WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2 of the Abattoirs Act, 1909-1941, that "Stock" means any bovine animal, swine or goat and also such other animals to which the Governor may by notice in the *Government Gazette* declare that this Act shall apply; and whereas it is deemed expedient to declare equine animals as "Stock" for the purposes of the said Act and to which the said Act should apply; Now therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2 of the Abattoirs Act, 1909-1941, do by this Proclamation declare that equine animals shall be "Stock" for the purposes of the said Act and to which the said Act shall apply.

(1) IN pursuance of the provisions of section 17 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, hereby declare that with respect to nets known as set-nets, when used or intended to be used in the waters of the Wellstead Estuary or the Beaufort Inlet for catching all kinds of fish, nets of 100 yards in length and with a

mesh of 4 inches throughout shall, during the period between the 1st May and the 30th September (both inclusive) in each year, be lawful nets; and nets of 50 yards in length and with a mesh of 4 inches throughout shall, during the period between the 1st October in each year and the 30th April in the year next following (both days inclusive), be lawful nets.

(2) In pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the said Act I hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in the following Western Australian waters, that is to say, the whole of the rivers, tributaries, creeks and affluents flowing into the waters of the Wellstead Estuary and the Beaufort Inlet.

(3) In pursuance of the provisions of sections 8 and 10 of the said Act I further prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of nets from the Western Australian waters known respectively as Wellstead Estuary and Beaufort Inlet, except the set-nets defined in paragraph (1) hereof during the periods therein set out respectively; provided that during the period between the 1st May and the 30th September (both inclusive) in each year no person, either as principal, or as the employee or agent of any person, nor any company or party of persons, nor any partnership, shall use or cause to be used more than six nets at any one time, and that no person shall set, or cause to be set, any net closer than 100 yards to any other net set therein; and provided further that during the period between the 1st October in each year and the 30th April in the year next following (both days inclusive) no person, either as principal, or as the employee or agent of any person, nor any company or party of persons, nor any partnership, shall use or cause to be used more than one net at any one time, and that no person shall set, or cause to be set, any net closer than 100 yards to any other net set therein.

(4) The Proclamation dated 25th August, 1942 (published in *Government Gazette* of 16th October, 1942), and 11th May, 1943 (published in *Government Gazette* of 14th May, 1943), relating to the prohibition of net-fishing in the waters of Pallinup and Wellstead Estuaries, and the tributaries of those estuaries, respectively, are hereby rescinded.

(5) The provisions of this Proclamation shall have effect for the term of five years from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this first day of March, 1944, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Health Act, 1911-1942.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1942, that the Governor may by Order in Council *inter alia* constitute any portion of the State, not being a municipal district, a health district with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the order and may alter the boundaries of any such district; and whereas by an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th day of March, 1913, a health district was constituted and the boundaries thereof were defined and such health district was ordered to be known as Beverley Road Health District; And whereas the said district is still subsisting, and the boundaries thereof are now those prescribed and defined in an Order in Council made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th day of December, 1943; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to change the name of the said health district in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act doth hereby change the name of the said Beverley Road Health District to "Beverley Health District" and direct that henceforth the said health district shall be known as Beverley Health District in lieu of Beverley Road Health District.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1224/41.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements—City of Perth.

