WESTERN AUSTRALIA, { By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor, and its Dependencies in the Common-[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

[L.S.] wealth of Australia. WHEREAS by section 4 of the Courts of Session Act, 1921, it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclama-tion constitute any magisterial district or two or more districts together a Sessions Division for the purposes of the said Act, may declare the name by which any such Division shall be known, may revoke or vary any such Proclamation, and may abolish any Division; and by section 6 of the said Act it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation establish for any Division named therein a Court of Session and assion a name to named therein a Court of Session and assign a name to named therein a Court of Session and assign a name to the Court and may revoke any proclamation made under the said section 6; and whereas by a Proclamation issued under the said sections 4 and 6 respectively and pub-lished in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of November, 1940, the *Governor inter alia* constituted the Esperance Magisterial District a Sessions Division to be known as Esperance Sessions Division and for such Division established a Court of Session to be known as Esperance Court of Session and to be holden at the Court House at Esperance; and at the same time and by the same Proclamation the Governor constituted the Coolgardie, Dundas, Collier and Hannans Magisterial districts together to be a Sessions Division to be known as Eastern Goldfields Sessions Division and for such Division established a Court of Session to be known as Eastern Goldfields Court of Session and to be holden at the Court House at Kalgoorlie; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to abolish the said Esperance Sessions Division and the said Esperance Court of Sessions Division and the said Esperance Court of Session, and to amend the said Eastern Gold-fields Sessions Division by adding to and including therein the said Esperance Magisterial district: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in overrise of the powers conformed any me by continue. in exercise of the powers conferred on me by sections 4 and 6 of the Courts of Session Act, 1921, do hereby as from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette :-

(a) Abolish the Esperance Sessions Division and the Esperance Court of Session as constituted and estab-lished respectively under and for the purposes of the

said Act by the Proclamation issued thereunder and published in the Government Gazette on the 8th day of November, 1940; and

(b) Constitute the Coolgardie, Dundas, Collier, Han-nans and Esperance Magisterial Districts together to be a Sessions Division for the purposes of the said Act and to be known as the Eastern Districts Sessions Division; and

(c) Establish the Court of Session heretofore estabished and known as the Eastern Goldfields Court of Session and still existing to be by the same name the Court of Session for the Eastern Goldfields Sessions Division as now constituted by this present Proclamation; and

(d) So far as may be necessary or requisite for giv-ing due effect to paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this Proclamation according to the tenour thereof respec-tively, vary and amend the Proclamation heretofore issued under the said Act and published in the *Govern-ment Gazette* on the 8th day of November, 1940, as hereinbefore mentioned.

WHEREAS by section 166 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation temporarily suspend the operations of the said Act, in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed for any shop or shops, either generally or in any specified locality or district: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of

the powers conferred by the said Act, do, by this Proclamation, temporarily suspend the operations of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, for the period the 26th day of March to the 29th day of March, 1945, in-clusive, in so far as the said Act applies to the closing time of shops situated in those districts throughout the State, which would normally observe the workly held State which would normally observe the weekly half holiday during that period between the usual hour of closing of such shops and 6 p.m. on the said days.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 116 of the Fac-tories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that the expression ''Public Holiday'' shall mean certain days therein specified, and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that Saturday the 31st day of March, 1945, shall be a public holiday throughout the State for the purposes of section 116 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, and all shops (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule and registered small shops) shall be closed.

# Native Administration Act, 1905-1941. Reserve for Natives at Katanning. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchelt, TO WIT. K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, Lieutenant-Governor. [L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be reserves for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a reserve for Natives should be declared at Katanning: Now, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an area of 4 acres 2 roods 27 perches, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a reserve for Natives.

#### Schedule.

All that portion of land being Katanning Lot 547 and 777, containing together 4 acres 2 roods 27 perches, starting at the intersection of the south-eastern side of Arnold street with the south-western side of the Katan-Arnold street with the south-western side of the Katan-ning-Pingrup Railway Reserve, and extending  $110^{\circ}$  6', along the latter side, 12 chains 64 9/10 links; thence  $225^{\circ}$  30', 100 links, to the northern side of a one-chain road; thence  $270^{\circ}$  6', along the said side, 16 chains 27 4/10 links, to the south-eastern side of Arnold street aforesaid; and thence  $45^{\circ}$  30', along the said side, 7 chains 16 4/10 links, to the starting point. # PROCLAMATION

VESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. } K.G.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-[L.s.] wealth of Australia. WESTERN

(1) IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in those portions of Western Australian waters described in Schedules A, B and C. hereto, for the term of twelve months from April 1, 1945, inclusive.

