WHEREAS by section 11 of the Land Act, 1933, the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in section 29 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Conditional Purchase Lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Conditional Pur-chase Lease 12741/68 (Ninghan Locations 1023 and 1024), as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph (f) of section 29 of the said Act, that is to say, for School Site: Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation resume portion of Conditional Purchase Lease 12741/68 (for the purpose aforesaid).

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, { By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 100 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that, subject to the suid section, the closing time for shops (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Act and except registered small shops) shall be, in every week, *inter alia*, on one day one o'clock, and by subsec-tion (2) of the same section, that in the absence of any other determination as provided for in the solid scation other determination as provided for in the said section, the day upon which all shops affected by the said sec tion shall close at one o'clock shall be Saturday: And whereas it is enacted by subsection (5) of section 100 aforesaid that it shall be lawful for shops to which the said section applies (except those in the Metropolitan Shop District and the shop district which comprises the Kalgoorlie, Boulder, Brown Hill-Ivanhoe, and Hannans Electoral Districts) to remain open until nine o'clock on one evening in the week, and that, subject to any other determination as provided for in the said sub-section, the day upon which such shops may so remain open shall be Friday: And whereas all the enactments by section 100 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937. hereinbefore-mentioned, were formerly enacted by section 102 of the Factories Act, 1920: And whereas the Governor, in accordance with section 101 of the Fac-tories and Shops Act, 1920, had, prior to the month of May, 1921, constituted and defined a shop district, to be known as the Wickepin Shop District, and by two Proclamations issued under section 102 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920, both published in the Government Gazette on the 13th day of May, 1921, proclaimed that the day upon which all shops in the said Wickepin District should close at one o'clock should be Wednesday, and that the day upon which all shops in the said Wickepin Shop District might keep open until nine

o'clock in the evening should be Saturday: And whereas

I, the Lieutenant-Governor, acting pursuant to section 99 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, by a Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of August, 1941, abolished the said Wieke-pin Shop District theretofore constituted and defined as aforesaid and in lieu thereof constituted and defined

a new shop district, to be known as Wickepin Shop District: And whereas doubts have arisen as to the effect of the said abolition of district upon the said Proclamations published in the *Government Gazette* on

the 13th day of May, 1921, as aforesaid, and it is deemed desirable and expedient to resolve such doubts:

Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council

with the advice and consent of the Executive Couler and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 100 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, and of all other powers me enabling, do by this Pro-clamation revoke and cancel the Proclamations hereto-fore issued under the Factories and Shops Act, 1920, in relation to shops in the old Wickepin Shop District aforesaid and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1921 days of Mag. 1921, as hereinbefore mutiqued

the 13th day of May, 1921, as hereinbefore mentioned, to the intent that in accordance with section 100 of the

Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, and until other determinations are made as provided for in such section the day upon which all shops in the Wickepin Shop

District as now constituted and defined to which the said section 100 applies shall close at one o'clock shall

be Saturday, and the day upon which such shops may re-main open until nine o'clock in the evening shall be

Friday, and I declare that this Proclamation shall have

and take effect as from and after the date of the publication of the same in the Government Gazette.

## GAME ACT, 1912-1913.

- Regulation 2 is amended by inserting therein immediately below the line reading "Part IV—Sale of Immature Game (reg. 40)," the words "Part IVA—Special Offences (reg. 40A)."
- 2. A new Part, to stand as Part IVA, is inserted after regulation 40 as follows :---

## PART IVA-SPECIAL OFFENCES.

40A. (1) No person shall, except under the authority of a license issued under this Act, carry or discharge any firearm or throw or discharge any stone or other missile on any part of a reserve for native game.

