WHEREAS by section 45 of the Health Act, 1911-1944 it is provided that a local authority, in the exercise of its powers conferred by Part 3 of the said Act may make and levy rates of different amounts in respect of porand levy its district, defined for that purpose by Proclamation: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation define the following portions of the Brookton Road Board Health District wherein rates of different amounts in respect of the said portions of such district may be levied—(a) Brookton Central Ward, (b) Aldersyde Townsite, (c) Kweda Townsite and District Generally.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any portion of this State, not being a municipal district, a health district with such bound-daries and by such names as may be specified in the Order, and may abolish any such district, or alter the boundaries of any such district; and whereas by Order in Council dated the 28th January, 1913, as published in the Government Gazette on the 31st January, 1913, the whole of the Cue-Day Dawn Road District was declared a Health District; and whereas by Order in Council dated the 15th September, 1915, and published in the Government Gazette on the 17th September, 1915, an area included in the circumference of a circle, the radius of which is one mile and the centre the Pinnacles radius of which is one mile and the centre the Pinnacles
Post Office, was excluded from the Cue-Day Dawn Health Post Office, was excluded from the Cue-Day Dawn Health District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, doth hereby reinclude in the Cue-Day Dawn Health District all that area within the circumference of a circle the radius of which is one mile and the centre the Pinnacles Post Office.

HEALTH ACT, 1911-1944

Midland Junction Municipality-Resolution.

WHEREAS by section 321 of the Health Act, 1911-44, it is provided that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a local authority under the provisions of the said Act; and that a local authority may of its own motion by resolution, adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws; and whereas Model By-laws have been prepared in accordance with the provision of the said section and published in the Government Gazette on the 8th day of April, 1927; 20th October, 1933; 5th October, 1934; 1st February, 1935; 12th February, 1937; 2nd July, 1937; 22nd April, 1938; 2nd March, 1939, 20th Santamber, 1939, 18th July 3rd March, 1939; 29th September, 1939; 18th July, 1941; 30th April, 1943; and the 10th day of December, 1943, and were reprinted in consolidated form in the Government Gazette on the 4th day of December, 1944: now therefore it is resolved and determined by the Midland Junction Municipal Council, being a local authority within the meaning of the said Act, that the whole of such Model By-laws be adopted, together with Model By-law prepared and published in the Government Gazette on the 26th day of January, 1945, and together also with amendments and modifications as contained in the Schedule hereto, to be the by-laws for the Health District of Midland Junction.

Schedule of Amendments and Modifications to Model By-laws referred to above.

PART 1.—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS.

1. By-law 4 is amended by deleting the word "privy" wherever occurring in this by-law and substituting therefore the words "sanitary convenience."

2. By the addition of a by-law to be read as by-law No. 11A of Part 1, as follows:—11A. The owner of any premises from which any sanitary service is effeeted shall, if a charge is not fixed by contract and collected by a contractor under the provisions of section 94 of the Health Act, 1911-44, pay to the local health authority in advance, the charges specified in Schedule B hereto. And by the addition of a Schedule to be read as Schedule B at the end of Part 1, as fol-

Schedule "B."

(a) For the removal of each sanitary pan and replacing it by a clean pan, at per pan-2/9 per month, or part thereof.

(b) For the removal of trade and domestic refuse at per load of two cubic yards-10s. At per load of four cubic feet or part thereof-6d.

(c) For the removal and disposal of each carcase of a horse, ox, or cow-£1.

(d) For the removal and disposal of each carcase of a calf, sheep, or goat—5s.

(e) For the removal and disposal of each carcase of

a dog, cat, or other animal—2s. 6d.

(f) For the removal of liquid refuse and foul liquids

—1s. per 10 gallons for the first 50 gallons; from 51 to 100 gallons 5s.: from 101 to 200 gallons 7s. 6d., and each additional 100 gallons or part thereof 3s. 6d.

3. By-law 12 is amended as follows:—
(i) By inserting in clause (a) after the word "The" first occurring in the first line the words "owner or."

- (ii) By adding new clauses after clause (b), to stand as (c) and (d) as follows:—(c) Such receptacle as provided for in paragraph (a) of the by-law shall be provided by the local authority at the expense of the owner or occupier: Provided that, on receipt of the written application of any occupier, the local authority may dispense with such occupier procuring such receptacles from such local authority, and may allow such tacles from such local authority, and may allow such occupier to provide such bin or receptacle as may suit his own requirements, subject to the condition that such bin or receptacle, so provided shall be approved by an inspector. (d) Where any house, building, or premises is occupied by two (2) or more tenants, the owner shall, when so directed by an inspector, provide a separate receptacle for each separate tenancy.
- Part 1 is amended by adding a new by-law to be read as by-law 14A.

Persons Authorised to Empty Receptacles.

No person other than an employee of the local 14A. authority or a contractor licensed by the local authority shall remove the whole or any part of the contents of any receptacle provided for nightsoil, urine, liquid waste, or house refuse: Provided that, on receipt of written application from the occupier of any premises, the local authority shall permit such occupier to dispose of his own house refuse (except nightsoil, urine, or liquid waste) subject to the condition that the means of disposed of such refuse shell he specified in such applications. posal of such refuse shall be specified in such application and is approved by an inspector.