(2) In pursuance of the provisions of the section aforesaid I prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in that portion of Western Australian waters described in Schedule D hereto, during the periods commencing at 8 o'clock in the forenoon of Friday in each week and ending at 8 o'clock in the forenoon of the Monday next following for the term of twelve months from April 1, 1945, inclusive.

(3) In pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Act aforesaid I prohibit—(a) The taking of all species of fish by means of nets, known as ''pilehard nets'' and ''whiting nets,'' as defined in paragraphs (c) and (d) respectively of the Proclamation dated October 24, 1940, and published in the *Government Gazette* dated November 1, 1940, in those portions of Western Aus-tralian waters described in Schedule E hereto, from October 1, 1945, to March 31, 1946, both inclusive; (b) The taking of all species of fish by means of nets known as ''garfish nets'' as defined in paragraph (e) of the Proclamation aforesaid, in that portion of West (3) In pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the of the Proclamation aforesaid, in that portion of West-ern Australian waters known as Koombana Bay from August 1, 1945, to March 31, 1946, both inclusive.

#### Schedules.

#### Schedule A.

The whole of the waters of the entrance to Leschenault Intervalue of the waters of the entrance to Lesenenault Inlet upwards from its junction with Koombana Bay and of the waters of Leschenault Inlet (including all tributaries) upwards to a line drawn from Turkey Point to the northernmost end of the Turkey Point channel, and thence to the north-western corner of Leschenault Lot 1.

#### Schedule B.

The whole of the waters of the Collie River and all its tributaries and all that portion of Leschenault Inlet lying within a radius of one-half-mile of the northern-most extremity of Bar Island.

#### Schedule C.

The whole of the coastal waters in the vicinity of Bunbury known as "Hungry Hollow," being those waters lying between the westerly extensions of Clifton street and Beach road, in the municipality of Bunbury, and within a distance measured rectangularly from the foreshore of one-half-mile.

#### Schedule D.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Inlet lying to the north of a line drawn from Turkey Point to the northernmost end of the Turkey Point channel, and thence to the north-eastern corner of Leschenault Lot 1.

#### Schedule E.

The whole of the waters of Koombana Bay and of Leschenault Inlet lying to the north of a line drawn from Turkey Point to the northernmost end of the Turkey Point channel and thence to the north-eastern corner of Leschenault Lot 1.

 WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Shipping and Pilotage Consolidation Ordinance, 1855, that the Governor may by Proclamation from time to time frame, alter, amend or repeal rules and regulations not repugnant to any of the provisions of the said Ordinance to be observed by all masters and commanders of all ships or vessels in any of the ports or harbours of Western Australia and by all persons duly appointed or licensed to act as Harbour Masters or Pilots in such ports or harbours, and may substitute others in their stead but so that all such rules and regulations shall be promulgated by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* at least one month before the same shall take effect, at the expiration of which time the same shall be in full force and effect; and whereas the Governor did by Proclamation dated the 14th day of November, 1917, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of November, 1917, make regulations in accordance with the said Ordinance to have effect in relation to all ports and harbours in the State except Bunbury and Fremantle and further Proclamations have been issued and regulations have since from time to time been made and published amending or varying the first hereinbefore mentioned regulations; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to amend regulation 27 of the said regulations in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Ordinance, do hereby amend the hereinbefore mentioned regulations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of November, 1917, as at present in force in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder; and also do hereby declare that this Proclamation and the amendment and variation hereby made in the said regulations shall come into force one month after the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

#### Schedule.

Regulation 27 (Gazettes 16/11/1917, 7/11/1930 and 7/8/1931) is amended by deleting the whole of paragraph (a) from the further proviso to the said regulation (as inserted by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 7th day of August, 1931).

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from January 1, 1945, until December 31, 1947, inclusive.

#### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA { By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 25 of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1910-1937, as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938, that the Governor may by Proclamation declare any article to be a poison within the meaning of the said Act, and may revoke or vary any Proclamation made under the said section by a subsequent Proclamation; and whereas the Governor has under and in accordance with the said section from time to time proclaimed certain articles to be poisons as aforesaid; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to add to such poisons declared as aforesaid: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred upon me in that behalf by section 25 of the said Act do hereby declare that the article specified in the Schedule hereunder shall be deemed a poison within the meaning of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1910-1937, and that the name thereof shall be inserted in Part 11 of the Fifth Schedule to the said Act.

