WHEREAS it is enacted by section 116 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that the expression "Public Holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified, and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that Saturday the 8th day of April, 1944, shall be a public holiday throughout the State for the purposes of section 116 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, and all shops (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule and registered small shops) shall be closed.

WHEREAS by section 166 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation temporarily suspend the operations of the said Act, in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed for any shop or shops, either generally or in any specified locality or district: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and

consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do, by this Proclamation, temporarily suspend the operations of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, between the 2nd day of April and the 7th day of April, 1944, in so far as the said Act applies to the closing time of shops situated in those districts throughout the State which would normally observe the weekly half holiday during that period between the usual hour of closing of such shops and 6 p.m. on the said days.

PROCLAMATION

Lieutenant-Governor. } and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] } wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 45 of the Health Act, 1911-1942, that subject to any express provisions of that Act, with respect to every health rate, sanitary rate, supplementary rate and special loan rate made and levied under the said Act by a local authority, all the provisions of its local governing Act relating to the making payment and recovery of general rates shall apply and be deemed to be incorporated with the said Act but that the local authority in the exercise of its powers conferred by Part III. of the Health Act, 1911-1942, may make and levy rates of different amounts in respect of different portions of its district defined for that purpose by proclamation; and whereas the boundaries of Denmark Health District as constituted under the Health Act, 1911-1942, are coterminous with those of the Denmark Road District as constituted under the Road Districts Act, 1919-1942, and the Denmark Road District is divided into wards one of which is known as the "Town Ward"; and whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient that in the exercise of its powers aforesaid the local authority for the Denmark Health District shall be empowered to make and levy under the Health Act, 1911-1942, rates in respect of that portion of the Denmark Health District which is constituted as and is the Town Ward of the Denmark Road District under the Road Districts Act, 1919-1942, of amounts which are different from the amounts of the rates which the said local authority shall or may make or levy under the Health Act, 1911-1942, in respect of those portions of the Denmark Health District other than that portion which is identical with the Town Ward of the Denmark Road District as aforesaid: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon me by section 45 of the Health Act, 1911-1942, do hereby define and declare that in the exercise of its powers conferred by Part III. of the Health Act, 1911-1942, the local authority of the Denmark Health District may make and levy under that Act rates in respect of that portion of the Denmark Health District which is constituted as and is the Town Ward of the Denmark Road District under the Road Districts Act, 1919-1942, of amounts which are different from the amounts of the rates which the said local authority shall or may make or levy under the Health Act, 1911-1942, with respect to those portions of the Denmark Health District other than that portion which is identical with the Town Ward of the Denmark Road District as aforesaid.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 16th day of March, 1944, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, that it shall be obligatory

for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas The Mutual Life and Citizens' Assurance Company, Limited, of 179a St. George's terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the said Act, and as such subject to the said section, and having made application in accordance with the said Act and the regulations made thereunder for exemption from the operation of the said section 10, has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by it, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, Commonwealth Government Securities of the value of Five thousand pounds (£5,000): Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the Company, the said The Mutual Life and Citizens' Assurance Company, Limited, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, for a period of two years commencing on and including the 1st day of March, 1944.

The Child Welfare Act, 1907-41.

NATIONAL SECURITY (SUPPLEMENTARY) REGULATIONS.

The State of Western Australia—Hours of Opening and Closing of Establishments Order.

WHEREAS it is provided by regulation 23A of the National Security (Supplementary) Regulations (as amended by statutory Rule 1943, No. 155) that, subject to the direction of the Prime Minister, the Premier of any State may by order determine the hours of opening and closing of any prescribed establishment in the State and that an order made under the said regulation may apply, operate and take effect to the extents or in the manners variously mentioned in sub-regulation (2) of the said regulation; and whereas I, John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, acting in exercise of the authority conferred by regulation 23A aforesaid made and issued an order dated the 24th day of September, 1943, which was published in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia on the same day and is cited as The Hours of Opening and Closing of Establishments Order No. 1 and is still in force; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to amend the said Order in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, the said John Collings Willcock, acting as such Premier aforesaid and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said regulation 23A as aforesaid do hereby make the following order:—

1. This order may be cited as The Hours of Opening and Closing of Establishments Order No. 2, and shall be read as one with The Hours of Opening and Closing of Establishments Order No. 1 hereinbefore mentioned, hereinafter referred to as the principal order.

