WHEREAS by the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Natives: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared at Jaurdi (near Calooli): Now, therefore I, the said Lientenant-Governor, with the advice of the Excentive Council, do hereby declare an area of about fifty acres, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Natives.

Jaurdi (near Calooli), No. 22281 (Natives):-Bounded by lines starting from a point on the north side of the road on the northern side of the Eastern Railway Reserve situate north of a point 10 chains west of the 347-Mile mark on the said railway and extending north about 27 chains, east 20 chains, and south

about 23 chains to the north side of road aforesaid; thence along the latter west-south-westward to the starting point (about 50a.).

Wagin Municipal Conncil.

WHEREAS it is enacted by sections 111 and 133 of the Health Act, 1911-1937 (as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938), that any local anthority which has nndertaken or contracted for the collection and removal of nightsoil, urine, and rubbish within its district may by by-law prohibit any person executing or undertaking the execution of the work aforesaid, so long as the local authority or its contractor executes or continues the execution of the said work, or is prepared and willing to execute or continue the execution of such work: And whereas, Wagin Municipal Conneil, being a local authority in respect of the Health District of the Wagin Municipality within the meaning and for the purposes of the Health Act, 1911-1937, has contracted for the efficient collection, removal, and disposal of nightsoil, urine, and rubbish, within the Health District of the Municipality of Wagin aforesaid, and deems it desirable and expedient to prohibit any and every person, other than the contractor of the said Municipal Conneil, executing or undertaking the execution of the work aforesaid: And whereas the Wagin Municipal Council, as such local health authority aforesaid, by a resolution published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th day of September, 1935, adopted Series A of the Model By-laws prepared pursuant to section 295 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927, and for the purposes of imposing the prohibition hereinbeforementioned deems it necessary and expedient to annend the said Model By-laws as adopted by the said Wagin Municipal Council as aforesaid: Now, therefore, it is resolved and determined by the said Wagin Municipal Council as such local authority aforesaid, acting pursuant to sections 111 and 133 of the Health Act, 1911-1937 (as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938) that the said by-laws of the Wagin Municipal Council, being the Series A of the Model By-laws, and inserting in lien thereof a new by-law

Prohibition against Collection, Removal, and Disposal of Nightsoil, Urine, Liquid Refnse, Offensive Materials, Honse or Trade Refnse, and Rubbish.

24. (a) The Wagin Municipal Council, as the local health authority for the Wagin Municipal Health District, having contracted for the efficient collection, removal, and disposal of nightsoil, nrine, liquid refuse, offensive materials, house or trade refuse and rubbish within the said Health District by its contractor, no person, other than the contractor of the said local health authority, shall execute or undertake the collection, removal, or disposal of nightsoil, nrine, liquid refuse, offensive materials, house or trade refuse and rubbish within the Wagin Municipal Health District so long as the said contractor, as the contractor of the said local anthority, executes or continues the said work, or is prepared and willing to execute or continue the execution of the said work; and the charges to be paid to the said contractor of the local authority for the removal and disposal of such nightsoil, urine, liquid refuse, offensive materials, house or trade refuse and rubbish shall be such as may be fixed from time to time by the said local health authority and published in a newspaper circulating in the district.

SCHEDULE.

By-laws for the Control of Medical Funds under section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927.

The term "subscriber" shall mean any person, 1 male or female, who has paid his or her subscription and is financial and has paid at least two weeks' subscription prior to seeking any benefits or privileges, and shall include, so far as benefits are concerned, all de-pendants of the subscriber.

2. The subscription to be paid by a subscriber shall be 7s. per month, or £1 1s. per quarter, as the subscriber may elect.

3. The word "dependant" shall mean the wife, parents, and grandparents of a subscriber, the sons, daughters, brothers, and sisters not over sixteen years of age of a subscriber who are actually residing with and wholly dependent on him at the date of the illness or accident which the Medical Officer is required to treat.

(b) If the Medical Officer is not aware or is in doubt as to whether any person is or is not a dependant he may refer the matter to the secretary and be guided by his decision.

Every subscriber and his dependants shall, if required, submit to a medical examination by the Medical Officer of the Fund before he is accepted as a subscriber.

Every subscriber shall be entitled to medical and 5. hospital treatment as an indoor or outdoor patient and to medicine, dressings, and appliances, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in these by-laws, for so long as the Medical Officer deems necessary, free of charge.

