WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, that "Vermin" means and includes any animal, bird or insect mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act and such other animals, birds or insects the names of which the Governor may by proclamation add to the said Schedule and that any proclamation whereby the names of other animals, birds or insects are added to the said Schedule may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State to be defined by the proclamation; and whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient that the bird of the parrot or cockatoo

species "Kokatoe Rosiecapilla" commonly known as "Galah" shall be vermin for the purposes of the said Act within the boundaries of the Dalwallinu Vermin district: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act do by this proclamation add to the Third Schedule to the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, the name of the bird of the parrot or cockatoo species "Kokatoe Rosiecapilla" commonly known as "Galah," and declare that this proclamation shall apply and have effect only in that portion of the State which is comprised within the boundaries of the Dalwallinu Vermin district as constituted under the said Act.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1939, it is made lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve No. 22480 should vest in and be held by the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board in trust for the purpose of Recreation: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board in trust for the purpose aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1941.

Harvey No. 3 Irrigation District.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 8/39.

WHEREAS by the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1941, it is provided that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister acting with the advice of the Commissioners, vary or amend any of the provisions of any previous Orders relating to any district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council on the recommendation of the Minister acting with the advice of the Commissioners, doth hereby vary and amend the Harvey No. 3 Irrigation District by extension of boundaries to include the whole of the land described in the Schedule hereto.

#### Schedule.

(Part II. (1945).)

All that portion of land, bounded by lines starting from the southern corner of Harvey Agricultural Area Lot 153, and extending 92° 0', 44 chains; thence 75° 0', 23 chains; thence 85° 0', 23 chains; thence about 58° 38', about 16 chains 28 links, to the south-easternmost corner of Murray Location 259; thence about 102° 20', about 22 chains 80 links, to the north-western corner of Wellington Location 363; thence 95° 0', 33 chains; thence 75° 30', 30 chains; thence about 155° 17', about 57 chains 75 links, to the north-eastern corner of Murray Location 545; thence about 151° 53', about 26 chains, to the south-western corner of location 855; thence 136° 27', 25 chains; thence about 125° 28', about 29 chains, to the western boundary of location 1170; thence southerly, 15 chains, to the south-western corner of the said location; thence 120° 14', 37 chains; thence 138° 45', 14 chains; thence about 97° 30', about 31 chains, to the eastern boundary of late 3139; thence southerly, 33 chains, to the south-eastern corner of the said reserve; thence about 110° 38', about 127 chains, to the south-westernmost corner of Wellington Location 1261; thence about 113° 54', about 191 chains 75 links to the easternmost south-eastern corner of location 2973; thence about 176° 34', about 150 chains 57 links, to a one mile survey post near a north-western corner of timber lease 261/113; thence south, about 86 chains 50 links, to a surveyed line; thence 207° 18', 126 chains 18 links; thence 252° 30', 146 chains; thence about 257° 30' about 152 chains, to the north-eastern corner of location 717; thence westerly, and southerly, along boundaries of the said location, to a south-eastern corner of late 4210; thence westerly, along the southernmost boundary of the said reserve, 27 chains 50 links; thence south 51 chains 50 links, to a point situate on the northern boundary of location 716; thence 229° 30', about 56 chains 28 links, to the north-easternmost corner of location 1760; thence about 203° 38', about 103 chains 75 links, to the south-western corner of location 2260; thence about 213° 44', about 64 chains 50 links, to a post situate on the intersection of the eastern boundary of Korijekup Estate Lot 59 with the northern boundary of the irrigation supply channel reserve; thence south to the northern side of the north supply channel; thence generally westerly, and northerly, along the said side, crossing Weekes Brook, Clarke Brook, Logue Brook, Wagerup Brook, Bancells Brook and Yalup Brook, to the northern bank of the last-mentioned; thence generally westerly, along the said bank, to the western side of the South-Western Railway Reserve; thence northerly and north-easterly, along the said side, to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the western boundary of Harvey Agricultural Area Lot 153 aforesaid; and thence northerly, to the starting point, as shown in red on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 30394.

