FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934. NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection 1 of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

In the matter of an Award made on the 30th day of April, 1940, Nod. 13 of 1939, as amended by Orders, Nod. 291 of 1941 and 124 of 1943, and in the matter of an application by the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter referred to as "the Union") for further amendment of the said Award.

Fisher on behalf of the Conservator of Forests for Western Australia, and by consent, the Court, in pursuance of the powers contained in section 90 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, doth hereby order and declare that Award, Nod. 13 of 1939, as amended by Orders Nod. 291 of 1941 and 124 of 1943, be and the same is hereby further amended in the terms of the Schedule of Amendments annexed hereto, such amendments to operate as from the 8th day of December, 1944.

Schedule of Amendments.

Clause 5. Overtime:

Strike out subclause (b) (i) and (ii) and insert in lieu thereof:-

- "(b) (i) During the fire season an overseer, if so required shall remain on his block or plantation and be in regular communication as instructed by the Forester in Charge with either a Divisional Officer, District Office, fire tower or other fire watcher, so that he may be available for patrol or fire fighting curing the week-end. This clause will apply also to Christmas Pay, Labour Day and Good Friday, or from knock off time in any shift to starting time in the next successive shift. When so required, an overseer, at his option, may have the privilege of extra leave, as set out in clause 6, subclauses (b) and (c) or alternatively, may receive payment at the following rates:-
 - (1) 12s, for the full week-end or 4s, each for Saturday afternoon, Sunday morning and Sunday afternoon respectively.
 - (2) For Christmas Day, Labour Day or Good Friday, payment will be at the rate of 10s. per day.
 - (3) At any other time payment will be at the rate of 8s. per day.
- (ii) When fire service involves more than one (1) hour's work outside the ordinary working hours specified in clause 4, an overseer shall be paid at the rate of three shillings (3s.) per hour on a basic wage of £4 8s. 0d. per week, the rate to be varied by 3d. per hour with every rise or fall of 11s. in the basic wage, for such period in excess of one (1) hour. Provided that an overseer working with a gang on fire fighting or similar working shall be paid for the full period outside ordinary working hours."

Clause 6. Holidays:

Strike out subclause (b) and insert in lieu thereof: "(b) In the case of an overseer who is required under clause 5 (b) to remain on his block or plantation during the fire season, leave on full pay shall be allowed at the rate of half (½) a day for each week or portion thereof. Alternatively, at his option, the overseer may be allowed payment as provided in clause 5 (b) (i)."

Clause 11. Camping Allowance:

Strike out clause 11 and insert in lieu thereot:-"Camping Allowance—(1) An overseer who is obliged to live in a tent or hut away from his usual residence or home station shall receive a camping allowance at the rate of 15s. per week. Provided that if a suitable residence, not being a tent, is provided for a married worker there shall be no obligation to pay any allowance under the above clause. For broken periods this particular allowance shall be calculated at one

sixth, viz., 2s. 6d. per day.

Strike out present clause and insert in lieu thereof:-"Preference of employment shall be given to financial members of the Australian Workers' Union, provided that any worker shall be entitled to equal preference, provided that such worker or applicant shall within fourteen (14) days of commencing employment under this Award, make and complete an application for membership with the Australian Workers' Union, provided that in the case of a member of another recognised Union such application shall be made within fourteen days of the expiry of his current ticket with such Union."

Clause 17. Definition:

Add the following: -- "Home Station for the purposes of this Award means any Forests Department District Headquarters."

Clause 17a:

Insert new clause to be numbered 17a-Use of own

conveyance.
"Use of own conveyance.—When an overseer at the Department's direction uses any kind of conveyance of his own in travelling on the Department's service, the amount of hire payable will be the normal rate which the Department ordinarily pays in that District. In the case of bicycles the allowance will be at the rate of 3s. per week'

Clause 18. Interpretations:

Add the following:—(e) "Home Station" for the purposes of this Award means any Forests Department District Headquarters.

Clause 24. Overtime:

Strike out clause (c)-Detention Allowance-and in-

sert in lieu thereof:

"(c) Detention Allowance.—During the fire season any worker may be required during the week-end to remain in reasonable proximity to his home, and in regular communication as instructed by the Forester in Charge with either a divisional office, district office, fire tower, or other fire watcher, so that he may be ready to answer a call for fire fighting if an outbreak occurs. This clause will apply also to Christmas Day, Labour Day and Good Friday, or from knock off time in any shift to starting time in the next successive shift.

Payment for this service will be at the following

- (1) 12s. for the full week-end or 4s. each for Saturday afternoon, Sunday morning and Sunday afternoon respectively. If a full week-end is involved, the worker lat his option may receive an additional half day's leave (to be added to his annual leave in lieu of other payment).
- (2) For Christmas Day, Labour Day or Good Friday, payment will be at the rate of 10s. per day.