(2) Any person who in any respect contravenes this regulation shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows :-

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with, or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any

action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

At a meeting of the Board of Management of the Yarloop District Hospital on the 26th day of May, 1941, the following resolution was passed :-

Whereas, under the provisions of section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, a Board may itself establish and manage a Medical Fund, the object of which shall be to manage a Medical Fund, the object of which shall be to secure for its subscribers medical attendance, hospital treatment, or other similar benefits; and may by by-laws provide for the regulation and control of such fund: And whereas a Medical Fund has been established by the Board of Management at the Yarloop District Hos-pital: Now, therefore, the said Board of Management, acting pursuant to section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927 do hereby make by laws for the regulation and 1927, do hereby make by-laws for the regulation and control of the said Medical Fund in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder:

## Schedule.

(1) The term "subscriber" shall mean any person, male or female, who has paid his or her subscription and is financial and has paid at least two weeks' subscription prior to seeking any benefits or privileges, and shall include, so far as benefits are concerned, all dependants of the subscriber.

(2) The subscription to be paid by the subscriber shall be 7s. per calendar month or £1 1s. per quarter. The rate for subscribers under 21 years carning less than the basic wage shall be 3s. 6d. per calendar month, or 10s. 6d. per quarter.

(2a) No subscription shall be deemed necessary whilst a subscriber is incapacitated from work.

(3) The word "dependant" shall mean the wife, parents, and grandparents of a subscriber, the sons, daughters, brothers, and sisters not over sixteen years of age of a subscriber who are actually residing with and wholly dependent on him at the date of the illness or accident which the Medical Officer is required to treat.

(b) If the Medical Officer is not aware or is in doubt as to whether any person is or is not a dependant, he may refer the matter to the secretary and be guided by his decision.

(4) Every subscriber and his dependants shall, if required, submit to a medical examination by the Medical Officer of the Fund before he is accepted as a subscriber.

(5) Every subscriber shall be entitled to medical and hospital treatment as an indoor or outdoor patient and to medicine, dressings, and appliances, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in these by-laws for so long as the Medical Officer deems necessary, free of charge.

(6) Cost of transport of subscribers or dependants from out-centres to Yarloop to consult the Medical Officer, or, in his absence, the matron, shall be borne by the Board only when such journeying to Yarloop is authorised by the Medical Officer or matron (telephone day and night) before the journey is undertaken. The the of payment for transport from such out-centes to be as is fixed by the Board from time to time.

(7) Subscribers shall not receive free treatment in any of the following cases:

- (a) Incurable diseases.
- (b) Disorders for the cure of which other establishments are provided.
- Any person requiring food and not medicine (c) and who is more properly the subject for a benevolent institution.
- Venereal disease. (d) Alcoholism, or conditions resulting therefrom.
- (e) (f)Dentistry.
- (g) Insanity. (h) Account Accouchements (abortive or otherwise)
- Any person for any condition for which he is already covered by the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, or (i) by any other form of Insurance. (j) Sera and vaccines. (k) Pathological examination fees.
- (i) Major operations, with the exception of urgent operations. (An urgent operation is one where the postponing of the operation for more than 24 hours after the decision to operate has been made, would, in the opinion of the Medical Officer, be detrimental to the health of the patient.)
  (m) No patent medicines or any medicines pre-
- pared and sold under any proprietary name will be supplied free of charge to any sub-scriber or his dependants, unless the Board decide that any particular medicine may be included as a benefit. In all other cases any patent medicine or proprietary line pre-scribed by the Medical Officer must be paid for by the subscriber at a price to be fixed by the Board.

(7a) Should any subscriber or dependant refuse to follow out the Medical Officers orders, or not act in accordance with the instructions of the matron, he or she, shall be liable to forfeit all Fund benefits.

(8) The Board shall have discretionary powers regarding the payment of hospital maintenance incurred in garding the payment of hospital maintenance incurred in any subsidised hospital by subscribers or their depend-ants who are temporarily outside the district, and who become suddenly seriously ill or meet with a serious accident which precludes their returning to the hospital covered by their Fund. In approved cases, the Board will be responsible for payment to the other hospital concerned at the rate of 7s. 6d. per day, or such lesser sum as may be the prevailing charge, for a period not exceeding 60 days in any one year, but any amount in addition to this, charged as fees by the other hos-pital, will be a matter for settlement between the subpital, will be a matter for settlement between the subscriber and the hospital concerned. The Board will not be responsible for any payment to doctors for treatment of such cases.

