NATIONAL SECURITY (SUPPLEMENTARY) REGULATIONS.

State of Western Australia—Liquor Control (Armistice Celebrations) Order.

I, JOHN COLLINGS WILLCOCK, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, acting in exercise of the powers conferred by regulation 45 of the National Security (Supplementary) Regulations, hereby make the following order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Liquor Control (Armistice Celebrations) Order.

2. This Order shall apply throughout the State of Western Australia.

3. This Order shall be read in conjunction and as supplementary to the Act, and the Intoxicating Liquor (Restriction) Orders and so that where there exists or appears to exist any inconsistency between any provision of this Order and any provision of the Act or of the Intoxicating Liquor (Restriction) Orders, the provision of this Order shall prevail and have effect accordingly.

4. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires "The Act" means the Licensing Act, 1911-1939, of Western Australia. "Armistice celebration period" as regards a licensee or the secretary or other person in charge of a registered club means any hours declared to constitute an armistice celebration period by notice to that licensee or that secretary or other person aforesaid given under this Order. "The Intoxicating Liquor (Restriction) Orders" means and includes all the Intoxicating Liquor (Restriction) Orders heretofore or hereafter made under regulation 45 of the National Security (Supplementary) Regulations in relation to the said State of Western Australia and in force during the period of the operation of this Order. "Licensee," "licensed premises," "intoxicating liquor" and "registered club" shall have the same meanings respectively as those given to such expressions in sections five and one hundred and eighty respectively of the Act.

5. (1) The Premier of the State, upon receiving from any source information that fighting between Great Britain and any country with which Great Britain is at war is about to cease or has ceased, may by notice given to any licensee and to the secretary or other person in charge of any registered club declare that the whole of any specified day or days or any specified hours of any specified day or days will constitute an armistice celebration period for the purposes of this Order.

(2) Any such notice—

(a) may be given to any licensee or to the secretary or other person in charge of any registered club on behalf of the Premier of the State by any member of the police force of the State or other person authorised by the Commissioner of Police of the State, or by the said Premier.

(b) may be given in writing or orally or by a general broadcast through any wireless broadcasting station.

(c) if it is given by a person other than the Premier of the State and purports or is expressed to be given on behalf of that Premier, shall be deemed to be given on behalf of that Premier unless the contrary is shown.

6. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Act or in the Intoxicating Liquor (Restriction) Orders:—

(1) A licensee shall not during an armistice celebration period—

(a) keep his licensed premises open for the sale of intoxicating liquor; or
(b) permit any bar room, lounge, or other place usually used as a place in which intoxicating liquor may be supplied for consumption, on his licensed premises to be unlocked; or

(c) sell, supply or deliver any intoxicating liquor; or

(d) permit any intoxicating liquor to be carried away from his licensed premises or conveyed by any person from his licensed premises to any person outside those premises; or

(e) permit any intoxicating liquor to be drunk on his licensed premises.

(2) (i) During an armistice celebration period the secretary or other person in charge of a registered club shall not—

(a) permit or suffer the club to be open for the sale of intoxicating liquor; or

(b) permit or suffer any bar room, lounge or other place usually used as a place in which intoxicating liquor may be supplied for consumption in the registered club to be unlocked; or

(c) permit or suffer any intoxicating liquor to be supplied or sold or delivered to any person; or

(d) permit or suffer any intoxicating liquor to be carried away from the registered club or conveyed by any person from the registered club to any person outside the registered club; or

(e) permit or suffer any intoxicating liquor to be drunk in the registered club.

(ii) If any contravention of this paragraph is committed in any registered club, the secretary or other person in charge of such registered club shall be deemed to be the occupier of the said club for the purpose of paragraph (7) of regulation 45 of the National Security (Supplementary) Regulations.

7. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Act or in the Intoxicating Liquor (Restriction) Orders, a person shall not during an armistice celebration period—

(a) purchase or obtain or attempt to purchase or obtain any intoxicating liquor at any licensed premises, or in any registered club; or

(b) carry any intoxicating liquor away from any licensed premises or registered club or convey any intoxicating liquor from any licensed premises or registered club to any person outside those licensed premises or that club; or

(c) drink any intoxicating liquor in any licensed premises or registered club; or

(d) be present in any bar room, lounge or other place usually used as a place in which intoxicating liquor may be supplied for consumption, on any licensed premises, or in any registered club.

8. The powers conferred on the Premier of the State, and members of the police force and other authorised persons by this Order may be exercised from time to time whenever fighting is about to cease or ceases between Great Britain and any country with which Great Britain is at war; and if the Premier of the State considers that circumstances justify him in doing so, he may declare more than one armistice celebration period in respect of the cessation of fighting between Great Britain and any country.

9. The Commissioner of Police and every member of the police force of the State is hereby authorised and directed to do the following things during an armistice celebration period for the purpose of procuring the due observance of the provisions contained in clauses six and seven of this Order, that is to say:—

(a) Direct the licensee of any licensed premises, and, in the event of a licensee refusing or failing to comply with such direction, to close such licensed premises himself;

(b) Direct the secretary or other person in charge of a registered club, and in the event of a secretary or other person aforesaid refusing or failing to comply with such direction, to close such registered club for the sale of intoxicating liquor himself;

(c) Seize and retain during the continuance of an armistice celebration period any intoxicating liquor which any person has in his possession in or about or in proximity to any licensed premises or registered club in circumstances which justify a reasonable belief that such person is acting in contravention of this Order; and

(d) Take or use such other reasonable measures (including such force as may be necessary) which in the opinion of the said Commissioner of Police or member of the police force aforesaid are requisite to obtain the due observance of the provisions of this Order by all persons to whom the same are applicable.

10. This Order shall operate and have effect as from the date of the publication of the same in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia.

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1943; THE TOWN PLANNING ACT, 1928-1944.

Perth Road Board—By-laws Classifying Portions of Osborne Ward.

THE Perth Road Board under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943, and the Town Planning Act, 1928-1944, and all other powers enabling it doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. That portion of Osborne Ward of the Perth Road Board comprising portion of Perthshire Locations Aq and Au and being lots 1 to 32 inclusive on plan 5993 the subject of Certificate of Title Volume 1077, Folio 18, is classified into districts as hereinafter set out.

2. Lots 3 to 25 inclusive and lot 32 of the above lots are hereby classified as a residential district.

3. No building or structure shall be hereafter erected, altered or used in such residential district except for the purpose of a private dwelling house for not more than one family or for a Road Board building or for a house of worship.

4. Lots 1 and 2 and lots 26 to 31 inclusive of the above lots are hereby classified as a business and residential district.

5. No building or structure shall be hereafter erected, altered or used in such business and residential district for any purpose other than—

(a) any of the purposes permitted by by-law 3 above in the residential district above mentioned, or

(b) any of the following purposes—(i) a shop; (ii) an office, a bank, or an hotel; (iii) a work room or work rooms connected with a retail business in which not more than 50 per cent. of the total floor area of such business is used as a work room or work rooms; (iv) a garage or service station and the necessary workshops and stores connected therewith; (v) a theatre, public hall, cinema, club, or place of amusement; (vi) such other purposes as the Board may determine but not including any industry, industrial purpose factory, manufactory or noxious trade.

6. Any person who shall erect, alter or use any building or structure in contravention of any of these by-laws shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

7. Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of these by-laws shall be made not later than six months from the date on which these by-laws are first published in the *Government Gazette*.