Proposed improvements to water supply, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 6725.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the first day of March, 1944.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas the Bank of New South Wales, of St. George's terrace, Perth, in the State of Western Australia, being an employer within the meaning of the said Act, and having made application in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that as such employer it has established a fund for insurance against its liability aforesaid, and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a bond of five thousand pounds, given by the said Bank, charged with all payments to become due and payable by the said Bank under its said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said Bank of New South Wales as such employer aforesaid from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, for a period of two years computed from and including the 31st day of March, 1944.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 320 of the Health Act, 1911-1942, that every local authority may from time to time make by-laws as in the said Act provided and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act within its district and may repeal amend or suspend the operation of any by-laws so made; and by section 321 of the said Act that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a local authority as aforesaid and that a local authority may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws with or without modification; And whereas Model By-laws have been prepared known as Model By-laws Series A as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927, and other subsequent dates, and in particular Model By-laws 63 and 64 contained in Part I. of the said Model By-laws Series A have been deleted from and new By-laws 63, 64 and 66A have been inserted in Part I. of the said Model By-laws Series A as set forth in a notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of December, 1943; and whereas the Collie Municipal Council is the local authority within the meaning of the Act, and deems it desirable and expedient in accordance with section 321 of the said Act to adopt the amendments aforesaid made in the said Model By-laws Series A to the intent that the new Model By-laws 63, 64 and 66A aforesaid shall be by-laws of the said local authority: Now, therefore, the said Collie Municipal Council as such local authority doth hereby resolve and determine to adopt as part of its by-laws under the said Act those By-laws 63, 64 and 66A which now form part of Part I. of the said Model By-laws Series A by virtue

of the amendment thereof as set forth in the notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of December, 1943, and to adopt the same without modification.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 320 of the Health Act, 1911-1942 (as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938), that a local authority may make by-laws, and may amend, repeal or alter by-laws so made, and by section 321 of the said Act that the Governor may cause Model By-laws to be prepared and published in the *Government Gazette*, and that any local authority may adopt such by-laws with or without modification, as the by-laws of the said local authority; and whereas Model By-laws were prepared and gazetted as aforesaid on the 8th day of April, 1927, and the same were adopted by the Merredin Road Board: Now therefore it is resolved and determined by the Merredin Road Board as such local health authority aforesaid, acting pursuant to section 185 of the Health Act, 1911-1927, (as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938), that the said by-laws be amended by inserting in section C of Part IX. thereof, after by-law 1 as contained in the said section C, a new by-law to stand as by-law A1 as follows:—

Prohibited area for keeping of swine or pigsty.—1A Subject as hereinafter provided, on and after 1st day of May, 1944, no person shall keep any swine or pigsty in that locality of the District specified hereunder:—All that land comprising the Townsite of Merredin.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 320 of the Health Act, 1911-1942, that every local authority may from time to time make by-laws as in the said Act provided and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act within its district and may repeal amend or suspend the operation of any by-laws so made; and by section 321 of the said Act that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a local authority as aforesaid and that a local authority may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws with or without modification; and whereas Model By-laws have been prepared known as Model By-laws Series A as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927, and other subsequent dates, and in particular Model By-laws 63 and 64 contained in Part 1 of the said Model By-laws Series A have been deleted from and new By-laws 63, 64, and 66A have been inserted in Part 1 of the said Model By-laws Series A as set forth in a notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of December, 1943; and whereas the Balingup Road Board is the local authority within the meaning of the Act, and deems it desirable and expedient in accordance with section 321 of the said Act to adopt the amendments aforesaid made in the said Model By-laws Series A to the intent that the new Model By-laws 63, 64, and 66A aforesaid shall be by-laws of the said local authority: Now, therefore, the said Balingup Road Board as such local authority doth hereby resolve and determine to adopt as part of its by-laws under the said Act those By-laws 63, 64 and 66A which now form part of Part 1 of the said Model By-laws Series A by virtue of the amendment thereof as set forth in the notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of December, 1943, and to adopt the same without modification.

By-law (7).—(1) Add the words "Medical treatment for" before the words "Major operations" in the first line.

THE BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937-1942.

Regulations.

Citation.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1942, Regulations.

Repeal.

2. All regulations heretofore made under and for the purposes of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and any amendment thereof, are hereby repealed.

Interpretation.

3. In these regulations "the Act" shall mean the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1942, and terms used shall, unless the contrary intention appears, have the same meanings as those given to such terms by the Act.

Permit to burn within a Fire Protected Area.

