when so constructed as aforesaid shall be a Government tramway under and for the purposes of the Government Tramways Act, 1912:

The Schednle above referred to.

Commencing at a point at the intersection of the eastern alignment of Gregory street with the northern alignment of Cambridge street, a distance of 4 miles 25 chains 75 links from the commencement of the Wembley route at Trafalgar road; thence proceeding along Cambridge street in a westerly direction to the terminus at the intersection of Keane street and the Bonlevarde with Cambridge street, a distance of 75 chains 18 links from point of commencement at Gregory street.

The return journey will proceed along the same street as described above, but in the opposite direction, making a total distance of 1m. 70ch. 36 links or thereabouts and more particularly delineated on tramway plans.

BUSH FIRES ACT; 1937.

By-laws of the Pingelly Road Board relating to the establishment, maintenance and equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Pingelly.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application accompanied by a copy of these by-laws shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

A Bush Fire Brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof. Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a Bush Fire Brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such Brigade is established, the Brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

Appointment of Officers.

- 2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who, in the Board's opinion, have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.
- 3. The secretary of the Board or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.
- The Board may appoint an Equipment Officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the Equipment Officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.
- 5. The Board shall appoint Bush Fire Control Officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act, shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall when so directed by the Board instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

- 7. (1) The membership of a Bush Fire Brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members; (b) Fire fighting members; and (c) Associate members.
