Profiteering Prevention Act, 1939. PROCLAMATION No. 7

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia tis Dependencies in the Common wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Profiteering Prevention Act, 1939, that the Governor may from time to time on the report and advice of the Commissioner, under section 11 of the Act, fix and declare for any commodity the maximum price at which it may be sold, according to or upon any principle or condition prescribed, and may vary any price previously fixed, but so as to apply only to future transactions: And whereas, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 28th day of February, 1941, the Governor fixed and declared that the maximum price at which commodities (save and except such commodities which may be exempted by Proclamation) which had been or which might thereafter be declared as such under the said Act should be sold as from the date of the said Proclamation should be determined in accordance with the principles and conditions prescribed in the Schedule to the said Proclamation: And whereas the Commissioner of Prices, under section 11 of the said Act, has now reported and advised that the maximum price so fixed in accordance with the said certain principles and conditions should now be amended: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and on the report of the Commissioner of Prices aforesaid, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me in that behalf by section 13 of the said Act, do hereby fix and declare that the

maximum price at which commodities (save and except such commodities which may be exempted by Proclama-tion) which have been or which may hereafter be declared as such under the said Act shall be sold as from the date of this Proclamation shall be determined in accordance with the principles and conditions pre-scribed in the Schedule to the said Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 28th day of February, 1941, and subject to a further condition, to be inserted after paragraph 4 of the Schedule to the said Proclamation, and to stand as paragraph 4A, as follows:

Variation of Gross Profit.

4A. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Proclamation, the Commissioner may determine a higher or lower rate of gross profit instead of that to which a trader or manufacturer would be entitled on any goods under the provisions of this Proclamation, and the maximum price at which, under those provisions, any such goods may be sold by the trader or manufacturer shall be varied accordingly.

THE HOSPITALS ACT, 1927.

M.H.D. 389/32.

Department of Public Health, Perth, 22nd April, 1941.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting in exercise of the powers conferred by section 37 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, has been pleased to amend the regulations made under the said Act, as published in the Government Gazette on the 6th day of December, 1940, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended by adding thereto after regulation 10, a new regulation, to stand as regulation 11, as follows:

The Principal Medical Officer may transfer any hospital patient to a home for the aged or infirm, if he considers such transfer necessary, and provided the home receiving such patient is better equipped for dealing with such patient.

The Principal Medical Officer may transfer any inmate of a home for the aged and infirm to any hospital, if he considers such transfer necessary, and provided such hospital has special facilities or equipment for treating such inmate.

- (3) Fire-fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.
- (4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire-fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.
- (5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire-aghting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.
- (6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire-fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

Meetings of Brigade.

9. November and April of each year.

These by-laws under the Bush Fires Act, 1937, were passed by a resolution of the Harvey Road Board (a local authority under the provisions of such Act) at a meeting held at Harvey on 9th December, 1940.

matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to declare the said agreement an Award: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 63 of the Act and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court :-

Memorandum of Agreement.

1.—Definitions.

- (a) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker employed for less than five (5) consecutive working days, where a five-day week is worked, or for less than six (6) consecutive working days, where a six-day week is worked. This shall not apply to workers mentioned in clause 6 (b).
- (b) "'Wet ground" shall mean ground in which, in the opinion of the Chief Executive Officer, or such other person as may be authorised by him, it is impracticable for workers to work without getting wet feet.
- (c) "Concretor" shall mean any worker engaged in mixing, wheeling or packing concrete, including machine mixing.
 (d) "Permanent yard or depot" shall be deemed to
- mean and include a permanent place wherein are stored or kept plant, equipment, and materials, or a place where vehicles are parked or horses stabled.
- (e) "Municipal outside worker" or "other worker" shall, for the purpose of clause 6, and without limiting the rights of the parties under clause 16 (a) (ii) in respect of any class of worker which is not now existing in the industry, mean a worker engaged in all or any of the following classifications:-
 - (1) Single horse-driver,
 - Scoop men.
 - (3) Nursery men (in conjunction with clause 7 (i) (e)).
 - Gardener.
 - Tree pruner.
 - (6) Scythe men.
 - Horse mower men.
 - (8) Motor mower men.
 - Rubbish tip men.
 - (10) Stone kerber.
 - Concrete slab, kerb, or pipe maker's assistant.
 - (12) Road men forming or constructing roads and street surfaces, including footpaths.
 (13) Hammer and gadmen, and hammer and drill
 - men.
 - Spallers and knappers, on roads.
 - (15) Stone pitchers.
 - (16) Men screening gravel or metal.
 - (17) Men throwing material over six feet up into truck or vehicle.
 - Gravel-pit men.
 - (19) Sand-pit men.
 - (20) Drainage workers.
 - (21) Pipe jointers.
 - (22)Tree pullers.
 - (23) Bridge builders.
 - (24)Culvert builders.
 - Grave diggers. (25)
 - (26)Poison carter.
 - Beach inspector.
 - (28)Axeman (sapping, falling or lopping, not grubbing, unless such grubbing entails the cutting of roots of over 12 inches in diameter) where the major portion of the bush to be cut is more than 12 inches in diameter.

