PROCLAMATION

Lieutenant-Governor. } and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] } wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 15 of the Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938, that the Governor may from time to time on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee as constituted by the said Act, by Proclamation fix minimum and maximum prices at which substances included in the definition of flour or in the definition of wheat products may be sold in the State or in any specified part of the State by any person and by a subsequent Proclamation may revoke, amend or vary any such Proclamation aforesaid; and whereas by a Proclamation issued under the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 31st day of August, 1939, the Lieutenant-Governor fixed in relation to bread the prices at which bread may be sold by any person respectively in the various parts of the State specified in such Proclamation (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Proclamation"); and whereas the Lieutenant-Governor by a subsequent Proclamation dated the 3rd day of July, 1940, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of July, 1940 (hereinafter referred to as "the amending Proclamation"), varied and amended the principal Proclamation; and whereas the principal Proclamation as amended by the amending Proclamation fixed prices for the sale of bread *inter alia* within the town of Laverton; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to vary and amend the said prices as fixed for bread sold within the town of Laverton aforesaid and to vary and amend further the principal Proclamation as amended by the amending Proclamation accordingly: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in accordance with the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee aforesaid and in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon me by the said Act but subject to any

orders now or from time to time in force under the National Security (Prices) Regulations of the Commonwealth of Australia do hereby declare that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the principal Proclamation or in the amending Proclamation the prices at which bread, being a wheat product within the meaning of the said Act, may be sold by any person within the town of Laverton shall be and are subject as hereinafter provided hereby fixed in accordance with the prices set forth hereunder: provided that this Proclamation shall not apply in the case of sales of any such bread aforesaid under contract to public charitable institutions or to Government institutions; and also that to the extent by which this Proclamation is inconsistent with the provisions of the principal Proclamation or of the amending Proclamation this present Proclamation shall prevail and the principal Proclamation and the amending Proclamation shall be and are hereby respectively amended and varied; and also that nothing in this present Proclamation shall be deemed in any way whatsoever to interfere with, prejudice or affect the application of the provisions of paragraphs 10 and 11 of the principal Proclamation to sales of bread by any person within the town of Laverton aforesaid but that subject to variation of prices as provided in this present Proclamation the provisions of paragraphs 10 and 11 of the principal Proclamation shall apply to sales of bread within the town of Laverton as fully and effectually as if the said paragraphs were expressly incorporated in this present Proclamation:—

1. The prices of bread sold by any person within the town of Laverton are by this Proclamation fixed as follows:—

A. White bread, whole-wheatmeal bread, standard wheatmeal bread and brown bread sold as No. 2 loaves within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1938:—
(i) Retail—cash—8½d. per loaf, booked—8½d. per loaf.
(ii) Wholesale—8s. per dozen loaves.

B. White bread, whole-wheatmeal bread, standard wheatmeal bread and brown bread sold as No. 1 loaves within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1938:—
(i) Retail—cash—4½d. per loaf, booked—4½d. per loaf. (ii) Wholesale—4s. per dozen loaves.

2. This Proclamation shall have effect as from and after the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

Lieutenant-Governor, and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 15 of the Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938, that the Governor may from time to time, on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee as constituted by the said Act, by Proclamation fix minimum and maximum prices at which substances included in the definition of flour or in the definition of wheat products may be sold in the State or in any specified part of the State by any person and that the Governor may from time to time revoke or vary any Proclamation under the said section by a subsequent Proclamation; and whereas the Lieutenant-Governor by a Proclamation dated the 22nd day of April, 1941, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th day of April, 1941 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Proclamation), fixed certain prices in relation to flour bread and other substances therein specified at which flour bread and the other substances aforesaid might be sold by any person in the various parts of the State therein specified; and whereas the Lieutenant-Governor by a subsequent Proclamation dated the 14th day of August, 1941, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd day of August, 1941, varied and amended the principal Proclamation; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to vary and amend further the principal Proclamation in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in accordance with the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee aforesaid and in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon me by the said Act do hereby vary and amend the principal Proclamation as already amended by the said Proclamation dated the 14th day of August, 1941, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd day of August, 1941 in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder; and also declare that this Proclamation shall have effect as from and after the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

Schedule.

The said principal Proclamation is varied and amended as follows:—

1. Subparagraph A of paragraph 1 is amended as follows:—

(a) By deleting subparagraph (iii) and inserting in lieu thereof a new subparagraph (iii) as follows:—
(iii) When sold for delivery elsewhere than in the area served by the railways aforesaid and delivered in bags or other containers of approximately 150 lbs. weight delivered to buyers at mill door or mill siding or railway siding—the appropriate price as fixed in the Schedule hereunder.

(b) By inserting after subparagraph (iii) a new subparagraph, to stand as subparagraph (iii) a as follows:—(iii) a When sold for loading on ship at Fremantle or Geraldton and for delivery at any other coastal port—the price shall be the price f.o.b. ship at Fremantle or Geraldton as the case may be in accordance with the prices hereby fixed for deliveries at Fremantle or Geraldton (as the case may be) plus two shillings and sixpence loading charge plus freight payable on the consignment.