4. (1) Any owner or occupier of land within a fire protected area desiring to obtain permission in pursuance of subsection (2) of section 8 of the Act to set fire to the bush upon such land shall lodge an application, signed by him, in the Form 1 in the Appendix to these regulations with the nearest authorised officer within the fire protected area or if there be no such officer within the fire protected area, with the Minister, for a permit to burn as hereinafter prescribed. (2) An application under the preceding paragraph of this regulation may be accepted in the form of a letter provided that the full information contained in the Form 1 aforesaid is supplied in such letter. (3) For the purpose of this regulation the term "authorised officer" shall mean an officer acting with the authority of the Minister. (4) Every forest officer appointed under the Forests Act, 1918, shall be deemed to be an "authorised officer" within the meaning of this regulation.

5. (1) The Minister or authorised officer upon receipt of an application under the preceding regulation shall consider same and provided he is satisfied that proper precautions have been or will be taken by the applicant to confine the fire within the boundaries of the land in respect of which the application is made and that there is no undue risk of the fire getting out of control, shall issue to such applicant a permit to burn in accordance with the Form 2 in the Appendix to these regulations. (2) A permit to burn shall contain such conditions relating to the precautionary measures to be taken by the permit holder to control the fire as the Minister or authorised officer issuing such permit may consider necessary.

6. The holder of a permit to burn, shall, upon demand, produce such permit to an authorised officer.

7. Any person acting under the instructions of an authorised officer may enter upon any land in respect of which a permit to burn has been granted or application has been made therefor for all or any of the following purposes, namely:—(i) investigating the dangers likely to arise by burning; (ii) being present at burning operations; (iii) investigating steps taken to prevent the spread of fire subsequent to the main burning.

8. The holder of a permit to burn shall not set fire to any part of the bush at any time unless—(i) he has delivered or caused to be delivered personally at least four days' notice in writing of his intention to do so to each owner or occupier of all lands adjoining the land upon which the bush proposed to be burnt is situated; (ii) he has himself arranged for and provided at least three men to be constantly in attendance at the fire from the time it is lighted until it is completely extinguished to assist in keeping the fire under control and preventing it from spreading beyond the land on which the burning is to take place.

9. The holder of a permit to burn shall take such precautions as may be required by any authorised officer for the purpose of preventing the spread of fire from the land in respect of which the permit is granted on to any State forest, timber reserve or other Crown land or upon any adjoining holding.

10. In the event of any fire escaping beyond the boundaries of the land in respect of which a permit to burn has been granted, the holder of such permit shall, if possible, immediately notify the nearest authorised officer and within 24 hours of the suppression of such fire shall report in full the circumstances causing such escape to the authorised officer by whom the permit to burn was granted.

Permit to Burn Clover during Prohibited Times.

11. (1) An application for a permit to burn clover during prohibited times for the purpose of facilitating the collection of clover burr shall be made in accordance with the Form 3 in the Appendix to these regulations and shall be lodged with the nearest authorised officer who may, if he thinks fit, require the applicant to make the statutory declaration contained in such form. (2) An application for a permit to burn clover may be accepted in the form of a letter provided that the full information contained in the Form 3 aforesaid is supplied in such letter. (3) For the purpose of this and the next two succeeding regulations the term "authorised officer" shall mean any officer duly appointed by the Minister, notice of whose appointment has been published in the *Government Gazette* and in at least one news-

paper circulating in the district in which the officer resides. The local authority for the district in which any such officer resides shall be notified forthwith in writing of his appointment by the Minister.

12. Upon receipt of an application for a permit to burn clover the authorised officer shall consider same and if satisfied that such application should be granted shall issue a permit in the Form 4 in the Appendix to these regulations.

13. In the event of any fire escaping beyond the boundaries of the area in respect of which a permit to burn has been granted, the holder of such permit shall, if possible, immediately notify the nearest bush fire control or authorised officer and within 24 hours of the suppression of such fire shall report in full the circumstances causing such escape to the authorised officer by whom the permit was granted.

Charcoal Burning.