Where the foregoing boundaries abut or cross the boundaries of the Harvey Irrigation No. 1 District Extension as gazetted on page 236 of the *Government Gazette* of March 12th, 1943; or on the boundaries of the Waroona Irrigation District Part 2 as gazetted on pages 346 and 347 of the *Government Gazette* of April 9th, 1943, the description above given shall be taken to be the amended Common boundaries of such Districts.

The Water Boards Act, 1904-1942.

Collie Water Area.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 36/41; Ex. Co. No. 1226.

WHEREAS by section 40 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-42, it is enacted that subject to the provisions of the said Act a Water Board shall have power to construct water works for the purposes of the said Act; and whereas it is provided by section 41 of the said Act (as amended by the Water Boards Act Amendment Act, 1937), that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from the operation of certain sections of the said Act; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reticulation works not exceeding 8 inches in diameter and not exceeding a cost of £500 in relation to such reticulation work to be constructed hereafter in the Collie Water Area shall be exempted from the operation of the said sections of the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and of all other

powers in this behalf enabling him doth hereby exempt from the operations of sections 41, 42, 43, 44 and 45 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1942, all reticulation works not exceeding 8 inches in diameter and not exceeding a cost of £500 in relation to such reticulation work which the Minister, under section 52 of the said Act, may hereafter from time to time find it necessary to carry out, either alone or in connection with other water works in the course of exercising the powers conferred upon Water Boards by section 40 of the said Act.

Road Districts Act, 1919-1943.

Rockingham Road Board—Increase in Membership.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 722/27.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 20 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943, the Governor may by Order in Council declare from time to time the number of members to constitute a Road Board and may also determine the number of members for each Ward; and under section 14 of the said Act the Governor may on a change being made under the said Act in the number of members of a road board declare and direct whether a new election of members shall be held for any district or any ward thereof, and if so, when such election shall be held; and whereas it is desirable to increase the number of members of the Rockingham Road Board to nine in lieu of eight and to allocate the extra member to the Town Ward, and also to hold an election to fill the extra seat on the Board allocated to the Town Ward of the District: Now, therefore, His Excellency, the Lieutenant-Governor, under the provisions of the said Act by and with the advice of the Executive Council and all other powers enabling him in this behalf doth hereby declare that the number of members of the Rockingham Road Board shall be nine and doth determine that the number of members for each Ward of the district shall be as follows:—Town Ward—3 members, Safety Bay Ward—2 members, Central Ward—2 members, East Ward—2 members, and doth declare and direct that a new election shall be held for the Town Ward to elect the extra member allocated thereto and that such election shall be held on Saturday the twenty-fourth day of November, 1945; and doth also direct that no new election in respect of the offices of the existing members shall be held by reason of such increase of members.

Plantagenet Road District—Redivision into Wards.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 907/26.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of section 8 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943, doth hereby redivide the Plantagenet Road District by—1. The abolition of the existing East Ward; and 2. The creation of two new wards, namely—Woogenellup and East described in Schedule hereto.

#### Schedule.

##### Woogenellup Ward.

Bounded on the north by the north boundary of the Plantagenet Road District.

On the westward by the eastern boundary of the North Ward. By the north boundary of Plantagenet Location 1103, the west boundaries of said location and locations 1505, 2413, 1153, 1909, 1910, 1084, 881 and 1805 and by the north boundaries of locations 1805 and 881 and by the Railway Reserve to Moorilup, thence by a line extending northward to a point situated about 64 chains eastward of the north-east corner of location 3635, thence eastward for a distance of about 25 chains and northward for a distance of about 210 chains to the north boundary of the district.

