WHEREAS under the provisions of the Medical Act Amendment Act, 1940, where the Governor in Council is satisfied that any hospital within the meaning of the Hospitals Act, 1927, is not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, the said Governor in Council may, by Proclamation, declare such hospital to be a region within the meaning of the said Act: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, being satisfied that the Woorloo Sanatorium, being a hospital within the meaning of the Hospitals Act, 1927, is not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, proclaim the said Woorloo Sanatorium to be a region under the provisions of the said Act, to be designated the Woorloo Sanatorium Region.

districts, and also in the Health District of any other Local Authority which the Governor may from time to time declare: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that the said provisions of Division 3 of Part V of the said Act shall operate and have effect in the Health District of the Claremont Local Health Authority, a Local Authority within the meaning of the said Act.

Life Assurance Companies Act, 1889-1944.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 22A of the Life Assurance Companies Act, 1889-1944, that when in the opinion of the Governor there exists in this State any emergency which he considers justifies the substitution of abridged forms for the forms contained in the Schedules to the said Act the Governor may by Order in Council authorise and direct that for a period to be specified in the Order it shall not be necessary for companies which by any of the provisions of the said Act are required to furnish statements or returns in the forms contained in the Schedules to the said Act to furnish such statements or returns in such last-mentioned forms and that it will be sufficient if the said companies furnish such statements or returns in such abridged forms as may be prescribed by the said Order but that no abridged form shall be prescribed by any such Order in Council unless and until it has been first approved by the State Government Statistician and the Registrar of Companies as being sufficient to meet their official requirements respectively; and also that the Governor may by any Order in Council aforesaid direct that in addition to the three

printed copies of any statement or abstract required by section 23 of the said Act to be deposited at the office of the Registrar an additional copy of such statement or abstract as prepared in the abridged forms authorised by the Order in Council shall be so deposited for transmission by the Registrar to the Commonwealth Statistician: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred upon him by section 22A of the said Act and with the approval of the Acting State Government Statistician and of the Registrar of Companies do hereby firstly authorise and direct that until this Order in Council is revoked by me it shall not be necessary for companies which by the provisions of sections 16, 17 or 18 of the Life Assurance Companies Act, 1889-1944, are required to furnish the statements or returns mentioned in such sections respectively in the forms contained in the First and Second Schedules, or in the Third and Fourth Schedules or in the Fifth Schedule to the said Act as provided for in the said sections respectively to furnish such statements or returns in the forms contained in such Schedules; and that it will be sufficient if the said Companies furnish such statements or returns in such one or more of the abridged forms numbered 1, 2 and 3 respectively prescribed in the Schedule hereunder as the case may require; and secondly doth hereby direct that in addition to the three printed copies of every statement or abstract required by section 23 of the said Act to be deposited at the office of the Registrar of Companies an additional printed copy of such statement or abstract as prepared in the abridged forms authorised by this Order in Council shall be so deposited for transmission by the said Registrar of Companies to the Commonwealth Statistician.

HOSPITALS ACT, 1927.

Wiluna District Hospital—Amendment of By-laws. WHEREAS under section 22 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, the Board of Management of a hospital may make by-laws for any of the purposes specified in the said section and under section 37 of the said Act the Governor may make regulations for the purposes of the said Act and may thereby formulate Model By-laws for the guidance of boards in respect of all or any of the matters regarding which Boards may make by-laws; and whereas the Governor in Council having formulated Model By-laws as contained in regulation 10 of the regulations made under the said Act and

published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of December, 1940, the Board of Management of the Wiluna District Hospital adopted the same by a resolution passed on the 18th day of May, 1941, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of May, 1942; and whereas it is now deemed expedient to amend the said Model By-laws as the by-laws of the said Board of Management of the Wiluna District Hospital in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, the said Board of Management doth hereby amend its said by-laws being the said Model By-laws adopted by it as aforesaid in the manner following that is to say:—

1. Model By-law 16 is deleted and a new by-law is inserted in its place as follows:—

FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST.

Amendment of Regulations.