(8b) If the Medical Officer of the Fund recommends the transfer of a patient to another hospital because he deems the appliances at hand inadequate for the proper treatment of such patient, then the Board will accept liability for a maximum sum of 26 guineas in any one year, in respect of the cost of transfer and treatment at the rate of 7s. 6d. per day, or such lesser sum as may be the prevailing charge, at the hospital to which this patient is transferred.

(8c) If the subscriber or dependant transferred is treated as an out-patient, the Board will not be responsible for fees exceeding the in-patient daily rate, or the total amount for which liability is accepted under rule 8b, even, though it be deemed necessary for a guardian to accompany the patient. If out-patient treatment is to extend for a period of more than seven days the subscriber or dependant must notify the Board in writing on or before the expiration of seven calendar days from the date of the first attendance, or Fund benefits shall be forfeited.

(9) Subscribers and their dependants requiring outpatient attendance shall attend at the Medical Officer's surgery between such times as shall be fixed by the Board from time to time. In the event of their not being able to attend, a message should be left at the Medical Officer's surgery or residence before 9 a.m.

(9b) The Medical Officer shall be in attendance at his surgery for treatment of subscribers at the hours fixed by the Board.

(10) When a subscriber residing outside a radius to be fixed by the Board requires the services of a Medical Officer, he shall pay the Medical Officer mileage at such rates as shall be arranged between the Fund and the Medical Officer

(11) The doctor shall keep such records as the Board may determine from time to time.

4. Every subscriber and his dependants shall, if required, submit to a medical examination by the Medical Officer of the Fund before he is accepted as a subscriber.

5. Every subscriber shall be entitled to medical and hospital treatment as an indoor or outdoor patient, and to inclicine, dressings, and appliances, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in these by-laws, for so long as the Medical Officer deems necessary, free of charge.

- (m) No patent medicines or any medicines prepared and sold under any proprietary name will be supplied free of charge to any subscriber or his dependants, unless the Board decides that any particular medicine may be included as a benefit. In all other cases any patent medicine or proprietary line pre-scribed by the Medical Officer must be paid for by the subscriber at a price to be fixed by the Board,

The Board shall have discretionary powers re-8. garding the payment of hospital maintenance incurred in any subsidised public hospital by subscribers or their dependants who are temporarily outside the district, and who suddenly become seriously ill or meet with a serious accident which precludes their returning to the hospital accident which precludes their returning to the hospital covered by their Fund. In approved cases the Board will be responsible for payment to the other hospital concerned at the rate of 7s. 6d. per day for a period not exceeding 60 days in any one year, but any amount in addition to this, charged as fees by the other hospital, will be a matter for settlement between the subscriber and the hospital concerned. The Board will not be re-sponsible for any payment to doctors for treatment of such cases. such cases.

9. Subscribers and their dependants requiring outpatient attendance shall attend at the Medical Officer's surgery between such times as shall be fixed by the Board from time to time. In the event of their not being able to attend, a message should be left at the Medical Officer's surgery or residence before 9 a.m.

(b) The Medical Officer shall be in attendance at his surgery for treatment of subscribers at the hours fixed by the Board.

10. When a subscriber, residing outside a radius to be fixed by the Board, requires the services of a Medical Officer, he shall pay the Medical Officer mileage at such rates as shall be arranged between the Fund and the Medical Officer.

11. The doctor shall keep such records as the Board may determine from time to time.

## INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

## (No. 17 of 1941.)

## (Registered 9/10/41.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-35, this 1st day of October, one thousand nine hundred and forty-one, between the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Boulder, in the State of Western Australia (hereinafter called the employers) of the one part, and the Eastern Gold-fields Federated Engine-drivers' and Firemen's Union of Workers, an industrial union duly registered under the provisions of the said Act whose Registered differ is situated at 13 Piesse street, Boulder (hereinafter called the Union), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the consideration hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree one with the other:-

## 1.---Area.

This agreement shall operate over the works of the Boulder Municipal Electric Light Station.