On the southward by the west boundary of Plantagenet Location 1103 and by its south boundary; thence by the eastern side of the Great Southern Railway Reserve and along the south boundaries of location 1272, 906 and 3950 and the west, north and east bound-

daries of location 499 and the south boundaries of locations 3960 and 431 and to and along a surveyed line to the west boundary of location 3335 and by said west boundary and the north boundary of said location and by the west boundary of location 1041 and by part of the south and the west boundary of location 1620 and by the north-western boundary of location 3370; thence north through reserve No. 21428 to the prolongation west of a north boundary of location 45 thence east to and along the said prolongation and north boundary; thence north along a west boundary of said location and east along its north boundary and by its east boundary and south boundary and by the east boundary of location 3370 and by part of the east boundary of location 4088 and along a surveyed line to the prolongation south of the west boundary of location 2661; thence north to and along its west boundary and by its north boundary and by part of the west boundary of location 5069 and by the prolongation of same north for a distance of about fifty chains; thence extending east for a distance of about sixty chains; thence extending south for a distance of about fifty chains; thence extending east for a distance of about fifty chains; thence extending south for a distance of about thirty chains; thence extending east for a distance of about one hundred and ten chains; thence extending south for a distance of about thirty chains to a surveyed line and extending east along same to road No. 991; thence north-eastward along said road to a bridge over the Kalgan river; thence south-easterly along the left bank of the said river to the south-west corner of location 2288; thence east to the Road Board boundary.

On the eastward by the eastern boundary of the Plantagenet Road District.

##### East Ward.

Bounded on the northward by the south boundary of the Woogenellup Ward, as above described.

On the westward by the eastern boundary of the North Ward. By the western and south boundaries of Plantagenet Location 364, west boundaries of locations 18, 1785, 522, 2207, 4561, part of the north boundary of location 752 and by the Railway Reserve to the north boundary of the South Ward.

On the southward by the north boundary of the South Ward and by the district boundary. By a line extending from a point on the Railway Reserve situated about 10 chains southward from the south-east corner of location 3522 and passing through locations 2701, 920 and 3586 and continuing to the eastern boundary of the Road District.

On the eastward by the east boundary of the Plantagenet Road District.

Health Act, 1911-44.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any portion of this State, not being a municipal district, a health district with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the Order, and may abolish any such district, or alter the boundaries of any such district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-44, doth hereby declare all that portion of the State comprised in the Capel Road District to be a Health District and for the purpose of the said Act to be known as the Capel Health District.

Schedule.

Regulations Governing the Admission of Survey Cadets, Public Works and Water Supply Departments.

1.—Conditions.

An applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty-one nor less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He shall also produce satisfactory evidence as to his character.

When forwarding his application each candidate shall attach a completed questionnaire on the printed form obtainable at the office of the Public Service Commissioner.

2.—Qualifications.

Applicants must have qualified for matriculation in the Faculty of Engineering of the University of Western Australia or have passed an approved equivalent examination. All other things being equal, preference will be given to applicants

who have passed at the Leaving Standard in Applied Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry or Geology. Applicants will be required to produce evidence of the examinations passed by them.

### 3.—Competitive Examination.

Applications will be invited by the Public Service Commissioner by advertisement, and in the event of more applications being received than the number of vacancies, selection will be made by either of the following methods:—(a) a Board consisting of the Public Service Commissioner, the Permanent Head and a professional member to be nominated by the Commissioner; or (b) a competitive examination in trigonometrical computations, plotting and plan drawing.

### 4.—Probation.

Every cadet shall, in the first instance, be appointed on probation for a period of three months. Before the expiration of the period of probation, the Permanent Head shall report to the Public Service Commissioner on the manner in which the probationer has performed his duties, and upon his general conduct. Upon receipt of such report the Commissioner will confirm, or annul, the cadetship. Upon confirmation of a cadet's appointment, he will be article to the Director of Works for a term hereinafter prescribed.

### 5.—Term of Cadetship.

The cadet shall serve for an aggregate period of two years in the Department. For the purpose of determining this period the sum of all University vacations actually spent by the cadet in training in the Department shall be counted. Leave without pay will be granted to cover the University terms.

