WHEREAS it is enacted by section 116 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that the expression "Public holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified, and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that Monday, the 1st day of May, 1944, shall be a public holiday throughout the State for the purposes of section 116 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, and all shops (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule and registered small shops) shall be closed.

PROCLAMATION.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,
TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and
JAMES MITCHELL, } over the State of Western Australia
Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

PURSUANT to section 10 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, hereby alter the boundary of the Reserve known as the Nookawarra Reserve containing the Wilgi Mia Cave as defined by Proclamation of the 27th day of October, 1937, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of November, 1937, and proclaim and declare that the

boundaries of the said Reserve shall be as set out in the Schedule to this Proclamation and that the lands comprised within the boundaries therein specified shall be a Reserve for Natives.

SCHEDULE.

All that piece of land bounded by lines starting from a point about three chains seventy-eight links, at a bearing of 132° 22' from the most westerly corner of existing 5 ac. native reserve; thence about four chains at a bearing 49° 58', thence about two chains fifty links at a bearing of 139° 58', thence about four chains at a bearing of 229° 58', thence about two chains fifty links at a bearing of 319° 58' back to the starting point. The area comprising one acre with the Wilgi Mia Cave at its approximate centre.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 26th day of April, 1944, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Local Authorities (Reserve Funds) Act, 1942.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 404/43.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Local Authorities (Reserve Funds) Act, 1942, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the the Honorary Minister but subject to the requirements of the proviso to the said section, by Order in Council, authorise a Local Authority to establish during the present war and to maintain a reserve fund for the purpose of accumulating therein any surplus of ordinary revenue of the Local Authority and of applying the moneys in such reserve fund and any income or profit derived from the investment of moneys in such reserve fund in the carry-

ing out, after the cessation of the present war, of works and undertakings authorised by the Local Government Act of the Local Authority which the Local Authority may not be able conveniently to carry out during the present war; and whereas it is desirable that such reserve fund shall be established by the Local Authorities as set forth in the Schedule hereto: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting pursuant to the recommendation of the Honorary Minister and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, after being satisfied as required by the proviso to section 4 of the said Act, doth hereby authorise the Local Authorities as set forth in the Schedule hereto, to establish and maintain a reserve fund.

BUSINESS NAMES ACT, 1942.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to section 23 of the Business Names Act, 1942, has been pleased to make under and for the purposes of the said Act the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

SCHEDULE.

Business Names Act, 1942—Regulations.

- These Regulations may be cited as the Business Names Regulations, 1944.
- In these Regulations the term "Act" means the Business Names Act, 1942, and the term "Registrar" means the Registrar of Companies.
- The following additional particulars shall be furnished upon the registration of a firm, individual or corporation within the provisions of section five of the Act:—(a) The christian names and the surname of the individual or of each partner in the firm, or the name of the corporation, on whose behalf the business is carried on; (b) The usual residence of the individual or of each partner in the firm, or the registered office of the corporation; (c) The business name and address of the foreign firm as general agent for which the business is carried on.
- Where a statement required under section 7 and referred to in section 8 of the Act purports to be signed by the Attorney of an individual, it shall not be deemed to have been duly furnished as required by section 7 of the Act unless and until the instrument appointing such attorney is first produced to the Registrar and the Registrar is satisfied that the appointment of the Attorney is legally in order and that he is duly empowered to sign the said statement for the purposes of the registration in relation to which such statement is furnished.
- A body claiming to be a body corporate shall not be registered under a business name, either solely or as a member of a firm, unless the Registrar is satisfied that such body is duly incorporated, and, in the case of a foreign company, that it is registered as a foreign company under the legislation relating to companies for the time being in force in Western Australia.
- The forms set out in the First Appendix to these regulations, with such modifications as the circumstances may require, shall be used for the purposes for which they are respectively applicable. A carbon copy of any document required to be furnished under the Act shall not be accepted for registration.

7. (1) The fees set out in the Second Appendix to these regulations shall be paid to the Registrar for the several matters therein referred to. (2) Any person or corporation furnishing to the Registrar any statement, notice or other document required by the Act without payment of the prescribed fee, and failing or neglecting to pay such fee forthwith after being called upon by the Registrar by notice in writing to do so shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty Pounds and the Court before which the prosecution takes place shall also order payment of such fee.
