WHEREAS it is enacted by section 63 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, that the Governor may by Proclamation establish a Court, to be called "a Court of Native Affairs," in any district or districts, to be specified in such Proclamation, for the trial of any offence committed by a native against another native: And whereas, in pursuance of the power conferred by the said section, Courts of Native Affairs, called respectively the East Kimberley District Court of Native Affairs, the Katanning Court of Native Affairs, the Mount Margaret District Court of Native Affairs, the Pilbara Court of Native Affairs, and the West Kimberley Court of Native Affairs were established by Proclamations published in the *Government Gazette* respectively on the 19th day of March, 1937; the 19th day of May, 1939; the 2nd day of July, 1937; the 27th day of May, 1938, and the 31st day of May, 1940, for the district or districts specified respectively in the said Proclamations, and in every case the district or districts aforesaid were defined in relation to Magisterial Districts as then constituted and the said Courts were named in relation to the said Magisterial Districts: And whereas, by a Proclamation issued under the Magisterial Districts Act, 1886, new Magisterial Districts were constituted and in some cases were renamed, and by reason thereof the jurisdiction of the said Courts of Native Affairs were affected, and it is now deemed desirable and expedient to bring the said Courts of Native Affairs and their several jurisdictions into relation with the said new Magisterial Districts: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, and of all other powers in this behalf me enabling, do hereby amend and vary the hereinbeforementioned Proclamations heretofore made under the said last-mentioned Act, so that henceforth the Courts of Native

Affairs mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereunder shall be called by the names set forth in the second column of the said Schedule and shall be deemed to be established for the districts set forth in the third column of the said Schedule, and shall operate and have jurisdiction accordingly.

WHEREAS by regulation 2 of the Building Regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the Road Districts Act, 1919-1939, it is provided that no block of ground shall be laid out for building unless and until a plan showing the number of houses or buildings proposed to be built thereon, and the area to be occupied by each house or building, have been laid before and approved by the Road Board, and that it shall be unlawful for the Board to approve of any plan which does not show that every proposed building intended to be or capable of being used as a dwelling-house will have in the rear or on one side thereof an open space exclusively belonging thereto comprising an area equal in width to the full width of that allotted to the building, and of a depth of at least 20 feet, and that the area of such building and the open space will together be not less than the area for the time being fixed by Proclamation as the minimum area to be allotted to any building in the locality in which such building is to be erected: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth by this Proclamation declare that the proper area to be allotted to each and every building and the open space to be used therewith in the townsites of Mandurah and Pinjarra, and in every gazetted Townsite within the Murray Road Board Area, shall be an area of not less than eight thousand square feet.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation temporarily suspend the operations of the said

Act, in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed by any shop or shops: And whereas it is expedient to exercise such power in manner hereinafter appearing: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation suspend the operations of the said Act between the hours of six o'clock and nine o'clock in the evening of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday in every week during the period commencing on the first day of January, 1942, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1942, in so far as it applies to the closing time of shops conducted in open markets which are kept open for the conduct of business there-in between the times aforesaid and on the days aforesaid, and in which shops home-made jams and preserves, honey, butter (other than factory butter), and eggs, hams and bacon (not being factory hams or bacon), are sold or offered for sale: provided that only the said goods shall be sold or offered for sale between the said times by virtue of this Proclamation, and the said shops shall not be kept open for the sale or offering for sale of any other goods which cannot otherwise be lawfully sold or offered for sale between the times aforesaid.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the second day of December, 1941, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Vermin Act, 1918-1938.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 14 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1938, that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any defined portion of the State a Vermin District, for the purposes of the said Act, and assign a name to any district, and by section 15 of the said Act it is enacted that for every district there shall be a Board, which shall consist of so many members as may from time to time be prescribed by the Governor, and such members shall be elected or appointed as in the said Act provided, and by section 45 of the said Act it is enacted that the Governor may appoint the Board of any Road District to be the Board of any Vermin District the boundaries whereof are the same as those of the Road District, or which is comprised within the Road District: And whereas the Governor, by Order in Council made under the provisions of the Vermin Boards Act, 1909, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th day of August, 1917, constituted the portion of the State defined in such Order in Council a Vermin District, to be known as Ashburton Vermin District, and by the same Order in Council appointed nine persons to be the Board for such Vermin District: And whereas the Ashburton Vermin District still exists under and for the purpose of the Vermin Act, 1918-1938, and is comprised within the Ashburton Road District, and it is now deemed desirable and expedient to dissolve and abolish the Board heretofore appointed and constituted as aforesaid for the said Vermin District and in lieu thereof to appoint the Ashburton Road Board to be the Board for the said Vermin District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Vermin Act, 1918-1938, doth hereby dissolve and abolish the Vermin Board heretofore appointed and constituted as aforesaid for the said Ashburton Vermin District, and in lieu thereof doth hereby appoint the Ashburton Road Board to be the Vermin Board of the said Ashburton Vermin District and to be known as the Ashburton Vermin Board.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

