1942.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,
TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and
JAMES MITCHELL, } over the State of Western Australia
Lieutenant-Governor. } and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] } wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 3 of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942, that during a time of war the Governor on the recommendation of the Minister may at any time and from time to time by Proclamation direct that any election required by its Governing Act to be held by any public authority shall be postponed for such period not exceeding twelve calendar months as shall be specified in the Proclamation, subject however to the provisions of paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of the said section; and whereas the Dairy Products Marketing Board as constituted under the Dairy Products Marketing Regulation Act, 1934-1937, is a public authority within the meaning of the said Act as declared by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th day of November, 1943, and is required by its said governing Act ordinarily to hold an election of members of the Board during the month of March, 1944; and whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient that the said election shall be postponed until the month of March, 1945; and whereas in accordance with the requirements of paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 3 of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942, the Minister caused notice of his intention to recommend to the Governor the issue of this Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* on the 26th day of November, 1943, and in the *West Australian* newspaper on the 27th day of November, 1943, and no objection has been made to such recommendation or to the issue of this Proclamation within the time prescribed by the said paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 3 of the Act aforesaid: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor acting within the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942, do hereby direct that the election of the Dairy Products Marketing Board which ordinarily would be held during

March, 1944, shall be postponed for a period of twelve months until March, 1945.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 26th day of January, 1944, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Land Act, 1933-1939.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 4930/26.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1939, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserves A8615, A3355 and 20357 should vest in and be held by the State Gardens Board in trust for Park Lands, Public Recreation, and Park and Recreation respectively: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the State Gardens Board in trust for Park Lands, Public Recreation, and Park and Recreation respectively with power to the said State Gardens Board to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserves for any term not exceeding Five (5) years from the date of the lease.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to

become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas McIlwraith, McEacharn, Limited, of Scottish House, Phillimore street, Fremantle, Western Australia, being an employer and as such subject to the said section and having duly made application in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act for exemption from the operation of section 10 aforesaid has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability under the said Act as such employer and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit Commonwealth Bonds for Five Thousand Pounds, charged with all payments to become due under its said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 10 of the said Act, doth hereby exempt McIlwraith, McEacharn, Limited, aforesaid from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, for a period of two years commencing on the 1st day of January, 1944.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1942.

Department of Public Health,
Perth, 26th January, 1944.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 321 of the Health Act, 1911-1942, that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a local authority under any of the provisions of that Act and that a local authority may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws with or without modification; and whereas it is enacted by section 15 of the said Act that in any emergency or necessity the Commissioner of Public Health may *inter alia* exercise and perform in any part of the State any or all of the powers and duties vested in or imposed upon a local

authority under the said Act; and whereas pursuant to section 321 aforesaid Model By-laws known as Model By-laws Series A have been made and the same have been from time to time amended as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927, and subsequent dates; and whereas the Commissioner of Public Health acting under the authority of sections 15 and 321 aforesaid has adopted the said Model By-laws Series A and now deems it desirable and expedient to adopt certain amendments thereof hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore, the Commissioner of Public Health acting under the authority of sections 15 and 321 of the Health Act, 1911-1942, doth hereby resolve and determine to adopt without modification those amendments of the said Model By-laws Series A heretofore made under the said Act and more particularly published in the *Government Gazette* respectively on the following dates that is to say:—(a) the 29th day of September, 1939—transport of meat; (b) the 18th day of July, 1941—fixtures and fittings relating to water supply, sewerage and drainage; (c) the 23rd day of April, 1943—sanitary conveniences; (d) the 10th day of December, 1943—rat destruction.