#### 2.—Term.

For a period of two (2) years from the 1st day of October, 1941.

## 3.-Wages.

Basic wage:--£5 5s. 7d. per week. Engine-drivers :- The wages payable to be 28s. 11d. per day, and a half extra for Sundays.

4.-Hours of Labour. Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked in five (5) shifts of eight (8) hours, the men to work according to the attached roster.

#### 5.-Overtime.

Time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter.

## 6.-Holidays.

Employees shall be entitled to the holidays herein-After mentioned.—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Easter Monday, Labour Day, and Boulder Cup Day.

#### 7.—Aunual Leave.

All employees shall be granted, once in each year, a fortnight's holiday, which shall include ten (10) working days on full pay; if the employment is deter-mined before the holiday is due, the employee shall be entitled to holidays in proportion to the length of service.

## 8.-Rotation.

All employees engaged on shift work shall follow the rotation of shifts in the usual way.

#### 9.-Change Room.

A suitable change room, supplied with heating appliance, wash basins, hot and cold showers, shall be provided for the employees.

## 10.-Union Official.

A duly accredited official of the union shall have right of access to the works, and shall be allowed to inspect the time-sheets and pay-sheets relating to any worker affected by this Agreement, and to make extracts therefrom.

## (No. 16/1941.) (Reg. 8/10/41.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and forty-one, between Soap Distributors, Limited (hereinafter called 'the em-ployer'), of the one part, and the Metropolitan and South-Western Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's winen of Warden Hereina and South-Western Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's union of Workers of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the union"), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other, as follows :----

## 1.—Area.

This Agreement shall apply over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

### 2.—Term.

This Agreement shall continue in force for a period of three (3) years from its date.

#### 3.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked at the option of the employer, in five and one half  $(5\frac{1}{2})$  or five (5) days.

(b) Any shift (whether day, afternoon or night) shall be worked in a continuous period. Meal interval shall not be deemed to break a shift. All shifts shall be worked at times to suit the convenience of the employer.

## 4.—Overtime.

(a) All work performed beyond forty-four (44) hours in any one week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Work done on Sunday, Good Friday, Easter Sat-urday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day shall be paid for at double time rates.

## 5.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu (a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu thereof, shall be holidays, and no deduction shall be made from the wages of workers for such holidays:—Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.
(b) As to any other public holidays, the employer may make a deduction from the wages of any worker in respect of same, if no work is done on any such days.
(c) If work is performed on any of the other public holidays referred to in subclause (b) of this clause ordinary rates shall be paid

ordinary rates shall be paid.

#### 6.-Annual Leave.

(a) A holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each worker on the completion of each year of service. A worker not completing one year of ser-vice shall be granted pay in lieu thereof in proportion to his length of service.

(b) Where practicable, annual leave shall be granted

by the employer at Christmas time. (c) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatsoever. (d) A worker dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall lose all rights

under this clause.

## 7.-Payment for Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the grounds of personal ill-health, for one half day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in any calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

This clause shall not apply where the worker is en-titled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

## 8.-Change and Mess Room.

A suitable change and mess room shall be provided for in all establishments.

## 9 .- First Aid Equipment.

Adequate first-aid equipment shall be provided in all establishments.

#### 10 .- Contract of Service.

All workers other than casuals shall be engaged and paid by the week, and one week's notice shall be given by either party: Provided, however, that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for re-fusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct.

## 11.-Wages.

(a) Basic wage—Adult males, £4 10s. 5d. per week.
(b) Adults:—Boiler attendant—Margin per week, 10s. 6d.

(c) Casual workers:----- "Casual worker" shall mean a worker who is employed for a period of less than six (6) days. Casual workers shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the ordinary rate.

