The Health Act, 1911-1937. PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the Native Administration Act, 1905-1940, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Natives: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared near Guildford: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an area of about forty-eight acres, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Natives.

Schedule.

Swan (near Guildford) No. 12720 (Camping, for the use of Natives):—Bounded on the north-eastward and north-westward by lines starting from a point about 140 links south of the east corner of Swan Location 23 and extending south-eastward about 24 chains along the south-western side of a surveyed road and south-westward about 20 chains along the south-eastern side of a surveyed road; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal.

Sandalwood Act, 1929. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1478/29.
WHEREAS under the provisions of section 2 of the Sandalwood Act, 1929, the Governor may from time to time by Order in Conneil limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period therein stated: And whereas it is desirable to limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period from the first day of July, 1941, to the thirty-first day of December, 1941, to 1,000 tons: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lientenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Conneil and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period from the first day of July, 1941, to the thirty-first day of December, 1941, to 1,000 tons, exclusive of sandalwood required for oil distillation purposes within the State.

Traffic Act, 1919-1935. Shark Bay Road Board. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following Order under the authority of section 48 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1935, namely, that, in pursuance of—(1) paragraph (i) (a) of subsection (1) of section 46 of the said Act, the Shark Bay Road Board is hereby empowered to make by laws prescribing the rules to be observed in respect of any vehicle being driven or used on roads within its district; (2) subparagraph (b) of paragraph (vii) of subsection (1) of section 46 of the said Act, the Shark Bay Road Board is hereby empowered to prohibit the passage of heavy or obstructive traffic over any specified road, either generally or during certain months of the year.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, that it shall be obligatory for every employer or group of employers to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him or them, but that if an employer or group of employers proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer or group of employers has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer or group of employers from the operation of this section: And whereas Ernest Alexander Buckingham, of Claisebrook road, East Perth, and James Thomas Buckingham, of Serpentine, carrying on business to-gether in partnership under the registered firm name of "Buckingham Brothers," at Claisebrook road, East Perth, and at Serpentine, in this State, as sawnillers and timber merchants, are an employer or a group of employers within the meaning of the said Act, and as such are subject to the provisions of section 10 of the said Act, and have, in accordance with the regulations, made application for exemption from the operation of the said section: And whereas they have proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that as such employer or group of employers they have established a fund for insurance against the liability mentioned in the said section and have deposited securities, to wit, a certificate of fixed deposit account for five thousand pounds (£5,000) of fixed deposit account for five thousand pounds (£5,000) at the Union Bank of Australia, Limited, at Perth, in the name of the Honourable the Treasurer, Government of Western Australia, at the Treasure, charged with all payments to become due by them under the liability aforesaid: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred upon him by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said Ernest Alexander Buckingham and the said James Thomas Buckingham, carrying on business as aforesaid under the registered firm-name of Buckingham Brothers, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Comfrom the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, for the period commencing as from the 1st day of June, 1941, and ending on the 1st day of June, 1943.

MOUNT MAGNET HOSPITAL BOARD.

AT a meeting of the Board of Management of the Mount Magnet Hospital on the 26th day of February,

Whereas under the provisions of section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, a Board may itself establish and manage a Medical Fund, the object of which shall be to secure for its subscribers medical attendance, hospital treatment or other similar benefits; and may by by-laws provide for the regulation and control of such Fund: And whereas a Medical Fund has been established by the Board of Management at the Mount Magnet Hospital: Now, therefore, the said Board of Management, acting pursuant to section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, do hereby make by-laws for the regulation and control of the said Medical Fund, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder:—

Schedule.

- 1. The term "Subscriber" shall mean any person (male or female), who has paid his or her subscription and is financial and has paid at least two weeks' subscription prior to seeking any benefits or privileges, and shall include, so far as benefits are concerned, all dependants of the subscriber.
- 2. No person who becomes a subscriber shall receive any benefits or privileges for a complaint for which he or she or a dependant has entered the hospital prior to becoming a subscriber.
- 3. The subscription to be paid by subscribers shall be as follows:—(a) Adult subscribers—2s. per week or 26s. per quarter, as the subscriber may elect; (b) Infant subscribers—1s. 4d. per week.
- 4. The word "Dependant" shall mean the wife, parents, and grandparents of a subscriber, the sons, daughters, brothers, and sisters, not over sixteen years of age of a subscriber, who are actually residing with and wholly dependent on him at the date of the illness or accident which the Medical Officer is required to treat.
- 4. (b) If the Medical Officer is not aware or is in doubt as to whether any person is or is not a dependant, he may refer the matter to the secretary and be guided by his decision.