HOSPITALS ACT, 1927.

Cue District Hospital.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 37 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, the Governor may make regulations for the purpose of the Act, and may thereby formulate Model By-laws for the guidance of Boards in respect of all or any of the matters regarding which Boards may make by-laws: And whereas the Governor in Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the said section, has formulated Model By-laws, as contained in regulation 10 of the regulations made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1940: And whereas a Board may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws: Now, therefore, Cue Hospital Board, being a Board within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, doth hereby adopt the Model By-laws contained in regulation 10 of the regulations made under the Hospitals Act, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1940, subject to the modifications described in the Schedule hereunder:—

Schedule.

Add to clause, by-law No. 16:—'Concessional rates to subscribers and their dependants—accouchements, X-ray and theatre fees, half rates only to be charged.'

Passed at a meeting of the Cue District Hospital Board this 2nd day of September, 1941.

At a meeting of the Board of Management of the Cue District Hospital on the 26th day of June, 1941, the following resolution was passed:—

Whereas under the provisions of section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, a Board may itself establish and manage a Medical Fund, the object of which shall be to secure for its subscribers medical attendance, hospital treatment, or other similar benefits; and may by by-laws provide for the regulation and control of such Fund: And whereas a Medical Fund has been established by the Board of Management at the Cue District Hospital: Now, therefore, the said Board of Management, acting pursuant to section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, do hereby make by-laws for the regulation and control of the said Medical Fund in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

By-laws for the Control of Medical Funds under section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927.

1. The term "subscriber" shall mean any person, male or female, who has paid his or her subscription and is financial and has paid at least two weeks' subscription prior to seeking any benefits or privileges, and shall include, so far as benefits are concerned, all dependants of the subscriber.

2. The subscription to be paid by a subscriber shall be—adult, 2/0d.; minor, 1/4d., per week, or—adult, 25/0d.; minor, 17/0d., per quarter, as the subscriber may elect.

3. The word “dependant” shall mean the wife, parents, and grandparents of a subscriber, the sons, daughters, brothers, and sisters not over sixteen years of age of a subscriber who are actually residing with and wholly dependent on him at the date of the illness or accident which the Medical Officer is required to treat.

(b) If the Medical Officer is not aware or is in doubt as to whether any person is or is not a dependant he may refer the matter to the secretary and be guided by his decision.

4. Every subscriber and his dependants shall, if required, submit to a medical examination by the Medical Officer of the Fund before he is accepted as a subscriber.

5. Every subscriber shall be entitled to medical and hospital treatment as an indoor or outdoor patient and to medicine, dressings, and appliances, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in these by-laws for so long as the Medical Officer deems necessary, free of charge.

6. Subscribers employed by any mining company shall be deemed to be financial as from the date of their employment: Provided that the Mine Management undertakes the collection of their subscriptions from wages due.

7. Subscribers shall not receive free treatment in any of the following cases:—

- (a) Incurable diseases.
- (b) Disorders for the cure of which other establishments are provided.
- (c) Any person requiring food and not medicine and who is more properly the subject for a benevolent institution.
- (d) Venereal disease.
- (e) Alcoholism, or conditions resulting therefrom.
- (f) Dentistry.
- (g) Insanity.
- (h) Accouchements (abortive or otherwise).
- (i) Any person for any condition for which he is already covered by insurance under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (j) Sera and vaccines.
- (k) Pathological examination fees.
- (l) Major operations, with the exception of urgent operations. (An urgent operation is one where the postponing of the operation for more than 24 hours after the decision to

operate has been made, would, in the opinion of the Medical Officer, be detrimental to the health of the patient.)

