PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,
TO WIT. K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and
over the State of Western Australia
Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 41
of the Superannuation and Family Benefits Act, 19381939, that, as soon as practicable after the expiration
of each period of five years from the commencement of of each period of five years from the commencement of the said Act, the Governor may upon the recommendation of the Superannuation Board prescribe tables of contributions which shall, subject to the approval of both Houses of Parliament, take effect from a date to be fixed by proclamation and remain in force until other tables are prescribed under the said subsection; and whereas the Superannuation Board has recommended that the tables of contributions set forth hereunder shall be prescribed to take the place of the tables of contributions now contained in the First, Second, Third and Fourth Schedules to the said Act and to come into force and have effect as from and including Super-annuation Fortnight No. 172 ending on the first day of February, 1946: Now therefore I, the said Lieutenant-February, 1946: Now therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and upon the recommendation of the Superannuation Board, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the said Act and of all other powers in that behalf enabling me do by this proclamation prescribe under and for the purposes of the Superannuation and Family Benefits Act, 1938-1939, the tables of contributions set forth in the three schedules hereunder marked Schedules A, B, and C respectively and declare that the said tables of contributions hereby prescribed shall take the place of the tables of contributions. prescribed shall take the place of the tables of contribu-tions contained in the First, Second, Third and Fourth Schedules to the said Act respectively and have effect as from and including Superannuation Fortnight No. 172 ending on the 1st day of February, 1946.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA | By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,
TO WIT. | K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and
JAMES MITCHELL,
Lieutenant-Governor. | Lieutenant-Governor and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown Lands to be Reserves for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared at Tenterden: Now, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an area of two hundred acres more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Natives.

Schedule.

All that portion of Hay Location 1243 bounded by lines commencing at its north-east corner and extending west 50 chains, south 40 chains, east 50 chains; and thence north 40 chains to the starting point.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, it is provided that the Governor may, by proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from January 1, 1946, until December 31, 1948, inclusive.

Schedule.

The whole of the waters of Geraldton Harbour south and west of a line drawn due east from the eastern end of the mole to a point on the foreshore.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Game Act, 1912-1913, that the Governor may, by proclamation, declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof, and that the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operations of any such declaration under the said Act any defined locality; and whereas by a proclamation dated the 30th day of July, 1924, it is provided that the portions of the State and localities defined in the Schedule thereto shall be a reserve for grey kangaroos, known scientifically as Macropus giganteus; and whereas it is desirable to exempt from the operations of the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the powers aforesaid, do hereby by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, exempt from the operations of the Schedule hereto as from the date of the publication of this proclamation in the Government Gazette until April 30, 1946.

The proclamation dated November 28, 1945, and published in the *Government Gazette* on December 7, 1945, is hereby cancelled.

Schedule.

All that part of the Gingin Road District lying to the west of the Moore River.

15A.—Use of Locomotives Underground.

- (1) No person shall be allowed to have charge of a locomotive used for traction purposes underground unless he has been examined by the Manager of the Mine, or some competent person appointed by him in writing for such purpose, and the engineer, by a thorough practical trial in the use of the machine, and has received from them a certificate that he is thoroughly competent and fit to have charge of it.
- (2) A duplicate of every such certificate shall be sent by the Manager to the Inspector forthwith after issue thereof.

- (3) Such certificate shall state the name of the person in full to whom it is issued, his address, his place of birth, his age, the name of the mine and mine owner, the date and place of issue, and shall be signed by the persons examining him, and the holder shall sign his name in the margin of both the original and duplicate certificate in the presence of the Manager, who shall certify that the signature is that of the person examined by him, and to whom the certificate is issued.
- (4) The Inspector may examine the holder of any such certificate by a thorough practical trial in the use of the machine, and if satisfied of his competency to have charge of same may endorse the certificate to that effect.
- (5) The Inspector may, at any time, cancel any such certificate, whether previously endorsed by himself or another inspector or not, if he has reason to believe that the holder should not be entrusted with the charge of such machine, and the holder shall, on demand, deliver his certificate to the Inspector for cancellation.
- (6) Any person taking charge of such machine without a certificate, and any owner, agent, or manager knowingly allowing such person to take charge of it, shall each be guilty of a breach of this regulation.