14. (1) Every person proposing to light a fire or fires for the conversion of any bush into charcoal at any time during the period commencing on the first day of October and ending on the thirty-first day of May next ensuing in every yearly period as provided for in paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 16 of the Act shall, at least seven days before lighting such fire, give notice in writing of such intention to the local authority in whose district the land on which the fire is to be lighted is situate, and, in the event of the land on which the fire is to be lighted being within two miles of a State forest, to the local forest officer. Such notice shall specify the land on which the burning is to take place and the period during which the fire is to be kept burning. (2) The local authority, through its fire control officer or the local forestry officer as the case may be, may, within the period specified in paragraph 1 of this regulation, direct that such further measures of precautions be taken as, in the opinion of the bush fire control officer or forestry officer, are considered necessary to prevent the fire from spreading or escaping, and when the bush fire control officer or forest officer has given such directions, the said fire shall not be lighted until such directions have been complied with.

Permit to Burn Plants (other than Flax) during Prohibited Times.

15. (1) Whenever the Governor by Proclamation, pursuant to the provisions of section 18 of the Act, has authorised the burning of any specified plant, or the refuse thereof, during the prohibited times or any period thereof, any person desirous of burning such plant, or the refuse thereof, within the area and within the times to which such Proclamation relates, shall lodge an application, signed by him, in Form 9 in the Appendix to these regulations with the secretary of the road board within whose district such burning is to take place or with the nearest authorised officer for a permit to burn such plant, or the refuse thereof, as hereinafter prescribed. (2) An application under the preceding paragraph of this regulation may be accepted in the form of a letter provided that the full information contained in the Form 9 aforesaid is supplied in such letter. (3) The secretary of the road board or the authorised officer with whom the application is lodged may, if he thinks fit, require the applicant to make the statutory declaration contained in the form of application. (4) For the purpose of this and the next succeeding regulation the term "authorised officer" shall mean any officer duly appointed by the Minister, notice of whose appointment has been published in the *Government Gazette* and in at least one newspaper circulating in the district in which the officer resides. The local authority for the district in which any such officer resides shall be notified forthwith in writing of his appointment by the Minister. (5) In this and the five next succeeding regulations the term "plant" shall not mean or include the plant known as "flax."

16. Upon receipt of an application for a permit to burn plants or the refuse thereof the secretary of the road board or the authorised officer shall consider same, and if satisfied that such application should be granted, shall issue a permit in the Form 10 in the Appendix to these regulations.

17. The area of ground on which the plants or refuse thereof are to be burnt shall be so cleared or prepared that the fire shall not in any circumstances be able to run along the ground.

18. The plants or refuse thereof to be burnt shall be placed in heaps and so that each heap shall not be more than three feet high measured from the ground, and shall not cover an area of ground exceeding that which would be contained within the circumference of a circle having a diameter of six feet and so that there shall be a distance of at least ten feet between the base of any one heap and that of any other heap.

19. The heaps mentioned in regulation 18 hereof shall be distant approximately one-half chain from any brush fence in the vicinity thereof, and at least one chain from the nearest boundary of any pastoral or agricultural property adjoining the land upon which such heaps are situated.

20. The person proposing to burn plants or the refuse thereof as aforesaid shall—(a) two days at least before doing so, deliver or cause to be delivered notice in writing of his intention so to do personally to each owner or occupier of all lands adjoining the land upon which the plants or refuse thereof will be burnt, and also to the secretary or a bush fire control officer of the local authority in whose district or adjacent thereto the said last-mentioned land is situated, and, if the area to be burnt is situated within two miles of a State forest, to a forest officer employed in connection with such State forest; (b) before commencing burning operations, provide and have available at the place thereof at least eight gallons of water in suitable containers which can be conveniently used for extinguishing fire; (c) provide at least three men to be constantly in attendance at the burning operations from the time when the fire is lighted until it is completely extinguished, and to assist in keeping the fire under control and prevent it from spreading beyond the land on which the said burning operations are conducted; (d) carry out the burning operations only between the hours of 8 p.m. and midnight.

Permit to Burn Flax or Flax Stubble during a Prohibited Time.

