WHEREAS it is provided by the Game Act, 1912-1913, that the Governor may by Proclamation declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof, and that the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operations of any such declaration under the said Act any defined locality: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 30th day of July, 1924, it is provided that the portions of the State and localities defined in the Schedule thereto shall be a Reserve for Grey Kangaroos, known scientifically as Macropus giganteus: And whereas it is desirable to exempt from the operations of the said Proclamation certain defined localities: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, exempt from the operations of the aforesaid Proclamation and the declaration contained therein all those localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto as from the 1st day of October, 1941, until the 31st day of December, 1941, inclusive.

# Vermin Act, 1918-1938. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 15 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1938, that for every vermin district as constituted under the said Act there shall be a vermin board, which shall consist of so many members as may from time to time be prescribed by the Governor, and that such members shall be elected or appointed as in the said Act provided: And it is also enacted by section 45 of the said Act that the Governor may appoint the board of any road district to be the board of any vermin district the boundaries whereof are the same as those of the road district or which is comprised within the road district: And whereas the Governor, having under the provisions of the Vermin Boards Act, 1909, constituted that portion of the State comprised in the Black Range Road District a vermin district, to be known as Black Range Vermin District, by an Order in Council made under the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 27th day of June, 1924, appointed and constituted a board, to be known as the Black Range Vermin Board, for the said Black Range Vermin District to consist of five members, and appointed the several persons named in the said Order in Council to be the members of such board until the first election of members of such board shall have taken place: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to abolish the said Black Range Vermin Board heretofore appointed and constituted as aforesaid and in lieu thereof to appoint the Black Range Road Board to be the Vermin Board of the said Black Range Vermin District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by sections 15 and 45 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1938, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling him, doth hereby abolish the Black Range Vermin Board as heretofore constituted and appointed as aforesaid and in lieu thereof appoint the Black Range Road Board to be the Vermin Board for the said Black Range Vermin District, to be known as the Black Range Vermin Board.
