ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1939, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve No. 22450 should vest in and be held by the Bunbury Harbour Board in trust for the purpose of storage of kerosene, motor spirit and other oils and petroleum products: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Bunbury Harbour Board in trust for the purpose aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.