21. (1) Whenever the Governor by Proclamation, pursuant to the provisions of section 18 of the Act, has authorised the burning of flax, or the refuse thereof, during the prohibited times or any period thereof, any person desirous of burning flax, or the refuse thereof, within the area and within the times to which such Proclamation relates shall lodge an application, signed by him, in the Form 11 in the Appendix to these regulations with the secretary of the road board within whose district such burning is to take place or with the nearest authorised officer for a permit to burn flax, or the refuse thereof, as hereinafter prescribed. (2) An application under the preceding paragraph of this regulation may be accepted in the form of a letter provided that the full information contained in the Form 11 aforesaid is supplied in such letter. (3) The secretary of the road board, or the authorised officer with whom the application is lodged may, if he thinks fit, require the applicant to make the statutory declaration contained in the form of the application. (4) For the purpose of this regulation the term "authorised officer" shall mean any officer duly appointed by the Minister, notice of whose appointment has been published in the *Government Gazette* and in at least one newspaper circulating in the district in which the officer resides. The local authority for the district in which any such officer resides shall be notified forthwith in writing of his appointment by the Minister. (5) The permit to burn shall not be granted unless and until the applicant for the same satisfies the secretary of the road board or the authorised officer to whom the application is made that—(i) the land to be burned at one time and under the permit applied for does not exceed the area as fixed by the secretary of the road board or the authorised officer when granting the permit, provided that the area does not in any case exceed one hundred acres; (ii) such area has been surrounded by a firebreak to a width of not less than twenty feet; (iii) if the area to be burned is carrying any standing trees (whether green or ring-barked), that all grass and debris has been raked to a distance of not less than six feet from the base of each standing tree. (6) A permit to burn flax, or the refuse thereof, shall be in the Form 12 in the Appendix to these regulations. (7) The application for the permit to burn shall be received by the secretary of the road board or the authorised officer to whom the application is made, at least seven days before the day upon which it is intended to commence burning. (8) The secretary of the road board or authorised officer to whom the application for the permit is made shall, before granting such permit, enter upon the land of the applicant to inspect the area proposed to be burned. (9) If the permit to burn applied for is granted the holder thereof shall, before commencing to burn under the authority of such permit—(i) deliver or cause to be delivered personally to each owner or occupier of all lands adjoining the area to be burnt, and, where the authorised officer who granted the permit is not an officer of the local authority within whose district the area to be burnt is situated, to such local authority or to the bush fire control officer of such local authority at least four days' notice in writing of his intention to burn such area; and (ii) if the area to be burnt is situated within two miles of a State forest, deliver or cause to be delivered personally to a forest officer employed in connection with such State forest at least four days' notice in writing of his intention to burn such area. (10) The burning of an area under the authority of a permit to burn flax, or the refuse thereof, shall be carried out between the hours of six o'clock in the afternoon and midnight of the same day and not at any other periods of the day. (11) No fire is to be lit if the fire hazard is as defined by the Forests Department to be above "average summer." (12) The owner or occupier of the area to be burned shall himself arrange for and provide at least three men to be constantly in attendance at the fire in the area from the time it is lighted until it is completely extinguished, to assist in keeping the fire under control and preventing it from spreading beyond the area proposed to be burned. Provided that—(i) no permit shall be granted for the burning of flax growing upon any land situate in any locality within the district of a local authority specified by such local authority in a notice in writing given by it to the duly authorised officer for the district of such local authority, whereby the local authority objects to the issue or grant of any such permit for the purpose aforesaid on the ground that the burning of the flax in respect of which the permit is applied for may be a source of danger to lands adjoining the land on which the proposed burning is intended to take place; and (ii) the secretary of the road board or the duly authorised officer may refuse to issue or grant a permit when in any case after inspection he is satisfied that, notwithstanding that all the precautions required to be taken under the said regulations in connection with the proposed burning are taken, such proposed burning may nevertheless be or become a source of danger by escaping from the land on which it is intended to carry out such burning.