#### Schedule.

The description of the article declared aforesaid as a poison and to be inserted in Part 11 of the Fifth Schedule to the Act is as follows:—Ortho-dichlorobenzene and preparations or solutions thereof.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIL. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor, and its Dependencies in the Common-[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943, that for the purposes of the said Act, the word "Town" or "Townsite" means and in-cludes *inter alia* any land (including privately owned subdivided land) which the Governor may see fit, as he is hereby empowered, to declare by Proclamation to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act; and whereas all that land situate within the Belmont and whereas all that land situate within the Belmont Park Road District, and more particularly described, defined and delineated in the Schedule hereto, is land which the Governor may by virtue of section 5 of the said Act declare by Proclamation to be a Town or Town-site for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in everying of the purpose conferenced when we be the action exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Act, and for all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do hereby declare that all that land situate within the Belmont Park Road District, and more particularly described, defined and delineated in the Schedule hereto shall be townsite to be known as "Belmont Park" within the meaning and for the purposes of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943.

#### Schedule.

All that land comprising the Townsite of Belmont Park inclusive of all that piece of land being an extension thereof as described as follows:-All that portion of land, bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the south-eastern side of Great Eastern highway with the south-western side of Hardeys road, Belmont Park, the south-western side of Hardeys road, Belmont Park, and extending south-easterly, along the latter side to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the south-eastern side of Wallace street; thence north-easterly, to and along the said side, to the south-western side of Leake street; thence north-westerly, along the said side to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the south-eastern side of Mural street; thence north westerly of the south-eastern side of Mural street; thence north-casterly, to and along the said side to the south-western side of Epsom avenue; thence south-easterly along the said side to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the normal south-eastern side of Alex-andra street; thence north-easterly, to and along the said side, to the south-western side of Kanowna avenue; thence south-easterly, along the said side, to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the south-eastern side of Second street; thence north-easterly, to and along the said side to the south-western side of Coolgardie avenue; thence south-easterly, along the said side, to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the south-eastern side of Henderson avenue; thence north-easterly, to and along the said side, and continuing to the north-eastern boundary of Swan Location 28; thence north-westerly, along the said boundary, to the north-western side of Great Eastern highway aforesaid; thence south-westerly, along the said side, to the northern side of Mathieson road; thence westerly, along the said side, to the eastern side of Ford street; thence northerly, along the said side and onwards to low water mark of the left bank of the Swan River; thence westerly, downwards, along the said low water mark, to the eastern side of the Belmont Railway Reserve; thence southerly, along the said side to the north-western side of Mathieson road aforesaid; thence south-westerly, along the said side to the north-eastern side of Hardeys road aforesaid; thence north-western side of Nardeys road alore-said; thence north-westerly, along the said side to the north-western side of Northey street; thence south-westerly, along the said side to the western side of Grandstand street; thence southerly, to and along the western side of Stoneham street to the north-western side of Great Eastern highway aforesaid; there south-westerly and southerly, along the said side, to the northeastern side of Abernethy road; thence north-westerly, along the said side and onwards to low water mark of the left bank of the Swan River aforesaid; thence southerly, south-westerly and westerly, downwards, along the said low water mark to the north-western corner of Swan Location 34; thence south-easterly, along the south-western boundary of the said location to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the southeastern side of Wright street; thence north-easterly, to

and along the said side to the north-eastern side of Acton avenue; thence north-westerly, along the said side, to the south-eastern side of Francisco street; thence north-easterly, along the said side and onwards to the north-eastern side of Abernethy road aforesaid; thence north-westerly, along the said side, to the south-eastern side of Barker street; thence north-easterly, along the said side, to the south-western side of Hehir street; thence south-easterly, along the said side to the south-eastern side of Peet street; thence north-easterly, along the said side and onwards to the north-eastern side of Belgravia street; thence north-westerly, along the said side, to the south-eastern side of Barker street afore-said; thence north-easterly, along the said side and onwards to the north-eastern side of Daly street; thence north-westerly, along the said side, to the south-eastern side of Great Eastern highway aforesaid; and thence north-easterly, along the said side, to the starting point.

1. Regulation 4A in Part 1 is amended by adding thereto a paragraph as follows:---(3) Laundries facilities shall be contained in a building constructed, as to the walls thereof, with brick, concrete, or wood and iron, and, as to the roof, with tiles, corrugated galvanised iron or other impervious material provided with spouting and down piping. The floor of such building shall be constructed of concrete four The floor of inches thick rendered to a smooth surface with 2 to 1 cement mortar and graded 1 in 20 and shall have an area of not less than 50 square feet. The walls of such building shall be not less than eight feet high from the floor level.