2.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to workers eligible to belong to the applicant union and employed in any of the classifications mentioned in clause 6 hereof.

3.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the area comprised within the South-West Land Division over which the Municipalities who are respondents to this Agreement have local governing authority. Award No. 2 of 1938 shall, as from 1st July, 1941, cease to apply to the Northam Municipal Council.

4.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for three (3) years from 1st July, 1941.

5.-Contract of Service.

The contract of service of workers mentioned in subclauses (c), (d), (e), (f), and (l) (i) of clause 6 hereof shall be a weekly one. The contract of service of all other workers in clause 6 shall be a daily one.

7.—Conditions.

- (i) One shilling (1s.) per day extra shall be paid to the following workers:-
 - (a) Casual workers.
 - (b) Concretors, other than slab, kerb and pipe
 - (c) Men engaged on tar or bitumen work, and who come into contact with the tar or bitumen.
 - (d) Men working in wet ground.
 - (e) Nurserymen.
- (ii) Two shillings (2s.) extra per day shall be paid to the operator of the power tar-spraying pressure Provided that such worker shall not be entitled to be paid in addition the allowance prescribed by clause 7 (i) (c).
- (iii) Three shillings (3s.) extra per day shall be paid to workers cleaning bitumen tank or boiler, when so employed. Provided that such worker shall not be entitled to be paid in addition the allowance prescribed by clause 7 (i) (c).

(iv) Leading Hands in charge of not less than

three (3) other workers shall:—

(a) Where the leading hand is himself performing the work of a "Municipal outside worker," be entitled to be paid at the rate of fifteen shillings (15s.) per week in addition to the rate prescribed for a "Municipal outside worker."

(b) Where the leading hand is himself performing any class of work other than that of a "'Municipal outside worker," be entitled to be paid at the rate of six shillings (6s.) per week in addition to the rate prescribed

for the class of work he is performing.

(v) Attendance on Horses:—Drivers who, in addition to the hours of which the working week is composed, are required to attend to horses, shall do so in their own time and shall be paid the following rates in addition to the weekly wage:—

One or two horses-1s. per day and 1s. for Sundav.

More than two horses-2s. per day and 2s. for Sunday.

8.—Payment of Wages.

(a) When a worker has been discharged or has resigned before the usual pay day, he shall be paid all wages due within twenty-four (24) hours of the time

when he has been discharged or has resigned.
(b) Payment of wages shall be made once weekly or once fortnightly, at the discretion of the employer.

(c) No employer shall keep more than two (2) days'

9.—Piecework.

pay in hand.

- (a) An employer may make a contract with any worker or group of workers for payment by results by piecework.
- (b) The rate of payment shall be fixed on the basis that it shall be sufficient to yield to a worker of average capacity for a full week's work of the ordinary hours at least ten per cent. (10%) above the minimum time rate of pay as prescribed herein for such week's work.
- (c) A worker working under any system of payment by results shall receive at least the time rate of pay as prescribed herein.
- (d) Any dispute under this clause shall, in default of agreement between the employer and his workers, or the employer and the union, be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

10.—Special Provisions.

- (a) Travelling:-Where workers are engaged on a job which is more than one and a half (11/2) miles from a permanent yard or depot, such workers shall be provided with travelling facilities or reimbursed any fares necessarily incurred.
- (b) Sanitary arrangements:-Proper sanitary arrangements shall be made on each job for the convenience of all workers.
- (c) Supplying tools:—All tools required by the worker in the performance of his work shall be supplied without charge by the employer.
- (d) First-aid equipment shall be kept in a permanent yard or depot.

11.—Hours.

- (a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work for all workers, to be worked in five and onehalf (5½) days, except in the case of workers mentioned in clause 6 (b), when the forty-four (44) hours shall be worked as mutually agreed between the employer and workers concerned: Provided that this subclause shall be deemed to have been complied with if an eighty-eight (88) hour fortnight is worked. Provided further, that the eighty-eight (88) hour fort-night referred to herein shall only be applied after written permission to work same has been granted by the union.
- (b) By agreement between the employer and the workers employed in any particular establishment, a week's work may be worked in five (5) days.
- (c) The daily spread of hours shall not exceed ten (10) inclusive of not more than one (1) hour for a meal.

- (d) All time worked to make up the hours of duty on any one day shall be worked in a continuous shift.
- (e) The hours of work of all workers whose ordinary duties are carried out during daylight hours shall be performed between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.: Provided that these hours may be varied by agreement between any employer and the union.
- (f) A driver required by the employer to drive any vehicle from or to any permanent yard or depot shall be paid for such time as he is actually driving.