(m) No patent medicines or any medicines prepared and sold under any proprietary name will be supplied free of charge to any subscriber or his dependants, unless the Board decide that any particular medicine may be included as a benefit. In all other cases any patent medicine or proprietary line prescribed by the Medical Officer must be paid for by the subscriber at a price to be fixed by the Board.

(n) In respect to accouchements, X-rays, and theatre fees, subscribers shall be charged half rates.

8. The Board shall have discretionary powers regarding the payment of hospital maintenance incurred in any subsidised public hospital by subscribers or their dependants who are temporarily outside the district, and who suddenly become seriously ill or meet with a serious accident which precludes their returning to the hospital covered by their Fund. In approved cases the Board will be responsible for payment to the other hospital concerned, at the rate of 7s. 6d. per day for a period not exceeding 60 days in any one year, but any amount in addition to this charged as fees by the other hospital will be a matter for settlement between the subscriber and the hospital concerned. The Board will not be responsible for any payment to doctors for treatment of such cases.

(b) If the Medical Officer of the Fund recommends the transfer of a patient to another hospital because he deems the appliances at hand inadequate for the proper treatment of such patient, then the Board will pay, for a period not exceeding 60 days in any one year, the hospital to which this patient is transferred, at the rate of 7s. 6d. per day. The Board will not, however, be responsible for any fares or cost of transfer.

9. Subscribers and their dependants requiring out-patient attendance shall attend at the Medical Officer's surgery between such times as shall be fixed by the Board from time to time. In the event of their not being able to attend, a message should be left at the Medical Officer's surgery or residence before 9 a.m.

(b) The Medical Officer shall be in attendance at his surgery for treatment of subscribers at the hours fixed by the Board.

10. When a subscriber, residing outside a radius, to be fixed by the Board, requires the services of a Medical Officer, he shall pay the Medical Officer mileage at such rates as shall be arranged between the Fund and the Medical Officer.

11. The doctor shall keep such records as the Board may determine from time to time.

RIGHTS IN WATER AND IRRIGATION ACT, 1914-1939.

Schedule.

RIGHTS IN WATER AND IRRIGATION ACT, 1914-1939.

Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act Regulations, 1941.
2. In these regulations, subject to the context:—
 - “The Act” means the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914, as amended by the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act Amendment Act, 1939.
 - “Advisory committee” means any advisory committee appointed by the Minister under these regulations.
 - “Proclamation” means a Proclamation issued under and for the purposes of subsection (5) of section 27 of the Act.
 Other expressions used in these regulations, which are defined in section 2 of the Act, have the same meanings in these regulations as they have in the Act.

Advisory Committee.

3. (1) The Minister may from time to time appoint an honorary advisory committee for the purposes of these regulations.
 - (2) An advisory committee may consist of such number of persons, including representatives of owners and occupiers of land and officers of Government departments, as the Minister may think fit.
- Provided that—
- (a) not more than three persons shall be members of the committee as representatives of owners and occupiers of land at any one time; and
 - (b) the persons to be members of the committee as representatives of owners and occupiers of land shall be such persons as the Minister may select from persons to be nominated by the local authorities in whose districts the watercourse, lake, lagoon, swamp or marsh referred to in regulation 4 hereof is situated.
- Provided that, where such local authorities make no nominations or an insufficient number of nominations, the Minister may select the persons to be members of the advisory committee as representatives of the owners and occupiers of land without nominations by such local authorities;
- (c) the Minister may from time to time determine the number of nominations to be made by the local authorities and the manner in which such nominations shall be made.
- (3) Persons appointed to be members of the committee shall hold office during the pleasure of the Minister.
 - (4) The functions of the advisory committee shall include assisting and advising the Minister and the Commissioners in respect of the allocation of water supply to licensees and of such other matters as the Minister may deem desirable or expedient to refer to the committee.

Licenses.

