WHEREAS by subsection (2) of section 95 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1939, the Governor may make such orders as he deems necessary to remove any obstacle by which the due course of any election is likely to be impeded: And whereas it appears that an extraordinary election is to be held by the Upper Blackwood Road Board, which has been appointed by that Board to take place on the 24th of October, 1941, and there is insufficient time to comply with the provisions of section 69 of the said Act, which requires that any person who is qualified and desirous of being a candidate for election shall at or before twelve o'clock noon on the nomination day, or within fourteen clear days next preceding that day, cause to be delivered to the returning officer a nomination paper in the prescribed form: And whereas it is desirable that the nomination day shall be the 10th day of October, 1941, instead of the 3rd day of October, 1941, as required by the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, doth hereby order that the nomination day

RECLASSIFICATION OF THE TEACHING STAFF OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT FROM 1st JULY, 1941.

THIS Classification of Teachers has retrospective effect from the First day of July, 1941, and replaces the old salary scales as follows:-

There is a dual basis for the computation of the salaries of classified teachers in the Primary Schools-

(1) The position held by the teacher.

(2) The personal classification of the teacher, based upon examinations passed and practical efficiency in teaching.

The portion of salary allotted on the former basis is termed the "Position Quota." The portion allotted on the latter basis is termed the "Qualification Quota."

Basic Wage Adjustment.

- 1. (a) The salary rates contained herein shall be increased by such amounts as will ensure that adult male teachers shall receive the same increases in their salaries as have been granted to adult male civil servants employed under the Public Service Act between the 1st July, 1926, and the 1st July, 1941.
- (b) Adult female teachers shall receive 80 per cent. of the increases granted to adult male teachers, calculated to the nearest £1.
- (c) Teachers whose salary rates are less than £185 per annum shall receive increases pro rata with the adult male minimum of £185 per annum.
- 2. (a) The salary rates for adult male teachers shall be subject to adjustment at the rate of £5 per annum for every variation of 1s. 11d. per week in the basic wage declarations made by the Court of Arbitration.
 - (b) Adult female teachers—eighty (80) per centum of the adult male rate, calculated to the nearest £1.
- 3. Teachers located in an area for which an independent basic wage has been declared higher than the metropolitan basic wage shall be paid the difference between such basic wage rates as an allowance.

 This classification takes the place of the reclassification published in the Government Gazette of the