Whenever such permission has been granted, occupier shall dispose of such refuse at least weekly, or so much more frequently as an Inspector may direct, by the means specified and to the satisfaction of the inspector: Provided further that such permit may be varied

or cancelled from time to time.

5. By adding the words "or trade" after the word "domestic" in the second line of by-law 21 of Part 1.

6. By inserting the words "owner or" before the word "occupier" in the first line of by-law 23.

By adding to subparagraph (a) of paragraph (1)

of by-law 23 the following words:—

"The owner or occupier executing any of the works in this by-law specified, and also any person actually carrying out such work on his behalf, shall be responsible for the submission of the aforesaid plan for approval. No such work or works shall be commenced until such approval has been obtained."

8. By adding a paragraph after paragraph 1 of by-law 23, Part 1, to be read as paragraph 1A, as fol-

lows:-

1A. By discharging into a french drain, which shall

comply with the following conditions:—

(a) A sketch plan showing the design, situation, and construction together with the connections with such french drain shall be submitted to and approved in writing by an inspector.

(b) It shall be constructed of agricultural drain pipes of not less than 4 inch diameter laid in a straight line with open joints and completely surrounded with not less than 9 inches of broken blue metal of not less than

3-inch gauge, or with other approved material.

(c) The house fittings shall be to the satisfaction

of the inspector and each such fitting shall be discharged over an open gully provided with a water-sealed trap. A grease intercepting trap of approved design and dimensions shall be installed at such premises as is considered necessary by the inspector and shall be situated where directed by the inspector.

(d) The dimensions of the trench in which the drain

(d) The dimensions of the trench in which the drain is laid shall be determined by an inspector.

(e) The french drain to be ventilated by means of a four-inch diameter galvanised iron pipe erected vertically, carried up to a height of not less than eight feet, or if the french drain is within twelve feet of the wall of the house, the longer pipe shall be carried up at least one foot above the eaves of each house. (f) Whenever ordered by an inspector such french

drain shall be emptied, cleansed, and disinfected in such manner and within such time as is specified in the

requisition.

By adding after the number (1) (1A) in by-law

23 (3) Part 1.

10. By adding the words "A grease intercepting trap of approved design and dimensions shall be installed at such premises as is considered necessary by the inspector and shall be situated where directed by the inspector' after the word "trap" in by-law 23 (1) (c), of Part 1.

11. By adding the words "or owner" after the word "occupier" in the first line of by-law 26 of Part 1.

12. By deleting the word "dwelling" in the second line of by-law 29 (b) of Part 1.

13. By adding the words "or owner of any dead animal" after the word "animal" in the first line of by-law 30 of Part 1.

14. By inserting a new subparagraph in Part 1, to be known as subparagraph 41 (e) as follows:—
41. (e) Where any house is not provided with an ample supply of clean wholesome water, the owner of the premises shall cause such house to be properly provided with a supply, either by connecting to any existing water main, constructing a well, or providing suitable rainwater tanks, such work to be carried out to the satisfaction of the inspector.

(c) the premises are adequately ventilated by direct communication to the outer air.

4. No such license shall be granted in respect of private premises unless the site thereof is approved by the local authority or if the same are within 20 feet of any dwellinghouse.

ings and other public buildings.

4. The erection of buildings for or the carrying on of noxious trades (as described in the Health Act) are prohibited within the area described in the First Schedule hereunder.

Tenement houses and flats or any building called or let or used as a flat shall be erected on an area of not less than one acre. The total floor area of any not less than one acre. tenement house or building containing flats shall not exceed half the area of the land or lot on which such building is erected. Each flat or tenement shall be selfcontained, with a separate entrance, and with separate bathroom, kitchen, wash-house and sanitary convenience for each and every flat or tenement.

Within the business and shopping area as defined in the Second Schedule hereunder, no building shall be erected or added to or extended unless the new structures are in brick, stone or concrete.

The industrial area is defined in the No industrial building shall be Schedule hereunder. erected or factory or industrial building shall be erected or factory or industry erected or conducted within the area of the First Schedule hereunder. Provided that this by-law shall not apply to factories or industries established on the date of the gazettal of the by-law and provided that where any such factory or industry within the area of the First Schedule ceases to be used or carried on for a period of six months or over, its recommencement or re-opening or use after the expiration of such period is prohibited under this by-law.

Within the area of the First Schedule hereunder the erection and maintenance of any advertising device, advertisement hoarding or structure for advertising purposes is prohibited, provided that this by-law shall not apply to signs indicating professions, names, trades or callings exhibited on the land or buildings on or in which such profession, trade or calling is conducted.

9. The minimum area on which a dwelling or shop with dwelling attached may be erected is 6,000 square

feet.

Any person who shall erect any building or struc-10. ture or who shall structurally alter any building or maintain any structure or building in contravention of these by-laws shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.