THE Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners hereby amend the regulations made under the Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902, and as reprinted by the Government Printer with all amendments up to the 31st day of May, 1944, as follows:—

1. By deleting regulation No. 79 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—
No. 79.

Safety Nets—(a) Where a vessel is lying at a wharf or where two or more vessels are lying alongside of one another, and any means of passing from the vessel to the wharf or from one vessel to the other vessel as the case may be is used, the Master of the vessel which provides such means of passing aforesaid shall cause to be suspended and kept so suspended thereunder between the vessel and the wharf or between the two or more vessels as the case may be, a safety net or other suitable appliance of sufficient design and material as will, in the opinion of the Harbour Master or Berthing Master, prevent persons using such means of passing between the vessel and the wharf or between the two or more vessels as the case may be, in the event of a mishap, falling into the water.

(b) Where a vessel is discharging or loading cargo or is otherwise working at a wharf or alongside another vessel the Master of such vessel shall cause to be suspended and to be kept so suspended to the satisfaction of the Harbour Master or Berthing Master a safety net or save all so placed and of such size and character as will prevent any substance or matter (including coal, coke, ballast, ashes or other refuse) falling into the water.

(c) If any default be made in the due compliance with any provision of this regulation, the Master of the vessel so in default and the owners of such vessel shall be jointly and severally guilty of a breach of these regulations, and also shall be jointly

and severally liable for all loss, damage or injury caused to or suffered by any person by reason of such default.

2. By deleting regulation No. 293 and inserting in lieu thereof a new regulation as follows:—

No. 293.

Garbage, Oil or other Offensive Matter and Ballast—Discharge of into the Harbour Waters.

(a) No person whether from a vessel or otherwise shall by any means whatsoever deposit or permit to fall into the waters of the Inner Harbour any garbage, ashes, mud or other similar matter or cause any offensive matter, including oil, oily water, oil sludge, oil refuse or oily bilge water to flow thereon or shall discharge into such waters any ballast.

(b) No person whether from a vessel or otherwise shall by any means whatsoever deposit or permit to fall into the waters of the Outer Harbour, any garbage, ashes, mud or other refuse, or ballast, or permit or suffer any offensive matter including oil, oily water, oily sludge, oil refuse or oily bilge water to flow or be discharged into the said waters, except at such places in the said Outer Harbour as the Harbour Master shall from time to time direct and with his approval.

(c) Under no circumstances shall any such waste matter aforesaid be discharged from vessels or barges within two miles of the seaward end of the North Mole in any direction.

(d) Any person who in any respect contravenes this regulation shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

3. By repealing regulations Nos. 331 and 332.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 10 of 1944.

Between The Metropolitan and South-Western Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia, Applicant, and the Western Ice Co. (1919), Ltd., Fremantle Cold Storage Co., Ltd., Anchorage Butchers, Ltd., and Cartwright's Dairy and Ice Co., Ltd., Respondents.

WHEREAS an Industrial Dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to declare the said Agreement an Award: Now therefore the Court, having read the certificate of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration issued on the 18th day of July, 1944, under regulation 18 (2) (ca) of the National Security (Economic Organisation) Regulations, and pursuant to section 63 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement".)

1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers engaged as engine-drivers and firemen in the industry of refrigeration, ice-making and cold storage.

2.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be twelve months from the date of commencement hereof.

3.—Area.

This Award shall be limited in its operation to the area comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office at Perth and to the works and undertakings of the Albany Freezing Works, Ltd., at Albany.

4.—Wages.

By Agreement between the parties, or, in default of agreement, by the Board of Reference, any plant may be deleted from or added to the foregoing schedule.

5.—No Reduction.

Nothing in this Award shall in itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker below the rate actually received by him at the date hereof.

6.—Hours.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work.

For the sake of convenience in the rostering of shifts, an eighty-eight (88) hour fortnight may be worked if desired.

7.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of eight hours in any one day shall be deemed overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half. All time worked on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half.

(b) Work done on Christmas Day or Boxing Day or New Year's Day or Labour Day or Good Friday shall be paid for at double time rate, except in connection with repairs to the employer's machinery which has broken down and has caused a stoppage of operations when the rate of time and a-half shall apply to the work done on such days.

8.—Holidays.

(a) Each worker, other than a casual worker, shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' annual leave each year on full pay; or should the period of continuous employment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid holiday pay in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment. Annual leave shall be taken at a time mutually agreed upon between the employer and the worker.

(b) Holidays without deduction of pay shall be limited to twelve days per annum as aforesaid.