12.—Overtime.

- (a) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job or on any of the named holidays prescribed in clause 13 or on Sundays, he shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at penalty rates.
- (b) If a worker who is required to work during the recognised meal period does not, in consequence, obtain during the shift a full continuous meal period, or loses any portion of the meal period, he shall be paid at double time rates for the period not obtained or any portion lost.
- (c) All time worked before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half.
- (d) Any worker called upon to work on any of the holidays mentioned in clause 13 shall be paid at the rate of double time, except where the employer and the worker mutually agree that any of such days shall not be observed as a holiday, in which case work may be done at ordinary rates and an extra day added to the annual leave as prescribed by clause 14 for each day so worked.
- (e) All work performed on Sunday, except in the case of sanitary employees, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (f) Any sanitary work performed on Saturday night shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

13.-Holidays.

Subject to clause 12 (d), the following days or the days observed in lieu shall be paid holidays, namely:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, local Show Day (or, alternatively, King's Birthday), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

14.—Annual Leave.

- (a) In addition to the holidays prescribed in clause 13 hereof, one (1) week's leave on full pay shall be allowed to all workers on completion of each twelve months' continuous service: Provided that, should the period of continuous service be less than twelve months, the worker shall be entitled to pay in lieu of leave in the proportion that his length of service bears to the full year's employment.
- (b) Where practicable, annual leave shall be granted at Christmas time.
- (c) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay in accordance with clause 15, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.
 - (d) This clause shall not apply to casual hands.

15.—Payment for Sickness.

- (a) A worker, other than a casual hand, shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one half (½) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days (one (1) week's pay) in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause, unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

16.-Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court may appoint, for the purpose of this Agreement, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties as prescribed by the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935. There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Agreement, the functions of:—
 - (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement, or any of them;
 - (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement;
 - (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.
- (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-35, which, for this purpose, are embodied in this Agreement.

17.--Under-Rate Workers.

- (a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

18.—Record.

- (a) A readily intelligible record shall be kept by each employer, containing the following particulars:—
 - (i) The name of each worker.
 - (ii) The time he starts and finishes work each day.
 - (iii) All overtime worked.
 - (iv) The total number of hours worked.
 - (v) The wages (and overtime, if any) paid to each worker.
 - (vi) The amount of fares and special allowances (if any) paid.
- (b) Such record shall be signed by the worker and shall be open for inspection during office hours by the secretary or an accredited representative of the union, and such person may take extracts therefrom.

19.—Posting Copy of Agreement and Union Notices.

The accredited union representative shall not be prevented from posting a copy of this Agreement, or any notice of the union, not exceeding fourteen (14) inches by nine (9) inches, in a suitable place agreed upon between the employer and the union. Failing agreement in this connection, the Board of Reference shall decide where the copy of the Agreement, or the said notice, shall be posted.

20.-Leave of Absence.

For the purpose of this Agreement, leave of absence from duty, without prejudice, shall be granted to the president of the union or the president or secretary of any branch of the union, or any steward duly authorised by the union, without pay, provided that they shall first find satisfactory substitutes, if so required by the employer.

21.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for the time so employed.

It is understood that all the terms of this Agreement have been arrived at, in view of all the circumstances surrounding this dispute, and are not to be regarded as a precedent for this or any other industry.

The term of this Agreement shall be for three (3) years from 1st July, 1941.

5.—Contract of Service.

The contract of service of workers mentioned in subclauses (c), (d), (e), (f), and (k)(i) of clause 6 hereof, shall be a weekly one. The contract of service of all other workers in clause 6 shall be a daily one.

Should any worker not be notified before leaving work that his services will not be required on the next day, he shall be paid for that day, if he duly presents himself for work at the appointed time, provided that, if he cannot be employed on account of wet weather, he shall be notified accordingly, and shall be entitled to two hours' pay. The decision as to whether it is too wet to work shall rest with the Chief Executive Officer, or such other person as may be authorised by him.

7.—Conditions.

- (i) One shilling (1s.) per day extra shall be paid to the following workers:—
 - (a) Casual workers.
 - (b) Concretors, other than slab, kerb or pipe makers.
 - (c) Men engaged on tar or bitumen work and who come into contact with the tar or bitumen.
 - (d) Men working in wet ground.
 - (e) Nurserymen.
 - (f) Men camped on the job—maximum 6s. per week, except where a worker is required to attend to horses on a Sunday, when his maximum shall be 7s. per week.
- (ii) Two shillings (2s.) extra per day shall be paid to the operator of the power tar-spraying pressure machine. Provided that such worker shall not be entitled to be paid in addition the allowance prescribed by clause 7 (i) (c).
- (iii) Three shillings (3s.) extra per day shall be paid to workers cleaning bitumen tank or boiler, when so employed. Provided that such worker shall not be entitled to be paid in addition the allowance prescribed by clause 7 (i) (c).
- (iv) Leading hands in charge of not less than three (3) other workers shall:—
 - (a) Where the leading hand is himself performing the work of a "Road Board worker" be entitled to be paid at the rate of fifteen shillings (15s.) per week, in addition to the rate prescribed for a "Road Board worker."
 - (b) Where the leading hand is himself performing any class of work other than that of a "Road Board worker" be entitled to be paid at the rate of six shillings (6s.) per week, in addition to the rate prescribed for the class of work he is performing.
- (v) Attendance on Horses:—Drivers who, in addition to the hours of which the working week is composed, are required to attend to horses, shall do so in their own time and shall be paid the following rates in addition to the weekly wage:—