4. Whenever by any Proclamation any watercourse, lake, lagoon, swamp, or marsh has been brought within the provisions of Part III. of the Act, the following provisions shall apply:—
 - (a) if the water of such watercourse, lake, lagoon, swamp or marsh has been permanently diverted or at intervals during every year exclusively taken and used by the owner or occupier, or the successive owners or occupiers of any parcel of land alienated from the Crown before the date of the issue of the Proclamation, and has from a date prior to the date of the issue of the Proclamation been so taken and used by such owner or owners or occupier or occupiers for purposes and uses in respect of such land, other than domestic and ordinary use and watering cattle or other stock and the irrigation of a garden not exceeding five acres in extent, being part of such land and used in connection with a dwelling, such owner or occupier may at any time within twelve months after the date of the issue of the Proclamation apply to the Minister for a special license under section 15 of the Act to continue in like manner to divert or take and use such water for a further period of ten years from the date of the issue of the Proclamation; and when any such special license is granted the provisions of section 15 of the Act shall apply in relation thereto;
 - (b) if any owner or occupier who under paragraph (a) hereof is qualified to apply for a special license under section 15 of the Act, fails to make application for a special license within twelve months after the date of the issue of the Proclamation, such owner or occupier may nevertheless at any time thereafter apply to the Minister for an ordinary license under section 16 of the Act to take, use, or dispose of water from the said watercourse, lake, lagoon, swamp, or marsh;
 - (c) any owner or occupier of land, not being an owner or occupier to whom either paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) hereof applies, may at any time apply to the Minister under section 16 of the Act for an ordinary license to take, use, or dispose of water from such watercourse, lake, lagoon, swamp, or marsh; and

- (d) nothing in this regulation shall effect the right of any owner or occupier to whom section 17 of the Act applies, to take, use, or dispose of water from such watercourse, lake, lagoon, swamp, or marsh up to but not exceeding the quantities permitted by section 17 of the Act.

Special Licenses.

5. (1) Every application for a special license under section 15 of the Act shall comply with the provisions of subsection (2) of that section and shall be made in the Form No. 1 in the Appendix to these regulations.

(2) The application shall be accompanied—

- (a) by a statutory declaration made by the applicant in the Form No. 2 in the Appendix to these regulations; and
 (b) by the amount of five shillings, being the annual license fee for a special license as prescribed by regulation 24 hereof, in respect of the first year of the special license applied for.

(3) If the application is refused, the amount of the annual license fee paid therewith shall be refunded to the applicant.

6. The notice of an application for a special license to be published by the Minister in accordance with subsection (3) of section 15 of the Act shall be in the Form No. 3 in the Appendix to these regulations. Any number of applications may be included in the same notice.

7. (1) Where any owner or occupier of land entitled under subsection (4) of section 15 of the Act to object to the granting of a special license desires so to object, he shall give to the Minister notice of such objection, and the grounds thereof, in the Form No. 4 in the Appendix to these regulations.

(2) Such notice of objection shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration of the evidence supporting the objection, in the Form No. 5 in the Appendix to these regulations.

8. The Minister, before making to the Governor, in accordance with subsection (5) of section 15 of the Act, any recommendation in relation to an application for a special license under the said section shall refer such application, together with the objections (if any) thereto received by the Minister, to the Commissioners for their approval.

9. Where the Minister submits to the Governor an application for a special license, together with a recommendation that the same be granted, as provided for in subsection (5) of section 15 of the Act, the recommendation may contain, for the determination of the Governor a statement of the conditions upon which the special license applied for shall be granted.

10. Every special license granted under section 15 of the Act shall be in the form or to the effect of the Form No. 6 in the Appendix to these regulations, and shall be held upon and subject to the conditions stated in the license and to the provisions of the Act.

11. The statutory declaration to be furnished annually during the currency of a special license by the holder thereof in accordance with subsection (6) of section 15 of the Act shall be in the Form No. 7 in the Appendix to these regulations.

12. Every notice of intention to recommend the revocation of a special license given by the Minister under subsection (7) of section 15 of the Act shall be in the Form No. 8 in the Appendix to these regulations.

Ordinary Licenses.

13. (1) Every application for an ordinary license under section 16 of the Act shall be in writing, signed by the applicant, in the Form No. 1 in the Appendix to these regulations, with such adaptations as may be necessary, and shall contain the following particulars :—

- (a) a sufficient description of the land in relation to which the water is required, to enable proper searches as to title to be made ;
 (b) the name or description of the watercourse, lake, lagoon, swamp, or marsh from which the water is to be taken ;
 (c) the use to which the land aforesaid is applied at the time of making the application ;
 (d) the quantity of water for daily consumption for which the license is sought ;
 (e) the names and addresses of the owner or owners, or the occupier or occupiers of the land aforesaid and of other lands contiguous to the watercourse, lake, lagoon, swamp, or marsh aforesaid within a distance of three miles of the land in relation to which the license applied for is required ; provided that the Minister may dispense with compliance with the requirements of this paragraph in any case where he is satisfied that such compliance will be difficult or unnecessary ;
 (f) a map showing the location of the land aforesaid and indicating the point where diversion of water is proposed to be made.