(3) At any other time payment will be at the rate of 8s. per day.

If called upon to do any fire fighting during a stand to period, the rate for this work set out in clause 24 (b) (ii) will be paid.''

Clause 37. Camp Allowance:

Strike out present clause and insert in lieu there-

"Camp Allowance.-When a worker is required to live in a tent or hut away from his usual residence or home station, an allowance at the rate of fifteen shillings (15s.) per week shall be paid: Provided that if a suitable residence, not being a tent, is provided for a married worker there shall be no obligation to pay any allowance under the above clause.

For broken periods this particular allowance shall be calculated at one sixth, i.e., 2s. 6d. per day.

In the event of any dispute arising under this clause the matter may be referred to the Board of Refer-

Clause 39. Look-out Man:

Strike out subclause (a) and insert in lieu thereof:-"(a) Any worker detailed for work on a lookout tower shall receive:-

For each half day, i.e., up to midday or after midday for any number of hours worked—9s.
 For Saturday afternoons—10s.
 for each half day of Sunday—10s.

If part of a half day, the basic wage will be paid for the number of hours worked inside the usual working hours, and at fire service rates for time worked outside the ordinary hours, provided that no payment for a portion of a half day shall exceed the rate for that half day. A minimum of half an hour will be adopted for short service such as taking a bearing on a fire."

Clause 42. Board of Reference:

Add to (i) after the words "time to time" in the second line the following words:—"including any dispute arising under clause 37, Camp Allowance."

Clause 44. Contract of Service:

Strike out the present clause and insert in lieu thereof:-

- "Contract of Service.—(a) One week's notice at any time on either side shall be required, before the engagement of any but a casual worker shall be terminable.
- (b) The employer may dismiss any worker without notice for neglect of duty or misconduct, or inefficiency, in which case the worker shall be entitled to wages up to the time of dismissal only.
- (c) If for any reason whatever during any portion of the working hours of any week no work is available or performed, the worker will be entitled to be paid only for the time actually worked at the rate of pay prescribed, apportioned to such time actually worked during the week.
- (d) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill health, for one half (1/2) day for each completed month of for one nair (½) day for each completed month of service: Provided that the liability of the employer hereunder shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year ending on the 31st December in respect of any worker. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each such calendary and the time the worker leaves the service. dar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (ii) To entitle the worker to the benefits of this subclause, proof, satisfactory to the officer in charge, of sickness shall be produced, but a formal medical absent for three (3) consecutive working days or more. No payment will be made if any absence is due to the worker's own fault, neglect, or misconduct. This subclause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (iii) For the purpose of this clause the continuity of service shall not be deemed to be broken by—(a) inclemency of weather, provided the worker is ready

and willing to work if called upon; (b) permitted absence on account of sickness as herein provided; (c) periods occupied proceeding from job to job, as provided in this Award; (d) absence up to one (1) month whilst in receipt of payment under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(e) The engagement of casual workers shall be by the hour."

Clause 46. Preference:

Strike out present clause and insert in lieu thereof: -"Preference of employment in respect of the classes of workers covered by this Award shall be given to financial members of the Australian Workers' Union, provided that any worker shall be entitled to equal preference, provided that such worker or applicant shall within fourteen (14) days of commencing employment under this Award, make and complete an application for membership with the Australian Workers' Union, provided that in the case of a member of another recognised Union such application shall be made within fourteen days of the expiry of his current ticket with such Union."

Clause 47. Wages Schedule:

First Grade:

Firewood Cutters.—Strike out the margin "4s. (four shillings)" and insert in lieu thereof "9s. (nine shillings)."

Fence Post Splitters.—Strike out the margin "4s. (four shillings)" and insert in lieu thereof "7s. 6d. (seven shillings and sixpence)."

Second Grade:

Strike out the item "Light clearing, including minor operations associated with regeneration cleaning improvement work and crown thinning of pole stands, Margin Nil.

Special Rates:

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 7 of 1944.

Between the Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Association of Australasia West Australian Branch Association of Workers, applicant, and The Hon. Minister for Works and others, respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the Industrial Dispute between the abovenamed parties:-

AWARD.

1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to workers employed by the Minister for Works, the Minister for Water Supply,

Sewerage and Drainage, the Minister for Agriculture, the Minister for Health (in his capacity as Minister controlling Wooroloo Sanitorium and Claremont Mental Hospital) and the Chief Secretary, in the State of Western Australia; but it shall not apply to—(a) Locomotive drivers, locomotive firemen and locomotive cleaners employed on railway construction work or other works where industrial agreements or awards are in force; (b) Workers employed at pumping stations at Barbalin, Narembeen, Kondinin, Waddouring, Knungagin and others in the agricultural areas, except those gagin and victors in the agricultural areas, except under at Albany and Wicherina; (c) Pumping stations in the goldfields area situated at Station Creek, Menzies, 42-Mile Station, Ora Banda, Norseman, Nallan and Meeka-

2.-Hours.

