The Game Act, 1912-13. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia [L.S.]

No. 174/39.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Game Act, 1912-13, that the Governor may by Proclamation declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof, and that the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operations of any such declaration under the said Act any defined locality: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 30th day of July, 1924, it is provided that the portions of the State and localities defined in the Schedule thereto shall be a Reserve for Grey Kangaroos, known scientifically as Macropus giganteus: And whereas it is desirable to exempt from the operations of the said Proclamation a defined locality: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, exempt from the operations of the aforesaid Proclamation and the declaration contained therein all those localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto as from the date of publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette until the 31st day of December, 1941.

Health Act, 1911-1937. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, that the Governor may by Order in Conneil constitute any portion of the State, not being a municipal district, a health district, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the Order, and may abolish any such district, and that if the boundaries of any such district are not coterminous with a road district, the local authority shall be the road board of the road district within the boundaries whereof the health district is situated or a local board whereof the health district is situated or a local board of health constituted as in the said Act provided, as the Governor may from time to time direct: And whereas the Governor, by an Order in Conucil published in the Government Gazette on the 2nd day of June, 1911, constituted that portion of the State defined therein, situated in and about the Townsite of Moora, within the Macare Pead District a health district for the purposes. Moora Road District, a health district, for the purposes of the said Act, to be known as the Moora Health Dison the said 2nd day of June, 1911, directed that the local authority for the said Moora Health District shall be a Local Board of Health as constituted by such notice: And whereas it is now deemed desirable to change the name of the said Moora Health District in the manner hereinafter mentioned, but otherwise to leave the said health district as at present constituted: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, doth hereby change the name of the said Moora Health District constituted as aforesaid so that hereafter the said health district shall for all purposes be known as the Moora (Townsite) Health District, and doth hereby declare that, subject to the change of name aforesaid, the said health district shall continue as at present constituted, and the local authority for the same shall continue to be the Local Board of Health as heretofore directed and instituted.

Health Act, 1911-1937. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any portion of the State, not being a municipal district, a health district, with such bonndaries and by such name as may be specified in the Order, and may abolish any such district, and that if the boundaries of any such district are not coterminous with a road district the local authority shall be the road board of the road district within the boundaries whereof the health district is situated or a local board of health constituted as in the said Act provided, as the Governor may from time to time direct: And whereas the Governor, by an Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 2nd day of June, 1911, constituted that portion of the State defined therein, situated in and about the Townsite of Moora, within the Moora Road District a health district, for the purpose of the said Act, to be known as the Moora Health District, but the name of which has recently been or is about to be changed so that the said health district shall for all purposes be known as the Moora (Townsite) Health District: And whereas the Governor by an Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 29th day of January, 1932, constituted that portion of the State therein defined, situated in and about the Miling Railway Station, within the Moora Road District, a health district for the purposes of the said Act, to be known as the Miling Health District: And whereas the Governor, by an Order in Council published in the Government

Gazette on the 24th day of November, 1939, constituted that portion of the State defined therein, situated in and about the Townsite of Watheroo, within the Moora Road District, to be known as the Watheroo Health District: And whereas it is now deemed desirable to abolish the said Miling Health District and the said Watheroo Health District and in lien thereof to constitute all that portion of the State situate within the Moora Road District (other than that portion of the said Moora Road District now within the boundaries of the said Moora (Townsite) Health District as at present constituted) a health district, to be known as the Moora (Road District) Health District, and to direct that the Moora Road Board shall be the local authority for the said Moora (Road District) Health District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, doth hereby abolish the health districts heretofore constituted and known respectively as the Miling Health District and the Watheroo Health District hereinbefore mentioned, and doth hereby constitute all that portion of the State comprised in the Moora Road District (other than that portion of Moora Road District now comprised in Moora (Townsite) Health District aforesaid as at present constituted) a health district, for the purposes of the said Act, to be known as the Moora (Road District) Health District, in contradistinction to the Moora (Road District) Health District aforesaid, and also doth hereby direct that the local authority for the said Moora (Road District) Health District shall be the Moora Road Board.