(2) The application shall be accompanied :—

- (a) by a statutory declaration made by the applicant, in the Form No. 2 in the Appendix to these regulations, with such adaptations as may be necessary ; and
 (b) by the amount of twenty shillings, being the annual license fee for an ordinary license, as prescribed by regulation 24 hereof, in respect of the first year of the ordinary license applied for.

(3) If the application is refused, the amount of the annual license fee paid therewith shall be refunded to the applicant.

14. (1) The Minister shall cause notice of every application to be published in the *Government Gazette* and in at least one issue of a newspaper circulating generally in the neighbourhood of the land, and shall direct copies of such notice to be served on such persons as he thinks fit, and shall appoint a time, not more than one month from the date of such notice or of the first of such advertisements within which objections to such applications may be delivered. Any number of applications may be included in the same notice.

(2) Such notice shall be in the Form No. 3 in the Appendix to these regulations, with such adaptations as may be necessary.

15. (1) Within the time limited as aforesaid any owner or occupier of land contiguous to such watercourse, lake, lagoon, swamp, or marsh within the said distance of three miles, may, in writing, in the Form No. 4 in the Appendix to these regulations, with such adaptations as may be necessary, signed by him and addressed to the Minister, give notice of objection to the application and of the grounds of such objection.

(2) Such notice of objection shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration of the evidence supporting the objection, in the Form No. 5 in the Appendix to these regulations, with such adaptations as may be necessary.

16. (1) The Minister, before granting to the applicant an ordinary license under section 16 of the Act shall refer the application and the objections (if any) thereto to the Commissioners for their approval.

(2) The Commissioners, if they approve of the application, may determine any of the conditions subject to which the license shall be granted by the Minister. Failing any such determination by the Commissioners the Minister shall determine such conditions.

17. Notwithstanding that the Commissioners have approved of an ordinary license being granted, the Minister may refuse to grant such license; but the Minister shall not grant any ordinary license, except with the approval of the Commissioners.

18. Every ordinary license granted by the Minister under section 16 of the Act shall be in the Form No. 9 in the Appendix to these regulations, and shall be held upon and subject to the conditions stated in the license and to the provisions of the Act.

19. The holder of an ordinary license may under his license divert, take, and use water to the extent and in respect of the land and in the manner specified in his license.

20. The holder of an ordinary license shall, at the end of each and every year of the currency of his license, lodge at the office of the Minister a statutory declaration, in the Form No. 7 in the Appendix to these regulations, with such adaptations as may be necessary, declaring whether the diversion, taking, and use of the water throughout the then past year were and still are only as sanctioned by the license.

21. (1) If at any time during the currency of an ordinary license it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the holder of such license has failed to observe and perform the conditions and provisions subject to which it was granted and is held, or that it is expedient in the interests of the public as to the diversion and use of the water sanctioned by such license, that the license should be determined or modified, the Minister may, acting on the advice of the Commissioners, give the licensee notice in writing, in the Form No. 8 in the Appendix to these regulations, with such adaptations as may be necessary, either by delivering the same to the licensee personally or by sending it to him in a registered letter addressed to him at his address given in his application for the license, that after the expiration of one month from the date of such notice it is his intention to revoke or to modify such license.

(2) Unless the licensee, before the expiration of the month so fixed, shows to the Minister sufficient cause why the license should not be revoked or modified, the Minister may thereupon revoke or modify the same.

22. If the Minister revokes or modifies an ordinary license in the interests of the public, and, in so far as Parliament may appropriate the Consolidated Revenue for such purpose, such amount by way of compensation may be paid to the licensee out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund as to the Minister may seem just and equitable.

General Conditions of Licenses.

