WHEREAS by section 45 of the Health Act, 1911-1942, it is provided that a local authority, in the exercise of its powers conferred by Part III of the said Act may make and levy rates of different amounts in respect of portions of its districts defined for that purpose by proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation declare that the Moora Road Board being the local health authority for the Moora Health District may levy rates of different amounts in respect of portions of its district defined as follows:—(a) Moora Townsite; (b) all Rural Wards; (c) Townsites of Miling, Coomberdale, Gabalong and Bindi Bindi; (d) Watheroo Townsite.

Reserve for Natives at Wandering.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be reserves for natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a reserve for natives should be declared at Wandering:

Now, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an area of about 9,670 acres, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Natives.

Schedule.

All that portion of land (containing an area of about 9,670 acres) comprising Avon Locations 17827, 17828, 17829, 18510, 18511, 18515, 21977, 23604, 23605, 23712 and 23789, together with all that portion of unsurveyed Crown land bounded by lines commencing at the southernmost south-east corner of Avon Location 21977 and extending north along an east and east along a south boundary of said location to the west boundary of location 23789; thence south along part of the west and east along part of the south boundary of the latter location to the north-west corner of location 11984; thence south along part of the west boundary of location 11984 to the production east of the southernmost boundary of location 21977 aforesaid; thence west along said production to the starting point. (Avon—No. 22433, Native Purposes.)

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking by any means of capture whatsoever, the fish known as or called the "Crayfish," in that portion of Western Australian waters lying south of

28° 15' of south latitude, and west of 114° 10' of east longitude including the waters surrounding the islands situated therein, from the first day of October, 1944, to the 31st day of January, 1945.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-37, that the expression "Public Holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purpose of the said Act; and whereas it has been ordered that Monday, the 13th day of November, 1944, shall be observed as a public holiday in honour of the birthday of His Most Gracious Majesty King George VI: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that Monday, the 13th day of November, 1944, shall be a public holiday throughout the State for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be observed as a public holiday under every part of the said Act in which the expression occurs.

Water Boards Act, 1904-1942.

Manjimup Water Area.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1942, the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to alter or extend the boundaries of a Water Area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby extend the boundaries of the Manjimup Water Area in accordance with the Schedule hereto.

This Order in Council shall take effect on the 20th day of October, 1944.

Schedule.

Commencing at a point on the boundary of the existing water area at its intersection with the south-eastern boundary of Chopping street and following the said boundary in a general south-westerly direction to a point in prolongation easterly of the northern alignment of Springall street; thence westerly along the said boundary and its prolongation to the western alignment of Cronin street; thence northerly along the said alignment to the intersection of the boundary of the existing water area with the Timber Tramway; thence following the said boundary in a general easterly, southerly, easterly, south-easterly, southerly and easterly direction to the point of commencement as shown in red on plan P.W.D., W.A. 30140.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 399/44.

WHEREAS by The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water

Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor-in-Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvement—Guildford Municipality, Swan Road District, Midland Junction Municipality, City of Perth, City of Fremantle, Perth Road District and Cottesloe Municipality.—Proposed lining in situ of 12in., 10in., 8in. and 6in. diameter cast iron water mains with cement mortar, as shown in red and green on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 6752.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 20th day of October, 1944.

Local Authorities (Reserve Funds) Act, 1942.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 404/43.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Local Authorities (Reserve Funds) Act, 1942, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Honorary Minister, but subject to the requirements of the proviso to the said section, by Order in Council, authorise a local authority to establish during the present war and to maintain a reserve fund for the purpose of accumulating therein any surplus of ordinary revenue of the Local Authority and of applying the moneys in such reserve fund and any income or profit derived from the investment of moneys in such reserve fund in the carrying out, after the cessation of the present war, of works and undertakings authorised by the Local Government Act of the Local Authority which the Local Authority may not be able conveniently to carry out during the present war; and whereas it is desirable that such reserve fund shall be established by the Local Authorities as set forth in the Schedule hereto: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting pursuant to the recommendation of the Honorary Minister and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, after being satisfied as required by the proviso to section 4 of the said Act, doth hereby authorise the local authority as set forth in the Schedule hereto, to establish and maintain a reserve fund.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-42.