Bush Fire Control Officer.

22. (1) A local authority shall advertise, pursuant to subclause (2) of section 23 of the Act in a newspaper circulating in its district, notice of the appointment of every bush fire control officer appointed by such local authority. (2) Notice of such appointment shall be forwarded by the local authority to the Under Secretary for Lands, within seven days after such appointment for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Bush Fire Brigades.

23. (1) An application by a local authority desiring to register a bush fire brigade and an application by an association of persons desiring to be registered as a bush fire brigade under and for the purposes of the Act, pursuant to subsection (2) of section 27 of the Act shall be made in accordance with the forms 5 and 6 respectively in the Appendix to these regulations. (2) Every application under this regulation shall be in accordance with the by-laws made by the local authority for the purpose of establishing bush fire brigades, and which have been approved by the Governor in Executive Council, or, in the case of an application by any association of persons, by a copy of its rules made for the purpose aforesaid.

24. The Minister shall cause to be kept a register of bush fire brigades in the Form 7 in the Appendix to these regulations and upon registration shall issue to the local authority or association of persons a certificate of registration in the Form 8 in the Appendix to these regulations.

25. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations or failing to comply with any condition upon which a permit to burn is granted shall be guilty of an offence and liable upon summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

(1) Whenever the Governor by Proclamation, pursuant to the provisions of section 18 of the Act, has authorised the burning of any specified plant, or the refuse thereof, during the prohibited times or any period thereof, any person desirous of burning such plant, or the refuse thereof, within the area and within the times to which such Proclamation relates, shall lodge an application, signed by him, in Form 9 in the Appendix to these regulations with the secretary of the road board within whose district such burning is to take place or with the nearest authorised officer for a permit to burn such plant, or the refuse thereof, as hereinafter prescribed.

(2) An application under the preceding paragraph of this regulation may be accepted in the form of a letter provided that the full information contained in the Form 9 aforesaid is supplied in such letter.

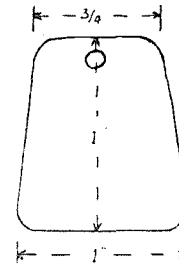

ABATTOIRS ACT, 1909-1941.

The abovementioned regulations are amended by adding after Regulation 36 new regulations as follows:—

Equine Animals.

37. (1) The Minister may, by license under his hand according to the form numbered (1) in the Appendix to these regulations, authorise the slaughter within the Metropolitan District as declared under the Act of equine animals at such place, other than the Abattoirs, as is expressly named in such license. (2) Each such license shall operate and have effect according to its tenor for the space of twelve months from the date of issue thereof unless revoked or suspended by the Minister in the meantime. (3) Each such license shall be granted subject to the condition that the requirements of the Health Act, 1911-1942, and of any other statutory enactment which may be for the time being in force relating to slaughtering, and to the establishment and maintenance of places for that purpose, shall be duly observed with respect to the licensed premises, and in the event of non-compliance with any such requirement by act or omission, the Minister shall have power to revoke or suspend the license. (4) The fee for each such license shall be one guinea.

38. No person shall slaughter any equine animal within the Metropolitan District as declared under the Act except at a place licensed for the slaughter of the same by the Minister in accordance with the provisions of the preceding regulation.

39. With the exception of the next two preceding regulations, the provisions of these regulations shall be deemed not to apply to equine animals.

Gazette and shall remain in operation until it is revoked or cancelled by a subsequent notice published in like manner.

IN accordance with the provisions of section 65 of the Mines Regulation Act, 1906-1938 (as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to amend the regulations made under the said Act (originally published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of November, 1934, and reprinted as corrected and amended up to the 31st day of December, 1938, and as subsequently amended by notices published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th day of July, 1939; the 8th day of December, 1939; the 3rd day of May, 1940; the 4th day of October, 1940; the 20th day of December, 1940, and the 5th day of June, 1942) in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

SCHEDULE.

