WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (2) of section 100 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that the day on which all shops, except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule and registered small shops, shall close at one o'clock, shall be Saturday: Provided that the Governor may by Proclamation at any time and from time to time on the petition (according to the form in the Sixth Schedule) of the majority of the keepers of such shops in any district or specified locality not within the district, substitute in that district or locality for Saturday any other week day, and may at any time

on the like petition revoke any such substitution: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me in that behalf by subsection (2) of section 100 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, do hereby repeal and revoke the Proclamation issued under the said section in respect of shops in the Preston Shop District and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of March, 1928, declaring Wednesday to be the day on which such shops should close at one o'clock in the afternoon.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.
NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection 1 of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to declare, under section 9 of the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1942, that it shall be unlawful to set fire to the bush in the Dandaragan Road District during the period the 22nd October, 1944, to the 1st March, 1945 (inclusive), excluding that portion of the district defined in the *Government Gazette* of the 6th October, 1944, lying within three miles of the coastline, the period for which shall be the 15th October, 1944, to the 31st January, 1945.

This Agreement shall operate over the Power House owned and controlled by the Collie Power Company, Limited.

4.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for three (3) months from the date hereof and this Agreement shall thereafter run concurrently with Industrial Agreement No. 5 of 1940.