The Peppermint Grove Road Board—The Adoption of Model By-laws.—Resolution.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 320 of the Health Act, 1911-1942, that every local authority may from time to time make by-laws as in the said Act provided and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act within its district and may repeal, amend or suspend the operation of any by-laws so made; and by section 321 of the said Act that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a local authority as aforesaid and that a local authority may of

its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws with or without modification; and whereas Model By-laws have been prepared known as Model By-laws Series A as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927, and other subsequent dates, and in particular Model By-laws 63 and 64 contained in Part I of the said Model By-laws Series A have been deleted from and new by-laws 63, 64, and 66A have been inserted in Part I of the said Model By-laws Series A as set forth in a notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of December, 1943; and whereas the Peppermint Grove Road Board is the local authority within the meaning of the Act, and deems it desirable and expedient in accordance with section 321 of the said Act to adopt the amendments aforesaid made in the said Model By-laws Series A to the intent that the new Model By-laws 63, 64, and 66A aforesaid shall be by-laws of the said local authority: Now therefore the said Peppermint Grove Road Board as such local authority doth hereby resolve and determine to adopt as part of its by-laws under the said Act those by-laws 63, 64, and 66A which now form part of Part I of the said Model By-laws Series A by virtue of the amendment thereof as set forth in the notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of December, 1943, and to adopt the same without modification.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations, under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-18.

MATERNITY HOMES.

Regulations.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-18, His Excellency the Governor in Council may make Regulations providing for the supervision and inspection of Maternity Homes, and prescribing what requisites must be complied with as regards structure, maintenance, and management of such Maternity Homes: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor does hereby make the Regulations following:—

Maternity Homes.

Gazettes 8/11/1918, 18/7/1941.

1. (a) Every application for a license in respect to a maternity home must be in the form of Schedule A, signed by the applicant, with the certificate as to the fitness and respectability of the applicant signed by a medical practitioner.

(b) Every applicant for a license for a maternity home shall pay a fee of £1 for each year or part of a year ending 31st December, provided that any applicant already licensed, who applies for a license in respect of other premises after the 30th June in any year, shall be called upon to pay in respect of such other premises a license fee of ten shillings.

Provided further, that any license issued in respect of a hospital, which is a public hospital within the meaning of the Hospitals Act, 1927, shall be exempt from payment of the license fee.

(c) Every license shall be in the form of Schedule B, and shall not be transferable.

(d) Every license shall expire on the 31st day of December in the year of issue.

(e) Every licensee desirous of renewing her license shall apply for such on or before the 15th December, prior to its expiry.

1A. (a) A license shall not be granted in respect of any building, structure, or apartment when the applicant for such license is over the age of 65 years or apparently over that age, unless such applicant proves to the satisfaction of the Commissioner that at all times during the currency of the license, the maternity home will be directly under the management and control of a person under the age of 65 years.

(b) Any proof of age requisite for the purposes of this regulation shall be in such form and of such nature as the Commissioner may require.

1B. A license shall not be granted in respect of any building, structure, or apartment for use as a maternity home, unless such building, structure, or apartment is distant not less than 15 feet on all sides thereof from the nearest boundary of the lot or parcel of land upon which the same is erected.

2. No application for a license shall be granted unless the premises in respect of which such license is sought comply with the following conditions:—

(a) Every room to be occupied by one or more patients shall have at least one thousand cubic feet of air space and one hundred square feet of floor area, and eight feet of lineal wall space for each patient; and if the floor be of wood, the bottom joists of every such room shall be at least three inches above the ground, and the space under every such floor shall be sufficiently ventilated.

(b) Every room shall be separately and independently and sufficiently ventilated to the external air.

(c) Every such room shall be provided with windows in the external walls having a ratio of one square foot of clear glass to each ten square feet of floor.

(d) Every room shall be accessible through a hall or passage which is used for no other purpose than that of a passage way.

(e) Every wall of such room to be properly protected immediately above the foundation, by a durable damp course.

(f) The inner surface of every wall and every ceiling to be smooth, and so constructed that they can, without sustaining injury, be readily cleansed and disinfected.

(g) The drainage of the premises to be sufficient and to the satisfaction of the Commissioner.

(h) The water supply to be abundant and wholesome.

(i) Ablutionary appliances to be provided of such number and so arranged as the Commissioner may prescribe.

(j) Every room to be sufficiently furnished to the satisfaction of the Commissioner.