One or two horses—1s. per day and 1s. for Sunday. More than two horses—2s. per day and 2s. for Sunday.

8.-Payment of Wages.

(a) When a worker has been discharged or has resigned before the usual pay day, he shall be paid all wages due within twenty-four (24) hours of the time when he has been discharged or has resigned.

(b) Payment of wages shall be made once weekly or once fortnightly, at the discretion of the employer.

(c) No employer shall keep more than two (2) days' pay in hand.

9.—Piecework.

- (a) An employer may make a contract with any worker or group of workers for payment by results by piecework.
- (b) The rate of payment shall be fixed on the basis that it shall be sufficient to yield to a worker of average capacity for a full week's work of the ordinary hours at least ten per cent. (10%) above the minimum time rate of pay as prescribed herein for such week's work.
- (c) A worker working under any system of payment by results shall receive at least the time rate of pay as prescribed herein.
- (d) Any dispute under this clause shall, in default of agreement between the employer and his workers or the employer and the union, be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

10.—Special Provisions.

- (a) Camping on the job:-
 - (i) On work which necessitates camping on the job, all reasonable goods and camping outfits to be collected at the depot and returned to the depot on completion of the job.
 - (ii) Shifting camp:—All shifting of camp to be done in the employer's time.
- (b) Travelling:—Where workers are engaged on a job which is more than one and a half (1½) miles from a permanent yard or depot, such workers shall be provided with travelling facilities or reimbursed any fares necessarily incurred.
- (c) Sanitary arrangements:—Proper sanitary arrangements shall be made on each job for the convenience of all workers.
- (d) Supplying tools:—All tools required by the worker in the performance of his work shall be supplied without charge by the employer.
- (e) Workers working in isolated places:—A driver of a roller, grader, or tractor shall not work alone on construction work in isolated places.
 - (f) Medicine chest and first-aid Equipment:-
 - (i) When workers are engaged on work which necessitates camping on a job, a medicine chest and first-aid equipment shall be supplied by the employer.
 - (ii) First-aid equipment shall be kept in a permanent yard or depot.

11.—Hours.

- (a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work for all workers, to be worked in five and one-half (5½) days, except in the case of workers mentioned in clause 6 (b), when the forty-four (44) hours shall be worked as mutually agreed between the employer and workers concerned: Provided that this subclause shall be deemed to have been complied with if an eighty-eight (88) hour fortnight is worked. Provided further, that the eighty-eight (88) hour fortnight referred to herein shall only be applied after written permission to work same has been granted by the union.
- (b) By agreement between the employer and the workers employed in any particular establishment, a week's work may be worked in five (5) days.
- (c) The daily spread of hours shall not exceed ten (10) inclusive of not more than one (1) hour for a meal.
- (d) All time worked to make up the hours of duty on any one day shall be worked in a continuous shift.
- (e) The hours of work of all workers whose ordinary duties are carried out during daylight hours shall be performed between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.: Provided that these hours may be varied by agreement between any employer and the union.
- (f) A driver required by the employer to drive any vehicle from or to any permanent yard or depot shall be paid for such time as he is actually driving.

12.—Overtime.

(a) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job or on any of the named holidays prescribed in clause 13, or on Sundays, he shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at penalty rates,

- (b) If a worker who is required to work during the recognised meal period does not, in consequence, obtain during the shift a full continuous meal period, or loses any portion of the meal period, he shall be paid at double time rates for the period not obtained, or any portion lost.
- (c) All time worked before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half.
- (d) Any worker called upon to work on any of the holidays mentioned in clause 13 shall be paid at the holidays mentioned in clause 13 shall be paid at the rate of double time, except where the employer and the worker mutually agree that any of such days shall not be observed as a holiday, in which case work may be done at ordinary rates, and an extra day added to the annual leave as prescribed by clause 14 for each day or worked. so worked.
- (e) All work performed on Sunday, except in the case of sanitary employees, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (f) Any sanitary work performed on Saturday night shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

13.-Holidays.

Subject to clause 12 (d), the following days, or the days observed in lien, shall be paid holidays, namely:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, local Show Day (or, alternatively, King's Birthday), Christmas Day, and Paring Day. Boxing Day.

