PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 116 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that during every Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Anzac Day and Easter Monday and any other day that the Governor may by proclamation declare to be a public holiday to be observed under the said Act, all shops (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule and registered small shops) shall be closed: Now therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act do by this proclamation declare that, in addition to Christmas Day, 1945, and New Year's Day, 1946, Wednesday, the 26th day of December, 1945, shall be a day to be observed as a public holiday under the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, throughout the State with the intent that on the said day all shops throughout the State (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the said Act and registered small shops) shall be closed.

The Health Act, 1911-44.

Infectious Diseases.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 3 of the Health Act, 1911-44, that the term "Infectious Disease" means and includes certain specified diseases, and also any other disease which the Governor may declare to be an infectious disease for the purposes of the said Act; and whereas it is desired to so declare the disease known as German Measles (Rubella or Rotheln): Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby declare the disease abovementioned, that is to say, German Measles (Rubella or Rotheln), to be an infectious disease for the purposes of the Health Act, 1911-44.

Constitution of the Dumbleyung Health District under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-44.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-44, that the Lieutenant-Governor may constitute any portion of the State, not being a Municipal District, to be a Health District, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the Order; and whereas, certain areas in the Dumbleyung Road District were declared to be Health Districts; and whereas it is desired to extend the boundaries of the said Health District, now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that all land embraced within the boundaries of the Dumbleyung Road District shall be a Health District to be known as the Dumbleyung Health District under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-44.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 646/45.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act; now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor with the advice of the Executive Council hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of sections 20, 21, 22 and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.—Metropolitan Reticulation Water Main Extensions.—Belmont Park Road District and City of Perth—Victoria Park.

- (a) Proposed 4-inch diameter main commencing at a point in Orrong road opposite lot 1061 and proceeding thence in a south-easterly direction along Orrong road to the intersection of Orrong road and President street; thence in a north-easterly direction along President street, to a point opposite lot 279 (length about 71 chains).
- (b) Proposed 4-inch diameter main commencing at the junction of Orrong road and Fulham street and proceeding thence in a north-easterly direction along Fulham street to a point opposite lot 1364 (length about 4½ chains).
- (c) Proposed 4-inch diameter main commencing at the junction of Orrong road and Mercury street and proceeding thence in a south-westerly direction along Mercury street to a point opposite lot 40 (length about 1 chain).

The above mains to be complete with valves, hydrants and all necessary apparatus as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 6812.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 30th day of November, 1945.

Sandalwood Act, 1929.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 2 of the Sandalwood Act, 1929, the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council, limit and restrict the quantity of Sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period therein stated; and whereas it is desirable to limit and restrict the quantity of Sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period from the First day of November, 1945, to the Thirtieth day of June, 1946, to 500 tons: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby limit and restrict the quantity of Sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period from the First day of November, 1945, to the Thirtieth day of June, 1946, to 500 tons, exclusive of Sandalwood required for oil distillation purposes within the State.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-43.

HEALTH ACT, 1911-1944.

Department of Public Health,
Perth, 28th November, 1945.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting in accordance with the advice of the Advisory Committee, pursuant to section 225 of the Health Act, 1911-1944, has been pleased to amend the Food and Drug Regulations as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th day of August, 1928, and amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time thereafter, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

The Food and Drug Regulations are amended by inserting therein after sub-regulation 3 of regulation 68 the following new paragraphs:—

(4) In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—"receptacle" includes any portion of the outside of a cask capable of holding any liquid; "waste beer" includes any beer, ale or stout which is—

(a) derived from the spill, drip or overflow from any tap, vessel or other receptacle; or

(b) derived from any unconsumed portion supplied to and left by a customer in any glass or other receptacle; or

(c) contained in any drip tray; or

(d) contained in any receptacle the contents of which are derived from any of the sources mentioned in the foregoing paragraphs (a), (b), (c).

(5) The proprietor of every licensed victualler's premises shall—

(a) not permit waste beer to be on such premises in any container, receptacle or appliance unless such container, receptacle or appliance contains the colouring matter Methyl Violet present in sufficient quantity to impart to such waste beer at all times a distinct violet colour; and

(b) cause every vessel on such premises into which waste beer is received, placed, allowed to run, or to discharge, to contain the colouring matter prescribed in the immediately foregoing paragraph (a); and

(c) not place or permit to be placed in any drip tray on such premises any receptacle capable of holding beer.

THE Perth Road Board under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943, and the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1944, and all other powers enabling it doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. Those portions of Inglewood Ward of the Perth Road Board District comprising all that portion of Swan Location Y within the boundaries of the Ward, that portion of Swan Location X extending from Railway parade to Government road; and portion of Swan Location X, being lots 14 to 22 inclusive on deposited plan 2623, and portion of Swan Location W being lots 1 to 11 inclusive and 22 to 29 inclusive on deposited plan 181 are classified into districts as hereinafter set out.

2. All the above portions of Swan Location Y, X and W, with the exception of the areas included in by-laws 4 and 7 are hereby classified as a residential district.

3. No building or structure shall be hereinafter erected, altered or used in such residential district except for the purpose of a private dwelling house for not more than one family or for a Road Board building, or for a house of worship.

4. All lots in Swan Location Y and X fronting Beaufort street to a depth of 165 feet; lots 127, 128, 130 and 131 and lots 196, 197, 199 and 200 in Swan Location X, section 9 on deposited plan 1929 and lots 5 to 11 inclusive in Swan Location W on deposited plan 181 are hereby classified as business and residential districts.

5. No building or structure shall hereafter be erected, altered or used in such business and residential districts for any purpose other than—

(a) private dwelling house for not more than one family;

(b) a road board building or a house of worship;

(c) a tenement house if within the tenement house district as classified by by-law 6 of these by-laws;

(d) a shop;

(e) an office, a bank or an hotel;

(f) a workroom or workrooms connected with a retail business in which not more than 75 per cent. of the total floor area of such business is used as a work room or work rooms;

(g) a garage or service station and the necessary workshops and stores connected therewith;

(h) a theatre, public hall, cinema, club, or place of amusement;

(i) such other purposes as the Board may determine but not including any industry, industrial purpose factory, manufactory or noxious trade as detailed in the second schedule of the Health Act, 1911-1944.

6. All that portion of the business and residential districts as above classified being all lots in Swan Location Y and X fronting Beaufort street to a depth of 165 feet is hereby classified as a tenement house district.

7. Lots 53 to 97 inclusive in Swan Location X, section 4, on deposited plan 1749 and lots 14 to 20 inclusive in Swan Location X on deposited plan 2623 and the north-western portions of lots 1 to 4 inclusive in Swan Location W on deposited plan 181 with a depth from the north-western boundary of each lot of 217.8 links, and lots 22 to 29 inclusive in Swan Location W on deposited plan 181 are hereby classified as an industrial and residential district.

8. No building or structure shall be hereafter erected, altered or used in such industrial and residential district for any purpose other than—

(a) private dwelling house for not more than one family;

(b) an industry, industrial purpose factory, or manufactory approved by the Board, not a noxious trade as detailed in the second schedule of the Health Act, 1911-1944.

9. The Board may permit structural alterations to any building or structure being used at the date of publication of these by-laws in the *Government Gazette* for purposes other than those mentioned in by-laws 3, 5 and 8 above, provided that the purpose for which such building is used or is to be used shall not afterwards be changed in contravention of these by-laws.

10. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the above by-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

11. Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of these by-laws shall be made not later than six months from the date on which these by-laws are first published in the *Government Gazette*.