The time spent in the Department shall be allocated as arranged by the Director of Works.

### 6.—Final Examination.

No cadet shall be considered to have completed his cadetship until he has obtained the degree of Bachelor of Surveying.

### 7.—Extension of Term.

If, at the end of the prescribed term of his cadetship, a cadet has not succeeded in fulfilling the conditions of completion set out in regulation 6, his cadetship may be extended at the discretion of the Public Service Commissioner for a further period not exceeding two years at the same remuneration as he was in receipt of for the last year of his cadetship.

### 8.—Student Membership.

A cadet, as soon as he is qualified by age, shall become a student member of either the Institution of Civil Engineers, London, or the Institution of Engineers, Australia.

### 9.—Progress and Conduct.

At any time after a cadet has completed one year of the prescribed term of service, if, in the opinion of the Permanent Head of the Department, his progress and general conduct have not been satisfactory, his cadetship may be cancelled on the approval of the Public Service Commissioner.

### 10.—Regulations.

During the whole term of his cadetship and any extension thereto, a cadet shall be subject to the Public Service Act and regulations relating to the Permanent Staff as far as these may be applicable. The period of his cadetship shall not be considered as any part of a term of service for which long service leave may be granted.

### 11.—Remuneration.

The remuneration of a cadet shall be at the following rates:—1st year—£90 per annum; 2nd year—£110 per annum; 3rd year—£130 per annum; 4th year—£160 per annum; 5th year—£185 per annum.

An allowance of 2s. per diem will also be paid when in the field in camp.

When employed away from Headquarters allowance may be paid as compensation for extra cost of transport necessarily incurred.

When stationed away from home, and no camp is provided, a special sustenance allowance may be paid as compensation for the extra cost of living involved.

These transport or sustenance allowances will be at such rates as may be approved by the Public Service Commissioner in each case.

### 12. Permanent Appointment.

A cadet who has satisfactorily completed his cadetship shall (should he be so required) serve in the Public Service of the State for a period of three years at a salary of £270 for the first year, and thereafter in accordance with the Public Service Commissioner's classification of the work upon which he is engaged.

### 13. Agreement and Bond.

Before any person is accepted as a cadet under these regulations, an agreement in the form, or to the effect, of Form No. 1 in the appendix hereto shall be executed by such person and his legal guardian and the Head of the Department concerned; and a bond in the form, or to the effect, of Form No. 2 in the said appendix shall be executed by the said legal guardian and by one or two sureties to be determined and approved by the Head of the Department concerned.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Harvey Public Cemetery, the said Trustees make the following by-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in Schedule A shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned, unless otherwise ordered.

2. The "secretary," as referred to in these by-laws means the person for the time being employed by the Trustees as the secretary of the Cemetery, and such person shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these by-laws, and the direction of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

3. The "superintendent," as referred to in these by-laws, means the person for the time being employed by the Trustees as the superintendent of the Cemetery,

and such person shall, subject to the Trustees, have charge of the general care of the Cemetery, the supervision of the erection or placing of monumental work and fixtures, also the supervision of interments, the opening, closing and dressing of graves, and such other duties as are mentioned in these by-laws or ordered by the Trustees.

4. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule B. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an "Order for Burial," in the form contained in Schedule C.

5. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustees in such time as to allow at least five working hours' notice being given to the Superintendent at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Magistrate's order therefor, be handed in at the office in such time as to allow of at least five working hours' notice being given as above.

6. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

7. Before any interment is allowed, the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the Superintendent.

8. Every coffin should have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this by-law shall be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.

9. Every grave shall be at least 7ft. deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3ft. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

10. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantees shall be handed in with the application.

11. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the Cemetery, unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Superintendent, at the latest upon the funeral entering the Cemetery. Should the undertaker or his representative be unable to produce the said certificate from the Registrar, he shall give a written guarantee to produce same within three days, and satisfactory reasons must be given for the non-production of the said certificate in the first instance. In default of the production of the said certificate within three days, the undertaker's license may be suspended until such certificate is produced. The certificate will be retained, but the Coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.

12. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—Week days—from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays—from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.; and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

13. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to a fine of 10s. 6d.

14. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

15. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

16. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, grave, or any erection, or in any way infringing these by-laws shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

17. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers, which are to be placed in the receptacles provided by the Trustees for same), or any articles from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the Trustees or their representative.

18. No person shall pluck any tree, plant, shrub, or flower growing in any portion of the Cemetery.

19. No person shall remove or carry out of or attempt to carry out of the Cemetery any tree, shrub, plant, or flower without the written authority of the Trustees, or their representative.

20. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery, any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system or advertisement whatsoever, without the written consent of the Trustees, and any person infringing this by-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

21. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery, other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

22. Subject to the by-laws, and to the directions of the Trustees the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

23. Any person requiring an Exclusive Right of Burial in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased person whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

24. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof, or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form E in the Schedule.

25. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees, may if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in Form E in the Schedule.

26. Every such Grant shall be subject to the by-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless production of the "Order for Burial" aforesaid nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

27. Every coffin placed in such bricked grave or vault, shall be bricked in, cemented and covered with a slab of stone, slate or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

28. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee to assignee shall be produced.

29. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with section 23 of the principal Act (61 Vict., No. 23).

30. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

31. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Superintendent or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.

32. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.

33. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the secretary to the Trustees the sum of 10s., which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the two preceding by-laws be not complied with to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.

34. All material required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery; and all

materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Superintendent shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4 inches broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

35. No catacomb shall be allowed.
36. If required by the Trustees, each applicant for an "Order for Burial" shall, within three months from date of application enclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slate or stone, and shall cause to be placed thereon a number-plate bearing the number of the grave or vault. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by, and at the expense of the grantee. Should the grantee's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the Trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee.
37. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.
38. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the Superintendent.
39. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these regulations and by-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Superintendent, may be removed from the Cemetery.
40. Licences for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees in the form contained in Schedule G, such licences to be renewed annually in the month of January.
41. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a) No rubbish, soil, sand or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Superintendent.

(c) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent.

(d) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.
42. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees an annual fee, as provided in Schedule A, and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit" to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of January following, and unless in the possession of such a "Permit" no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.
43. The Trustees may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantees so to do. If the grantees do not desire the Trustees to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Trustees for that purpose.
44. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Trustees, or those licensed by the Trustees, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.
45. Any person committing any breach of any of these by-laws and regulations or of any other rules, regulations or by-laws, lawfully made under the authority of any Act, relating to cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty of not exceeding £5, and in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall be forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, the Superintendent, or other officer of the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.
46. A plan of the Cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation and number of graves, and a register of all certificates of "Rights of Burial" shall be kept at the office of the Harvey Road Board.

The foregoing by-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Trustees held at the Road Board Office on the 10th day of September, 1945, and adopted.

Any person requiring an Exclusive Right of Burial in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased person whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

24. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof, or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form E in the Schedule.

25. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees, may if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in Form E in the Schedule.

26. Every such Grant shall be subject to the by-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless production of the "Order for Burial" aforesaid nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

27. Every coffin placed in such bricked grave or vault, shall be bricked in, cemented and covered with a slab of stone, slate or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

28. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee to assignee shall be produced.

29. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with section 23 of the principal Act (61 Vict., No. 23).

30. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

31. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Superintendent or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.

32. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.

33. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the secretary to the Trustees the sum of 10s., which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the two preceding by-laws be not complied with to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.

