ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 344/44.

WHEREAS by the Land Drainage Act, 1925-1941, the Governor may constitute any defined portion of the State a drainage district for the purposes of the Act; specify the boundaries of such district; and assign a name to such district: Now therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute the area having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereto a Drainage District and doth assign thereto the name of the "Pinjarra Drainage District."

Schedule.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the high water mark, near the southern extremity of Harvey Estuary and situate about 10 chains north and 116 chains west from the south-western corner of Murray Location 1409, and extending south and east to said corner and continuing in the latter direction along the southern boundary of said location to its south-eastern corner; thence north-easterly and northerly along a one-chain road to a point in prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of location 978; thence easterly to and along said boundary and onwards to the western boundary of location 802; thence northerly to the south-western corner of location 417; thence easterly and northerly along boundaries of said location to a point in prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of location 380; thence easterly to and along said boundary and onwards to the western boundary of location 388; thence southerly along said boundary for a distance of 15 chains; thence east to the western boundary of location 383; thence southerly along said boundary for a distance of 11 chains; thence east to the western boundary of location 384; thence northerly along said boundary and onwards to the southern boundary of Coolup A.A. Lot 62; thence easterly to the south-western corner of lot 60; thence northerly along the western boundary of the latter for a distance of 15 chains; thence east to the western boundary of lot 59; thence northerly along said boundary for a distance of 7 chains; thence easterly to the western boundary of lot 58; thence northerly along the said boundary for a distance of 13 chains; thence east to the western boundary of lot 56; thence northerly along said boundary for a distance of 25 chains; thence east to a point on the western boundary of lot 37, and onwards for a further distance of 10 chains; thence south 40 chains; thence east 10 chains to the western boundary of lot 36; thence southerly to the south-western corner of lot 36; thence easterly, along the southern boundary of said lot and onwards to the westernmost corner of lot 235; thence generally southerly to and along boundaries of Murray Location 616 to a point situate 33 chains northerly from its south-western corner; thence east 57 chains; thence south to the southern boundary of location 8; thence easterly along said boundary to the left bank of the Murray River; thence generally north-north-westerly, downwards, along said bank skirting the northern extremity of Yoodoocoo Island, to and along the north-eastern side of Ballee Island, and continuing to and along the northern side of Meeyip Island, to its western extremity and the high water mark of Peel Inlet; thence along said high water mark generally southerly and westerly to Point Grey; and thence generally south-south-easterly, along the high water mark of the aforesaid Harvey Estuary, to the starting point; as shown within the green border on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 30097.

Waroona Drainage District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 670/40.

WHEREAS by section 12, subsection (1) of the Land Drainage Act, 1925-1941, the Governor may repeal, vary, or amend any of the provisions of any previous order relating to any district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor with the advice of the Executive Council doth hereby vary and amend the boundaries of the Waroona Drainage District in the manner described in the Schedule hereto.

Lot 156; thence easterly to and along the said northern boundary to the western side of the highway aforesaid; thence southerly and south-westerly along the said side to a point in prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of location 760; thence southerly to and along the said boundary and onwards to the northern boundary of location 621; thence easterly, southerly and westerly and again southerly and westerly along boundaries of the said location to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of location 1179; thence southerly, easterly and again southerly along boundaries of locations 1179, 157 and 172 and onwards in the latter direction to the northern boundary of location 212; thence easterly and southerly along the boundaries of the said location to the north-westernmost corner of location 419; thence easterly, southerly, westerly and again southerly along boundaries of the said location 419, and location 420 to the south-easternmost corner of the latter location; thence generally westerly to and along the southernmost boundary of location 279 and its prolongation westerly to the eastern side of the South-Western Railway Reserve; thence westerly to the south-easternmost corner of Harvey A.A. Lot 145; thence westerly, southerly, and again westerly along boundaries of the said lot and onwards in the latter direction to the western side of Wellington road; thence northerly along the said side to a point situate 24 chains north of the south-eastern corner of lot 150; thence generally west north-westerly to and along boundaries of lot 201 to the northern corner of the said lot; thence southerly along its western boundary to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the southern boundary of lot 210; thence westerly to and along the said boundary and onwards to the eastern boundary of lot 225; thence southerly, westerly, southerly and easterly, and again southerly and