(c) By deleting from subparagraph (c) of subparagraph (iv) the figures "15s." in the last line, and inserting in lieu thereof the figures "25s."

(d) By deleting from subparagraph (d) of subparagraph (iv) the figures "£1-10-0d." in the last line and inserting in lieu thereof the figures "£2-18-0d."

(e) By deleting from subparagraph (f) of subparagraph (iv) the figures "£1-2-6d" in the last line and inserting in lieu thereof the figures "£2-1-6d."

(f) By deleting subparagraph (vi).

2. The Schedule to the principal Act is amended by deleting therefrom all that part of the Schedule commencing with the sub-heading "North West List Prices."

[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 15 of the Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938, that the Governor may from time to time on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee as constituted by the said Act, by Proclamation fix minimum and maximum prices at which substances included in the definition of flour or in the definition of wheat products may be sold in the State or in any specified part of the State by any person; and whereas by Proclamation dated the 13th day of July, 1939, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the same day (hereinafter referred to as the principal Proclamation) the Lieutenant-Governor fixed prices in relation to bread at which bread may be sold in certain parts of the State other than the Metropolitan Area, and *inter alia* fixed the prices at which bread may be sold in the towns of Bunbury, Bridgetown, Wagin and Harvey; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to vary and amend the said prices as fixed for bread sold in the towns aforesaid and to vary and amend the principal Proclamation accordingly: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in accordance with the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee aforesaid and in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon me by the said Act but subject to any orders now or from time to time in force under the National Security (Prices) Regulations of the Commonwealth of Australia do hereby declare that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the principal Proclamation the prices at which bread being a wheat product within the meaning of the said Act may be sold by any person within the towns of Bunbury, Bridgetown, Wagin and Harvey respectively shall be and are subject as hereinafter provided hereby fixed in accordance with the prices set forth hereunder: provided that this Proclamation shall not apply in the case of sales of any such bread aforesaid under contract to public charitable institutions or to Government institutions; and also that to the extent by which this Proclamation is inconsistent with the provisions of the principal Proclamation this present Proclamation shall prevail and the principal Proclamation shall be and is hereby amended and varied; and also that nothing in this present Proclamation shall be deemed in any manner whatsoever to interfere with, prejudice or affect the application of the provisions of paragraphs 6, 7 and 8 of the principal Proclamation to sales of bread by any person within the towns of Bunbury, Bridgetown, Wagin and Harvey aforesaid but that subject to variation of prices as provided in this present Proclamation the provisions of paragraphs 6, 7 and 8 of the said principal Proclamation shall apply to sales of bread within the towns aforesaid as fully and as effectually as if the said paragraphs were expressly incorporated in this present Proclamation—

1. The prices of bread sold by any person within the town of Bunbury are by this Proclamation fixed as follows:—

Bunbury.

A. White bread, whole-wheatmeal bread, standard wheatmeal bread and brown bread sold as No. 2 loaves within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1938—
(i) Retail—(a) When sold *ex* shop or bakehouse: cash—5d. per loaf, booked—5½d. per loaf. (b) When delivered to buyer's premises: cash—5½d. per loaf;

booked—6d. per loaf. (ii) Wholesale: (a) When sold for resale—4s. 6d. per dozen loaves. (b) When not for resale—5s. per dozen loaves.

B. White bread, whole-wheatmeal bread, standard wheatmeal bread and brown bread sold as No. 1 loaves within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1938—
(i) Retail—(a) When sold *ex* shop or bakehouse: cash—2½d. per loaf, booked—2¾d. per loaf. (ii) Wholesale—
(a) When sold for resale—2s. 3d. per dozen loaves. (b) When not for resale—2s. 6d. per dozen loaves.

2. The prices of bread sold by any person within the town of Bridgetown are by this Proclamation fixed as follows:—

Bridgetown.

A. White bread, whole-wheatmeal bread, standard wheatmeal bread and brown bread sold as No. 2 loaves within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1938—
(i) Retail—cash—5½d. per loaf, booked—6d. per loaf. (ii) Wholesale—5s. per dozen loaves.

B. White bread, whole-wheatmeal bread, standard wheatmeal bread and brown bread sold as No. 1 loaves within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1938—
(i) Retail—cash—3d. per loaf, booked—3¼d. per loaf. (ii) Wholesale—2s. 6d. per dozen loaves.

3. The prices of bread sold by any person within the town of Wagin are by this Proclamation fixed as follows:—

Wagin.

A. White bread, whole-wheatmeal bread, standard wheatmeal bread and brown bread sold as No. 2 loaves within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1938—

(i) Retail—cash—5½d. per loaf, booked—6d. per loaf. (ii) Wholesale—5s. per dozen loaves.

B. White bread, whole-wheatmeal bread, standard wheatmeal bread and brown bread sold as No. 1 loaves within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1938—
(i) Retail—cash—3d. per loaf, booked—3¼d. per loaf. (ii) Wholesale—2s. 6d. per dozen loaves.

5. This Proclamation shall have effect as from and after the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.