14.—Annual Leave.

- (a) In addition to the holidays prescribed in clause 13 hereof, one (1) week's leave on full pay shall be allowed to all workers on completion of each twelve months' continuous service: Provided that, should the period of continuous service be less than twelve months, the worker shall be entitled to pay in lieu of leave in the proportion that his length of service bears to the full year's employment.
- (b) Where practicable, annual leave shall be granted at Christmas time.
- (c) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay in accordance with clause 15, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.
 (d) This clause does not apply to casual hands.

15.—Payment for Sickness.

- (a) A worker, other than a casual hand, shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-half (½) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days (one (1) week's pay) in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker in entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

16.—Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court may appoint, for the purpose of this Agreement, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties as prescribed by the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935. There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Agreement the arrived at between the parties to this Agreement, the functions of:-
 - (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement, or any of them;

- (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.
- (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which, for this purpose, are embodied in this Agreement.

17.—Under-rate Workers.

- (a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

18.—Record.

- (a) A readily intelligible record shall be kept by each employer, containing the following particulars:—
 - (i) The name of each worker.
 - (ii) The time he starts and finishes work each day.
 - (iii) All overtime worked.
 - (iv) The total number of hours worked.
 - (v) The wages (and overtime, if any) paid to each worker.
 - (vi) The amount of fares and special allowances (if any) paid.
- (b) Such record shall be signed by the worker and shall be open for inspection, during office hours, by the secretary or an accredited representative of the union, and such person may take extracts therefrom.

19.-Posting Copy of Agreement and Union Notices.

The accredited union representative shall not be pre-The accredited union representative shall not be prevented from posting a copy of this Agreement or any notice of the union not exceeding fourteen (14) inches by nine (9) inches, in a suitable place agreed upon between the employer and the union. Failing agreement in this connection, the Board of Reference shall decide where the copy of the Agreement or the said notice shall be posted.

20.-Leave of Absence.

For the purpose of this Agreement, leave of absence from duty, without prejudice, shall be granted to the president of the union or the president or secretary of any branch of the union, or any steward duly authorised by the union, without pay, provided that they shall first find satisfactory substitutes, if so required by the employer.

21.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for the time so employed.

It is understood that all the terms of this Agreement have been arrived at in view of all the circumstances surrounding this dispute, and are not to be regarded as a precedent for this or any other industry.

I certify pursuant to section 63 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, that the foregoing is a copy of the Agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

AWARD-SHOP ASSISTANTS (METROPOLITAN).

In the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia.

(No. 10 of 1940.)

Between the West Australian Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and H. V. McKay, Bon Marche, Ltd., and others as per Schedule attached hereto, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties: And whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination: And whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference: And whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to declare the said agreement an Award: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 63 of the Act and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note: Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to the industries mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereunder and to the industries conducted by the respondents named in the second column hereunder and similar industries conducted by other persons, firms, or companies in respect of workers following the vocations mentioned herein: Provided that it shall not apply to workers who are at

present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, or in any industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935.

2.—Area.

This Award shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the General Post Office, in the city of Perth.

3.—Term.

This Award shall apply for a period of three (3) years from the date of delivery, subject to the right of either party to apply to amend same in pursuance of the provisions of the Act.

4.—Definitions.

- (a) "Shop assistant" shall mean a worker substantially performing one or more of the following duties in retail establishments:—Selling goods, weighing, assembling and/or preparing goods for sale, attending to stock, receiving cash and dressing out for display of goods. The term shall include soda fountain and/or milk bar assistants, assistants in country order departments, window dressers and messengers.
- (b) "Storeman" shall mean a worker substantially performing one or more of the following duties:—Receiving, storing, assembling, weighing, branding, stacking, or unpacking or distributing goods in a shop, store or warehouse, or delivering goods from a shop, store, or warehouse for transit.
- (c) "Head storeman" shall mean a worker who may perform the duties of a storeman and who supervises or directs the work of one or more other workers.
- (d) "Storeman working singly" shall mean a storeman working where no other storeman is employed in the establishment.
- (e) "Despatch hand" shall mean a worker who is substantially engaged in handling or receiving goods in or from departments for despatch, or who passes them over to the packing room, or prepares and hands over packages to carters for delivery and who, if required, shall be responsible for the proper checking off of such packages and for the proper branding and marking thereof, and keeping necessary records, such as rail notes and cart notes.
- (f) "Head despatch hand" shall mean a worker who is placed by his employer in charge of one or more despatch hands.
- (g) "Packer" shall mean a worker who packs goods for transport by rail or ship. A worker who packs goods for delivery by road transport where the destination of such goods is beyond the area covered by this Award shall be classed as a packer.
- (h) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice: Provided that the minimum engagement of all shop assistants engaged as casual hands shall not be less than one day. The minimum engagement of all other workers shall be four (4) hours, to be worked in one continuous period.
- A worker engaged and not permitted to commence work shall receive two (2) hours' pay at the prescribed rate of pay.
- (i) "Adult'"—For the purpose of this Award the word "adult" shall mean a worker twenty-one (21) years of age and over, or a worker who is in receipt of the prescribed adult rate of pay.
- (j) "Weekly hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one (1) week's notice on either side. Such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week: Provided that any worker employed for a period of four (4) consecutive weeks or less shall be classed as a casual hand and paid not less than the minimum rate of wages herein prescribed for a casual hand, but this proviso shall not apply in cases where a worker employed as a weekly hand has been dispensed with for incompetence or unsuitableness or any cause referred to in clause 18 hereof.
- (k) "Department" shall mean a section of an establishment in or from which classified goods are sold or offered for sale by retail.

