The Vermin Act, 1918-1942.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,
TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and
JAMES MITCHELL, } over the State of Western Australia
Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] } wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, that "vermin" means and includes any animal, bird, or insect mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act and such other animals, birds, or insects the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said Schedule; and whereas it is deemed expedient to add to the said Third Schedule the name of the animals or birds known as Emus with intent that Emus shall be vermin within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, and in particular for the purposes of paragraph (d) of subsection (3) of section 103 of the said Act; Now therefore I the said Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred upon me by the said Act do by this Proclamation add to the Third Schedule to the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, the name of the animal or bird known as "Emu" with the intent that Emus shall be vermin within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act and in particular for the purposes of paragraph (d) of subsection (3) of section 103 of the said Act and I declare that this Proclamation shall operate and have effect generally throughout the State.

Boyup Brook Water Area.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 112/43.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1942, it is provided that before undertaking the construction of water works, the Minister shall submit plans, descriptions, books of reference and estimates of the proposed works to the Governor for approval, and that if they are approved, the Governor may forthwith, by Order in Council, empower the Minister to undertake the construction of the proposed works: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor with the advice of the Executive Council hereby approves of the plans, descriptions, books of reference and estimates marked P.W.D., W.A. 29777, for the construction of water

works within the Boyup Brook Water Area, which were duly submitted for approval, and hereby empowers the Minister to undertake the construction of the said works.

Water Boards Act, 1904-1942.

Boyup Brook Town Water Supply—Reticulation.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 442/44.

WHEREAS by section 40 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1942, it is enacted that subject to the provisions of the said Act a Water Board shall have power to construct water works for the purposes of the said Act; and whereas it is provided by section 41 of the said Act (as amended by the Water Boards Act Amendment Act, 1937), that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from the operation of certain sections of the said Act; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the reticulation works referred to in the following Schedule shall be exempt from the operations of the said sections of the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers in this behalf enabling him doth hereby exempt from the operations of sections 41, 42, 43, 44 and 45 of the Water Boards Act 1904-1942, the reticulation works included in the following schedule.

Schedule.

Construction of the following reticulation works as indicated on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 29777 at an estimated cost of £300:—A 4in. main in lieu of 3in. and 2in. mains from the south-east corner of lot 77 north-easterly along the right-of-way to and across Inglis street; thence south-westerly along Inglis street to Blechynden street; thence along Blechynden street north-westerly for about 7 chains. A 4in. main in lieu of a 2in. main in Bridge street from Barron street to Forrest street, and in Forrest street from Bridge street to Inglis street and in Inglis street from Forrest street to Cowley street and in Cowley street from Inglis street to a new hydrant opposite the Road Board hall on reserve 21532. A 2in. main from the termination of the 4in. main above described along Cowley street to Jayes road and in Jayes road from Cowley street to a point approximately 2½ chains north of the south-eastern corner of lot 200.

(b) Add new designation—Senior worker (crating moulded goods)—margin, 11s. 0d.

Clause 4.—Hours.

2. Add the following at the end of subclause (a):—
Provided that by agreement between the parties, the working week of 44 hours for workers, not being shift workers, may be worked in five (5) days.

Clause 5.—Overtime.

3. Add the following new paragraph to this clause:—
Double time shall be paid for work done on Sundays or on the specially named holidays prescribed by this Award.

4. Add the following new clauses:—

Clause 9A—Payment for Shift Work.

For all work performed on any shift other than day shift additional payment shall be made by the employer to the employee at the rate of 5 per centum of the rates prescribed herein.

Clause 9B—Gloves and Aprons.

(a) Gloves or cotts and aprons shall be provided by the employer to employees who require them for the protection of their hands and or clothing against oil, wetness, heat or cement. For employees in the moulding shop the aprons shall be of leather unless water and oil proof aprons of other material are supplied.

(b) The present practice shall continue and the provisions of this clause remain in abeyance if owing to scarcity of supplies or other good reason the gloves or

cotts and aprons mentioned herein cannot be supplied by the employer. If any question arises under this sub-clause the onus shall lie on the employer to establish the fact that he is unable owing to causes beyond his control to supply the said articles.
