AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, Perth, this 18th day of April, 1945, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Health Act, 1911-1942, as amended by the Health Act Amendment Act, 1944.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Health Act, 1911-1942, as amended by the Health Act Amendment Act, 1944, enacts that the provisions of Division 3 of Part V. of the Principal Act shall operate and have effect in certain specified districts, and also in the health district of any other local authority which the Governor may from time to time declare: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that the said provisions of Division 3 of Part V. of the said Act shall operate and have effect in the Health District of the Guildford Local Health Authority, a local authority within the meaning of the said Act.

Constitution of the Three Springs Health District under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-44.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-44, that the Lieutenant-Governor may constitute any portion of the State, not being a Municipal District, to be a Health District, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the Order; and whereas, by Order in Council dated 28th May, 1929, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 31st May, 1929, all that land contained within the circumference of a circle, the radius of which is half a mile from the Three Springs Railway Station, was declared to be the Three Springs Health District; and whereas it is desired to extend the boundaries of the Three Springs Health District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby cancel the Order in Council dated 28th May, 1929 and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 31st May, 1929, and does hereby declare that all that

land embraced within the boundaries of the Three Springs Road Board shall be the Health District to be known as the Three Springs Health District under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-44.

Local Authorities (Reserve Funds) Act, 1942.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 404/43.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Local Authorities (Reserve Funds) Act, 1942, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Honorary Minister but subject to the requirements of the proviso to the said section, by Order in Council, authorise a local authority to establish during the present war and to maintain a reserve fund for the purpose of accumulating therein any surplus of ordinary revenue of the Local Authority and of applying the moneys in such reserve fund and any income or profit derived from the investment of moneys in such reserve fund in the carrying out, after the cessation of the present war, of works and undertakings authorised by the Local Government Act of the Local Authority which the Local Authority may not be able conveniently to carry out, during the present war; and whereas it is desirable that such reserve fund shall be established by the Local Authorities as set forth in the Schedule hereto: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting pursuant to the recommendation of the Honorary Minister and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, after being satisfied as required by the proviso to section 4 of the said Act, doth hereby authorise the Local Authorities as set forth in the Schedule hereto, to establish and maintain a reserve fund.

Wyalkatchem Road Board—Extension of the Second Schedule of the Act to portion of the Wyalkatchem Road District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.  
NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection 1 of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process of proceedings, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer, or any of the farmer's assets whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not during the operation of such Stay Order; provided that by leave of a judge any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

By inserting after regulation 147 the following new regulation:—

## No. 148.

## Handling Charges on Bagged Wheat.

Subject as hereinafter provided the rates prescribed hereunder shall be payable in respect of the handling of bagged wheat, that is to say:—

	Per bag.
(a) Receiving, including the unloading of railway trucks and stacking where required, the Trust giving a receipt for number of bags only . . . . .	1.275d.
(b) Delivering from stack to vessel for loading by means of gantry loaders, vessel's own gear or crane . . . . .	1.0d.
(c) Delivering from stack to the platform of road vehicles, including the customary single bag weighing . . . . .	2.0d.
(d) Delivering from stack to railway wagons, including stowing but without weighing . . . . .	2.50d.
(e) Re-stacking or re-handling, for each service . . . . .	1.25d.
(f) Handling to and from scales for single bag weighing during the course of shipment (including the weighing of the bags, together with a list of weights but not a receipt for weight) . . . . .	1.25d.
(g) Discharging direct from railway wagons and slinging or loading on to gantry loaders . . . . .	0.75d.

Provided that there shall be added to the handling charges assessed in accordance with the respective rates so specified, an amount equal to thirty-five per centum (35%) of such assessment.

5. Any goat, whether registered and wearing the prescribed disc or unregistered, found at large within the Townsite of Norseman may be seized, impounded or destroyed by any officer or person under the instructions of the Board.

6. The owner or keeper of any goat or goats so seized, impounded, or destroyed shall forfeit a penalty of two pounds for every goat so found at large, in addition to all costs and expenses incurred in so seizing, impounding or destroying such goat or goats.

7. The Board reserves the right to restrict the number of goats to be kept by any one householder within the Townsite of Norseman and to refuse registration accordingly.

8. The Board may at any time refuse the registration of any male goat or goats, unless proof is given to the satisfaction of the Board that the same is or are required for stud purposes.

Prohibition and regulation of the erection and use of Buildings, Advertising Hoardings, and Structures for advertising purposes, clause 6 the Second Schedule Town Planning and Development Act No. 39, 1928, and section 201, sub-section 59, of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1942.

1. The use of buildings, advertising hoardings or other structures for advertising purposes is prohibited within the area of the Bassendean Road District, except as provided in these by-laws.

2. The erection or maintenance of any advertising hoardings or structures for advertising purposes on or over or near to any public roads or footpaths within the said Road District is prohibited except as provided in by-law 4.

3. Provided that the prohibition in by-law 1 shall not apply to:—

(a) professional business or trade signs or plates erected on the premises wherein the services advertised are available or practised;

(b) signs or structures on vacant land or premises indicating that such is to let or for sale or for lease;

(c) signs or structures indicating the trade or calling of the occupant;

(d) signs or structures indicating goods, wares or services available in the premises on which the advertisement appears.

4. Any advertising hoardings or structure for advertising purposes erected over any public roadway or footway shall:—

(i) be put up or maintained only with the written consent of the Road Board by resolution;

(ii) bear the name and trade or calling or the profession or business to which it applies;

(iii) be erected on or attached to the awning of the building or the facade or side of the building in which the business trade or calling is conducted;

(iv) be of no greater length than 10 feet or a greater depth than 2 feet and shall have a clearance for the whole of its length above any public footpath or public road of not less than 8 feet 6 inches;

(v) be erected at right-angles to the building or awning to which it is attached.

5. Where an advertising hoarding or structure for advertising purposes has been authorised, or licensed by the Road Board under by-law 4 any contravention of the conditions upon which any license is granted, such license or permission is thereby cancelled and the contravener liable to the penalty described in these by-laws.

6. If any person shall either by act or omission contravene any of these by-laws he shall be guilty of an offence under these by-laws and on conviction for such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.