(c) If Christmas Day falls on a Sunday, the following Monday shall be kept.

(d) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefits of the holiday clause.

9.—Shift Work.

(a) Where an employee works afternoon or night shift only, or afternoon and night shifts in rotation but does not work day shift at least one week out of three, he shall receive one shilling per shift in addition to the rates set out above.

(b) Where a worker is called upon to work night shift continuously without rotation, such worker shall be paid five per cent. (5%) in addition to the ordinary rate as well as the loading of one shilling (1s.) per shift prescribed in subclause (a) of this clause.

10.—Casual Workers.

A casual worker shall mean and include an employee competent to do the work he is engaged to do who is, without any fault of his own, dismissed or refused work (as it is hereby agreed he may be) before the expiration of six days from and including the date he starts work. Casual workers shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates set out above.

11.—Weekly Engagement.

Except as provided by clause 10 all employment shall be by the week.

12.—Time and Wages Record.

A time record shall be kept by each employer in which shall be entered the names of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received by him each week; the said record shall be open to the inspection of the accredited representative of the Union at any time during the ordinary office hours and he shall be allowed to take necessary extracts therefrom.

13.—Definition.

"Fireman—first class" means a fireman who attends to two or more boilers or two or more suction gas generators or one or more boilers or one or more generators developing 100 i.h.p. in the aggregate.

14.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court hereby appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board of Reference.

(b) The Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one (1) to be nominated by each of the parties.

(c) The Board is hereby assigned the following functions in the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by the Award:—

(i) Classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any machine, occupation, or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award, but so as not to contravene any of the provisions herein;

(ii) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them;

(iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(d) The provisions of regulation 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

15.—Absence through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days (i.e. one week's pay) in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(b) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay under the preceding provision, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

16.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

17.—Date of Commencement of Operation.

This Award shall take effect from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

I certify pursuant to section 63 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, that the foregoing is a copy of the Agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 3 of 1945.

(Registered 8/2/45.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, of Western Australia this fifth day of January, 1945, between the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, hereinafter called the employers, of the one part, and the Coastal Dock, Rivers and Harbour Works Union of Workers, hereinafter called the employees, of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to the patrolmen in the service of the employers, and shall operate over the area comprised within the boundaries of the Port of Fremantle vested in the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners.

2.—Hours of Duty.

(a) The hours of duty shall consist of seven shifts of eight hours each per week.

(b) The rotation and hours of shifts, at both Victoria Quay and North Wharf, shall be as follows:—

Day shift—one man, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.; night shift—two men, midnight to 8 a.m.; afternoon shift—two men, 4 p.m. to midnight.

(c) Employees may be permitted to relieve one another for the convenience of catching trams or trains within a reasonable period (as per transport time-tables) of the starting or finishing time of a shift, provided that the full shift, as herein defined, is at all times maintained.

(d) In special circumstances an employee may where convenient, be permitted to change shift or part of a shift by mutual arrangement with another employee, provided due notice of such desire is given, and provided that the relieving employee will not thereby be caused to be on duty for an excessive period in any one shift.

3.—Engagement and Dismissal.

All regular employees shall be deemed to be engaged upon a monthly basis, and one month's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the services of any employee: Provided that an employee may be instantly dismissed or suspended for insobriety, misconduct or neglect of duty.

4.—Rate of Pay.

Basic Wage . . . £4 19s. 11d. per week.

The rate of pay shall be £7 6s. 2d. per week, which amount shall be computed as follows:—Basic wage, plus three-elevenths and margin over basic wage 19s. per week.

5.—Overtime.

Overtime shall mean all time worked in excess of eight hours in any one shift, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and at double time thereafter: Provided that overtime shall not be payable where such period of eight hours is exceeded owing to the mutual relief arrangements permitted under clause 2, subclauses (c) and (d).

6.—Meals.

Employees shall be granted thirty (30) minutes during each shift, as near as possible to the middle of such shift, for the purpose of having a meal.

7.—Leave.

(a) Employees shall be allowed special leave with pay for one complete day of 24 hours during each week, excepting during such period as the employee shall be on annual or long service leave.