- (1) "Wholesale establishment" shall mean any warehouse or place where goods are exclusively or principally sold for resale and/or where goods are sold for consumption and/or use in another business.
- (m) "Canvasser" shall mean a worker who solicits orders for goods by retail from persons in private households, boarding houses, hotels, or other residential establishments, or from persons employed in offices, shops or warehouses, but shall not include motor vehicle salesmen.
- (n) "Collector" shall mean a worker whose principal duties consist of collecting money for his employer in places other than the employer's establishment.

The duties of a canvasser or collector may be amalgamated to suit the convenience of the employer's business.

5.—Chemists' Shops.

Any worker employed in a chemist's shop shall be subject to the terms of this Award up to the time he or she becomes indentured to the profession.

6.-Hours.

The hours of work shall be as follow:—
(a) Retail Establishments (other than Fourth Schedule Shops):—

- (i) Shop assistants:—Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work. Such hours shall be worked between 8.30 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Monday to Friday, inclusive, and between 8.30 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturday.
- (ii) Storemen, packers, and dispatch hands:—Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work. Such hours shall be worked between 7.20 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Monday to Friday, inclusive, and between 7.20 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturday.

Provided that no day's work shall exceed a spread of nine (9) hours, Monday to Friday inclusive, and four (4) hours on Saturday, to be worked in one continuous shift.

- (iii) By agreement between the employer and the workers employed in any particular establishment, the week's work may be worked in five (5) days, exclusive of Saturday and Sunday, in which case no day's work shall exceed eight (8) hours forty-eight (48) minutes.
- (iv) On the day mutually agreed upon by the parties hereto to be observed as Christmas Eve for the purpose of a late shopping night, the ordinary hours of work may be extended by agreement between the parties.
- (b) Fourth Schedule Shops:—The workers employed in shops comprised in the Fourth Schedule of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1932 (whose hours of work shall not exceed forty-four (44) per week), shall be worked to suit the convenience of the employer's business: Provided that, from week to week, the worker shall be notified by the employer of the half-day which shall be granted in the afternoon upon which his or her services will not be required in each week.
- (c) Wholesale Establishments:—The number of hours per week usually and customarily worked prior to the date of this Award shall be observed, but shall not exceed forty-four (44) hours per week: Provided that the starting time shall not be earlier than 7.30 a.m. and the finishing time not later than 6 p.m. Monday to Friday, inclusive, and 7.30 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturday. Provided further, that no day's work shall exceed a spread of nine (9) hours, Monday to Friday inclusive, and four (4) hours on Saturday, to be worked in one continuous shift.
- (d) On one night in the week immediately preceding or immediately following the Christmas holidays, weekly hands in wholesale establishments may be called upon to work overtime until 9.30 p.m., without payment of overtime, in which case such weekly hands shall be allowed an extra holiday on full pay on the next working day immediately preceding or following New Year's Day

(e) The spread of hours for females shall not exceed nine (9) hours.

7.—Meal Times.

- (a) Retail Shops (other than Fourth Schedule Shops):—
 - (i) One hour for any meal shall be given and taken. Except as provided in subclause (iii) hereunder, the lunch hour shall be between 12 noon and 2.15 p.m.
 - (ii) Tea hour shall start within fifteen (15) minutes after the prescribed finishing time.
 - (iii) On the first working day of the week and on any Friday, the lunch hour may be taken between 11.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m.

Provided that, if the employer so desires, he may substitute some other day in that week for the first working day herein referred to. The employer shall notify the union in writing of such substitution within twenty-four (24) hours.