2. Clause 2 of the principal order is amended by deleting the whole of the said clause and inserting in lieu thereof a new clause as follows:—2. (a) In relation to all Government Departments of the State within the meaning of the Public Service Act, 1904-1935, the opening hours and closing hours in respect of the commencement and cessation of work by the persons employed therein and also in respect of the transaction of business therein by members of the public shall be such as are for the time being and from time to time prescribed by regulation 8 of the regulations made and in force under the Public Service Act, 1904-1935. (b) In relation to the Government Railways Department and the Government Tramways and Electricity Supply Department the opening hours and closing hours in respect of the commencement and cessation of work by the administrative officers who are employed under the Commissioner of Railways in the Head Office and districts offices of the said departments respectively and also in respect of the transaction of business in such offices by members of the public shall notwithstanding any award or industrial agreement to the contrary be the same as those prescribed in relation to Government Departments of the State within the meaning of the Public Service Act, 1904-1935, under paragraph (a) of this clause and the provisions of regulation 8 of the regulations made and

in force under the said Act shall apply accordingly. (c) For the purposes of paragraph (b) hereof every reference to the "Commissioner" in regulation 8 of the regulations made and in force under the Public Service Act, 1904-1935, shall be read and construed and be applied as if it were a reference to the Commissioner of Railways. (d) If any question shall arise as to whether or not any officer is an "administrative officer" within the meaning of paragraph (b) of this clause such question shall be referred to the Minister for Railways and his decision shall be final. (e) Paragraphs (a) and (b) of this clause shall apply and have effect throughout the State.

3. This order and the principal order as amended by this order shall come into operation and take effect on the 27th day of March, 1944, and subject to recision by the Prime Minister as provided for in sub-regulation (5) of regulation 23A aforesaid shall continue in operation until amended, varied or revoked by a subsequent order.

PUBLIC SERVICE ACT, 1904-1935.

Office of Public Service Commissioner,

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting pursuant to section 84 of the Public Service Act, 1904-1935, has been pleased as from the 25th day of March, 1944, to repeal Regulation 8 of the regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of September, 1910, and later amended as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th day of July, 1938, and the 6th day of March, 1942, and in lieu thereof to make a new regulation, to stand as Regulation 8, as follows:—

Office Hours.

8. (1) Subject as hereinafter provided, and as from and after the 27th day of March, 1944, the hours of attendance to be observed by officers not subject to special regulations or departmental arrangements in that behalf or not specially exempted by the Commissioner shall be from 8.45 o'clock a.m. to 1 o'clock p.m. and from 1.55 o'clock p.m. to 5.15 o'clock p.m. on all week days except Saturday, and the attendance of officers shall not be required on Saturdays. Provided that—(i) Where the public interest requires that offices shall be open to the public and officers shall be in attendance in such offices on Saturdays, or where the nature of the work of any officer requires his attendance on Saturdays, the officers mentioned in this paragraph of this proviso may be required to attend in such offices or on such work on Saturdays between the hours of 8.45 o'clock a.m. and 11.45 o'clock a.m.; (ii) where in any office the performance of any statutory duty may be necessary on a Saturday, and only one senior or adult officer is employed in such office, the hours prescribed by paragraph (1) of this regulation shall not apply and such senior or adult officer shall attend in such office on each week day except Saturday between the hours of 8.45 o'clock a.m. and 1 o'clock p.m. and 2 o'clock p.m. and 4.45 o'clock p.m., and on Saturdays between the hours of 8.45 o'clock a.m. and 11.45 o'clock a.m.; (iii) where under paragraph (1) of this proviso the attendance of any officer is required on any Saturday, then during the week days next following such Saturday and preceding the next ensuing Saturday the hours of attendance of such officer shall be on each such week day from 8.45 o'clock a.m. to 1 o'clock p.m. and from 2 o'clock p.m. to 4.45 o'clock p.m., or subject to the approval of the Permanent Head of the Department in which such officer is employed the hours of attendance shall be those prescribed by this regulation except on one or more week days aforesaid when the officer shall be allowed time off either in one period or in two or more periods equal in the aggregate to the time worked on the Saturday last preceding such week days aforesaid.