34. All material required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery; and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Superintendent shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4 inches broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

35. No catacomb shall be allowed.

36. If required by the Trustees, each applicant for an "Order for Burial" shall, within three months from date of application enclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slate, or stone, and shall cause to be placed thereon a number plate bearing the number of the grave or vault. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by, and at the expense of the grantee. Should the grantee's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the Trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee.

37. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.

38. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the Superintendent.

39. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these regulations and by-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Superintendent, may be removed from the Cemetery.

40. Licences for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees in the form contained in Schedule G, such licences to be renewed annually in the month of January.

41. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a) No rubbish, soil, sand or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Superintendent.

(c) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent.

(d) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

42. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees an annual fee, as provided in Schedule A, and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit" to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of January following, and unless in the possession of such a "Permit" no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

43. The Trustees may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantees so to do. If the grantees do not desire the Trustees to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Trustees for that purpose.

44. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Trustees, or those licensed by the Trustees, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

45. Any person committing any breach of any of these by-laws and regulations or of any other rules, regulations or by-laws, lawfully made under the authority of any Act, relating to cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty of not exceeding £5, and in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall be forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, the Superintendent, or other officer of the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.

46. A plan of the Cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation and number of graves, and a register of all certificates of "Rights of Burial" shall be kept at the office of the Cookernup Road Board.

The foregoing by-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Trustees held at the Road Board Office on the 10th day of September, 1945, and adopted.

Where after the commencement of this regulation provision is made in any building used as a factory, shop or warehouse for the interior illumination of such building by natural light such provision shall be such as is in conformity with the Australian Standard Code for the interior illumination of buildings by natural light as from time to time declared and published by the Standards Association of Australia.

18B. Where after the commencement of this regulation—

(a) any artificial lighting system is installed in any factory, shop or warehouse for the interior illumination of the building; or

(b) any artificial lighting system already installed in any factory, shop or warehouse for the interior illumination of the building is altered or extended

such lighting system shall be so installed, or so altered and extended, as the case may be, so as to be in conformity with the Australian Standard Code for the interior illumination of buildings by artificial light as from time to time declared and published by the Standards Association of Australia.

(b) by adding at the end of regulation 19 a new paragraph as follows:—

(c) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in either paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) of this regulation the provisions made in every factory, shop or warehouse after the commencement of this paragraph for the ventilation thereof shall be such as shall in every respect conform with the Australian Standard Code for the ventilation of buildings as from time to time declared and published by the Standards Association of Australia.

## Schedule.

## THE RURAL AND INDUSTRIES BANK ACT, 1944.

(No. 51 of 1944.)

## Regulations.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Rural and Industries Bank Act Regulations, 1945, and are divided into parts as follows:—

PART I (regulations 2 to 17). Definitions, The Commissioners, Meetings, Management and Conduct of Business, Common Seal.

PART II (regulations 18 to 27). Applications for Loans, Valuations and Inspections.

PART III (regulations 28 to 34). Form of Security and Protection of Securities of the Bank.

PART IV (regulations 35 to 38). Control and Discipline of the Officers and Servants and Authorised Agents of the Bank.

PART V (regulations 39 to 42). Debentures.

PART VI (regulations 43 to 44). Offences and Penalties.

## PART I.

2. In these regulations, unless the context or subject matter otherwise indicates or requires—

“The Act” means the Rural and Industries Bank Act, 1944 (No. 51 of 1944).

“The Bank” means the Rural and Industries Bank constituted by the Act and includes the Commissioners thereof.

“The Commissioners” means the Commissioners of the Bank.

“Branch” means a branch of the Bank.

“Head Office” means the principal place of business of the Bank.

## Meetings.

3. The Commissioners shall meet for the transaction of business at such times and in such places as the chairman shall appoint.

## Minutes.

4. A Minute Book shall be kept by the Commissioners in which shall be recorded minutes of the proceedings at any meeting convened by the chairman, in pursuance of the foregoing regulation, and the minutes, when duly read and confirmed, shall be signed by the chairman.