## 12.-No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Agreement was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum rate prescribed in this Agreement.

## 13.-Time and Wages Book or Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up a book or record containing the name of each of his workers to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each worker and the time during which each such worker has been employed. Such book or record shall be open for inspection by a representative of the union during all working hours.

## 14.-Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent. prevent.

## 15 .- Board of Reference.

The Court appoints, for the purpose of the Agreement, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Agreement, the functions of :-

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time,
- except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them;
  (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manuer and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

## IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

## No. 12 of 1941.

Between the Bank Officials' Association of Western Australia Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and the Bank of Australasia; the Union Bank of Australia, Limited; the National Bank of Australasia, Limited; the Commercial Bank of Australia, Limited; the English, Scottish, and Australian Bank, Limited, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties: And whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination: And whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference: And whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to declare the said agreement an Award: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 63 of the Act and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

#### Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note:--Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

## 1.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to all clerks and/or typists (including messengers) employed by the respondents in the State of Western Australia, but excepting that portion of the State within the 20th and 26th parallels of latitude and the 125th and the 129th meridians of longitude and excluding the premises and places occupied by the Bank of New South Wales and any of its branches and the Bank of Adelaide and any of its branches.

## 2.—Definitions.

(a) "Messengers" shall mean all male employees other than the elerical staff, lift attendants, watchmen, caretakers, and cleaners.

(b) For the purpose of calculating the length of service of an employee, all service, whether continuous or in broken periods (provided the break is not for more than twelve (12) months) in any Bank, and also any period for which an employee (already in the Bank service when he enlisted) has been engaged on active service in the Great War shall be included.

(c) Messengers:

1. Head messengers:-Head messengers (metropolitan) shall be paid a wage ranging from a minimum of £5 10s. to a maximum of £6 per week. Where quarters are provided the rates shall be from  $\pm 5$  to  $\pm 5$  10s. per week. Advancement from the minimum to the maximum shall be at the discretion of the bank concerned. The provisions of subclause (i) (1) are deemed to apply.

2. Other messengers:—Messengers (metropolitan) where covered by a State determination or Award shall be paid at the rate prescribed by such determination or Award and, where not covered by a State determination or Award, they shall be paid at the following rates:—

If during the currency of this Award the Arbitration Court of Western Australia should prescribe a basic wage generally or in any district differing in amount from that now prescribed, then such increase or decrease, as the case may be, shall be deemed to be added to or deducted from the value of the quarters, to the intent that the abovementioned rates shall remain constant: Provided that, where quarters are not provided, the provisions of subclause (i) shall apply.

(d) Female clerks, other than typists, engaged on or before the first day of September, 1920, may be paid the rates prescribed for female typists, but any female clerks other than typists engaged after the first day of September, 1920, are to be paid the rates prescribed for male clerks. Where, however, female clerks are employed on such work as typing, shorthand, indexing, sorting, filing, recording branch remittances, current account of tellers' cash books or slips, perusal or dealing with branch returns or the working of any mechanical appliances, they may be paid the rates prescribed for female typists.

(e) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (d) of clause 3, if vacancies occur in any positions, due either directly or indirectly to the absence of male officers on naval, military, or air force service, then such vacancies may be filled temporarily by the employment of female employees at female rates of pay.

such vacancies may be mice temportury is a pay. (f) The minimum rate at 21 years of age for adult clerks, male and female, shall be at the male rate provided for the sixth year of service, and for adult female typists at the female rate provided for the fifth year of service.

(g) In the case of a male officer who joins the service of a bank when over mineteen years of agc, his salary on reaching the age of twenty-eight years shall be not less than that prescribed for an officer in his twelfth year of service, and shall be increased thereafter as though he had completed eleven years' service on reaching his twenty-eighth birthday, but this provision shall not affect or prejudice the established rights of any officer who at the date of this Award was entitled to the benefit of subclause (d) of clause 1 of Industrial Agreement No. 15/1925.