(2) Offices in which members of the public require to transact any business shall be open to the public on week days other than Saturday between the hours of 10 o'clock a.m. and 3.30 o'clock p.m., and on Saturdays between the hours of 9.45 o'clock a.m. and 11.45 o'clock a.m. unless it be otherwise arranged by the Commissioner or be otherwise required by statutory rules or regulations. Provided that, subject to any statutory rules or regulations aforesaid, the Commissioner may arrange that any office shall not be open to the public on Saturdays.

PUBLIC SERVICE ACT, 1904-1935.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting pursuant to section 84 of the Public Service Act, 1904-1935, has been pleased to amend the regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act as reprinted with amendments up to the 1st day of March, 1934, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

SCHEDULE.

The abovementioned regulations under the Public Service Act, 1904-1935, are amended as follows:—

1. Regulation 164 is repealed, and a new regulation is inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—

164.—*Leave for Special Necessity.*

Persons temporarily employed may, on production of such evidence of special necessity as the Permanent Head shall consider sufficient be granted special leave not exceeding one day for each month of service. Provided that—(i) Such special leave shall be deducted from any allowance or leave which is actually due under the next two following regulations; (ii) when no allowance or leave referred to in paragraph (i) of this proviso is due, the special leave shall be granted without pay; and (iii) back pay may be subsequently allowed in respect of the special leave granted without pay when subsequently leave has accrued.

2. Regulation 167 is repealed, and a new regulation is inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—

167.—*Sick Leave.*

Persons temporarily employed may, on production of an adequate medical certificate be granted sick leave as follows:—Where the person has served continuously—(a) for a period not exceeding six months—three days on full pay; (b) for a period exceeding six months but not exceeding eighteen months—twelve days on full pay; (c) for a period exceeding eighteen months but not exceeding three years—two weeks on full pay and two weeks on half pay; (d) for a period exceeding three years and for each triennial period after the expiration of the first three years—one month on full pay. Provided that—(i) the grant of sick leave under either paragraph (a) or (b) above shall be subject to the approval of the Permanent Head; (ii) the grant of sick leave under either paragraph (c) or (d) above shall be subject to the approval of the Minister; (iii) indisposition not necessitating confinement to the house shall not be regarded as illness, in respect of which leave of absence may be granted under this regulation, except under special circumstances to be approved by the Commissioner.

- A new by-law is inserted as follows:—219A. For any breach of hospital by-laws, rules, regulations or resolutions of the Board the Board may impose on a pupil nurse such disciplinary measures as in its discretion it considers appropriate. Such disciplinary measures shall generally be in accordance with the scale hereunder:—(a) By official caution to be recorded on the personal record of the pupil nurse; or (b) By suspension from duty for any period from 24 hours up to 3 months. Such suspension from duty shall mean loss of pay, exclusion from the hospital premises and the loss of other accruing privileges and emoluments during the term of suspension; or (c) By cancellation of the indentures.
- By-law 277 is hereby repealed and a new by-law is substituted as follows:—277. (a) Members of the staff shall receive sick leave in accordance with the terms of any award, agreement or contract governing his or

her employment. If there is no award applicable or the award, agreement or contract contains no sick leave provisions, then such sick leave as the Board may determine shall be granted. (b) Any employee desiring sick leave shall report to the Medical Superintendent at the earliest opportunity. The Medical Superintendent will supply to the Manager a certificate embodying his recommendation. If the employee is unable to report personally to the Medical Superintendent he must lodge a suitable medical certificate within 3 days. (c) Sick leave for the Manager, Medical Superintendent and Secretary shall be in accordance with the conditions applicable under the Public Service Act to Government employees. (d) A schedule shall be presented to the Board each month by the Manager showing all sick leave granted to members of the staff during the month.