6 Subscribers employed by any mining company shall be deemed to be financial as from the date of their employment; provided that the Mine Management undertakes the collection of their subscriptions from wages due.

Subscribers shall not receive free treatment in any of the following cases:— (a) Incurable diseases.

- (b) Disorders for the cure of which other establishments are provided.
- (c) Any person requiring food and not medicine and who is more properly the subject for a benevolent institution.
- (d) Venereal disease.
- (e) Alcoholism, or conditions resulting therefrom.
- (f) Dentistry.

- (g) Insanity.
 (h) Accouchements (abortive or otherwise).
 (i) Any person for any condition for which he is already covered by insurance under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act.
- Sera and vaccines.
- k) Pathological examination fees.
- (1) Major operations, with the exception of urgent operations. (An urgent operation is one where the postponing of the operation for more than 24 hours after the decision to operate has been made, would, in the opinion of the Medical Officer, be detrimental to the
- (m) No patent medicines or any medicines prepared and sold under any proprietary name will be supplied free of charge to any subconsider or big docuder in the supplied free of ange the Board scriber or his dependants, unless the Board decide that any particular medicine may be included as a benefit. In all other cases any patent medicine or proprietary line pre-scribed by the Medical Officer must be paid for by the subscriber at a price to be fixed by the Board.
- (n) Infectious diseases cases.

8. (a) The Board shall have discretionary powers regarding the payment of hospital maintenance incurred in any subsidised public hospital by subscribers or their dependants who are temporarily outside the district, and who suddenly become seriously ill or meet with a serious accident which precludes their returning to the hospital covered by their Fund. In approved cases the Board will be responsible for payment to the other hospital concerned at the rate of 7s. 6d. per day, for a period not exceeding 60 days in any one year, but any amount in addition to this, charged as fees by the other hospital, will be a matter for settlement between the subscriber and the hospital concerned. The Board will not be responsible for any payment to doctors for treatment of such cases.

(b) If the Medical Officer of the Fund recommends the transfer of a patient to another hospital because he deems the appliances at hand inadequate for the proper treatment of such patient, then the Board will pay, for a period not exceeding 60 days in any one year, the hospital to which this patient is transferred, at the rate of 7s. 6d. per day. The Board will not, however, be re-sponsible for any fares or cost of transfer.

(a) Subscribers and their dependants requiring outpatient attendance shall attend at the Medical Officer's surgery between such times as shall be fixed by the Board from time to time. In the event of their not being able to attend, a message should be left at the Medical Officer's surgery or residence before 9 a.m.

(b) The Medical Officer shall be in attendance at his surgery for treatment of subscribers at the hours fixed by the Board.

10. When a subscriber, residing outside a radius, to be fixed by the Board, requires the services of a Medical Officer, he shall pay the Medical Officer mileage at such rates as shall be arranged between the Fund and the Medical Officer.

11. The doctor shall keep such records as the Board may determine from time to time.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937.

By-laws of the Kent Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance, and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Kent.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain, and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provi-sions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws, and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application, accompanied by a copy of these by-laws, shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

A Bush Fire Brigade may be established for the A Bush Fire Brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof: Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a Bush Fire Brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such Brigade is established, the Brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

Appointment of Officers.

2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first licuten-ant, a second licutenant, and such additional licuten-ants as it shall deem uccessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who in the Board's opinion have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The secretary of the Board, or such other per-son as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.

4. The Board may appoint an Equipment Officer, who shall be responsible for the custody and mainten-ance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain, where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the Equipment Officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint Bush Fire Control Officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dis-missal, and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for dutics under this Act shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire-fighting, and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first licutenant, and, in the absence of the first, the second licutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire, shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall, when so directed by the Beaudi instruct of the darma or comparison to along Board, instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a Bush Fire Brigade may consist of the following:--(a) Subscribing members; (b) fire-fighting members, and (c) associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates:—

- 10 0 (ii) Other persons-a minimum subscription of 5 0 . . ·

(3) Fire-fighting members shall be those persons, being able bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form con-tained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.

(4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire-fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by laws.

(5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire-fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.

(6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire-fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

Meetings of Brigade.

9. Meetings of the Brigade will be held as often as required.