- (a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work.
- (b) Such ordinary hours shall not exceed eight (8) hours on the first five (5) days of the week and four (4) hours ending noon on Saturdays: Provided that employees shall, if required, work seven (7) shifts, each of eight (8) hours in the week, Sunday time to stand alone: Provided further that the forty-four (44) hours can be worked in five (5) days on the approval of the Minister concerned.
- (e) The hours of labour shall include all time occupied in raising steam, banking fires, starting up or closing down of engines. The existing arrangements for early and late attendance at the Fremantle Harbour Works to continue.
- (d) In connection with shift work on construction jobs the first shift in two-shift work shall work eight (8) hours, not including any crib time; all other shifts to be of eight (8) hours, including half $(\frac{1}{2})$ an hour crib time, i.e., seven and a half $(7\frac{1}{2})$ hours' actual working time.
- (e) Where circumstances permit, a regular starting and finishing time may be fixed by agreement in writing between the union and the department concerned or its representative.

3.—Overtime.

- (a) All time worked outside of or in excess of the usual hours shall be paid for the first four (4) hours after the usual stopping time, time and a half, and thereafter double time.
- (b) Provided that employees called to start work within an hour and a half of the usual starting time shall be paid at the rate of time and a half until the usual starting time.
- (c) Should a worker be called back after completing a day's work, he shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at overtime rates.
- (d) For all work done on Sundays, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day, double time rates shall be Provided that employees working seven (7) shifts a week shall be paid time and a half for Sundays.

4.-Holidays.

- (i) (a) Subject to subclause (iii) hereunder, two (2) weeks' leave (an aggregate of eighty-eight (88) hours per annum) shall be granted to each employee, provided that with the exception of employees working seven (7) shifts per week, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and Labour Day shall be taken as they come as portion of the leave. (b) The balance shall be granted to each employee at the convenience of the depart-
- (ii) Notification of annual leave shall be given by the department to workers entitled thereto at least a week before the intended commencement of the leave.
- (iii) All workers other than casuals, with less than twelve (12) months' continuous service, shall be entitled to the same proportion of holiday leave, or payment in lieu thereof, as their length of service is to the full period of leave for the twelve (12) months.
- (iv) Payment for holidays shall be made in accordance with the usual hours worked.

6.—Casual Workers.

Casual workers shall be paid 10 per cent. (10%) over the usual rate in this Award for the employee's occupation. A casual worker is one for whom work, over a period of six (6) consecutive days, not counting holidays, is not provided by the employer.

7.—Contract of Service.

(a) Except in the case of a casual worker, whose engagement shall be by the hour, the contract of hiring of every worker shall be a weekly contract, terminable on either side by one (1) week's notice given on any day.

(b) Any worker not attending for duty shall lose his pay for the actual time of such non-attendance, subject to the provisions of clause 15 hereof, as to payment for absence on account of illness.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss

or unions affiliated with it or by any other association or union or through any breakdown of the employer's machinery or from any other cause for which the employer is not responsible.

8.-Mixed Functions.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two (2) hours in any shift, shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift: Provided that such minimum rate is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two (2) hours at the work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole shift.

9.—Firing and Minor Repairs.

(a) Engine-drivers shall, where it is reasonable, do their own firing and shall also do such minor repairs

to the plant as in the opinion of the Engineer-in-Charge can be done during their shift. Where the reasonableness of his so doing is disputed, the Chief Inspector of Machinery shall decide this question.

(b) Drivers of all steam-driven locomotive engines of more than twenty (20) tons gross weight shall have the assistance of a competent fireman not less than eighteen (18) years of age. For petrol, crude oil, or other internal combustion locomotive engines, or for steam-driven locomotives of not more than twenty (20) tons gross weight, it shall be at the option of the Engineer-in-Charge whether a fireman shall be employed.

10 .- Shift Workers.

- (a) Except where otherwise provided, employees shall be allowed to rotate shifts, and change of shift shall, as far as possible, be arranged to suit transport facilities.
- (b) Shift workers, when employed on afternoon or night shift, shall be paid five per cent. (5%) in addition to their ordinary rates for such shifts.

11.-Country Work.