5. After the confirmation and the signing of the minutes of the preceding meeting, consideration shall be given to the business of the meeting, in such order as the Commissioners may decide.

6. The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall give his decision but shall not be obliged to discuss or comment on the same; his decision in each case shall be final.

7. Any of the Commissioners may at any time demand the production of any of the documents and records of the Bank applying to the question under discussion, and may at any time during business hours have access to all the records and documents of the Bank.

8. At every meeting of the Commissioners all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall, if required by the Chairman, be—(a) reduced into writing; (b) signed by the mover; and (c) delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

#### Common Seal.

9. The Commissioners shall keep a common seal, bearing the name of the Commissioners and containing some appropriate device thereon.

10. The common seal shall be kept in safe custody by the secretary, at the office of the Commissioners in Perth, and shall not in any circumstances be affixed to any document except—(a) pursuant to a resolution passed by the Commissioners; and (b) by the secretary or other officer authorised in writing by the Commissioners in that behalf, in the presence of a Commissioner.

#### Hours of Business.

11. Except on Public and bank holidays the head office and branches of the Bank shall be open to the public for the transaction of business on all week days except Saturday, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. and on Saturdays 9.30 a.m. to 11.30 a.m. and at such other hours as the Commissioners may from time to time direct.

#### Receipts and Disbursements.

12. (a) No money shall be received on account of the Commissioners by any person or persons whomsoever other than such of the officers or agents of the Commissioners as are authorised to receive such moneys.

(b) Every receipt issued by an authorised officer or agent shall be on an official form, to be supplied by the Commissioners.

13. Any receipt given for any such moneys received by any person other than the authorised officers of the Commissioners shall be null and void.

14. All moneys paid to the Commissioners shall be paid at the office of the Commissioners, or at some branch office of the Commissioners, or to some person authorised to receive money on behalf of the Commissioners.

15. All such moneys shall be held for the credit of the Commissioners and shall from time to time be paid to a special account kept at the Treasury.

16. No withdrawals shall be made from the said account other than on account of payments which have been authorised by the Commissioners, or on account of payments which are made by persons authorised by the Commissioners to make the same.

17. All cheques drawn against the said account shall be signed by some person or persons authorised in that behalf by the Commissioners.

### PART II.

#### Applications for Loans.

18. All applications for loans from the Bank shall be on the prescribed form numbered 1 in the Appendix hereto.

19. The applicant may be required to pay all charges and out of pocket expenses in connection with the investigation of his title and perfecting and registering his securities.

20. When an inspection of the proposed security is necessary the Commissioners may require the application for a loan to be subject to payment by the applicant of out of pocket expenses not exceeding £3 3s. 0d. incurred for such inspection, provided that the Commissioners may either generally or in a particular case, waive, remit or reduce any fee payable under this regulation.

21. Such fee shall be retained by the Commissioners whether the required advance or any part thereof is made or not, unless the Commissioners otherwise direct.

22. The Commissioners may require an applicant to meet other expenses incurred, but such expenses shall not exceed two per centum of the amount of the loan up to £100, and thereafter one half of one per centum on such amount exceeding £100 and up to £500, and one quarter of one per centum on such amount exceeding £500.

23. In the case of loans made for the purpose of effecting work the Commissioners may direct advances be made by instalments, as the work proceeds, or in one sum.

24. Should an application be accepted either wholly or in part, and the applicant fail to produce his securities for registration within two months from the date of acceptance, such application may be cancelled, and the inspection fee wholly or in part may be refunded.

25. Where loans are not drawn on for a period of twelve months, the Commissioners may cancel the unexpended balance.

26. The Commissioners may require any applicant for an advance to set out a full statement of his assets and liabilities, distinguishing between those liabilities which are secured and those which are unsecured and, in the former case, to give particulars of the securities held by his several creditors.

#### Valuations and Inspections.

27. The valuer's report obtained by the Commissioners being a confidential document, its contents shall not be disclosed to applicants.