23. In addition to any other conditions which may be imposed by the Governor or by the Minister, as the case may be, every special license granted by the Governor under section 15 of the Act, and every ordinary license granted by the Minister under section 16 of the Act, shall be granted and shall be held subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) that the license granted is personal to the person to whom it is granted, and shall not be transferable or assignable to any other person, except with the express approval of the Governor or of the Minister, as the case may require, and then only upon and subject to such terms and conditions as the Governor or the Minister, as the case may be, may stipulate;
- (b) that in the event of the water in any watercourse, lake, lagoon, swamp, or marsh falling short of the quantity necessary to provide water in sufficient quantity to be of practical service to the licensees authorised to divert, take, and use the water from such watercourse, lake, lagoon, swamp, or marsh, the Minister may by notice in writing to the licensees concerned, or by notice published in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper circulating in the locality affected, ration or limit the quantity of water which each licensee may take under his license, in such manner as may be determined by the Minister, on the advice of the advisory committee and the Commissioners, for the period specified in such notice;
- (c) if any licensee in any respect contravenes the provisions of any notice given to him under condition (b) hereof, he shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations and also of a breach of the conditions of his license.

Fees for Licenses.

24. (1) The fee for a special license granted under section 15 of the Act shall be an annual fee of five shillings, payable annually in advance at the commencement of each year of the currency of the license.

(2) The fee for an ordinary license granted under section 16 of the Act shall be an annual fee of twenty shillings, payable annually in advance at the commencement of each year of the currency of the license.

Penalties.

25. Any person who contravenes these regulations or fails to carry out any condition of the license held by him shall, in addition to the revocation of his license, as provided for in the Act and these regulations, be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds for each such contravention or breach.





(c) This by-law shall come into effect at the expiration of five years from the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette* of the State of Western Australia.

By-laws to Control Camping in the Upper Blackwood Road District.

P.W. 867/37.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1939, the Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act, the Upper Blackwood Road Board doth, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every power enabling it in this behalf, hereby make the following by-laws:—

(1)—Camping.

No person shall, except as hereinafter provided, camp, lodge, or tarry for a longer period than seven conse-

cutive days on any Crown lands or reserve for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying thereon.

(2)—Permits for Camping.

Notwithstanding the provisions of clause (1), camping may be permitted in areas set apart for the purpose by the Road Board, but not elsewhere, upon the issue of a permission by an inspector or ranger appointed by the Road Board, and subject to the following conditions:—

The Board may at any time make and declare a schedule of charges and issue permits to persons desirous of camping on any such area.

(a) No person shall sublet any camp, or sell, give, or otherwise dispose of any permit to any person.

(b) No person shall cut or otherwise destroy any trees or shrubs within the camping area, excepting only by permission of the inspector or ranger, for clearing those areas actually required for erecting camps thereon.

(c) Campers must keep the area covered by their permit in a clean and sanitary condition at all times. All rubbish capable of destruction by fire shall be burned by the occupier in the approved fireplace, and all other rubbish shall be placed in proper receptacles.

(d) All campers must use the sanitary conveniences provided, and in no circumstances will improvised conveniences on individual camping sites be permitted.

(e) Camping permits may at any time be withdrawn by the inspector, if in his opinion a breach of these by-laws has been committed, or if in his opinion it is desirable that the permit shall be terminated. In the event of termination hereunder, the rental paid shall be forfeited to the Road Board, and no compensation shall be paid for loss, damage, or inconvenience suffered through the withdrawal of the permit.

(f) Subject to the right of the inspector and the officers and employees of the Road Board, or any other person acting under their instructions, or any police officer, to enter any camping site at any time, no persons shall enter into or remain within such camping site, except with the permission of the holder of the permit.

(g) No fires shall be lighted on any camping area, except in places approved by the inspector.

(h) Permits issued shall be for a period of three months only, and an extension of this period can only be obtained by the approval of the Board granted at a Board meeting.

(i) Tents only will be allowed.

Buildings constructed with a wooden or iron framework are prohibited.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in these by-laws, the Board may at a full board meeting, upon application by an old age or other pensioner, agree to the issuing of a permit for the erection of a wood and iron camp for permanent occupation by the person to whom the permit is issued.

(j) Business of any description will not be allowed on any camping area.

(3)—Penalty.

For every offence against the provisions of these by-laws, the offender shall, upon conviction, before any one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds (£20).

Schedule of Fees.

For each private camping site (33 ft. x 69 ft.)—two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.), to be paid in advance. This is for a period of three months, or portion thereof. Persons occupying camps must also pay a fee of sixpence (6d.) per week for each camp, such payment to be utilised towards the payment of sanitary services carried out on the camping grounds.