- (a) When a worker is instructed to proceed on duty from the place where he is then or usually employed, the employer shall pay all fares, including sleeper, and a proper allowance at current rates for all necessary meals, or board and lodging. Fares shall be second class, except when travelling by coastal boat, when saloon fares shall be paid, and shall include return fare on completion of job or after twelve (12) months on job. Provided this clause shall not apply on construction jobs where workers are entitled to camp allowance under clause 16 of this Award.
- (b) Travelling time shall be paid at ordinary rates at place of departure with a maximum of a day's pay when travelling by boat or in a sleeper. When travelling by night without a sleeper, the worker shall be entitled to receive an extra day's pay for such travelling. No time to be lost for travelling.

12.-Shift Workers-Guaranteed Week.

Employees working seven (7) shifts shall be guaranteed six (6) days' work per week.

13.-Right of Entry to Works.

On notifying the Officer-in-Charge, any officer of the union authorised in writing by the President and Secretary of such union shall have the right to enter any place or premises during ordinary working hours wherein members of such union covered by this Award are engaged, for the purpose of conversing with or interviewing the employees in such place or premises premises.

Provided that such officer shall not hamper or otherwise hinder the employees in the carrying out of their work. The Officer-in-Charge shall determine whether employees are being hampered or hindered in their work.

14.-No Reduction.

In the case of any employee who is being paid above the minimum rate applicable under previous Award or arrangement to other workers doing the same class of work, such employees shall not suffer, by reason of this Award only, any reduction of the additional sum so paid over and above the above-mentioned minimum rate.

15.—Payment for Sickness.

- (a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for (a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill health for one-half (½) day for each completed month of service. (ii) The liability of the employer here-under shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker. (iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred
- the time the sickness occurred.

 (b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer, or his representative, of sickness, but

the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.

(d) No payment will be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect, or misconduct.

16.—Camp Allowance.

Workers required to live in tents at or in the neighbourhood of the job shall be paid an additional allowance of Fifteen shillings (15s.) per week, provided that north of latitude 24 the allowance shall be Five shillings and threepence (5s. 3d.) per week. The above allowance covers a week, whether of six (6) or seven (7) days. For broken periods this particular allowance shall be calculated at one-sixth, viz., Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day and tenpence half penny (10½d.) per day respectively.

17.-Preference of Employment.

Preference of employment shall be given in respect of tasks for which rates of wages are specified in this Award, to members of The Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Association of Australasia, West Australian Branch Association of Workers.

18.—Payment of Wages.

When an employee is discharged before the usual when an employee is discharged before the usual pay day he shall be paid his wages when he ceases work, or it shall be forwarded to his address the day after by registered post, at the employer's risk, unless the employee desires to collect it at the office.

19.—Definition.
"Engine-driver" shall mean and include any person who operates or drives any engine or engines the motive power of which is either steam, gas, oil, water, compressed air, or electricity: Provided the definition shall not include—(a) the driving of any internal combustion engine of 30 or less b.h.p., or (b) any engine or electric motor or any pump air compressor pneumatic or small hoist on which no engine-driver or fireman or greaser is employed as such, but the starting and stopping of and attention to which is done by an employee, the greater part of whose time is taken up with other work, or (c) pump attendants employed under the Metropolitan Water Supply Award No. 26 of 1937.

20.—District Allowances.

District allowances, calculated on the rates specified below, shall be paid to workers employed in the un-dermentioned areas:—(a) Carrabin and Bullfinch to Southern Cross—5s. 3d. per week; (b) Southern Cross and eastward thereof to Kanowna—5s. 3d. per week except the towns of Southern Cross, Coolgardie, Kalgoorlie and Boulder and within five miles thereof, Kalgoorlie and Boulder and within five miles thereof, where the allowance will be 2s. 4d. per week; (c) Coolgardie to Salmon Gums—5s. 3d. per week; (d) southward of Salmon Gums to Esperance—2s. 4d. per week; (e) northward of the Kalgoorlie radius—7s. per week; (f) Wurarga and eastward and northward thereof to Meekatharra—7s. per week; (g) three miles eastward of Meekatharra to Wiluna—10s. 6d. per week; Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe—7s. per week.

District allowances, as specified below, shall be paid to workers stationed at—(a) Carnarvon and within an area of five miles thereof—15s. per week; (b) Onslow and Point Sampson and within an area of five miles thereof—23s. 6d. per week; (c) Port Hedland, Broome and Derby, and within an area of five miles thereof—30s. per week; (d) Wyndham and within an area of five miles thereof—38s. per week.

21.—Term.

This Award shall operate for a term of one (1) year.

22.—Board of Reference.

(i) For the purpose of this Award, Boards of Reference are hereby appointed, which shall each consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of:-(a) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award or any of them; (b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time; (c) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award.

(ii) An appeal shall lie from any decision of a Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which, for this purpose, are embodied in this Award.