(k) Mattresses for patients' use to be kept exclusively for that purpose.

(l) Every room to be used for patients, the kitchen and the dining-room to be rendered flyproof.

(m) A laundry, with all necessary appliances, sufficient to cleanse and disinfect all bedding, body-clothing, linen, napery, and other similar articles to be provided.

(n) There shall be sufficient accommodation for the licensee, her family and staff.

2A. The licensee of a maternity home shall—(a) employ and maintain therein a nursing staff in the proportion of one midwifery nurse for every four patients accommodated in the maternity home at any one time; (b) employ a night nurse (who need not be a trained nurse) for duty at night when there are more than three patients in the maternity home at any one time.

3. (a) A licensee shall only accommodate patients in those rooms specified in the license.

(b) No licensee shall accommodate, or allow to be accommodated, any patients in a room not specified in the license.

(c) The use of any rooms, specified in the license for other purposes than the accommodation of patients, is prohibited.

4. Every licensee of a maternity home shall, within three days after the death or removal of any person in her care, give notice thereof to the Commissioner in the form of Schedule C. Provided that this regulation shall not apply in the case of a married woman who leaves her home accompanied by her child.

5. Every licensee of a maternity home shall keep a register in the form of Schedule D, and such other books and records as may be required by the Department.

5A. (1) The licensee of a maternity home shall provide therein to the satisfaction of the Commissioner—(a) a labour ward properly equipped; and (b) a nursery.

(2) Only such labour ward, and no other room in the maternity home shall be used for the delivery of patients.

6. Every person conducting or keeping a maternity home shall:—

- (a) Flush and disinfect all drains upon the premises at least once in every day, and cause all such drains to be maintained in good order and efficient action.
- (b) Provide and at all times keep upon such premises, in efficient order, all materials and appliances necessary for the use of the inmates and staff.
- (c) At all times exercise a close personal supervision of the premises and the persons employed therein or thereon, and cause all orders of the medical practitioner in charge of any patient to be diligently carried out.
- (d) Forthwith carry out all orders or directions that may be given from time to time by the inspector relating to sanitary arrangements, the collecting or disposal of excrementitious matter, refuse, liquid or other wastes; or other directions which may be found necessary.
- (e) At all times keep all household linen, beds, bedding, furniture, cutlery, crockery, cooking and other utensils, and all other things used in the management or conduct of such hospital thoroughly clean, and, when required by an inspector, disinfect any or all of the said things.
- (f) Cause all refuse or condemned linen or clothing to be burnt on the premises, in such a manner as may be directed by an inspector.
- (g) Provide separate approved air-tight receptacles into which all used surgical dressings, human tissues, or fluids, other than those already provided for in these regulations, shall be placed, and all such special refuse shall be burnt.
- (h) Provide an autoclave or other approved device for pressure sterilisation.
- (i) Provide any drugs ordinarily required by medical attendants, and such drugs as may be ordered by the Commissioner to be provided.
- (j) Provide such appliances as are needed for carrying out any treatment ordered by medical attendants.

7. No licensee of any maternity home shall be absent from the premises overnight, while there is any patient therein, unless a registered midwife be left in charge.

8. No licensee shall absent herself from her maternity home for more than a week, while there is any patient on the premises, without first appointing a registered midwife to take charge during her absence, whose name shall be notified to the Commissioner by the licensee.

9. No children shall be permitted by the licensee to remain on the premises of any maternity home, except by permission of the Commissioner: Provided that this restriction shall not apply to children of the licensee, infants recently born on the premises, and children who may be patients in a general hospital which is also licensed as a maternity home.

10. Should any case of puerperal fever occur in any maternity home, the licensee shall cause such case to be isolated and treated by a separate staff, and shall at once report the case to the Commissioner. No other maternity case shall be admitted to the room occupied by such patient until it has been thoroughly disinfected to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer of Health.

11. No licensee shall suffer or permit a number of patients to be in her home or in any licensed room thereof greater than the number authorised in the license.

12. Every licensee conducting a maternity home shall maintain in such home at all times, to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, a sufficient number of assistants, including those engaged in ordinary household duties.

13. No room or any portion of a maternity home shall be sublet, nor shall boarders or lodgers be taken in, other than patients.

14. Poultry shall not be kept or allowed within 25 feet of any maternity home.

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15. No cat or dog shall be kept or allowed in any maternity home.