(h) The rates of pay and increases in pay prescribed in clause 3 (b) shall be subject to good conduct, diligence, and efficiency. The certificate of the superintcudent, general manager, or chief manager of the bank concerned, or his deputy, shall be accepted as conclusive evidence as to this.

Whenever any salary or increment provided for by this Award shall be withheld from any officer, he shall be informed within a fortnight after the date on which it is decided to withhold such salary or increase.

If such officer within one month afterwards asks in writing to be furnished with the reasons for such withholding, he shall be informed in writing of such reasons within a fortnight from the receipt at head office of the request therefor.

(i) (1) If during the currency of this Award the Arbitration Court of Western Australia should prescribe a basic wage generally or in any district differing in amount from that now prescribed, then the marginal differences between the present basic wage and the minimum rates herein prescribed shall be deemed to be increased or decreased, as the case may be, to the same extent as the present basic wage may be decreased or increased by the said Arbitration Court as aforesaid, to the intent that the rates herein prescribed shall remain constant. (j) Except as provided by subclause (c) allowances provided by this Award are not subject to variation in accordance with fluctuations in the basic wage.

## 4.-Payment of Salaries.

(a) All wages shall be paid twice a month on dates most convenient to individual banks.

(b) Automatic increases shall date from the first pay day after the completed year of service or, at the option of the individual banks, they may date from the nearest half-yearly balance day following the completed year of service. Individual banks may select which of these methods they adopt. But if a bank decides not to adopt the first method set out in this subclause for fixing the date of increases, and the completed year of service falls in the first three months of the halfyear, the increase shall date from the end of the 'halfyear preceding the completed year of service.

## 5.—Travelling Expenses.

Employees when travelling under instructions from the bank shall be entitled to the following travelling expenses:—

- (i) First-class fares by rail or boat and any necessary cab and porterage expenses, to be approved of by the bank;
  (ii) Ten shillings (10s.) per day and five shillings
- (ii) Ten shillings (10s.) per day and five shillings (5s.) per half day. No allowance for journeys completed between ordinary meal times;
- (iii) One third of these allowances to be paid when travelling by boat and found.

## 6.---Relieving Allowance.

(a) An employee sent from the metropolitan area of Perth to relieve an employee ontside the metropolitan area, or an employee sent from one country town to another to relieve an employee, and who as a consequence has to reside away from his usual home, shall be paid a minimum relieving allowance at the rate of  $\pm 1$  10s, per week, in the case of clerks and accountants, and  $\pm 2$  2s. per week in the case of managers. These allowances shall be increased to cover any further actual reasonable expenses incurred while relieving. The inspector of the bank concerned shall decide what are reasonable expenses.

#### 7.—Hours.

(a) The ordinary hours of duty of employees, other than messengers, shall not exceed forty-two (42) hours per week, exclusive of meal hours, except at halfyearly balancing periods, when for two (2) weeks, including balancing day, the hours shall not exceed fortyeight (48) per week. Not less than forty-five (45) minutes shall be allowed for meals on all working days, except Saturday. In weeks in which statutory or proclaimed holiday are observed the ordinary weekly hours shall be reduced by seven hours thirty-six minutes for a full holiday, four hours for a half holiday, or for Saturday.

(b) The hours of duty of messengers shall not exceed forty-eight (48) hours per week exclusive of meal hours.

#### 8.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked by employees other than messengers in excess of the hours prescribed in clause 7 (a) shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half ordinary rates. No overtime need be paid to an employee for the time worked looking for errors in his or her own work. The superintendent or general manager or chief manager of the bank concerned, or his deputy, shall decide whether any overtime is to be paid or not. Overtime shall be computed on fortnightly periods of eighty-four (84) hours, except at halfyearly balancing time, when the period shall be ninetysix (96) hours per fortnight.

(b) Overtime need only be paid for if worked by direction of some responsible officer deputed by the bank. No overtime shall be paid to any employee not working under supervision.

(c) No overtime need be paid to an employee drawing a salary in excess of £436 per year, nor to any manager or executive officer.