(b) Employees who serve continuously for twelve months shall be granted annual leave on full pay for a continuous period of twenty-nine (29) days. Where the period of service is less than twelve months, but is not less than one month, the period of leave shall be reduced *pro rata* to the period of service. Annual leave shall be taken at the convenience of the employers, and shall be in accordance with a roster to be arranged in January of each year.

8.—Sickness and Accident.

(a) 1. An employee who is incapacitated through sickness or injury, other than that arising out of or in the course of his employment, may be granted sick leave with pay for a period of, or periods not exceeding in the aggregate, four weeks in any year, upon production, within 48 hours of the commencement of any such period of absence, of a medical certificate showing the nature of the illness and the probable duration.

2. Where such incapacity arises through the wilful act or misconduct of the employee, or a medical certificate is not furnished as required, or where the employee has already had sick leave with pay for a period of or periods aggregating four weeks during that year, the employee shall not be entitled to any pay for the period he is absent from duty.

3. Upon the period or periods of absence exceeding four weeks in the case of paragraph (1) hereof, or upon the happening or occurrence of any of the events specified in paragraph (2) hereof, immediately such absence commences, or such event happens or occurs, the contract of service shall be deemed to have been terminated without requiring further notice by the employers, who shall thereby be relieved of any further obligation to the employee: Provided that any

such period of incapacity may at the discretion of the employers be regarded as leave without pay.

(b) An employee who while on duty or acting under the instructions of the employer, receives an injury arising out of or in the course of his employment, or contracts an illness due to the nature of and attributable to such employment and is thereby incapacitated from duty in circumstances which entitle him to the benefits prescribed under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-41, shall be entitled to receive in addition to such benefits a weekly sum equal to the difference between the compensation provided for under that Act and the wages prescribed in this Award from the date of the commencement of his said incapacity up to and including the date of his recovery as certified by his medical attendant, provided that the employer's liability hereunder shall in no case exceed 30 days in respect of each separate injury or illness.

(c) All amounts payable under this clause shall be paid in the usual manner each week.

9.—Long Service Leave.

Employees shall be granted three months' long service leave after each seven (7) years' service, but periods of absence on long service leave shall not count as service qualifying towards the grant of such leave.

10.—Uniforms.

Employees shall be provided with uniforms, consisting of a tunic coat, vest and trousers each eight months and, in addition, there shall be provided, if required:—Each year—one oilskin coat, one cap; each two years—one helmet; each four years—one great-coat. Badges and buttons will be renewed when necessary.

11.—Change Room.

A change room shall be provided at Victoria Quay and at North Wharf, with lockers suitable and high enough to take employees' topcoats, but nothing herein shall prevent the employers from requiring the employees to report at the Victoria Quay office only, when coming on or going off duty, provided that the hours of duty are not thereby exceeded.

12.—First Aid.

Where an employee desires to qualify in first aid, and regularly attends classes of instruction for this purpose during his leisure time, arrangements shall be made, where convenient, for such employee to attend any class that may be held during such time as he should otherwise be on duty.

13.—Casual Employees.

(a) A "Casual" employee means an employee engaged in a temporary or a relieving capacity only, and his engagement shall be by the day, excepting that, where the period of employment exceeds one month, one week's notice shall be given to terminate such engagement.

(b) The rate of pay to casual employees shall be as for regular employees: Provided that where the period of employment does not exceed fourteen consecutive days, such rate shall be increased by ten per cent.

(c) A casual employee shall be entitled to *pro rata* annual leave: Provided that his period of employment exceeds one month, but shall not be entitled to uniform nor to the sickness and accident benefits provided in clause 8.

14.—Board of Reference.

Should any dispute arise between the employers and the employees under this Agreement, the matter shall be referred to a Board of Reference consisting of a representative of the employers, a representative of the employees, and the Registrar of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, who shall act as chairman. The decision of the Board shall be final and binding.

15.—Term.

This Agreement, which shall come into force from 8 a.m., 5th January, 1945, and shall continue for a period of twelve months therefrom, replaces Indus-

trial Agreement No. 6 of 1934 (as amended by No. 23 of 1939 and No. 19 of 1941), made between the herein named parties on the 14th June, 1934.

16.

It is hereby agreed that pursuant to the National Security (Economic Organisation) Regulations, nothing herein contained shall be deemed to increase the rate of remuneration (other than cost of living variations) of any worker covered by this Industrial Agreement from that in force on the 10th February, 1942.