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16. Where anything by these regulations is directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or where authority is given to any officer to direct anything to be done, and such act directed to be done remains undone, or such act forbidden to be done, is done, in every such case the person making default as to such direction or prohibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of a breach of the said regulations, and shall be

liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against any such person guilty of such offence, to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every breach of any such regulations.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1942.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council pursuant to the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1942, has been pleased to approve of the amendment by the Midwives Registration Board of the regulations relating to Midwifery Nurses under Part XII of the said Act as reprinted in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th day of April, 1943, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

The abovementioned Midwives Registration Board Regulations are amended as follows:—

1. A new regulation is inserted in Part IV after regulation 23 as follows:—

23A. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in regulation 23 or elsewhere in these regulations, any nurse at the King Edward Memorial Hospital who has watched the progress of and personally conducted not less than fifteen cases of labour and assisted with at least five additional midwifery cases, and has made a statutory declaration to that effect, shall be deemed to have completed the prescribed number of cases necessary to entitle her to present herself for examination for a certificate of competency as a midwife.

FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST.

Amendment of Regulations.

THE Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners hereby amend the regulations made under the Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902, and as reprinted by the Government Printer with all amendments up to the 31st May, 1944, as follows:—

No. 207.

By deleting the words "smoke or" between the words "shall" and "have" in the second line of paragraph (g) of regulation No. 207.

By repealing regulation No. 308 and inserting in lieu thereof the following new regulations:—

No. 308.

Smoking.—No person shall smoke on or under any wharf or in, on or under any shed, or on any crane or other plant or any vehicle thereon or therein. Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds (£100) in respect of each such breach.

No. 308a.

Loitering.—No person shall—

- (a) loiter or play any game in, on or about any place within the boundaries of any premises vested in or under the control or authority of the Commissioners; or
- (b) sleep among any cargo which is lying or stacked within the boundaries of any of the premises aforesaid; or
- (c) without the consent of the Commissioners address any assemblage of persons in, on or about any place within the boundaries of the premises aforesaid.

114B.—For the purpose of the next two preceding regulations the expression “public building” shall be deemed to include any open air garden or any other premises or place where motion pictures are publicly exhibited.

GOLDFIELDS WATER SUPPLY ACT, 1902-1942.

Restrictions on Use of Water—By-law.

65A. (1) As from and after the date of this by-law coming into operation, the use by any person of water supplied by the Minister under the Act shall be subject to the following provisions, and any person who uses any such water in contravention of any of such provisions shall be guilty of a breach of these by-laws, that is to say:—

(a) where the water is used for watering lawns or gardens appurtenant to a private dwelling or other private building, no mechanical device shall be used for the purposes of such watering on any day, except between the hours of 6 o'clock p.m. and 8 o'clock p.m.; and, where the watering is done other than by means of or through a mechanical device, it shall be done either with a watering can or other container held in the hand or with a hose held in the hand;

(b) where the water is used for watering fruit trees or fruit vines, no mechanical device shall be used at any time for the purposes of such watering, and such watering shall be done only with a watering can or other container held in the hand or with a hose held in the hand;

(c) where the water is used for watering market gardens or nurseries of plants other than fruit trees or fruit vines, and in all other cases of watering (other than the watering of fruit trees or fruit vines), where the water is supplied at irrigation prices as prescribed under these by-laws, no mechanical device

or hose held in the hand shall be used for the purposes of such watering on any day other than Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, except with the permission of the Minister, and where the watering is done on days upon which the use of a hose or a mechanical device is prohibited by this subparagraph, it shall be done only with a watering can or other container held in the hand;

(d) where the water is used for watering race-courses, sports grounds, bowling greens, croquet greens, tennis courts, golf courses or gardens appurtenant to any of the places aforesaid, no mechanical device shall be used at any time for the purposes of such watering, the water shall not be used for such watering on any day other than Monday and Friday in any week, and on Mondays and Fridays such watering shall be done only with a watering can or other container held in the hand or with a hose held in the hand.

(2) The term “mechanical device,” as used in paragraph (1) of this by-law, means any mechanical or fixed sprinkler or any other mechanical contrivance, or any hose temporarily fixed at the outlet thereof which usually is or can be used for watering purposes as an alternative to a watering can or other container held in the hand or to a hose held in the hand.
