Mosman Park Road Board—Abolition of Wards.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 650/30.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-43, the Governor may by Order in Council abolish all or any of the wards of a District, and may, on the abolition of such wards, determine whether any and which of the existing members of the Board shall go out of office and at what time and if necessary appoint a day for holding an election of new members to take the place of those members who go out of office, and determine matters in connection with existing loans; and whereas it is desirable to abolish all the wards of the Mosman Park Road District and to determine that only two members shall go out of office on a day to be appointed, and to appoint a day for holding the election for the two vacant seats and to determine that the abolition of the said wards shall not prejudice or interfere with the effect or operations of any notices heretofore published by the Mosman Park Road Board in relation to proposals for raising loans: Now, therefore, His Excellency, the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf doth hereby:—1. Abolish all the wards of the Mosman Park Road District. 2. Determine that only two of the existing members of the Board shall go out of office and that those two members shall be those who would have retired by effluxion of time at the Annual Election to be held on the 15th day of April, 1944, and the said two members shall go out of office accordingly on that day. 3. Appoint the 15th day of April, 1944, as the day on which an Election shall be held to fill the vacancies on the Board caused by the retirement of the two members referred to in paragraph 2 hereof. 4. Determine that the abolition of the said wards shall

not prejudice or interfere with the effect or operation of any notices heretofore published by the Mosman Park Road Board in relation to proposals for raising loans and in which the wards so abolished are mentioned in relation to the description of special areas in respect of the levying of loan rates in connection with such loans.

NATIONAL SECURITY (SUPPLEMENTARY)  
REGULATIONS.

Friendly Societies (Western Australia) Order No. 2. WHEREAS by regulation 35 of the National Security (Supplementary) Regulations it is provided that notwithstanding anything contained in the law of the State or any provisions governing any friendly society or branch thereof the Premier of any State may by order published in the *Government Gazette* of the State make provision for and in relation to the postponement or cancellation of the holding of any meeting or conference or of any election or of the making of any appointment the continuance in any office of any friendly society or branch thereof of any officer, the manner in which provisions governing any friendly society or branch thereof may be amended or added to, or any provision thereof repealed, and the payments to be made during the present

war to the funds of any friendly society or branch thereof by the members thereof; and whereas I, John Collings Willecock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, acting pursuant to the said regulation made and issued an order dated the first day of May, 1942, which was published in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia on the 8th day of May, 1942, is cited as the Friendly Societies (Western Australia) Order and is still in force; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to amend the said order in the manner herein-after mentioned: Now therefore I, the said John Collings Willecock, as such Premier aforesaid and acting pursuant to the said regulation 35 do hereby make the following order:—

1. This order may be cited as the Friendly Societies (Western Australia) Order No. 2, and shall be read as one with the Friendly Societies (Western Australia) Order dated the first day of May, 1942, and published in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia on the eighth day of May, 1942, as aforesaid, hereinafter referred to as the principal order.

2. Clause 2 of the principal order is amended by inserting therein after the definition of "committee" a new definition as follows:—"Duration of the war" means the period of the war in which at the date of the coming into operation of this present order the Commonwealth of Australia is engaged and six months after the Governor-General of the said Commonwealth in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth shall have declared by Proclamation that the said war has ended.

3. Clause 3 of the principal order is amended as follows:—(a) by deleting from subparagraph (a) of paragraph (1) the words "two years after the coming into operation of this order" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "the duration of the war." (b) by deleting from subparagraph (b) of paragraph (1) the words "two years after the coming into operation of this order" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "the duration of the war." (c) by deleting from subparagraph (c) of paragraph (1) the words "the present war" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "the duration of the war." (d) by deleting from paragraph (2) the words "two years after the coming into operation of this order" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "the duration of the war."

4. This order shall come into operation upon publication thereof in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia.

2. Any person aggrieved who is desirous of appealing pursuant to subsection (2) of section 147 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1943, against his removal from office, shall lodge notice of appeal in the form in the Schedule hereto with the Magistrate of the Local Court in the district in which the office of the Municipal Council is situated.

3. A copy of such notice shall be served on the Municipal Council and the Minister in all cases.

4. On proof by affidavit to the satisfaction of the Magistrate that the said notice or notices have been duly served, the Magistrate shall fix and cause to be sent written notice to the parties of a date and time for the hearing of such appeal, which date shall not be less than fourteen clear days from the service of the last of such notices.

5. If either party neglect to appear personally or by counsel or solicitor on the date and at the time fixed for hearing, the Magistrate may—(a) where the appellant fails to appear, dismiss the appeal; (b) where the Municipal Council concerned, fails to appear, hear the appeal or adjourn it to some other date.

6. On the hearing and determination of the appeal the Magistrate may make such order as to costs to be paid by either party to the appeal to the other party, as he may think just.

7. On the hearing of the appeal the appellant shall open his case, and the appeal shall proceed as nearly as may be according to the procedure and rules of evidence relating to a trial of an action in the Local Court.

8. The Rules of the Local Court shall, in so far as applicable and not inconsistent with these Regulations, apply to appeals hereunder.