(d) Overtime shall be paid without an employee being required to make application therefor.

## 9.-Meal Money.

If any employee other than messengers is required to work after 6.30 p.m. on Monday to Friday, inclusive, or after 1.30 p.m. on Saturday, such employee shall be allowed two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) for a meal, and a further two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.), if required to work after 6.30 p.m. on Saturday, in addition to any overtime payment he or she may be entitled to, provided he or she is nuable for sufficient reason to go to his or her usual place of abode for such meal.

#### 10.-Holidays.

(a) Employees other than messengers of up to and including ten years' service shall receive not less than two (2) weeks' leave of absence annually on full pay, in addition to all gazetted Bank holidays, and those of over ten years' service three (3) weeks' leave of absence annually on full pay. Messengers shall receive two (2) weeks' annual leave on full pay.

(b) In the event of it being found impracticable to grant such leave in any year the employee concerned shall in the following year be granted two or three weeks' leave, as the case may be, in addition to the leave for such year. Leave shall not accumulate for more than two years.

(c) Where practicable, married officers shall be given at least a fortnight's notice of the bank's intention to send them on annual leave.

(d) Annual leave shall be in respect of each calendar year.

## 11 .- Away From Home Allowance.

Any employee who is required by a bank to live away from his or her usual home shall receive a total remuneration of not less than at the rate of £150 per year. In the absence of any arrangement to the contrary, "usual home" shall be taken to be the place at which he or she is first engaged.

### 12.-No Reduction.

(a) No employee shall, as a result of this Award, suffer any loss of wages, allowance, or position to which the employee may be entitled under agreement with the bank concerned, and each bank will continue its present practice with regard to sick pay and mining, field, and other special allowances.

(b) Banks will continue their present practice of reviewing periodically the pay of employees other than those provided for by this Award.

## 13.-Engagement.

(a) All employees under this Award, with the exception of messengers, shall be engaged and employed by the month, except where otherwise mutually agreed to in writing between the individual Banks and their individual employees.

## 14.-Aged and Infirm Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infimity is unable to earn the minimum rate of wage herein prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate of wage, to be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the union, or, in default of such agreement, within twenty-four hours' after such worker shall have applied in writing to such secretary stating his desire that such wage be agreed upon, such wage shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application.

After having made application to the secretary, and after lodging the application to the Magistrate, and pending the decision therein in either case, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed by the employer at the proposed reduced wage.

The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for six calendar months from the date thereof, and, after the expiration of the said period, until the wage shall be again fixed in the manner prescribed at the instance of the said secretary.

The secretary may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of any such application before the Magistrate.

#### 15.-Disputes.

In the vent of any dispute arising as to any of the matters herein contained, except any question of inter-pretation, the matter shall be referred to a representa-tive of the Union and a representative of the Bank concerned, and, if they are unable to come to an agree-ment, the matter shall be referred to the Court, which may determine the matter itself or refer to a board constituted under section 87 of the Act.

#### 16.-Dismissal, etc.

(a) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary con-tained in or implied by clause 3 hereof, an officer may, subject to sections 92 and 121 (6) of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, be reduced for disciplinary reasons, or for inefficiency or other good cause, in which event he shell be paid such rate as may be agreed upon event he shall be paid such rate as may be agreed upon by the Bank concerned and the secretary of the union. If the Bank is unable to agree with the secretary of the union as to the rate to be paid in such case, the matter shall be dealt with in the manner prescribed by along 15 by clause 15.

This subclause (a) shall not in any way interfere with the discretionary powers referred to in clause 3 (h).

(b) Whenever an officer is dismissed, suspended, or reduced in salary, or is informed that he is disrated, and within one month afterwards such officer asks in writing to be furnished with the reasons for such action, he shall be informed in writing of such reasons within a fortnight from the receipt at head office of the request therefor.

#### 17.---Term.

This Award shall come into operation as from the beginning of the current pay period and shall remain in force for a period of two (2) years.