westerly along boundaries of the said lot 225 and those of lots 226 and 227 and onwards in the latter direction to a south-western boundary of lot 247; thence generally north-westerly along the boundaries of the said lot to its south-western corner, thence southerly and westerly along boundaries of Wellington Location 937 to the north-eastern corner of location 3912; thence southerly to and along the eastern boundaries of location 1269 to a point situate 55 chains south of its north-eastern corner; thence north-westerly to a point situate 23 chains south from the north-western corner of the said location; thence west 40 chains; thence south about 28 chains to the north-eastern side of road No. 891; thence generally north-westerly along the said side to its intersection with a north-eastern boundary of reserve No. 7655; thence generally north north-westerly along boundaries of the said reserve and continuing along the western side of a one chain road to the southern boundary of location 3167; thence westerly along the southern boundary of the said location to its south-western corner; thence northerly along the western boundary of same and onwards to the southernmost boundary of Murray Location 936; thence easterly along the said boundary and onwards to high water mark of Harvey Estuary; thence generally south-easterly, northerly and south south-easterly along the said high water mark to a point situate about 10 chains north and 116 chains west of the south-western corner of location 1409; thence south and east to said corner and continuing in the latter direction along the southern boundary of said location to its south-eastern corner; thence north-easterly and northerly along a one chain road to a point in prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of location 978; thence easterly to and along said boundary and onwards to the western boundary of location 802; thence northerly to the south-western corner of location 417; thence easterly and northerly along boundaries of said location to a point in prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of location 380; thence easterly to and along said boundary and onwards to the western boundary of location 388; thence southerly along said boundary for a distance of 15 chains; thence east to the western boundary of location 383; thence southerly along said boundary for a distance of 11 chains; thence east to the western boundary of location 384; thence northerly along said boundary and onwards to the southern boundary of Coolup A.A. Lot 62; thence easterly to the south-western corner of lot 60; thence northerly along the western boundary of the latter lot for a distance of 15 chains; thence east to the western boundary of lot 59; thence northerly along said boundary for a distance of 7 chains; thence easterly to the western boundary of lot 58; thence northerly along the said boundary for a distance of 13 chains; thence east to the western boundary of lot 56; thence northerly along the said boundary for a distance of 25 chains; thence east to a point on the western boundary of lot 37 and onwards for a further distance of 10 chains; thence south 40 chains; thence east 10 chains to the western boundary of lot 36; thence southerly to the south-western corner of lot 36; thence easterly along the southern boundary of said lot and onwards to the westernmost corner of lot 235; thence generally southerly to and along boundaries of Murray Location 616 to a point situate 33 chains northerly from its south-western corner; thence east 57 chains; thence south to the southern boundary of location 8; thence easterly along said boundary to the left bank

of the Murray River; thence generally east-south-easterly, upwards, along the said bank to a point in prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of location 493; and thence generally southerly to and along the said boundary and to and along boundaries of locations 246 and 1182 aforesaid to the starting point, as shown within the green border on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 30096.

HOSPITALS ACT, 1927.

Warren District Hospital Board—Amendment of By-laws—Resolution.

MINE WORKERS' RELIEF ACT, 1932-1943.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council acting under section 62 of the Mine Workers' Relief Act, 1932-1943, has been pleased to amend in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder the Mine Workers' Relief Regulations made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 12th day of July, 1935, the 16th day of April, 1937, the 2nd day of July, 1937, the 10th day of September, 1937, the 8th day of October, 1937, the 24th day of November, 1939, the 26th day of July, 1940, the 29th day of November, 1940, the 13th day of June, 1941, the 11th day of July, 1941, the 20th day of November, 1942, the 4th day of June, 1943, and the 27th day of August, 1943.

SCHEDULE.

The abovementioned Mine Workers' Relief Regulations are amended as follows:—

1. Regulation 6 is amended by adding thereto a paragraph as follows:—Where the said person is suffering from tuberculosis without silicosis, the Minister shall also on receipt of the said report serve upon him a notice in Form E1 in the said First Schedule hereto.

2. New Regulations are added after regulation 55 as follows:—

Curative Treatment.

55A. For the purposes of these regulations the term "Superintendent" means the person appointed and holding office under section 7 of the Act under the name or designation "Superintendent Mine Workers' Relief Act."

55B. A mine worker, who, in accordance with regulation 6 of these regulations has been served with a notice in Form E1 in the First Schedule to these regulations shall as soon as reasonably may be reply to the said notice by serving on the Superintendent a notice in Form E2 in the said First Schedule duly completed and signed by the mine worker.

55C. If a mine worker who has been served with a notice in Form E1 aforesaid, and in Form E2 aforesaid agrees to accede to the request of the Minister to attend for further medical examination and curative treatment the Minister shall appoint times and places for the purposes of such further medical examination and curative treatment and shall notify the mine worker in writing thereof.