The abovementioned regulations are amended as follows:—

(1) A new regulation is inserted after Paragraph (3) of Regulation 2A as follows:—2B—Safety Belts for Winzes.—In all winzes having an inclination of more than 50° from the horizontal, safety belts shall be provided and shall be worn by all men who are raised or lowered in such winzes.

(2) A new general rule is inserted after General Rule 49 of Regulation 4 as follows:—49A. (a) No charge shall be fired in a winze or in any working from a winze unless an air hose or air pipe has been installed to discharge compressed air to the bottom of the winze or to the face of any working from such winze and secured in a manner approved by the Inspector of Mines. The discharge end of the hose or pipe shall be secured so as to discharge air at 20 feet from the bottom or working face. Any variation from the distance of 20 feet must have the sanction of the Inspector of Mines. (b) The master tap controlling the supply of compressed air to a winze or to any intermediate workings within 20 feet of such winze shall be situated at the brace or top of the winze, and no other tap shall be allowed in the winze except by permission in writing of the Inspector of Mines.

(3) A new general rule is inserted after General Rule 53 of Regulation 4, as follows:—Signalling in Winzes.—54. No verbal communication shall be made up and down any winze exceeding 60 feet in depth and when hoisting appliances are utilised, a knocker line or other contrivance approved by the Inspector of Mines shall be provided in every such winze to enable signals to be communicated to the driver from every portion of the winze.

Between The Perth and Suburban Bread Manufacturers Industrial Union of Employers of Western Australia, and West Australian Operative Bakers' Union of Workers.

WHEREAS Award No. 1 of 1933 as amended between the above parties, provides *inter alia* that a Board, to be called the "Advisory Committee," may be appointed by the Court to advise in regard to any apprenticeship matter; and whereas the said Award further provides that such committee should consist of the following:—(a) some person appointed by the Court, who shall act as chairman; (b) two representatives appointed by the employer; (c) two representatives appointed by the industrial union or unions of workers in the trade; and whereas the Award further provides that the Advisory Committee shall have such powers and duties as the Court in each case may determine; and whereas on the twenty-fifth day of February, 1944, the Court, in pursuance of the said Award, appointed as such Advisory Committee as aforesaid the following:—Mr. R. A. Wood (Chairman); Messrs. W. Penn and H. Baker (Employers' Representatives); Messrs. T. Nielsen and W. Webb (Workers' Representatives); and whereas the parties have requested the Court to define the powers and duties of the said Committee: Now, therefore, the Court of Arbitration, acting in pursuance of the said Award and all other powers and authorities vested in it by the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, hereby orders and declares as follows:—That the said Committee shall have the following powers and duties without limiting the powers and duties that at any time hereafter may be conferred:—

1. To deal with all matters affecting apprentices assigned to the determination of the Committee by the Court, and in particular to perform and discharge all powers and duties in the regulations attached to the Award and therein to be performed and discharged by the Court, except such powers and duties as are specially assigned to the Court by the Act.

2. The Committee shall be invested with the following powers and functions in addition and without prejudice to those mentioned in (1):—(a) to endeavour to promote apprenticeships under this Award; (b) to draw up syllabi of training and to arrange for the periodical examination of apprentices; (c) to permit in any special circumstances the taking or employment of an apprentice by an employer, notwithstanding that the quota fixed by the Award in any particular case may be ex-

ceeded; (d) to enter any factory, workshop, or place where an apprentice is employed, or appoint any other person for that purpose, and inspect the conditions under which any apprentice is employed; (e) to require any employer to furnish the Committee with any specified information relating to any trade or industry subject to this Award, or any of the workers engaged therein, with a view to determining whether there is a sufficient number of apprentices being trained to meet future requirements and in the interests of the community; (f) to advise the Court as to all matters appertaining to apprentices.

3. A majority of the members of the Committee, one of whom must be the chairman, shall constitute a quorum.

The decision of the Committee shall be the decision of the majority of the members and shall be signed by the chairman and forwarded to the Registrar. Either party, with the consent of the Court, may at any time alter its representative.