### PART III.

#### Form of Security and Protection of Securities of the Bank.

28. No form of security other than that which is according to the form approved by the Commissioners for general use shall be used in the conduct of the business of the Commissioners.

29. Should any material alteration of these forms become necessary to suit the circumstances of any particular cause, the responsible officer of the staff concerned will, where necessary, obtain the opinion of a Crown Law officer in regard to the particular security.

30. All securities shall be under the direct control of some person authorised by the Commissioners and who shall be responsible for the safe custody thereof.



31. In order to keep a proper check on the securities of the Commissioners, such authorised person shall keep a register of securities and enter therein from time to time all securities on which the Commissioners have advanced any moneys, and make a note of the disposition thereof from time to time.
32. No security or title shall be produced at the request of any subsequent encumbrancer, transferee, or other person interested in obtaining production, except on payment of such fee or fees as the Commissioners may deem reasonable in the circumstances.
33. The authorised person in control of the securities shall be responsible for making available to the audit officer of the Auditor General the securities of the Commissioners for audit purposes.
34. No security shall be discharged until the whole of the moneys secured by the security, together with a closing fee, which shall be fixed by the Commissioners, are first paid.

PART IV.

Control and Discipline of the Officers and Servants and Authorised Agents of the Bank.

35. Upon the Commissioners appointing officers, servants, valuers, and agents of the Bank, each of such officers, servants, valuers, and agents shall before entering upon duty be required to make a declaration as determined by the Commissioners undertaking not to disclose to any persons other than officers, valuers, or agents of the Bank any matter affecting the Bank's business or the Bank's business in connection with its customers.

Hours of Attendance.

36. (i) The hours of attendance to be observed by any person employed by the Bank as an officer pursuant to section thirty-six of the Act shall be from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. with a recess of one hour for luncheon on all week days except Saturdays and on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 12 noon.
- (ii) Subject to the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, the hours of attendance required to be observed as aforesaid shall be deemed to be the officer's usual working hours for the purpose of clause 3 paragraph (a) of an agreement made in pursuance thereof between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia Incorporated and the Public Service Commissioner on the twenty-third day of June, 1938, and published on the first day of July, 1938, in the *Government Gazette*.
- (iii) The provisions of paragraphs (i) and (ii) of this regulation shall be deemed to constitute hours of attendance to be observed by officers the subject of special regulations for the purposes and within the meaning of regulation 8 (as amended and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-first day of March, 1944) of the regulations made pursuant to the Public Service Act, 1904-1935.
37. Subject to the Act the regulations made under the Public Service Act, 1904-1935, shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to every person employed by the Bank as an officer thereof.
38. Officers and servants and authorised agents of the Bank shall comply with instructions issued from time to time by the Commissioners in connection with the Bank's business.

PART V.  
Debentures.

39. Where Debentures shall be offered for sale the following provisions shall apply:—
- (a) An application to purchase debentures, excepting where made on a form accompanying a prospectus calling for subscriptions by public tender, shall be in accordance with Form 2 in the appendix hereto.
- (b) The application shall be accompanied by the purchase-money.
- (c) Upon receipt of the application and purchase money an official receipt in accordance with Form 3 in the appendix hereto shall be issued.
40. Debentures, with interest coupons attached, shall be prepared in accordance with Form 4 in the said appendix.
41. A record of particulars of debentures issued shall be made and kept in a Register of Debentures.
42. Interest payable on debentures shall be paid half-yearly on the thirtieth day of June, and the thirty-first day of December in each year, at the head office or any branch of the Bank on presentation of appropriate coupon on or after the due date for payment thereof.

PART VI.  
Offences and Penalties.

43. Every person who by act or omission commits a breach of these regulations commits an offence. Penalty—Twenty pounds.
44. Notwithstanding any conviction under these regulations the Commissioners shall not be prejudiced in the exercise of the disciplinary powers of the Commissioners against any member of the staff.
