PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 3 of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942-1943, that during a time of war the Governor on the recommendation of the Minister and after due notice given as required by paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of the said section may at any time and from time to time by Proclamation direct that any election required by its or their governing Act or Acts to be held by any public authority or any class or classes of public authority shall be postponed for such period as shall be specified in the Proclamation; and whereas Potato Growers' Advisory Committee as constituted under the Potato Growers Licensing Act, 1941, has in accordance with the provisions of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942-1943, been declared by the Governor to be a public authority under and within the meaning and for the purposes of that Act; and whereas by a Proclamation issued under section 3 of that Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd day of September, 1943, the Governor directed that the election of Potato Growers' Advisory Committee aforesaid which ordinarily would have been held on the 15th day of June, 1943, be postponed until the 15th day of June, 1944; and whereas it being deemed expedient that the said election shall be further postponed until the 15th day of June, 1945, the Minister in accordance with paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 3 of the said Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942-1943, has duly given notice of his intention to recommend to me the said Lieutenant-Governor that I by proclamation issued under section 3 of the said Act shall postpone further until the 15th day of June, 1945, the election of the said Potato Growers' Advisory Committee which ordinarily would have been held on the 15th day of June, 1943, and now stands postponed as aforesaid until the 15th day of June, 1944, and no objection to such further postponement has been made or received: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommen-

ation of the Minister and in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon me by section 3 of the Public Authorities (Postponement of Elections) Act, 1942-1943, do hereby direct that the election of the said Potato Growers Advisory Committee which ordinarily would have been held on the 15th day of June, 1943, and which now stands postponed until the 15th day of June, 1944, shall be further postponed until the 15th day of June, 1945.