55D. A mine worker who in conformity with these regulations has agreed to attend for curative treatment shall receive and continue to receive such curative treatment at the times and places appointed by the Minister as aforesaid until he is furnished with a certificate in Form E3 or in Form Z8 in the First Schedule to these regulations as the case may require.

55E. From the date when a mine worker receives notice from the Minister of the times and places appointed by the Minister for further medical examination and curative treatment of the mine worker and until the mine worker is furnished with a certificate in Form E3 or Form Z8 as aforesaid, all expenses and charges incidental to the further medical examination and curative treatment of the mine worker shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be borne and paid by the Mine Workers' Relief Board out of the Mine Workers' Relief Fund.

Provided that—(i) The amount of such expenses and charges payable by the Board as aforesaid shall be those specified respectively in Scale III. of the Second Schedule to these regulations; and (ii) In the case of any expense or charge, not expressly provided for in the said Scale III., the amount payable by the Board shall be such as the Board after due consideration shall deem to be reasonable.

55F. If upon an examination by a medical officer or practitioner appointed under the Act a mine worker who has been receiving curative treatment is found to be free from tuberculosis as defined by the Act the laboratory shall furnish to the Superintendent a certificate in the Form Z6 in the First Schedule to these regulations.

55G. When in respect of a mine worker the laboratory has furnished a certificate to the Superintendent in the Form Z6 as provided for in regulation 55F hereof, the Superintendent shall notify the Minister thereof, and thereupon the Minister shall issue to the said mine worker a certificate in the Form E3 in the First Schedule to these regulations.

55H. Whenever in respect of a mine worker and in accordance with regulation 6 hereof a notice in Form G in the First Schedule to these regulations has been served by the Minister upon the employer of such mine worker, and the Minister subsequently issues to the mine worker a certificate in Form Z6 as provided for in regulation 55F hereof, the Minister shall as soon as reasonably may be after the issue of such certificate serve upon the said employer a notice in Form G1 in the said First Schedule.

55I. Whenever in accordance with regulation 55D of these regulations a certificate in Form E3 in the First Schedule to these regulations is issued to a mine worker, the Superintendent shall forthwith serve upon the Mine Workers' Relief Board in respect of such mine worker a notice in Form P1 in the First Schedule to these regulations.

55J. (a) When in accordance with regulation 55D hereof a certificate in Form E3 has been issued to a mine worker, such mine worker is employed in or about a mine shall within six months after the issue to him of such certificate submit himself for further medical examination in accordance with the Act, and if then found to be free from tuberculosis as defined by the Act shall be furnished with a certificate in Form C2 in the First Schedule to these regulations.

(b) Whilst a mine worker to whom a certificate in Form E3 has been issued as aforesaid continues to be employed on in or about a mine he shall submit himself for further medical examination after the first medical examination mentioned in paragraph (a) of this regulation at intervals which shall not exceed six months in duration, and so long as he continues to be free from tuberculosis as defined in the Act, the term of the certificate in Form C2 aforesaid issued to him in accordance with paragraph (a) of this regulation shall from time to time be extended accordingly.

(c) Any expenses of travel unavoidably incurred by a mine worker in attending for medical examinations in compliance with the requirements of this regulation shall be borne and paid by the Mine Workers' Relief Board out of the Mine Workers' Relief Fund in accordance with Scale III. in the Second Schedule to these regulations.

(d) The employer of a mine worker attending medical examinations as required by this regulation shall pay the mine worker the wages ordinarily payable to him during such reasonable period as the mine worker is absent from his employment for the purpose of attending such medical examinations.

55K. When a mine worker to whom subsection (3) of section 49A of the Act applies is examined by a medical officer or practitioner appointed under the Act and is found to be suffering from tuberculosis as defined by the Act, without silicosis, the laboratory shall furnish to the Superintendent a certificate in Form Z7 in the First Schedule to these regulations; and thereupon the Superintendent and the Mine Workers' Relief Board shall re-instate the mine worker in the registers of prohibited mine workers kept by them respectively, and upon such re-instatement the mine worker shall again become entitled to receive the benefits under the Act to which he would have been entitled if he had not been issued with the certificate in Form E3 as provided for in regulation 55D hereof.

Provided that the benefit to which the mine worker is again entitled as aforesaid shall recommence from the stage reached at the date when a certificate in Form E3 was last issued to the mine worker.

55L. A mine worker who is in course of receiving curative treatment and who is discharged from such treatment by the Minister as provided for in subsection (1) of section 49A of the Act shall be furnished with a release in Form Z8 in the First Schedule to these regulations; and thereafter the benefits under the Act to which the mine worker is entitled shall continue except in so far as any such benefits relate or are incidental to curative treatment.