- 5. Subject to when a subscriber is infinancial through unemployment or other causes beyond control of the subscriber, and this is reported to the secretary by the subscriber concerned, one day's treatment be allowed, if occasion arises, for each month of membership, up to a limit of one month, provided that all arrears of dues be paid when employment is again secured.
- 6. Every subscriber and his dependants shall, if required, submit to a medical examination by the Medical Officer of the Fund before he is accepted as a subscriber.
- 7. Every subscriber shall be entitled to medical and hospital treatment as an indoor or outdoor patient, and to medicine, dressings, and appliances, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in these by-laws, for so long as the Medical Officer deems necessary, free of charge.
- 8. Subscribers employed by any Mining Company shall be deemed to be financial as from the date of their employment: provided that the Mine management undertakes the collection of their subscriptions from wages due.
- 9. Subscribers shall not receive free treatment in any of the following cases:
 - a. Incurable diseases.
 - Disorders for the cure of which other establishments are provided.
 - e. Any person requiring food and not medicine and who is more properly the subject for benevolent institution.
 - d. Venereal disease.
 - e. Alcoholism, or conditions resulting therefrom.
 - f. Dentistry.
 - g. Insanity.
 - h. Accouchements (abortive or otherwise).
 - Any person for any condition for which he is already covered by insurance under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act.
 - j. Sera and vaccines.
 - k. Pathological examination fees.
 - 1. Major operations, with the exception of urgent operations (an urgent operation is one where the postponing of the operation for more than 24 hours after the decision to operate has been made, would, in the opinion of the Medical Officer, be detrimental to the health of the patient).
 - m. No patent medicines, or any medicines prepared and sold under any proprietary name will be supplied free of charge to any subscriber or his dependants, unless the Board decide that any particular medicine may be included as a benefit. In all other cases any patent medicine or proprietary line prescribed by the Medical Officer must be paid for by the subscriber at a price to be fixed by the Board.
- 10. Maternity Cases.—The hospital fee for maternity cases for subscribers shall be 5s. 3d. per day: provided such subscriber shall have been financial on the Fund for at least six months prior to entering hospital.
- 11. Suitable bottles must be provided by subscribers requiring medicines, otherwise a charge of sixpence for each bottle will be collected by the dispensing chemist.
- 12. The Board shall have discretionary powers regarding the payment of hospital maintenance incurred in any subsidised public hospital by subscribers or their dependants, who are temporarily outside the district, and who suddenly become seriously ill or meet with a serious accident which precludes their returning to the hospital covered by their Fund. In approved cases the Board will be responsible for payment to the other hospital concerned at the rate of 7s. 6d. per_day, for a period not exceeding 60 days in any one year, but any amount in addition to this charged as fees by the other hospital will be a matter for settlement between the subscriber and the hospital concerned. The Board will not be responsible for any payment to doctors for treatment of such cases.

- (b) If the Medical Officer of the Fund recommends the transfer of a patient to another hospital because he deems the appliances at hand inadequate for the proper treatment of such patient, then the Board will pay, for a period not exceeding 60 days in any one year, the hospital to which this patient is transferred at the rate of 7s. 6d. per day. The Board will not, however, be responsible for any fares or cost of transfer.
- 13. Subscribers and their dependants requiring outpatient attendance shall attend at the Medical Officer's surgery between such times as shall be fixed by the Board from time to time; in the event of their not being able to attend, a message should be left at the Medical Officer's surgery or residence before 9 a.m.
- (b) The Medical Officer shall be in attendance at his surgery for treatment of subscribers at the hours fixed by the Board.
- 14. When a subscriber residing outside a radius to be fixed by the Board requires the services of a Medical Officer, he shall pay the Medical Officer mileage at such rates as shall be arranged between the Fund and the Medical Officer.
- 15. The Doctor shall keep such records as the Board may determine from time to time.

Town Haulage—A special charge of 6s. per ton will be made on all goods received or delivered in the town and of 4s. per ton on all cargo delivered to the Customs Bond. Where extra haulage is made without handling and it is to the convenience of the Department, a charge of 2s. per ton only will be made.

Haulage of trucks, for stores for vessels-5s.

*Handling Livestock—Department does not handle livestock, but shall if requested to do so, and charge according to services rendered.

Dangerons Cargo shall include match's, carbide, compressed gases, corrosives, poisons, cartridges and films.

Inflammable Liquids shall include petroleum, kerosene, and any oil, liquid, or spirit derived wholly or in part from any petroleum, shale, schist, coal, peat, bitumen or any similar substance, and which has a true flashing point of less than 150° Fahrenheit; and any other liquid which the Governor by proclamation in the Gazette declares to be an inflammable liquid.

Ship's Stores—Stores for consumption of vessel by which shipped are free of wharfage dues, but handling and hanlage charges shall be payable at ordinary cargo rates, according to services rendered.

Statement of Analysis (Section 9).

6. The statement of result of analysis to be forwarded to the agent or vendor shall be in the Form No. 7 in the First Schedule hereto.

Certificate of Analysis (Section 11).

7. A certificate of analysis issued under section 11 shall be in the Form No. 8 in the First Schedule hereto.

Fees Pavable.

8. The fees payable under the Act for registration and for any analysis shall be as set out in the Second Schedule hereto.