- (iv) On a third working day in any week the 11.30 a.m. to 2.30 p.m. lunch hour spread may be used, but this provision shall not be exercised without the written permission of the union
- (v) When the provisions of subclauses (iii) and/or (iv) of this subclause are availed of, a break of ten (10) minutes shall be allowed in the morning to any worker whose lunch hour shall commence not earlier than 1.30 p.m. A break of ten (10) minutes shall also be allowed in the afternoon to any worker whose lunch hour shall commence not later than 12 o'clock noon.
- (b) Fourth Schedule Shops:—Meal hours in Fourth Schedule Shops shall be taken at the time most convenient to the employer's business: Provided that one hour shall be given and taken for each meal and that not more than five (5) or less than three (3) hours' interval shall be worked without an interval for a meal being taken.
- (c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause, the lunch hour for workers in retail establishments other than Fourth Schedule shops shall, during the first two (2) days of each of the three sales per annum and during Christmas week, be given and taken between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m.
- (d) Wholesale Establishments:—One hour shall be given and taken for a meal: Lunch hour shall be taken between 12 noon and 2.15 p.m.; tea hour shall start within fifteen (15) minutes after the usual finishing time.
- (e) Where work is performed outside the ordinary working hours, one hour's break for a meal shall be allowed between 12 o'clock midnight and 1 o'clock a.m. and between 7 a.m. and 8 a.m.
- (f) The meal hours referred to in this clause shall be taken in one continuous period.

8.-Meal Money.

- (a) With the exception of all workers whose duties are usually performed after 6 p.m., from Monday to Friday and after 1 p.m. on Saturday, all other workers shall, if required to work after the usual finishing time from Monday to Friday, or after the usual finishing time on Saturday, be paid one shilling and sixpence (Is. 6d.) for meal money: Provided that meal money shall not be payable where a worker continues to work on after the prescribed finishing time for one half-hour or less.
- (b) Meal money shall be paid prior to the meal hour on the day upon which the additional time is to be worked.

9.—Overtime.

(a) Excepting as provided hereunder, all overtime worked shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter. In the computation of overtime each day shall stand by itself.

- (i) Where overtime is worked in Fourth Schedule shops, the worker shall be paid overtime as provided in (a) after the prescribed weekly hours of work have been exceeded. Work performed on Sundays and/or prescribed holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (ii) Where workers are required to work continuously after the first four (4) hours of overtime have been worked (except on Saturday) they shall be paid at the rate of double time up to the time they finish work: Provided that hour shall not be later than the prescribed starting time the next day.
- (b) All time worked in establishments other than those prescribed in (i) hereof, before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time shall be paid for at overtime rates. Work performed on Saturday afternoons, Sundays, and/or prescribed holidays shall be paid for at double time.
- (c) When overtime is worked, the proportion of juniors employed on overtime shall not exceed the proportion provided by clause 17 hereof.

10.—Holidays.

- (a) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall be observed as holidays and paid for, namely—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

 (b) A holiday of one week on full pay shall be reported to each weeker upon completion of each year.
- (b) A holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each worker upon completion of each year of service. A worker not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays in proportion to the length of his or her service.

Provided that, when a worker is entitled to holidays under this clause, he shall receive at least two (2) weeks' notice from his employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer that such worker should take his holidays: Provided further, that this clause shall not apply in the case of any worker summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

- (c) Every worker shall be given and shall take annual holidays within six months after the date they fall due.
- (d) Workers shall be paid wages for annual holidays prior to the taking of such holidays.

11.-Wages.

The minimum rate of wage payable to any male worker employed as a shop assistant who is of the age of twenty-one (21) years or upwards, or to any female worker employed as a shop assistant who is of the age of twenty-one (21) years or upwards shall be as follows:—

But, where such canvasser provides his own bicycle he shall be paid an extra allowance of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week, and where some other means of transport is provided by the canvasser, he shall be paid an extra allowance, as set out below, for each mile travelled in such conveyance on the employer's business:—motor car—3d. per mile; motor cycle—ld. per mile; motor cycle and sidecar—l½d. per mile

Provided always, it shall be competent for an employer or a worker to refer the matter to the Board of Reference, as provided in clause 21 herein, which shall fix a rate per mile for the particular motor vehicle under review sufficient to cover the actual cost of petrol and oil used on the employer's business. The rate shall also include an allowance for depreciation, registration, and insurance, to be calculated in the proportion to the number of miles actually travelled on the employer's business to the total mileage for the year. Each worker under this clause shall enter in the record provided by the employer for the purpose before starting and upon finishing duty each day, the reading of the speedometer attached to his vehicle

12.

Any person, whether a junior or adult, employed as a canvasser and/or collector shall be paid the full adult minimum wage.

13.

Where an employer usually has more than six (6) workers engaged under the terms of this Award, he shall provide his workers with a suitable room for keeping their hats and clothing and to use as a room for taking their meals. Such room to be situated within a reasonable distance of his place of business and to be kept in a proper state of cleanliness.

14.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

15.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Award than that which he or she usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate while so employed.

16 .- Mixed Functions.

Where a worker is called upon to perform more than two (2) classes of work on any one day he shall, for the purpose of ascertaining the wages to be paid, be deemed to have worked the day at the class for which the higher rate is prescribed: Provided that, where the starting and finishing time of work done in the higher grade is entered in the time and wages book and such work done in the higher grade is under two (2) hours in any one week, no extra payment shall be made. In the event of no record being made in the time and wages book, the provisions of the first paragraph of this clause shall apply.

17.-Proportion of Juniors.

(a) The number of male juniors, with the exception of junior packers, shall not exceed the proportion of one to one for the first five (5) male adults and thereafter one junior to every two (2) male adults or fraction thereof.

Provided that the number of junior packers shall not exceed the proportion of one junior to every four (4) or fraction of four (4) adult packers.

- (b) Where no adult shop assistant is employed, one junior shop assistant may be employed.
- (c) Where one adult female assistant is employed, two (2) junior female assistants may be employed.

Where two (2) adult female assistants are employed three (3) junior female assistants may be employed.

Where three (3) adult female assistants are employed four (4) junior female assistants may be employed.

Where four (4) adult female assistants are employed five (5) junior female assistants may be employed.

And thereafter the proportion shall not exceed five (5) junior female assistants to four (4) adult female assistants.

18.—Engagement.

One week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement: Provided that an employer at any time may dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct, or if, after receiving one week's notice, such worker does not carry out his or her duties in the same manner as he or she did prior to such notice.

19.—Time and Wages Record.

- (a) The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Award applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each worker, the age of each junior worker and the time during which each worker has been employed. Such record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the union between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on any working day from Monday to Friday inclusive
- on any working day from Monday to Friday, inclusive.

 (b) Every keeper of a Fourth Schedule shop shall post, or cause to be posted and kept posted up in a conspicuous position in his shop, so as to be easily

accessible to and easily read by every shop assistant in his employ during working hours on every day, or by any accredited representative of the union, a roster, written in the English language, showing:—

- (i) The name and sex of each worker bound by this Award.
- (ii) The age of each worker under the age of 21 years.
- (iii) The class of work performed by each worker.
- (iv) The times on which each worker is required to commence and finish work on each day in each week.
- (v) The hours in each day during which each worker is entitled to be off duty during each day.
- (vi) The time allotted for meals to each worker on each day.
- (vii) The day in each week on which each worker is given and shall take the weekly half-holiday and the time from which the half-holiday shall be taken.
- (viii) The particulars contained in such roster shall be in respect of the full week, Monday to Saturday, inclusive, during which it is posted up, and may be altered or varied only on account of the sickness or absence of a worker, or by the inclusion of particulars in respect of casual workers.
- (ix) Any worker on duty, when in accordance with the roster such worker should be off duty (except as provided by subclause (viii) hereof), shall be paid at overtime rates as provided by clause 9 (a).

20.-Uniforms and Overalls.

Should any dispute arise between the parties as to the wearing of uniforms and overalls, if such are required to be worn, the dispute, howsoever originating and any matter arising thereout, including the matter of the laundering of uniforms and overalls, shall be determined by the Board of Reference.

21.-Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:—
 - (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
 - (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
 - (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.
- (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which, for this purpose, are embodied in this Award.

22.—Under-rate Workers.

- (a) Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

23.—Country Work and Travelling Time.

(a) When a worker is engaged on outside work, the employer shall pay all fares, and a proper allowance at current rates shall be paid for all necessary meals. Fares shall be second class, except when travelling by coastal boat, when saloon fares shall be paid.

- (b) When a worker is engaged at such a distance that he cannot return at night, suitable board and lodging shall be found, at the employer's expense.
- Travelling time outside ordinary working hours shall be paid for at ordinary rates up to a maximum of twelve (12) hours in any twenty-four (24) hours period, from the time of starting on the journey: Provided that, when the travelling is by boat, not more than eight (8) hours shall be paid for in such period.

24.—Premiums.

No premium in respect of the employment of any worker bound by this Award shall be paid to or received by the employer or his agent, whether such premium is paid by the worker employed or by some other person.

25. Provided always, and it is hereby expressly agreed and declared, that nothing in this Award shall apply to workers in any wholesale business (excepting wholesale hardware) other than the following:—Head storemen, storemen, storemen working singly, packers, junior packers, junior storemen, junior despatch hands, casual packers, despatch hands, casual storemen, casual despatch hands (junior and adult), junior and adult messengers.

26.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:—(i) Name in full; (ii) age and date of birth.

- (a) The certificate shall be signed by the worker.
- (b) No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages, in the event of his age being wrongly stated on this certificate: Provided that this subclause shall operate only for the first three (3) months from the date of the worker's first engagement, thereby enabling the employer, if he so desires, to obtain proof of the junior worker's age.

27.—Payment for Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half (½) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness oc-This clause shall not apply where the worker is curred. entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

The worker shall, if required by the employer, produce proof satisfactory to the employer of sickness.

I certify, pursuant to section 63 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, that the foregoing is a copy of the Agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.
